As recorded in this report, in about May 1919, Mr. ARNOID HRAMISH, Los Alamos, New Mexico, claimed to request CIA to attempt to obtain information concerning JOAN CHASE MINTON. It is suggested that the Bureau may desire to contact CIA to determine whether they obtained any information concerning Miss HINTON.

It is believed that Dr. EDWARD FILLER is an excellent suspect in this case. Dr. TELLER's parents and parents-in-law are believed to be in Budapest, Hungary at the present time. It is suggested that the Bureau request the CIA to attempt to obtain information concerning the present status of TELLER's parents in Hungary.

ALBUQUERQUE MAID PREED OFF TO SUBJECT: Rebulet to Albuquerque May 8, 1950, requesting that Albuquerque advise in more detail what records were checked concerning travel and leave records at The University of California payroll for the month of December, 1944, was used as a means of determining who was employed by the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory in the latter part of 1944. This payroll should have included all technical area employees at that time with the exception of military personnel All'In the event that he was employed of in the LASL, which seems probable, his name should have appeared on the December, 1944 payroll of the University of California unless he was a member of the U.S. The University Business Office maintains a separate file on each em-The files of all employees whose names appeared on the December 1944. payroll were checked and a record was made of the number of days leave that was taken by each employee during each of the months of November and December, 1944 and January 1945. Only the number of days leave taken during a particular month are shown and not the exact days leave was taken. It was noted that in several instances an employee had reported leave all in one month when other records show that it was probably taken part in one month and part in another month. Leave records of the University for approximately 65 employees for the years 1943, 1944, and 1945 had been destroyed. Nearly all of these individuals whose leave records have been destroyed are presently employed by the LASL at Los Alamos. Their University personnel file does not show leave taken by them. The AEC Security files were checked on all individuals who, according to the University Business Office records, had leave during November or December. 3 , 1944, and January, 1945, and also on all individuals whose University have records had been destroyed. Exempt from GD During 1944 and 1945 all individuals traveling out of a 200 mile radius of Los Alamos were required to fill out a travel form prior to their departure, showing when and where they were going and any official contacts to be made by them. that had been made in their itinerary. Many of these forms are still maintained in the individual's Security Office files at Los Alamos. Some of these forms, however, have been destroyed or forwarded with other portions of these files to Oak Ridge. Previous checks at Oak Ridge have reflected that the portions of the old MED security files which were forwarded to Oak Ridge from Los Alamos are no longer at Oak Ridge. It would be appreciated if the Bureau would advise whether these files are presently in the possession of the Bureau or whether their present location is known.

Although a check of individual Security Office files at Los Alamos resulted in a very incomplete record of travel by individuals who are known to have had leave during the pertinent period, two other records reflecting travel were located which are believed to be more complete. Where no record of travel could be located, it is assumed that the individual remained at Los Alamos during his leave.

An old MED security file was located, which contained lists captioned "Vacations - Tech Area," which appear to be recaps by months of all travel by Tech Area employees both for personal and offical purposes. The absolute accuracy of these lists cannot be determined. In a number of instances travel is listed on these lists when no individual travel form could be located to support the travel. In all instances, however, where an individual travel form was located, the travel appeared on the lists captioned "Vacations - Tech Area." These lists however, with a few exceptions, do not show travel by military personnel even though they were employed in the Tech Area and were engaged in scientific work.

A record was also kept by the laboratory director's office of official travel by laboratory employees. This record was kept in handwriting in a bound notebook in the director's office and a typed list was forwarded to the MED security office. Both the notebooks and recaps have been checked and pertinent travel reported.

Fairly accurate details of official travel by LASL employees can be obtained from University of California travel vouchers for the pertinent period. Where it appeared that pertinent information might be obtained, these travel vouchers were checked.

Concerning military personnel at Los Alamos during the pertinent period, the only records that have been located at Los Alamos concerning leave is an MED file of teletypes located at the AEC Records Depository which contain teletype morning reports for military personnel. From this file it could be ascertain-

ed which soldiers were on furlough during the pertinent periods, but no information is available as to travel by these soldiers while on furlough.

Efforts are being made at Los Alamos to locate records that may be supplement information concerning travel and leave already reported.

Dr. EDWARD FELLER, Associate Director for Weapon Development, LASL, is again suggested as a most logical suspect for Soviet Agent or the following reasons:

- 1. Dr. TELLER was a close associate of EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS at Los Alamos. Mrs. TELLER made a trip to Mexico City with FUCHS in the latter part of 1945. The TELLERS had FUCHS at their home for dinner when FUCHS returned to this country in 1947. Dr. TELLER had considerable contact with FUCHS in England in the summer of 1949. FUCHS has admitted Soviet espionage activity.
- 2. Dr. TELLER recommended THEODORE ALVIN HALL as a good prospect for the graduate school at the University of Chicago in about January 1946 and stated that they had worked together at Los Alamos. HALL has been identified as a Soviet espionage agent while at Los Alamos.
  - 3. As early as October, 1944, Dr. TELLER had expressed concern over the status of his and his wife s relatives in Budapest. Hungary as the Russians were about to enter Budapest.


San Francisco T-2, of unknown reliability, has supplied information concerning the identities of members of the organization known as Atomic Scientists of Chicago. SF T-2 supplied the name of HINTON as a member of the organization and gave her address as 1850 Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

Rear Admiral EILIS M. ZACHARIAS, USN (Retired), advised in May 1947 that the residence of WILLIAM and JEAN HINTON CREEN, 1739 Harvard Street, NW, Washington D. C., has been periodically visited by two Russian officers SORAIEFF and EREZIN, who interrogated CREEN for information concerning radar activities. GREEN was reported to have had no such information. The CREENS were allegedly pro-Soviet and reportedly were invited to participate at the Russian Embassy. JEAN RINTON CREEN was believed to be a member of the Communist Party. It is to be noted that she is the sister of JOAN CHASE HINTON.

MARSHALL HALLOWAY, Los Alamos, New Mexico, has advised SA FINIS L. PARISH that he worked with HINTON at Los Alamos on the atomic bomb project in 1944 and 1945. He said that he was in Chicago early in 1947 and that while there, he was present in a group in which HINTON was also present. He said that on this occasion she endorsed several ideas favorable to Russia.

### VICTOR FREDERICK WEISSKOPF

The Publication "American Men of Science," published at Lancaster, Pennsylvania in 1944, reflects that VICTOR FXWEISSKOPF was born in Vienna, Austria on September 19, 1908. He received a Ph.D degree from Goettingen University in 1931. He was a research associate in Berlin, Germany at the university in 1931 - 1932. He occupied a similar position under a grant furnished by the Rockefeller Foundation at the University of Copenhagen and in Cambridge, England in 1931 - 1933. He assumed a similar position at Zurich Institute of Technology between 1933 and 1936 and returned to Copenhagen in 1936 - 1937. He was associate professor with the University of Rochester, Rochester, New York, in the Department of Physics in 1937, and according to his biography, remained there until its publication in This publication reflects that WEISSKOPF is a specialist in the 1944. Theoretical Physics; The Theory of Elementary Particles; 4 Nuclear Physics; Radiation Theory and the Theory of Spectral Lines. He is reported to be one of the outstanding Theoretical Physicists in the world.





San Francisco T-3, another governmental agency, has advised that WEISSKOPF is considered to be the foremost Physicist in the United States today and is further considered to be one of the scientists who is directly responsible for the immediate development of the atomic bomb. In September 1948, he was employed as a professor of physics in the laboratory for nuclear science and engineering at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology at Cambridge, Massachusetts. His residence address at that time was 64 Grey Street, Arlington, Massachusetts.

Professor I. I. RABI, a physicist at Columbia University, advised that while WEISSKOPF was in Europe, he had visited Russia and had come back so disgusted with conditions as he had seen them that he had ever since been anti-Communist and anti-Soviet in his views, RABI said that WEISSKOPF is a political liberal who believes in protecting the rights of labor within the framework of the constitution but that he was far removed from Socialism and Communism.

JOHN H. MANLEY, Associate Division Leader, P-Division, Los Alamos, New Mexico, stated that WEISSKOPF like many prominent citizens is very liberal in his political views and is a strong advocate of world government. He stated that WEISSKOPF once thought that Russia and the United States could function together along peaceful means but mainly believed that although he had not had much close contact with WEISSKOPF, that the latter must have changed his views in this matter because of the recent trend in world events. MANLEY further advised that WEISSKOPF originally advocated the world-wide dissemination of scientific data but in a recent conversation WEISSKOPF had indicated that he had changed his opinions along these lines to a certain extent.

HERBERT I. MILLER, Alternate Division Leader, M-Division,
Los Alamos, stated that various officials at Los Alamos had endeavored
to persuade WEISSKOPF to return to the installation to take an active part
in the program, but it was his understanding WEISSKOPF would not have any
part in the program as long as the development of atomic weapons was the
principal goal of the entire program. He further advised that it was his
opinion WEISSKOPF did his part during the war, but immediately after the
first bombs were dropped, he withdrew from the entire program. MILLER stated
that WEISSKOPF was "deeply" conscious about the seriousness of the atomic
program, and it is his intention not to have anything more to do with the
development of atomic power for war weapons. MILLER further said that
WEISSKOPF is an expert on the declassification of atomic information and
has been consulted often in this regard.



TOD OF

WEISSKOPF has been identified as an active leader of the Cambridge Association of Scientists, a branch of the Federation of American Scientists. This organization has been classified by responsible faculty members at MIT as being an unstable group. WEISSKOPF is a member of a nine man executive committee of the Cambridge Association of Scientists. Two members of this executive committee, namely Professor WENDELL FURRY, of Harvard University, and Professor HENRY WALLMAN, mathematician at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, have been identified by San Francisco T-4, of unknown reliability, as members of the Communist Political Association at Cambridge, Massachusetts, in 1945.

San Francisco T-5, of unknown reliability, stated that he distrusted WEIS3KOPF because he had observed him in the company of WENDELL FURRY, ISADOR AMDUR, BART BOK, and HENRY CHUNDFEST. SF T-5's only association with WEISSKOPF had been at meetings of the Federation of American Scientists, and he had only observed WEISSKOPF talking to the aforementioned individuals at the meetings. SF T-5 furnished information in October 1946 in which he attributed a statement having been made by both WILLIAM ICGINBOTHAM and WEISSKOPF, the substance of which was that Russia was making a greater sacrifice in attempting to preserve the peace than the United States. A further statement attributed to both of these individuals was the suggestion that the United States should appease Russia by destroying its stock piles of bombs and ceasing manufacturing operations. This same informant, on the other hand, stated that on one occasion WEISSKOPF refused to address the Boston-Cambridge Chapter of the American Association of Scientific Workers on the grounds that he thought it was a Communist Party organization.

San Francisco T-6, of unknown reliability, stated that WEISSKOPF had demonstrated a pro-Russian attitude on political matters but that at no time had he gone to the extent where this informant would be willing to unquestionably label him as a Communist sympathizer. On reinterview, SF T-6 was unable to specifically recall any definite statements ever made by WEISSKOPF upon which his earlier opinion could logically rest.

The publication "Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists," published by the atomic Scientists of Chicago for November 1, 1946, carries an article entitled "Cambridge Conference of Natural and Social Scientists" which refers to a conference arranged by the Association of Cambridge Scientists for the purpose of determining the possibilities for cooperative action and research by social and physical scientists in the field of atomic energy. On Octover 27, 1946, the conference voted to set up a continuing committee with the responsibility of implementing the recommendations made for this program. Professor VICTOR F. WEISSKOPF, Department of Physics, MIT, was listed as a member of the committee. same publication for December 1, 1946 contains an article by WEISSKOPF in which he points out that foreign scientists have probably erroneously obtained the impression that American scientists are completely enslaved by the American government. He suggested that this situation could be improved by accelerating the declassifiable materials and seeking a means for assuring the transmission of such declassified material to foreign scientists.

# CHARLES JAMES LEPORE

LEPORE advised Agents of the Newark office in November 1947 that he had knowledge that a group photograph was taken in August 1945 at Los Alamos and that the atomic bomb appeared in this group photograph, He said that he had not been photographed with this group because he was absent from Los Alamos on furlough at the time. He stated, however, that he was photographed alone with the bomb on another occasion. He surrendered this photograph to Newark Agents and declared that he had never shown it to anyone.








Philadelphia, Penna, June 2, 1950

I, Harry Gold, make the following voluntary statement to Richard E. Brennan and T. Scott Willer, Jr., who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice. No threats or promises have been made to me, and I realize that I do not have to make a statement, and any statement I do make may be used against me in a court of law. I realize I have a right to counsel.

As of the Spring of 1945 I had been engaged in espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union, since 1936. There were two lapses in my espionage activities, one from the late Summer of 1938 to late Summer of 1940, during which time I was attending College in Cincinnati, Ohio. The second lapse was from the Spring of 1941 to the Fall of 1941. In the Spring, Sam, who was my Russian contact at the time, told me I was not needed anymore. In the Fall, however, Sam told me that now that Russia had been attacked, we must resume our work on an intensified scale.

In the Spring of 1945, I was meeting regularly with a man unknown to me except by the name of John, who was obviously a Russian, and who had succeeded Sam as my Russian contact.

