As a result considerable investigation is being conducted to determine the possible source and the exact nature of the information. The Bureau has requested that a check be made of the possibility that such data may have been secured through BETHE by either ALFRED SARANT or WILLIAM BRUCE DAYTON, both of whom were acquainted with BETHE at Cornell University, and are suspected of being members of the ROSENBERG espionage network.

THE BALTIMORE DIVISION.

AT HAGERSTOWN, MARYLAND, will make an appropriate check at the Fairchild Engine and Airplane Corporation to determine if they have a master list reflecting identity of classified documents charged out to the subject during the time he was a consultant for the NEPA Project, of which the Fairchild Corporation was the prime contractor. The above-entitled case is now before the Regional Loyalty Board for adjudication of the question of loyalty under the provisions of Executive Order 9835 as amended by Executive Order 10241.

Your Bureau conducted an investigation of the subject as a departmental applicant for the above position in the Immigration and Maturalization Service. The following FBI reports and memorandum have been received in this office for consideration:

Report of Special Agent Richard G. Hoffman, dated August 15, 1952 at Cincinnati, Ohio.

It is noted that subject's maiden name and former residence address appeared in an address book found by your Bureau in the apartment of David Greenglass in June 1950 and this book was identified as the property of Ruth Printz, wife of David Greenglass. It is also noted that an agent of your Bureau interviewed Ruth Greenglass who advised she knew the subject as Rose Nudelman with whom she worked at the Mizrachi Zionist Organization of America, 1133 Broadway, New York City as a Clerk-Typist for about one and one-half to two years until Movember 29, 1942 when the witness left her job to be married; that she and the subject went out together while working at this organization and on one occasion they attended an office party together; and that her association with the subject ended when witness left the organization. Witness also stated that at that time subject was not a Communist, like herself, nor a Liberal, nor inclined to be in any way subversive and, during their acquaintanceship, subject never said or did anything which would indicate that subject was anything but loyal to the United States. Witness explained the reason subject's address was listed in her address book was simply because of their relationship at the time they were both employed at that organization.

It is also noted that David Greenglass advised he did not know subject and never heard her name and that the subject may have been an acquaintance of his wife, who at one time in the 1940's was employed by Mizrachi, described by the witness as a religious Jewish organization, with which one Rabbi Gellman was connected.

An Interrogatory was approved and submitted to Mrs. Smith by the Regional Loyalty Board requesting information concerning her alleged association with Ruth Frintz Greenglass. In her reply, subscribed and sworm to on February 19, 1953, Mrs. Swith denied ever having been associated, at any time, with Ruth Printz Greenglass, wife of David Greenglass, or that she has ever known them personally, or in any professional, business or social capacity. She stated she has no knowledge of any affiliations they may have had in any Communist Party, or any Communist organizations, or any foreign country, other than that which she has read in the past in the daily press. She stated she has never aided, acquiesced in, or participated in any activities with either of them or any other individuals in behalf of the Communist Party, or the Communist cause, or any foreign country. She also stated that, not knowing or having known Ruth Printz Greenglass or her husband, she has never been under their influence, control or dominance nor have either of these persons ever influenced her own viewpoint. Mrs. Smith also denied present or former membership or affiliation with the Communist Party, U.S.A., the Communist Political Association, or any Communist organization, as well as with the Mazi or Fascist movements or with any organization or political party whose objective is now or ever has been the overthrow of the Constitutional Government of the United States. Mrs. Smith also requested a hearing before the Regional Loyalty Board in order that she may appear in

person to refute the allegations made and to dispel any suspicions aroused concerning her loyalty to the United States of America.

In view of the information furnished by Ruth Greenglass concerning her former association with appointee and appointee's positive denial of any association or knowledge of the former, it appears that it will be necessary to request appointee to appear before a Panel of the Regional Loyalty Board for a hearing before a final decision can be made. However, before such a hearing is scheduled, it is felt that the Board should have the benefit of certain additional information as follows:

(1) If possible, that Ruth Greenglass be requested by the FBI to furnish a signed statement furnishing detailed information concerning the nature and extent of her association with appointee, the types of business or social activities in which they were mutually associated, and the duration of their association. Mrs. Greenglass might also be requested to indicate whether or not appointee was aware of the witness' sympathy or activity in behalf of the Communist Party or any Communist organization and whether or not appointee may have participated or joined with the witness in any activities in behalf of the Communist Party or any Communist organization.

Concerning the appearance of appointee's maiden name and residence address in the address book referred to above, it is believed that further information might be secured to indicate whether or not the names of any other employees of the Mizrachi Zionist Organization of America appeared in the book and, if so, that Mrs. Greenglass be requested to explain the circumstances of any possible mutual association between herself, appointee and such other individuals and reasons therefor. It would also appear that Mrs. Greenglass might be requested to state whether or not appointee had been acquainted with or associated with her husband David Greenglass and, if so, the nature and extent of such acquaintanceship and association.

