

The Walter Winchell Broadcast for Sunday night, March 4, 1951, was monitored by Supervisor R. W. Corman and the following items are of possible interest to the Bureau.

Winchell -

"Omaha, Nebraska - The desperate convicts who escaped today are still at large. They snatched a third victim, a farmer, tonight. They have crossed into Kansas. This means death under the Lindbergh Law."

Comment -

The Omaha Office advised by teletype on March 4, 1951, that Dewey Battershaw and Victor Sweet escaped from the Douglas (Nebraska) County Jail at 2:00 P.M. on March 4, 1951, where they were being held for robbery of a gas station. They escaped with the aid of an unknown subject who forced Clifford Hansen to accompany them at gunpoint. Upon leaving the jail they forced John N. Baldwin, an Omaha Attorney, to accompany them and he is believed to have been taken as a hostage. They abandoned a 1937 Ford automobile containing the keys to the jail at the farm of Otto Timm, near Gretna, Nebraska, about 4:30 P.M. on March 4, 1951. The subjects took Timm's 1950 Chevrolet and also took Timm as an additional hostage. No federal prisoners were involved in the escape, and according to the Night Supervisor in the Investigative Division who was in telephonic contact with the Omaha Office at 10:30 P.M. on March 4, 1951, there was no indication the subjects had crossed the state line into Kansas. Agents are maintaining continuous contact with local authorities in order to be immediately apprised of any developments within our jurisdiction.

Winchell -

"Washington. Commander Robert Morris, the New York Attorney is now the general counsel for Senator McCarran's un-American Activities Committee. A very big story when this is confirmed."

Winchell -

"New York City. The big Atom Bomb trial starts Tuesday next. The Defendants may take the stand in their own defense. For the first time the Atom Bomb itself will be described publicly."

Comments -

This relates to the Rosenberg case, the trial of which is scheduled to commence March 6, 1951. There is no indication that the defendants will take the stand, but David Greenglass is one of the defendants and has already pleaded guilty. He will be one of the prosecution witnesses. You will recall that AUSA Miles Lane made a special trip to Washington to confer with Atomic Energy officials in order to ascertain what information concerning the bomb could be disclosed at the trial of this case and undoubtedly there will be testimony by Atomic Energy officials about the manufacture of the bomb.

Winchell -

"The FBI is very interested in a Canadian journalist. He allegedly has been engaged in Communist activities in the Middle West and New York City."

Comment -

Winchell may possibly be referring to Rudolf Shohan, also known as Roy Davis. He has been the subject of investigation by the Bureau [redacted] for the past several years. He is presently in Canada where he is known as Roy Davis and is a prominent figure in the Labor Progressive Party of Canada. Davis was actively engaged in Communist organizational activities in the 1930's in New York, Ohio, and Missouri. (b)(1) [S]

Winchell -

"New York Mirror. The New York Police Department has been alerted to limit and screen all visitors to transatlantic liners such as the Queen Elizabeth and Mary. A bomb, not high explosive, was found on the Coronian and the Mauritania before their recent departure from England."

Comment -

While this is not a matter within our jurisdiction, we have instructed our New York Office to check with the New York Police Department to ascertain if there is any information of an intelligence nature of interest to the Bureau.

**WINCHELL SAID:**

The U. S. Department of Immigration will round up all alien Commies. The first target will be the International Workers Order, the biggest Commie front in the entire nation.

**COMMENT:**

These observations undoubtedly refer to the Attorney General's Denaturalization and Deportation Program under which action against some of the International Workers Order (IWO) officials will possibly proceed. It is to be noted that the IWO was cited under Executive Order 10450. The Department is presently preparing a case for presentation before the Subversive Activities Control Board to determine whether this organization is required to register under the provisions of the Internal Security Act of 1950.

**WINCHELL SAID:**

Robert Murphy of the State Department will be the new Under Secretary of State.

**COMMENT:**

This information was referred to in the press last week. Mr. Murphy is a career diplomat and was the President's Political Advisor during the European Campaign in the last war. Mr. Murphy has held high diplomatic posts and is reportedly replacing Mr. H. Freeman Matthews, Under Secretary for Political Affairs.

# Spies Planned Flight To Haven in Mexico

NEW YORK, March 13 (AP).—The Russian Embassy in Mexico City was linked in testimony today to a spy ring accused of stealing some top United States atom bomb secrets.

Former Army Sergt. David Greenglass, 29, a confessed member of the ring, described the embassy as the key point in an escape route for spies when the FBI got too close on their trail.

Greenglass said he was instructed specifically by his brother-in-law, Julius Rosenberg, an accused spy, in the procedure for

contacting the Russian Ambassador in Mexico last June.

Rosenberg, 33, an electrical engineer, is on trial in Federal Court with his wife, Ethel, 35 (Greenglass' sister), and radar expert Morton Sobell, 33, on a charge of conspiring to spy for Russia.

The witness said Rosenberg became alarmed after the arrests of Dr. Klaus Fuchs in England and Philadelphia chemist Harry Gold in the United States on espionage charges.

Greenglass, who previously was employed on the atom bomb project at Los Alamos, New Mex., said Rosenberg told him to leave the country "as soon as possible."

Greenglass said Rosenberg gave him these detailed instructions:

Go to Mexico City. Write to the Russian Ambassador. Say something favorable in the letter about the Soviet position in the United Nations and sign it "I. Jackson."

Three days later go to the statue of Columbus in Mexico City with a travel guide. You will be approached by a "contact" man. Comment to him that "it is a magnificent statue" and add that you are from Oklahoma.

The contact will identify himself by saying there are more beautiful statues in Paris. Then he will give you money and a passport.

From Mexico City you will go to Vera Cruz, then to Sweden. In Stockholm you will follow the same procedure at the statue of Minness and make contact with a man who will arrange transportation to Czechoslovakia.

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In Czechoslovakia, write to the Soviet Ambassador, this time signing your full name.

Rosenberg told him that he, too, intended to flee the country, Greenglass testified.

Greenglass said he himself went so far as to get passport photographs and to accept \$5000 in "escape expense" money from Rosenberg.

But then, he said, he told Rosenberg he had decided "to stay right here and do nothing."

He did not explain his change of mind.

Ten days later he was arrested by FBI agents.

Greenglass returned to the witness stand today after testifying yesterday on atom bomb details never before heard in a courtroom.

He said then that less than a month after the first atom bomb was dropped on Hiroshima in 1945 he gave Rosenberg plans of a newer model A-bomb from information acquired at Los Alamos.

Greenglass said today one reason he provided the information was because he had "a kind of hero worship" for Rosenberg.

The trial provided a dramatic moment when Greenglass said under cross-examination he still felt an affection for his sister and her husband (the Rosenbergs) even though he was testifying for the Government against them.

In response to a defense question, he said he realized his sister faced a possible death penalty.

His sister, seated at a counsel table, nervously clasped and unclasped her hands. Her husband looked intently straight at Greenglass.

Greenglass himself is awaiting sentence after pleading guilty to an espionage charge.

Defense Attorney Emanuel Bloch asked him whether he had any "qualms" when he accepted an honorable discharge from the Army in February, 1946.

