



The information from this source is not, under any circumstances, to be disseminated outside of the Bureau. The information from this source should not be placed in communications in other cases. 



merals; that his general reputation was good and that to his knowledge he was not or had he ever been a member of any subversive group, and his interests were not inimical to the welfare of the United States. He said that DAVID HAWKING had sent him a Letter which was received June 18 to the effect that DAVID HAWKING was resigning from his present position at George Washington University and was going to Colorade to teach at the University of Denver.

Records maintained at the Registrar's Office, University of California, Berkeley, California, reflected that DAVID HAWKINS attended that institution as a graduate student from 1936 to 1940 and that he received his Th.D degree in the field of philosophy in May of 1940. He was employed as an assistant in the Philosophy Department while a graduate student and later as an instructor in the Philosophy Department from 1941 to 1943.

Professor William R. DEWNES, Chairmen of the Department of Philosophy, University of California, advised that he had been alosely associated with DAVID HARAINE while HARAINE had been studying for his PhoD degree and later when he had been supleyed as an instructor in the Philosophy Department at the University. Professor DEWNES also stated that DAVID HARAINE had been employed in Professor DEWNES eastion at the Lea Alames Laboratory, New Mexico, from 1943 to 1946. He said that DAVID HARAINE had originally been the dreft deforment officer at the installation and later he was made an administrative assistant and that he became the general administrative trouble-sheeter to the leading edientists in the project, and that he was well thought of by the director of the project, Dr. J. BOBERT OPPENHEIMER and other scientists, such as, ROBERT SIRHER and FRAME OPPENHEIMER.

Professor DENNES said that he thought DAVID HAWKINS was capable and that he had great confidence in him and he regarded him as honest, and said his loyalty and integrity were unquestioned. He said that DAVID HAWKING had always taken an interest in world politics and world affairs and that he was widely read and that he know that at least one individual regarded HAWKING as being a Marxist. Professor DENNES said that he did not construe this to be the fact nor would be suspect DAVID HAWKING of entertaining any disloyal tendencies. He said he certainly knew of no erganizations which might be regarded as subversive to which DAVID HAWKING belonged.

Professor DEMES said that while at Los Albuss he had had one long conversation with DAVID HARKING with respect to the philosophical theory of Marxism and that after this conversation, he did not intertain the coinion that DAVID HOWKING was a Marxist in what is the cylindring of the toru, "Marxism". He cald that it was HARKING opinion that Marxism proved that the coordina factor was a notiveting power in the development

of history and the development of the individual. He said that HAWKING was certainly not a revolutionary nor did he believe that enomenic change should be brought about by revolution, nor did he belong or advocate belonging to any revolutionary group. He said that HAWKING did not feel that the present Bussian Covernment would be the solution to any enomals problems and he recalled that HAWKING had once souffed at the idea of intelligent people waiting to learn the Communist Party line before making up their own minds on political problems. Professor DENNICO also stated he recalled that DAWIN HAWKING had once drawn a simile between the present deverment in Bussia: and the fairy tale of the good prime and the bad prime by saying that STALIN and his distator ship replacing time distatorship of the Guar was partainly not a good primes replacing a bad once.

Professor DENRES said that probably the slosest friend DAVID HARRING had at the University of California was FRANK OFFEMBLIGHT, the brother of Dr. J. ROBERT UPPERHELIMEN.

Professor PAHL MARKERS, professor of philosophy at the intersity of California at Berkeley, advised that he had been the associate of DAVID HARKING over a long period of years, since 1933, and they ind both been employed as instructors at the University of California and had shared an office there. He said he knew him very well; that he liked him; that HAWKING had a nice personality, and Professor MARKERS said that he mished HAWKING well. He said, however, that he was willing to furnish any information desired and answer to specific questions:

He was asked whether he thought HAWKIRS possossed desirable traits of character, such as, honosty, integrity, souriety, and morality, to which Dr. MATHETITE said, yes, he did. 

MThe American radar crews, Alvarez said, have been watching the Russian formations through the 200-mile eye of a microwave early-warning radar installation. The Russians, Alvarez said, were within range of the American radar unit long enough for the speed to be double-checked.

