SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Superceding indictment returned 1/31/51 by USGJ, SDNY, charging DAVID GREENGLASS and others with conspiracy to commit espionage. GREENGLASS entered guilty plea to above indictment 2/2/51, and sentencing continued until 2/15/51. Removal hearing of GREENGLASS on New Mexico indictment continued by USC, SDNY to 2/23/51. Additional recollections of Subject concerning his espionage activities set forth.

Details:

On January 4, 1951, DAVID GREENGLASS appeared before Judge HENRY W. GODDARD, Southern District of New York, for sentencing on the Southern District of New York indictment, and at that time, Judge GODDARD postponed sentencing until February 13, 1951.

On January 5, 1951, Mr. EDWARD McDONALD, U. S. Commissioner, Southern District of New York, continued removal hearing of DAVID GREENGLASS on the New Mexico indictment until February 23, 1951.

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On January 31, 1951, the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, returned an indictment superceding the previous Southern District of New York indictments against the Subject and others.

A copy of this indictment was made available by Mr. Myles J. Lane, Chief Assistant United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, which reads as follows:

"The Grand Jury charges:

"1. On or about June 6, 1944, up to and including June 16, 1950, at the Southern District of New York, and elsewhere, JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV, also known as 'John', DAVID GREENGLASS and MORTON SOBELL, the defendants herein, did, the United States of America then and there being at war, conspire, combine, confederate and agree with each other and with HARRY GOLD and RUTH GREENGLASS, named as co-conspirators but not as defendants, and with divers other persons presently to the Grand Jury unknown, to violate subsection (a) of Section 32, Title 50, United States Code, in that they did conspire, combine, confederate and agree, with intent and reason to believe that it would be used to the advantage of a foreign nation, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, to communicate, deliver and transmit to a foreign government, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and representatives and agents thereof, directly and indirectly, documents, writings, sketches, notes and information relating to the National Defense of the United States of America.

"OVERT ACTS

"1. In pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the District of Columbia, on or about June 6, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG visited a building at 247 Delaware Avenue, Washington, D. C.

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"2. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about November 15, 1944, the defendants JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG conferred with RUTH GREENGLASS.

"3. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about November 20, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG gave RUTH GREENGLASS a sum of money.

"4. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about November 20, 1944, RUTH GREENGLASS boarded a train for New Mexico.

"5. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about December 10, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG went to 266 Stanton Street, New York City.

"6. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about December 10, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG received from RUTH GREENGLASS a paper containing written information.

"7. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 5, 1945, the defendants JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG conferred with the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH GREENGLASS.

"8. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 5, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG gave RUTH GREENGLASS a portion of the side of a torn cardboard 'Jello' box.

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"9. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 10, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG introduced the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS to a man on First Avenue, New York City.

"10. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 12, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG conferred with the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS.

"11. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 12, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG received from the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS a paper containing sketches of experiments conducted at the Los Alamos Project.

"12. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 14, 1945, the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS boarded a train for New Mexico.

(Section 34, Title 50, United States Code).

On February 2, 1951, Judge HENRY W. GODDARD, Southern District of New York, accepted a guilty plea from DAVID GREENGLASS on the above quoted indictment and continued sentencing of GREENGLASS to February 15, 1951.

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During the recapitulation of his espionage activities with Special Agents John W. Lewis, John A. Harrington and William F. Norton, Jr., DAVID GREENGLASS recalled the following additional details:

It was during his first meeting with JULIUS ROSENBERG during the month of January, 1945, soon after January 1, 1945, at 266 Stanton Street, New York City, that JULIUS ROSENBERG gave GREENGLASS a description of an atom bomb similar to that which was subsequently dropped on Hiroshima, Japan in August, 1945.

It was also at that same meeting that JULIUS ROSENBERG asked DAVID GREENGLASS for the information he had gathered concerning the atom bomb at Los Alamos, New Mexico. In compliance with this request, DAVID GREENGLASS subsequently reduced to writing the information he had concerning high explosive lens molds and personnel at Los Alamos. GREENGLASS gave these writings to JULIUS ROSENBERG a day or two later or when he and RUTH GREENGLASS went to the ROSENBERG apartment for dinner a few days later.

During the evening of the above mentioned dinner at the ROSENBERG apartment, there was a discussion between DAVID GREENGLASS and JULIUS ROSENBERG about high explosive lenses and the work that DAVID GREENGLASS was doing at Los Alamos.

At that time, JULIUS ROSENBERG told DAVID GREENGLASS that in gathering information at Los Alamos, he should not attempt to take any sketches or materials from the installation at Los Alamos, but should gather only information which he could remember.

Toward the end of that evening, RUTH GREENGLASS, JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG, came out of the kitchen of the ROSENBERG apartment, and RUTH GREENGLASS showed DAVID GREENGLASS the cut portion of a "Jello" box side to be used in the identification of the courier to be sent to New Mexico to pick up atomic bomb information obtained by DAVID GREENGLASS.

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At the time that DAVID saw this means of identification, he said to JULIUS ROSENBERG, "That is very clever". JULIUS ROSENBERG then said, "Often the simplest things are the best".

RUTH GREENGLASS showed DAVID the "Jello" box side portion again when he and she returned to their own apartment that night.

It was on a date subsequent to the above mentioned dinner and during DAVID GREENGLASS' January, 1945 furlough, about two or three days before GREENGLASS returned to Los Alamos, that JULIUS ROSENBERG arranged for DAVID GREENGLASS to meet an unknown Russian on First Avenue between 42nd Street and 59th Streets, New York City.

This unknown Russian questioned GREENGLASS regarding the high explosive lens which DAVID GREENGLASS had previously sketched and had given to JULIUS ROSENBERG. The unknown Russian asked DAVID GREENGLASS for the mathematical formula of the curves involved in the construction of the exterior of the high explosive lens. DAVID GREENGLASS was unable to furnish him with this formula.

This unknown Russian left GREENGLASS with the impression that the former is a technically-trained man, and that the high-explosive lens approach to the problem of constructing an atomic bomb was an entirely new one to him.

GREENGLASS said that he would not have known that this unknown man was a Russian if ROSENBERG had not told him so, because the man spoke with no perceptible accent. GREENGLASS said that the unknown Russian's speech was typically American, and possibly that of a New Yorker.

DAVID GREENGLASS is under the impression that when HARRY GOLD came to Albuquerque to see him on June 3, 1945, that HARRY GOLD said that JULIUS had sent him.

When DAVID GREENGLASS furnished a written description of the atomic bomb to JULIUS ROSENBERG in September, 1945, he also told ROSENBERG orally that when the atomic bomb is dropped from an airplane, the bomb is attached to a parachute to slow-down its descent.

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He advised ROSENBERG that this was necessary in order to permit the barometric pressure fuse to function properly so that the bomb can be detonated at the appropriate time before striking the ground.

At one time during the period between 1946 and 1949, while attempting to persuade DAVID GREENGLASS to enroll at one of the better universities at Russian expense, JULIUS ROSENBERG told GREENGLASS that he is the pay-master for a group of students at various universities who are being sponsored by the Soviets.

It was in February, 1950, soon after the arrest of British scientist KLAUS FUCHS, that JULIUS ROSENBERG told DAVID GREENGLASS that he had known both JACOB GOLOS and ELIZABETH BENTLEY. ROSENBERG did not mention knowing HARRY GOLD.

Subsequently, RUTH GREENGLASS was badly burned in a household accident on February 14, 1950, and as a result thereof was in a hospital until March 13, 1950. DAVID GREENGLASS recalled that about a week before March 13, 1950, JULIUS ROSENBERG came to DAVID GREENGLASS' apartment, and told DAVID again that he should leave the United States.

About May 1, 1950, JULIUS ROSENBERG came to the GREENGLASS apartment to ask for the stock held by GREENGLASS in the PITT MACHINE PRODUCTS COMPANY, and at that time again told DAVID GREENGLASS that he must leave the United States.

On May 24, 1950, JULIUS ROSENBERG came to DAVID GREENGLASS' apartment to show the photograph and account of the arrest of HARRY GOLD appearing in the "New York Herald Tribune" newspaper of that date.

On the following day, May 25, 1950, JULIUS ROSENBERG came to the GREENGLASS apartment, at which time he gave

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GREENGLASS \$1,000 cash and promised to give him \$6,000 additional at a later date.

On that date, May 25, 1950, JULIUS ROSENBERG and DAVID GREENGLASS took a walk, at which time ROSENBERG gave GREENGLASS instructions for travel to Czechoslovakia.

On May 28, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS, RUTH GREENGLASS and their children went to the photographer on Clinton Street near their home and had photographs for passports taken. DAVID GREENGLASS picked up these photographs on the night of May 28th. Although he did not plan to leave the United States, he had these passport photos taken for fear that otherwise, JULIUS ROSENBERG would furnish him no more money.

On May 30, 1950 (Memorial Day), JULIUS ROSENBERG came to DAVID GREENGLASS' apartment, at which time GREENGLASS furnished the passport photographs of himself and family to JULIUS ROSENBERG.

On June 4, 1950, JULIUS ROSENBERG returned to the GREENGLASS apartment with a package, which he said contained \$4,000, which he gave to GREENGLASS. The two men took a walk, during which DAVID GREENGLASS, at the request of JULIUS ROSENBERG, repeated to ROSENBERG the instructions for traveling to Czechoslovakia, which ROSENBERG had previously given him, in order to satisfy ROSENBERG that he had memorized these instructions.

Mr. MAX MILLER, proprietor of MILLER PHOTO SHOP, 130 Clinton Street, New York City, made available negatives of the passport photographs taken by him for DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS and family.

Mr. MILLER advised that he was able to recall taking these photographs because he especially remembered DAVID GREENGLASS' son, STEPHEN GREENGLASS, because they had had such a difficult time trying to get him to smile.

P E N D I N G

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ADMINISTRATIVE DATA

HARRY GOLD advised SA Joseph C. Walsh that while conferring with DAVID GREENGLASS at the New York City Prison, that GREENGLASS had told him that he had received the Order of the Red Star through JULIUS ROSENBERG and that ROSENBERG had also received this Soviet citation.

RUTH GREENGLASS advised SA John A. Harrington that she had told her attorney G. JOHN ROGGE about the aforementioned passport photographs in August, 1950, and had asked him to notify the F.B.I. and that he had said that he would do so.

Mr. ROGGE advised SA Harrington that the above information is true, and that he had simply forgotten to bring this matter to the attention of the FBI.

Photographs of the following individuals have been exhibited to DAVID GREENGLASS, and he advised that he is unfamiliar with either the names or photographs:

GREENGLASS also advised that he has no information concerning BERTHA ~~ESKIN~~ nor IRVING ~~GOLDBERG~~, with aliases, Isie ~~Goldberg~~, Isidora ~~Goldberg~~, "Itany" ~~Goldberg~~.