"I did my work as a soldier," Greenglass said, "and since the information went to a supposed ally at the time I had no qualms about accepting the honorable discharge."

Greenglass testified earlier that he had begun spying at the urging of his wife. She is named in the indictment as a coconspirator, but is not a defendant. She is expected to be a Government witness.

Deputy Attorney General William Rogers called me today and stated that Roy Cohn is trying to interview David Greenglass and Harry Gold at Lewisburg Penitentiary and he has asked Director of Prisons Bennett to allow this tomorrow. Mr. Rogers stated he told Mr. Bennett to hold off that he first wanted to find out what Roy Cohn had in mind and he wanted to talk to me about it. Mr. Rogers asked if I had any idea what it was all about and I told him I did not but I did think that he should certainly be asked exactly what the purpose of it was. I stated Greenglass is an individual, who may, or may not, be of assistance to us in the future. I stated if they were merely looking for some more headlines, that is one thing, but if they have some specific things they want to inquire into, that was entirely different. I stated a prisoner in a Federal Penitentiary is in the custody of the Attorney General and they should not resent an inquiry as to exactly what the purpose of the interview is. Mr. Rogers stated he had requested they have either the Chairman or Acting Chairman of the Committee request the interview in writing as he did not approve of staff members doing such a thing. Mr. Rogers stated he just wanted to alert me of the matter. He stated also that we had continuing investigations where these two prisoners are involved and we should know what Cohn had in mind. Mr. Rogers stated that just between us, Cohn wanted Mr. David Schine and Mr. Carno go with him on this interview. I stated if they had any specific thing they wanted to know about and would submit it in letter form to the Department, the Department could then pass upon it. Mr. Rogers thanked me.

At the Staff Luncheon today, the Attorney General's secretary brought into him a letter for the Attorney General addressed to him by Senator Porter, asking that arrangements be made for Mr. Roy Cohn, Mr. David Schine, and Mr. Carr, investigators for the McCarthy Committee, to interview Green-glass and Gold at the Lewisburg Penitentiary. This letter stated that the purpose of the interview was to obtain additional facts in connection with subversive activities in the Army Signal Corps. The Attorney General asked me what I thought about this and I then briefed him as to what had developed as a result of my conversation with Deputy Attorney General Rogers yesterday, wherein Mr. Rogers had informed me that Cohn had asked the Bureau of Prisons to arrange for this interview and I had suggested to Mr. Rogers that I felt any requests of this character should be in writing and made by the Chairman of the Committee, and also that there be indicated the purpose for which the interview was desired. Obviously Mr. Rogers had done this and the letter from Senator Porter was what followed. I stated to the Attorney General that as I understood it, any interviews with Green-glass and Gold might interfere with current or forthcoming investigations by the FBI. I made the suggestion that Deputy Attorney General Rogers handle this matter with Senator Porter and possibly suggest that if the investigators of that Committee would submit interrogatories, that the same would then be considered by the Department as to what further assistance could be given.

I would like to be advised of just at the moment why it would be undesirable for Green-glass and Gold to be interviewed by representatives of the Senate Committee.

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# Reveal 200 Spied For Stalin in U. S.

By HOWARD RUSHMORE

Since V-J day, four Americans have been arrested by the FBI and charged with participation in Soviet espionage rings set up by Stalin to steal our atomic secrets.

Yet the FBI's files will show that for every American arrested as a Soviet spy, approximately 50 others equally guilty of treason are still at liberty.

This was learned today from a survey which estimated that a minimum of 200 citizens of this country served in Stalin's espionage network during and after the war.

## NAMES LISTED.

Their names were listed along with a summary of their treasonable activities in a special FBI report on Russian espionage. The report was given administration leaders in November, 1945.

In 1945 the FBI knew nothing about Klaus Fuchs, German-born atomic scientist now in a British prison. Neither did the G-men have information on Julius Rosenberg, David Greenglass, Harry Gold and Alfred D. Black, arrested recently as members of the Fuchs spy apparatus.

## HEADED NETWORK.

The "boss" of the network, personally assigned by Stalin and the MVD to head up the American spy system, was Arthur Alexandrovich Adams.

Adams, regarded as far more important than Fuchs and the four Americans now under arrest, disappeared in December, 1945, shortly after the N. Y. Journal-American and other Hearst newspapers exposed him.

Of the 200 linked by the FBI with Soviet spying, a total of six now face legal justice — four on

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charges of espionage, two for contempt of Congress.

A total of 17 government agencies, bureaus and departments are represented in the FBI spy report. These Federal groups and

ZALMOND DAVID FRANKLIN was born September 14, 1909, at Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He attended public schools in that city and subsequently studied at the Marquette University and at the University of Wisconsin, receiving a B. S. Degree from the latter school in 1936. He is a bacteriologist by training. FRANKLIN'S father, Dr. SAMUEL M. FRANKLIN, is a physician and practices in the Milwaukee area where he has been known as a Communist Party physician. Subject and his father both served in the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in Spain during the years 1937 and 1938. The subject from approximately June of 1937 until February of 1938 when he returned to Milwaukee by way of Paris, France. In Spain, the subject served the Loyalist forces as a bacteriologist in four hospitals at Murcia, Spain.

The subject married SYLVIA CALLEN in February, 1935 at Madison, Wisconsin, and investigation to date has not reflected any record of subject having contact with her after his return from Spain.

LOUIS BUDENZ has advised that in 1938 he brought SYLVIA CALLEN to New York City from Chicago in collaboration with GREGORY LVORICH RABINOWITCH, head of the Russian Red Cross and member of the Russian Secret Police, for the purpose of placing CALLEN in the Socialist Workers Party, where she was to serve as a CP "plant." 

de HOFFMAN wanted to take a plane trip they went to Santa Fe and flew to Albuquerque from there. He believes that when he went to Albuquerque alone he spent the time window shopping and purchasing records. The only thing he recalls he and de HOFFMAN doing was that they went through a number of hotel lobbies, but he could not recall where they stayed.

He did state that on one occasion he had stayed for one night in Albuquerque. At first he related he did not know the name of the hotel but that it was by the station. He then said that he did not know what hotel it was and that it may have been the one by the station.

HALL was shown a photograph of ~~SERGEI KOURNAKOFF~~ and he denied ever having seen this individual. He said that he was familiar with the name of KOURNAKOFF and knew he had written articles and also knew that KOURNAKOFF had been a white Russian who later became sympathetic with the Soviet Union. He said he had no knowledge of KOURNAKOFF having been a writer for any newspaper in New York and when questioned further advised that de HOFFMAN had informed him KOURNAKOFF had once been at Harvard University during the war to lecture. He stated he does not think he ever saw KOURNAKOFF but said he is hazy in this regard and could have met KOURNAKOFF at Harvard at some unknown campus meeting which had KOURNAKOFF as a speaker. He was of the opinion he had read an article by KOURNAKOFF in "Moscow News", but was not sure of this fact. He believes the article dealt with the reconstruction of the Soviet Union after the war. He did not know whether or not KOURNAKOFF was an American citizen. He stated again that he could not recall ever having met KOURNAKOFF although he might possibly have "bumped" into him at Harvard. He said he could not guarantee that he would remember the fact if he had met KOURNAKOFF because there were many lecturers at Harvard. He said he had never discussed KOURNAKOFF nor any books written by KOURNAKOFF with SAX.

