However, they do have a record of a DAVID GREENE, 64 Sheriff Street, New York City, Social Security Number 057-12-3377. This record indicates that he was born on April 3, 1922, in the United States, and his father was listed as having been born than the state of t

GREENE had been employed as a machine shop apprentice in the Rectifying Department on night shift. He listed TESSIE GREENE, 64 Sheriff Street, as the person to notify in case of emergency. The record indicated that GREENE was 5 feet 9 inches tall and weighed 180 pounds.

His references were M. TAIGMAN, 242 West 22nd Street, New York City, manufacturer of electrical clutches; F. MARINO, 19 Clinton Street, Brooklyn, New York, physics instructor; S. ZIRCLE, 303 Br. 14th Street, Brooklyn, New York, tool maker.

Under business experience, he listed the following: Eugene Limited, 100 Imlay Street, Brooklyn, New York, as a turret lathe operator, from April, 1941, to June 1941, laid off because of lack of material. Freeman Brothers, 733 Broadway, New York City, as a general machinist helper under Mr. I, FEIT, from November, 1940, to April, 1941, leaving of his own accord. At the Naborhood Electric Company, 27 East 22nd Street, New York City, as a general machinist helper under S. FREUND, unsteady work from 1937 until 1940 when he left to go with Freeman Brothers.




ASAC Whelan called from New York at 10:25 am. He said he had just gotten a call from 0. John Rogge, who said he has been retained to represent Greenglass. He wanted to know what charges are being placed against him and where he could see him and when. Whelan advised Rogge that the facts regarding Greenglass were presently being considered by the Department of Justice. Whelan said he would either call Rogge back, or if Rogge so desired, Greenglass was available and he could talk with him. Rogge haid that he would call back shortly.

Fr. Whelen stated that if Rogge comes to the New York Office, be planned to let him see and talk with Greenglass. I told him that this fas the proper procedure and that unless instructed to the contrary, he should follow this procedure.

At 10:30 am, Mr. Whelan advised that Rogge called and said he was sending his associate, Herbert J. Fabricant, to the New York Office to talk with Greenglass. He will be allowed to talk with Greenglass in the presence of Agents.

Mr. and Mrs. W. B. FREEHAN, 606 Ridge Place, Albuquerque, advised that they were the owners of the premises located at 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, and had been the owners of that premises since prior to January 1, 1945.

According to their memory, an apartment located on the second floor of that address was rented to DAVID and RUMA GREENGIASS on March 19, 1945, to March 9, 1946. They pointed out that they could not precisely fix these dates, but they were positive it was from some date in March, 1945, until March, 1946, and it was their opinion that it was on the dates above given. Mrs. FREEMAN produced two documents described as "Form D-35, Order Adjusting Maximum Rent, Concerning 209 N. High Street, Albuquerque, Apartment Number 4, Docket Number 5-A1-H-7196, "addressed to Mr. W. B. FREEMAN, 606 Ridge Place, Albuquerque, New Mexico; and a form bearing Budget Bureau Number 08-R 029-42, Form DD 7D, Landlord's copy, entitled, "United States of America, Office of Price Administration, Registration of Rental Dwellings," which showed on the reverse side of these documents the signature of RUTH GREENGIASS and fixing the period of occupancy from the period March, 1945, until March, 1946, without setting forth the specific dates of the occupancy other than stated.

Mr. and Mrs. W. B. FREEMAN advised they were only able to recall one visitor calling on the GREENGLASSES during this period of occupancy and although they could not fix the exact period or time of this visit, they expressed the opinion that it was during January, 1946. This individual whom they could not describe was believed to have called on a Sunday and stayed for Sunday dinner. It was pointed out by them that during 1945 and 1946, including the period of time of GREENGLASS! tenancy at this address, the FREEMANS were in residence at the address of 209 North High, occupying an apartment on the second floor in the front of the building. It was subsequent to the departure of the GREENGLASSES that they moved to their present address on Ridge Place.

They recalled that the GREENGLASSES had received packages from New York and that the GREENGLASSES had commented that they were packages of "Kosher food". It was recalled by Mrs.FREEMAN that the return address on these packages carried the name of the sender as having the last name of "PRINTZ."

Neither of the FREEMANS were able to recall the GREENGLASSES having been financially embarrassed or "flushed" financially during the period of their tenancy at the above address.

They were able to state that DAVID GREENGLASS was an enlisted man in the United States Army stationed at Los Alamos, New Mexico, and that he was in Albuquerque with his wife at the above address on week-ends. 10# 65-39

The wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, was recalled as having been employed in some capacity by the Office of Price Administration in Albuquerque, New Mexico. It was their recollection that she was employed in the "gas and tire rationing office" but no further details could be recalled.

Mrs. FREEMAN stated that prior to Christmas of 1944, her father, Mr. P. M. SHERER, was visiting them and living at the address, 209 N. High. According to her memory, her father left sometime during the middle of June, 1945, the precise date not being recalled. Mr. SHERER can presently be reached at 2400 West 23rd Street, Los Angeles, California, in care of Reverend HENRY SHERER, a Lutheran Minister in that city.

Mr. P. M. SHETER was described as having grey hair, being approximately 5.6" in height, weighing 140 pounds, having a slender build, and being approximately seventy-five years of age. Mrs. FREEMAN pointed out that her father, although seventy-five years of age, gave the appearance of a man some ten years younger. Mr. SHERER was further described as being a man with a fairly good memory but one who presently suffered from a heart condition and was being protected by the members of their family from any undue excitement.

Mr. FLETCHER BRUMIT, Resident Manager, Hilton Hotel, 'Albuquerque, produced a registration card for that hotel for "HARRY GOLD, 6923 Kindred Street, Philadelphia 24, Pennsylvania." The firm given was "TERRY AND SEIBERT" and the registration shows that the room was occupied by this individual from 12:36 P.M. to 8:00 A.M., June 3, 1945. Mr. BRUMIT pointed out that on the reverse side of this registration card appeared the date and time stamp of the hotel and that this date and time stamp showed the time as above stated, but the date as being June 4, 1945. He further informed that an examination of other registration cards for guests registering at that hotel on June 3, 1945, showed that the date stamp on these cards carried the date of June 4, 1945, as in the case of this particular card for GOLD. It was stated by BRUMIT that for some unknown reason on June 3 the automatic date and time stamp used by the hotel had set itself for June 4 instead of the correct date of June 3.

Mr. BRUMIT advised that in the event the records of this hotel were desired under subpress that one of the following would be the proper official to subpress:

H. O. BEASLEY, Auditor; MARK NEAL, Assistant Manager, in charge of Rooms Department; COBY BRIEHN, Executive Assistant Manager; or himself.

He requested that prior to the issuance of a subposem that he be contacted in order that he might determine which official would be available.

ROBERT S. POAGE, Cashier, Albuquerque National Bank, caused a search to be made of the records of that institution. There was produced the original ledger card for savings account Number 35169 in the name of RUTH GREENGLASS, 209 North High, which reads as follows:

The original ticket for each deposit and withdrawal was located.

Savings Department credit for Book #35169 dated June 4, 1945, shows a deposit of \$400 in "currency" on that date; the name set forth on this ticket is "RUTH GREENGLASS."

A deposit ticket for this account dated July 23, 1945, was located. It shows a check in the amount of \$55.40 was deposited to savings account #35169. A debit ticket for account #35169 dated September 4, 1945, was found wherein RUTH GREFIGIASS withdrew \$5500.40. (Should have been \$400.40.)

A savings withdrawal ticket showing a debit to the same account November 7, 1945, in the amount of \$15 was found with the name of RUTH GREENGLASS thereon. This debit shows a balance at that time of \$385.40.

A deposit ticket to the same account showing a deposit of 5 in "currency" was made in the name of DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS on November 9, 1945.

A deposit to this account consisting of 35 in "currency" was found under date of November 16, 1945.

A deposit in the amount of \$5 in "currency" to the same account under date of November 30, 1945, was found.

Savings withdrawal ticket dated January 29, 1946, for account number 35169 was found showing that \$\infty\$402 was withdrawn on that date from that account by RUTH GREENGLASS.

The signature card for savings account Number 35169 with the Albuquerque National Trust and Savings Bank, Albuquerque, New Mexico, setting forth an account in the name of RUTH and DAVID GREENGLASS was found. Thereon appears what purports to be the signature of "DAVID GREENGLASS" and "RUTH GREENGLASS" giving the address of "209 N. High St." with the notation introduced by "D.K." on "6-4-45." There is the further notation under data of the following "Torks at OPA, husband in Army."

Mr. POAGE advised that in the event the above records were desired for prosecutive purposes that he be contacted prior to the issuance of the Subperm Duces Tecum in order that at that time the proper bank official to be so served might be designated.

Mr. R. R. GAL USEA, Cashier, First National Bank, Albuquerque, New Mexico, caused a search to be made of the records of that institution and produced a ledger sheet in the name of "DAVID or RUTH GREENGLASS, 209 N. High, City", which reads as follows:

The following investigation was conducted by SA J. JERCHE

#### AT LOS ALAMOS, NEW MEXICO

The files of Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, reflect T-5 DAVID GREENGLASS, Army Serial Number 32882473, was at Los Alamos, New Mexico, as a member of the Special Engineers Detachment, United States Army, from about August, 1944, to February, 1946. A list dated August 31, 1944, showed that GREENGLASS was a member of Group E-5 at that time. Group E-5 was in the Ordnance Division, of which Captain WILLIAM S. PARSONS was the Division. Leader. Dr. GEORGE BOGDAN KISTIAKOWSKY was at that time a Group Leader of Group E-5. From September 30, 1944, to November 30, 1944, GREENGLASS was listed as a member of Group X-1. During that period, Dr. GEORGE BOGDAN KISTIAKOWSKY was the Division Leader of X-Division and Commander NORRIS E. BRADBURY was the Group Leader of Group X-1.

In January, 1945, GREENGLASS was listed as a member of Group X-4. Mr. E. A. LONG was the Group Leader of Group X-4 at that time. The files of T-1 reflected GREENGLASS was still in Group X-4 in May, 1945, but these files contained no list of servicemen by groups, subsequent to June, 1945.