Russians were flying on their side of their zone and stayed there. The operators refused to believe their figures when the Russian fighters were seen on the scope for the first time, but later sightings duplicated the early speed figures.

This newspaper article indicates that the information reported therein had been secured from Dr. LUIS ALVAREZ described in the article as a foremost electronics scientist and physicist at the University of Californiae Investigation has disclosed that the full name of Dr. ALVAREZ is LUIS WALTER ALVAREZ and that he was born June 13, 1911 in San Francisco California under the fine of LUIS SCHMELL ALVAREZ.

Confidential Informant T-L made available

An investigation of ALVAREZ conducted by the FBI at the request of another governmental agency has disclosed that ALVAREZ has an excellent reputation as a scientist and is believed by his neighbors, associates and colleagues to be very conservative in his views concerning governmental ideology and to be epposed to both Fascism and Communism. ALVAREZ and all members of whis immediate family have the reputation of possessing excellent moral character.

was located and persons interviewed recommended ALVAREZ highly claiming he possessed discretion and ability to handle confidential work. It was ascertained in the course of this investigation that ALVAREZ was known as one of the important key scientists in the government work in the development of the atomic bomb. His eminence in this field, according to one of his collagues, caused him to be one of two scientists selected to view the utilization of the atomic bombs in the war with Japan.

Investigation at the Radiation Laboratory of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, Massachusetts disclosed that ALVAREZ was one of the original employees entering on duty November 15, 1940 the day after the laboratory was officially opened. He continued as a research staff member until September 27, 1943. ALVAREZ, according to the employment records was in charge of the research pertaining to the Ground Control Approach for landing airplanes.

Dr. F.W. LOOMIS, former director of the MIT Laboratory gave.

ALVAREZ an excellent recommendation when ALVAREZ resigned from the MIT Radiation.

Laboratory September 27, 1943. According to the records at this Laboratory.

ALVAREZ resigned in order to accept research work at the Metallurgical Laboratory at the University of Chicago.

informed that he has been acquainted Confidential Informant with ALVAREZ since 1936 when ALVAREZ first came to the University of Californian and worked as a research fellow at the Radiation Laboratory of the University of California. According to this informant ALVAREZ is the son of Dr. WALTER Com ALVAREZ, a member of the Staff of Mayo Clinic, Rochester, Minnesota. This in formant stated that throughout the years of his acquaintance with ALVAREZ her has never observed any reason to question the loyalty of Dr. ALVAREZ and he feels personally that the tremendous scientific contribution made by ALVAREZ during the war years speaks immeasurably of ALVAREZ personal loyalty to the United States. According to informant, ALVAREZ willingly gave up his home in Berkeley in order to accept employment at various places in the United States where his scientific ability could best be utilized in the national interest. Informant felt that ALVAREZ was sufficiently alert to recognize the necessity. for scientific advancement if this country hoped to win in World War II and therefore ALVAREZ willingly devoted his time and efforts to aid his country. Informant mentioned that ALVAREZ had received the COLLIER trophy, the highest award bestowed upon individuals for achievements in the field of aviation. This award was given to ALVAREZ as a result of his development of the GCA. (Ground Control Approach) system for landing airplanes "blind" In addition to receiving the Collier trophy informant stated that it was his understanding that ALVAREZ has received or is to receive the national Medal of Merit from the President of the United States for his development of the GCA system.

Informant commented that the GCA system utilized electronics and radar to enable sirplanes to land by instruments or under weather conditions which eliminate the visibility usually necessary for landings.

and the writer. ALVAREZ was interviewed by Special Agent William P. Poole and the writer. ALVAREZ stated that his present residence is 360 Vassar Street, Berkeley, California. ALVAREZ advised that he had been informed of the publicity given his name and the story published in the Washington TIMES-HERALD on March 20, 1948. He mentioned that this story had undoubtedly originated with

the Chicago TRIBUNE and that a similar story had appeared in that newspaper on either March 19 or 20, 1948. ALVAREZ stated that as a result of his employment in the MIT Radiation Laboratory where he aided in the development of the GCA system his name is well known to most persons presently employed to operate GCA installations in the United States and elsewhere. According to ALVAREZ the foreign installations of the GCA system are installations of the United States Air Force and some of the crews are civilian while others are military personnels.