Sometime around May of 1945 I met John in, I believe, a bar on Third Ave, New York City. This meeting was to discuss plans for my departure in June of 1945 for Santa Fe, New Mexico. I was going to Santa Fe on the instructions of John. During this meeting John supplied me with a name and address of a man in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and instructed me to contact this man while I was there. I believe John told me to contact the man's wife in case the man was not there. John told me that I would receive information from this man, which I was to deliver to John. John gave me an envelope containing about \$500.00. I was instructed to give this money to the man in Albuquerque in payment for the information. I was instructed to give this sum to him only if he would indicate a need for funds.

I left Philadelphia in June of 1945 and went to Albuquerque, and then Santa Fe, N.W. On my return from Santa Fe to Albuquerque on a Saturday evening, I tried unsuccessfully to contact this man on that evening. I was informed that he was not at home at that time. I again went to his house on the next morning, Sunday. At this time I met the man. I cannot retail this man's name, but I believe he lived on the second or third floor of a house, the exact address of which I cannot remember. It was, however, somewhere north of East Central Ave., one or two blocks north, and somewhere between N. High Street and N. Pine Street.

I introduced myself to this man as either Frank Kessler or Frank Martin, I cannot recall which. I used some form of recognition, involving the first name of a man, and stating that he had sent me. This individual recognized the password.

At this time I discovered to my surprise that this individual whom I was contacting was in the U. S. Army, and was, I believe, a Technician Fifth Grade. His rating may have been higher, however. This man was not over 25 years of age, perhaps even younger, about 5'7", sturdily built, dark brown or black hair, which was either curly or bushy, brown eyes, sumb nose, even teeth, a wide mouth, and an open, pleasing countenance. I believe from things he said that his home was in New York City, possibly the Bronx or Brooklyn, not Manhattan. I also met his wife. She was about 5'3" and normally good looking, and neither excessively stout or slender. Her name may have been Ruth, although I am not sure.

I returned to this house later in the afternoon, at which time he gave me an envelope containing three to five pages of written information, and possibly one sketch. This information dealt with, I believe, a generalized description of the area in Los Alamos, N.W., in which he worked. There may also have been a sketch of some bit of structural equipment or a machine.

I believe, from what he said, that he worked in one of four jobs at Los Alemos: 1-As a draftsman. 2-As a machinist. 3-As an electrician. 4.-In the physics labratory.

At the time that this man gave me the envelope containing the information, I gave him the approximately \$500.00. He had expressed a need for funds to enable his wife to stay near him.

During this conversation that I had with this man, tentative arrangements were made for a second meeting between us. This meeting was to occur in New York City during a furlough which he expected to get at Christmas time 1945. I was to call this man's father-in-law, in the Bronz, N.Y. The father-in-law's first name was, or may have been, Philip. This meeting never occurred, on the orders of John, who seemed to have lost interest when I mentioned the matter to him in the late fall of 1945. I have never seen this soldier nor his wife since, nor have I heard from them.

I took the information which I received from this man in Albuquerque, and turned it over to John upon my return to New York. The actual transfer of the information from me to John, occurred in Brooklyn, in the neighborhood of Metropolitan Ave.

I have read the above statement consisting of this and five other pages and am signing each page as all the information contained therein is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.





ASAC Whelan called from New York and advised that Greenglass contacted the Arma Company in Brooklyn, where he works, today and requested that he be granted la months annual leave to go away on a vacation looking toward the ultimate recuperation of his wife, who was recently severely burned. Greenglass is to call the Arma Company again on June 6 to receive their final answer as to whether this leave will be granted to him.

Mr. Whelan pointed out that a surveillance of Greenglass because of the location of his residence is not considered at all practical. He lives at 265 Rivington in Manhattan, which is near the foot of the Brooklyn Bridge and is in an area which is most difficult for surveillance purposes. His father-in-law operates a little atore right across from where Greenglass lives. It was pointed out by Mr. Whelan that if Greenglass does leave New York for a vacation, it will be difficult at a later time to arrange an interview with him under classified by 30/9000 conditions which are favorable.

Mr. Thelan also pointed out that although available pictures of Greenglass have been exhibited to Gold, he has neither identified nor rejected them. Mr. Whelan recommended that since there is no indication that Greenglass was definitely tied in with other subjects in this case except Gold, that an interview with him at this time be undertaken so that it can be begun under favorable conditions two or three days prior to his departure on leave.

Supervisor Granville later called and talked with Mr. Branigan. He advised that Greenglass was interviewed before in connection with the case entitled "Ralph Eugene Lapp, Atomic Energy." He was interviewed concerning his knowledge of persons who had possession of uranium spheres while at Los Alamos. He furnished no pertinent information.

Greenglass was also considered as a possible suspect in the case entitled "Unsub, aliase He has not eliminated in this respect.

#### OBSERVATION:


It is observed that Greenglass is probable identical with the unidentified soldier described by Gold, who furnished him information in Albuquerque, New Mexico, in September, 1945. He is presently under as much surveillance as can be afforded. He is one of three individuals

presently under surveillance, they having been named by Gold as espionage agents. The other two are Alfred Slack and Thomas Black. It is believed desirable to maintain surveillances on these individuals until such time as interviews with Gold regarding their activities can be completed, during which time some details regarding their habits and associates can be obtained. It is felt that all of these individuals should be maintained under surveillance until Greenglass is definitely identified or eliminated by Gold as his espionage contact in Albuquerque. Black and Slack have been definitely identified.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that an interview with Greenglass be held in abeyance until simultaneous interviews can be had with Greenglass, Black and Slack. It is anticipated that such interviews may be begun by June 9th or 10th. It is believed that little psychological advantage will be lost by interviewing Greenglass while he is on vacation.

The captioned subject was contacted at his home in Albuquerque, New Mexico, on June 3, 1945, by HARRY GOLD, at which time GOLD met both the subject and the latter's wife.

The subject was a soldier at Los Alamos, and furnished GOLD with information concerning his work at the atomic energy installation.

The subject is believed to be identical with DAVID TREENGLASS, who with his wife, RUTH TREENGLASS, was residing at 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico, on June 3, 1945.

The landlord, Mr. W. B. FREEMAN, at that address has advised that in 1945 ROSALIE TERREIL was also residing there, and was well-acquainted with RUTH GREENGLASS. He said that he believed that ROSALIE TERRELL is a retired Telephone Company employee, and that she is presently residing at Route ?, Box 564, San Antonio, Texas.

At the appropriate time, the New York Office will request San Antonio by teletype to interview TERRELL to determine if she saw GOLD come to the GREENGLASS residence, or if she can recall any conversation on the part of RUTH GREENGLASS to the effect that GOLD may have visited the GREENGLASS residence. GOLD is of the opinion that, at the time he made the contact with the unknown subject, he either used the name FRANK KESSIER, FRANK KEPPLER, or FRANK MARTIN in introducing himself to the unknown subject and the latter's wife.

GOLD, at that time, furnished the unknown subject with \$500 for the latter's services.

There are enclosed herewith for the San Antonio Office three photographs of HARRY GOLD, and one photograph of DAVID and RUTH GREENGLASS.

## I. INTRODUCTION

HARRY GOLD, of 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on May 22, 1950 advised Special Agents T. SCOTT MILLER, JR. and RICHARD E. BRENNAN that he was the individual to whom Dr. EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS passed information concerning the atomic bomb for transmission to Russia.

On May 23, 1950 a complaint was sworn to by Special Agent JOHN M. COLLINS, of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, before MARTIN C.

EFSTEIN, United States Commissioner, Eastern District of New York, charging that from on or about January 1, 1944 and continuing to the date of the complaint, HARRY GOLD and "JOHN" DOE conspired among themselves and with other persons unknown to violate Sub-Section A, Section 32, Title 50, United States Code; in that HARRY GOLD would obtain from EMIL JULIUS KIAUS FUCHS documents, etc., relating to the national defense, with intent and reason to believe that it was to be used to the injury of the United States and to the advantage of a foreign nation, the U.S.S.R., and that GOLD would deliver, etc. the documents, etc. to "JOHN" DOE, a representative officer, agent and employee of the U.S.S.R., and to other persons unknown who were not entitled to receive the documents, etc. In pursuance of this conspiracy, HARRY GOLD and "JOHN" DOE met in September 1945 and conferred together in the vicinity of Jackson Heights, Long Island, in the Eastern District of New York.

On May 23, 1950 a hearing was held before United States District Judge JAMES P. McCRANERY, Eastern District of Pennsylvania, sitting at Philadelphia. Federal Judge McCRANERY advised the subject of his constitutional rights and stated he was entitled to benefit of counsel, and permitted HARRY GOLD to read a copy of the complaint filed against him in the Eastern District of New York.

Upon completion of the hearing before Federal Judge McGRANERY, bail was set in the amount of \$100,000, and GOLD was remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal in default of bail. GOLD was removed by the United States Marshal and placed in Moyamensing Prison. He was later removed from the Moyamensing County Prison because of crowded conditions and placed in the Holmesburg County Prison by prison authorities.

## II. DEALINGS WITH UNKNOWN AMERICAN, ALBUQUERQUE, NEW MEXICO


## A. HARRY GOLD'S VERSION

GOLD, on June 1, 1950, advised Special Agents T. SCOTT MILLER and RICHARD E. ERENNAN that prior to his departure for Santa Fe, New Mexico to see FUCHS in June of 1945, he met his Russian contact, YUHN, in a bar on Third Avenue in New York City. He said that JOHN gave him at this time a slip of paper containing a name and address in Albuquerque and told GOLD to contact this person while he was in Albuquerque. He said that JOHN advised that this individual would have information for GOLD, and JOHN gave GOLD \$500.00 to pay this individual. JOHN also told GOLD that he was to see this unknown individual after his visit to FUCHS.

GOLD advised that upon his arrival in New Mexico, he went first to see FUCHS and returned that evening to Albuquerque from Santa Fe, and attempted to contact the unknown subject but found no one at home. GOLD said as a result of this he stayed overnight in Albuquerque but on the next morning, which was a Sunday, he went to the address supplied him by JOHN and at this time he met the unknown subject.

GOID said this was the first time that he knew the unknown subject was a soldier. GOID advised that this individual was a non-commissioned officer, either a Corporal or a Sergeant. GOID said he returned to this house again in the afternoon, and at this time the unknown American soldier gave GOID an envelope containing several sheets of handwritten or typewritten paper containing information pertaining to the division in which the soldier was employed at Los Alamos, New Mexico. GOID said he did not know how important this information was. At the time the soldier furnished GOID the information, he was handed the \$500.00. GOID said the soldier took the money and said that he needed it badly. HARRY GOID has advised that he has no recollection of obtaining a receipt from the soldier and believes that he did not do so.

HARRY GOLD advised that he used the name FRANK KESSLER in his meeting with the soldier. He is not certain about the name KESSLER, but he definitely remembers that he used the first name FRANK. GOLD has advised that although he was given the name of the soldier at this time, he has completely forgotten it. GOLD said that he believed this soldier to be a native of the Bronx or Brooklyn, New York, and stated that the soldier talked with a definite New York accent.





GOLD also recalls that this soldier told him that he and his wife were returning to New York on furlough about Christmas time and gave GOLD the address of his mother-in-law or father-in-law in New York City for a possible future meeting. GOLD said, however, he never made such a meeting and saw this unknown American soldier on only this one occasion. GOLD also said that this soldier's wife was present at the time of their meeting, though he believes the wife was sent into the kitchen or bathroom when the actual business was transacted. GOLD said the soldier's wife had only recently arrived in Albuquerque, and it was his impression that the American soldier had not been there too many months. He said this couple had no children.

On June 2, 1950, HARRY GOLD furnished the following signed statement to Special Agents RICHARD E. BRENNAN and T. SCOTT HILLER concerning his associations with an unidentified American soldier in Albuquerque, New Mexico:





"Philadelphia, Penna, June 2, 1950

"I, HARRY GOLD, make the following voluntary statement to RICHARD E. BRENNAN and T. SCOTT MILIER, JR., who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice. No threats or promises have been made to me, and I realize that I do not have to make a statement, and any statement I do make may be used against me in a court of law. I realize I have a right to counsel.

"As of the Spring of 1945 I had been engaged in espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union, since 1936. There were two lapses in my espionage activities, one from the late Summer of 1938 to late Summer of 1940, during which time I was attending college in Cincinnati, Ohio, The second lapse was from the Spring of 1941 to the Fall of 1941. In the Spring, SAM, who was my Russian contact at the time, told me I was not needed anymore. In the Fall, however, SAM told me that now that Russia had been attacked, we must resume our work on an intensified scale.

"In the Spring of 1945, I was meeting regularly with a man unknown to me except by the name of JOHN, who was obviously a Russian, and who had succeeded SAM as my Russian contact.

"Sometime around May of 1945 I met JOHN in, I believe, a bar on Third Ave, New York City. This meeting was to discuss plans for my departure in June of 1945 for Santa Fe, New Mexico. I was going to Santa Fe on the instructions of JOHN. During this meeting JOHN supplied me with a name and address of a man in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and instructed me to contact this man while I was there. I believe JOHN told me to contact the man's wife in case the man was not there. JOHN told me that I would receive information from this man, which I was to deliver to JOHN. JOHN gave me an envelope containing about \$500.00. I was instructed to give this money to the man in Albuquerque in payment for the information. I was instructed to give this sum to him only if he would indicate a need for funds.