The files of T-1 contained a Vocational and Educational Sheet dated August 7, 1944, signed by GREENGLASS which reflected he had been in the Military Service one and one-half years. He listed his previous stations as M O P, Mississippi, three months; Pomona, California, three months; Fort Ord, California, five months; and Aberdeen, Maryland, four months. He listed his present civilian address as 266 Stanton Street, New York, New York, and his home telephone number as GR 7-4649. GREENGLASS listed the following former employment:

1937 to 1940, neighborhood electric (vacation and after school)
October, 1940, to June, 1941, FREEMAN BROTHERS, 8th St. and Broadway, New York, New York;
June, 1941, to October, 1941, INT, Tel. and Tel., Varick and Spring Street, New York, New York;
October, 1941, to April, 1943, PEERLESS LABORATORIES, 115
East 23rd Street, New York, New York.

After the question "What forms of employment or work do you consider yourself best qualified for?" GREENGLASS stated, "I have had various machinist and mechanical electrical job which I feel that I am capable of doing. I have done drafting, and have a good education in machining and have had good electro mechanical experience which included mach. shop and building of X-Ray equip."

GREENGLASS listed his hobby as "designed model airplanes."

He stated he was a member of the United Elec. Radio Machine Workers of America,
CIO. He stated he attended Brooklyn Polytechnic from 1940 to June, 1940, for

one semester. He stated he had attended the Haaren Aviation Tech. High School. He indicated he could speak the Yiddish language and that he had an aunt living in Poland.

GREENGLASS listed the following references:

NORMAN BROWN, 79 Lewis Street, New York City, shipyard, known ten years;

MORRES BAUM, 40 Marcy Pl., Bronx, New York, salesman, known ten years;

SAMUELY RUED, care Mr. B. GREENGLASS, 64 Sheriff Street, New York City;

MORRISS RUDMAN, care MARKOWITZ, 73 Willett Street, New York City, machinist, known ten years;

Pvt. DAUE RICK, Company A, 150 M.T. Bn., 36 MT Regit., T. Lewis, Wash., Ordnance, known ten years.

Mrs. LILLIAN ANDREWS, Secretary in GMX Division, Los Alamos, New Mexico, made available records of the Division formerly known as X-Division, which are presently maintained in the files of the Central Mail and Records Section, Los Alamos, Scientific Laboratory, Los Alamos, New Mexico. These files reflected that the name of T-5 DAVID GREENGLASS appeared on a list of members of Group X-4 which was undated but which was probably made in January, 1945, which listed GREENGLASS as a machinist, semi-skilled.

An undated list of the functions of the X-4 Service Section showed JOHN P. FITZPATRICK as the Section Leader. This list showed that one part of this section was called "Student Shop." The following individuals were listed as members of this sul-section:

T-3 H. HOLIND, in charge T-4 C. SCHROTDER, alternate T-5 C.COMRAD, machinist T-5 D. GREENGLASS, machinist T-5 W. SIMERALL, machinist Cpl. J. BRANDT, machinist.

The functions of the student shop were shown as "to maintain shop equipment for use of members of X-Division to make miscellaneous expeitems; to do experimental work on large jobs before final design is made for large orders."

These files also contained a letter prepared for the signature of Dr. J. R. OPPENHEIMER, the Laboratory Director, dated October 1, 1945, acknowledging the contribution of T-4 DAVID GREENGLASS. This letter read in part as follows:

AC# 65-39

"According to your Group Leader, you have served with this project since August 8, 1944. You have worked very efficiently in a small experimental engineering shop as a machinist, assisting in working out design details in various mechanisms before production. Your broad knowledge of machine tools was a great help in planning tooling set-ups on production, and in ironing out design troubles in pilot models."

Similar letters were written for all military personnel at Los Alamos.

The records of the old X-Division at Los Alamos indicate that during the summer of 1945, the X-4 Service Section was transferred from Group X-4 and placed directly under the X-Division Office. JOHN P. FITZPATRICK was the Section Leader of the X-Service Section. GREENGLASS was listed as a member of the X-Service Section on January 31, 1946. His name appeared on no subsequent list of the members of this section.

Sometime during the Fall of 1945, JOHN FITZPATRICK was transformed from the X-Service Section and Sergeant HARRY BEACH became the Section Leaders

The following description of DAVID GREENGLASS was obtained from the Vocational and Educational Sheets completed by GREENGLASS in about August, 1944:

Upon the authority of Assistant United States Attorney MAURICE SANCHEZ, Albuquerque, New Mexico, Special Agent J.JEROME MAXWELL filed the following complaint before United States Commissioner OWEN J. MCWREY at Albuquerque, New Mexico, at 9:36 A.M., June 16, 1950. The warrant was signed at 9:37 A.M., June 16, 1950. The complaint is as follows:

"Before me, the undersigned, a United States Commissioner, in and for the District of New Mexico, upon this 16th day of June, 1950, personally appeared J. JEROME MAXWELL, Special Agent, Federal Bureau of Investigation, and first being duly sworn, deposes and says:

"That from on or about January 1, 1945, and continuously thereafter for a considerable period, the exact period ' being to deponent unknown in the District of New Mexico; and within the jurisdiction of this Court and elsewhere, DAVID GREENGLASS, the defendant herein, did, the United States then and being at war, conspire, combine, confederate and agree with HARRY BOID and ANATOLI A TAKOVLEV, alias violate sub-section (A) of Section 32, Title 50; United States Code, in that they did conspire, combine, confederate and agree, with intent and reason to believe that it would be used to the advantage of a foreign nation, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, to communicate, deliver and transmit and attempt to communicate, deliver and transmit to a foreign government, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and representatives and agents thereof, directly and indirectly, documents, writings, sketches, notes and information relating to the National Defense of the United States, to wit, documents, writings, sketches, notes and information relating to Atomic Energy and nuclear fission.

"Pursuant to the said conspiracy and to effect the objects' thereof, the defendant and other conspirators, did commit, among others, the following overtact:

"1. In or about the month of June or July, 1945, the exact date being to deponent unknown at Albuquerque in the District of New Mexico, the defendant, DAVID GREENGLASS, met and conferred with HARRY GOLD and at that time delivered to said HARRY GOLD information relating to the National Defense of the United States.

"In violation Section 34, Title 50, United States Code (1946 edition)."



Assistant United States Attorney MAURICE SANCHEZ recommended bond of \$100,000 and such bond was fixed at that figure by the United States Commissioner, Albuquerque.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that according to the Los Alamos Technical History, in August, 1944, Group E-5 was in the Ordnance Division, of which Captain WILLIAM S. PARSON was the Division Leader. Group E-5 was known as the "implosion experimental" Group. Mr. GEORGE BOGDAN KISTLAKOWSKY was in charge of one section of the Ordnance Division and was also the Group Leader of Group E-5. In August, 1944, the explosives or X-Division was organized with KISTIAKOWSKY as the Division Leader. Group X-1 of that Division was under the direction of Commander NORRIS E. BRADBURY.

Group X-4 was created in October, 1944, under E. A. LONG and J. W. STOUT. This group was charged with engineering of molds for "S" Site, research on sintered and plastic bonded explosives and miscellaneous services for the Division. A section was added to this group in December, 1944, under W. G. MARLEY, responsible for some aspects of lens research.

T-2 made available progress reports for the pertinent period which reflected that in July and August, 1944, Group E-5 was headed by G. B. RISTIANCWSKY and that the major portion of efforts of that group during these months was devoted to the "study of symmetry of collapse and of the methods for its improvement."

Although it is not clear from the progress reports, it appears that the work performed and most of the personnel of Group E-5 were transferred to X-Division and more specifically to Group X-1 in August or September, 1944.

The progress reports of Group X-1 reflected that that group was under the leadership of Commander NORRIS E. BRADBURY and that during the period GREENGLASS was a member of Group X-1, that is from about September, 1944, to December, 1944, the group was working on "implosion research."

The work of Group X-1 was summarized for this period as follows:

"The investigation of experimental implosion group (X-1) is continued to be directed along three major lines. These are (1) The designs and use of explosive lenses; (2) The study of non-lens spherical and cylindrical implosions; (3) Improvements in instrumental technique."

T-2 stated that, according to the records of the Document Division, Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory, GREENGLASS had no card indicating that he had been given access to classified documents while at Los Alamos. He stated that no notebook had been charged out to GREENGLASS for use in his work

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and that no scientific papers had been retained by him while at Los Alamos.

By teletype dated June 2, 1950, the Philadelphia Office advised that GOLD had stated that he had the impression that the unknown subject that he had contacted in Albuquerque was somewhat naive in that he suggested that GOLD recruit another individual who was assigned to the same section of Los Alamos as was the unknown subject. GOLD stated that the person mentioned was a Corporal who had recently been broken.

In this connection, it was noted that a list of Group X-4 personnel in June,1945, showed only one member of this Group who was a Corporal. This individual was Corporal JOHN FRANCIS BRANDT, Army Serial Number 35009331. The records of T-1 reflected that BRANDT came to Los Alamos in about March, 1915, and that he was a Corporal at that time. The date that BRANDT was transferred from Los Alamos was not shown. The investigation conducted concerning BRANDT at the time he came to Los Alamos uncovered no unfavorable information, concerning him. The following description of BRANDT was obtained from the files of T-1:

Files of T-1 reflected that a report from the military authorities at Los Alamos reflected that two men had been reduced in grade in May, 1945. These two men were listed as T-5 CARL J.SETZER JR., ASN 15308262, who was reduced to Private and T-3 BENJAMIN BEDERSON, ASN 32505267, who was reduced to Private.

The files of T-1 reflect that CARL JOHN SETZER JR. was a member of Group CM-5 in May and June, 1945. An investigation concerning SETZER at the time he came to the Los Alamos Project reflected no unfavorable information. The following description of SETZER was obtained from the files of T-1:

The files of T-1 reflected that BENJAMIN BEDERSON was a member of the Special Engineers Detachment, United States Army, Los Alamos, New Mexico, from about March, 1964, to February, 1966, In August, 1964, he was assigned to Group E-9 and during the latter part of 1964, was assigned to Group X-2. In the Spring of 1965, he was assigned to Group X-5.

The files of T-1 further reflected that EMJAMIN DEDERSON was been Nevember 15, 1921, at New York, New York. His father, ABRAMAN MICHAEL DEDERSON, and his mother, LENA WAXLOWSKY BELFRSON, were both bern in Russia. In a Vocational and Education sheet dated March 25, 1944, BEDERSON stated that he had been a member of the International Workers Order from 1935 to 1939. He also stated that he had visited Russia from November, 1932 to May, 1933. He added the following statement:

"Father went to work (established large cafeteria in Moscow factory)."

He stated that his father's relatives lived in Minsk and his mother's relatives lived in Kiev prior to the Invasion.