ALVAREZ stated that there have been several magazine articlesoutlining his work in the development of the GCA system and stating that he is a faculty member of the: University of California. Accordingly when persons employed to operate GCA installations pass through the Berkeley area they: frequently contact ALVAREZ even though he personally has never been acquainted... with them before. ALVAGEZ stated these contacts during 1947 and early 1948. occurred approximately once a week although they have now declined in number. When operators of GCA installations contact ALVAREZ it is customary, according to his statement in the interview, for them to discuss with him any outstanding utilization of the GCA systems. In the latter part of 1947 some two or threedifferent persons who had been employed as member of GCA crews in occupied 👾 Korea landed in San Francisco and contacted ALVAREZ. He stated that due to the number of similar individuals who had contacted him he could not recall the identity of these particular crew members. However, they brought to him a "rumor" to the effect that GCA crews in Korea near the dividing line between the American and Soviet occupation somes had observed what were apparently Soviet airplanes flying on the Soviet side of the partition of the occupation zones. Tha crews noted these planes flew across the radar screens at greater speeds than any of the American air force planes had ever flown. Accordingly they arranged to clock some of the Russian flights and verified their belief that the speed of the Russian planes exceeded the operational speeds of any of the American war planes on duty in Korea. ALVAREZ stated this story was merely a rumor unofficially received by him in direct conversation with members of GCA crews.

At no time has ALVAREZ received any official confirmation of this "rumor". ALVAREZ stated that he has as a physicist been quite interested in the problems of design involved in the development of a supersonic airplane. Accordingly the information from Korea indicating the Russian planes may have broken the supersonic wall interested him. One of the returning GCA crew members claimed the information concerning the speed of the Russian planes had been forwarded to the headquarters of General MacARTHUR in Tokyo where at first the information was discounted as being untrue and afterwards a representative of the air forces visited one of the GCA installations and personally supervised the clocking of some Russian planes. This portion of the information, according

to ALVAREZ is likewise just, a "rumor" so far as he is concerned. ALVAREZ advised when Colonel ROBERT MCCORMACK of the Chicago TRIBUNE went to Japan to visit with General DOUGLAS MacARTHUR and to observe American operations cCORMACK of the Chicago TRIBUNE went to Japan 1900 there and in Korea, McCORMACK passed through Berkeley and was entertained bymembers of the staff of the University of California Likewise when McCORMACK returned he again visited some of the faculty members and administrative and officers of the University to discuss with them some of the things he had observed in Japan and Korea. ALVAREZ stated that in an informal discussion with: McCORMACK where Professor ERNEST O. LAWRENCE, Director of the Radiation Laboratory University of California and Professor ROBERT THORNTON and EDWARD. MILLER were present, McCORMACK told the group of having been shown the secret war plans drawn up by MacARTHUR's staffs. McCORMACK also informed that he had been permitted to visit classified areas and discuss highly restricted matters with members of MacARTHUR's staff and MacARTHUR personally. Likewise ALVAREZ claimed that Professor LAWRENCE had received clearance from the Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission to permit Colonel McCORMACK to visit the Radiation. Laboratory and to view the activities of one area of the Radiation Laboratory known as an "exclusion area" where research of a highly secret nature is presently in progress. In view of this information indicating that McCORMACK was considered qualified by representatives of the government to receive and arepsilondiscuss classified projects such as those mentioned above, ALVAREZ stated it occurred to him that McCORMACK might have some confirmation of the rumor; concerning the speed of the Russian sirplanes. Accordingly ALVAREZ mentioned to McCORMACK the information he had received along these lines. ALVAREZ recalled McCORMACK had no information in this connection and did not display any great personal interest in ALVAREZ! remarks concerning the Soviet planes.