Upon viewing the photograph of RAYMOND ANTHONY LOPEZ, DAVID GREENGLASS stated that this photograph looked very much like the Spanish-speaking man who came to see JULIUS ROSENBERG with RUSSELL ~~McNUTT~~ in 1946 or 1947 at the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY in New York City. GREENGLASS stated, however, that he could not be positive of the identification, and that he is unable to recall whether or not the man had a moustache.

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ADMINISTRATIVE (Cont'd)

When asked to explain why his common stock at the PITT MACHINE PRODUCTS COMPANY, INC. was endorsed by him to JULIUS ROSENBERG on January 4, 1950, but not cancelled on the books of the company until May 1, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS furnished the following explanation:

He had been wanting to get rid of this PITT MACHINE stock since September, 1949, and had carried on negotiations with JULIUS ROSENBERG from that time for the latter to purchase the stock. These negotiations had been prolonged because RUTH GREENGLASS thought DAVID should get \$2,000 or \$3,000 for the stock, and ROSENBERG was unable to pay that amount for the stock.

In January, 1950, ROSENBERG told DAVID GREENGLASS that he wanted DAVID's stock because he felt that if he had control of the stock he would be able to negotiate with DAVID SHEIN for the latter's preferred and common stock.

JULIUS ROSENBERG promised DAVID that he would pay \$1,000 for the latter's stock, with payment to be made at such times as the earnings of the corporation would permit.

On the basis of the above offer, GREENGLASS took his stock to BENJAMIN GELMAN, Notary Public, and had his signature notarized as signing over the stock to JULIUS ROSENBERG on January 4, 1950. He intended to turn over the stock to ROSENBERG immediately thereafter, but did not because RUTH GREENGLASS objected to giving up the stock without payment.

About May 1, 1950, JULIUS ROSENBERG told DAVID that he thought that he could get SHEIN out of the corporation if he were in possession of all outstanding stock other than that held by SHEIN. At that time, DAVID GREENGLASS had decided that he would be unable to obtain any money for the stock and, therefore, surrendered it to JULIUS ROSENBERG.

Correspondence of DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS

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ADMINISTRATIVE (Cont'd)

indicates that RUTH was living at 266 Stanton Street, New York City until about February 24, 1945. DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH GREENGLASS stated that she lived at that address until she moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico about March 1, 1945.

MRS. FRANK WILENTZ, 690 Fort Washington Avenue, advised that her husband owns and operates the apartment building at 266 Stanton Street, and that his rent receipts reflect that DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS rented apartment 4-C at 266 Stanton Street, New York City from December, 1942 through February, 1945.

DAVID GREENGLASS advised that he is under the impression that MRS. MARK PAGE, prior to her marriage, had been the fiancée of DR. MAX HART, and that ETHEL ROSENBERG had first consulted DR. HART upon the recommendation of MRS. MARK PAGE.

RUTH GREENGLASS advised that she has never heard of either BERTHA ESKIN or ARTHUR SHARFIN.

The books of the PITT MACHINE PRODUCTS COMPANY, INC. reflect that Check No. 2356, payable to JULIUS ROSENBERG in the amount of \$800 had been voided and not issued.

In regard to this check, DAVID GREENGLASS advised when the PITT CORPORATION was first formed, that DAVID SHEIN, who became a principal at that time, agreed to pay DAVID and BERNARD GREENGLASS and JULIUS ROSENBERG \$800 for the good will of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY, which was being taken over by the PITT MACHINE PRODUCTS COMPANY, INC. GREENGLASS said that the above mentioned check was written by JULIUS ROSENBERG in payment for the good will, but that he apparently had been unable to obtain SHEIN's signature on the check.

When questioned concerning the balance sheet of the PITT MACHINE PRODUCTS COMPANY, INC. dated December 31, 1949, DAVID GREENGLASS advised that since he was not active

in the company on that date, he knows nothing concerning the balance sheet. He said that he would not be able to estimate the inventory on that date, and is of the opinion that it would be very difficult for anyone to arrive at an accurate estimate of the value of the inventory.

He believes that the purpose of the balance sheet may have been either to obtain a bank loan or in connection with a bid on a Government contract. He said that he believes that JULIUS ROSENBERG maintained an estimate file for Government contracts.

The books of the PITT MACHINE PRODUCTS COMPANY, INC. reflect that there was no shop payroll from October, 1948 to April, 1949. DAVID GREENGLASS advised that during that period, the only persons working at PITT were himself, BERNARD GREENGLASS and JULIUS ROSENBERG. They were drawing no pay during that period in order to enable the company to pay off its debts. DAVID GREENGLASS said that he recalls that he was working so hard during that time that he had to quit attending night school.

He said that the principals in the company drew no salaries from October, 1948 to July 28, 1950, as reflected by the books of the company, and that during that period, he had spent all of his savings on living expenses. He also advised that BERNARD GREENGLASS had lived on his savings, and that JULIUS ROSENBERG claimed that he obtained money for living expenses from his friends.

DAVID GREENGLASS advised that the "Hebrew Loan" reflected in the records of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY refers to a loan obtained by his mother, TESSIE GREENGLASS, in the amount of \$500, which she had obtained with no interest charges from the HEBREW FREE LOAN SOCIETY located on 6th or 7th Street, near Second Avenue in New York City. He said that this loan, which was obtained for the benefit of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY, was paid off by that company.

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ADMINISTRATIVE (Cont'd)

When reinterviewed concerning NATHAN SUSSMAN, DAVID GREENGLASS advised that he first met SUSSMAN about 1937 or 1938 as a friend of JULIUS ROSENBERG who frequented the apartment at that time occupied by DAVID GREENGLASS and his sister ETHEL. In this way, he continued to see SUSSMAN until about 1939 when ETHEL married JULIUS ROSENBERG. He said that about 1939, SUSSMAN was interested in the use of electronics to operate automatic machine tools, and at that time SUSSMAN and JULIUS ROSENBERG were very good friends and shared the same political beliefs.

GREENGLASS is under the impression that he has not seen SUSSMAN since 1939, although he recalls JULIUS ROSENBERG mentioned SUSSMAN several times between 1946 and 1949, saying that he had received letters from SUSSMAN and that the latter was married.

GREENGLASS is of the belief that ETHEL ROSENBERG probably carried on the correspondence with SUSSMAN because JULIUS ROSENBERG "is not a letter-writer".

RUTH GREENGLASS advised that she does not recognize either NATHAN SUSSMAN's name or photograph, and believes that she has never met him.

After reviewing the records of the capital investment shown on the books of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY, DAVID GREENGLASS advised that he is of the opinion that these records are correct. He said that the books of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY had been kept by ISIDORE GOLDSTEIN, who was an accountant.

DAVID GREENGLASS said that the \$310 withdrawn by him on July 23, 1946, was used for a downpayment on his furniture. He advised that the two \$500 amounts had been withdrawn by BERNARD GREENGLASS on July 23, 1946, and in August, 1946 were used as downpayments on machinery purchased by the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY.

He is of the opinion that the other withdrawals of capital listed were made to meet payrolls and were listed under the name of whichever partner happened to go to the bank to get the payroll money.

DAVID GREENGLASS advised that the capital investment of \$3870 on July 16, 1946 listed to BERNARD GREENGLASS had been borrowed from relatives for the benefit of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY.

The records of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY reflect Check No. 1093 dated October 14, 1946 in the amount of \$200 payable to T. GREENGLASS marked for "Comm. on job" and this amount is offset by a \$200 charge to the Armco job.

DAVID GREENGLASS explained that T. GREENGLASS is his mother, and that the above mentioned \$200 was in payment for work done by his father, BARNET GREENGLASS, on the STEVE JAVNA contract, which involved "Armco" Iron, having magnetic qualities.

GREENGLASS explained that his father's machine shop business had been put in the name of TESSIE GREENGLASS because BARNET GREENGLASS had been too generous in becoming the co-signer on notes for his friends who were in need of money.

The records of the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY reflect the receipt of \$25 on March 10, 1947, and \$63 on April 15, 1947 from BRUCE ROSENBERG for the BRUCE ROSENBERG job.

In regard to this, DAVID GREENGLASS advised that the G & R ENGINEERING COMPANY had made some tools for the wood-working shop of BRUCE ROSENBERG, who was a cousin of ISADORE GOLDSTEIN. GREENGLASS believes that BRUCE ROSENBERG was located in Philadelphia at that time.

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ADMINISTRATIVE (Cont'd)

By letter of January 20, 1951, the Albuquerque Office was requested to obtain a photograph of HYMAN ADLER through the Atomic Energy Commission at Los Alamos, New Mexico.

Concerning the attempts of JULIUS ROSENBERG to get him to attend the University of Chicago, DAVID GREENGLASS furnished the following information to SA John A. Harrington:

Mr. [unclear] DAVID GREENGLASS had told JULIUS ROSENBERG that EMANUEL SCHWARTZ was a mathematical physicist who had been an instructor at the University of Chicago prior to being employed on the Atomic Bomb Project at Los Alamos. At the time that SCHWARTZ left Los Alamos, he gave GREENGLASS his telephone number and suggested that GREENGLASS call him if he were ever in Chicago.

When GREENGLASS was discharged from the Army, he stopped off in Chicago while en route to New York City, and called the number SCHWARTZ had given him, and was advised by MRS. SCHWARTZ that MR. SCHWARTZ was then working at the University of Chicago.

GREENGLASS stated that he has not seen or heard from SCHWARTZ since that time.

GREENGLASS also told ROSENBERG that THOMAS FINEBERG, who was employed at the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project, had been a student at the University of Chicago at the time he was drafted into the Army, and had intended to return to the University to continue his studies upon his discharge.

JULIUS ROSENBERG told DAVID GREENGLASS that if GREENGLASS were to enroll at the University of Chicago, he would be able to continue his friendship with FINEBERG and SCHWARTZ, and perhaps through that friendship, would be able to obtain additional information concerning new developments in the field of nuclear physics.

DETAILS: AT LOS ALAMOS, NEW MEXICO

On March 26, 1951, while being interviewed in connection with another matter, Mr. JAMES S. CHURCH, CMR Division, Los Alamos Scientific Laboratories, Los Alamos, New Mexico, advised that he had formerly lived in the same barracks as subject GREENGLASS at Los Alamos. He stated that NORMAN GREENSPAN, WILLIAM SPINDEL and GREENGLASS lived in the same corner of the barracks and associated with each other almost continuously.

The other men in the barracks had little to do with them. He stated that another associate of GREENGLASS at Los Alamos was THOMAS A. FINEBERG. CHURCH stated that FINEBERG bragged about the fact that he was a liberal and had stated that he had a lot of the same ideas as the Communists. He advised that FINEBERG had also commented that he had his ideas first and that the fact that they coincided with the ideas of the Communists was an accident. CHURCH stated that he had heard at one time that while FINEBERG was in the United States Army he had made a trip through the south and had demanded that he be allowed to sit in the Negro cars on trains.