An investigation concerning BEDERSON in June, 1944, in connection with his employment at Los Alamos reflected that the files of the United States Civil Service Commission indicated that subject's father, ABRAHAM BEDERSON and his mother, LENY BEDERSON, were registered Communists for the years 1936 and 1937 in the Sixth Assembly District, 125th Election District, Bronx County. His mother signed a Communist nominating petition for ISIDORE BEGUN on August 10, 1939, Sixth Assembly District, 130th Election District, Bronx County. A reference listed by BEDERSON, one PAUL ABRAHAMSON, 2714 Wallace Avenue, Bronx, New York, was found to be the son of LENY ABRAHAMSON, who signed a Communist Party nominating petition for ISRAEL AMPTER on July 8, 1942.

Mr. MICHAEL KARABIN, Superintendent of the building in which BEDERSON formerly resided, stated that BENJAMIN BEDERSON was not a Communist

but that his parents were Communists.

References on his Vocational and Educational Sheet were: PAUL ABRAH MISON, 27th Wallace Avenue, Bronx, New York, Inspector, Signal Corps, known five years;

JOSEPH DERMAN, 3205 (Street not legible), Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Inspector, Signal Corps, known two and one-half years;

STANLE FISHMAN, 124 West Ninth Avenue, Columbus, Ohio, Inspector, U. S. Navy, known five years;

Corporal JOSEPH H KATZ, address illegible;

TEMMETH WINNICK, 3604 Bx. Boulevard, Bronx, New York.

The files of T-1 further reflected that under date of May 11, 1944, PFC IRVING RASCHMOLKA and T-4 BENJAMIN LEDERSON wrote the following letter to the Surgeon General, War Department:

"In these critical times, when all of we Americans are united in fighting the evils of Fascism and Fascist Doctrines, we take time out just long enough to inquire whether or not you are carrying out one of Hitler's (and Fascism's) Doctrines in segregating the blood plasma of Negroes and whites? And are you requiring that the American Red Cross, which recruits and procures the blood plasma, does not carry out this policy of segregation?"

By letter dated May 27, 1944, F. N. SCHVARTZ, Major, Medical Administration Corps, Blood Plasma Branch, Surgery Division, advised BEDEREON and SCHMOLKA that although there was no scientific basis for the practice of plasma segregation, there are other factors which must be considered. SCHWARTZ stated that many whites would object to have Negro blood injected into their veins and that although this objection might be the results of prejudice and ignorance, it nevertheless exists.

By letter dated June 5, 1944, they again wrote to SCHWARTZ in part as follows:

We wish to thank you for a very interesting answer, and the frank explanation which you were so kind to give us. Since it is so unusual, we ask your permission to make it available for public consumption by releasing it to the Press.

"This is not to be taken as an indication that we agree with the contents of your letter, and subscribe to the belief expressed!"

By letter dated June 12, 19hh, SCHWARTZ declined permission for the above mentioned letters to be released to the Press.

The file contained a copy of another letter from SCHMOLKA at Camp Beale, California. which was probably addressed to the Bureau of Public Relations, War Department, although the copy of the letter does not indicate to whom it was addressed. This letter read as follows:

"I hereby request permission to make available for public consumption, the enclosed two letters, as well as a third. This letter is dated 21 May 1944, and addressed to the Surgeon General's Office. It merely asks why the U.S. Army practices segregation of Negro and white blood plasma.

"I believe that publication of these letters, together with my opinions on the subject might do much to get the Surgeon General's Office to discontinue its Hitler-like doctrine of segregation. This would do much to prove that we are really fighting a war for democracy - in dees as well as in theories."

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that the progress report there for Group X-5 in May, 1945, reflected that L. FUEEL JR. was the Group Leader of Group X-5 and that the Group was doing work on "descripting compits."

It is pointed out that GREENGLASS suggested to GOLD that GOLD stated to recruit a member of his Section at Los Alamos in June, 1945, and that GOLD stated that this man had recently been broken. BEDERSON was reduced from Grade T-3 to Private in May, 1945. BEDERSON was never a member of the same group as GOLD at Los Alamos but was a member of the same Divisions.

The files of Confidential Informant T-1 were thoroughly searched by SA JEROME J.MAXWELL and no photograph could be located for either DAVID GREENGLASS or BENJAMIN BEDERSON.

By letter dated April 18, 1950, the Saint Louis Office advised that Army Service Records reflected that BENJAMIN BEDERSON, ARmy Serial Number 32505267, was on furlough on the following dates:







Special Agent Richard L. Brennan, Philadelphia Office, advised as follows concerning information furnished by Harry Gold in re eaptioned cames

Gold had only one meeting with the unknown subject, a corporal or sergeant probably assigned to Los Alamos,

Prior to making his first trip to Santa Fe in June, 1945, Gold met Nohn in a bar, he thinks, on Third Avenue, New York City. John gave him a slip of paper containing the address and name of an individual and an envelope containing \$500 for this individual, telling Gold to contact him while in Santa Fe but not to let that assignment interfere in any way with his contacting Fuchs. Gold did see Fuchs in Sants Fe, then returned to Albuquerque and tried to contact the individual whose name and address he had. No one was at the address, so Gold stayed overnight, and made the contact mext morning, learning for the first time that unknown subject was a United States soldier. Gold thinks he met the unknown subject that morning and again that afternoon and believes the information given to him pertained to the physical setup of the installation at Los Alamos. The soldier expected the money.

Gold passed the information reserved on to John on his return to New Yorke

Gold cannot recall the unknown subject's name. He describes him as young, not over 25, dark curly hair, light colored eyes (maybe brown), snub nose, square jaw, about 5'7", 180 pounds, goed regular teeth, broad mouth, tanned complexion, a rather engaging appearance, possibly a machinist er draftsman with some training in physics, a New Yorker by birth with a definite Bronx or Brooklym accemt, believed to be Jewish. He hadm't been married long, his wife was a recent arrival there and they had no children. Unknown subject had a Christmas furlough in 1945. Unknown subject's wife is recalled very vaguely at as about 5.5" and "possessed with normal good looks." RECORDED. 165-59028-97

Gold says he can identify unknowled bull 10050 residence in Albuquerque if shown maps or motion pictures. He regalls that it is on a side street off the main street, describing "main" street as that on which the Hotel Hilton is located. Leaving the Hotel Hilton, says Gold, malk past the Santa Fe Railroad tracks, continuing on this "main" street five to eight

blocks, turn left to the first, second, or third house. The unknown subject's residence had a brick cement foundation and on top of that brown clapboards three feet high. The front of the house has an enclosed porch of glass or screening or both. The sidewalk leading to the house is narrow as is the street itself. In front of the house is a lawn about twelve feet deep. Unknown subject lived on the third floor, the stairway leading to his apartment leading directly up from the enclosed porch.

Special Agent T. Scott Miller suggests reviewing Bureau files on Theodore Hall, the subject of an espionage case who was at one time in Los Alamos.

Enclosed herewith to Philadelphia will be found the only available photograph of the house at 209 North High, Albuquerque, New Mexico, during the year 1945.

For the assistance of the Philadelphia Office it will be observed that six people are standing on what appears to be the front steps of this building. In the photograph enclosed it will be observed that to the left of these individuals is a window. To the right of this group of individuals will be found the former entrance to the building. This constitutes a view of the southeast corner of the building in question.

The building in its present condition varies from that reflected in the photograph as follows: The window above described has now been remodeled to become the entrance to the building and a form of step has been constructed beneath what is now the window. The porch, a portion of which appears to the right of the group in this photograph, has now been enclosed, has a stucco finish and only the lower two steps appear in the present condition of the house.

By separate letter Philadelphia has been provided with movie film of this house in its present condition. The above will assist the Philadelphia Office in identifying the house in question on the movie film.

No identifying marks have been placed upon the enclosed photograph for the assistance of the Philadelphia Office in exhibiting it to the informant. Schedler called at [12:50 p.m., stating that he had gotten word from Whearty that he had a release prepared in the typewriter and that Peyton Ford had instructed that Mr. Hoover's name be put in the release. He stated that he had told Peyton of my discussion with him and that he was doing the decent thing by letting me know. I told him that the Director's name was not to be put into the release and I wished to lodge a formal and vigorous protest against the Director's name being put in the release, that this was against his wishes and contrary to his order and that I thought they had no right to quote him without his permission. He stated that he had his orders and there was nothing else to be done. I told him that I would check to see if the Director was still here and if so I would ask him. I called Schedler back in a few minutes and told him that the Director had gone out, that I could not give approval for the use of the Director's name without the Director's consent and I wished to ledge a vigorous protest egainst the use of the Director's name pursuant to his instruction. I think the attacked memo might be in order.



Mr. Schedler called Mr. McGuire earlier this
morning and stated that he had just had a call from Whearty
regarding the development of the Greenglass case and Mr.
Ladd had told him that probably there would not be any action for approximately an hour. He wanted to come right on eround to get some data, stating that he was in the same position he was in last night. Mr. McGuire told him that he had some people with him which was a fact.

I called Schedler back shortly after 11:00 a.m. Schedler told me that he needed some basic information to get up a release and that he had the press people standing by. I told Schedler that in view of Peyton Ford's conversation with me last evening, we had decided we would not put out a press release in Vashington as far as the Bureau is concerned. He asked where that left him. I told him that it left him with the fact that we were not going to send a release around. He stated that if he could just get Greenglass' name, age and a little personal background, he could get up a two or three paragraph release and attach it to a copy of the complaint. I told him that we were not being a party to any press release in Vashington. The conversation terminated.

Shortly thereafter he called back. I was on the phone at the time and returned his call at approximately 11:45 a.m. He stated that he found himself in a powerless position and that it was certain that he could not or would not or had no desire to overrule either the Bureau or the Director but that he thought his position was untenable, that he had nothing to say to the press. I previously told him that the press could get the details at the Commissioner's hearing. He said that, of course, he could not tell the press that. In our latest conversation, he stated that he could, of course, go down to Whearty is office and get a few details from the Bureau's memo but that would also be voerruling the Bureau. I told him that that was the Department's memo, the Bureau had sent it to the Department and he could do as he wished. He stated that he did not want to do anything which the Director would not approve of. I told him that the Director was concerned only with the Bureau and that, of course, he could do as he wished but that we were not sending around a press

He stated that he couldn't understand Ford's criticism of him last night. told him quite frankly I had told Ford that I resented the criticism directed at the Bureau and me personally and that I also told Ford that I did not see where he could criticize Schedler for doing what Schedler and his predecessors had been doing for the past 15 years, that it just didn't make sense. I further told Schedler that the only thing that I could conclude with was that somebody didn't want Mr. Hoover's name in the newspapers and if that were the case, we would see to it that this did not happen. He asked what I thought shout his getting up a press release based upon the Bureau's memo. I told him that that was the Department's meno and he could do as he wished. He didn't want Mr. Hoover to get mad at him. I told him that Mr. Hoover would not get mad with him for doing his duty, that I would talk to the Director about this but that certainly he was not authorized and could not use Mr. Hoover's name in the press release. Shortly after 10:00 am today, Mr. Ladd, Supervisor Lamphere and Mr. Belmont conferred with Mr. James McInerney, Mr. Raymond P. Whearty, and Mr. George Kneip, of the Department, concerning the case of David Greenglass. At the start of the conference, Mr. McInerney was unavailable; however, he came in shortly after the conference started.