According to the best recollection of Dr. ALVAREZ his visit at which he mentioned this information to Colonel McCORMACK occurred in the latter part of 1947. Thereafter in February or March of 1948 ALVAREZ was contacted by MAXIKARANT who was then the editor of "FLYING" magazine, at 185 North Wabash, Chicago, Illinois. ALVAREZ stated that KARANT had since resigned this position and is presently at 1600 Wilmette Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. ALVAREZ stated he has known KARANT for a number of years and when KARANT visited in the San Francisco Bay Area he has either lunch or dinner with ALVAREZ, if not a more extended visit. On this occasion in February or March, 1948, KARANT arranged to have dinner with ALVAREZ in a San Francisco restaurant. When ALVAREZ met KARANT for this dinner, KARANT was accompanied by WAYNE VHOMAS, an aviation writer for the Chicago TRIBUNE. ALVAREZ recalled that the three of them dined and discussed various matters of mutual interest pertaining generally to aviation for approximately the last three years or so. In the course of this conversation, ALVAREZ stated that either he, ALVAREZ,

or KARANT brought up the "current rumor" concerning the clocking of the Soviet airplanes in Korea. ALVAREZ advised he may well have broached the subject but he recalled KARANT claimed to have heard a similar rumor. Neither KARANT nor THOMAS was able to authenticate the story as received by ALVAREZ and so far as ALVAREZ can recall there was no mention of any exact or approximate speed of the Soviet airplanes, the only reference to their speed being that they exceeded the operational speed of many American war planes in use in the Korean occupation zone.

MAYNE THOMAS gave any indication of taking notes, nor did either of them questions him concerning his source of the information or the authenticity of it.

Thereafter the newspaper article quoted hereinbefore as well as a Chicage TRIBUNE article with similar content appeared. ALVAREZ stated he was embarrassed by the appearance of these articles in question and it occurred to him that the information might be classified but because he was quoted as an authoritative source with regard to instant matter when actually he knew very little concerning it. ALVAREZ stated that the items attributed to him by the use of quotations marks were definitely not his quotations although he may have made similar remarks. ALVAREZ denied ever having stated that the Russian planes had travelled 800 miles per hour and informed that he has serious doubts as to whether any air force presently has planes capable of this speed.

have been an unauthentic and improper use of his name ALVAREZ wrote to MAX KARANT immediately after learning of the article in the Chicago TRIBUNE on either Warch 19 or 20th, 1948. KARANT replied to ALVAREZ by letter dated April 15, 1948, stating it was his belief that WAYNE THOMAS, the other member of the dinner party mentioned above, had written the article for the TRIBUNE and that the Chicago TRIBUNE Press Service had relayed this story to his subscribers.

ALVAREZ stated he certainly would not reveal this information with any intent or expectation that such a revelation would benefit the enemies of the United States or harm the United States itself. ALVAREZ advised that he was greatly embarrassed by the unauthorized use of his name and the quotation of statements attributed to him when he personally can not recall having made-such statements. ALVAREZ commented that he hoped that his loyalty to the United States had been established by his efforts as a scientist during the war and he further hoped that this indiscretion if it is felt by the "powers that be" to be an indiscretion will not jeopardize his continued service as a research scientiste

Mrs. ROBERT R. PORTER, 350 Vassar Avenus, Berkeley, California, stated that the ALVAREZ family have been living next door to her for the past six months. She indicated that she has not visited with her new neighbors so consequently knows very little concerning them. She stated that from what she has observed she would describe the ALVAREZ family as being good neighbors, quiet, and the type of people who mind their own business. In the past six months applicant's family has earned a good reputation in that neighborhood. She said that she does not know Applicant personally and therefore would be unable to give an opinion concerning his loyalty to this country.

Mr. and Mrs. HENRY A. STONE, 374 Vassar Avenue, Berkeley, advised that employee and his family have been their neighbors for the past saw or seven months. They consider the ALVAREZ family to be excellent neighbors who enjoy a

good reputation in that community. They said that they consider Applicant to be of good character, honest, trustworthy. In regard to his loyalty they said they believed him to be a loyal citizen but since they have been neighbors for such a short while they did not feel qualified to give an opinion concerning the matter.

She said that they were good neighbors, honest, trustworthy, and the Applicant was well qualified to handle work of a confidential nature. She indicated that she knew of no derogatory information concerning him.