- (2) If it is developed that appointee had been acquainted with or associated with David Greenglass, that David Greenglass be requested to furnish further information, either verbally or in a signed statement, concerning the nature and extent of his acquaintanceship or association with appointee.
- (3) Appointee's application for Federal employment dated June 16, 1952 indicates she was employed from 1935 to November 1942 as a Typist by the Mizrachi Organization, 1133 Broadway, New York, New York under L. Gellman, President and left because she wished to aid the war effort. It is requested that supplemental investigation be conducted to secure information concerning appointee's activities during this period of employment, with particular reference to her association with Ruth Printz Greenglass and any others with whom they may have been mutually associated.

She also stated that DAVIDY CREENGLASS was at the New York Bargain House prior to his arrest On August 15, 1950, T-1 was shown photographs of GOLD and OREENGLASS but was unable to identify gither as ever having been in the New York Bargain House.

The title of the referenced report as well as the titles of other previous reports on the subject have indicated the subject has more than one alias; however, the report of SA ROBERT A. COILIER dated March 4, 1944, carried a title identical with the title of this report and since that time there have been no changes.



LINSCHITZ indicated on his Personnel Security Questionnaire submitted to the Atomic Energy Commission that he was born August 18, 1919 in Bronx County, NYC. Records of the Dept. of Health, NYC reflect that a male child of the family name of LINSCHITZ was born on October 18, 1919 The record indicated the father's name was JOSEPH and the mother, MINNIE MARGOLIES, both born in Austria.

LINSCHITZ was hired in 9/48 as an Assistant Professor of Chemistry at Syracuse University, which has AEA work. He was granted a "Q" clearance 2/28/50 as a Security Monitor on unclassified matters and non restricted data. LINSCHITZ presently resides at 735 W. Onondaga St., Syracuse, MY.

Records of T- (US Army, in a report by ARTHUR E. RILEY, Agent, CIC, dated April 6, 1944) another government agency conducting security type investigations reflect that LINSCHITZ was vice-president of the Baskerville Chemical Society during 1939 and 1940 at the College of the City of New York. It was reported that during this period the society's faculty advisor was ROBERT ROSENTHAL, later dismissed from the faculty for Communistic activity, and that two other office-holders were described by reliable informants as being Communistically inclimed.

When DAVID (REENGLASS was interviewed concerning the JULIUS ROSENBERG espionage ring, he stated, after reviewing his address book, that he believed he had furnished among other names, the name of LINSCHITZ to HARRY GOLD as a possible espionage recruit at los Alamos.

Interviewed by FHI agents on 2/23/51, LINSCHITZ denied thathe ever knew JULIUS ROSENBERG or HARRY GOLD or had been approached by anyone to furnish information to the Russian espionage system. He further denied categorically that he is or ever had been a member of the Communist Party NDFXF

The files of Confidential Informant T-2, another Government Agency, reflect that THOMAS ALIAN FINEBERG, ASN 16145707, was at Los Alamos, New Mexico, as a member of the Special Engineer Detachment, U. S. Army, from about June, 1944 to March, 1946. He was born Kinnesota.

DAVIDERENCIASS, who has been convicted of Soviet espionage, advised agents of the FBI that he had furnished the names of eighteen or nineteen potential espionage recruits at Los Alamos to JULIUS ROSENBERG and HARRY GOID, both of whom have been convicted of Soviet espionage. GREENBIASS said that he did not know that any of the potential recruits mentioned by him were Communist but that he had learned through either working with them or living with them in the barracks at Los Alamos, or both, that they were liberal and believed in a welfare state. One of the names was that of THOMAS ALIAN FINEBERG.

A report of the Seditious Activities Investigation Commission of the Illinois State Legislature prepared in 1948 by Mr. CHARLES L. KRUGER, contained information pertaining to members of the Communist Club at the University of Chicago. This information includes the following:





Reports by your Bureau furnished as a result of investigations completed in April 1953, include information by Mrs. Ruth Greenglass, wife of David Greenglass, the self-confessed Soviet espionage agent, that she knew the employee for two years as a fellow employee at Mizrachi, a religious organization.

In connection with employee's answer to an interrogatory and at a hearing pursuant to E.O. 9835, she denied ever knowing Ruth Greenglass, needPrintz, either at Mizrachi or elsewhere. Any further information available which would assist in resolving the conflicting information will be appreciated.

The employee states that her brother, denies he has ever been a member of the Communist Party and has no knowledge of how his name became affiliated with the 239 Utica Avenue Club, 18th Assembly District, Kings County Section of the Communist Party, New York. It is also requested that the Bureau furnish any further information available regarding Communist Party membership or activity on the part of the employee's brother-in-law,