CHURCH also advised that he vaguely recalled that when either FINEBERG or GREENGLASS would read an article in the "New Republic" or some other magazine, they would call it to the other's attention and discuss the articles with each other.

CHURCH stated that he considered all of the individuals mentioned above as being liberal in their political views, but that he had no definite information that they were pro-Communist. He advised that while he was stationed at Los Alamos in the United States Army, his wife had resided ^{at} Albuquerque, New Mexico, and that he had ridden to Albuquerque with WILLIAM SPINDEL on a number of occasions, and a few times with GREENGLASS. CHURCH recalled that when SPINDEL left Los Alamos, he had made the remark that he had been denied clearance because his wife was formerly a member of the Communist Party.



A few days later ROSENBERG introduced DAVID GREENGLASS to an unknown Russian with whom GREENGLASS discussed the high explosive lens experiment mentioned above.

During January 1945 ROSENBERG furnished GREENGLASS with a means of identifying an espionage courier who would contact him subsequently at Albuquerque, New Mexico to obtain further information.

On June 3rd, 1945 DAVID GREENGLASS was contacted at Albuquerque, New Mexico by HARRY GOLD, who appropriately identified himself as the above-mentioned courier. GREENGLASS furnished to GOLD certain confidential and restricted information regarding atomic energy, together with a list of scientists employed there and a list of employees who might be recruited into espionage. HARRY GOLD gave the defendant \$500.00 cash for the above information.

In September 1945 the defendant went to New York City on furlough, where he met JULIUS ROSENBERG who gave him, GREENGLASS, \$200.00. At that time GREENGLASS furnished to ROSENBERG a sketch and a written description of the make-up of the atomic bomb, as well as lists of scientists at Los Alamos and persons employed there who might be recruited to furnish secret information to the Soviet Union. DAVID GREENGLASS gathered the above information concerning the Los Alamos Project, its employees and the atomic bomb through his regularly assigned duties, through observation and through conversations with other employees on the Project.

Because of the defendant's past assistance in Soviet espionage, JULIUS ROSENBERG gave DAVID GREENGLASS during the period from 1946 through 1949 several sums of money. DAVID GREENGLASS estimates the total of these sums to be between \$1,000.00 and \$2,000.00

On May 24th, 1950 the newspapers announced the arrest of HARRY GOLD at Philadelphia as an espionage agent. On that date JULIUS ROSENBERG gave DAVID GREENGLASS \$1,000.00

in cash to assist him in fleeing from the United States. On June 4th, 1950 ROSENBERG gave DAVID GREENGLASS an additional \$4,000.00 in cash for the same purpose. GREENGLASS has spent all of the espionage money received by him, \$3,900.00 of which was paid to his attorney as a retainer subsequent to his arrest.

DAVID GREENGLASS was arrested on June 16th, 1950 at New York City on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage in violation of Sub-Section A, Section 32, Title 50, United States Code. He remained in the custody of the United States Marshal, Southern District of New York in lieu of \$100,000 bail from that date until he was sentenced.

On July 6th, 1950 the defendant was indicted in the District of New Mexico, for the above violation.

On October 10th, 1950 DAVID GREENGLASS was indicted for violation of Sub-Section A, Section 32, Title 50, United States Code in the Southern District of New York, naming him as a co-defendant with JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV and MORTON SOBELL, in a conspiracy to commit espionage by transmitting to the USSR information relating to the national defense of the United States during time of war.

On October 18th, 1950 DAVID GREENGLASS entered a plea of guilty to the second indictment mentioned above. On January 31st, 1951 the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York returned an indictment superseding the one dated October 10th, 1950. The last two indictments were the same except that the first date of the conspiracy was changed from November 1st, 1944 to June 6th, 1944. The indictment dated January 31st, 1951 reads as follows:

*The Grand Jury charges:

"1. On or about June 6, 1944, up to and including June 16, 1950, at the Southern District of New York, and elsewhere, JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV,

also known as 'John', DAVID GREENGLASS and MORTON SOBELL, the defendants herein, did, the United States of America then and there being at war, conspire, combine, confederate and agree with each other and with HARRY GOLD and RUTH GREENGLASS, named as co-conspirators but not as defendants, and with divers other persons presently to the Grand Jury unknown, to violate sub-section (a) of Section 32, Title 50, United States Code, in that they did conspire, combine, confederate and agree, with intent and reason to believe that it would be used to the advantage of a foreign nation, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, to communicate, deliver and transmit to a foreign government, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and representatives and agents thereof, directly and indirectly, documents, writings, sketches, notes and information relating to the National Defense of the United States of America.

OVERT ACTS

"1. In pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the District of Columbia, on or about June 6, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG visited a building at 247 Delaware Avenue, Washington, D.C.

"2. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about November 15, 1944, the defendants JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG conferred with RUTH GREENGLASS.

"3. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about November 20, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG gave RUTH GREENGLASS a sum of money.

"4. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about November 20, 1944, RUTH GREENGLASS boarded a train for New Mexico.

"5. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about December 10, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG went to 266 Stanton Street, New York City.

"6. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about December 10, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG received from RUTH GREENGLASS a paper containing written information.

"7. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 5, 1945, the defendants JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG conferred with the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH GREENGLASS.

"8. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 5, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG gave RUTH GREENGLASS a portion of the side of a torn cardboard "Jelle" box.

"9. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 10, 1945; the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG introduced the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS to a man on First Avenue, New York City.

"10. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 12, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG conferred with the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS.

"11. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 12, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG received from the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS a paper containing sketches of experiments conducted at the Los Alamos Project.

"12. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 14th, 1945, the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS boarded a train for New Mexico."

"(Section 34, Title 50, United States Code)."

On February 2nd, 1951 DAVID GREENGLASS withdrew his plea of guilty to the indictment dated October 10th, 1950 and entered a plea of guilty to the indictment dated January 31st, 1951 before Honorable HENRY W. GODDARD, United States District Judge, Southern District of New York.

On April 6th, 1951 Honorable IRVING R. KAUFMAN, United States District Judge, Southern District of New York, sentenced DAVID GREENGLASS to a term of fifteen years in prison on his guilty plea to the indictment dated January 31st, 1951. The above sentence will terminate on April 5th, 1966.

AGGRAVATING AND MITIGATING CIRCUMSTANCES

The defendant's brother, SAMUEL GREENGLASS, advised that when DAVID GREENGLASS was about twelve years of age, because of the small size of his parents' apartment, DAVID GREENGLASS moved into an apartment with his sister ETHEL and his brother BERNARD on an upper floor of the same building at 64 Sheriff Street, New York City. ETHEL GREENGLASS was then nineteen years of age and was being courted by JULIUS ROSENBERG, although ETHEL's parents had forbidden her to see JULIUS ROSENBERG. SAMUEL GREENGLASS stated that by that time both ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG were avowed Communists and expounded on their ideological views to DAVID GREENGLASS. According to SAMUEL GREENGLASS, DAVID was not affected by this for a short time because he disliked JULIUS ROSENBERG, but after the latter bought DAVID a chemistry set, the two became close friends.

The defendant's brother SAMUEL advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG continued to be a frequent visitor at the apartment occupied by DAVID GREENGLASS until ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG were married in 1939. During that time DAVID GREENGLASS became very fond of JULIUS ROSENBERG and was fully converted to Communist ideals due to the influence of ETHEL GREENGLASS and JULIUS ROSENBERG.

As a result, DAVID joined the Young Communist League at the age of fourteen. When the defendant's older brother SAMUEL learned of the influence ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG had over DAVID GREENGLASS, he offered to pay their passage to Russia if they would promise to remain there. This offer was declined.

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife advised that DAVID GREENGLASS complied with the request to furnish secret information for the benefit of the Soviet Union because of his Communist ideals, and to comply with the desire of his sister ETHEL and his brother-in-law JULIUS ROSENBERG, so that he might stay in their good graces.

Since his arrest, DAVID GREENGLASS claims to have made a complete confession to the FBI concerning his participation and knowledge of Soviet espionage. He was a key government witness in the trial in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, which resulted in the conviction, for conspiracy to commit espionage, of his sister ETHEL and his brother-in-law JULIUS ROSENBERG. DAVID GREENGLASS testified at the above trial on March 9th, 12th, 13th and 14th, 1951.

At the time Judge KAUFMAN sentenced DAVID GREENGLASS, he commented that he found the defendant's acts of espionage to be loathsome and that he could not condone or minimize those acts. He said, however, that he recognized the help given by DAVID GREENGLASS in the apprehension and bringing to justice the arch criminals in this nefarious scheme, and commended DAVID GREENGLASS for his confession and assistance to the Government and stated it took a great deal of courage for DAVID GREENGLASS to testify as he did against his own sister to assist the United States in this matter. Judge KAUFMAN remarked that DAVID GREENGLASS had helped the United States strike a death blow against the traffic in military secrets. Judge KAUFMAN stated that DAVID GREENGLASS had, in the past, believed that Russia was utopia and he had, in fact, enlisted in what amounted to the Russian Foreign Legion, but that GREENGLASS had found his way back before the curtain had fallen upon his life.

PERSONAL HISTORY

DAVID GREENGLASS is twenty-nine years of age and a citizen of the United States. The defendant stated that his mother told him that he was born on March 3rd, 1922 on the kitchen table of the ground floor flat occupied by his parents at 64 Sheriff Street, New York City, a tenement building in an overcrowded section of the lower East Side of Manhattan, New York. According to SAMUEL GREENGLASS, his father BARNET GREENGLASS, a Russian emigrant, was then past fifty years of age and the operator of a small machine shop in front of his flat at 64 Sheriff Street, from which he was able to earn only enough to buy the bare necessities of life for his four children and his wife, TESSIE FEIT GREENGLASS, a Polish emigrant who was then forty years of age.

According to SAMUEL GREENGLASS, DAVID GREENGLASS continued to live at 64 Sheriff Street until his marriage. The neighbors in that vicinity state that his parents enjoyed a good reputation in the neighborhood, and that his father was considered to be honest and a good machinist.

DAVID GREENGLASS was educated in the public schools of New York. He attended Public School #4 for six years and Public School #97 for three years. He attended Haaren Aviation High School for three years, where he studied machine shop work and aviation and graduated in January 1940. He studied mechanical engineering from January 1940 to June 1940 at the Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute, Brooklyn, New York. Thereafter, he studied mechanical design at Pratt Institute for one and one half terms during 1948.