"I left Philadelphia in June of 1945 and went to Albuquerque, and then Santa Fe, N.M. On my return from Santa Fe to Albuquerque on a Saturday evening, I tried unsuccessfully to contact this man on that evening. I was informed that he was not at home at that time. I again went to his house on the next morning, Sunday. At this

time I met the man. I cannot recall this man's name, but I believe he lived on the second or third floor of a house, the exact address of which I cannot remember. It was, however, somewhere north of East Central Ave, one or two blocks north, and somewhere between No. High Street and No. Pine Street.

Introduced myself to this man as either FRANKINGSLER or FRANK MARTIN, I cannot recall which. I used some form of recognition, involving the first name of a man, and stating that he had sent me. This individual recognized the password.

"At this time I discovered to my surprise that this individual whom I was contacting was in the U. S. Army, and was, I believe, a Technician Fifth Grade. His rating may have been higher, however. This man was not over 25 years of age, perhaps even younger, about 5'7", sturdily built, dark brown or black hair; which was either curly or bushy, brown eyes, shub nose, even teeth, a wide mouth, and an open, pleasing countenance. I believe from things he said that his home was in New York City, possibly the Bronx or Brooklyn, not Manhattan. I also met his wife. She was about 5'3" and normally good looking, and neither excessively stout or slender. Her name may have been RUTH, although I am not sure.

"I returned to this house later in the afternoon, at which time he gave me an envelope containing three to five pages of written information, and possibly one sketch. This information dealt with, I'believe, a generalized description of the area in los Alamos, N.M., in which he worked. There may also have been a sketch of some bit of structural equipment or a machine.

"I believe, from what he said, that he worked in one of four jobs at Los Alamos: 1 - As a draftsman, 2 - As a machinist, 3 - As an electrician, 4 - In the physics labratory.

"At the time that this man gave me the envelope containing the information, I gave him the approximately \$500.00. He had expressed a need for funds to enable his wife to stay near him.

"During this conversation that I had with this man, tentative arrangements were made for a second meeting between us. This meeting was to occur in New York City during a furlough which he expected to get at Christmas time 1945. I was to call this man's father-in-law, in the Bronx, N.Y. The father-in-laws first name was, or may have been, PHILIP.





This meeting never occurred, on the orders of JOHN, who seemed to have lost interest when I mentioned the matter to him in the late fall of 1945. I have never seen this soldier nor his wife since, nor have I heard from them.

"I took the information which I received from this man in Albuquerque, and turned it over to JOHN upon my return to New York. The actual transfer of the information from me to JOHN occurred in Brooklyn, in the neighborhood of Metropolitan Ave.

## B. GOLD'S DESCRIPTION OF UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIFR AND WIFE

On June 2, 1950, HARRY GOLD advised Special Agents T. SCOTT MILLER and RICHARD E. BRENNAN that his unknown American soldier contact could be described as follows:

the soldier and his wife mentioned the difficulties in finding a Jewish type delicatessen in Albuquerque, New Mexico.)

GOLD's description of the soldier's wife is somewhat less specific. He described her as being approximately 5'3" in height and good looking, as well as possibly having the first name of RUTH.

## C. HOUSE IN WHICH CONTACT WAS MADE

HARRY GOLD advised on June 2; 1950 that in order to reach the residence of the unknown American soldier, he walked up the main street of Albuquerque, that is, the street on which the Hilton Hotel is located, and walked on the same side of the street on which the Hilton Hotel is. GOLD said he continued on this street and passed the point where the Santa Fe Railroad tracks run either over or under the street, and then continued on for somewhere between five and eight blocks. He said that at this point he turned left, and the house where the American soldier lived was the first, second or third house from the corner on the left-hand side of the street in the direction in which GOLD was walking. GOLD is not certain as to whether this house was a single or duplex house, but he stated that if it were a duplex, the American soldier lived on the side closest to the main street.

On June 3, 1950, HARRY GOLD, when shown a map of Albuquerque, New Mexico, said that his original story was not quite correct. He said that he had forgotten the Hilton Hotel was not on the main street of Albuquerque, New Mexico. However, he said that his method of going to the residence of the unknown American soldier was substantially the same as he had furnished on the previous day.

GOLD said this house was not of the Spanish or Mexican type architecture but was more of the conventional American type. He said this house is set back from the street not more than fifteen or twenty feet and has a small patch of lawn in front of it. He said the house has a glass or screen enclosed perch. He also advised that the foundation of the house was brick or cement and that a few feet above the foundation and below the siding proper was brown clapboard. GOLD advised that this house was on a shaded street which was paved from curb to curb with some type of macadam. He also said this soldier lived on the second or third floor in a one room and bath or one room and kitchen apartments. GOLD advised that the stairs to this apartment rose directly from the enclosed porch and it was not necessary to enter the downstairs apartment in order to get to this soldier's apartment. GOLD has also stated that he feels the entrance to the porch was from the side of the house and not a center entrance. GOLD said that diagonally across the main street from the American soldier's residence, on the opposite corner or up one block, was an automobile agency, and a block or two beyond that was a blue neon sign.

## III. SUSPECT, DAVID GREENGLASS

Albuquerque Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised on June 2, 1950 that a logical suspect in this matter was one DAVID TREENGLASS, who with his wife, RUTH, had a small efficiency apartment at 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, during the period of GOLD's contact. T-1 advised that this house has been remodeled since 1945.

On June 6, 1950, HARRY GOLD was exhibited pictures of DAVID CREENCLASS or Special Agents RICHARD E. BRENNAN and T. SCOTT MILLER. At this time GOLD advised that he was not able to effect any identification of GREENCLASS from the current photographs of him; however, GOLD advised that, a picture of GREENCLASS in which he were an accidence gown, without a later resembled to a great extent the individual when he had contacted in Albuquerque in 1945. This latter picture was taken of CREENCLASS in 1940. In connection with the pictures of GREENCLASS and those of his time, GOLD stated that he could not make a definite identification from any of these pictures. He did state, however, that there was some resemblance between RUTH GREENCLASS and the unknown American soldier's wife whom he had met in 1945.

On June 7, 1950, HARRY GOLD was shown current motion picture films of houses in areas in Albuquerque, New Mexico, that coincided with the general directions furnished by him in reaching the residence of his American soldier contect. In these films GOLD selected the house at 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico, as that most closely resembling the house he visited in June of 1945.

## ADMINISTRATIVE SHEET

Posserance is made to Albuquerque letters of June 6 and June 8, 1950, along with which was submitted a photograph of the house at 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico, during the year 1945. At the present time this photograph has not been shown to HARRY GOLD.

During the recent search of the residence of HARRY GOLD at 6023 Kindred Street, Kulladelphia, Pennsylvania, many items were secured. At the present two an englysis of the material regioned has redicated nothing relating to DANTO GRADALLES on to the Albuquerque incident.

It the present time no comparative descriptive data are being set up for DATAL (REENGLASS and the unknown American subject, as the New York Office has added that DAVID GREENGLASS currently weight approximately 195 pounds. This weight is roughly twenty-five pounds heavier than that of the American contact of HARRY GOLD.

At the present time complete descriptive information concerning DAVID CREENGLASS during the period that he was employed by the AEC has not been received from the Bureau.

DETAILS: The investigation in instant ease was predicated upon information furnished by HARRY GOLD to Special Agents RICHARD E. BRENNAN and T. SCOTT MILLER, Jr., in a voluntary signed statement dated June 3, 1950, which is set out as follows:

"Philadelphia, Penna. June 2, 1950

"I, Harry Gold, make the following voluntary statement to Richard E. Brennan and T. Scott Miller, Jr., who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice. No threats or promises have been made to me, and I realize that I do not have to make a statement, and any statement I do make may be used against me in a court of law. I realize I have a right to counsel.

"As of the Spring of 1945 I had been engaged in espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union, since 1936. There were two lapses in my espionage activities, one from the late Summer of 1938 to late Summer of 1940, during which time I was attending College in Cincinnati, Ohio. The second lapse was from the Spring of 1941 to the Fall of 1941. In the Spring Sam, who was my Russian contact at the time, told me I was not needed anymore. In the Fall, however, Sam told me that now that Russia had been attacked, we must resume our work on an intensified scale.

"In the Spring of 1945, I was meeting regularly with a man unknown to me except by the name of dehn, who was obviously a Russian, and who had succeeded Sam as my Russian centact.

"Sometime around May of 1945 I met John in, I believe, a bar on Third Ave, New York City. This meeting was to discuss plans for my departure in June of 1945 for Santa Fe, New Mexico. I was going to Santa Fe on the instructions of John. Luring this meeting John supplied me with a name and address of a man in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and instructed me to contact this man while I was there. I believe John told me to contact the man's wife in case the man was not there. John told me that I would receive information from this man, which I was to deliver to John. John gave me an envalope containing about \$500.00. I was instructed to give this money to the man in Albuquerque in payment for the information. I was instructed to give this sum to him only if he would indicate a need for funds.

I left Philadelphia in June of 1945 and went to Albuquerque, and then Sante Fe, N.M. On my return from Santa Fe to Albuquerque on a Saturday evening, I tried unsuccessfully to contact this man on that evening. I was informed that

he was not at home at that time. I again went to his house on the next morning, Sunday. At this time I met the man. I cannot recall this man's name, but I believe he lived on the second or third floor of a house, the exact address of which I cannot remember. It was, however, somewhere north of East Central Ave., one or two blocks north, and somewhere between N. High Street and N. Pine Street.

"I introduced myself to this man as either Frank Kessler or <u>Frank</u> Martin, I cannot recall which. I used some form of recognition, involving the first name of a man, and stating that he had sent me. This individual recognized the password.

"At this time I discovered to my surprise that this individual whom I was contacting was in the U. S. Army, and was, I believe, a Technician Fifth Grade. His rating may have been higher, however. This man was not over 25 years of age, perhaps even younger, about 5' 7", sturdily built, dark brown or black hair, which was either curly or bushy, brown eyes, snub nose, even teeth, a wide mouth, and an open, pleasing countenance. I believe from things he said that his home was in New York City, possibly the Bronx or Brooklyn, not Manhattan. I also met his wife. She was about 5' 3" and normally good looking and neither excessively stout or slender. Her name may have been Ruth, although I am not sure.

"I returned to this house in the afternoon, at which time he gave me an envelope containing three to five pages of written information, and possibly one sketch. This information dealt with, I believe, a generalized description of the area in Los Alamos, N.M., in which he worked. There may also have been a sketch of some bit of structural equipment or a machine.

"I believe, from what he said, that he worked in one of four jobs at Los Alamos: 1-As a draftsman. 2-As a machinist. 3-As an electrician. 4-In the physics labratory.

"At the time that this man gave me the envelope containing the information, I gave him the approximately \$500.00. He had expressed a need for funds to enable his wife to stay near him.

"During this conversation that I had with this man, tentative arrangements were made for a second meeting between us. This meeting was to occur in New York City during a furlough which he expected to get at Christmas time 1945. I was to call this man's father-in-law, in the Bronx, N.Y. The father-in-law's first name was, or may have been Philip. This meeting never occurred, on the orders of John, who seemed to have lost interest when I mentioned the natter to him in the late fall of 1945. I have never seen this soldier nor his wife since, nor have I heard from them.

"I took the information which I received from this man in Albuquerque, and turned it over to John upon my return to New York. The actual transfer of the information from me to John, occurred in Brooklyn, in the neighborhood of Metropolitan Ave.

I have read the above statement consisting of this and five other pages and am signing each page as all the information contained therein is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

Confidential Informant TA-18, of known reliability, advised that the records of the Los Alamos Project, New Mexico, reflect that one DAVID GRENOLASS, rank T-5, Army Serial No. 32882473, was at Los Alamos from an unknown date to about February, 1946, and, in January 1945, was assigned to Group X-4. It was indicated that DAVID GREENGLASS was born warch 3, 1922, at New York, New York. His father, GARNET GREENGLASS, was born in Russia and his mother, TESSIE TEIT GREENGLASS, was born in Austria. He attended Brooklyn Polytechnic for one semester in 1940. GREENCLASS listed his home address as 266 Stanton Street, New York, New York. He was on furlough from December 30, 1944 to January 20, 1945.

Special Agent MAURICE W. CORCORAN and reporting agent ascertained that the name GREENGLASS did not appear on the bells or mail boxes at 266 Stanton Street, New York City.

It was noted that the telephone directory for the Borough of Manhatten, New York, disclosed that one DAVID GREENGLASS or 265 Rivington Street was listed as having telephone number Orchard 4-4673.

At 265 Rivington Street, New York City, which is an apartment house, it was ascertained that the name D. GRENGLASS appeared on the bell.

Confidential Informant TA-1, of known reliability, on June 3, 1950, advised that to the best of his recollection one GREENGLASS moved over two years ago from 266 Stanton Street to 25h Rivington Street, New York City, c/o PRINCE (ph.). Confidential Informant TA-1 advised that he has never scen GREENGLASS but merely recollects that occasionally he has left mail for them at 25h Rivington Street, c/o PRINCE (ph.).

Confidential Informant TA-1 further advised that he recalled that a GREENCLASS family now resides at 265 Rivington Street, New York City. It was informant's opinion that this GREENGLASS, who is an ex-GI, married and in his middle 20's, originally came from 64 Sheriff Street, where his mother is employed as a superintendent. GREENGLASS' mother allegedly resides on the first floor of 64 Sheriff Street.

