

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



JACK L. CAIDIN, President, Empire Record Corporation, 2050 First Avenue, New York City, and a source of information, on January 7, 1955 telephonically advised that the subject had contacted him about making a phonograph record titled, Investigator.

CAIDIN had learned that the record was presently being made by Columbia on the Discuriosities label and was being distributed here by Dauntless Records, 225 Lafayette Street, New York City. CAIDIN said on January 10, 1955, that he had talked with SID FRY of the Dauntless Company and was told that Dauntless did not have sole rights to the record and that the company distributed Rights in this country supposedly are held by Radio Rarities, a "dummy" corporation headed by JOHN L. BUBBERS and WALTER T. COLQUIT. CAIDIN said he had learned that EDWARD R. MURROW of A Columbia was interested in the record.

On January 8, 1955, CAIDIN indicated that he wanted with the second advice as to whether or not he should make "The Investigator." The writer advised him that the decision would have to be his own, based on whatever business and personal reasons he might consider. CAIDIN said he did not wish to gain a reputation for dealing with such people and expressed, as he has on past. occasions, strong anti-Communist sentiments. The writer advised him that the fact of his cooperation with this Bureau would be made a matter of record. He also related that he had heard the record, "The Investigator," and that it is strongly anti-McCARTHY and is critical of Congressional investigations. [



Referenced Bureau letter to the Department advised that NY and Chicago have been instructed to follow this matter closely and to obtain additional details. The carbon copies for NY and Chicago bore notes to the respective SACs requesting that as much detail as possible

Similarly, any information coming to the New York Office in those cases for which copies of this letter are designated, should be reflected in suitable memorandum form for ultimate reporting to the Bureau.



As instructed in referenced Bureau letter to the Department, under note to SAC, NY, this matter will be treated in as much detail as possible without compromising any highly placed informants in an investigative report now being prepared at NY.

To bring this matter up to date, the following information has been received recently from NY 603-S\*:

On 3/3/55 FRANK SCHEINER (attorney, who, in the past, has performed services for UE) contacted JAMES MATLES (UE Director of Organization). SCHEINER told NATLES that he spoke to "the guy" and laid down the conditions, and that he (the guy) was not fazed but thought the conditions were principled ideas.

Later that same day, SCHEINER conferred again with MATLES. SCHETTER told MATLES that he talked to "him" a couple of days ago and gave him the three points. SCHRINER said "he" did not bat an eyelash and thought they (the three points) were principled. (It appears from this that SCHLINER and MATLES were discussing the same man on both occasions.) SCHEINER added that "he" visited NY by plane this afternoon and conferred with SCHEINER. SCHEINER asked "him" how it went. SCHEINER said "he" was told that "they" have no objection to the one (point) that they do not control entirely themselves. SCHEINER said "they can't guaranty". SCHEINER added that "they" raised the question as to who talks the terms and (they) asked if it would be possible to meet with someone below the absolute top level MATLLS said no, it has to be with the top and that the only alternative is to keep going the way they are at present. MATLES said the three points have to be reduced to writing before a meeting. SCHEINER said he would meet the man the following morning at ten a.m. MATLES and SCHEINLR agreed to meet the following ; morning at nine a.m. in SCHEINER's office.

On 3/7/55 MATLES told ALBERT FITZGERALD (UE President) that he just got word from two places that a complete report of the Board meeting (UE General Executive Board meeting) has been made to CAREY (JAMES B. CAREY, President of IUE) and now the IUE is sending "key guys" to meet with UE "key guys" telling them what DE MAIO (ERMEST DE MAIO, President of UE District 11 - Chicago, Illinois) said and what MC LEISH (JAMES MC LEISH, President of UE District 14 - Newark, N.J.) said, etc.





on 3/8/55 JAMES MC LEISH asked MATLES if he knew that he (MC LEISH) had met with the IUE on the previous day. MATLES said he knew nothing about it.

MC LEISH then told MATLES about telephone calls he had received the previous Thursday, March 3, 1955, from WHITEROCK and COLLINS of IUE who wanted to meet with him.

MC LEISH said he checked with "JULES and FITZ" (JULIUS EMSPAK, UE Secretary-Treasurer and ALBERT FITZGERALD, UE President) and they said go ahead. MC LEISH said he met with them for about five hours yesterday (Monday, March 7, 1955). He said CLIFF CAMERON (Business Manager of UE Local 1,75 - Brooklyn, NY) was with him. He said that the IUE was represented by WHITEROCK, CERNEY, COLLINS, MILLER and JENNY (all ph). (It is known that WHITEROCK and COLLINS are IUE officials of IUE District 4 with headquarters at Newark, N.J.)