According to SAMUEL GREENGLASS, DAVID GREENGLASS has been steadily employed since he became old enough to work. The defendant has furnished the following information concerning his employment: During his early life he helped in his father's machine shop. He worked part-time assisting SAM FREUND, an electrician at Broadway and 22nd Street, New York City, from 1936 to 1938.

During 1939 and 1940 he was employed by the Freeman Machine Shop on Broadway near 8th Street, New York City, and was employed as a machinist maintenance man in 1940 by the International Telephone and Telegraph Company, New York City, and he

resigned when that company moved to New Jersey. He then worked for a short time in a machine shop of Eugene Limited, New York City, where he used the name of DAVID GREENE. He claims to have resorted to the device of an alias because he felt that this company might have anti-Semitic feelings and would be reluctant to hire him if he used the name GREENGLASS. He was employed by the Peerless Machinery Company from 1941 to 1943. He was inducted into the United States Army on April 5th, 1943 and was used as a machinist by the Army until his honorable discharge on February 28th, 1946. While in the Army, he was assigned to the Los Alamos Atomic Bomb Project from August 5th, 1944 until February 27th, 1946. After his discharge from the Army, he became a partner in the Wholesalers & Distributors Company, 64 Sheriff Street, New York City with ISADORE GOLDSTEIN, BERNARD GREENGLASS and JULIUS ROSENBERG. This firm engaged in buying and selling government surplus machinery and after a few months operation it became the G & R Company.

In 1947 the G & R Company was taken over by the Pitt Machine Products Company, Inc., in which DAVID GREENGLASS owned one-fourth of common stock. The other stockholders in this company were his brother BERNARD GREENGLASS, his brother-in-law JULIUS ROSENBERG, all of whom took an active part in conducting the corporation's business, and a fourth person DAVID SCHEIN, who had only a financial interest in the corporation and who owned \$15,000 in preferred stock, as well as 25% of common stock.

DAVID GREENGLASS continued to work in the Pitt Machine Products Company on a full-time basis until August 1949, when he left that corporation because he was not making any money. He was then employed as a machinist by the Arma Corporation, Brooklyn, New York from September 1949 until the date of his arrest. At the Arma Corporation, his earnings ranged from \$76.00 to \$127.00 per week.

The following information was furnished by the defendant's wife:

DAVID GREENGLASS married RUTH PRINTZ on November 29th, 1942 at New York City. RUTH was born on May 1st, 1923 at New York City and lived all her life in the same neighborhood, in which DAVID GREENGLASS was reared. Her parents were emigrants, her father coming from Hungary and her mother from Austria. The PRINTZ family consisted of the parents and four children.

They lived in very poor circumstances similar to the manner in which the GREENGLASS family lived. During their married life DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH GREENGLASS have been very devoted to one another and, because of this devotion, RUTH GREENGLASS espoused the cause of Communism at the request of DAVID GREENGLASS. Both DAVID and RUTH claim now to be disillusioned with Communism as they realize Russia's plans for world conquest and realize that the Russians may use the atomic bomb to destroy everything that is near and dear to both of them.

The defendant and his wife stated that they have continued to live in the same neighborhood in which they were born, occupying cold-water flats, very near their parents, and have two children, STEPHEN born August 8th, 1946 and BARBARA born May 16th, 1950. Both DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS claim to be very fond of children and, at the time of DAVID's arrest, said they were planning to adopt a two year old daughter of DAVID's brother, BERNARD, whose wife was about to die.

At the present time DAVID and RUTH state they have no funds to support their children and that their relatives are in poor financial circumstances. According to his neighbors at 265 Rivington Street, New York City, DAVID GREENGLASS enjoyed a good reputation in his community prior to the disclosure of his espionage activities.

Records of the New York City Police Department and of the Identification Division of the FBI failed to reflect any record of a prior arrest for DAVID GREENGLASS.

Rebulet 4/3/51 requesting information concerning the personality of captioned subject and like details which do not appear in the usual investigative report.

From the outset of the investigation GREENGLASS has exhibited a friendly, easy going, self assured manner. He is extremely garrulous and expounds at length on inconsequential matters. He is sometimes impatient and sarcastic, but usually is able to control his emotions. GREENGLASS appears both courageous and honest. He is loyal to his family and friends and is generous to the point of improvidence. He has a sense of humor and enjoys a joke. He takes pleasure in attempting to startle others by his unexpected knowledge of facts and situations. He dresses in a sloppy manner and in rather poor taste, possibly because of color blindness. He does not like to shave regularly, and has his hair cut infrequently. GREENGLASS is a moderate cigarette smoker and does not care for alcoholic drinks. He is extremely fond of food and tends toward obesity.

GREENGLASS is inclined to avoid physical exercise. He enjoys movies, chess, conversation, and tampering with gadgets, and attempting to improve them.

Most of his reading is directed toward popular mechanics and scientific magazines. He appears to be of above average intelligence and is better informed than his scholastic achievements would seem to indicate.

GREENGLASS is very devoted to his wife and two children. He was planning to adopt a two year old niece at the time of his arrest.

The following circumstances led to DAVID'S Communistic indoctrination. He was deprived to some extent of the guidance of his anti-Communist parents during his adolescence, because there was insufficient room in his parents' small cold water flat for grown children. Thus, of necessity, the older children occupied a flat on an upper floor of the tenement building. When the oldest brother SAMUEL married and moved away from home in 1932, DAVID moved into this upper flat to live with his brother BERNARD and sister ETHEL. DAVID was then 12 while ETHEL was 19. ETHEL soon became a violent Communist.

About 1934 or 1935, ~~JULIUS ROSENBERG~~, also a violent Communist, began to spend most of his time in this apartment with ETHEL and brought Communist literature and Communist friends to the apartment. After several years of constant exposure to this Communist influence, DAVID was convinced that the Communists were right. He joined the neighborhood Young Communist League about 1937. His attendance at meetings was infrequent, and the officers had difficulty in collecting dues from him. He dropped out of the YCL after a year or two. Although GREENGLASS believed that Communism was the answer to the world's problems, his attitude towards personal participation was so lackadaisical that he never joined the Communist Party because he did not desire to submit to the rigorous discipline demanded by Party membership.

Although GREENGLASS was not a CP member, he was a Communist at heart and followed the activities of the CP through its publications until about 1948.

When TITO of Yugoslavia was expelled from the Cominform, GREENGLASS realized that Communism was being used as a tool by the USSR for the purpose of world conquest, instead of working toward panacea.

It is believed that GREENGLASS did not derive any personal feeling of relief by his confession because his crime had not weighed on his conscience. He had rationalized his acts of espionage as being just and proper because he felt the U.S. was withholding information from the USSR to which he believed the USSR was entitled. During the period between the arrest of HARRY GOLD and his own arrest, GREENGLASS was apparently unable to decide whether to flee to the Soviet Union or remain in the U.S.

It appears that he was pleased to have the course of events relieve him of the problem of making this difficult decision. After his confession, GREENGLASS appeared to derive considerable satisfaction from the attention and publicity he received in the preparation for the trial of the conspirators against whom he testified. He appears to be satisfied with his 15 year sentence.

While talking with Assistant Attorney General McInerney of the Department on April 17, he mentioned the fact that O. John Rogge, attorney for Subject Greenglass, is alleged to have informed Greenglass' mother that he had had a deal with McInerney that Greenglass would be sentenced to three years. McInerney stated that as a matter of fact he had had no such deal with Rogge. He said he had told Rogge that he would see to it that any cooperation furnished by Greenglass to the Government would be called to the attention of court authorities in connection with his sentencing, and that he had done this. He said specifically, however, that he was writing a letter recommending that Greenglass be granted parole when he is eligible for parole. He said he was going to do this now since he did not know whether he would be around when Greenglass came up for parole. He said he was doing this because he felt that Greenglass' cooperation with the Government had contributed immeasurably to the success of the case, pointing out that Greenglass had testified against his sister at the trial of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

Details:

On April 6, 1951, subject was sentenced to a term of fifteen years by Judge IRVING R. KAUFMAN, United States District Court Judge, Southern District of New York, on his plea of guilty that he conspired to commit espionage.

Since imposition of sentence, GREENGLASS has been confined to the New York City Prison, White Street, New York City. Since his imprisonment, GREENGLASS has been interviewed weekly by the reporting agent, SA WILLIAM F. NORTON, JR., and SA ROBERT F. ROYAL. During these interviews, GREENGLASS has been questioned carefully concerning all of the events in this matter which have been previously submitted.

He has also been questioned and interviewed concerning various other individuals of whom he may have had some knowledge. In most instances, GREENGLASS did not know the individuals in question.

The Bureau is advised that during this review of subject's story, there have been no major changes or additions to what has been previously reported except as hereinafter set forth.

On April 16, 1951, GREENGLASS was interviewed by SA JOHN W. LEWIS. GREENGLASS stated that while he was standing by the milling machine at Pitt Machine Products, Inc., either in September or October, 1948, or possibly in the Spring of 1948, he was having a conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG and BERNARD GREENGLASS, his brother. During this conversation, ROSENBERG mentioned that the mathematics had all been worked out for the construction of an atomic energy airplane motor. Later, DAVID asked JULIUS in private how JULIUS knew about this, and he replied that he had learned it from one of his boys. DAVID questioned JULIUS about the possibility of the plane's pilot receiving radiation burns. JULIUS said that this had been solved by placing the pilot and the passengers far away from the shielded power plant.

The writer reinterviewed GREENGLASS, but he was unable to add any further information to the foregoing except that he did not believe that MORRIS ISRAEL was present during this conversation between himself, JULIUS ROSENBERG and BERNARD GREENGLASS, as he had previously advised SA LEWIS.

The writer interviewed BERNARD GREENGLASS concerning this incident, but he was unable to recall such a conversation.

On April 4, 1951, a photograph of one ~~ARTHUR SPRIGMAN~~ was exhibited to GREENGLASS by SA JOHN W. LEWIS. GREENGLASS identified this photograph as one ARTHUR who had come to the apartment occupied by ~~DAVID~~ and ~~ETHEL GREENGLASS~~ sometime during the 1930's on four or five occasions. GREENGLASS recalled that this individual played the violin and piano and on one occasion, repaired a violin. He also recalled that ARTHUR was either an associate or a partner in the Como Aeronautical Company on 17th Street, which was started by a negro named ~~WILLIAMS~~ who was an aviator, and that both JULIUS ROSENBERG and ~~MARK PAGE~~ were also working for the Como Aeronautical Company.

GREENGLASS recalled that JULIUS ROSENBERG had become angry with both WILLIAMS and SPRIGMAN concerning the business. He stated that he has not seen SPRIGMAN since ~~JULIUS~~ and ~~ETHEL ROSENBERG~~ were married in 1939, and that it was several years prior to that time when he last saw him. GREENGLASS was under the impression that SPRIGMAN was a Communist and believes he heard some mention that he was a member of the Communist Party.

