PAUL EDMUND PETERSEN

Phristote

The files of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, 19th and East Capitol Streets, reflect that PAUL EDMIND PETERSEN, landed in Quebec on September 12, 1925 from the SS Auraunia which sailed from London. His destination was Winnipeg, Canada where he lived for two years; thereafter, illegally entering the United States near Neche, North Dakota. INS files reflected that he had no visa and had stated he had lost his passport in Canada. A Danish passport was furnished April 2, 1931 by the Minister of Denmark in order that he could be deported, and he sailed from the United States on April 25, 1931 on the SS Frederick VIII. He was described as 5:6%, 165 lbs.; blue eyes; red hair; oval face; nose and mouth medium; occupation, Laborer; marital status, single. There was no photograph in the INS files.

FREDERICK CHRISTIAN VICHTODOVA PETERSEN, alias, JAMES SMITH

The INS files reflect that FREDERICK PRIERSEN had actually first entered the United States in June or July 1926 on the SS Oscar II from Copenhagen, Denmark as a crew member. While in the United States, he was arrested on January 8, 1932 in the city of New York and was sentenced to three months in the workhouse for disorderly conduct. He used the name JAMES SMITH while living in New York during the time of

With reference to HARRY GOLD and THOMAS L. HLACK describing their one time Soviet espionage superior as PAUL SMITH and PAUL PETERSON, respectively, it is to be noted that in reviewing the GOLD case, SMITH/PETERSON turned GOLD over to his (PAUL'S) successor, STEVE SWARTZ. It would appear that the names PAUL SMITH and PAUL PETERSON are cover names for GOLD's first Soviet superior in view of the fact that successively all of GOLD's espionage superiors used cover names. Successively, they were the following, the identifications having been made by HARRY GOLD: STEVE SWARTZ (SEMEN MEFODIEVICH RUGA), FRED (Unidentified), SAM (SEMEN SEMENOV), JOHN (ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEY), Unknown Russian No. 1 (FILIPP TIKHONOVICH SARYTCHEV).

Reference is made to the report of SA ROBERT G. and JENSEN, dated August 24, 1950 at Philadelphia concerning instant matter wherein on pages 11 and 12 it is set forth in connection with an interview on June 20, 1950 with THOMAS L. BLACK that BLACK received an assignment to locate a man whom PETERSEN knew only as NICHOIS and who lived in East Rutherford, New Jersey. A notation "See NICHOIS E. HUTHERFORD" was identified by BLACK in a notebook found in his small green strong box as the notation he made at the time PETERSEN gave him that assignment. PETERSEN also told him that NICHOIS was a metallurgist whose hobby was microscopy, and that he was a graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. PETERSEN allegedly told BLACK that RUTHERFORD had at an earlier time been a valuable Soviet contact.

It is to be noted that currently an investigation is being conducted concerning BENJAMIN SKILG by the Cincinnati office in view of his having been contacted by HARRY GOLD. During the course of the SKILG investigation considerable investigation has been made at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology concerning SMILG and his associates and principally concerning STANISLAUS SHUMOVSKY, a former Soviet aeronautical engineering student at MIT and one who has allegedly been engaged in espionage activities.

Copies of SA JENSEN's report have been enclosed for the Boston and Newark offices in order to provide them with background information concerning instant matter.

In my opinion SARYTCHEV was a trained interrogator as illustrated by the fact he apparently knew the type of information he was after and he pursued his questioning most diligently and relentlessly. "In connection with these regular meetings I distinctly recall that SARYTCHEV also gave me further instructions. He impressed on me that I should come to How Tork late the night before (that is on Seturday night before the meeting) and spend the time wandering around New York City never staying too long in one spot. The morning of the meeting I was to go past the regular seeting place one bour or so in advance and if I observed any signs of surveillance or anything of a suspicious nature then I was not to attempt to make the meeting at the appointed time. In the event I did not make the regular meeting because of either of the foregoing I was to wait until I heard from them. I do not recell receiving these wame instructions from SARYTCHEV in the event I deemed it undesirable to make one of the morganby meetings,

Barter Stationsy and I and discussed the best maner of arranging emergency meetings and as he did not offer any practical concrete suggestions I advanced the fellowing plan which was accepted by him. It was agreed that should I desire to contact the Soviets in an emergency I was to come to New York and personally insert an advertisement in the Situations Mantadi section of the flow Tork Times! in the early part of the week.

