Since December, 1943, the organization has become increasingly active and particularly so since it established headquarters at the Institute for International Democracy, 23 West 26th Street, in January, 1944. (This organization will be referred to hereinafter.)

Max Yergan, in February, 1944, visited Canada, making several public addresses, among which was a radio broadcast on the subject "The Atlantic Charter and the Colonial People in Africa." Yergan is said to have referred to the necessity for carrying forward a "broadly conceived plan for meeting the education and health needs, providing the economic development, and insuring speedy advancement toward complete responsible self government for the African people."

Subsequently, on April 14, 1944, a conference was held by the subject organization at the Institute for International Democracy. Paul Robeson, Negro singer, who is Honorary Chairman of the Council on African Affairs, presided at the meeting. It is said he made the opening statement that the purpose of the conference was to consider the relation of the American people and their Government to the African peoples during the war and in the postwar period. In his statement he referred to the Soviet Government as an example of how sympathetic planning can transform a backward country into one of high social and political level. Dr. William J. Schiefflen, who is Vice Chairman of the organization, also spoke and stated that the Council on African Affairs was growing and that a larger program was being planned for the future. Max Yergan referred to the alleged struggle against Fascism and "forced labor" in Africa. He also referred to the necessity of determining the essential policies which will provide "for the general advancement of the African people toward achieving their proper place in the modern world community."