MC LEISH said that the IUE guys related that they heard of the UE General Executive Board meeting and of the possibility that the UE was going to reconsider (merger with IUE) because of the CIO and AFL merger. MC LEISH told MATLES "they" are asking about fragmentation (taking UE locals one by one), and that he told them he would have no part of it. MC LEISH told them if they wanted UE to merge with the IUE, IUE would first have to quit playing around with congressional committies and second, they would have to stop raiding (the UE).

MATLES told MC LEISH that last week WHITEROCK contacted CAREY and that it was "put out" that MC LLISH was asking for a meeting with CAREY and said he would consider it. MATLES said the call was from WHITEROCK to CAREY. MATLES said that CAREY then contacted several key people throughout the country, advising that MC LEISH was seeking a meeting with CAREY and all that was mentioned was CAMERON and MC LEISH; no mention of MILLER. (This





MILLER is believed possibly identical with MATTHEW MILLER, former officer of UE Local 1,75 who quit the UE about 191,8, around the time of HOUA investigation into Communist infiltration of that local.)

On 3/15/55 FRANK SCHEINER advised MATLES that he had "completed my mission - very happy to talk to you - I got some phone numbers". SCHEINER said "he" could be reached right now at BA 7-7279 or at Union Hall, GR 5-3260 or Industry Joint Board, MU 5-7165. SCHEINER said his friend told him "this guy" is sympathetic about these things but pointed out his relationship with the international, especially BROUCH (ph) which is a matter of long standing. SCHEINER and MATLES both agreed "this guy" is very powerful. SCHEINER said "the guy" he saw was very friendly and helpful. (It appears that the person SCHEINER conferred with is a friend of his, and that these two were discussing still another person in an unknown union who is very powerful.)

Later that same day MATLES requested that SCHEINER call NOVAK for him. SCHEINER said he knows NOVAK very well and has never had any fights with him. MATLES wanted SCHEINER to find out if NOVAK is coming to town (NY), and if not, wants to find out if NOVAK can arrange for MITLES to see NOVAK's boss. MATLES feels NOVAK's boss will be afraid to see him and feels it would be important to talk with him to explore some angles; however, MATLES does not want to be in the position to have "the guy" (NOVAK's boss) say MATLES called him. MATLES requested that in contacting NOVAK by thephone, SCHEINER not use MATLES! name over the wire.

On 3/17/55 NY 603-S\* learned from ALBERT FITZGERALD that JAMES MATLES was on his way out to Chicago to fire "them" (those UE staff members involved in the International

Harvester Farm Equipment deal with UAW). FITZGERALD considered that it was nothing but an "unprincipled deal" and that it is no merger it is a concession.

On 3/17/55 JAMES MC LEISH told JULIUS EMSPAK that on the following day he would meet first in KINOY's office at ten a.m. and then in SCHEINER's office at two p.m. (ARTHUR KINOY, attorney, who has in the past rendered services to UE) On that same day FRANK SCHEINER conferred with JULIUS EMSPAK about meeting in his office, 401 Broadway, NYC, on the following morning. EMSPAK said he would be there at ten a.m. SCHEINER said he does not think there is anything there which EMSPAK would regard with disfavor. They agreed to discuss it at the meeting.

Later on 3/17/55 DAVID SCRIBBER (UE General Counsel) told JULIUS EMSPAR he had met with the third party. SCRIBNER said "he" (the third party) was chatting about a lot of things, and that "he" could not meet EMSPAR tonight. SCRIBNER said "he" suggested the first thing the following morning, and that "he" is of the opinion that it might be better for EMSPAR to make it alone. EMSPAR asked if SCRIBNER made a "touche". SCRIBNER said he thought so. EMSPAR asked if SCRIBNER developed any leads or any other possibility. SCRIBNER said none at all. EMSPAR said that was good as he had no intention of involving SCHIBNER.

The informent learned that FR.NK SCHEINER subsequently contacted JULIUS EMSPAK and both of them agreed to meet the following morning in SCHEINER's office at 401 Broadway, Room 810.