The memorandum to the Attorney General dated June 16, setting forth the background and available information concerning David Greenglass was furnished to the Department. After a study of this information, Mr. Whearty advised that the Department would authorise prosecution against Greenglass under Section 34 of Title 50 charging conspiracy to violate Section 32 a of Title 50 USC.

Mr. Whearty was of the opinion that venue would most clearly lie in the Federal District of New Mexico, inasmuch as the passing of the information from David Greenglass to Harry Gold occurred at Albuquerque. Mr. Whearty was orally advised that Greenglass had been allowed to call his home last night and again this morning, as a result of which, attorney 0. John Rogge had called the New York Office this morning to state that he represented Greenglass and was sending Mr. Fabricant, a representative of his firm to the New York Office to interview Greenglass. Mr. Whearty was advised that arrangements were being made for Fabricant to interview Greenglass.

In view of the interest of Mr. Rogge in this matter, Mr. Whearty immediately called U. S. Attorney Saypol, SENY, and requested him to be alert for any action on the part of Rogge to secure a writ for the release of Greenglass, although Greenglass as yet has not been placed in custody. Mr. Whearty advised Mr. Saypol very briefly of the fact that a complaint was to be filed in Albuquerque against Greenglass and based on the warrant to be issued, Greenglass would be apprehended in New York. Mr. Whearty told Mr. Saypol there was to be no publicity prior to the arrest.

In view of the fact that it was only 8:00 am in New Mexico at this time, Wr. Whearty also spoke to U. S. Attorney T. Vincent Keough, EDNY, to advise him of the same facts and that the Department was authorizing process in Albuquerque, but that if Attorney Rogge attempted to get a writ, it might be necessary to file a complaint immediately in the Eastern District of New York. Mr. Keough was advised by Mr. Whearty that this matter should be kept confidential and no publicity should in MNChesimand in the arrest.

Mr. Whearty then called Assistant U. S. Attorney Sanches at Albuquerque, New Mexico, and advised him that the Department was authorizing process in the Federal District of New Mexico. He requested that Sanches immediately contact SAC Wyly, who would have the necessary facts to draw up the complaint. He advised Sanches that Greenglass was in New York and would be apprehended on the basis of the warrant to be issued in Albuquerque.

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#### MEMORANDUM FOR MR. LADD

Prior to the calls to the above United States Attorneys, Mr. Whearty and Mr. Kneip drew up the complaint against Greenglass. A copy is attached. Immediately on the completion of the drawing up of the complaint, both the New York Office and the Albuquerque Office were telephonically furnished the exact wording of the complaint. SAC Wyly was advised to take the matter up immediately with Mr. Sanches and to have an Agent appear before the United States Commissioner, and to advise the Bureau telephonically the moment the warrant was issued.

The New York Office was advised to be prepared to arraign Greenglass immediately upon receipt of word that the warrant had been issued.

For record purposes, prior to authorization of prosecution by the Department, the above Department representatives were advised, as set forth in memorandum to the Attorney General, that the interview with Greenglass first started at 1:46 pm, June 15, at his apartment, that he accompanied Agents to the office at 5:25 pm on a voluntary basis, and signed a statement commercing his activities at 1:06 am on June 16. Thereafter, he slept in the murse's quarters at the New York Office. He called his brother-in-law on the night of June 15, and again called his family on the morning of June 16. The Department was advised that Greenglass had not been arrested, but neither had he furnished a written consent to stay with the Agents overnight.

Mr. McInerney inquired as to what action the Bureau was taking concerning Julius Rosenberg. He was advised that Rosenberg is presently being questioned at the New York Office on a voluntary basis.

Mr. Whearty inquired whether we had taken steps to interview Buth Greenglass. He was advised that she is in a hospital in New York undergoing treatment for an infection resulting from a severe burn some months ago and that consequently we had not interviewed her as yet this morning. His advice was sought as to whether, under the circumstances, the Bureau should seek to interview Ruth Greenglass. He and Mr. Kneip were both of the opinion that Buth Greenglass should be interviewed at once, if possible. Instructions were telephonically furnished to the New York Office to contact the doctor treating Buth Greenglass and hospital authorities to determine her condition, and if her condition was such to permit interview, instructions were given to interview her immediately.

At 12:39 pm, Mr. Carlton, of the Albuquerque Office, called to advise that the complaint had been filed at 9:36 am (Ibuquerque time (12:36 pm, Washington time) and the warrant issued immediately thereafter. The complaint was signed by Special Agent J. Jerome Maxwell before U. S. Commissioner Owen J. Mowrey. Bond was set at \$100,000 upon the recommendation of the U. S. Attorney, following recommendation by the Department for this amount. Bond is returnable forthwith at Albuquerque. Certified copies of the papers are being forwarded air mail special delivery to the U. S. Attorney at the SDMY. This information was immediately furnished to ASAC Whelan at New York with instructions that Greenglass be arraigned at once.

#### MEMORANDUM FOR MR. LADD

It is noted that Mr. Whearty called while the call from the Albuquerque Office was in process to advise that AUSA Sanches had informed that the complaint had been filed and the warrant issued.

At 1:07 pm, ASAC Whelen advised that U. S. Attorney Saypol had informed him that O. John Rogge would not be available for the arraignment until 1:30 pm. Therefore, the arraignment will take place at that time. Mr. Whelen will advise at once when the arraignment has taken place.

Relative to Ruth Greenglass and Julius Rosenberg, Mr. McInerney and the other Department representatives were of the opinion that process should not be issued at this time on the basis of the statement of Greenglass alone. They requested that the Department be kept advised of any developments resulting from the interviews of these individuals. They were told they would be kept advised.


At 2:05 pm, ASAC Whelan advised that the subject had been arraigned before U. S. Commissioner Edward W. McDonald, SDNY. Bail was set at \$100,000 and Greenglass was remended to the custody of the marshal until hearing scheduled for June 23, 1950. Attorney Rogge made a plea for bail in the amount of \$5,000, stating that hysteria is gripping the country; that figures mean nothing under these conditions; and that \$100,000 in reality means denying bail to the defendant and thus violating his Constitutional rights. Both the U. S. Attorney and the U. S. Commissioner disagreed with him and bail was set at \$100,000.



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#### THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

On June 15, 1950, Marry field made a positive identification of Grounglass from photographs which were shown to him.

Bavid Grounglass, who was born March 5, 1925, in Now York City, was industed into the United States Army on April 5, 1945, and entered active duty on April 12, 1945, at Fort Dix, Now Jersey. During July, 1944, he was transforred to the First Provisional Special Engineer Detachment Unit, Manhatan District, Oak Ridge, arriving on July 27, 1944. He departed from Oak Ridge on August 3, 1944, and joined the Second Provisional SED Unit apparently became Munice, on August 5, 1944. The Second Provisional SED Unit apparently became a part of the Santa Fo Detachment, 9012 TSU-CR, Manhattan Mistrict, Santa Fo, on November 26, 1946. On February 20, 1946, Grounglass was transferred from this assignment to the Separation Center at Fort Bliss, Towns, and was discharged on February 20, 1946. The recerts in Les Alemes reflect that Grounglass worked on highly confidential material in connection with atomic energy research.

On or about November 29, 1944, my wife, Enth, arrived in New Hexico from Now Tork City and told so that Julius Resemberg, my brother-in-law, had " acked if I would give information on the atom bomb and stated as a reason for that that we are at war with Germany and Japan and that they are the energy and that Soviet Russia was fighting the energy and was entitled to the information. On that besis, I agreed to give whatever information can to me in the course of my employment at Lea Linnes, New Mexico, at the Los Alemos Abus Boob Project. This message, which my wife conveyed to me, was not her own idea but was on idea given to her by Julius Peremberg. The told me at the time that a man would contact me later for information about the Lee Alence Aton Book Project. About Pobracry, 1948, my wife nevel to Albuquerque, New Mexico, from Mer York City. Three or four months later she had a miscorpiage. Approximately a month after that time, a man sens to the place where Euth was living, 200 Borth High Street, Albuquerque, But Musico. I did not know this man's some at the time but recently recognised his pistures is various newspapers as being Marry Cold. He had with him a term or out place of paper eard which fitted a term piece of paper eard furnished no as a means of identifying this name. On the evening of June 15, 1860, Marry Sold made the following metation on a photograph of David Greenglass, "This is the men I contacted in Albuquerque, Now Mexico in June, 1948, on instructions from my Soviet esplaints superior 'John.' The man in the picture gave me information polative to his work at Las Alamas, Now Mexico which information I latter gave to 'John.'" At 1:10 AM on June 16, 1980, Greenglass wrote the following on the book of the photograph of Marry Sold, "This is the picture of the man who was the recipions of my information at Alb," Signed "Savid Greenglass."

Oreenglass telephonically requested Mr. Louis Abel, his brother-inler, to obtain for him the atterney, 0. John Regge, and told Mr. Abel that he was at the FDI Office. David Grounglass was put to bed in the Barne's Office at the FBI Office, United States Court Mone, Poley Square, New York Sity, at 1:40 AM on June 16, 1950.

In connection with Cold's contact with Grounglass in June, 1945, investigation has reflected that a sevings account was opened in the names of path and movid Grounglass, 200 North Migh Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico, es June 4, 1945, with a \$400 deposit in currency. It will, of course, be necessary to issue a subposum for the bank recerts prior to the public disclosure of this information.

Prem the ferogoing it would appear that Bavid Groonglass, his wife, Buth Groonglass, and his brother-in-law, Julius Resemberg, have compired to violate the Mar Time Repienage Statute. It would appear insofar as venue is concerned regarding David Groonglass, that it would lie in the Judicial District of New Mexico.