Confidential Informant TA-1 was unable to furnish additional information and was unable to state whether or not the GRANGLASS individuals mentioned hereinabove as having resided at 266 Stanton and 64 Sheriff Street were in any way related.

On June 3, 1950, Confidential Informant TA-2, of known reliability, advised that DAVID GREENGLASS of 265 Rivington Street, apartment 6, New York City, then held a charge account with Macy's Department Store, New York City, which had been started December 11, 1949. The informant advised that DAVID GREENGLASS' wife was known as RUTH and that DAVID GREENGLASS' o cupation was that of machinist. He worked for the Arma Engineering Corporation and received \$107.00 a week as a salary.

Confidential Informant TA-3, of known reliability, advised that DAVID GREENGLASS had telephone service initiated at 265 Rivington Street on September 26, 1946. The informant noted that GREENCLASS was a veteran and that his occupation at that time was that of machinist with G & R Engineering Company (no address shown). The informant also stated that at that time DAVID GREENGLASS had an account with the Public National Bank at Delancey and Orchard Street.

Confidential Informant TA-4, of known reliability, advised on June 3, 1950, that as of December 14, 1949, DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTH, were residing at 265 Rivington Street, New York City. DAVID GREENGLASS' occupation was shown as that of machinist at Arma Engineering Corporation, 36th Street and 3rd Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. It was further ascertained that he had a charge account at Macy's Department Store which had been opened on December 14, 1949.

Confidential Informant TA-5, of known reliability, advised that DAVID GREENGIASS began his employment with Arma Engineering Company, 254, 36th Street, Brooklyn, New York, about September 19, 1949. His address at that time was 265 Rivington Street, New York, New York. He was employed as a mechanic to work on a machine in the model shop in the Engineering Department of Arma Engineering Company.

Confidential Informant TA-5 made available a fingerprint card containing the fingerprints and description of DAVID GREENGIASS. The following description of DAVID GREENGIASS was noted thereon:

March 3, 1922, New York, New York Borne 51 911 Height: Weights 190 lbs. Hairt Black Hazel Eyest Builda Medium Complexion: Medium Races White

Confidential Informant TA-5 further advised that DAVID GREENGIASS wife had suffered severe burns in a fire accident about two months earlier and had required blood transfusions.

Confidential Informant TA-5 also stated that to the best of his knowledge, Arma Engineering Company is engaged mainly on Navy contracts, some of which are classified.

Confidential Informant TA-6, of known reliability, furnished two photos of DAVID GREENGIASS which apparently had been taken about September 1949. Confidential Informant TA-6 also advised that in an application for employment dated September 9, 1949, DAVID GREENGIASS, 265 Rivington Street, New York, furnished the following information concerning himself:

## Background

Married seven years; wife - RUTH GREENGLASS; one child (son); had been residing at 265 Rivington Street for past three years; father - BARNET (deceased), had been self-employed machinist, born in Russia, naturalized citizen; mother - TESSIE, age 69, housewife at 64 Sheriff Street, New York City, had been born in Austria, naturalized citizen; brother - SAMUETA GREENGLASS 1384 Carroll Street, Brooklyn, age 39, employed by Pohltock Watch Company as watch and instrument worker; sister - ETHEL, 10 Monroe Street, housewife GREENGLASS age 34; brother - BERNARD, 65 Cannon Street, machinist, age 32 years, un-employed.

Confidential Informant TA-6 further advised that DAVID GREENGLASS has Social Security No. 057-12-3377, birth certificate # 10817, issued in New York on March 3, 1922. It was also stated that DAVID GREENGLASS had registered at Local Board #6.

According to Confidential Informant TA-6, DAVID CREENGLASS applied for a position as experienced machinist at Arma Engineering Company and is now employed on the night shift between the hours of 1:45 pm and 1:15 am from

Monday through Friday (30 minutes off for lunch) as a mechanic on a machine in the model shop.

Confidential Informant TA-6 stated that Arma Engineering Company is engaged mainly on Navy contracts, some of which are classified. He stated that other Government contracts are also handled and that some of these are classified.

Confidential Informant TA-6 further advised that DAVID GREENGLASS on September 19, 1949 signed the Sabotage statute as having read it. DAVID GREENGLASS indicated that he did not then, and would not later, advocate or hold membership in any organization or group that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States of America.

The recerds of the New York City Department of Health reflect that DAVID GREENGLASS was born March 3, 1922 in Manhattan and his father was listed as BARNET, born in Russia, age forty eight, occupation machine repairing; mother TESSIE FEIT, born in Austria, age thirty eight, occupation housewife. The residence was given as 64 Sheriff Street, New York City. An item stated that there were three other children in the family at that time.

The same department listed STEVEN LAWRENCE GREENGLASS, born August 6, 1946 at the Jewish Maternity Hospital. The father's name was listed as DAVID, born New York City, age twenty-four, occupation machinist, engineering company; mother, RUTH PRINTZ, born New York City, age twenty-two, occupation housewife. One other child was in the family. The residence was given as 265 Rivington Street, New York City.

The same department listed ROSE LAPRINTZ, born April 30, 1924 in Manhattan. The father was listed as MAX, born Austria, age twenty-six, occupation slaughterer; mother as TAUBE LIGHTER, born Austria, age twenty-three, occupation housewife. An item appeared that there was one other child in the family at the time. The residence was listed as like Lewis Street.

The records of the Manhattan Marriage Bureau, New York City, listed the marriage of DAVID GREENGLASS, 64 Sheriff Street, New York City, to RUTH PRINTZ, 254 Rivington Street, on November 29, 1942, Certificate No. 23765. The following information appeared in regard to DAVID GREENGLASS.

He was white, age twenty, occupation machinist, born New York City, father's name, BARNET, born in Russia; mother's name, TESSIE, nee FEIT, born Austria.

The following information appeared for RUTH PRINTZ:

She was white, age eighteen, born New York City, occupation secretary, father, MAX I born Hungary; mother, TILLIE, new LEITER, born Austria.

There was a notation that it was the first marriage for both and they were married by Rabbi MAURICE HULKOWNER, 1548 President Street, Brooklyn. Witnesses were given as JACOB N. COHEN and MAX TABAK.

#### SELECTIVE RECORDS .

Confidential Informant TD-4 advised that DAVID GREENGLASS of 64
Sheriff Street, New York City, registered with Local Draft Board #6 on June 30,
1942. He received Order No. 11234. The registration card executed by the
registrant stated that he was known to his employer, the Peerless Laboratory,
as DAVID GREEN and DAVID GREENE. GREENGLASS was born March 3, 1922 in New York
City. He attended eight years of elementary school, four years of high school,
and one semester at Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute. His Occupational Questionnaire
reflects that he was employed as a turret-lathe operator and general machinist.
He stated that his previous occupational experience had been as an electrician's
helper from 1937 to 1949, as a machinist's helper from 1939 to 1940, and as a
turret-lathe operator from 1940 to 1942. He indicated he was single and listed
the following individuals as his relatives:

BARNET GREENGLASS, age 66, father TESSIE GREENGLASS, age 60, mother BERNARD GREENGLASS, brother



Confidential Informant TB-1, of known reliability, reported that RUTH GREENGLASS, wife of DAVID GREENGLASS, 265 Rivington Street, New York City, was admitted to Gouverneur Hospital, Gouverneur Slip, New York City, on February 14, 1950, suffering from extensive first, second and third degree burns of the body. These burns were suffered as a result of an accident in the home of GREENGLASS. RUTH GREENGLASS was discharged on March 13, 1950, and was advised to continue follow-up treatment at the out-patient department of the hospital. At the time of her admittance to the hospital RUTH GREENGLASS was six months' pregnant.

The records of the Bureau of Vital Statistics of the City of New York reflect that a child, BARBARA HELENE GREENGLASS, was born on May 16, 1950 at Beth Israel Hospital to DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH PRINTZ of 265 Rivington Street, New York City.

## RECORDS OF ATOMIC ENERGY COMMISSION, NEW YORK CITY

Confidential Informant TB-2, of known reliability, reported that DAVID GREENGLASS had been attached to the Manhattan Engineering District Project, Special Engineering Detachment, U. S. Army. He was thereafter transferred to the installation at Los Alamos, New Mexico

The same Informant reported that prior to GREENGLISS' induction he had been employed by the International Telephone and Telegraph Company, Varich and Spring Streets, New York City.

Mr. RAYMOND SPROW, Head of Plant Protection, Federal Telephone and Radio Corporation, Clifton, New Jersey, advised that the records of the International

Telephone and Telegraph Company in his custody reflected that DAVID GREEN had been employed from July 28, 1941 to October 7, 1941 in the machine shop of the Rectifier Division. This DAVID GREEN has the same Social Security Number and date of birth as GREENGIASS.

## BACKGROUND OF RELATIVES OF DAVID GREENGLASS

## BARNETT GREENGLASS, FATHER

The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, New York City reflect that BARNETT CREENCHASS, under number 114954, filed a petition for naturalization. A review of his file reflects that he was born on June 8, 1876 at Humen, Russia. He emigrated from Antwerp, Belgium on the SS KROONLAND and arrived at New York City on August 15, 1903. He listed his occupation as a machinist and set forth the following family:

Wife, TESSIE, born July 9, 1884, Austria Son, SAMUEL, born March 16, 1909, New York Daughter, ETHEL, born September 28, 1915, New York Son, BERNARD, born November 30, 1917, New York

BARNETT GREENGLASS was admitted to United States citizenship on April 6, 1921.

## SAMUEL GREENGLASS, BROTHER

The records of Local Draft Board #216, New York City, reflect that SAMUEL CREENCLASS, a resident of 1384 Carroll Street, Brooklyn, New York, was born on March 16, 1909 at New York City. He listed his occupation as a material man with the New Jersey Jewelers Supply House, Newark, New Jersey. He was married on June 5, 1932 at New York City, and had one child, a daughter, MARILYN. He listed BARNETT and TESSIE as his parents, and ETHEL, BERNARD and DAVID as his sister and brothers.

## BERNARD ABRAHAM GREENGLASS, BROTHER

The records of Selective Service, Local Board #6, reflect that BERNARD ABRAHAM GREENGLASS, born on November 30, 1917 at New York City, registered on October 16, 1940. A review of this file reflects that he stated his brother DAVID had been employed for Eugene, Ltd., 100 Imlay Street, Brooklyn, as a tool box maker on May 22, 1941. He listed debts due by his family, totaling \$2,230. He was inducted on May 1, 1942 and received Army Serial No. 32329855. He attained the rank of Corporal and was discharged on August 4, 1945. His service included two years, six months and 18 days in the European theater of operations.

## MAX JACOS PRINTZ, FATHER-IN-LAW

The records of Local Draft Board #6 reflect that MAX JACOB PRINTZ, 25h Rivington Street, registered on February 15, 1912. It was indicated that he was born on May 1, 1898 in Hungary, that his wife was TILLIE PRINTZ, and that he had four children. He indicated he was employed as a fat trimmer by Cudahy Packing Company, Jersey City, New Jersey. He also stated that he owned a drygoods store at 257 Rivington Street. He listed the following children:

## SIDNEY JOSEPH PRINTZ, BROTHER-IN-LAW

The records of Local Draft Board #103 reflect that SIDNEY JOSEPH PRINTZ, son of MAX JOSEPH PRINTZ and TILLIE PRINTZ, was horn on July 31. 1921 at New York City. He had been a student at Tulane University, Louisiana, and enlisted in the U. S. Naval Reserve on July 12, 1942. He entered active service on July 1, 1943 and w as honorably discharged on July 5, 1945, attaining the rank of Ensign. His Navy Serial Number was 121918.

Through the cooperation of Confidential Informant TC-1, of known reliability, at the National City Bank of New York, Personal Credit Department, 17 East 42nd Street, NewYork City, the following information was obtained: This information should not be disclosed except in the usual proceedings following the issuance of a subpoena.

Informant advised that DAVID GREENGIASS had made two loans with the National City Bank of New York, first of which was in 1947 and the second of which was in 1949 and is still open.

## Loan No. 3-1217-698

This loan was made in 1947 for \$300 and the proceeds, after deducting the bank's interest in advance, were \$285.98. This amount was paid by National City Bank Check #239335. This check has not as yet been furnished for observation by the National City Bank of New York.

On application #42-3657, which washade in order to procure the above loan, DAVID GREENGLASS set forth the following information:

He had resided at 265 Rivington Street, New York City, for one year. His last previous address was 64 Sheriff Street, New York City, where he had resided for 21 years. He gave the name of his wife as RUTH.

He stated he was employed by G & R Engineering Company in the machine shop at 300 East Second Street, New York City, telephone GR 3-8330. He gave his position as Shop Foreman and stated he had been associated with this company for one year. His yearly salary was \$2250. He listed his previous employment as the Army. He replied in the negative to questions as to whether he owned a motor car, real estate or had a personal bank account. He said, however, that the G & R Engineering Co. had a bank account at the Manufacturers Trust Company, Grand Street Branch.

GREENGLASS offered as identification Operator License #1673351, State of issue not given, and also offered a War Department identification photograph.

The loan file on GREENGLASS reflects that the National City

Bank of New York made inquiry of the Manufacturers Trust Company regarding the account of G & R Engineering Company and learned that GREENGLASS signed as a partner on this account.