On 3/18/55 JULIUS EMEPAK told ALBERT FITZGERALD that contact had been made with "this fellow". EMEPAK

recalled that he had seen this fellow several weeks ago in a general approach, at which time the fellow agreed to see what he could do about it while keeping quiet and keeping in touch. EMSPAK said "this fellow" made his contact with another lawyer in NYC, not on the basis of negotiation but simply as a feeling cut kind of business. EMSPAK said as it stands right now "the guy who was sounded out" turned down "meeting with the three of them", but would consider meeting with FITZGERALD.

EMSPAK said that it is important that their position is "local by local" (that is, to take UE locals one by one). EMSPAK said as a result "our guy" (believed to be referring to JAMES MATLES) told them he will have nothing to do with that kind of discussion."

EMSPAK said that this fellow, who he saw this morning, stated that "our man here" (believed to be JAMES MATLES) had told him (the fellow) that MATLES called VAN ARSDALE of IBEW (International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers - AFL) and was told there was not much chance of doing anything at the present time.

EMSPAK told FITZGERALD that contacts were made with "this guy" (believed to be FRANK SCHEINER), as a gobetween, plus the one he made on his own with the guy in the IBEW. EMSPAK said he thinks there are possibilities which could lead to a variety of places or could develop into a good thing. He added that he thinks the most important thing is a common approach "by you and me".

FITZGERALD suggested coming in (to UE headquarters in NYC) carly on Monday morning, 3/21/55. EMSPAK countersuggested that since FITZGERALD is scheduled to be at the Sonotone Company (election campaign), White Plains, NY, at

5:30 p.m. on Monday and is scheduled to attend a staff meeting in Boston earlier that same Monday, FITZGER/LD should stop by EMSP/K's home in Tuckahoe, NY on his way down from Boston Monday afternoon before proceeding to White Plains. EMSP/K stated that he would not go into the office on Monday at all because he does not want to get into an argument (presumably with M-TLES); in that way he explained he would be in the house all day Monday. FITZGER/LD agreed to stop by EMSP/K's house Monday afternoon, 3/21/55.

On 3/22/55 JULIUS EMSPAK told JAMES MC LEISH that MATLES did just what was expected on his trip to the Midwest (fired the International Harvester Farm Equipment UE staff members). EMSPAK added, however, that "the thing is on its way" (Farm Equipment Workers secession is successful).

On 3/22/55 FR.NK SCHEINER told J.MES M.TLES that he received the call but it is no good. According to NY 603-S\*, MATLES appeared very much dejected. SCHEINER added that it (UE merger) was discussed and debated all morning, "and the answer was they couldn't see their way to do it. Everything else was all right, still anxious and all that; but that one point, they just couldn't go ahead with it". SCHEINER emphasized that "they are still very anxious to go ahead". MATLES indicated he would meet with SCHEINER (and presumably some others). He stated he would be tied up the following day but that he thought he could make it. According to NY 603-S\* SCHEINER and MATLES agreed that they should let it rest.

On 3/23/55 MORRIS KERSTEIN (Shop Chairman at University Loud Speaker, Inc., White Plains, NY - UE Local 430 Shop) told ALBERT FITZGERALD that he had talked

to "him" and that CAREY would be willing to talk to FITZGERALD if FITZGERALD would call CAREY. FITZGERALD indicated he would see about it. (It appears that KERSTEIN talked to an intermediary in the IUE concerning contact with CAREY and FITZGERALD.)

Information received on 3/23/55 concerning KERSTEIN was furnished to the Bureau by air-tel dated 3/24/55.

#### BACKGROUND AND PERSONAL HISTORY

The subject was born in New York City, September 29, 1920. He re-\
ceived a law degree from Columbia University in 1947. He is a member of the
law firm, Donner, Kinoy, and Perlin, 342 Madison Avenue, New York City.

The subject was married to SUSAN KNOPF of New York City in 1945, and since 1953 they have resided on Chestnut Hill Avenue, Norwalk, Connecticut. KINOY commutes daily to his law business in New York.

KINOY and his associate; FRANK JORIS DONNER, have over a period of years been in frequent contact on legal matters with New York State and National leaders of the Communist Party (CP). DONNER has acted as a defense attorney, assisted the defense, and has been consulted in cases involving leaders of the CP in various districts. DONNER, KINOY and PERLIN has represented the United Electrical, Radio, and Machine Workers of America, a union which was expelled from the CIO as Communist influenced. During the last two years this firm has received sizable checks from the "UE Defense Fund" account. For example, in July, 1957, \$7,000 and \$540; in September, 1957, \$3,000; in October, 1957, \$2,921.97; in November, 1957, \$540; and in December, \$1,368.76, and \$415.60.