He also stated that he believes that all of the individuals associated with the Como Aeronautical Company were Communists. He stated that he believed SPRIGMAN came from Canada, had once served a jail sentence, possibly for embezzlement, and had been married several times.

On June 30, 1951 and July 2, 1951, GREENGLASS was interviewed by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL, WILLIAM F. NORTON, JR., and the reporting agent.

GREENGLASS advised during the Christmas holiday period of 1949, he went to see JULIUS ROSENBERG at the Pitt Machine Products Company, 307 East Houston Street, New York City, for the purpose of discussing his status in this business. DAVID explained that he had a stock certificate for twenty-five of the 100 outstanding shares

in this business and he desired to sell his shares to ROSENBERG. ROSENBERG explained to GREENGLASS in the office of the Pitt Machine Products Company during a preliminary discussion pertaining to business that he was attempting to borrow \$5000 from a cousin in order to buy DAVID SHEIN'S twenty-five shares. He told DAVID GREENGLASS that GREENGLASS should sign over his stock shares to him. ROSENBERG said that he did not want to alarm him but that "you will have to begin thinking about going away to Paris" and that GREENGLASS was "hot."

GREENGLASS stated that his interest mounted and he became quite excited. ROSENBERG invited him to have a cup of coffee with him at the corner luncheonette located at Houston Street and Avenue C. While sitting at a booth in the luncheonette, ROSENBERG explained that GREENGLASS and his wife should obtain U.S. passports visced for France, by applying at the Department of State and at the French Consulate, both in New York City. GREENGLASS was to state as his purpose that he owned property in France and that he desired to dispose of it. This trip was to be accomplished via ship travelling from the Port of New York to a French port. He was told that money would be provided for the trip and that in Paris, he would make contact with someone in their "espionage ring."

GREENGLASS advised that he questioned ROSENBERG as to why he was to leave the United States and JULIUS explained that "something is happening which will cause you to leave the United States." ROSENBERG said that he would have to get rid of the other apartment. DAVID said he asked JULIUS, "Do you mean the 12th Street (and Avenue B) apartment?" JULIUS said, "No, I mean the Greenwich Village apartment!" ROSENBERG indicated to DAVID that he had already disposed of the 12th Street apartment.

ROSENBERG indicated to DAVID that he didn't have to worry, that he should sign over his stock

certificate for twenty-five shares, have it notarized, and then bring it to him. DAVID advised that he put him off by stating that it was in his safety deposit box. DAVID advised that he left JULIUS, having agreed to the above request. He told his wife only about the stock certificate part of his discussion with JULIUS. She agreed that he should sign the certificate, have it notarized, and wait until JULIUS paid them for their shares before giving up the certificate.

GREENGLASS further advised that he recalls "feeling uneasy" at a New Years Eve party at the home of JACK SCHLEIDER, 54 Forsyth Street, New York City, telephone: CA 63355, on December 31, 1949. He states that during this party, he thought about what JULIUS had said about going away and definitely recalls reminiscing about his friends who were present and thought that this would probably be the last New Years Eve party that he would spend with them.

He stated that shortly after the first of January, 1950, he signed the stock certificate and had his druggist, a Mr. BENJAMIN P. GELMAN, notarize the certificate.

On July 2, 1951, Assistant United States Attorney JOHN M. FOLEY, Southern District of New York, allowed SA ROYAL to review this stock certificate which was entered as a Defense Exhibit #C-1 in the ROSENBERG trial on March 22, 1951.

GREENGLASS stated that this certificate was surrendered to ROSENBERG on or about May 1, 1950. It is noted that this certificate is marked "Cancelled 5/1/50."

DAVID GREENGLASS stated that a Special Agent of the F.B.I. called him at his home, 265 Rivington Street, New York City, during the morning of January 27, 1950, at which time he arranged an appointment to see GREENGLASS at 2 p.m. that afternoon. DAVID stated

that after the agent's call, he went to see ROSENBERG at Pitt Machine Products Company. He advised JULIUS of his call and appointment. ROSENBERG told him to find out what the agent wants and to get in touch with him later, advising him of the F.B.I. interest.

GREENGLASS advised that the agent interviewed him at his home, 265 Rivington Street, New York City, at 2 p.m. as scheduled. He learned that the agent's inquiry was of a routine nature about the theft of some uranium from Los Alamos. He stated that he went to work after the interview. This was a Friday, and Saturday being the Jewish Sabbath, Pitt Machine Products was not open. On Sunday morning, January 29, 1950, he again contacted ROSENBERG at Pitt Machine Products and advised him of the agent's interest. JULIUS said that there was nothing to worry about.

SA LAWRENCE W. SPILLANE advised that he contacted DAVID GREENGLASS, 265 Rivington Street, New York City, as alleged, at 2 p.m. on January 27, 1950, after having telephoned him that morning to arrange an appointment.

DAVID GREENGLASS advised that after the arrest of KLAUS FUCHS in England, JULIUS ROSENBERG immediately came to his home. DAVID and JULIUS took a walk, at which time he told DAVID that "this guy FUCHS is the man who was contacted in this country by 'DAVE' (HARRY GOLD) and now you will have to leave." JULIUS further advised that FUCHS had been contacted by the British Police prior to his initial contact in December, 1949, and that is the reason why DAVID will have to leave.

DAVID suggested that JULIUS should get hold of "DAVE" and have him lay low for a while. JULIUS countered by explaining that ETHEL (his wife) had said the same thing. He also advised at this time that the "Russians try to work six months ahead of the F.B.I.," explaining that when one man such as FUCHS is contacted,

then they try to anticipate who the F.B.I. will be contacting in six months and get to that man first. In this case, JULIUS reasoned that "DAVE" and GREENGLASS would be next.

Concerning Dr. HANS A. ~~BETHE~~, GREENGLASS stated that he furnished this name, among others, to HARRY GOLD on June 4, 1945, as a possible Soviet espionage recruit. He stated that WILLIAM SPINGELL had advised him that BETHE was a Communist. DAVID stated that he never met BETHE who was then connected with the Los Alamos Atomic Energy Project, as was Greenglass.

GREENGLASS relates that his instructions were to furnish the names of prospective recruits; however, under no circumstances was he to follow up by contacting the individuals. He stated that he never spoke to JULIUS or GOLD again about BETHE, and does not know whether BETHE was recruited. Instructions were received from RUTH ~~GREENGLASS~~, who, in turn, had received them from JULIUS ROSENBERG. GOLD gave the list to ANATOLE A. ~~YAKOVLEV~~, Vice Consul of Russian Consulate, New York City.

This was the last matter discussed with DAVID GREENGLASS before his removal to Lewisburg. He stated that in the event anything came to his attention that he had not previously told, he would either correspond with the reporting agent or have the Warden at Lewisburg contact the Philadelphia Office to have an agent visit him in jail.

He stated that he was reconciled to his term of fifteen years and believes that under all the circumstances, he and his wife were quite fortunate. He stated that he will work hard in jail and will continue to cooperate with the F.B.I. in any matter of which he has knowledge.

Assistant United States Attorney JAMES B. KILSHEIMER, Southern District of New York, advised on July 3, 1951 that the indictment dated October 10, 1950 would not be dismissed until all appeals had been heard and disposed of in the case of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL.

PURPOSE

To recommend the instant case be considered closed. All logical investigation has been completed. Greenglass has been sentenced and is presently serving at Lewisburg Penitentiary. Greenglass is cooperative and is interviewed from time to time relative to other subjects in the Rosenberg network. The results of these interviews will be set forth in the pertinent files. All pertinent data appearing in the Bureau files has been incorporated in the main file on Greenglass.

DETAILS

The New York Office under date of July 27, 1951, submitted a closing report in this case. Previously a parole report had been submitted and it was transmitted to the Bureau of Prisons. On April 6, 1951, Greenglass was sentenced to a term of 15 years by Judge Irving R. Kaufman in the Southern District of New York on his plea of guilty. The New York Office by teletype dated July 6, 1951, advised that Greenglass had been transferred to Lewisburg Penitentiary. It is contemplated that Greenglass, who is cooperative, will be interviewed at various intervals by Agents of the Philadelphia Office. In the event matters of particular importance arise the Agents of the New York Office who have handled the main interviews with him will travel to Lewisburg Penitentiary to handle the interviews. The results of such interviews will, of course, be incorporated in the pertinent files. A review of the Bureau files reflects that all pertinent data has been incorporated in the main file on Greenglass.

RECOMMENDATION

Re: David Greenglass

Dear Mr. Hoover:

You may be interested to know that David Greenglass, a subject of your investigation and subsequent criminal prosecution, was a loan applicant in 1947. Some of the pertinent facts on file at the New York Loan Agency may be of interest to you.

It seems that David Greenglass, then twenty-five years of age - married - and having served in the army, assigned to the Atom Bomb Project, until his honorable discharge on February 28, 1946, entered into a business partnership known as the G & R Engineering Co., on April 18, 1946. The firm's business was listed as engineers and machinists engaged principally in the production of sewing machine devices and parts, located at 300 East 2nd Street, New York 9, N.Y. On September 9, 1947 this enterprise filed a loan application for \$4500. for working capital purposes under the veterans' guarantee provisions of law. On December 30, 1948 the loan application was withdrawn and the matter was closed.



Re Philadelphia tel February 19, 1952, captioned "Emanuel Schwartz, Espionage - R." For the information of the Philadelphia Office, David Greenglass previously advised that while he was at Los Alamos in either 1944 or 1945, he and Schwartz had a cup of coffee together in a cafeteria at Los Alamos, at which time Schwartz told Greenglass the size and make-up of the atom bomb. You will note that this information differs to some degree from the information Greenglass now professes to have just remembered. You should reinterview Greenglass in detail for all information he can recall concerning his relationship with Manuel Schwartz.

The New York Office should interview Ruth Greenglass for information concerning Manuel Schwartz, it being noted that Greenglass states his wife knew Schwartz. The New York Office should also endeavor to determine the extent of Schwartz's testimony before the Federal Grand Jury in New York, it being noted that the New York Office, by teletype of January 23, 1951, reflected that Schwartz was to be subpoenaed before a Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York.

It is noted that the Chicago Office in the report of SA Jeremiah J. Hurley, dated August 7, 1950, in the case entitled "Julius Rosenberg, Espionage - R," did set forth information obtained from Manuel Schwartz in an interview had with him on August 6, 1950. A signed statement was obtained in which Schwartz admitted that he might have told Greenglass of information concerning the atom bomb but that he had no definite recollection of having done so. In view of Greenglass' recent statement that Schwartz had the same sympathies as himself, the Chicago Office should reinterview Schwartz on this point and other phases of this matter. An effort should be made through the interview to determine Schwartz's present sympathies and activities, particularly in view of the fact that he reportedly joined the International Workers Order in 1947.