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



Dear Mr. Grantham:

Reference is made to the above case in which at the Department's request you filed a complaint on June 16, 1950.

The removal preceedings in the Southern District of New York have been set for June 23, 1950. One adjournment of ten days to two weeks undoubtedly can be obtained, in addition to which a further adjournment for a like period is possible. Since the Department is extremely interested to avoid a preliminary hearing which will entil any disclosure of the Government's evidence, it follows that an indictment must be produced within the maximum period indicated above in order to obviate that result. If possible such indictment should be returned within the two week period subsequent to June 23.

It is the Department's understanding that a regular grand jury will not again be convened in your district until September 6, 1950. In the discumetances, and in view of the mature of the case, it will be appreciated if you will endeavor to make immediate arrangements with the court for impaneling a special grand jury to consider the matter. The Government is in a position at the present time to present sufficient evidence to establish a prima facie case so that no delay will be necessary in having the requisite witnesses available whenever a grand jury is convened.

It will be further appreciated if you will advise the Department promptly as to the requested impensions of a

special grand jury and as to any further developments in the matter in your district. Conversely, you will be kept advised of all developments occurring in the Southern District of New York or alsowhere.

The Department appreciates your cooperation in handling the preliminary complaint so expeditiously.

With reference to my earlier memorandum today reflecting a telephone call from O. John Rogge, I desire to advise that ASAC Whelan of the New York Office called me and advised that Rogge had called him and advised that he had made with an appointment to see me on June 26. At this time, he told Mr. Whelen he would like to have Special Agents Fruitkin and Louis, who questioned Greenglass, at the Commissioner's hearing on Friday, June 23.

Mr. Thelan desired to know what advice he should give Mr. Rogge. Mr. Thelan further informed me that he had talked to Mr. Saypol, the U. S. Attorney, who had indicated that he did not desire to have the Agents present unless Rogge issued a subpoena for them inasmuch as he, Saypol, intends to either have the commissioner's hearing postponed or in any event, does not desire to bring up any testimony on this occasion.

I told Mr. Whelan to call Mr. Rogge and advise him that he, Rogge, should take the question of the Agents' appearance up with the U. S. Attorney and that the Bureau would abide by whatever agreement or instructions were issued by the U.S. Attorney concerning this matter.

ROSALEA TERREIL advises she was acquainted with RUTH GREENGLASS during the period March-Oct. 1945 while residing in adjoining apartment at 2092 High St., Albuquerque, N.M. States she had no contact with DAVID GREENGLASS or with any visitors at the GREENGLASS apartment; never recalls hearing the name FRANK KESSLER, FRANK KEPPLER or FRANK MARTIN. States the GREENGLASS couple appeared to be in moderate circumstances during all of the above period; took one trip to New York City. TERRELL observed or heard nothing of a suspicious nature during period of her acquaintance with RUTH GREENGLASS.

ROSALEA TERREIL, 130 W. Carson Street, advised that during February 1915 she received a disability retirement from the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company because of enlarged bronchial tubes and moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico for her health. She stated that on March 1, 1915 she had obtained an apartment at 209½ N. High Street, Albuquerque and that later during that same month DAVID and RUTH CREENGLASS had rented the apartment adjoining hers at that address. TERREIL stated that she had been under the impression that DAVID and RUTH CREENGLASS had previously lived at another address in or near Albuquerque prior to moving to the High Street address. TERREIL advised that during the subsequent months she had become very friendly with RUTH GREENGLASS but had

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
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TERRELL stated that inasmuch as she had no friends in Albuquerque she was very lonesome as was RUTH GREENGLASS, consequently, they visited each other quite often during the evenings. In this connection she stated that RUTH worked for the OPA or some other government agency in Albuquerque, consequently, she rarely saw her during the day except on week-ends. TERRELL stated that their conversations had been of a very general nature and that she had found out very little about either DAVID or RUTH or their backgrounds. She stated that she had learned that the relatives of either DAVID or RUTH had a store in New York and regularly sent them packages of kosher food. She stated that RUTH had remarked that she had lived in hig apartment houses all of her life, had never seen regetables or farm produce being grown, and several times mentioned that she would like to quit office work and get some sort of a job on a farm while living in that area.

TERRYLL advised that all the mail for the residents of  $209\frac{1}{2}$  High Street was left on a table in the hall and subsequently picked up by the tenants. She stated that she observed that the GREENGLASS couple regularly received mail from New York but that she does not recall ever having seen anything unusual in the amount of mail or any mail which appeared to be suspicious in any way.

TERREIL advised that she had never had any contact with visitors at the GREEN-GRASS apartment and while she remembers that on one or two Sundays they did have guests at the apartment, she did not see these individuals and so far as she could recall RUTH never said anything to her concerning her visitors. She stated that the names FRANK KESSLER, FRANK KEPPLER or FRANK MARTIN are not at all familiar to her and she is positive that RUTH never mentioned these names to her. She stated that occasionally a young girl whom she believes worked at the same place as RUTH visited at RUTH's apartment but she was never introduced to this girl and does not know her name.

TERRELL advised that DAVID CREENGLASS had been very secretive concerning his essignment at too allows and she had heard one or two of the tenants speculate as to what sort of an assignment he had. She stated apparently he had not even discussed his assignment with his wife because after the dropping of the first atomic bomb when it became known that the bomb had been developed at his assignment involved anything of that nature. TERRELL advised that DAVID had not associated with anyone in particular while residing there to her knowledge except that he had ridden back and forth to work with some individual whose identity was not known to TERRELL.

TERRELL advised that RUTH CREENGLASS had never discussed financial matters. had hever complained of not having enough money and the couple appeared to be in moderate circumstances during the entire period that she was acquainted with RUTH. She stated that the couple ate extremely well, that RUTH always prepared huge meals on the week-ends that DAVID came home. TRRELL stated that DAVID was always in uniform and that RUTH did not appear to possess many clothes but dressed like an average housewife. She stated that the couple never appeared to have or to spend any large amounts of money and had taken only one trip to her knowledge during the period March-October 1945. TERRELL stated that as well as she recalled this trip was to visit their relatives in New York City and was taken sometime during September 1945. She stated she believed the couple made the trip by train; that she had received a card from RUTH in New York City and that the couple had returned to Albuquerque about two weeks prior to the time that TERRELL moved back to San Antonio which was on October 20, 1945. TERRELL stated that one or two days prior to her departure from Albuquerque she had talked to DAVID, GREENGLASS for the first time when she went to the GREENGLASS apartment to tell them goodby.

regretal stated that GREENGLASS had not been very well liked at the apartment house because he was rather loud or noisy, slammed doors going in and out of the house and his apartment and made a lot of noise going up or down the stairs no matter what time of day or night it was. She stated that RUTH on the other hand appeared to be a very nice considerate person and that she had liked her very much. She stated that she intended to carry on a correspondence with RUTH but had not done so and has had no contact with her since October 1915. She stated she had heard nothing at all concerning the couple until she heard a radio broadcast last Friday relative to DAVID GREENGLASS having been arrested. She stated this had been very much of a shock to her because she had never seen or heard anything in connection with RUTH or DAVID which would arouse her suspicions in any way and she could hardly believe that he could be capable of doing things he is alleged to have done.

TERRELL advised from the current photographs of RUTH GREENGLASS she does not appear to have changed very much except that she is somewhat thinner but that DAVID appears to be twice the size that he was in 1915 and much older. The photograph of HARRY GOLD was exhibited to TERRELL and she recognized it as being of HARRY GOLD, stating that she had seen his photographs in newspapers. There are being transmitted herewith to Albuquerque, two photostatic copies of DAVID GREENGLASS' signed statement dated 6/15/50, and two photostatic copies of the sketch referred to therein.

During the interview with DAVID GREENGLASS on the night of 6/15/50, GREENGLASS drew the rough penciled sketch from memory and described it as a sketch of a high explosive lens mould at one end of a steel tube. At the points indicated on the sketch there is a high explosive detonator which is i set off. The other end of the steel tube has a photographic film to record the effect of the implosion on the steel tube. The values so derived are translated to uranium to determine the critical mass of uranium which would not explode before detonation.

You will recall that at the time of the press release on the apprehension of Harry Gold, Miss Norma Abrams, of the New York Daily News, telephonically advised of her disappointment and of the disappointment of other reporters in New York City because no release was made at New York City.

At 5:00 pm today, Miss Abrams called to take this opportunity to express to the Bureau her appreciation, the appreciation of the Daily News, and that of all other reporters in New York City because the press release on the apprehension of David Greenglass was made in New York City. She advised that she is sure that the Bureau has gained good will by making this release and the effectiveness of the release in New York City will be shown by the stories in the New York papers.

I advised Miss Abrams that I was glad that she and the other reporters were pleased with the story. I pointed out to her, however, that in each instance when a release is made, all factors are taken into account, and in a great many instances it is outside of our control exactly where a release is made and that it is impossible to please everyone. I pointed out that she should bear this in mind as to future releases.

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### I. NARRATIVE OF OFFENSE

DAVID GREENGLASS, Army Serial Number 32882473, was inducted into the United States Army on April 5, 1943 and entered on active duty on April 12, 1943. He joined the First Provisional Special Engineering Detachment Unit, Manhattan District, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, on July 27, 1944. While there he was given a security pep talk by a representative of the United States Army. He departed from Oak Ridge, Tennessee, August 2, 1944 and joined the Second Provisional Special Engineering Detachment Unit, Santa Fe, New Mexico, en August 5, 1944. GREENGLASS was assigned to the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project and remained there until February 27, 1946, when he was transferred to Fort Bliss, Texas for discharge,

At Los Alamos, New Mexico DAVID GREENGLASS, with Army Grade T-5, was assigned to Group E-5 (which was concerned with implosion experimentation) in August, 1944 under GECRGE B. KISTIAKOWSKY. The work of Group E-5 in August, 1944 was "Study of the Symmetry of Collapse and of the Methods for its Improvement". From September 30, 1944 to November 30, 1944 DAVID GREENGLASS was a member of Group X-1. Group X-1 worked on "Implosion Lesearch" in that period, and Dr. GEORGE B. KISTIAKOWSKY was the Division Leader of X-Division.

About December, 1944 or January, 1945 DAVID GREENGLASS was a member of Group X-4, which was charged with the duty of "Engineering of Moulds for High Explosives, Research on Sintered and Plastic Bonded Explosives", and miscellaneous services for X-Division. He was still in Group X-4 in May, 1945.