A photograph of KOURNAKOFF was again exhibited to HALL. He failed to identify it. He was also shown a photograph of ANATOLI ANTONOVICH ~~YAKOVLEV~~ and a photograph of JULIUS ROSENBERG, which he failed to identify. He denied ever knowing ~~YAKOVLEV~~, hearing of ~~YAKOVLEV~~ or of any person who might be identical with ~~YAKOVLEV~~. He denied knowing JULIUS ROSENBERG and was shown a photograph of numerous suspected members of the Rosenberg Espionage Ring which he failed to identify with the exception of the photograph of DAVID GREENGLASS which he said he recognized as having appeared in recent newspapers. With regard to GREENGLASS he stated he did not know him at Los Alamos, nor did he remember having heard of him while there.

DETAILS:

I. INTERVIEW WITH RUTH GREENGLASS

*When*  
RUTH GREENGLASS, self-confessed espionage agent and wife of DAVID GREENGLASS, self-admitted espionage agent, advised SA MAURICE W. CORCORAN and the writer that she first heard about the consultant friend of JULIUS ROSENBERG in 1949. It is noted that in his previous interview DAVID GREENGLASS had stated he recalled that JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted Soviet espionage agent, first told DAVID about his consultant friend in either 1948 or 1949. DAVID fixed these dates in relation to an accident his wife had had and believed that his wife could fix the date more accurately than he could.

RUTH GREENGLASS advised that on or about February 26, 1949 she had an accident and cut her leg which required medical attention. She recalled that things were not too good at the shop and she and DAVID were in need of money. She recalled that she asked DAVID to borrow some money from JULIUS. She remembered DAVID told her that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him he had a friend from whom he borrowed money, and RUTH told DAVID to borrow some money from JULIUS through this friend. She remembered that about the time she was injured JULIUS ROSENBERG gave DAVID \$60.00. RUTH stated that DAVID's father died on March 7, 1949 and JULIUS ROSENBERG laid out the money for the burial plot, paying the shares of both BERNARD, DAVID and himself. She remembered DAVID told her that JULIUS had told him in private the money JULIUS had furnished for the grave was not a loan since there was a "different relationship" and that JULIUS had a friend who staked him. This friend was a consultant for a dam project in Egypt and earned a lot of money. He was also employed by the government and because of the extra money he made as a consultant he did not miss the money he gave to JULIUS.

RUTH GREENGLASS advised it was her impression that this friend of JULIUS was single and was paid on an hourly basis, probably between \$4.00 and \$5.00 an hour. She stated that figuring \$5.00 an hour as a basis on a 40-hour week meant that this consultant would earn about \$200.00 a week besides the government salary. She stated she is positive now that DAVID

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never told her this consultant made \$200.00 a day because she is certain that such a large amount would have impressed her and she certainly would have been more curious about the individual. She does recall DAVID telling her that JULIUS' friend had been a consultant on a dam in Egypt, but she could not now recall DAVID telling her this friend had flown to Egypt.

She stated it is her impression this consultant must have been single and around JULIUS' age, and must have been very friendly with him. She stated she gathered this impression because she is sure that if the man were married his responsibilities would prevent him from giving money to JULIUS; further, that only a close friend of JULIUS would lend him money. She believes that this man was a contact of JULIUS and was either working with him or was aware of his espionage activities. She also stated that this friend was not a Russian who paid JULIUS since JULIUS would never refer to him in the manner in which he did. She stated that when JULIUS referred to his Russian friends there could be no mistake about it. She agreed that DAVID was mixed up as to the year 1948 and was certain that if he were advised her injury took place in 1949 he would more clearly recall the incident concerning the unknown consultant.

She also stated it was her opinion that if this unknown consultant were an individual of world repute JULIUS would somehow have indicated this fact to DAVID, BERNARD and herself. She stated that DAVID was confused about the sum of \$200.00 a day and believes it is the result of his discussion with her of the probable amounts this unknown friend received for his consulting work. She stated that when DAVID first told her about him she mentally figured out how much the man would earn. She recalls calculating that the man made \$4.00 to \$5.00 an hour and on the basis of a 40-hour week would probably make \$200.00 a week. She distinctly recalls that figuring on the basis of \$200.00 a week the man would make approximately \$10,000.00 a year.

She further stated she could not recall DAVID telling her the man flew to Egypt on his job. She recalls that JULIUS never told DAVID where this man lived, but it is her recollection he told DAVID on one occasion that the man happened to be in New York.

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II. INTERVIEW WITH RUTH GREENGLASS  
RE MIKE SIDOROVICH

When DAVID GREENGLASS was interviewed on May 1 and 2, 1952 at Northeastern Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, he recalled that in June 1949 JULIUS gave him \$800.00, telling him to take his wife and child to the country for a vacation. RUTH GREENGLASS advised that DAVID was confused as to the date ROSENBERG gave DAVID the \$800.00. She recalled that on February 21, 1948 her father fell and broke his hip on the sidewalk in front of a hardware store near Sheriff and Rivington Streets, and was laid up about six months. She recalled that DAVID's cousin JULIUS gave DAVID \$200.00 on or about June 6, 1948 so that they could spend a vacation at Monticello. RUTH recalls she paid about \$185.00 for a room in a boarding house in Monticello. She remembers that DAVID's cousin died on June 13, 1948 and the day before, a Saturday, DAVID, RUTH and BERNARD GREENGLASS and his wife GLADYS saw their cousin JULIUS at DAVID's mother's house. RUTH recalls that JULIUS took sick in DAVID's mother's house and was sent to the hospital that afternoon. She recalls DAVID's mother insisted that DAVID, RUTH, BERNARD and GLADYS go to the movies as they had planned.

RUTH is certain that it was with the \$200.00 given by DAVID's cousin JULIUS LEWIS that they were able to go to the country. She stated her belief in this regard is further strengthened by the fact that she was going to have a birthday party for her boy STEPHEN on August 6, 1948. At the end of July 1948 DAVID came to visit her in the country and told her JULIUS ROSENBERG had given him \$800.00. She recalls that DAVID said he put all the money in the bank except about \$60.00 which he gave to RUTH. She further remembers that she went into the town of Monticello to go to the movies on Saturday, the end of July, and bought herself a pair of copper earrings which she still has. Further, that because of this unexpected money she had a larger party for STEPHEN than she had contemplated.

She stated that because her mind is refreshed in these matters she now recalls that on Friday, July 2, 1948 she was at home preparing and packing to leave for the country on Saturday morning, July 3. She stated that DAVID came home early from the

shop to help her pack. She remembers this distinctly because she stated she was very happy to have DAVID home unexpected to help her. She recalls that DAVID told her MIKE SIDOROVICH had come to the shop looking for JULIUS ROSENBERG. DAVID had introduced him to his brother BERNARD. She recalls asking DAVID what MIKE was doing in New York and DAVID replied that MIKE told him he was on vacation. RUTH stated she was amazed at this and asked DAVID, "Why did MIKE leave the country and come to the city to spend his vacation?"