## Loan No. 17-1419-974

This loan was made August 18, 1949. GREENGLASS filled out application #42-1723 dated August 2, 1949. He gave as his address 265 Rivington Street, New York City, Apartment 6, telephone OR 4-4673. He gave a last previous address as the Army. He listed his wife sname as RUTH and stated he had two dependents. He said he wasborn in New York City on March 3, 1922.

At the time of his application, GREENGLASS was employed as a Shop Foreman by Pitt Machine Products, Inc., 370 East Houston Street, New York City, telephone GR 3-8330. (It is noted that this telephone number is the same aspreviously listed for G & R Engineering Co.) GREENGLASS stated he had been with this firm for four years and earned an annual salary of \$2750.

The National City Bank of New York confirmed the employment of GREENGLASS through Mr. ROSENBERG (ph), President of Pitt Machine Products, Inc.

The amount of this loan was \$300 and the net proceeds, after deduction of interest, were \$285.98, which were received by GREENGLASS in the form of cash at the Grand Street Branch of the National City Bank of New York. Confidential Informant TC-1 advised that payment was made at the Grand Street Branch because GREENGLASS made application for the loan at that branch. The purpose of the loan was stated to be for repayment of money to a relative and also to pay an insurance premium.

The file indicated that GREENGLASS was co-maker on loans #1-0018-285 and 21-0008-862.

The files indicated that the National City Bank of New York had, during the course of its investigation, made inquiry concerning GREENGIASS of the Public National Bank and Trust Company, 7th Street and Avenue C, New York City, who advised the National City Bank that GREENGIASS had an account with them. They stated this account had been opened in December, 1947 and had an average balance running to a medium three figures.

They also advised that Pitt Machine Products had a secured low-moderate four figure loan at Public National Bank and that in connection with Pitt Machine Products, DAVID GREENGIASS signed as Vice-President.

Through the cooperation of Confidential Informant TC-2, of known reliability, the following information was obtained from the records of the Manufacturers Trust Company, 376 Grand Street, New York City. This information should not be disclosed except in a usual proceeding following the issuance of a subpoena.

Special Checking Account #3227 in the name of RUTH GREENGLASS, DAVID GREENGLASS, Attorney

It was determined that RUTH GREENGLASS had opened Special Checking Account #3227 on October 7, 1949 and that DAVID GREENGLASS has power of attorney. The address on this account is 265 Rivington Street, New York City. There is no identifying information, such as, references, background of banking activities, and so forth.

A transcript of this account was prepared from October 7, 1949 until May 31, 1950, the date of the last transaction in this account. The account opened on October 7, 1949 with a deposit of \$18.00 and activity in the account to date has been very moderate with no large transactions either in the form of deposits or withdrawals. The balance in the account on May 31, 1950 was \$44.78.

It was possible to examine certain of the cancelled vouchers and these are listed below:

A check in the amount of \$10.00 was charged to the account on May 1, 1950, payable to Cash and endorsed by M. H. FOOD DISTRIBUTORS, and deposited in Branch 6 of the Manufacturers Trust Company.

A check in the amount of \$43.13 was charged May 11, 1950 and was payable to Consolidated Edison Company for accounts #161-315 and 191196.

There was charged to this account on May 15, 1950 a check

in the amount of \$8,00 payable to Goldsmith Brothers.

There was also charged on May 15, 1950 a check in the amount of \$6.32 payable to the New York Telephone Company for phone number OR 4-4673.

There are charged on May 17 and 18, 1950 checks for \$2.60 and \$5.98 respectively, each payable to Sears Roebuck & Co., Philadelphia, Pa.

There was charged on May 19, 1950 a check for \$40.00 payable to Dr. HARRY SCHNEIDER, which was deposited in Branch 22of the Corn Exchange Bank and Trust Company.

There was charged on May 29, 1950 a check for \$10.00 payable to Cash and endorsed by RUTH GREENGLASS and then by DENICTSILING (illegible) of 265 Rivington Street. This check was deposited in Branch 22 of the Corn Exchange Bank and Trust Company.

There was charged on May 29, 1950 a check for \$48.00 which waspaid to BETH ISRAEL HOSPITAL and deposited in the Manufacturers Trust Company.

There was charged on May 31, 1950 a check in the amount of \$65.00 payable to TESSIE GREENGLASS and endorsed by SAM GREENGLASS and deposited in the Metropolitan Industrial Bank, NewYork City (formerly Montrose Industrial Bank).

A check dated May 9, 1950 in the amount of \$20.00 was paid to the Mutual Holding Corporation and deposited by payee in the 42nd Street Branch of the Chase National Bank of New York.

A check dated May 13, 1950 in the amount of \$20,00 was paid to the National City Bank of New York for personal loan 17-1419-974. This was deposited in Branch 42 of the National City Bank of New York. It was drawn by DAVID GREENGLASS as attorney.

A check dated May 9, 1950 in the amount of \$20.11 was paid to MAX J. PRINTZ, and endorsed by payee, of 256 Rivington Street. This was then endorsed by K & K Kosher Meat Market and deposited in Branch 22 of the Corn Exchange Bank and Trust Company.

A check dated May 4, 1950 in the amount of \$40.00 was paid to DIANA/EINSOHN and deposited by payee in the main office of the National City Bank of New York. This check bore the stamp of the Compound Interest Department of that bank. The face of the check also bore a notation "I,S.".

## Safe Deposit Box 1602-B

It was determined through Confidential Informant TC-2 that RUTH and DAVID GREENGLASS maintained a Safe Deposit Box 1602-B at the Grand Street Branch of the Manufacturers Trust Company, New York City. This box was taken out in September of 1945 and at that time their address was c/o PRINTZ, 254 Rivington Street, New York City.

## Safe Deposit Box 1144-B

It was determined also that MAX or TILLIE PRINTZ of 254 Rivington Street, maintained Box 1144-B at the Grand Street Branch of the National City Bank, New York City. This box was taken out June 26, 1945.

It was determined from Confidential Informant TC-2 that the Manufacturers Trust Company does not maintain a record of the dates on which box holders have access to their various boxes.

Confidential Informant TD-1, of known reliability, advised that DAVID CREENCLASS, 265 Rivington Street, on his 1947 New York State Income Tax Return stated that his net income for the year was less than twenty-five hundred dollars, and that he had been employed as a partner by the G & R Engineer Company (no address shown) and by the Pitt Machine Products, Inc., 370 East Houston Street, New York City, as an engineer. This return reflected that CREENGLASS was married to RUTH LEE CREENGLASS, and had one son. His deductions showed interest to the National City Bank for a loan.

Confidential Informant TD-2, of known reliability, advised that GREENGLASS had obtained a loan from the National City Bank on August 15, 1949.

The records of the New York City Board of Elections reflect that RUTH and DAVID GREENGLASS registered for the American Labor Party during the years 1946 and 1947. In 1948 and 1949 they both registered as members of one of the major parties. Prior to 1946 RUTH GREENGLASS had not voted, and DAVID GREENGLASS had last registered in 1944 absentee from New Mexico. During the years 1946 to 1949 both were residing, according to these records, at 265 Rivington Street, New York City, and both were born in the United States.

The American Labor Party was cited by the Special House Committee on Un-American Activities by report, March 29, 1944, page 78, which states, "For years the Communist Party has put forth the greatest effort to capture the American Labor Party throughout New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Brooklyn sections of the American Labor Party, but outside of New York City they have been unable to win control."

The American Labor Party was also cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, reports of 1948, pages 40 and 41, which included it in one of the Worganizations that were victims of Communist domination.\*

Confidential Informant TA 6 advised on June 5, 1950, that DAVID GREENGLASS had appeared at ARMA ENGINEERING COMPANY, Brooklyn, New York, during that morning to request one and one-half month's leave of absence because his wife had suffered a relapse and he had to take his family out-of-town. GREENGLASS indicated that he would telephone the ARMA ENGINEERING COMPANY on the following day to find out if the leave would be granted. He also said he intended to leave Thursday but might come to work until then.

Confidential Informant TA 6 subsequently pointed out that DAVID GREENGLASS did not report to work June 2, 1950 and failed to show up for work on June 5, 1950.

On June 5, 1950 SA LAWRENCE W. SPILLANE and the reporting agent maintained a spot surveillance in the vicinity of 265 Rivington Street, New York City, beginning at 11:25 A.M. DAVID GREENGLASS and a woman identified as his wife were observed at 1 P.M. in front of 256 Rivington Street, which is the location of the M. J. PRINTZ DRY GOODS STORE. At that time motion pictures and still photographs were obtained of DAVID GREENGLASS, his wife and an unidentified man entering a green 4-Door Kaiser automobile, with loading racks on roof, and bearing New York License #SUB 50-74. The unidentified man drove the car to the corner of Water Street and Gouverneur Slip, New York City. At 1:25 P.M. DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife left the automobile and entered the Gouverneur Hospital through its side entrance on Gouverneur Slip.

On June 7, 1950, Confidential Informant TA 6 advised that GREENGLASS had not contacted ARMA ENGINEERING COMPANY to find out the status of his leave request.

On June 5, 1950, Confidential Informant TA 7, of known reliability, advised that the records of Haaren High School, 59th Street and 10th Avenue, reflected that DAVID GREENGIASS attended there from February, 1936 until he graduated on January 31, 1940. His date of birth on his high school record was shown as March 3, 1922; his parent's name was given as BARNET GREENGIASS. DAVID GREENGIASS' address was shown as 64 Sheriff Street, New York City, and later on as 265 Rivington Street, New York City. DAVID GREENGIASS majored in Aviation courses while in attendance at the school and received grades of "Fair". However, he received a rating of "Good" or "Average" in conduct and character. He had previously attended Junior High School #97, which is no longer in existence. It was noted that DAVID GREENGIASS' grades were sent to the following institutions:

The January, 1940 edition of "Quill and Hammer", the class yearbook for GREENGLASS' graduating class, contained his photograph. These photographs had been taken by S. TARR, 5th Avenue and 42nd Street, New York City.

Confidential Informant TA 8, of known reliability, made available four photographic negatives of DAVID GREENGLASS taken in January, 1940 by S. TARR for the class yearbook.

Confidential Informant TA 9, of known reliability, advised that the records of Pratt Institute Evening School of Science and Technology, Brooklyn, New York, disclosed that DAVID GREENGLASS attended two terms at that school ending June 14, 1948 and October 14, 1948, respectively. At that time he studied elements of drawing, algebra, shop drafting and trigonomentry. His address at that time was 265 Rivington Street, New York City.

Confidential Informant TA 10, of known reliability, advised that the records of the Brooklyn Polytechnical Institute, Brooklyn, New York, disclosed that GREENGIASS applied for admission for the term beginning February, 1940. At that time his address was 64 Sheriff Street, New York City. The records indicated that GREENGIASS had been born at that address on February 3, 1922. It was also indicated that BARNET GREENGIASS was then a machinist residing at 64 Sheriff Street, New York City. According to the Brooklyn Polytechnical Institute records DAVID GREENGIASS had had the following employments:

Electrician's helper at neighborhood electrical shop during Summers of 1937, 1938.

Soda dispenser for H. GREENGIASS, August, 1939.
Machinist's helper for B. GREENGIASS (father's store) after school.

GREENCLASS attended Brooklyn Polytechnical Institute for one term and in June, 1940 was requested to withdraw because of low grades.

According to the Brooklyn Polytechnical Institute records, GREENGLASS listed the following relatives and intimate friends interested in engineering or chemistry:

GREENGLASS also indicated in the record that he earned money during his attendance at high school by doing clerical work for the NATIONAL YOUTH ADMINISTRATION. He listed the following references:

MA TAIGMAN, 242 W. 22nd Street, New York City. MRS. IDEXKURIAND, 317 Lefferts Avenue, Brooklyn, N. Y. SAMUELY FREUND, 27 E. 22nd Street, New York City.

Confidential Informant TA 11, of known reliability, advised that the March, 1932 school census record of the New York City Board of Education, 110 Livingston Street, Brooklyn, New York, reflected that RUTH PRINTZ resided at 254 Rivington Street, New York City, at the time when RUTH was in Class 3A at Public School #4. RUTH's sister, DOROTHY PRINTZ, was born in 1928 and was not attending school at that time.

Confidential Informant TA 12, of known reliability, advised that the records of Public School #4 indicated that RUTH PRINTZ' birthdate was originally given as May 1, 1923, but was later changed to April 30, 1924 with the notation "Birth Certificate" indicating that a birth certificate was presented to make this change. In 1935 RUTH PRINTZ transferred from P.S. #4 to P.S. #12, New York City, and from there went to Junior High School. Her last address given at P.S. #4 was 254 Rivington Street, New York City.

Confidential Informant TA 13, of known reliability, advised that according to the records of Public School #12, RUTH PRINTZ was born May 1, 1923. She graduated from P.S. #12 in February, 1928 and her record was transferred to Seward Park High School, New York City.

Confidential Informant TA 14, of known reliability, advised that the records of the Seward Park High School disclosed that RUTH PRINTZ graduated from this school in January, 1941, having taken a commercial course. It was noted here that she was born May 1, 1924 and resided at 254 Rivington Street, New York City. She had a good scholastic record.