DAVID GREENGLASS was a member of the "Student Shop" of Group X-4. The functions of the "Student Shop" were "to maintain shop equipment for use of members of X-Division, to make miscellaneous experimental items, to do experimental work on large jobs before final design is made for large orders".

In general, DAVID GREENGLASS! work was in regard to the Atom Bomb, a fact he learned about a month or two after he was assigned to Los Alamos, New Mexico.

DAVID GREENGLASS received a five day pass in late November, 1944. On or about November 29, 1944 his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, arrived

in Albuquerque, New Mexico to celebrate their wedding anniversary with him. At that time she told DAVID GREENGLASS that JULIUS ROSENBERG, his brother-in-law, had asked if DAVID GREENGLASS would give information on the Atom Bomb. She told DAVID GREENGLASS that JULIUS ROSENBERG had said that the United States was at war with Germany and Japan and that those countries were enemies, and that Soviet Russia was fighting the enemy and was entitled to the information. On that basis, DAVID GREENGLASS agreed to give whatever information came to him in the course of his work at the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project. RUTH GREENGLASS told DAVID GREENGLASS that a man would contact him later for such information.

DAVID GREENGLASS had a furlough from December 30, 1944 to January 19, 1945 and spent this furlough (as he did all of his furloughs) in New York City. He also had a furlough from September 7, 1945 to September 25, 1945.

About May, 1945 HARRY GOLD met one "JOHN", his Russian contact, in New York City to discuss plans for HARRY GOLD's departure, about June, 1945, for Santa Fe, New Mexico. "JOHN" supplied HARRY GOLD with name and address of DAVID GREENGLASS in Albuquerque, New Mexico, with instructions to contact him. "JOHN" said HARRY GOLD was to receive information from DAVID GREENGLASS, which information he was subsequently to deliver to "JOHN". "JOHN" gave HARRY GOLD an envelope containing about five hundred dollars to give to DAVID GREENGLASS in payment for the information if DAVID GREENGLASS should indicate a need for funds. "JOHN" is ANATOLI A YAKOVLEV, former Assistant Consul General of the Russian Consulate, New York City.

On the evening of June 2, 1945 HARRY GOLD tried unsuccessfully to contact DAVID GREENGLASS at the latter's residence, 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico, and ascertained that DAVID GREENGLASS was not at home at that time. On the next morning (Sunday, June 3, 1945) HARRY GOLD again went to 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico, and there met DAVID GREENGLASS, whereupon HARRY GOLD introduced himself by a fictitious name. HARRY GOLD had in his possession a torn card which fitted a torn card in the possession of DAVID GREENGLASS. GREENGLASS' torn card had been given to him either by RUTH GREENGLASS, when she moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico about February, 1945, or by JULIUS ROSENBERG during DAVID GREENGLASS' New York furlough between December 20, 1944 and January 19, 1945. HARRY GOLD left 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico and then returned in the afternoon to the same address. DAVID

GREENGLASS, feeling it was gross negligence on the part of the United States not to give Russia Atom Bomb information as an Aliy, at that time gave HARRY GOLD a list of names of persons working at Los Alamos, who, he thought, could be approached for information.

DAVID GREENGLASS also gave HARRY GOLD a sketch of a high explosive lens mould (or something of that type), which was an experiment to study implosion effects on a steel tube in order to understand the effect it would have on uranium so that it could be determined how a critical mass could be achieved that would not explode before detonation. DAVID GREENGLASS also gave HARRY GOLD information concerning the identity of a world-famous scientist who was working at los Alamos under an assumed name. He also told HARRY GOLD that OPPENHEIMER and KISTIAKOWSKY were working at los Alamos, New Mexico.

After receiving this information, HARRY GOLD gave DAVID GREENGLASS an envelope containing approximately five hundred dollars. Tentative arrangements were made for a second meeting between them, which did not come to pass.

During the December 30, 1944 to January 19, 1945 furlough, or during the furlough DAVID GREENGLASS had subsequent to his meeting with HARRY GOLD, DAVID GREENGLASS was introduced by JULIUS ROSENBERG to an unidentified man in New York City. This man asked DAVID GREENGLASS questions about the high explosive lens which was being experimented with at Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project. DAVID GREENGLASS attempted to describe this high explosive lens to the man,

# II. RELEVANT STATUTES

Title 50 United States Code Section 32, Subsection (a) and Title 50 United States Code Section 34.

It is noted that DAVID GREENGLASS is charged with a violation under Title 50 USC Section 34, which constitutes a conspiracy to violate Title 50 USC Section 32 Subsection (a). Title 50 USC Section 32, Subsection (a) provides that whoever violates this statute in time of war shall be punished by death or by imprisonment for not more than thirty years thoreby making violation of this Section a capital offense.

# III. STATUTE C' LIMITATIONS

Since the violation charged against DAVID GREENGLASS is a capital offense, there is no limitation of time, according to Title 18 United States Code Section 581 as amended August 4, 1939, Chapter 419, Section 1 (5) Stat. 1198). This statute reads as follows: "That an indictment for any offense punishable by death may be found at any time without regard to any Statute of Limitations".

### IV. END OF WAR

President Harry Truman by Proclamation No. 2714 declared the cessation of hostilities of World War II effective twelve noon, December 31, 1946 (12 Federal Register #1, page 1, dated January 1, 1947).

#### V. PRELIMINARY PROSECUTIVE ACTION

DAVID GREENGLASS was placed under arrest at 1:32 a.m. on June 16, 1950 in New York City. At 1:50 p.m. on June 16, 1950 a complaint was executed by SA John W. Lewis before United States Commissioner Edward McDonald of the Southern District of New York, stating that a complaint and warrant had been filed and issued on June 16, 1950 in the District of New Mexico charging DAVID GREENGLASS with a violation of Title 50 USC Section 34 (1946 ed.). The complaint which was issued by United States Commissioner Owen J. Mowrey of the District of New Mexico was signed by SA J. Jerome Maxwell and was filed at 9:36 a.m. on June 16, 1950 against DAVID GREENGLASS in the District of New Mexico. This complaint charges the following:

"That from on or about January 1, 1945, and continuously thereafter for a considerable period, the exact period being to deponent unknown, in the District of New Mexico and within the jurisdiction of this Court and elsewhere DAVID GREENGLASS, the defendant herein, did, the United States then and there being at war, conspire, combine, confederate and agree with HARRY GOLD and ANATOLI A, YAKOVLEV, alias JOHN and DIVERS, and other persons to deponent unknown, to violate Sub-Section (A) of Section 32, Title 50, United States Code, in that they did conspire, combine,

"confederate and agree, with intent and reason to believe that it would be used to the advantage of a foreign nation, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, to communicate, deliver and transmit and attempt to communicate, deliver and transmit to a foreign Government, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and representatives and agents thereof, directly and indirectly, documents, writings, sketches, notes and information relating to the national defense of the United States, to wit, documents, writings, sketches, notes and information relating to Atomic Energy and nuclear fission.

"Pursuant to the said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, the defendant and co-conspirators did commit, among others, the following overt act:

"(1) In or about the month of June or July, 1945, the exact date being to deponent unknown, at Albuquerque, in the District of New Mexico, the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS met and conferred with HARRY GOLD and at that time delivered to said HARRY GOLD information relating to the National Defense of the United States.

"In violation of Section 34, Title 50, United States Code (1946 edition)."

The warrant based on the aforementioned complaint was signed at 9:37 a.m. on June 16, 1950 in the District of New Mexico.

#### VI. WITNESSES

REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ADJUTANT-GENERAL'S OFFICE WASHINGTON, D.C.

Can testify:

That DAVID GREENGLASS was inducted into the United States Army on April 5, 1943, entered on active duty on April 12, 1943 and was assigned Army Serial Number 32882473.

That DAVID GREENGLASS was assigned to the First Provisional Special Engineering Detachment Unit, Manhattan

District, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, on July 27, 1944.

That DAVID GREENGLASS leparted from Oak Ridge, Tennessee August 2, 1944 and joined the Becond rovisional Special Engineering Detachment, Santa Fe, New Mexico on August 5, 1944, and that DAVID GREENGLASS was assigned to the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project, Los Alamos, New Mexico.

That DAVID GREENGLASS was transferred to Fort Bliss, Texas from Los Alamos, New Mexico on February 27, 1946 for discharge.

That DAVID GREENGLASS had had the following

furloughs:

From June 6, 1944 to June 20, 1944. From December 30, 1944 to January 19, 1945 From September 7, 1945 to September 25, 1945.

REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ATOMIC ENERGY COMMISSION WASHINGTON, D.C. (Who will be designated at the time of the trial)

Can testify:

As to the confidential nature of the work at Los Alamos, New Mexico and as to the extent of DAVID GREENGLASS! contact with classified information at Los Alamos.

That in August, 1944 DAVID GREENGLASS was assigned to Group E-5 under Dr. GEORGE B. KISTIAKOWSKY and that Group E-5 was engaged in implosion experimentation, particularly "the study of the symmetry of collapse and of the methods for its improvement".

That from September 30, 1914 to November 30, 1914 DAVID GREENGLASS was a member of Group X-1, which worked on "implosion research" during that period, under Dr. GEORGE B. KISTIAKOWSKY, who was the Division Leader of X-Division.

That about December, 1944 or in January, 1945 DAVID GREENGLASS was a member of Group X-4, which was charged with the duty of engineering moulds for high explosives, research on sintered and plastic bonded explosives, and miscellaneous services for X-Division.

That DAVID GREENGLASS was still in Group X-4 in May, 1945 and that GREENGLASS was a member of the Student Shop of Group X-4, the functions of which were to maintain shop equipment for use of members of X-Division, to make miscellaneous experimental items, to do experimental work on large jobs before final design was made for large orders.

That the sketch of the high explosive lens (mentioned in the signed statement of DAVID GREENGLASS dated June 15, 1950) was under military classification by the Manhattan Engineering District and still is classified under the Atomic Energy Commission.

MR. AND MRS. W. B. FREEMAN 606 Ridge Place Albuquerque, New Mexico

Can testify:

That they were the owners of the premises located at 209 North High Street on June 3, 1945 and had been the owners of the premises since prior to January 1, 1945.

That they can identify DAVID GREENGLASS.

That an apartment located on the second floor of 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico was rented to DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH GREENGLASS either from March 19, 1945 to March 9, 1946 or from March 1945 to March 1946.