The Chicago Office should regard itself as office of origin. The New York and Philadelphia Offices should both submit reports. (65-58236-327, 1091, 886 p. 37, 665, 65)

During the course of interviews conducted with David Greenglass following his arrest for espionage he told of two lists of names he prepared of potential espionage recruits who were employed by the Manhattan Engineer District at Los Alamos, New Mexico. He said there were 18 or 19 individuals included on the two lists. The first list he gave to Harry Gold at Albuquerque, New Mexico, in June, 1945. The second list he gave to Julius Rosenberg in New York City.

Greenglass said he did not know that any of the potential recruits listed by him were Communists but that he had learned through either working or living with them at the barracks at Los Alamos that "they were liberal and believed in a welfare state."

(65-58236-886)

Harry Gold when interviewed recalled he did receive a written report from Greenglass at Albuquerque, New Mexico, in June, 1945. He believes the report did include a list of names. He does not recall the names on the list and the only information he can furnish with respect to the names is that the complete report was turned over to Anatoli A. Zakharev, his Soviet espionage superior. He does not know of any action taken by the Soviets with respect to the names.

One of the names Greenglass states he listed was that of Benson Swig, who was stationed at Los Alamos as a member of the Special Engineer Detachment from about December, 1944, to March, 1946.

In March, 1951, Swig was interviewed and related that he first met Greenglass when he arrived at Los Alamos and was assigned to a bunk next to Greenglass. Greenglass, according to Swig, often talked about the progress of organized labor and praised the Russians for their progress and accomplishments during the war. Swig agreed

with Greenglass regarding the progress made by United States workers and related that he was sympathetic to Russia during 1945, which, according to him, was the popular view of that time. He said he is not now and never has been a member of, or sympathetic with the Communist Party and never has been a member of any organization supporting Communism. He said he does not associate with anyone known to him to be a Communist, that he does not know Julius Rosenberg and has not seen Greenglass since leaving Los Alamos in 1946. He stated that he never has been approached by Greenglass or anyone else to furnish any material or information for the aid or use of Russia.

It was concluded that the RUTH GREENGLASS signatures on specimens Q1 and Q3 through Q10 were written by one individual.

No conclusion could be reached whether the handprinted RUTH GREENGLASS signature on Q2 was written by the above individual because this handprinted signature is not comparable with the other handwritten signatures.

It was further concluded that the DAVID GREENGLASS signatures on Q10 were written by a second person.

The remaining writing appearing on specimens Q1 through Q10 is not sufficiently intercomparable or is too limited to warrant a definite conclusion as to whether one or more individuals are involved in its preparation.

In connection with Q2, efforts should be made to obtain known hand-writing and handprinting specimens of RUTH GREENGLASS.

As set forth in the Bureau's teletype to your office on June 15, 1950, the two CPA forms designated as items one and two on page two of your letter of June 8 were submitted by you with a memorandum dated June 6, 1950, to the Mechanical Section. These two documents and photostatic copies of them were returned to you under date of June 13, 1950. Accordingly, the examination of the signature "Mrs. DAVID GREENGLASS" on the back of one of these two documents cannot be made until this material is resubmitted to the Bureau's Laboratory for comparison.

In answer to the Director's inquiry as to the statements of U. S. Attorney Myles J. Lane, S. Dist. of NY, concerning Sky Platforms, this is to advise that during the course of the investigation of Julius Rosenberg, convicted Soviet espionage agent, it was determined through David Greenglass, confessed Soviet espionage agent, that he had been informed by Rosenberg that he knew of certain work being done in up-state NY on a sky platform which was to be suspended at a point where earth's gravity ceased.

The Bureau's early efforts to verify the existence of such a project through the U. S. Army Air Forces developed that the Rand Corp., a subsidiary of Douglas Aircraft, Santa Monica, California, had been engaged in a theoretic basic research project concerning this matter approximately three years previously. It was the purpose of this research project to determine the feasibility and cost of completing such a platform.

Greenglass testified as to the information concerning this platform furnished him by Rosenberg during the espionage trial in NYC during 1951 and one of the officials at the Research & Development Board appeared as a witness in the trial to verify the fact that there had been a research project along those lines.

Detective EDWARDS, Cleveland, Ohio Police Department, advised this office on July 24, 1952 that LUKE HOFMANN, who was presently in the County Jail awaiting Grand Jury action for passing worthless checks, was desirous of speaking to an FBI Agent concerning Communist activity. HOFMANN was interviewed on July 24, 1952 by SAs JOHN G. SULLIVAN and EDWARD A. SHEA and he advised that he was released on July 1, 1952 from Federal Penitentiary at Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, having completed a sentence as a Conditional Release Violator. During his imprisonment he became acquainted with DAVID GREENGLASS while working in the machine shop. On several occasions HOFMANN and GREENGLASS engaged in conversation and HOFMANN expressed strong criticism and embitterment against his country because he was in the Federal Penitentiary. It was on one of these occasions toward the end of his sentence that GREENGLASS proposed a proposition by which HOFMANN could obtain "more money than he had ever seen in his life." HOFMANN was to contact JOHN BELASTRO (phonetic) in San Francisco, California; GREENGLASS did not indicate what HOFMANN would be required to do in order to obtain this money. The following is the only description available as to the place where HOFMANN was to contact BELASTRO -- the first cafe or tavern on the left hand side of Kearney Street (phonetic), starting at the beginning of the street. He was to advise BELASTRO that he had just been released from Lewisburg Federal Pen. The instructions as to the location of the cafe were given by HOFMANN from memory.

GREENGLASS further advised HOFMANN that if he was in need of funds he could obtain same from a hidden cache in Georgia. The exact location of this as given by HOFMANN from memory was as follows -- travelling Route 27 from La Grange to Columbus, Georgia, at the first concrete bridge over a creek, the money would be found in the first cement abutment on the right hand side, one foot up and six inches measured from the side of the abutment away from the road. GREENGLASS told HOFMANN that this money namely \$15,000 was placed in a black bag and set in the foundation when the concrete

was being poured; he also advised that it would be necessary to use a sledge hammer to remove the bag from the concrete. HOFMANN stated that GREENGLASS furnished no further information concerning this money but implied that it was "hot." When questioned as to why he did not go to Georgia himself to obtain the money, HOFMANN replied that he did not have a car to get there. He also advised that he had never been to Georgia in his travels.

HOFMANN commented further that on one occasion he overheard GREENGLASS and another inmate named DOUGLAS CHANDLER (a German announcer) discussing the disappearance of the two British diplomats, BURGESS and MC LEAN, however, he could furnish no details on this matter except that they mentioned the diplomats names.

HOFMANN also related that he was acquainted with ALGER HISS during his period of imprisonment but that HISS never made any overtures of a subversive nature.

HOFMANN stated he had furnished the above information to Major General BERGEN, AGO, Washington, D. C., in May of 1952 while incarcerated at Lewisburg but he had never received a reply.

HOFMANN during the course of the interview appeared mentally balanced and at no time did he mention that he was desirous of having the FBI intercede in his behalf to have his sentence lightened for furnishing the above information. HOFMANN did not seem to have any motive in mind in furnishing the above facts and he stated that the matter had been preying on his mind and, therefore, wanted to advise the proper authorities.

It is to be noted that HOFMANN's story concerning the location of the money sounds far fetched and the information regarding BELASTRO very vague but it is being furnished to the Bureau and interested offices for informational purposes. No further action is contemplated by this office unless further interrogation of HOFMANN is requested by the Bureau or offices receiving copies of this letter.

DAVID GREENGLASS, ESPIONAGE - R. WHILE INTERVIEWING GREENGLASS ON OTHER MATTERS AT THE U.S. PENITENTIARY, LEWISBURG, ON 12/15/52, GREENGLASS COMPLAINED THAT OVER THE PAST MONTHS OTHER INMATES HAVE BEEN HARASSING HIM AND CALLING HIM OBSCENE NAMES BECAUSE IT IS KNOWN TO THOSE INMATES THAT HE WAS COOPERATIVE WITH THE GOVERNMENT, AND PARTICULARLY BECAUSE THEY FEEL THAT HE IS DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE FOR SENDING TO DEATH HIS SISTER, ETHEL ROSENBERG. NO ACTUAL ACTS OF PHYSICAL VIOLENCE HAVE BEEN COMMITTED AGAINST HIM. HE STATED THAT THIS MATTER WAS RELIEVED SOMEWHAT WHEN HE WAS ASSIGNED TO A SPECIAL DIET LINE IN THE MESS HALL AND AS A RESULT DID NOT COME IN CONTACT WITH THE GENERAL INMATE POPULATION THERE, AND THAT IN RECENT MONTHS THE HARASSMENT HAS ABATED TO SOME EXTENT. TRANSFERRED TEMPORARILY TO THE TOMBS IN NEW YORK CITY AND KEPT THERE UNTIL ABOUT MARCH OR APRIL, 1952, AT WHICH TIME THE "HEAT" WILL HAVE DIED DOWN AT LEWISBURG. HE ALSO STATED THAT HE DID NOT FEEL HE WOULD BE SUBJECTED TO SUCH "HEAT" IF TRANSFERRED TO THE FEDERAL REFORMATORY AT DANBURY. IT WAS SUGGESTED THAT HE BRING THIS MATTER TO THE ATTENTION OF PRISON OFFICIALS WHO WOULD BE IN A POSITION TO TRANSFER HIM IF SUCH SEEMED ADVISABLE. HOWEVER, HE SAID THAT HE DID NOT FEEL THAT THE OFFICIALS AT THE PENITENTIARY WOULD RECOMMEND THIS TRANSFER. GREENGLASS WAS TOLD THAT HIS COMPLAINT WOULD BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF AUTHORITIES AT THE LEWISBURG PENITENTIARY, AND FURNISHED TO THE BUREAU FOR ITS INFORMATION. The above-named subject, convicted espionage agent who is serving a 15-year sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Lewisburg, was interviewed by a Bureau agent on December 15, last, concerning other matters. During the course of this interview, Greenglass complained that over the past several months, other inmates have been harassing him because it is known to these inmates that he was cooperative with the Government and particularly because they feel he is directly responsible for sending to death his sister, Ethel Rosenberg. He stated no actual acts of physical violence have been committed against him. For a time this harassment abated to some extent but since the recent newspaper publicity indicating that Ethel and Julius Rosenberg are to be executed during the week of January 19, 1953, the harassment has again commenced. He stated that no one inmate or any particular group of inmates are responsible but that it comes from many inmates and as time for the execution draws nearer he fears that he may be killed or seriously injured by other inmates. Greenglass requested that arrangements be made so that he could be transferred temporarily to the Tombs in New York City and kept there until about March or April, 1953, at which time the "heat" will have died down at Lewisburg. He also stated that he did not feel he would be subjected to such "heat" if transferred to the Federal Reformatory at Danbury. He further stated that prison officials had moved him from the D-3 cell block to D-1 but because of the fearing of inmates in the latter cell block, he requested a transfer back to D-3 which was granted.