She said that she knows of no organizations to which the Applicant belongs

The catalogue of the University of California reflects that in 1937 and 1938 Applicant was residing at 1685 Euclid Avanue, Berkeley. Mrs. JOHN S. JOHE, who has an apartment at this address, stated that there are no residents of this apartment house at the present time who lived here at the time the Applicant did. She indicated that the owner of the premises at that time was FRANK PETERSON who now resides at 1824 San Lorenzo Street, Berkeley.

Mrs. FRANK PETERSON advised that she had been well acquainted with Applicant and his family at the time the latter resided in their apartment house on Euclid Avenue. She stated that they were excellent tenants honest, trustworthy, and enjoyed a good reputation in the neighborhood. To her mind there never was any question regarding the loyalty of Applicant to this country. She believed that Applicant was opposed to Fascism and Communism. She said that she knew of no organizations to which Applicant belonged.

The catalogue of the University of California reflects that in 1936 Applicant resided at 2451 LeConte Avenue, Berkeley, Wrs. T. F. TAVERNETTI, manager of the apartment house at this address, stated that it is the property of the University of California. She indicated that her records reflected that Applicant resided at this address for some months in 1936, but she did not know the exact length of time. She said that at that time she did not reside at this address and all the other tenants are new and would not know the Applicant.

REFERENCES and EMPLOYMENT

Professor DONALD COCKSEY, of the Radiation Laboratory, University of California, advised that he has been acquainted with Applicant, since the latter came to the University in 1936 as a Research Fellow in the Physics Department of the Radiation Laboratory. He indicated that he knows of no individual he could more highly recommend than the Applicant, particularly so because the latter is a very loyal American who is not interested in political philosophies of any kind. He is opposed to Communism and Pascism and is a conservative in his political beliefs. He described Applicant as being honest, dependable, and thoroughly trustworthy. He stated that Applicant has made a fine impression on the Radiation Laboratory since coming there and that the Laboratory and those connected with it have benefited by having the Applicant associated with the Laboratory. He indicated that Applicant can be trusted with any type of work no matter how confidential it may be and the security of the country would not be endangered thereby. He added that he knows of no organizations to which Applicant belongs.

Professor ROBERT BRODS, of the Physics Department, University of California, advised that Applicant has been attached to the Physics Department since 1936 at which time he came here from the University sity of Chicago. He indicated that Applicant came out here on a Research Fellowship in the Radiation Laboratory. He said that Applicant now holds the position of a Professor of Physics at the University. To his mindente Applicant is a very reliable individual to have working around atomic projects since there is no question concerning his loyalty to this country He described Applicant as being very conservative in his political beliefs in fact so conservative that he would not even listen to one of Henry WALLACK's speeches. He said that Applicant is very much opposed to Fascism and Communism and is interested in seeing that the American way of life continues in this country. He said that the moral character of member of the National Academy of Science, having recently been elected to this group. He is also a member of various scientific societies such as Sigma II. He also indicated that Applicant is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He said that Applicant was awarded a citation by President Truman for his work in connection with Ground Control Approach for landing planes in dense fog. Professor ERODE advised that in the latter part of 1945, ... at the conclusion of the war, both he and ALVAREZ were at Los Alamos, New Mexico ALVAREZ desired to get back to Berkeley to continue with his work there so ERODE allowed him to use his house at 7 W. Parnassus Ct., in Berkeley, for a few months

Professor EDWIN MCMILIAN of the Physics Department and Radiation Laboratory, University of California, advised that he has known Applicant since 1936. He indicated that they both worked on RADAR together at Mass. Institute of Technology in 1941 and 1942. In his opinion Applicant is a person of unquestioned loyalty to the United States. He is very much interested in our democratic way of life. He is conservative in his politics and is opposed to Fascism and Communism. He believes applicant to be well qualified to handle work of a confidential nature. He described Applicant as being honest, trustworthy, and thoroughly dependable. He said that he would unhesitatingly recommend him for his good moral character. He knew of no organizations to which Applicant belongs other than scientific organizations such as Sigma XI.