"Should the Soviets desire to contact me they would send to me at my place of employment, the Philadelphia General Hospital, by first class mail a book entitled "Chamistry of the Carbohydrates" or Turther Advances in Carbohydrate Chamistry" by R. GCEPP and W.W. PICMAN. I thought this would be a particularly foolproof method for them to communicate with me inasmuch as this book was a technical publication which sold very few copies chances of my receiving such a book by mistake were extremely remote. It was agreed that I would understand that the receipt of such a book by me was to signify that a representative of the Seviets desired an emargency meeting with me also at 1 pan, on the Sunday following the receipt of this book by me.

"After this had been decided SARYTCHEV explained to me where the emergency meeting would be held. The area described by him was and is strange to me. As I recall the emergency meeting place was in New Rochelle, New York. SARTTCHEV explained the New Rochelle Railroad Station was bordered en one side by a small park through which park extended a path to a nearby boardwalk or promende. He said this particular path extended from the station directly through the middle of the park and ended on the boardwalk or promenade closely adjacent to what (on the boardwalk) was a shelter er bench protested from the weather. In the event of an energency meeting, this meeting would be held to the right of the shelter or bench. SARYTCHEV indicated to me that it was very likely that he would not be at this emergency meeting place and as a consequence recognition signals were agreed upon. It was agreed that the visual recognition signals of the corred-stem pipe and the eight, which it will be recklied were used in connection with the regular meeting, were also to be used in connection with smergency meetings, Although I disagreed, BARTYCHEV insisted that the verbal recognition signal concerning the directions to the Large Harding Hospital (used in connection with the regular meetings) should also be used at these emergency meetings as a further means of identification.

plans SARTICHEV made a few brief notes on all the salient points of the two classes of meetings. He used the back of an envelope for this but I was unable to see the front or address surface of this envelope. After talking with me for approximately one and a half hours SARTICHEV teld me that he had nothing to further discuss with me. At this point we were in a neighborhood strange to me. After advising me that he had nothing further to discuss with me, SARTICHEV merely turned and left me. I had no idea as to where I was and did not even have an idea as to the direction in which the elevated lay. I merely started walking and finally came to an elevated station (which one I cannot recall). I boarded an elevated train at this point and returned to Pann Station. Immediately following this I secured a train that returned me to Philladelphia.

"In order to make my regular (December, 1949) meeting with the Soviets, I left Philadelphia early in the morning the first Sunday in December, 1919, and traveled to new York City. Although this was Yhdirect disobedience to the instructions given me by SARYTCHEV that I should leave Philadelphia the night before in order to make such regular meetings, I left Philadelphia on Sunday morning in order to avoid friction at home. Following my arrival in New York I traveled by subway to the 90th Street or Elahurst Avenue station, arriving at this point at approximately 10 a.m. After arriving at this station I went to the street corner beneath this elevated line that was the proper corper for me to be on when I had no desire to communicate with my contact. After remaining on this sorner for approximately twenty minutes, and as I was not contacted. I secured a taxicab from a mearby cab stand and was driven by this cab to the Rossevelt Avenue - Jackson Heights station of the Queens - IND elevated line. My use of this taxicab was for the sole purpose of making better time and was not a devise used to forestall any surveillance of me. After reaching this elevated stop I boarded a New York bound elevated train and after my return to Penn Station secured a train that returned me to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. During my attendance at this meeting place I did not observe anyone that appeared to be interested in me

Sunday in February, 1950, I read that Mr. MIAUS FUCHS, the British scientist with whom I had dealt in the past (in connection with atomic energy espionage on behalf of the Soviets), had been arrested by the British authorities for espionage activity for the Soviets. I became extremely concerned over this but as my maxt regular meeting was scheduled for a Sunday following the arrest of FUCHS, I did mething in the way of attempting to use the "emergency meeting" method to contact the Soviets.