KINOY's associate, FRANK DONNER, wrote a magazine article in April, 1954, in which he criticized the government's use of "Informers" and reportedly was assembling material on the same subject in 1956 for a book.

#### RECOMMENDATION

It is noted that on 8/20/58, \$25.00 was paid by the firm of Rabinowitz and Boudin to the Clerk of the Court of Appeals in order to prosecute the appeal. The record reflects residence address of ANDREW REMES as 862 Union Street, Apartment 1F, Brooklyn 15, New York City. Docket entries with regard to REMES are the same as those set out above for JAMES WEST, with the exception of the following:

2/24/58 - Duplicate copy of notice of appeal and clerk's statement of docket entries (this was done on 2/24/58, rather than 2/21/58 in the case of WEST).

Also, the order of the Court report of 9/5/58 contains the notation in the docket entries that permission had been granted to REMES to file his brief in typewritten form.

The record also reflects that REMES, on 8/15/58, submitted an affidavit in support of an application for leave to proceed "In Forma Pauperis" pursuant to Rule 26 of the Court of Appeals. REMES stated in part in this affidavit that he is unable to afford the cost incident to the present appeal. Further, he is presently employed in New York City; has take-home pay of about \$110.00 a week; is married and has two children, ages 2 and 3; and that his wife is not employed and must devote her full time to attending to the needs of their two small children. further declared in this affidavit that his weekly salary is his only source of income; that he owns no real property, no personal property other than his own furniture, clothing, etc., and does not own an automobile. He further stated he has no savings at all; that there is a family bank account in his wife's name, but this contains only enough to pay current expenses.

He further stated in this affidavit that during the course of the trial in this matter, he was unemployed and also required to live away from home during the period of the trial. He was also required to make frequent trips to Cleveland for court and consultation with counsel, as a result of which he incurred debts of about \$500.00, which remain unpaid at the present time, these debts being owed to friends and relatives.

REMES concludes his affidavit: "I am advised that two of the other defendants expect to present a printed appendix and it is probable that most, if not all, of the portions of the records which I would present to the court would be included in that appendix. I, therefore, request that I be permitted to proceed in forms pauperis and to file with the Clerk four typewritten copies of the brief, together with an appendix consisting of such portions of the record, if any, as are not included in the printed appendix which will be filed by Marie and Fred Haug."

#### Docket #13674, HYMAN LUMER, Appellant

The record with regard to HYMAN LUMER reflects that his attorney is VICTOR RABINOWITZ and his associate counsel is ANN F. GINGER. It is noted that on 8/20/58 \$25.00 was paid by the firm of Rabinowitz and Boudin to the Clerk of the Court of Appeals in order to prosecute the appeal. The record reflects the residence address of HYMAN LUMER as 903 East 123rd Street, Cleveland, Ohio.

"I am presently employed in New York City and have a take-home pay of slightly over \$70.00 a week. My wife is also employed, in Cleveland, and her take-home pay amounts to about \$60.00 a week. Out of this income we must not only maintain a residence in Cleveland, but meet additional expenses incident to my employment away from home. We have one unmarried son depending on us for support. He is 18 years old and is about to enter Brandeis University. His tuition is being met by a scholarship, but he is dependent upon us for all living expenses. Even if he is able to secure some employment at college (which at present is uncertain), we anticipate that by far the major portion of his expenses will have to be made by us.

"We own no real estate and have no bank accounts. We own no stocks or bonds, nor have we any savings. My wife owns a car which has virtually no market value, having been purchased some time ago for \$55.00.

"I have debts which amount to \$400.00, which were incurred during the past few years. In addition, I was required to borrow money to post bail in the District Court.

"The court is respectfully referred to the accompanying affidavit of Andrew Remes which sets forth the reasons why leave to proceed in forma pauperis will be necessary if I am to prosecute this appeal. The reasons set forth there with respect to Mr. Remes are equally applicable to me."

#### Docket #13675, SAM REED, Appellant

The record with regard to SAM REED reflects that his attorney is VICTOR RABINOWITZ and his associate counsel is ANN F. GINGER. On 8/20/58 \$25.00 was paid by the firm of Rabinowitz and Boudin to the Clerk of the Court of Appeals in order to prosecute the appeal. "Bail in the court below was borrowed from friends and will have to be repaid.