Professor IEONARD IOEB of the Physics Department, U. C., advised that he has been acquainted with the Applicant since the latter came to Berkeley, but not intimately. He indicated that there is nothing of a subversive nature concerning the Applicant who is not interested in Communism or Facism. He said there is absolutely no question regarding the reliability of the Applicant. He also advised that the Applicant is well qualified to handle confidential work since he is a very discreet individual and not given to talking about his work. He indicated that the Applicant is of good moral character.

By teletype dated May 16, 1947, the State Bureau of Vital Statistics at Sacramento, California, verified Applicant's birthdate as June 13, 1911, at San Francisco, California.

Mr. ALVAREZ accompanied the group to Tinian Island for the expedition against Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Applicant is very much of a family man, has a nice wife and two or three fine children. He and family enjoyed a verygood reputation while on the project, and are certainly of the finest character. In his opinion Mr. ALVAREZ is a good American citizen, believes in our institutions, and certainly not interested in any type of foreign Isms or governments. Mr. SMITH also stated that applicant is Security

conscious, and not too long age the applicant was contacted by the officials regarding some photographs he had that were classified. He is sure Mr. ALVAREZ was cooperative with these officals in this matter, however, applicant might have thought the photographs he had should not have been classified, and he would have so stated inasmuch as he is the type of person who says so, if he thinks something is unimportant or silly. SMITH is sure that applicant would not intentionally, maliciously, or accidently jeopardize the security of this project, and certainly not to any foreign governments. In his opinion applicant has an excellent character fine reputation, good morals, and is loyal to our country.

Mm. MARY E. HARDY, housewife, 115% Iron, advised that she rented and resided in the apartment at 824 North 5th Street in Albuquerque in 1944 and 1945. She stated that from some time in the fall of 1944 to sometime in the following winter, she rented a room of that apartment to Mrs. SARA SPINDEL. Mrs. HARDY was unable to furnish any exact dates but stated that SPINDEL resided in this room for a period of three or four months to the best of her recollection. Mrs. HARDY stated that during that time, the only other individual who resided in the house was Mrs. HARDY's daughter-in-law, a Mrs. HAZEL HARDY, and her small baby. She explained that SARA SPINDEL's husband was a member of the Army at that time and she believes he was stationed at Los Alamos, New Mexico. She stated that he occasionally came to Albuquerque and spent a few hours with his wife but that she does not recall that he was ever able to stay all night or spend a weekend there.

She stated that for this reason she had very little contact with WILLIAM SPINDEL.

Mrs. HARDY described SARA SPINDEL as a brilliant but peculiar person and explained that she considered her peculiar because of the fact that SPINDEL had no friends or associates in Albuquerque. She stated that during such periods, SARA PINDEL was not employed and that she took her meals out and spent nearly all of her time in her room. She stated that SPINDEL read a good deal during that period but she does not recall what sort of literature she possessed.

Mrs. HARDY stated that the only telephone in the apartment was located in the downstairs dining room and that SARA SPINDEL called or received a call from her husband WILLIAM SPINDEL nearly every evening. She stated that there never seemed to be anything suspicious about such calls and that the SPINDELS did not in any way attempt to be secretive in their conversation. She stated that a large percentage of the time either she or her daughter-in-law was present during such calls. Mrs. HARDY stated that inasmuch as the phone was listed in her name, she is quite positive that no one made any long distance call charging it to that telephone to any place other than Los Alamos during the time that SARA SPINDEL resided there. She stated that there may have been a few times when both she and her daughter-in-law were absent from the house but that to her knowledge, neither SARA nor WILLIAM SPINDEL has received any long distance telephone call at that phone from any location other than Los Alamos.

Mrs. HARDY stated that SARA SPINDEL did not take or plan any extended visits during the time that she resided at her house and that she never indicated that her husband took or planned any trip outside of New Mexico during that period.

As set forth above, Mrs. HARDY stated that SARA SPINDEL did not have even one friend or close associate in Albuquerque and she also stated that SPINDEL did not associate with any of the other individuals residing in the neighborhood and that she is quite sure that none of the neighbors would even recall SPINDEL.