ERENNAN on June 5, 1950, however, GOID was unable to identify the picture of SCHULTZ, nor was he able to recall anyone by that name as having been involved in any espionage activities for the Soviet Unions U. po

A picture of SCHULTZ was exhibited on June 16, 1950 by Special Agents WILLIAM B. WELTE, JR., ROBERT W. HOLMES, and HUMAND A. SEARL to THOMAS I. MIACK, who has admitted being a close associate of HAMRY COLD since 1930 and who also has admitted having engaged in industrial esphenage on behalf of the Soviet Union during the late 1930 s. HIACK was not able to identify the photograph of SCHULTZ as snyone known to him, nor did he have any knowledge of any individual by this name engaged in espionage activity.

JILES, San Pedro, California, telephonically advised the Los Angeles Office that twenty-three Russian adult citizens and two children had arrived at 8:30 A.M. that day at San Pedro, California aboard the Swedish motorship PECUADOR" from Vladivostok.

As indicated above, the passports of the Russians en route to the USSR Embassy at London, England and to the USSR Consulate at New York City, were diplomatic passports.

According to Inspector JILES, the passports of the Amtorg party, while not diplomatic, bore visas as prescribed by Section 5, Paragraph 1, of the United States Immigration Regulations, which place such travelers in the status of employees of a foreign government.

The above-named aliens who are traveling under diplomatic passports, were casually asked concerning their departure from Los Angeles and their place of abode while in this city, but in each instance they advised through an interpreter that they knew nothing concerning their future plans. The Amtorg group also advised that aside from the fact that they expected to leave Los Angeles immediately for New York City, where they expected to remain for a period of from six to eight months, they knew nothing further concerning their future activities while in this country.

However, it was noted that the San Pedro, California representative of the Santa Fe Railroad was aboard the "ECUADOR" and subsequent information secured from his office disclosed that the eighteen adults and two children who composed the Amtorg party were registering at the Hotel Rosslyn in Los Angeles for the night of February 3, 1941, and that reservations had already been made for their departure from Los Angeles at 8:15 P.M. February 4, 1941 via the Santa Fe Railroad en route to New York City.

Referenced Philadelphia teletype reflected that WALTER ZUK desired to see an agent of the P.B.I. prior to leaving for Canada, in order to furnish information of an intelligence ZUK was contacted in Scranten, Pennsylvania, on 9/12/51, however, was not interviewed since his English was poor, but claimed to speak Russian, Ukrainian, German and Polish fluently.... Teletype indicated that ZUK was to depart for N.Y.C. on 9/12/51, where he expected to stay two days with an individual identified as TARASYMOWYCH, 646 East 9th Street, N.Y.C. ZUK agreed to appear at the N.Y. Office at approximately 9 A.M. on 9/13/51 at which time he would be interviewed by an agent familiar with any of the above-listed languages.

ZUK appeared at the N.Y. Office on the morning of 9/13/51; and was interviewed in Polish by SA CHESTER J. GUSTOWSKI.

ZUK related that he sent a letter from Toronte, Canada, to the "Intelligence Service Department," Washington, D.C., about a year ago, requesting that someone from the "Department" come to him in order to discuss with him a very important matter. ZUE stated that he did not reveal in this letter what the matter sancerned. Recording to ZUK, this letter was not answered, so he sent another letter soon thereafter to the "Intelligence Service Department, "Ottawa, Canada, reflecting the same informa-V tion again he did not receive an answer.