She stated that at that time she believed MIKE SIDOROVICH and his wife ANNE were still living in the country at Chappaqua. She is further certain that this event took place on July 2, 1948 and not later in the summer because she did not return to New York until after Labor Day, and she is certain DAVID never mentioned MIKE to her during the rest of the summer. She is certain DAVID would recall this visit by MIKE if he is told of her recollection.

### III. INTERVIEW WITH BERNARD GREENGLASS

BERNARD GREENGLASS was interviewed by SA MAURICE W. CORCORAN and the writer on July 16, 1952. He recalled his brother DAVID had mentioned to him that he had borrowed some money from JULIUS ROSENBERG and had suggested that he also ask JULIUS for money. BERNARD recalled that when he asked JULIUS for some money JULIUS told him he had borrowed money from his consultant friend. He had recently asked his friend for more money and his friend had requested that JULIUS repay him the money he had previously borrowed. JULIUS told BERNARD he would ask his friend for some money because in his consultant work he could make \$100.00 in a few days or so. BERNARD recalled JULIUS told him that the consultant worked for the government, but had no idea in which branch. He stated that on one occasion JULIUS told him that his consultant friend did not need the money JULIUS had borrowed from him and could wait until JULIUS repaid it.

BERNARD stated it was his impression that this individual, friend of JULIUS, was single and probably a friend from school. BERNARD was questioned as to whether JULIUS ever

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indicated to him the position in the engineering world that this consultant held. BERNARD stated it was his impression that the consultant friend was an engineer, but not of any exceptional ability. He stated that if this individual had been a widely known engineer he is certain JULIUS would have told him. Therefore, he stated that from the "light way" JULIUS referred to the consultant friend when he told about his asking for a repayment of the money he had loaned to JULIUS, it was his impression that JULIUS treated him in an offhand manner and that the individual was not very prominent.

He recalled that in the late winter of 1948 and the spring of 1949 business in the Pitt Machine Products, Inc., was very slow and there was very little money coming into the shop. Consequently he believes that he first heard about this consultant friend in the late winter of 1948 or the spring of 1949. He further recalled that on March 7, 1949 his father died and JULIUS ROSENBERG loaned him money to pay for the burial plot. He believed that this money was secured by JULIUS ROSENBERG from his consultant friend.

#### IV. INTERVIEW WITH BERNARD GREENGLASS RE MIKE SIDOROVICH

BERNARD GREENGLASS recalls that in the summer of 1948 when it was very hot, he and DAVID were in the shop of the Pitt Machine Products, Inc., when MIKE SIDOROVICH came to the shop looking for JULIUS ROSENBERG. He recalls DAVID spoke to MIKE and told him that JULIUS was out, and thereupon introduced MIKE to him. BERNARD recalls that he, MIKE and DAVID walked to the corner and had a cold drink or a soda in the luncheonette located on the corner of Houston Street and Avenue C. He stated he could not recall whether JULIUS ROSENBERG did meet MIKE at the shop that day or whether MIKE went away and came back to the shop and met JULIUS later on in the day.

BERNARD stated it is his recollection that it was a Friday when MIKE visited the shop, but he could not recall whether it was on the Fourth of July weekend, an earlier date or later on in the summer. His best recollection is that it was a Friday and very hot.

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

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Review of the file of WILLIAM SPINDEL (NY 116-31312) discloses a report made at NY, dated 5/10/49, of SA HECTOR L. During the period that [REDACTED] was in the United States Army, which included his assignment to Los Alamos, [REDACTED] described his attitude toward Communism as "neutral." [REDACTED]'s attitude was still sympathetic toward Russia and Communism as Russia was an ally of the United States. [REDACTED] said that he knew David Greenglass and his wife, Ruth Greenglass, while at Los Alamos, and that he knew them to be outspoken Communists. (Interview 2/25/57).

In an interview with the Federal Bureau of Investigation on February 3, 1951, [redacted] stated that David Greenglass would argue with anyone on the point of Communism, and that Greenglass would invariably adopt the Communist line. [redacted] stated on February 25, 1957, that he realizes now that he should have reported David Greenglass to the authorities for his, Greenglass', advocacy of Communism, but explained that he did not do so as "about forty people, including group leaders, already knew about Greenglass' pro-Communist arguments". [redacted] conceded that this did not relieve him of his own individual responsibility to have reported Greenglass to the authorities, particularly as [redacted] considered Greenglass (as previously stated by him in an interview with the Federal Bureau of Investigation in 1951) to be either a member of the Communist

Party or a Communist sympathizer. [REDACTED] has previously stated that he considered Greenglass "stupid", and that Ruth Greenglass was much more outspoken concerning her Communist sympathies than David Greenglass, and that it was his opinion that she was the driving force behind the Communist sympathies of David Greenglass. b7c b7D

It is noted that David Greenglass, admitted former Soviet espionage agent, was sentenced in United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on April 6, 1951, to fifteen years in prison for conspiracy to commit espionage.

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Civil Rights Committee, NLG, appeared before the Assembly Judiciary Committee (New York State Legislature) to oppose the bill. (u)

The House Committee on Un-American Activities published a report on September 17, 1950, entitled, "The National Lawyers Guild, Legal Bulwark of the Communist Party." Quoting in part from Page 3: (u)

"The committee is reproducing below a list of NLG members who have represented witnesses before the Committee on Un-American Activities. In each case the witnesses have refused to answer questions regarding Communist affiliations propounded by the committee . . . it should be noted in this connection that it is standard Communist practice to accept as attorneys only those who agree to abide by the Party's propaganda and conspirative directive . . . ." (u)

The first name appearing on the list mentioned is EMANUEL H. BLOCH, 270 Broadway, New York City. (u)

International Workers Order (IWO)

o/s The "Daily Worker" of August 13, 1941, Page 8, contained a 4 column announcement on an "All Nationalities Meeting" sponsored by the IWO. Scheduled as speaker for Thursday, August 14, 1941, was EMANUEL BLOCH, member of NLG. "Russian entertainment" was also scheduled. (u)

The IWO has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 10450. (u)

Miscellaneous

A. Activities in Connection with the Rosenberg Case

It should be noted that JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were executed on June 19, 1953, at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States. (u)

The "New York Times" on July 18, 1950, contained an article which stated that EMANUEL H. BLOCH had represented JULIUS ROSENBERG from the time of his arrest on July 17, 1950. (u)

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The "New York Times" again on August 12, 1950, contained an article stating that BLOCH was representing ETHEL ROSENBERG, who was arrested on August 11, 1950. (u)

On September 8, 1950, SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON interviewed RUTH GREENGLASS, wife of DAVID GREENGLASS, who was convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States and who is presently serving a 30 year term in Federal prison. RUTH GREENGLASS stated that a reporter for the "Jewish Daily Forward," named SCHAEFFER, was doing a series of articles regarding RUTH and DAVID GREENGLASS; that in the course of his interviews with various people connected with the ROSENBERG case he had concluded and so stated to RUTH GREENGLASS that EMANUEL BLOCH was very angry with ETHEL ROSENBERG's mother because she wanted ETHEL to confess to her part in the espionage activities of which they were then accused. (u)