Can produce upon issuance of subpoena duces tecum:

A document described as Form D-35, Order Adjusting Maximum Rent, Concerning 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, Apartment 4, Docket No. 5-Al-H-7196, addressed to Mr. W. B. FREEMAN, 606 Ridge Place, Albuquerque, New Mexico which shows on the reverse side the signature of RUTH GREENGLASS and which fixes the period of occupancy from March 1945 until March 1946.

A document described as United States of America, Office of Price Administration, Registration of Rental Dwellings, bearing Budget Bureau No. 08-R-029-42, Form DD7D (landlord's copy) which shows on the reverse side the signature of RUTH CREENGLASS and which fixes the period of occupancy from March 1945 until March 1946.

Can testify:

That during the tenancy of DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH GREENGLASS at 209 North High Street, they (Mr. and Mrs. W. B. FREEMAN) resided in a front apartment on the second floor of 209 North High Street.



That DAVID CHEENGLASS and RUTH CREENGLASS received packages from New York and that the packages carried the last name of the sender as "PRINTZ".

That DAVID GREENGLASS was an enlisted man in the United States Army stationed at Los Alamos and that he was in Albuquerque with his wife, RUTH, at 209 North High Street on weekends.

Special Agent T. SCOTT MILLER, JR. and Special Agent RICHARD E. HRENNAN Federal Bureau of Investigation New York, New York

> Can testify that on June 2, 1950 HARRY COLD of 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, made the following voluntary statement:

"Philadelphia, Penna, June 2, 1950

"I, HARRY GOLD, make the following voluntary statement to RICHARD E. BRENNAN and T. SCOTT MILLER, Jr., who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice. No threats or promises have been made to me, and I realize that I do not have to make a statement, and any statement I do make may be used against me in a court of law. I realize I have a right to counsel.

"As of the Spring of 1945, I had been engaged in espionage in behalf of the Soviet Union, since 1936. There were two lapses in my espionage activities, one from the late Summer of 1938 to late Summer of 1940, during which time I was attending college in Cincinnati, Ohio. The second lapse was from the Spring of 1941 to the Fall of 1941, In the Spring, SAM, who was my Russian contact at the time, told me I was not needed anymore. In the Fall, however, SAM told me that now that Russia had been attacked, we must resume our work on an intensified scale.

"In the Spring of 1945, I was meeting regularly with a man unknown to me except by the name of JOHN, who was obviously a Russian, and who had succeeded SAM as my Russian contact.

"Sometime around May of 1945 I met JOHN in, I believe, a bar on Third Avenue, New York City. This meeting was to discuss plans for my departure in June of 1945 for Santa Fe, New Mexico. I was going to Santa Fe on the instructions of JOHN. During this meeting JOHN supplied me with a name and address of a man in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and instructed me to contact this man while I was there. I believe JCHN told me to contact the man's wife in case the man was not there. JCHN told me that I would receive information from this man, which I was to deliver to JCHN. JCHN gave no an envelope containing about \$500. I was instructed to give this money to the man in Albuquerque in payment for the information. I was instructed to give this sum to him only if he would indicate a need for funds.

"I left Philadelphia in June of 1945 and went to Albuquerque and then Santa Fe, N.M. On my return from Santa Fe to Albuquerque on a Saturday evening, I tried unsuccessfully to contact this man on that evening. I was informed that he was not at home at that time. I again went to his house on the next morning, Sunday. At this time I met the man. I cannot recall this man's name, but I believe he lived on the second or third floor of a house, the exact address of which I cannot remember. It was, however, somewhere north of East

"Central Avenue, one or two blocks north, and somewhere between North High Street and North Pine Street.

"I introduced myself to this man as either FRANK RESSLER or FRANK MARTIN, I cannot recall which. I used some form .? recognition, involving the first name of a man, and stating that he had sent me. This individual recognized the password.

"At this time I discovered to my surprise that this individual whom I was contacting was in the United States Army, and was, I believe a Technician Fifth Grade. His rating may have been higher, however. This man was not over 25 years of age, perhaps even younger, about 5' 7", sturdily built, dark brown or black hair, which was either ourly or bushy, brown eyes, snub nose, even teeth, a wide mouth, and an open, pleasing countenance. I believe from things he said that his home was in New York City, possibly the Bronx or Brooklyn, not Manhattan. I also met his wife. She was about 5' 3" and normally good looking and neither excessively stout or slender. Her name may have been RUTH, although I am not sure.

"I returned to this house later in the afternoon, at which time he gave me an envelope containing three to five pages of written information, and possibly one sketch. This information dealt with, I believe, a generalized description of the area in Los Alamos, N.M., in which he worked. There may also have been a sketch of some bit of structural equipment or a machine.

"I believe, from what he said, that he worked in one of four jobs at Los Alamos; 1 - As a draftsman. 2 - As a machinist. 3 - As an electrician. 4 - In the physics labratory.

"At the time that this man gave me the envelope containing the information, I gave him the approximately \$500. He had expressed a need for funds to enable his wife to stay near him.

"During this conversation that I had with this man, tentative arrangements were made for a second meeting between us. This meeting was to occur in New York City during a furlough which he expected to get at Christmas time, 1945. I was to call this man's father-in-law in the Bronx, New York. The father-in-law's first name was, or may have been, PHILIP. This meeting never occurred, on the orders of JOHN, who seemed to have lost interest when I mentioned the matter to him in the late Fall of 1945, I have never seen this soldier nor his wife since, nor have I heard from them.

I took the information which I received from this man in Albuquerque, and turned it over to JOHN upon my return to New York. The actual

"transfer of the information from me to JOHN, occurred in Brooklyn, in the neighborhood of Metropolitan Avenue.

"I have read the above statement consisting of this and five other pages and am signing each page as all the information contained therei is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

That the search of the premises was begun by Special Agent LEO H. FRUTKIN and himself in the front bed room of the apartment at 1:58 P.M. on June 15, 1950.

That a quantity of photographs was found at the outset by Special Agent LEO H. FRUTKIN in the drawers of the night table.

That one of the photographs depicted DAVID GREENGLASS in an Army uniform and his wife, RUTH, standing in front of the porch of the house.

That DAVID CREENGLASS said the photograph was one of himself and his wife taken in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

That he found a foot locker on a shelf over a closet on the east wall of the room next to the kitchen and took it down with the assistance of DAVID GREENGLASS.

That DAVID CREENGLASS pried the rusted lock open with a screwdriver and disclosed the contents which were a quantity of letters.

That DAVID CREENGLASS told him that he could take the foot locker and letters with him.

That he gave the foot locker containing the letters to Special Agent WILLIAM F. NORTON who was in a Bureau car parked in front of 265 Rivington Street, New York City.

#### Can produce:

A letter dated August 23, 1943 at Arcadia, California from "DAVE", addressed to Mrs. R. CREENGLASS, 266 Stanton Street, New York City, which states in part as follows:

"Darling, during lunch our I had two discussions on political questions with some fellows. I used the utmost patience and care in the choice of words so that I could get my point across and still not be suspected of Communism....
I'll raise that flag yet so don't worry about the future. It's ours."

A letter dated June 29, 19th from "DAVE" at Jackson, Mississippi to Mrs. R. GREENGLASS, 266 Stanton Street, New York City, which states in part as follows:

"Darling, I have been reading a lot of books on the Soviet Union. Dear, I can see how far-sighted and intelligent those leaders are. They are really geniuses every one of them. I have been revising what I think and how I think politically. Having found out the truth about the Soviets, both good and bad, I have come to a stronger and more resolute faith and belief in the principles of Socialism and Communism."

A letter dated August 4, 1944 at Kansas City, Missouri from "DAVE" to Mrs. R. CREENGLASS, 266 Stanton Street, New York 2, New York, which states in part:

"Dear, I know that you are anxious to know where I am going so I'll tell you. The place is near Lamz, New Mexico. It is 6,000 feet above sea level... Dear, I have been very reticent in my writing about what I am doing or what I am going to do because it is a classified top secrecy project and as such I can't say anything. In fact, I am not even supposed to say this much. Darling, in this type of work at my place of residence there is censorship of mail going out and all off the post calls. So dear, you know why I didn't want you to say anything on the telephone. That is why I write C. now, dear, instead of Comrade....Your husband, lover and Comrade, DAVE."

That he received the foot locker from SA JOHN W. LEWIS and transported it to the FBI office where he gave it to Special Agent JAMES P. LEE and Special Agent JOSEPH C. WALSH.

That he received a group of photographs from Special Agent LEO H. FRUTKIN in front of 265 Rivington Street, New York City, and that he turned these photographs over to Special Agent MAURICE W. CORCORAN at the corner of Cannon Street and Rivington Street, New York City.

Special Agent JAMES P. LEE Special Agent JOSEPH C. WALSH Federal Bureau of Investigation New York, New York

Can testify that they received the foot locker from Special Agent WILLIAM F. NORTON at the FBI office.

Special Agent LEO H. FRUTKIN Federal Bureau of Investigation New York, New York

#### Can testify:

That on June 15, 1950, at 1:46 P.M., accompanied by Special Agent JOHN W. LEWIS, he visited DAVID CREENGLASS in Apartment 6 at 265 Rivington Street, New York City.

That CREENGLASS consented to a search of his apartment and at 1:57 P.M., June 15, 1950, executed the aforementioned written consent to a search of his premises.

That the search was begun by Special Agent JOHN W. LEWIS and himself in the front bed room at 1:58 P.M. on June 15, 1950.

That he found a quantity of photographs at the outset in the drawers of the night table.

That one of the photographs depicted DAVID (REENGLASS in an Army uniform and his wife, RUTH, standing in front of a porch of a house.

That CREENGLASS said the photograph was of himself and his wife taken in Albuquerque, New Mexico

That with DAVID GREENGLASS! permission, he took this photograph and others and turned them over to Special Agent WILLIAM F. NORTON in a Bureau car in front of 265 Rivington Street, New York City at 2:26 P.M.

That Special Agent JOHN W. LEWIS, in his presence, found a foot locker on a shelf over a closet on the east wall of the room next to the kitchen and that with his assistance and the assistance of DAVID CREENGLASS, JOHN LEWIS took the foot locker down.

That DAVID CREENGLASS asked him if he had come across a key during the course of his search with which he could open the lock on the foot locker.

That he gave DAVID GREENGLASS a key which was in the night table and that DAVID GREENGLASS turned this key in the lock of the foot locker.

That DAVID GREENGLASS then used a screwdriver to pry open the rusted lock, disclosing the contents which were a quantity of letters.