ZUK explained that he wanted to supply information concerning ANATOLITIAKOVLEV, or WAKOVLEV, who may be identical with ANATOLI YAKOVIEV, former Vice Consul of the H.Y. Soviet Consulate. ZUK stated that YAKOVIEV'S name was brought to his attention through publicity given to YAKOVLEV in the Politic newspapers in 19503

ZUK advised that he operated as a German spy during World war II in the Ukrainian and Stalingrad area , while the was operating in the city of Charley he became, war friendly with Mrs. ANATOLITYAKOVLEY, since both resided in the same

apartment. Under the guise of a German prisoner, employed as a chauffeur by the name of HANZ, ZUK assisted Mrs. YAKOVLEV and her child in her daily chores since her husband was away on a mission. During this time, Mrs. YAKOVLEV informed ZUK that her husband was a Colonel in the Russian Intelligence Service.


As time went on, Mrs. YAKOVLEV requested ZUK to try to obtain, if possible, the following information which she in turn could transmit to her husband, namely: where German staffs are located and who is conducting intelligence service from the German Army. ZUK immediately consulted his superiors regarding this request, and arrangements were made for him to pass erroneous information to Colonel YAKOVLEV through his wife.

It should be pointed out here that ZUK first met Mrs. YAKOVLEV in December, 1941. About March, 1942, Mrs. YAKOVLEV asked ZUK if he desired to act as an intelligence agent for the Russians. ZUK told her that he would not for if he were caught, his wife and child in Lwow, Poland, would be killed by the Germans. (ZUK lied since he was not married) However, he would supply what information came to him by charce.

ZUK'S association with Mrs. YAKOVLEV lasted about six months. He never met YAKOVLEV personally and would not recognize him if he saw him.

ZUK was shown a picture of Mrs. ANATOLI YAKOVLEV, wife of the former Russian Vice-Consul, and advised that she was not identical with the Mrs. ANATOLI YAKOVLEV that he knew. It should be pointed out here that ANATOLI YAKOVLEV and his wife entered the U.S. at San Pedro on 2/4/41, and during the period that ZUK knew Mrs. YAKOVLEV, Mrs. ANATOLI YAKOVLEV, the wife of the former Vice Consul, had been in New York.



Source C also advised that a special invitation was issued to KOVSHAR on August 3 to attend a lecture to be held in the concert room of the Palace Hotel on August 7, 1945. This source advised that KOVSHAR was in attendance at this lecture.

#### INDIGRATION AND NATURALIZATION STATUS

Source B advised on August 10, 1945, that Mrs. KOVSHAR received a letter from ROBERT F. DAVIS, adviser and consultant on immigration laws, in which DAVIS stated he had heard that the Board of Immigration Appeals had granted a suspension of the deportation order as to Mrs. KOVSHAR and had also granted a six months' extension on the departure date of KOVSHAR. DAVIS stated that it was now only necessary for Mrs. KOVSHAR to be made a legal, permanent resident and that DAVIS would then start working on KOVSHAR's status. Mrs. KOVSHAR stated to informant that this matter would have to be sent to Vancouver. She expressed great joy to informant over her good fortune in regard to this immigration matter and was evidently highly pleased.


#### MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS ACTIVITIES

Source C has furnished the following information concerning miscellaneous business activities of KOVSHAR:

On July 12, 1945, KOVSHAR, in a conversation with his sister, mentioned the fact that a very large house in Lake Tahoe is up for sale and that he has some ideas about it in connection with the movie projector he has. This conversation followed a discussion about the merits of various movie projectors and plans of KOVSHAR's sister to purchase a projector and go into the business of showing films.

On July 13, 1945, KOVSHAR made an appointment to have luncheon with CRIFFITH of the General Petroleum Company. KOVSHAR said his purpose in arranging this meeting was to talk over with GRIFFITH the fact that an acquaintance of kovshar's, with \$50,000 to invest, had told KOVSHAR he put a lot of trust in him and wished to deal through him.

On August 7, 1945, one MIKCLAI PANFILOVICH NICHKIN, connected with the Russian Life Newspaper, teld KOVSHAR he wished to discuss some theatrical business with him. This involved the financing of a Russian theatrical group. MICHKIN indicated that one YAKOVLEV was willing to put up \$1,000 and that if KOVSHAR put up more than that, he could have charge of the entire production. KOVSHAR stated he would think the matter over and would contact NICHKIN on the following day. Source C had no knowledge of the decision reached by KOVSHAR.