Confidential Informant T-17, of unknown reliability, but who was in a position to receive confidential information, advised that during the week of February 12, 1951, according to JULIUS ROSENBERG, a bonded messenger arrived at the office of "MANNY" BLOCH (EMANUEL BLOCH) with a package containing small bills in the amount of \$3,000 to \$5,000. This package allegedly came from one BUD WHITE, of Rutland, Vermont, and contained a note stating that the money was a gift to be used for a civil liberties case at the discretion of BLOCH. Informant stated that BLOCH wrote back to the donor that he intended to use the money in the ROSENBERG case, inasmuch as he considered it to be one of the leading issues of a civil liberties violation. This letter was returned to BLOCH marked "unknown at this address." The money was deposited in ROSENBERG's bank account and the information concerning the letter and the bonded messenger was all set up as a hoax in order to establish the source of the money. (u)

Confidential Informant T-17 advised confidentially on April 5, 1951, that JULIUS ROSENBERG and ABRAHAM BROTHMAN had been working on the draft of a news letter type publication to have been called "Retort," which was to have been organized as a counter-propaganda unit in connection with the ROSENBERG case. It was to have been published and distributed in a completely secret fashion in New York, Chicago, Detroit and Los Angeles. Two of the persons to have been active in effecting publication of this news letter were EUGENE DENNIS, a Communist convicted of violation of the Smith Act of 1940, and HOWARD FAST, previously described herein. In addition to having full knowledge of this plan and approving same, EMANUEL BLOCH was to be the (u)

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advisor in legal issues involved and also was to have been active in handling the funds connected with the publication. Informant subsequently advised on September 29, 1951, that it had been decided not to publish "Retort" but that facilities of the "National Guardian" were to be utilized in its place. (u)

ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, on November 22, 1950, was convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on a charge of conspiracy to obstruct justice. During the course of the trial, ELIZABETH BENTLEY, an admitted Soviet espionage agent, testified that she acted as a courier in the receiving of information from BROTHMAN and transmitted same to her Soviet espionage superior, JACOB MOLOS, during 1941. In BROTHMAN's testimony before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, on July 22, 1947, he admitted membership in the Young Communist League while a student at Columbia University. (u)

ols [ The 1949 report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Page 394, cited the "National Guardian" as a publication launched in New York in 1948, aiming at national circulation which, they found, to be from its inception notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management and content. (u)

The Young Communist League has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 10450. (u)

T-17, on April 11, 1951, advised that EMANUEL BLOCH had stated to JULIUS ROSENBERG that VIVIEN GLASSMAN, the SIDOROVICHES (MICHAEL and ANN) and WILLIAM PERL had all been contacted and that they were all solidly behind ROSENBERG; also, that he, ROSENBERG, should not worry because none of them would say a word. (u)

Informant advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG stated that he furnished his Soviet contact with the name of WILLIAM PERL as a person to be helped to flee the United States, and that his contact selected VIVIEN GLASSMAN as a courier for the job. According to the informant, ROSENBERG stated that GLASSMAN was directly contacted by a Russian agent and asked to take \$2,000 to WILLIAM PERL in Cleveland, Ohio, who was to use it to leave the country. (u)

T-17 further stated that BLOCH knew of the entire espionage apparatus from beginning to end and that BLOCH also was as familiar with every phase of it as was JULIUS ROSENBERG. Informant added BLOCH also knew about the Leica camera and the (u)

VIVIEN GLASSMAN was interviewed on August 3, 1950, by SAs ROBERT F. ROYAL and RICHARD T. HRADSKY. She admitted that she had met JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG while canvassing at the Knickerbocker Village apartment project for the ALP, with which she was affiliated, in 1945. She also admitted to said Agents that she made a trip to Cleveland, carrying \$2,000 which she had received from a source she refused to disclose, and which she was to deliver to WILLIAM PERL, together with instructions for PERL to go to Mexico. J

A picture of MICHAEL SIDOROVICH was exhibited to DAVID GREENGLASS, described hereinbefore, by SA JOHN W. LEWIS, July 19, 1950. GREENGLASS identified the photograph as that of the individual he referred to in his signed statement as the husband of ANN. GREENGLASS wrote the following statement on the reverse side of the photograph: (u)

"This is a picture of MIKE SODOROVICH, who is the husband of ANN, who was to have met me or my wife at Denver or Albuquerque to pick up information about the atom bomb. (u)

The "National Guardian," on December 11, 1952, contained an article which quoted EMANUEL BLOCH as stating that the New York newspapers had condemned and convicted the ROSENBERGS before their trial and that stories of their guilt had been fed to the papers by FBI Chief J. EDGAR HOOVER, Attorney General J. HOWARD MC GRATH and United States Attorney (IRVING) SAYPOL. (Mr. SAYPOL is now a Justice on the New York State Supreme Court) (u) j

The "New York Daily Mirror" on June 22, 1953, contained an article by WALTER WINCHELL, which is quoted in part as follows: (u) j

"He (EMANUEL BLOCH) was also quoted as phoning the prison (Sing Sing) and stating, 'Please give them (referring to the ROSENBERGS) my love. Tell them I am ashamed I am an American today.'" (u) j

The "New York Times" on June 22, 1953, carried an article entitled, "Lawyer for Rosenbergs Assails their 'Murder' at Funeral Here," relating to the funeral of the ROSENBERGS, which was held on the preceeding day. The article set out that at said funeral JOSEPH BRAININ, Chairman of the Committee to Secure Justice (u)

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for the ROSENBERGS, introduced various speakers, among whom was EMANUEL H. BLOCH, who was quoted in the article as follows: (u)

"America should know, as the rest of the world knows, that America today is living under the heel of a military dictatorship dressed in civilian garb. These people have no hearts. They have stones for hearts. They have hard hearts and they have hard eyes. (u) J

"They have the souls of murderers and this was an act of cold blooded murder. When I requested in Washington that these executions be put off so they would not occur on the Jewish Sabbath, the request was granted by a barbarian who pushed them up so that there would be no conflict. (u) J

"Let the pen prostitutes and the Voice of America know that the Rosenbergs were not executed according to law (u) J

"The entire court (referring to the Supreme Court of the United States) was stating to the President, 'Do not commit this barbaric act.' (u) J

"I place the murder of the Rosenbergs at the door of President Eisenhower, Mr. Brownell (referring to Herbert R. Brownell, Attorney General of the United States) and J. Edgar Hoover. They did not pull the switch true, but they directed the ones who did pull the switch. This was not the American tradition, not American justice and not American fair play. This was Nazism that killed the Rosenbergs, and if we forget the lesson, we will cringe, we'll live on our knees and we will be afraid. Insanity, irrationality, barbarism and murder seem to be a part of the feelings of those who rule us." (u) J

The "New York World Telegram and Sun," on June 24, 1953, contained an article with regard to subject's remarks at the ROSENBERGS' funeral. Said article stated in part that "In his funeral address, Mr. Bloch took pains to announce he was not speaking as the Rosenbergs' attorney, but as one who had lost a brother or a sister." (u) J

The "New York Journal American" contained an article on June 20, 1953, in which EMANUEL BLOCH was quoted as saying, "American democracy died with the Rosenbergs." (u) J