That he found in the drawers of the night table a card captioned New York City Central Committee, International Workers Order, Medical Department, 80 Fifth Avenue, New York City, reflecting Lodge 860 (reinstated) and the name and address of DAVID CREENCLASS, 265 Rivington Street, New York City.

That DAVID GREENGLASS remarked, when the card was found, that he (DAVID GREENGLASS) had belonged to the International Workers Order but had quit when the organization was listed by TOM CLARK as subversive because he did not want to lose his job.

That he found in the drawers of the night table a letter addressed to Mr. and Mrs. D. CREENGLASS, 265 Rivington Street, New York 2, New York, postmarked New York, New York, 1948, containing a form letter from the Executive Committee President of Lodge 860 of the Jewish Peoples Fraternal Order, International Workers Order, inviting the addressees to the next meeting of the Lodge at 853 Broadway, New York City,

Can testify that he received a group of photographs from Special Agent WILLIAM F. NORTON at the corner of Cannon Street and Rivington Street and turned them over to Special Agent WALTER C. ROETTING in a Bureau car on Rivington Street, New York City.

Special Agent WALTER C. ROETTING Federal Bureau of Investigation New York, New York

Can testify that he received a group of photographs from Special Agent MAURICE W. CORCORAN while in a Bureau car on Rivington Street, New York City, and delivered them to Special Agent LESTER O. GALLAHER at the FBI Office.

Special Agent LESTER O. GALLAHER Federal Bureau of Investigation New York, New York

Can testify that he received the photographs from Special Agent WALTER C. ROETTING and proceeded by train to Philadelphia where he turned them over to Special Agents T. SCOTT MILLER, Jr. and RICHARD E. BRENNAN.

Special Agent T. SCOTT MILLER, JR. Special Agent RICHARD E. BRENNAN Federal Bureau of Investigation New York, New York

Can testify:

That on June 15, 1950 they received the photographs from Special Agent LESTER O. GALLAHER and displayed them to HARI GOLD in Philadelphia and that HARRY GOLD identified the photograph of DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH GREENGLASS standing in front of a porch of a house in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

That HARRY GOLD wrote on the back of the photograph that this was the man he (HARRY GOLD) contacted in Albuquerque, New Mexico in June 1945 on instructions from his Soviet espionage superior "JOHN".

That the man in the photograph gave him (HARRY GOLD) information relative to his work at Los Alamos, New Mexico, which information HARRY GOLD later gave to "JOHN".

Special Agent JOHN W. LEWIS Special Agent LEO H. FRUTKIN Federal Bureau of Investigation New York, New York

Can testify that DAVID CREENGLASS furnished a voluntary statement on June 15, 1950 at 11:54 P.M., that this statement was transcribed from her stenographic notes by Stenographer FRANCES DEVLIN from 11:54 P.M., June 15, 1950 until 12:55 A.M., June 16, 1950, and that it was signed by DAVID CREENGLASS at 1:06 A.M. on June 16, 1950. This statement is set out as follows:

"New York, New York June 15, 1950

JOHN W. LEWIS and LEO H. FRUTKIN, who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I make this statement freely and voluntarily and have been advised of my right not to make a statement and that I have a right to an attorney. I understand that this statement may be used against me in a court of law.

"I was born March 3, 1922, at New York City and presently reside at 265 Rivington Street, New York City.

"On or about November 29, 1944, my wife, RUTH, arrived in New Mexico from New York City and told me that JULIUS ROSENBERG, my brother-in-law, had asked if I would give information on the Atom Bomb and stated as a reason for that that we are at war with Germany and Japan and that they are the enemy and that Soviet Russia was fighting the enemy and was entitled to the information. On that basis, I agreed to give whatever information came to me in the course of my employment at Los Alamos, New Mexico, at the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project. This message, which my wife conveyed to me, was not her own idea but was an idea given to her by JULIUS ROSENBERG. She told me at the time that a man would contact me later for information about the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project.

"About February, 1945, my wife moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico, from New York City. Three or four months later she had a miscarriage. Approximately a month after that time, a man came to the place where RUTH was living, 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico. I did not know this man's name at the time but recently recognized his pictures in various newspapers as being HARRY GOLD. He had with him a torn or cut piece of paper card which fitted a torn piece of paper card furnished me as a means of identifying this man. I cannot recall at this time whether this torn piece of card was given to me by my wife, RUTH, at the time she moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico, from New York about February, 1945, or whether I received it from JULIUS ROSENBERG while I was in New York City on furloush between about December 20, 1944, and January 20, 1945. COLD gave me an envisione containing \$500. GCLD said to me that I was living in a poor place at the time he gave me the \$500. I furnished him with information concerning the Los Alamos Project, although I did not do it for the promise of money. I gave him a list of names of persons who were working at Los Alamos who, I thought, could be approached for information. They were names of both

"soldiers and civilians, to the best of my recollection. I felt it was gross negligence on the part of the United States not to give Russia the information about the Atom Bomb because she was an ally.

"I think that I gave GOLD a sketch of a high-explosive lens mold, or something of that type of thing, which was an experiment to study implosion effects on a steel tube to understand the effect it would have on uranium so it could be determined how they could arrive at a critical mass that would not explode before detonation.

"I have furnished a rough penciled sketch of a portion of the above mentioned high-explosive implosion test to FBI Agents.

of a world famous scientist, who was working at Los Alamos under an assumed name. I also furnished the information to GOLD that OPPENHEIMER was working at Los Alamos and that KISTIAKOWSKY was working at Los Alamos.

"GCLD told me that he would some back to see me again and I agreed to see him; however, he never contacted me again.

"My wife was not in the room at the time I received the money from GOLD and at the time I gave him information about the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project. I gave GOLD the information without expecting money for it.

"I was inducted into the Army, April 12, 1943, and was given Army Serial Number 32882473. During the summer of 1944 I was assigned to Oak Ridge, Tennessee, where I remained for about two weeks. While at Oak Ridge, Tennessee, I was given a security pep talk by someone in Military Intelligence. and at Los Alamos was furnished with a security book. I understood that all of the work being done at Los Alamos, New Mexico, was top secret. I understand that under Army regulations 'top secret' means that such information is not to be discussed with anyone even with fellow employees, except when it is necessary for the work. I was assigned to the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project from about August, 1944 until about February, 1946, and during all that time I was a non-commissioned officer in the United States Army, having first, Grade T-5, and later, Grade T-4. I was assigned to Theta Shop at Los Alamos where I worked on high-speed cameras, lucite parts, experimental equipment, and also made up parts that could not be bought on the outside. One one occasion that I recall I handled uranium. In general, the work was in regard to the Atom Bomb, but I did not know this until about a month or two after I was assigned there. I heard it among the employees at the Los Alamos Project.

"I recall that I had a leave of five days in late November, 1944, and that my wife, who had arrived in Albuquerque for my wedding anniversary celebration, came on or about November 29, 1944. I also recall that I had a furlough from about December 80, 1944, to about January 20, 1945, and I spent my furlough time in New York City.

"I have read the above statement consisting of this page and three preceding pages and state that it is the truth to the best off my knowledge. No promises or threats or operation of any kind were used to obtain this statement.

That DAVID GREENGLASS pr pared a sketch of the high-explosive implosion test referred to in the above signed statement.

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#### Can testify further:

That after DAVID GREENGLASS had signed the aforementioned statement he laughed and said that of course he would plead not guilty and would repudiate his statement at the trial.

That after DAVID GREENGLASS signed his voluntary statement he wrote on the back of HARRY GOLD'S photograph that this was the picture of the man who was the recipient of his (GREENGLASS') information at Albuquerque, New Mexico.

That DAVID CREENGLASS orally stated that the internationally known scientist, mentioned in his signed statement, was DR. JOHR who CREENGLASS said was working at Los Alamos under the assumed name of MAKER.

That DAVID GREENGLASS orally stated before he finished the signed statement that he first learned of the atom bomb when his wife told him of it at the time she requested him to get information on it for the Soviets about November 29, 1944.

That DAVID GREENGLASS first said he did not know who might have asked RUTH GREENGLASS to approach him for the purpose of getting information on the atom bomb for Soviet Russia but later GREENGLASS admitted that JULIUS ROSENBERG, his brother in law, was the person who had asked RUTH to approach him. That GREENGLASS said he admitted this because he felt investigation would reveal the true facts.

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FRANCES DEVLIN, Stenographer Federal Bureau of Investigation New York, New York

That she took down in shorthand and transcribed on a typewriter the aforementioned statement of DAVID GREENGLASS and saw him sign it.

That after DAVID GREENGLASS had signed the statement he laughed and said that of course he would plead not guilty and would repudiate his statement at the trial.

Can testify that he placed DAVID CREENGLASS under arrest at 1:32 A.M., June 16, 1950 at the FBI office in New York City.

Special Agent LEO H. FRUTKIN Special Agent JOHN W. LEWIS Federal Bureau of Investigation New York, New York\_\_

Can testify that at 10:55 A.M. on June 16, 1950 DAVID GREENGLASS executed the following voluntary statement:

\*June 16, 1950

"I, DAVID GREENGLASS, 265 Rivington Street, N.Y.C. make the following voluntary statement to Special Agents 1EO H. FRUTKIN and JOHN W. LEWIS of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. They have told me that I do not have to make any statement and that any statement I make can be used against me in a court of law. I know I have the right of counsel and to be represented by an attorney. No promise or threat, or coercion has been used to obtain this statement.

"I recall that when I was on furlough from the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project, my brother-in-law, JULIUS ROSENBERG, in New York City asked to see me one night. I had a previous appointment of a social nature to see some personal friends and cut the appointment short in order to meet my brother-in-law, JULIUS ROSENBERG. I borrowed a 1935 Oldsmobile and drove to the vicinity of about First Avenue, somewhere above E. 42 St., but below E. 59 St. probably.

"I parked the par at the curb on a northbound street, facing north. JULIUS ROSENBERG walked over to the car and told me to wait. Then he walked away and came back with a man and introduced him to me by a first name which I do not recall. Then the man got into the car and I drove around while the man asked me questions about a high explosive lens which was being experimented with at Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project. I tried to describe the lens to the man while I was driving. When the man left the car about fifteen minutes later, I went home. JULIUS, after introducing the man to me, had left.

"This furlough was either the one before I met HARRY GOLD in the summer of 1945 or after that time.

"I have read the above statement consisting of this page and one preceding page and state it is the truth to the best of my knowledge.