Greenglass was advised that the FBI has no control as to where inmates of Federal prisons are assigned and that this is a function of the Bureau of Prisons. It was suggested to him that he bring this matter to the attention of prison officials.

The above matter was discussed by the interviewing Bureau agent on the same date with Mr. J. C. Taylor, Associate Warden. The latter advised that he was aware of Greenglass' fear of the other inmates but that in his opinion much of the cause of this fear lies in Greenglass' mind. He stated that he had Greenglass moved from D-3 to D-1 because correctional officers there would be in a better position to keep him under constant observation in the latter cell block, but because of complaints by Greenglass, he was transferred back to D-3. Mr. Taylor further advised that officers at the Penitentiary have not noted anything to indicate that violence against Greenglass is contemplated by other inmates.

Paradis stated that Greenglass told him he knew a source from whom Paradis could secure a false passport if Paradis ever desired to leave the U.S. Greenglass identified this source as Theodore Harris, a Greek living in Providence, Rhode Island. He told Paradis that he should mention Greenglass' name in contacting Harris. By Buairtel 1-7-59, Boston was requested to establish identity of Harris inasmuch as it appeared story was fabrication. Boston tel 1-9-59 identified Harris as an alias for Theodore Haralampopoulos, ex-convict who was released from Lewisburg a month ago, and which is same place of incarceration as Greenglass and Paradis. Philadelphia being requested to interview Greenglass and Paradis to determine which one made up story. If Paradis lied, possibility of violation of Section 1001, Title 18, U.S.C. should be considered.

On January 6, last, Ruth Greenglass, wife of David Greenglass, convicted espionage agent who is serving a 15-year sentence at the U. S. Penitentiary, Lewisburg, visited her husband at the penitentiary and he told her that he had been warned by some of the inmates to watch out for his life when his sister, Ethel Rosenberg, is executed. Mrs. Greenglass further advised that when she left the penitentiary she was driven to the railroad station by Rabbi I. Pickholts. The latter told her he had received information that some of the inmates who had a part in the recent murder of an inmate at Lewisburg were planning to do some harm to David if Ethel is executed. The rabbi was of the opinion that David Greenglass should be removed to another institution.

SYNOPSIS:

Raymond L. Paradis, cell mate of Greenglass at Lewisburg, reported that Greenglass told him of a source from whom Paradis could secure a false passport if Paradis ever desired to leave U.S. Greenglass identified source as Theodore Harris, a Greek living in Providence, Rhode Island. Investigation identified Harris as alias of Theodore Haralampopoulos, ex-convict who was released from Lewisburg in November, 1952. In view of past cooperativeness of Greenglass with Bureau it was felt that this information was fabricated by Paradis to ingratiate himself with Bureau or by Greenglass to impress Paradis. Philadelphia was instructed to interview Paradis and Greenglass to determine who made up story. Philadelphia has reinterviewed Paradis who vehemently denies fabricating story. Philadelphia recommends that Greenglass not be interviewed at this time because of possible harm to Paradis by other inmates if it becomes known he is an informer. Philadelphia suggests interview of Greenglass be deferred until 4-29-53 when Paradis due to be released. Recommend suggestion of Philadelphia be rejected and Greenglass be immediately interviewed.

PURPOSE:

To authorize transmittal of attached letter requesting Philadelphia to interview Greenglass.

BACKGROUND:

Philadelphia air-tel of 12-30-52 reported receipt of the following information from Raymond L. Paradis, cell mate of David Greenglass in Lewisburg penitentiary. Paradis, who is serving a term for violation of ITSMV, told Greenglass he may try to leave the country when he is released. Greenglass informed Paradis he knew of a source from whom Paradis could secure a false passport and other necessary papers to leave the country and identified his source as Theodore Harris, a Greek living in Providence, Rhode Island, at a number which Paradis believed to be 102 Root Street. Greenglass told Paradis to mention Greenglass' name to Harris and that Harris, for a payment of \$500 to \$1000, would fix him up with the necessary papers. Greenglass also advised Paradis that at the time he was picked up by the FBI he had a passport on him. Paradis was of the belief that Greenglass obtained this passport from Harris, although Greenglass did not say so.

Investigation has established that Theodore Harris is an alias of ~~Theodore~~ Haralampopoulos, a Greek residing at 120 Ruth Avenue, Providence, Rhode Island; further, Harris is an ex-convict who last served a prison sentence at Lewisburg and was released in November, 1952.

It is recalled that at the time of Greenglass' arrest by Bureau agents in June, 1950, no passport was found in his possession although he had passport photos on him. In view of the past cooperativeness of Greenglass it is felt that the above information was either fabrication by Paradis to ingratiate himself with the Bureau or by Greenglass to impress his cell mate. It was noted that Paradis, who has a lengthy criminal record mostly of minor violations, had attempted to get a transfer to the federal institution at Danbury in the past. He is expected to be released from Lewisburg on April 29, 1953.

Bureau air-tel 1-13-53 requested Philadelphia to immediately interview Paradis and Greenglass to determine if they knew Harris while the latter was in Lewisburg and also to determine if the story was a fabrication. It was pointed out to Philadelphia that if Paradis is lying, a signed statement should be secured from him admitting same and a separate Fraud Against the Government case be opened on Paradis. Thereafter the facts of this case should be presented to the United States Attorney for possible violation of Section 1001, Title 18, U.S.C., which provides that whoever, in any matter within the jurisdiction of any department or agency of the United States, knowingly and wilfully makes any false or fraud statements is liable to not more than \$10,000 fine or not more than 5 years imprisonment.

DETAILS:

Philadelphia air-tel 1-16-53 advised that Paradis was reinterviewed and denied acquaintance with Harris. Also he insisted that Greenglass told him the story and vehemently denied he was lying, stating he would have no motive in lying. Inquiry at Lewisburg indicates that Harris was friendly with Greenglass while there but apparently was not known to Paradis. Harris is described by a prison guard as a fast talker and of superior intelligence, but with a psychopathic personality.

The Philadelphia Office is of the opinion that, from the foregoing, it would appear that this story was either fabricated by Greenglass or Harris; that an interview of Greenglass would not be possible without him becoming aware of Paradis as the informant; that if the inmates become aware of Paradis furnishing information to the Bureau the latter would be labeled an informer and physical harm might ensue to Paradis by other inmates. It was also pointed out that those inmates who have been cooperative with the Bureau in the past would immediately discontinue their cooperation, feeling that their identities would not be protected. The attention of the Bureau was called to a pending case entitled "Eli Olen Newman, Et Al, Crime on a Government Reservation - Murder," involving the killing of an inmate at Lewisburg in

October, 1952, who had the reputation of being an informer. For the above reasons Philadelphia is holding in abeyance an interview with Greenglass and presentation of the facts in this matter to the United States Attorney pending advice from the Bureau. Philadelphia suggests that if the Bureau feels an interview with Greenglass is necessary, it be delayed until after 4-29-53 when Paradis is due to be released.

OBSERVATIONS:

It is not believed that the reasons advanced by the Philadelphia Office are cogent enough to warrant withholding the interview of Greenglass until after 4-29-53. As you know, Greenglass has been most cooperative with the Bureau and the inmates of Lewisburg are aware of this cooperativeness from his testimony at the Rosenberg trial. In view of this, there is no reason to believe that he will not cooperate in connection with this matter.

It is felt that Greenglass can be tactfully interviewed so that it will appear to him that the information concerning Harris came from a source other than Paradis. It is also felt that this interview should be conducted at this time in an effort to resolve the truth or falsity of the information concerning Harris. Pending the results of the Greenglass interview, any investigation of Harris would be premature.

RECOMMENDATION:

On the basis of the foregoing, it is recommended that the attached letter requesting Philadelphia to interview Greenglass be approved and transmitted.

In view of the past cooperativeness of Greenglass with the Bureau you are requested to interview Greenglass as soon as possible. It is suggested that Greenglass be advised that the Bureau has been interested in the activities of Harris since his release from Lewisburg and we would like to know if Harris gave any information to Greenglass which would be of interest to the Bureau. It is believed that if this interview is tactfully and intelligently handled the source of our information would not be disclosed and it can be determined if Greenglass actually told the story attributed to him by Paradis.

You are aware that the allegations against Harris, if true, would constitute a most serious violation of the federal laws. In view of the Bureau's responsibilities we cannot assume the position of waiting several months pending the release of Paradis from Lewisburg. This interview should be given prompt attention so that it may be determined as soon as possible what course of action, if any, the Bureau should take in this matter.

In accordance with instructions contained in rebulet, DAVID GREENGLASS was interviewed at the U. S. Penitentiary, Lewisburg, on February 9, 1953. He stated that he had become acquainted with THEODORE HARRIS when the latter was assigned, as an inmate, to duties in the mail room of that institution in about the middle of 1952. GREENGLASS pointed out that the mail room, where HARRIS was working, is located next to the office in which GREENGLASS works. *Pa. R.I.*

He said that he frequently visited with HARRIS. He said that about sixty days after he became acquainted with HARRIS, he, GREENGLASS, told HARRIS that he might want to leave the country when he is released from imprisonment, at which time HARRIS told him that he knew of any individual who could furnish passports and visas, and indicated that for payment of about \$1,000, GREENGLASS could get whatever papers in this line he might desire. GREENGLASS said that HARRIS never told him who this individual was, but that HARRIS told GREENGLASS to have the latter's wife get in touch with him, HARRIS, about the matter if he were further interested. GREENGLASS said they had discussed this, along with numerous other matters, in the presence and hearing of other individuals.

GREENGLASS said that HARRIS furnished him his, HARRIS' address, that he told HARRIS that he would write down this address in his own code. He said that HARRIS gave his address as something like 125 Ruth Street, Providence, R. I., and that he jumbled this information to indicate to HARRIS that he was writing it down in code, and he wrote it as 215 Anne Street. *st*

GREENGLASS said that the above conversations took place in "bull sessions" in which they engaged. He said that a few of the inmates in the penitentiary will have nothing to do with him, GREENGLASS, and that when he does find someone who will talk to him, he will kid them along and exchange fantastic stories, which all concerned know are fantastic, just in order to have something to talk about.

He said that in his own mind he had labeled HARRIS as a "con man," that at all time he was trying to impress others with his own importance and that he placed no stock whatsoever in HARRIS' statements as to his ability to get passports. He said that he let HARRIS think that he believed him merely in order to keep their acquaintance on a friendly basis but that actually he did not.