The "National Guardian" of July 13, 1953, Page 1, contained an article entitled, "The Last Letters of Ethel and

Julius Rosenberg." These were dated June 18 and 19 and are quoted in part as follows: (u)

"Dear Manny: I have drawn up a last will and testament so that there can be no question about the fact that I want you to handle all our affairs and be responsible for the children as, in fact, you have been doing. Ethel completely concurs in this request and is, in her hand, attesting to it . . . (u) +

"You, Manny, are not only considered as one of my family but are our extra special friend. The bond of brotherhood and love between us was forged in the struggle for life and all that it means and it is a source of great strength to us. Be strong for us, beloved friend, and we wish you long life to continue your fruitful work in health and happiness, for without doubt you are a fine man, dear friend and sincere advocate of the people. I salute you and caress you affectionately with all my heart. (u) +

"Never let them change the truth of our innocence. (u) +

"For peace, bread and roses, and simple dignity we face the executioner with courage, confidence and perspective, never losing faith. (u) +

Mr. Wall also stated that there was a strong possibility that Communist functionaries throughout the country may attempt to leave the U.S. and go into Mexico or Canada. He felt particularly that they might go to Mexico in view of the fact that espionage agents Morton Sobell and David Greenglass had instructions to leave the U.S. through Mexico. In this regard, Mr. Wall suggested that the Bureau effect arrangements with the Immigration authorities to preclude the departure of Communist Party functionaries from the U.S. to Mexico.



The official count of the November 4, 1952 national election returns for state of Tennessee on file at office of Secretary of State, Nashville, Tennessee, as reviewed on November 28, 1952 reflect that the Progressive Party ticket as headed by presidential candidate VINCENT GALLINAN and vice presidential candidate CHARLOTTA BASS received a total of 885 votes in state of Tennessee. This ticket received 71 votes in Davidson County (Nashville) and only 36 votes in Shelby County (Memphis). It received no votes in Maury County (Columbia) and got 48 votes in Rutherford County (Murfreesboro.) It biggest vote was in Hamilton County (Chattanooga) where it got 178 votes and got 26 votes in Knox County (Knoxville.)

## (A) DEFENSE OF JULIUS AND ETHEL ROSENBERG

ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG, U. S. citizens were convicted and sentenced to die in U. S. District Court, New York, New York in March, 1951 charged with conspiracy to commit espionage against U. S. by turning over atomic secrets to Russia.

As an example of the strong CP interest in the ROSENBERG defense please refer to editorial appearing on page 1, December 23, 1952 edition of Daily Worker which says ".....the Rosenbergs are innocent. The evidence against them is non-existent.....the men who plan the execution of the innocent Rosenbergs hope they will be able to take a big step toward fascization of the United States.....This means there is needed in our country an upsurge of the people in many forms....let the protests in wires and letters mount. Let us speak out now, in the streets, to the authorities in demonstrations, stoppages, as we have never done before..ACT!"

On November 2, 1952, L. E. McGURTY said he had just contributed \$5.00 to defense of ROSENBERGS. (Source T-2.)

At a December 16, 1952 CP meeting AL GREENBERG said the ROSENBERGS are innocent; otherwise they would have confessed as did the 14 Communists convicted of treason in Czechoslovakia in fall of 1952; that the government's key witness in the ROSENBERG case, DAVID GREENGLASS, was a perjurer, and that the conviction and death penalty imposed was clear cut proof of anti-Semitism in the U. S. growing out of the anti-Communist hysteria.

With regard to the Czech treason trials, AL stated that he personally knew one of the Czechs who was convicted and had attended CP meetings with him in Europe in 1948-49. He said this man was one of the three who got life sentences.

On December 16, 1952, AL GREENBERG and LAWRENCE E. McGURTY suggested having a Memphis Progressive Party meeting soon in order to organize a mass protest and appeal to President of the U. S., HARRY S. TRUMAN, urging executive clemency for the ROSENBERGS. (Source T-1.)

On December 16, 1952, AL GREENBERG bragged that he'd recently been elected as program chairman of the Tom Paine Club of Memphis (previously identified in instant case) and that at the next meeting, January 4, 1953, he would discuss the defense of the ROSENBERGS. (Source T-1.)

At meeting of Tom Paine Club of Memphis held at Memphis Jewish Community Center in Memphis on January 4, 1953, a discussion was held in which, without opposition, the group went on record as protesting the conviction of the ROSENBERGS. A collection was taken up to send a telegram to President HARRY S. TRUMAN urging that he exercise executive clemency in behalf of the ROSENBERGS.

The main speakers at this meeting in the defense of the ROSENBERGS were AL GREENBERG, L. E. MCGURTY, VINCENT ~~MIERS~~, JR., treasurer of the club, and an unidentified Marine and CLIFTON JOHNSON, history professor, LeMoyne College, Memphis, Tennessee. All of them quoted the same defenses of the ROSENBERGS which have consistently been parroted in the Daily Worker and National Guardian newspapers in recent months such as facts that the death sentence was excessive, that when the alleged acts of espionage took place, Russia was the ally of the U. S. (World War II); that the government's main witness, DAVID GREENGLASS, was a perjurer and was jealous of the ROSENBERGS; further that GREENGLASS did not have the intelligence to pass on to the ROSENBERGS all the secret data he is supposed to have passed to them. They also accused Federal Judge KAUFMAN of being unduly prejudiced in his handling of the case. (Source T-2.)

On night of January 4, 1953, Tom Paine Club did send a telegram to President HARRY S. TRUMAN, White House, Washington, D. C. urging that he exercise executive clemency in the ROSENBERG case. (Source T-4, of known reliability.)

On December 31, 1952, L. E. MCGURTY commented that he had just contributed an additional undisclosed amount to defense of ROSENBERGS. (Source T-2.)

#### (B) AMNESTY FOR SMITH ACT VICTIMS

Page 4, columns 2, 3, and 4 of December 10, 1952 issue of Daily Worker carried article captioned "280 National Leaders ask Truman Amnesty Jailed Communists."

The story stated that an appeal requesting amnesty to the leaders of the CP convicted under the Smith Act has been made by 280 prominent Americans and forwarded to President HARRY S. TRUMAN in the White House by Reverend KENNETH RIPLEY, ~~FORBES~~ of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, it was announced yesterday (December 7, 1952.)

The appeal urged that amnesty be granted and was based on the signers' belief that such action "would go far to combat the mounting attacks on the rights of non-Communists," and on "simple human considerations".

Bethe, a leading nuclear physicist in the United States, has been under investigation as an espionage suspect since September, 1951, on the basis of information received from David Greenglass, confessed espionage agent, that he had furnished Bethe's name to the Soviets as a possible espionage recruit and because of Bethe's known association with Alfred Sarant, known member of the Rosenberg espionage network. Investigation has failed to develop any information reflecting Bethe was engaged in either subversive or espionage activities. Albany Field Office requests permission to interview Bethe. Interview not believed desirable since it is felt no logical basis exists for it.

PURPOSE

To recommend transmittal of the attached letter to Albany denying its request to interview Bethe.