Confidential Informant TA 14 examined the graduation year books for the classes of January and June 1940 through 1942 and failed to locate a photograph of RUTH PRINTZ. RUTH PRINTZ' name did not appear in the back of these year books among those students who had graduated without having their photographs published in the yearbook. Transcripts of RUTH PRINTZ' record were sent to Brooklyn College Evening Session, April 17, 1942 and Washington Irving High School Evening School session, June 10, 1942.

Confidential Informant TA 15, of known reliability, advised that the records of Washington Irving High School disclosed that RUTH PRINTZ, while residing at 254 Rivington Street, New York City, attended the school for one semester from November to June, 1942, taking courses in geometry, intermediate algebra, and chemistry.

Confidential Informant TA 15 advised that photographs of students were not kept by Washington Irving High School.

According to Confidential Informant TA 15, RUTH PRINTZ had also attended the East Side Evening High School, New York City, from February, 1941 to January, 1942. This school is no longer in existence and its records were transferred to Seward Park High School.

Confidential Informant TA 14 advised that the records of Seward Park High School disclosed that while attending East Side Evening High School, RUTH PRINTZ had taken a course inNebrew, geometry, chemistry and European history from February, 1941 to January, 1942. However, no photographs were available.

Confidential Informant TA 16, of known reliability, advised that the records of Brooklyn College, Brooklyn, New York, disclosed that RUTH PRINTZ entered Brooklyn College in September, 1942 as a matriculated that student in the Evening School eligible for a Bachelor of Arts degree. She withdrew from the school on January 22, 1943 and her records bore as notation which, according to Confidential Informant TA 16, meant that RUTH PRINTZ claimed either that she contemplated entering military service or had decided to enter military service. No photographs of RUTH PRINTZ were available. When she entered Brooklyn College RUTH PRINTZ was residing at 254 Rivington Street and her date of birth was shown as May 1, 1924. There was no record of her under her married name of GREENGLASS.

Confidential Informant TA 17, of known reliability, advised that the following persons were listed as being members of the INTERNATIONAL WORKERS ORDER, Lodge 860, as of August, 1949:

It will be noted that the INTERNATIONAL WORKERS ORDER is one of the subversive Communist organizations listed by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order #9835. It may also be noted that Lodge 860 meet at Academy Hall, 853 Broadway, New York City.

On April 10, 1945, the Stamford Police Department arrested one, JOHN COURTNEY MACKEY, and ascertained that MACKEY had in his possession a letter addressed to himself from the CLUB OLGIN of the COMMUNIST POLITICAL ASSOCIATION, 154 Clinton Street, New York City. The letter asked MACKEY why he did not come around to any meetings and invited him to come to the next meeting. The letter further stated that MACKEY did not show up when the rest of the members made a pledge for the COMMUNIST POLITICAL ASSOCIATION 1945 FUND DRIVE. MACKEY also had in his possession a personal notebook containing names and addresses. Among these was the following:

"Ruth Greenglass, 266 Stanton Street, New York City (Member of the AYD)".

It may be noted that the AYD (AMERICAN YOUTH FOR DEMOCRACY) is one of the subversive Communist organizations listed by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order #9835.

A continuous surveillance has been maintained with regard to DAVID GREENGLASS from June 5, 1950, to date. However, nothing of apparent significance has been noted with regard to his activities.

Confidential Informant TA 6 advised on June 9, 1950 that DAVID GREENGLASS had telephoned the ARMA ENGINEERING COMPANY on June 8, 1950, and had been informed that his request for a leave of absence had been denied. At that time DAVID GREENGLASS informed the ARMA ENGINEERING COMPANY that he would report for work as usual on the night of June 12, 1950. He stated that his wife would go out-of-town for a rest without him.

The following description and personal history of GREENGLASS was obtained by observation and a review of records:

By teletype dated June 1, 1950, the Philadelphia Office informed the Bureau, New York and Albuquerque that HARRY GOID on that date had advised that when he saw FUCHS at Santa Fe, New Mexico, in June 1945, he stopped at the Hotel Hilton in Albuquerque. His reason for doing so was that he picked up information from a United States Army non-commissioned officer who was living in Albuquerque. The information was of a general nature on "installations." He gave the Army man \$500.00 for the information. HARRY GOID could not recall the man's name, but did remember that he was married and had no children. On June 2, 1950, Mr. CARL HENNRICH telephoned from the Bureau and advised that a possible suspect for the unidentified soldier from whom GOID said he got information is DAVID GREENGLASS, Army Serial No. 32882473.

By teletype dated June 2, 1950, the St. Louis Office informed the Bureau, the New York Office, and Philadelphia that the Army service record for DAVID GREENGIASS, ASN 32882473, reflects that he was inducted into the United States Army on April 5, 1943. He entered on active duty April 12, 1943 at Fort Dix, New Jersey, and was honorably discharged February 29, 1946 with the rank of AS-T/4 from Separation Center, Fort Bliss, Texas, by reason of demobilization. It was noted that GREENGIASS had been transferred during July 1944 from Headquarters, Army Service Forces Training Command, Mississippi Ordinance Plant, Flora, Mississippi, to Special Engineering Detachment, Manhattan District, Oak Ridge, Tennessee. He was transferred February 28, 1946 from Company F, Santa Fe Detachment 9812, TSU-CE, Manhattan District, Santa Fe, New Mexico, to the Separation Center at Fort Bliss, Texas.

DAVID GREENGIASS had been on furlough from November 15, 1943 to November 29, 1943; from June 6, 1944 to June 20, 1944; from December 30, 1944 to January 19, 1945; and from September 7, 1945 to September 25, 1945. GREENGIASS had no foreign service. He had been awarded the Good Conduct Medal, the World War II Victory Medal, and the American Theatre Service Ribbon. His character and efficiency ratings ranged from unknown to excellent, and there was no record of court --martial or AWOIs.

The following description for GREENGLASS was set out in his Army service record:

There was no photograph of GREENGIASS available in the Army service record.

It was noted that GREENGIASS's civilian occupation was that of a turret lathe operator—machinist. His military occupation was that of machinist.

GREENGIASS's home address was shown as 64 Sheriff Street,
New York City. His parents were BARNETT GREENGIASS and TESSIE GREENGIASS,
both of 64 Sheriff Street, New York City. It was noted that his wife, RUTH'
GREENGIASS, also resided at 64 Sheriff Street as well as 266 Stanton Street,
New York City. He had registered at Local Draft Board No. 6 in New York City
and had Order No. 11234. His Social Security number was 057-12-3377. It
was noted that he had Veteran Administration claim No. C14289193 at
New York City.

By teletype dated June 2, 1950, the Philadelphia Office informed the Bureau, New York and Albuquerque that HARRY GOLD on June 1, 1950 had supplied additional information concerning the unknown subject of instant case. GOLD said that prior to his departure for Albuquerque in June of 1945, he met his Russian contact, JOHN, in a bar on Third Avenue, New York City. JOHN gave him, at this time, a slip of paper containing a name and an address in Albuquerque and told GOLD to contact this person while in Albuquerque. GOLD said JOHN told him, at this time, that this individual would have information for GOLD; and he gave GOLD \$500.00 to pay this individual. JOHN also told GOLD that he was to see the unknown subject after his visit to FUCHS.

GOID said that on arrival in New Mexico, he went first to see
FUCHS and returned that evening to Albuquerque from Santa Fe and attempted
to contact the unknown subject but found no one at home. GOID said that as
a result, he stayed overnight in a rooming house a few blocks off the main
street of Albuquerque. GOID said that on the next morning, which was
Sunday, he went to the address supplied to him by JOHN and there met the
unknown subject. GOID said this was the first time he knew that the unknown
subject was a soldier. According to GOID, the unknown subject was a
non-commissioned officer, either a Corporal or a Sergeant. GOID recalled
returning to this house again in the afternoon, and at this time the
unknown subject gave GOID an envelope containing several sheets of handwritten
or typewritten paper containing information pertaining to the division in
which the unknown subject was employed at los Alamos, New Mexico. GOID
said he does not know how important this information was.

At the time the unknown subject gave GOLD the information, GOLD turned over to him the \$500.00. GOLD said the unknown subject took the money and said that he needed it badly. GOLD does not recall obtaining a receipt from the unknown subject and believes that he did not obtain one. GOLD said he had the impression the unknown subject was somewhat naive in that he suggested that GOLD recruit another individual who was assigned to the same section of Los Alamos as the unknown subject was. GOLD said that the person whom the unknown subject mentioned was a Corporal who had recently been broken.

GOLD further stated that he believed he used the name FRANK KESSLER in his meeting with the unknown subject. He is not certain about the name KESSIER, but definitely remembers that he used the first name FRANK. GOLD said that although he was given the name of the unknown subject at that time, he has completely forgotten it and does not know if he would recognize the name if he heard it or saw it again. GOID said he believed the unknown subject was a native of the Bronx or Brooklyn, New York, and also stated that the unknown subject talked with a definite New York accent. GOLD also recalled that the unknown subject told him that he and his wife were returning to New York on furlough around Christmas time and gave GOLD his mother-in-law's or father-in-law's address in New York City for a possible future meeting. GOLD said, however, he never made such a meeting and saw the unknown subject on only this one occasion. According to GOID, the unknown subject's wife was present at the time of their meeting although he believed that the wife was sent into the kitchen or bathroom when the actual business was transacted. GOLD said the unknown subject's wife had only recently arrived in Albuquerque, and it is his impression that the unknown subject had not been there too many months. He said the couple had no children.

GOID also advised that the unknown subject obviously expected to be contacted because GOID used a password and the unknown subject gave the proper answer.

GOID supplied the following description of the unknown subject:
Age not over 25, very youthful appearance, hair dark and curly, eyes light
brown, snub nose, square jaw, approximately 5° 7°, approximately 170 pounds,
good and regular teeth, mouth somewhat broad, good general physical
condition, tanned, permant address apparently New York City, Jewish religion.

GOID also recalled that both the unknown subject and his wife mentioned difficulties they had finding a Jewish-type delicatessem in Albuquerque.

GOID believed that the unknown subject's occupation was that of machinist or draftsman with the possibility of some training in physics. Although GOID could not recall the street name or address where the unknown subject lived, he believed he could find it on a street map of Albuquerque. However, GOID gave the following information concerning the location of the house:

He said he walked up the main street of Albuquerque, that is the street on which the Hilton Hotel is located, and walked on the same side of the street on which the Hilton Hotel is located. He passed the point where the Santa Fe Railroad tracks run over or under this street and then continued for somewhere between five and eight blocks. At this point, he turned left, and the house where the unknown subject lived was the first, second, or third house from the corner on the left-hand side of the street in the direction GOLD was walking. GOLD was not certain as to whether the house was a single or duplex house but stated that if it was a duplex house, the unknown subject lived on the side closest to the main street. GOLD said that this house was not a Spanish or Mexican type of architecture, but was of the conventional American type. This house is set back from the street not more than fifteen or twenty feet and has a small patch of lawn in front of it. The house has a glass- or screen-enclosed porch. The foundation of the house was brick or cement, and a few feet above the foundation and below the siding proper was brown clapboard. The street was a shaded street and was paved from curb to curb with some type of macadam. COLD recalled that the unknown subject lived on the second or third floor in a one-room-and-bath, or one-room-and-kitchen apartment. The stairs to this apartment rose directly from the enclosed porch, and it was not necessary to enter the downstairs apartment in order to go to the unknown subject's apartment. GOID also felt that the entrance to the porch was from the side and was not a center entrance.

GOID also said that the owner of this house, whom he met on his first visit there on a Saturday night, was a very old man who told him at that time that the unknown subject was not at home. GOID said that this old man was obviously a native of Albuquerque. GOID said that directly across the main street from the unknown subject's residence on the opposite corner or one block up was an automobile agency, and a block up to beyond that was a blue neon sign.

GOID said that after he conducted his business with the unknown subject, he, the unknown subject, and the unknown subject's wife

who GOLD described as approximately 5' 3" and normally good-looking, walked a few blocks away from the unknown subject's house. GOLD recalled they walked on a street which rar diagonally toward the main street. When they separated, GOLD returned to the main street and at either the place where he returned or one block toward the Hilton Hotel he sat on a stone wall and watched a religious parade passing down the main street. Later that evening GOLD left Albuquerque by train and eventually returned by train to New York City, where he turned over the information to JOHN which the unknown subject had given to him.

By teletype dated June 2, 1950, the Albuquerque Division informed the Bureau, Philadelphia, Newark, and Kansas City Offices that investigation in the area referred to by GOLD reflects that the house located at 209 North High Street, Albuquerque is situated geographically in such a way as to resemble somewhat the premises described by GOLD. The landlord of this house advised that this two story house did have a tenant by the name of DAVID GREENGLASS. The apartment occupied by GREENGLASS had one room, kitchenette, and a large store room located on the second floor. It was occupied by GREENGLASS from March 29, 1945 until March 9, 1946.

The landlord described GREENGLASS as an enlisted man in the United States Army employed at Los Alamos, California, large in build, 175 lbs., dark curly hair, dark complexion, not neat in dress, youthful in appearance and from New York, presumably New York City. This individual's wife was identified as Mrs. RUTH GREENGLASS, and she was described as 5' 2" or 5' 3"; weight, approximately 140 lbs.; but not fat; dark hair; possibly black; no children. She also was from New York, presumably New York City and was employed by the Office of Price Administration in Albuquerque, New Mexico during an unrecalled period of 1946 at a tire rationing and other boards. GREENGLASS used to return to Albuquerque each weekend to spend it with his wife and worked during the week at Los Alamos, California.