GREENGLASS said that he has no intention of leaving the country illegally at any time and is not interested in obtaining a false passport, visa, or other similar document. He said that HARRIS had never furnished any specific information as to his alleged source from which he could obtain such papers and that he did not believe HARRIS had any such source.

He said that HARRIS told him that that is not his correct name and he told GREENGLASS his true name, which GREENGLASS was only able to describe as being of Greek origin. He said HARRIS told him also that his father owns a restaurant.

GREENGLASS said he had mentioned the above to other inmates in the penitentiary and specifically said he had mentioned it to RAYMOND PARADIS and SAUL CHABOT, two of his friends in the institution. He said that there would be no point in interviewing them about HARRIS; however, inasmuch as they did not know him and the story told by HARRIS appeared to him to be a fabrication. He pointed out that in general "bull sessions" held among and between inmates, the inmates are inclined to tell stories about their past exploits and future plans which border on the fantastic, that the other inmates do not take such talk seriously but accept it for what it is, merely something about which to converse.

He said that he also engages in such talk and frequently tells to inmates stories which are untrue and which he believes they know are untrue.

GREENGLASS said that he had ascribed the statements of HARRIS to an over active imagination and did not believe they had any basis in fact and, accordingly, he had never brought such statements to the attention of the Bureau.

No further action is contemplated on this matter by the Philadelphia Office unless advised to the contrary by the Bureau.

Re Philadelphia letter February 16, 1953, reporting results of interview with David Greenglass. From the information set forth in reflet, it appears that Theodore Harris probably made up the story to impress Greenglass. However, in order to bring this matter to a logical conclusion, the Boston Office is instructed to locate and interview Harris. This interview should be handled in such a manner so that the identity of Greenglass as our source of information will be adequately protected.

NOTE: Raymond L. Paradis, cellmate of Greenglass at Lewisburg Penitentiary, originally advised Bureau agents that Greenglass told him he knew a source from whom Paradis could secure a false passport if Paradis ever desired to leave the United States. Greenglass identified the source to Paradis as Theodore Harris, a Greek living in Providence, R.I. Investigation has identified Harris as an alias of Theodore Maralamppopoulos, an ex-convict, released from Lewisburg in November, 1952, who was friendly with Greenglass while incarcerated.

Reference Philadelphia letter reports interview of Greenglass concerning this matter. In view of Greenglass' observations concerning Harris and probably Harris' story a fabrication, an investigation of Harris is not believed warranted. However, it is believed Harris should be interviewed to bring this matter to a logical conclusion.

THEFT OF GOVERNMENT PROPERTY

Reference is made to Bureau memorandum dated March 28, 1953, in the case entitled "Julius Rosenberg; Ethel Rosenberg, Espionage - R," wherein it is stated that the Rosenbergs claim to know David Greenglass had stolen uranium while employed at Los Alamos and had lied to the FBI when he was asked about it. This memorandum pointed out that efforts were being made by the Rosenbergs to secure an affidavit from Greenglass concerning this, apparently for the purpose of using it in their appeal to show Greenglass unworthy of belief. It was also pointed out in this memorandum that in 1949, the Bureau instituted an investigation in the case entitled "Dr. Ralph Eugene Lapp, et al, Atomic Energy Act, Theft of Government Property," which involved the theft of uranium hemispheres from the Atomic Energy installation at Los Alamos. Individuals who had access to these hemispheres, including Greenglass, were interviewed by Bureau agents. A number of these hemispheres were recovered by the Bureau from certain of these individuals and returned to the Atomic Energy Commission. This material was classified as restricted data by the Atomic Energy Commission. This matter was presented to your Division and an opinion was rendered that prosecutive action was not warranted. It is our understanding that in view of the number of instances involving the possession of such material by former employees, AEC has removed this material from the restricted data classification at the present time. RECORDED - 142 65-55228-395

David Greenglass was interviewed concerning this matter in January, 1950, and he denied any involvement in the theft of this material.

On March 25, 1953, Greenglass was reinterviewed by the U. S. Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, and furnished a signed statement in which he admitted taking, as a souvenir, a hollow uranium 238 hemisphere, one inch in diameter with 3/32 of an inch wall thickness weighing two or three ounces, from the Meta Shop, Manhattan Project, Los Alamos, to his barracks where he kept it until 1946. He thereafter shipped it to his home.

Greenglass claimed that this material was formerly used for experimental purposes, but at the time he took this piece, the experiment had been discarded and this piece was surplus. He stated that many of these pieces were used for ash trays on the project and that the cost of recovering any value from them at that time would have been prohibitive. He also stated that after being interviewed by FBI agents in 1950, he believed he threw this piece of uranium into the East River, New York City. He stated that his refusal to admit taking this uranium to agents during the January, 1950, interview was that he did not want to involve himself in a Federal offense as his wife was pregnant and he was no longer in any illegal activities. He stated that in subsequent interviews with Bureau agents during the Rosenberg investigation, he did not mention this incident because it had slipped his mind. To his recollection, he believed he told his wife and brother-in-law, Julius Rosenberg, of this incident.

The Atomic Energy Commission is being advised of the above information.

You are requested to advise if the above facts constitute a violation of the Atomic Energy Act and/or Theft of Government Property statutes, and if so, whether prosecutive action is advisable in connection with this matter.

CLAIMED THESE PIECES OF URANIUM TWO THIRTYEIGHT FORMERLY USED FOR EXPERIMENTAL PURPOSES, BUT AT TIME HE TOOK THIS PIECE THE EXPERIMENT HAD BEEN DISCARDED AND THIS PIECE WAS SURPLUS. STATED MANY OF THESE PIECES USED FOR ASHTRAYS ON THE PROJECT, AND COST OF RECOVERING ANY VALUE FROM THEM AT THAT TIME WOULD HAVE BEEN PROHIBITED. STATED AFTER INTERVIEW BY FBI AGENTS IN JANUARY 1950 HE BELIEVES HE THREW THIS PIECE OF URANIUM IN EAST RIVER. STATED AFTER THIS INTERVIEW HE DID NOT WANT TO INVOLVE HIMSELF IN ANY FEDERAL OFFENSE AS WIFE PREGNANT AND NO LONGER CONNECTED IN ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES. STATED IN SUBSEQUENT INTERVIEWS WITH AGENTS DID NOT MENTION INCIDENT AS MATTER SLIPPED HIS MIND. STATED TO THE BEST OF HIS RECOLLECTION, HE TOLD WIFE AND BROTHER-IN-LAW JULIUS ROSENBERG OF THIS INCIDENT. REPORT FOLLOWS.

THEFT OF GOVERNMENT PROPERTY

You will recall that investigation was instituted by this Bureau in 1949, in the case entitled "Dr. Ralph Eugene Lapp, et al, Atomic Energy Act, Theft of Government Property," which involved the theft of uranium hemispheres from the Atomic Energy installation at Los Alamos. Investigation reflected that more than 1800 hemispheres were produced prior to 1946, and that a number of them had been taken as souvenirs by various individuals employed at Los Alamos. Individuals who had access to these hemispheres during the pertinent period were interviewed. A number of these hemispheres were recovered and returned to your Agency. This matter was presented to the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice and an opinion was rendered that prosecution was not warranted.

You will also recall that David Greenglass, convicted Soviet agent who is serving a 15-year sentence at the U. S. Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, at the present time, was assigned to Los Alamos for a considerable period while in the Army and worked as a machinist at the installation. Greenglass has recently advised that while at Los Alamos he had taken as a souvenir a hollow uranium 238 hemisphere, one inch in diameter, with 3/32 of an inch wall thickness, weighing two or three ounces, from the Photo Shop, Manhattan Project, to his barracks where he kept it until 1946. He thereafter shipped it to his home.

ESPIONAGE - R

Reference is made to Bureau letter to Boston dated 2/26/53 requesting that THEODORE HARRIS be located and interviewed concerning the story told by GREENGLASS to RAYMOND PARADIS to the effect that HARRIS could secure fictitious passports and other means of identification.

THEODORE HARRIS was interviewed on March 31, 1953, at the Providence, Rhode Island Resident Agency. He said his real name was THEODORE HARALANPOPOULOS but he had legally changed his name at Wichita Falls, Texas, in 1945 in the District Court. HARRIS said he is residing with his father at 102 Ruth Avenue, East Providence, Rhode Island, and is employed by the New York System Restaurants. This is a chain of "quick-lunch" restaurants, and HARRIS said he works different days in different restaurants.

HARRIS said that when he was in Lewisburg and Leavenworth Prisons, he was able to get good jobs and, as a result, was able to do small favors for individuals incarcerated. He said at Leavenworth he was in the parole office and in Lewisburg he was in the mail room.

HARRIS said while at Leavenworth he was friendly with GUS HALL and IRVING POTASH, both of whom were Communist Party leaders. He said he became quite friendly with POTASH because he was able to suggest to POTASH a way in which he could legally have certain papers delivered to him within the prison. He said POTASH had been refused permission by the Warden, but that he, HARRIS, told POTASH how he could get the papers in over the Warden's objections in a legal manner. He declined to say what the papers were or by what means they were brought into the prison, other than he suggested to POTASH to have one of his visitors bring them in.

HARRIS, who is an egotistical individual, said he had many contacts both inside of the prison and outside, and because of this, was able to do favors for a lot of people. He said he was friendly with ALGER HISS and CARL WINTER.

HARRIS was questioned concerning his ability to secure false identification, false Selective Service Cards, false automobile registrations, false passports and other papers. He said one instance occurred concerning passports sometime after March, 1952. He said an extremely prominent individual, whom he refused to name but who was known not only all over the United States but all over the world, had approached him and said that he wanted to leave the country after he got out of prison and wanted to know if HARRIS could get him a passport. This individual promised him that there would be \$10,000 waiting in New York for him to work on and another \$10,000 when the passport was delivered.

This individual said that his wife would contact HARRIS when he got to East Providence to see whether or not he had any success in making the contact along this line. According to HARRIS, the individual was serious and, in his opinion, this man plans to leave the country upon his release. HARRIS said he would refuse to identify the man because he is already serving time and, if his identity were disclosed, it might go hard on him in prison.

HARRIS said that he felt this man was serious about wanting to get the passport and he felt sure this individual intended to leave the country after he was released.

HARRIS said this was the only time he discussed a passport and there was only one person besides himself involved. He said it was not his idea and this other individual sought him out.

HARRIS is an extremely "cocky" individual and one who is impressed with his own importance. He continually stated that he was going straight and intended to open up a dry-cleaning establishment across the street from his home on Ruth Avenue and did not want to get involved in any "shady deals". He said that he had connections all over the United States and all over the world and could get practically anything he wanted.

HARRIS stated inside of a prison fantastic stories are made up and circulate throughout the prison like the wind. However, he felt that this individual was serious about securing false papers and that he had sought HARRIS out because of his, HARRIS', reputation throughout the prison as a man who could get things done.