"As appears in the accompanying affidavit of Andrew Remes, the expenses which would be incurred for the printing of an appendix and brief herein would be beyond my ability to pay and none of my co-defendants is in any better position than I am financially. I therefore request that I be permitted to proceed in forma pauperis and to file with the Clerk four type-written copies of a brief, together with an appendix consisting of such portions of the record, if any, as are not included in the printed appendix which will be filed by Marie and Fred Haug."

#### Docket #13676, ERIC REINTHALER, Appellant

The record for REINTHALER reflects that he is being represented by the law firm Donner, Kinoy and Perlin, 342 Madison Avenue, New York 17, New York. 





The law firm of Donner, Kinoy and Perlin represents the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America and during the last three years this firm has received sizable checks from the UE "Defense Fund" account.

Regarding Frank Donner, New York T-2 advised on February 12, 1954, that Donner was a member of a secret Communist Party (CP) apparatus for government employees in Washington, D. C., during the period 1939 to 1942.

New York T-3 advised on January 15, 1954, that one Marshall Perlin was a member of the CP in 1947.

In February, 1950, New York T-4/advised that Arthur Kinoy was one of the petitioners in an Amicus Curiae Brief filed on February 6, 1950, by a number of attorneys with the Court of Appeals, Second Circuit, in connection with the appeal of the attorneys who represented the CP leaders in their trial in 1949.

The records of the Bureau of Special Services, New York City Police Department, as checked by Special Agent August J. Micek on May 12, 1954, reflect that Arthur Kinoy had signed a CP line statement opposing the appointment of former Attorney General Tom Clark to the Supreme Court.

On June 30, 1953, New York T-5 advised that the subject was a member of the New York chapter of the National Lawyers Guild.

On August 7, 1951, New York T-6 advised that Kinoy had been one of the attorneys representing the International Workers Order (IWO).

The IWO has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On October 11, 1950, New York T-7 advised that Kinoy had been invited to attend a meeting sponsored by the Civil Rights Congress (CRC).

The CRC has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On October 4, 1954, New York T-8 made available a circular regarding an October 28, 1954 "Salute To Attorneys", which was being held under the auspices of the New York Committee for Protection of Foreign Born at the Yugoslav American Hall, New York City. Subject's name was included as one of the 29 attorneys included on this circular.

New York T-9 advised that the New York Committee for Protection of Foreign Born was formed on February 27, 1954, to urge repeal of the Walter McCarran Law and promote public hearings on the Lehman-Celler Bill, defend the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, defend foreign born against "arrest without warrant, denial of bail, supervisory parole and harrassment" (relative to deportation proceeding).

The American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born has been designated by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The Yugoslav American Cooperative Home, Incorporated, has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.



Regarding Lillian Gates, New York T-ll advised on August 18, 1954, that issue number three, dated February 15, 1954, of "Legislative Bulletin", published by the Legislative Bureau, New York State Committee of the CP, listed Lillian Gates as Secretary, Legislative Bureau.

On September 28, 1956, New York T-12 advised that on that date Kinoy advised Steve Nelson that a motion had been received to remand Nelson's Smith Act case to the United States District Court for a hearing on the grounds that there was a serious reason to doubt the testimony of a United States Government witness.





UNITED ELECTRICAL, RADIO AND MACHINE WORKERS OF AMERICA

On December 20, 1955, the United States Department of Justice petitioned the Subversive Activities Control Board (SACE) for an order determining that the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America (UE) is a Communist infiltrated organization. The petition alleges that the UE was originally founded in Buffalo, New York, in March of 1936, under the name United Electrical and Radio Workers. Shortly thereafter, the name of the organization was changed to its present form. In 1949, the UE was expelled from the Congress of industrial Organizations on the ground that its policies and activities were consistently directed toward the achievement of the programs and purposes of the Communist Party of the United States of America. The petition further alleges that the UE, through its effective management, had been actively engaged in giving aid and support to Communist organizations, foreign Communist governments, and the world Communist movement at the time the petition was filed and during a three-year period prior thereto.

SACB hearings on UE commenced in New York, New York, on May 13, 1957. These hearings were indefinitely suspended by an order of the SACB on January 10, 1958.

The "Directory of National and International Labor Unions in the United States, 1957, United States Department of Labor Sulletin Number 1222" reflects that the UE advised the Department of Labor that in 1955-1956 it represented 100,000 members in 115 local unions.

The International Headquarters of UE is located at 11 East 51st Street, New York, New York, as of May 12, 1958.


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