Mrs. HARDY stated that she considered SARA SPINDEL to be of good character and that she never had any reason to question her loyalty in any way.

A check of old telephone directories revealed that Albuquerque telephone number 9717 was assigned to Mrs. MARY E. HARDY at 824 North 5th Street, in 1944.

Mrs. HAZEL HARDY, housewife, 332 Delores Drive, Albuquerque, New Mexico, advised that she is the daughter-in-law of MARY E. HARDY and resided at 824 North 5th Street during the time that SARA SPINDEL maintained a room there. HAZEL HARDY also stated that SARA SPINDEL obtained a room at that address sometime in the fall of 1944 and resided there continuously until an unrecalled date in the following winter when she moved to an apartment on West Coal Avenue in Albuquerque.

She likewise was unable to furnish any exact or even approximate dates of such residence but stated that she is quite sure that SPINDEL resided in the apartment on North 5th for a period of three or four months.

HAZEL HARDY furnished substantially the same information as her mother-in-law and stated that she never knew SARA or WILLIAM SPINDEL to ever make or receive any long distance telephone calls from or to any location other than Los Alamos.

She also stated that SARA SPINDEL did not make any extended trips during that period and never gave any indication that her husband, WILLIAM SPINDEL, made or planned any such trip.

She further stated that SARA SPINDEL was very cautious about making any statement pertaining to the place at which her husband was stationed or the work he was doing at that time.

She also stated that SARA SPINDEL did not have even one friend or associate other than her and her mother-in-law in Albuquerque during that time and that WILLIAM SPINDEL never brought any individual to the house on any of his infrequent visits with his wife.

The 1945 and 1946 city directories for the city of Albuquerque reflect that WILLIAM and SARA L. SPINDEL resided at 613 West Coal and that SARA was employed as a clerk at the Veterans Administration facility.

Incomplete personnel records of the U. S. Veterans Hospital at Albuquerque, New Mexico, reflect that SARA L. SPINDEL was employed as a file clerk in that facility from April 24, 1945 to August 11, 1945, and that she resigned such position. These records reflect that she was born July 7, 1922, in Poland; that her legal residence was Kings County,



New York City, New York; and that her local residence was 613 West Coal, Albuquerque, New Mexico. The records reflect that upon her resignation, she left a forwarding address "C/O SIMON, 459 East 22nd Street, Brooklyn, New York."

The actual personnel file relative to SARA TINDEL has been forwarded to the Veterans Administration Records Center, 5000 Wissahickon, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This file should contain her application form and actual record of any leave taken during such period.

Miss ROSE SAUR, Secretary to the Manager, Veterans Hospital, Albuquerque, New Mexico, advised that she was employed as Personnel Officer of the hospital in 1945 and that she was casually acquainted with the applicant during the few months that she worked there. She stated that applicant's services were satisfactory and that to the best of her knowledge, SPINDEL was considered to be a loyal citizen. She stated that she does not recall that SPINDEL had any close friend or associate during that period. She stated that she does not believe that any of the people who were employed at the hospital at that time knew any more about SPINDEL than she did.


Mrs. MARY KIRTLY, cook and cafe operator, 613 West Coal, advised that in 1945 she had her residence at that address divided into apartments and that she lived in one of the apartments and rented the other to SARA SPINDEL for a period of several months. She stated that SPINDEL resided in such apartment from sometime in the early Spring of 1945 to late Summer or early Fall of the same year. She has no record and is unable to recall the exact dates.

KIRTLY stated that during part of such period SARA SPINDEL was employed at an unrecalled place in Albuquerque and that to her knowledge only SPINDEL's husband, WILLIAM SPINDEL, resided with her during any of that time. She explained that WILLIAM SPINDEL was stationed at Los Alamos during such period and that he usually spent his weekends with his wife but otherwise was never at the apartment.

KIRTLY stated that she had very casual and infrequent contacts with either of the SPINDELS. She stated that Mrs. SPINDEL did not appear to have any close friends or associates in Albuquerque or vicinity other than her husband and that she does not recall any individual actually visiting in the SPINDEL apartment. She stated that SARA SPINDEL kept very much to herself and that she does not believe that any of the individuals who resided in neighboring houses during that period would even recall SPINDEL.