BACKGROUND

Bethe, a German refugee scientist, was brought to the United States in 1935, by the Physics Department of Cornell University, Ithaca, New York. He became a naturalized American citizen in 1941. From 1942 to date he has worked on various phases of atomic energy for the Atomic Energy Commission. He served in an advisory capacity on the "Lexington Project" wherein the results of research on the NEPA (Nuclear Energy for the Propulsion of Aircraft) Project were developed.

In 1947, Bethe was investigated under the AEA program and was given a Q clearance.

In February, 1950, Bethe was interviewed by Bureau agents concerning his association with Klaus Fuchs, an atomic spy whom he had known since 1934. He stated he did not suspect Fuchs was subversive.

In July, 1950, he was interviewed by Bureau agents concerning his association with Alfred Sarant, known member of the Rosenberg espionage network who was at Cornell University in the late forties. Bethe stated he became acquainted with Sarant's father-in-law, Victor K. D. Ross, an attorney in Ithaca in 1945, in connection with a private legal matter. He thereafter met Sarant through Ross. He stated that Sarant was never given access to any of the confidential data available to him nor did Sarant ever request such data.

In September, 1951, the Albany Field Office was instructed to institute an espionage investigation of Bethe on the basis of information received from David Greenglass, confessed Soviet agent, that he had furnished the name of Bethe to the Soviets in 1945, as a possible espionage recruit. Greenglass said he did not know Bethe, but heard he was a "Leftist." Information had also been received from Jerome Tartakow, a cellmate of Julius Rosenberg and of unknown reliability, that during discussion with Rosenberg, the latter mentioned that Sarant, who fled the United States after Rosenberg's arrest, had an excellent friend at Cornell, a Professor Beta (phonetic).

Information was also received from Greenglass and Tartakow that Rosenberg claimed to have received through espionage the highly confidential data relating to NEPA. Because of Bethe's work in this field, it was felt that if Rosenberg's statement is true, there was the possibility that Sarant could have obtained such material through Bethe.

In the memorandum from Mr. Clegg to Mr. Tolson dated 10/20/53 in the matter entitled, "Suspected Espionage, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey and Federal Telecommunications Laboratories, Nutley, New Jersey," it was recommended and approved that the "Domestic Intelligence Division should obtain and promptly review the findings of the McCarthy Committee with a view to determining whether any information not previously known to the Bureau regarding matters within its jurisdiction has been developed by this committee. The details should be promptly brought to the attention of the Director and in the event it appears this committee has obtained such information an explanation should be given as to why the Bureau did not know about it."

In order that the Domestic Intelligence Division can discharge its responsibilities there is attached hereto Photostats of pages 187 to 241 of the McCarthy Committee proceedings containing the testimony of the above captioned subject on 10-9-53. This testimony should be reviewed by the substantive Supervisor who should thereafter submit a memorandum analyzing the results of this review.

Where there has been substantial information not previously known to the Bureau developed in this testimony and an explanation is required in accordance with the above instructions, the explanation should accompany the memorandum of analysis.

Copies of all memoranda submitted as a result of this review should be designated for F. L. Jones, Room 2710, and D. J. Sullivan, Room 7644. Copies also should be designated for Bureau file 65-61685 and for the subject's case file.

On March 22, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted as a Soviet Espionage Agent, testified during the course of his trial that HARRY and SYLVIA STEINGART had loaned him two tables when they moved to California.

On March 27, 1951, DAVID GREENGLASS, an admitted former Soviet Agent advised that in 1945 or 1946, JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that the friends on the west coast to whom he had recently shipped furniture were engaged in Soviet Espionage and were going to China.

Inasmuch as the subject is presently residing, or will be residing in the territory covered by the San Francisco Division, and there is no indication that he will return to the territory covered by the Washington Field Office, it is suggested that San Francisco be designated Office of Origin.

"Dear Mr. Hoover:

"Morris Ben Agid, 40 Monroe Street, New York City, is a Communist. He was in contact with Julius Rosenberg during the years 1943 to 1945 and may have been a member of the same Communist cell. He has made his contacts with other Communist agents at a retail store in lower east side Manhattan, run by one of his relatives. Morris has a relative in the French Court System at Paris, France, and a brother of Morris, frequently in Europe has been a courier for Morris and the French relative, also known as Ben Agid, for espionage purposes.

"Morris received \$3,000 for his services to the Communists, from 1943 to 1946, and may have deposited this money in a bank near his home. He paid no Federal Income Tax on this money. Morris Ben Agid is employed as a government worker in the courts in New York City, and has stayed away from his Communist friends since 1950, when the Rosenbergs were arrested.

"Here are proof of some of his Communist activities and connections. The Rosenbergs were sent to Ben Agid of Paris, France, when they got passport photos, with the intention to leave the U.S. The arrangements for them in Paris were made by Morris, but were never used, as the Rosenbergs were arrested too soon.

"Morris Ben Agid always visited a certain Communist union official living on Sheriff Street, when he wanted to pass information to high Communists like the Rosenbergs, as he was afraid to visit them at their apartment in Knickerbocker Village.

"Morris Ben Agid sometimes met Max Elichter and Julius Rosenberg after Alumni meetings of City College graduates. All three were assigned to communize government Civil Service Workers; and discussed their plans at the times. All three are City College graduates.

"Mrs. Elichter has frequently met with Agid, at his relatives retail store to discuss organizing Civil Service workers.

# A-SPY BARES ROSENBERG RADAR THEFT

## Greenglass Tells Of Espionage

BY WILLARD EDWARDS

New York, Oct. 30 (CTPS)—The confessed atomic spy whose testimony helped send Julius Rosenberg to the electric chair last June has made a full disclosure of Soviet espionage in the secret radar laboratories of the Army signal corps at Ft. Monmouth, N. J.

David Greenglass, interviewed Thursday by investigators for Sen. McCarthy (R) of Wisconsin in the federal penitentiary at Lewisburg, Pa., where he is serving a 15-year term, swore that Russian agents, to his knowledge, pilfered data dealing with the latest electronic war weapons.

### Helped Convict A-Spies

This was learned from an authoritative source tonight as the text of Greenglass' two-hour statement was closely guarded. Greenglass gave names and dates and corroborative evidence. He will be a key witness in the open hearings before McCarthy's investigations subcommittee expected to start here early next month.

As a government witness in the Rosenberg trial, Greenglass admitted his own guilt and gave testimony against his sister, Ethel, and his brother-in-law, Julius, clinching the case against them which resulted in a death sentence.

When McCarthy's chief counsel, Roy M. Cohn, a prosecutor in the Rosenberg case, staff director Frank P. Carr and chief consultant G. David Schine faced Greenglass in the warden's office at the Lewisburg penitentiary, they knew that Greenglass was a potential source of information about espionage at Ft. Monmouth.

Two hours later, Greenglass had testified in the presence of John Roy, who were in the room to doubt the American sign.

close co-operation with McCarthy, has publicly pledged that this "teamwork" will continue until all disloyal workers are rooted out.

Greenglass did not work at Fort Monmouth. But he was intimately acquainted with the activities of Rosenberg, who entered the signal corps at the Army post in 1940 and remained until 1945. Rosenberg, according to the evidence, recruited a group of young engineers and technicians, all with Communist backgrounds, to work with him.