The landlord recalled that GREENGLASS received packages from her relatives in New York City and was of the opinion that these might have contained kosher food items. GREENGLASS had few visitors but did have a male visitor on one occasion during the tenancy (date of the visit not recalled).

The City Directory for Albuquerque for 1945-1946 lists DAVID GREENGLASS; wife, RUTH; USA, at 209 North High Street. The Directory identified Mrs. RUTH GREENGLASS as a "steno".

According to the aforementioned Albuquerque teletype, a search of the records of the Atomic Energy Commission, Security Section, Los Alamos disclosed that DAVID GREENGLASS was employed at Peerless Laboratory, 115 East 23rd Street, New York City from October, 1941 to April, 1943. He was employed at the International Telephone and Telegraph Company, Varick (illegible) and Spring Streets, New York City from June, 1941 to October, 1941.

No photograph of GREENGLASS was available in the Atomic Energy Commission files.

It was pointed out that the house where DAVID GREENGLASS resided in Albuquerque underwent alterations subsequent to 1945 and does not coincide with the description of the house provided by the informant.

By teletype dated June 3, 1950, the Philadelphia Office informed the Bureau, New York, and Albuquerque Offices that HARRY GOLD, on that date, had stated that he recalled that he had been originally told by "JOHN" that if the unknown subject was not there upon his arrival at the home in Albuquerque that the unknown subject's wife would transact the necessary business with GOLD. GOLD believes that the unknown subject's wife's name was possibly "RUTH" or that this, at least, is the closest to the name he could recall. He also believed that the unknown subject may have had some college training, perhaps one or two years. GOLD also believed that the unknown subject lived on the second or third floor of the house in Albuquerque and now states that it may have been in the two blocks north of East Central Avenue, somewhere between North High Street and North Pine Street.

GOLD also recalled that the entrance to this house contained both a screen door and a glass panelled door and that this door was not in the center of the porch but was off to one side. GOLD recalled that the man who opened the door for him in the morning when the unknown subject was not there was in his sixties, had white hair, was over 5' 10" tall, slim build, slightly stooped, and may have been slightly hard of hearing.

GOLD recalls also that he used either the name FRANK KESSLER or FRANK MARTIN in this contact and believed that the name he used was FRANK KESSLER. The unknown subject's wife asked GOLD if he were related to a family by the name of KESSLER in New York City whom she knew. GOLD also recalled that in tentative arrangements made at this time for a future meeting at New York City, the unknown subject mentioned the fact that his father-in-law's name was PHILIP, who GOLD believes lived in the Bronx. GOLD believes that the unknown subject was a Technician, Fifth Grade and that he worked in one of the following four jobs at Los Alamos:

- 1. As a draftsman.
- 2. As a machinist.
- 3. As an electrician.
- 4. In a Physics Laboratory.

GOLD believes the information the unknown subject gave him dealt with a generalized description of the area in Los Alamos in which the unknown subject worked together with a sketch of some bit of structural equipment or a machine. A list of twenty names was read to GOLD during the interview, and

he narrowed the possibilities down to two names, one, MAX SCHWARTZ, and the other, DAVID GREENGLASS.

Although GOLD would not make a definite statement on the name; he believed that GREENGIASS was the closest to all the names and said that the name rang a bell in his memory. He said also that the address of the unknown subject was a low number on the street; for instance, 107, 109, 207, or 209.

By teletype dated June 3, 1950, the Bureau informed Philadelphia and Newark that the only record in the Identification Division files on DAVID GREENGLASS was one to the effect that he had been fingerprinted for the Army in April, 1943 at New York City, Serial #32882473. No photograph was available.

By teletype dated June 1, 1950, the Philadelphia Office advised the Bureau; and the New York and Albuquerque Offices that GOLD had been shown several photographs on that day, including a photograph of DAVID GREENGLASS. Although GOLD did not make a definite identification of GREENGLASS, he stated that there is a definite resemblance, although GREENGLASS seemed to be heavier than the person GOLD contacted in Albuquerque. GOLD stated that many of the features were the same. GOLD also recalled at this time that the unknown subject told him in Albuquerque that he and his wife were regularly receiving packages of kosher food from New York City.

By teletype dated June 4, 1950, the Albuquerque Division informed the Bureau and the Philadelphia and New York Offices that Mr. and Mrs. W. B. FREEMAN, landlords of 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico, had stated that the GREENGIASSES had had few visitors but that they did recall one man who had Sunday dinner with them. The time of this dinner was vaguely fixed by Mr. and Mrs. FREEMAN as being three or four months prior to GREENGIASS' giving up the apartment (which occurred in March, 1946). They both vaguely recalled that RUTH or DAVID or both may have made a trip home for Christmas in 1945 but pointed out that this recollection is very vague and could be in error. They were unable to recall any associates of the GREENGIASSES but stated that a tenant, during the GREENGIASSES residence, was ROSALIE TERREIL; who now resides at Route 7, Box 564; San Antonio, Texas. This woman was recalled as being either well acquainted with RUTH GREENGIASS or as having conversed with RUTH at length.

During the period of tenancy, GREENGLASS, according to Mr. and Mrs. FREEMAN, paid his rent promptly in cash, and cannot be recalled as having

been financially embarrassed or "flushed with money" at any time. Mrs. FREEMAN recalls that the father of Mrs. GREENGLASS was the owner or operator of a delicatessen in New York City whose last name was phonetically similar to "PRINTZ". It was recalled that neither of the GREENGLASSES used the one telephone which was in the apartment of FREEMAN for other than local calls and did not receive any long distance calls. When the apartment was vacated by GREENGLASS, it was clean and no refuse was left behind.

Available records at Los Alamos failed to disclose any photograph of DAVID GREENGLASS. The records did disclose the following additional information, however:

GREENGLASS' telephone number at the time he was assigned to the Manhattan Engineering Project was GR 7-4649, presumably in New York City. The references given at that time were as follows:

NORMAN BROWN, 79 Lewis Street, New York City - acquaintance of ten years.

MORRIS BAUM, 40 Marcy Place, Bronx, New York, Salesman - acquaintance of ten years.

SAMUEZ/FRUED, in care of Mr. B. GREENGLASS, 64 Sheriff Street, New York City, Electrician - acquaintance of ten years. MORRISKRUDMAN, in care of MARKOWITZ. 73 Willet Street. New

MORRIS RUDMAN, in care of MARKOWITZ, 73 Willet Street, New York City, Machinist - ten years acquaintance.

Private DAVE RICK, Company A, 150 M T Battalion, 36th M T Regiment, Fort Lewis, Washington, Ordnance - acquaintance of ten years.

The following description was found in the file at Los Alamos, California for DAVID GREENGLASS:

Height 51 9m
Weight 165 lbs.
Eyes Hazel
Hair Black
Complexion Dark
Scars and marks Scar on right wrist
Wife RUTH PRINTZ GREENGLASS

By letter dated June 5, 1950, the New York Office transmitted to Albuquerque four graduation photographs of DAVID GREENGLASS taken in 1940 and

one still photograph of DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife taken on June 5, 1950.

By teletype dated June 6, 1950, the Albuquerque Division informed the Bureau and the Philadelphia and New York Offices that the Hotel Hilton registration care for HARRY GOLD showed the address of 6923 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; firm, Terry and Seibert. This registration card was obtained for transmission to the Bureau. A notation indicated that GOLD occupied his room from 12:36 P.M. to 8 P.M., June 3, 1945.

According to instant teletype, Confidential Informant T-19, of known reliability, advised that a closed account in the name of DAVID and RUTH GREENGIASS at the First National Bank of Albuquerque reflects that the account had been opened on April 30, 1945 with an initial deposit of \$206.70. The account was closed out on April 17, 1946 with a balance of 95¢. The maximum balance had been \$571,11 on September 1, 1945.

The account fails to disclose any deposits or withdrawals of significance on the basis of the present information. The seven deposits were in amounts of about \$50. One deposit in the amount of \$130 was made on May 18, 1945. A deposit in the amount of \$150 was made on July 23, 1945. An additional deposit in the amount of \$290.90 was made on August 6, 1945. A deposit of \$211.65 was made on September 1, 1945 and a deposit in the amount of \$123.04 was made on November 1, 1945.

The aforementioned information should not be utilized in any judicial proceeding unless obtained through the issuance of a subpoena ducas tecum.

By teletype dated June 7, 1950, the Philadelphia Office informed the Bureau and the New York and Albuquerque Offices that motion pictures supplied by the New York Office had been shown to HARRY GOLD. HARRY GOLD said that the picture showing GREENGLASS in a suit walking down the street alone, closely resembled the person whom he met in Albuquerque but that he could not make any positive identification. The remainder of the reel showed GREENGLASS and his wife in front of a store but did not result in GOLD making any further identification.

Concerning RUTH GREENGLASS, GOLD said that her nose was quite similar to that of the unknown subject's wife in Albuquerque.

Motion pictures supplied by Albuquerque were shown to GOLD, and picked the house at 209 North High Street as that most closely resembling the

house that he visited in 1945 but stated that he would have to see a picture of the house prior to its apparent remodeling before he could make a positive identification.

GOLD could not identify Mr. W. B. FREEMAN as being the individual who let him in the house in Albuquerque in 1945 but also could not say that FREEMAN was not the man.

By teletype dated June 7, 1950, the St. Louis Office informed the Bureau and the New York and Philadelphia Offices that there were no photographs of GREENGLASS available at R.A.C.A.G.

It may be noted that by teletype dated June 6, 1950, the Philadelphia Office had informed the Bureau and the Albuquerque and Newark Offices that pictures of DAVID GREENGLASS supplied by the New York Office had been shown to GOLD. These particular pictures consisted of current photographs of GREENGLASS and his wife as well as pictures of GREENGLASS taken in 1940. GOLD was not able to effect any identification from current photographs but stated that the picture of GREENGLASS in academic gown, without a hat, resembles, to a great extent, the individual whom he contacted in Albuquerque in 1945. He also said there was some resemblance between RUTH GREENGLASS and the unknown subject's wife. However, GOLD stated that he could not make any definite identification from these pictures.

It was noted that the graduation pictures were taken five years before GOLD met the unknown subject, and the current pictures were taken five years afterwards.

By teletype dated June 8, 1950, the Bureau advised New York and Philadelphia that the Bureau indices reflected no record on DAVID or DAVE GREENGLASS other than the information on DAVID GREENGLASS previously reported.

By teletype dated June 8, 1950, the Albuquerque Office informed the Bureau and the Philadelphia and New York Offices that Confidential Informant T-20, of known reliability, advised that the records of the Albuquerque National Bank reflect a savings account, #35169, in the name of RUTH and DAVID GREENGLASS, 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico which had been opened on June 4, 1945 with a \$400 deposit in currency. The sum of \$55.40 was deposited on July 23, 1945 in the form of a check.

On November 9, 1945 a deposit was made in the amount of \$5 in currency. On November 16, 1945 a deposit of \$5 was made in currency, and on November 30, 1945, a deposit of \$5 was made in currency.

The following withdrawals were made from this account:

September 4, 1945 - \$55 November 7, 1945 - \$15 January 29, 1946 - \$402

The account was closed on January 29, 1946 with the last mentioned withdrawal.

The aforementioned information should not be utilized in any judicial proceeding unless obtained through the issuance of a subpoena duces tecum.

By teletype dated June 8, 1950, the Albuquerque Office advised the Philadelphia and New York Offices that a photograph of the house at 209 North High Street was forwarded to Philadelphia on June 6, 1950 and that a second photograph of the same house made in 1945 was forwarded on June 8, 1950 to Philadelphia. According to this teletype, a search of the photographic studios in Albuquerque had been substantially completed without locating the photograph of GREENGLASS or his wife.

Mr. and Mrs. W. B. FREEMAN identified the graduation photograph of DAVID GREENGLASS which had been forwarded by the New York Office as being the photograph of the DAVID GREENGLASS who had occupied an apartment in their building at 209 North High Street. The current photograph of GREENGLASS and his wife RUTH, as provided by the New York Office, was examined by FREEMAN, and he expressed the opinion that the current photograph of GREENGLASS is that of the former occupant of their apartment and points to the curly hair as being a significant feature. He stated, however, that the current photograph of GREENGLASS shows him much heavier than before.

Mrs. FREEMAN expressed the opinion that the current photograph of RUTH GREENGLASS is that of the RUTH GREENGLASS who had occupied the aforementioned apartment but stated that the current photograph shows a different hair style and shows RUTH as being thinner than when she was a tenant at 209. North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico.

The FREEMANS now recall that the father of Mrs. FREEMAN was occupying an apartment at 209 North High Street shortly before Christmas, 1944 until sometime in June, 1945. The FREEMANS were of the opinion that it was possible that Mrs. FREEMAN's father was the person contacted by HARRY GOLD on the occasion when HARRY GOLD visited the unknown subject. This father of Mrs. FREEMAN is identified as Mr. P. M. SHERER, 2400 West 23rd Street, Los Angeles, California, in care of Reverend HENRY SHERER, a Lutheran minister in that city.

Mr. SHERER is described as follows:

Age 75 (appeared about ten years younger)

Height 5' 6"

Weight 140 lbs.

Build Slender

Hair Gray

Face Slender

A photograph of Mr. SHERER, made about ten months ago, was forwarded to the Philadelphia Office by the Albuquerque Office.