Mrs. KIRTLY stated that SARA SPINDEL did not have a telephone in the apartment during any of the period that she resided there; that she, Mrs. KIRTLY did not have a telephone and that she has no knowledge or recollection of either of the SPINDEL's having used any telephone in any way. She also said that to her knowledge neither of the SPINDELs took or planned any extended trip during the period that they rented the apartment.

Records of the Albuquerque City Police Department and the Credit Bureau of Albuquerque were checked with negative results in that they do not reflect any information relative to WILLIAM or SARA SPINDEL.

All of the above investigation was conducted under pretext of SARA SPINDEL's having applied for a position in which the Government is interested.



On Page 76 of referenced report it is noticed that in a list of names which had appeared in a small telephone notebook, which was found in GREENGLASS' apartment, was the name WILLIAM SPINDEL, 613 West Coal, Albuquerque, New Mexico.

On Page 50 and 51 of referenced report it is reported that a letter from T-5, D. GREENGLASS, Santa Fe, New Mexico, to Mrs. R. GREENGLASS, New York City, dated October 4, 1944, stated as follows:

"Well, today I worked kinds hard and am pretty tired, but instead of taking this leisurely I am going to dinner with HY and BILL at EMANUEL and ETHEL's home (you know the nice people I met). I hope that they have something good to eat since I am quite hungary."

It is suggested that the "BILL" mentioned in this letter may be identical with WILLIAM SPINDEL and it appears that SPINDEL and GREENGLASS may have been acquainted as early as October 4, 1944.

On Page 52 of this report, it is stated that a letter from T-5, D. GREENGLASS to Mrs. R. GREENGLASS, dated January 28, 1945, stated as follows:

"I was over to BILL's house last night for supper and this morning for breakfast -- besides this HY and I have not had much social activity - - BILL's wife is a very nice woman, pretty, and husky voice and about as sloppy-dressed as BILL so that they make a good couple. Make no mistake about it, she has brains too. You'll meet her."

SARAH LEW SPINDEL applied for a job at the University of California, Los Alamos, New Mexico, on December 12, 1944, giving as her address 824 North Fifth Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico.

It appears from the last letter quoted above that DAVID GREENGLASS may have been at the SPINDEL home for supper and breakfast in Albuquerque, New Mexico, January 27, 28, 1945. GREENGLASS mentions BILL in this letter and states that his wife will meet BILL's wife. This letter might be interpreted to mean that Mrs. GREENGLASS had already met BILL. WILLIAM SPINDEL was on leave from the Los Alamos Project from October 15, 1944, to November 4, 1944. As his home was in Brooklyn, New York, it is probable that he made a trip to Brooklyn at that time, as he had known DAVID GREENGLASS prior to that time at Los Alamos. He may have met RUTH GREENGLASS in Brooklyn during this furlough.

In support of this suggestio it is pointed out that on Page 55 of referenced New York report, it is stated that a letter from T-5 D. GREENGLASS to Mrs. R. GREENGLASS, dated November 10, 1944, stated as follows:

"Tonight I'm just relaxing and taking things easy. We had fish for supper so we (that's RUBY, HY BILL, BEN and I) broke with the larder again - - Afterwards we had a wonderful discussion. Since we all agreed on most things, the discussion become very involved, abstract, and theoretical Boy, we really enjoyed ourselves."

In further support of the theory that Mrs. GREENGLASS may have contacted WILLIAM SPINDEL, in addition to her husband when she came to Albuquerque in the latter part of November 1944. it is pointed out that on December 11, 1944, WILLIAM SPINDEL wrote a letter to Brooklyn College in an attempt to obtain his B.A. Degree It appears that SPINDEL's purpose in trying to get his degree at that time was to be able to obtain a white badge at Los Alamos which would entitle him to attend colloquium meetings at Los Alamos at which meetings highly classified subjects concerning the over-all work at Los Alamos Project were discussed. It may be significant that WILLIAM SPINDEL attempted to obtain additional access to classified information at this particular time.