Among the known accomplices of Rosenberg at Fort Monmouth were Alfred Sarant and Joel Barr, both of whom fled the country when the Rosenberg spy case broke and are now reported in Iron Curtain territory. William Perl, now serving a five-year sentence for perjury, and Vivian Glassman, sweetheart of Barr. Others have not been publicly identified.

Morton Sobell, serving a 30-year term at Alcatraz, was indicated in the testimony as the courier who took the secrets stolen from the radar laboratories and started them on their way to Russia. Sobell made numerous trips to the New Jersey home of a civilian employe at the Army post.

Evidence was reported mounting against a top scientist at Fort Monmouth who was among the first five suspended several weeks ago. This individual was under investigation as long ago as 1948 when secret documents were discovered in his home, but he escaped at that time with a reprimand.

Another confessed atomic spy, Harry Gold, was interviewed in the Lewisburg penitentiary, but had no information about spying at Fort Monmouth, according to report. However, Gold signed an affidavit which definitely linked a recently discharged United Nations radio broadcaster with Soviet espionage.

This U.N. employe, Alexander Svenchansky, who conceded he was also known as Shura Swan, had pleaded possible self-incrimination Thursday when questioned by chief counsel Robert Morris of the Senate internal security subcommittee headed by Sen. Jenner (R) of Indiana. He refused to answer any questions about his relations with Abraham Brothman, now serving a prison sentence for obstructing justice by inducing Gold to give false testimony in the atomic spy investigation.

In the affidavit, Gold swore that he met Brothman in September, 1941, and that Brothman said Shura Swan had introduced him to Soviet espionage work. Brothman once complained, he stated, of the "base ingratitude of the Soviet espionage setup" because Swan had been laid off by the Amtorg Trading corporation, a Russian cover for espionage.

Svenchansky, or Swan, received a \$20,000 award from a United Nations tribunal as recompense for being discharged.

## DETAILS:

This is a joint report of Special Agents EDWARD J. CAHILL and ROBERT F. ROYAL.

I. BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION

T-1, of known reliability, advised 10/16/53 that CARL GREENBLUM has stated to him that he, GREENBLUM, first met JULIUS ROSENBERG while both were students at the College of the City of New York (CCNY) in the late 1930's. GREENBLUM described himself as having been a Socialist at that time. JULIUS ROSENBERG was a Communist during the same period. Both GREENBLUM and ROSENBERG during this period endeavored to convert one MORRIS SAVITSKY, a fellow classmate, to their respective political philosophy. GREENBLUM advised T-1 that ROSENBERG, through SAVITSKY, learned of his, GREENBLUM's, political philosophy and as a result they were not too friendly at this time.

GREENBLUM and ROSENBERG were next associated when they attended the United States Signal Corps Inspectors' Training School held at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, in the fall of 1940. In 1941 GREENBLUM and ROSENBERG were both stationed in Philadelphia as Inspectors for the United States Signal Corps. Both ROSENBERG and GREENBLUM, according to T-1, roomed at the same residence in Philadelphia, the exact dates and address could not be furnished at this time. Other Signal Corps Inspectors stationed at Philadelphia during the same period were JOSEPH LEVITSKY, MARCUS (MAX) EPSTEIN and ALFRED C. WALKER. While in Philadelphia GREENBLUM became well acquainted with JOSEPH LEVITSKY.

o/s T-1 continued by stating that in the middle 1940's GREENBLUM visited JOSEPH LEVITSKY's home in Brooklyn, New York on several occasions. Present during these visits were people who were described as Communist Party (CP) members. These individuals were LEO, last name unknown; FRED, last name unknown; CECILE, last name unknown, and SYLVI, last name unknown. GREENBLUM advised T-1 that he could furnish description and identify photographs of these people. At that time of T-1's contact with GREENBLUM, the informant was advised that GREENBLUM had address books at home and would be able to furnish information of value from these books.

GREENBLUM advised T-1 that about 1947 LEVITSKY began showing increased interest in GREENBLUM's work and friends at

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Fort Monmouth, particularly concerning the nature of the work they were performing. GREENBLUM advised the informant that he suspected that at that time LEVITSKY was endeavoring to develop him as an espionage contact. GREENBLUM during this period was invited to a dinner party at a french restaurant on 34th Street, New York City. Three couples were present at this dinner party, in addition to LEVITSKY and his wife. GREENBLUM identified WILLIAM PERL and JOEL BARR as having been present at this dinner party. GREENBLUM could not recall the women guests at this party but, according to T-1, could describe them. GREENBLUM identified BARR as having been known to him as a member of the CP while a fellow classmate at CCNY.

o/s GREENBLUM advised T-1 he believed this dinner party was held for the express purpose of looking GREENBLUM over as an espionage prospect. GREENBLUM mentioned other dinner meetings but did not furnish details to T-1.

Later, according to T-1 information, LEVITSKY showed an unusual interest in LOUIS ANTELL's work with Signal Corp probably with a possible view toward developing ANTELL as an espionage contact.

GREENBLUM said that ANTELL probably alerted GREENBLUM to what LEVITSKY was trying to do and remarked this is serious business and it was ANTELL'S suggestion that both terminate their contacts with LEVITSKY.

T-1 said after arrest of JULIUS ROSENBERG arrest GREENBLUM had occasion to meet LEVITSKY. He asked LEVITSKY if he had anything to do with ROSENBERG. LEVITSKY answered "But for the grace of God There go I". No other explanation was offered.

LEVITSKY and GREENBLUM met during Summers of 1951 and 1952 on a social bases. T-1 advised that GREENBLUM knew MORTON SOBELL at City College New York and in year 1945 met him at Reeves Instrument Corporation, New York City in 1945.

JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL, were electrocuted on June 19, 1953 after having been convicted and sentenced for conspiracy to commit espionage. DAVID GREENGLASS, self-confessed Soviet espionage agent, in testimony at the JULIUS ROSENBERG, et al trial, identified JOEL BARR as an important Soviet agent connected with ROSENBERG, who went to Europe in 1948. This information was furnished to GREENGLASS by ROSENBERG. GREENGLASS states that BARR'S purpose in going to Europe was so that he could act further as a Soviet agent.

GREENGLASS is now serving a fifteen year sentence at the US Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania having pled guilty to a conspiracy to commit espionage charge.

WILLIAM PERL is now serving a five year sentence for perjury at the US Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana. PERL denied knowing JULIUS ROSENBERG after college (CCNY).

VIVIAN GLASSMAN, former girl friend of BARR, admitted to SAS RICHARD T. HRADSKY and ROBERT F. ROYAL on evening of August 3, 1950 that she was a friend of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. She admitted that an unknown man gave her \$2,000. and instructions to be given to an aeronautical engineer and friend in Cleveland, Ohio, for leaving the US. for Mexico on July 21, 1953. On July 22, 1953 she traveled to Cleveland via plane and contacted WILLIAM PERL. PERL would not take the money according to GLASSMAN. PERL in interview confirmed her trip and offer of the money and instructions. He denied taking the \$2,000.

MORTON SOBELL, mentioned herein, is serving a thirty year sentence at the US Penitentiary, Alcatraz, having been convicted and so sentenced for conspiracy to commit espionage along with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG.