By teletype dated June 9, 1950, the Bureau advised that the photo-fingerprints of DAVID GREENGLASS, #307, at the Arma Corporation, Brooklyn, New York, were identical with the fingerprints of DAVID GREENGLASS, Army Serial #32882473.

By teletype dated June 8, 1950, the Washington Field Division informed the Bureau and the New York, Philadelphia, and Los Angeles Offices that the Office of Price Administration records covering RUTH GREENGLASS' employment at Albuquerque have been reduced to microfilm, and no photograph is available. It was pointed out that RUTH GREENGLASS worked for JOSHUA HENDY IRON WORKS, 206 East Commercial Street, Pomona, California during March, April, and May, 1944.

The Marriage Record was checked by SE W. R. Sweeney on June 6, 1950.

The Birth Records were checked by SE Gerald M. Lenahan on June 5, 1950

It may be noted that the original of the signed statement made by HARRY GOLD in Philadelphia on June 3, 1950 is being retained by the Philadelphia Office.

It may also be noted that the fingerprints of DAVID GREENGLASS obtained at the Arma Engineering Company, Brooklyn, New York were transmitted to the Bureau and that the photographs of DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH GREENGLASS were promptly forwarded to the Philadelphia Office for display to HARRY GOLD.

With reference to the green Kaiser sedan bearing New York license #SUB 50-74, it should be noted that the records of the Motor Vehicle Bureau, New York City disclosed that this license was issued for a 1949 green Kaiser owned by ABRAHAM GERBAR, 62 Columbia Street, New York City,

The indices of the New York Office contained no information concerning ABRAHAM GERBAR.

It may be noted that Mrs. TAGREENGLASS, 64 Sheriff Street, New York City has telephone number Gramercy 7-4649.

It may be noted, also, that the indices of the New York Office were checked against the family name GREENGLASS and that such data as was obtained has been reported herein.

The records of the Board of Elections for Manhattan reflect that MAX J. PRINTZ and TILLIE PRINTZ of 254 Rivington Street, New York City registered for one of the two major political parties for the years 1945 through 1949 inclusive.

The following identification record, bearing FBI #443904A, was obtained from the Bureau concerning GREENGLASS:

Through the cooperation of Confidential Informant TC-1, of known reliability, at the National City Bank of New York, Personal Credit Department, 17 East 42nd Street, New York City, the following information was obtained. This information should not be disclosed except in a usual proceeding following the issuance of a subpoena.

As set forth in the details of this report, DAVID GREENGLASS has obtained two personal loans at the National City Bank of New York, number 17-1419-974, which was made August 18, 1949, and which is still pending, and loan number 3-1217-698, which was made in 1947 and has, of course, matured.

Various notations on the bank's files concerning the two above listed loans reflect that DAVID GREENGLASS, in addition to being a borrower, has also been a co-maker on several other loans.

#### Loan Number 21-0008-862

This loan was made September 21, 1948 to MAX J. PRINTZ, of 254 Rivington Street, New York City. PRINTZ filled out application number 11-18789 at the Canal Street Branch of the National City Bank of New York. He was loaned the sum of \$300.00, and received as net proceeds thereof, after deductions of interest, \$285.98. He was paid this by check number PLB 683521, which was examined and found to have been endorsed by MAX J. PRINTZ and deposited in Branch A of the Public National Bank and Trust Company on September 22, 1948.

In his application MAX PRINTZ stated that the purpose of his loan was for medical expenses. He advised that he had resided at 254 Rivington Street, New York City, telephone GR 5-8938, for thirteen years, and that his last previous address had been 55 Cannon Street, New York City, where he had resided for two years. He gave his wife's name as TILLIE, and stated he had three dependents. Concerning his employment he said that he owned his own business under the name of MAX J. PRINZ, at 256 Rivington Street, New York City, which was a dry goods business. He said that he had been in business at this address for thirteen years, and his annual income was \$3,700.00.

PRINTZ said he was born in Budapest on May 1, 1898.

# ADMINISTRATIVE (Continued)

It was determined that DAVID GREENGLASS was co-maker on the loan of MAX J. PRINTZ, and in his statement as co-maker he said that the applicant, MAX J. PRINTZ, was his father-in-law, and that he had known him ten years. GREENGLASS stated on September 16, 1948 that he had resided at 265 Rivington Street, New York City, for two and one-half years. His telephone number was given as OR 4-4673. He gave his date of birth as March 3, 1922. He listed his last previous address as 266 Stanton Street, New York City. He said that he was employed as Vice-President and a stockholder of Pitt Machine Products Corporation, 370 East Houston Street, New York City.

Concerning MAX J. PRINTZ and DAVID GREENGLASS, the National City Bank of New York made inquiry of the Grand Street Branch of the Manufacturers Trust Company, and this inquiry disclosed that this bank had no record of Pitt Machine Products Corporation, but did maintain a closed account on G and R Engineering Company, 300 East 2nd Street, New York City. This account was closed in February, 1948.

File number 21-0008-862 of MAX J. PRINTZ referenced loans number 12-0007-845 and 6-0007-358, upon which loans DAVID GREENGLASS had also been co-maker.

#### Loan Number 6-0007-358

This loan was made to MAX J. PRINTZ in the amount of \$210.00. PRINTZ received net proceeds of \$200.19.

In application number 11-11308, dated May 28, 1947, MAX J. PRINTZ gave substantially the same information as previously set forth under loan number 21-0008-862. However, he stated also that he was co-maker on a loan number VA 42048 on March 4, 1947. DAVID GREENGLASS was co-maker on loan number 6-0007-358.

In his statement as co-maker he said in May, 1947, that he had resided at 265 Rivington Street, New York City, for one year, and that his last previous address was 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico. He gave as his employment G and R Engineering Company, 300 East 2nd Street, New York City, telephone GR 3-8330. He stated that this was his own business and that he acted as foreman, and that it was a machine shop from which he derived \$2,200.00 yearly income.

He stated he had no personal bank accounts, but that his business maintained an account at the Grand Street Branch, Manufacturers Trust Company.

# Loan Number 1-0018-285

This loan was made to FRANK SEIDENBERG, of 265 Rivington Street, Apartment 5, New York City. SEIDENBERG filled out an application, number 42-7970, dated October 29, 1948. The face amount of this loan was for \$204.00 and the net proceeds to SEIDENBERG, after deduction of interest, were \$196.19. This amount was paid to SEIDENBERG by check number 713457, which, when examined, was found to have been dated October 29, 1948 and endorsed by SEIDENBERG and then by East Side Check Cashing Service.

The file reflected that FRANK SEIDENBERG had a previous loan, number 30-1226-296, which was a matured loan.

In SEIDENBERG'S application he stated that he had resided at 265 Rivington Street for six years, and that he had no residence telephone. He gave his last previous address as 63 Pitt Street, New York City, where he had resided for three years. He listed his wife's name as ANNE, and said he had three dependents.

SEIDENBERG, at the time of his application, was employed by American Textile Converters, of 30 East 10th Street, New York City, who are in the childrens' wear business. His occupation was that of packer in the shipping department, where he had been for fifteen months. He has badge number 51, and earns an annual salary of \$2,340.00.

He said he was previously employed by Mallace Exp., of East Broadway, New York City, for four years.

SEIDENBERG produced as identification his operator's license, number 3276692, dated November 5, 1947, State of issue not given.

SEIDENBERG advised the National City Bank that he also owed \$200.00 to SARA COURT of 265 Rivington Street, New York City, whose occupation was that of housewife.

DAVID GREENGLASS was co-maker on this loan and in his statement gave essentially the same information as reported in his statement as co-maker on the loan of MAX J. PRINTZ. He stated however, in addition, that he had known FRANK SEIDENBERG for three years. He also stated that he, DAVID GREENGLASS, had bank accounts at the Orchard and Delancey Branch of the Public National Bank and Trust Company, and at the 7th Street and Avenue C Branch of the same bank.

#### Loan Number 30-1226-296

This loan was made to FRANK SEIDENBERG, in the amount of \$144.00, on July 30, 1946. This loan matured May 16, 1947, with a balance of \$61.73 remaining. The National City Bank instituted suit in Third Manhattan Minicipal Court (Docket 5036-1947) and judgment was entered June 17, 1947 in favor of the plaintiff for \$56.96.

SEIDENBERG on July 23, 1946 filled out application number 42-1708, stating that he was born April 21, 1915 at New York City. The remaining information in this application was the same as previously reported under the other loan to him, with the exception of the following:

In July, 1946, he was employed by L. Mallace Company, of 196 East Broadway, New York City, who are in the export business. They have telephone number AL 4-0276. SEIDENBERG gave his position as manager, and stated he had been associated with this firm for one year, and that his superior was LEW MALLACE. SEIDENBERG was previously employed by Todd Shipyards, Hoboken, New Jersey.

A notation in the file indicated that at one time, date not stated, he was employed by Eagle American Insurance Company, New York City, as an operator at \$40.00 salary.

This file indicated also that SEIDENBERG had two other previous loans which were not examined, namely, 0-0631-528 and 25-1711-573. These were not examined for the reason that DAVID GREENGLASS was not listed as a co-maker.

SEIDENBERG was also co-maker on loan number 30-0003-074, but this loan was not examined inasmuch as DAVID GREENGLASS has no connection therewith.

#### Loan Number 12-0007-845

This loam was made to JOSEPH F ELTMAN, Jr., of 93-54 Queens Boulevard, Rego Park, Queens.

In an application, number 42-5669, dated December 10, 1947, ELTMAN stated that he was born in New York City on October 8, 1922, and that he had resided at the Rego Park address for five years. His last previous address was 88-22 50th Avenue, Elmhurst, New York, where he lived for six months.

# ADMINISTRATIVE (Continued)

The latest address of ELTMAN in the file of the National City Bank was one on December 14, 1948, when he resided at 68 De Mille Avenue, Elmont, Long Island.

ELTMAN listed his wife's name as MARGUERITE ANN, and said he had two dependents. He was employed in December, 1947, as shop foreman of G and R Engineering Company, 370 East Houston Street, Manhattan, New York City, which firm was engaged in metal manufacture. He said he had been with this firm for one year at a salary of \$3,600.00 per annum, and that his superior was DAVID GREENGLASS.

ELTMAN was previously employed in business for himself as Dale Mach. Company, of 429 East Houston Street, New York City. He was engaged in this business for two years.

He gave as banking references a special checking account for himself at the Rego Park Branch of the Sterling National Bank and Trust Company, and said also that his wife had an account at the Sterling National Bank.

He produced as identification operator's license, number 3114202, dated November 16, 1947, State of issue not given. He gave as his automobile registration BC-7795, dated November 18, 1947, State not given. This registration was for a 1934 Buick automobile.

The amount of ELTMAN'S loan was \$204.00, and the proceeds of this loan, after deduction of interest, were \$196.19. This amount was paid to him by check number 429015, which check has not yet been furnished by the National City Bank of New York.

Subsequent to December, 1947, the file on ELTMAN reflects that he was employed by Alco Machine Company of 36 East 40th Street, New York City, during 1948. The file contains a notation that on April 6, 1948 the comaker, DAVID GREENGLASS, called the National City Bank and requested a letter giving a list of the payments and dates made regarding the above loan, and the balance due in the loan account. The file stated that GREENGLASS "could not wait for the information".

A memorandum in the file dated January 5, 1949 states that the comaker was contacted regarding overdue payments. He stated that he would take care of the final payment on this account in a few days, if he knew the borrower's residence. The co-maker claimed that the borrower owed him money. The National City Bank furnished the co-maker with the borrower's residence; address.

DAVID GREENGLASS filled out in December, 1947, a statement of comaker on the above loan. He gave his residence address as 265 Rivington Street, New York City, and his last previous address as 64 Sheriff Street, New York City. He said that he was employed by G & R Engineering Company of 370 East Houston Street, New York City as superintendent. He said that he was a partner also and classed himself as self-employed. He said his annual income was \$3,900.00 per year.

GREENGLASS stated that he had known the applicant (ELTMAN) for two years, and that he was not related to him.

GREENGLASS said that his business maintained a bank account at the Grand Street Branch of the Manufacturers Trust Company, and that he maintained a savings account at the Public National Bank and Trust Company, Norfolk and Delancey Streets, New York City.

Confidential Informant TD-3 advised that Monticello 269M is the telephone number of "The Swan", a summer resort located at Bridgeville Road, Monticello, New York, which telephone was connected in 1947, and has summer service only. The bills for this telephone are sent to one IRVING COHEN at the above address.

Telephone Manhasset 7-1100 is listed to Levitt and Sons, Northern Blvd., Manhasset, Long Island, New York, and Hicksville 5-6600 is listed to Levitt and Sons, South Village Road, Hicksville, Long Island, New York.

It is known to the reporting agent that the above Manhasset address is the headquarters for Levitt and Sons, which is one of the world's largest builders of low cost houses which has a large housing development in the vicinity of Micksville, known as Levittown.

Mr. JOHN STEWART KENNEDY, Investigative Section, Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, New York City, advised SA WILLIAM O. McCUE that DAVID CREENGLASS has no insurance policy with that company.

A review of the files of the New York office under the names DAVID GREEN, Mrs. DAVID GREEN and variations thereof, failed to reflect any information identifiable with DAVID or RUTH GREENGLASS.
