SYLVIA STEINGART, WAS MIS SUBJECT: ESPIONAGE - B

Rerep SA RALPH M. LINDSET dated Jan. 4, 1952 at San Francisco.

A review of instant file in the San Francisco office reflects that subject, according to informants, is a member of and has been active in the Communist Party. Prior to March, 1951, this case bore the character "Security Matter - C."

On March 27, 1951, DAVID OREENGLASS, an admitted former Soviet Agent, advised that in 1945 or 1946, JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted as a Soviet espionage agent, told him that the friends on the West Coast to whom he had Shipped furniture were engaged in Soviet espionage and were going to China.

On March 22, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG testified during the course of his Strial in New York City, that HARRY and SYLVIA STEINGART had loaned him two Stables when they moved to California.

DAVID GREENGLASS was subsequently shown photographs and interviewed concerning the STEINGARTS. GREENGLASS advised that he had never seen or met the STEINGARTS or heard their name mentioned.

of unknown reliability and who will Confidential Informant not testify under any circumstances, advised agents of the New York Office on April 5, 1951, that JULIUS ROSENHERG; ABRAHAM BROTHMAN, convicted of conspiracy to obstruct justice; and MMANUEL BLOCH, Attorney for ROSENBERG, were planning to publish a counter-propaganda news letter to be entitled, "RETORT", which would be distributed in a clandestine manner throughout the country by individuals carefully selected by ROSENBERG, et al. The informant stated that the distributors of this publication would be members of the National Board, and among these individuals he named SYLVIA STEINGART of Los Angeles, Cali-62,670 fornia.

It is to be noted that this same informant subsequently reported that the plans had been altered and that the magazine "RETORT" would not be published.

On March 24, 1951, HARRY A STEINGART, husband of the subject, was interviewed by agents of the Los Angeles Office. This interview took place in the presence of STEINGART's attorneys, who, after STEINGART had admitted knowing JULIUS ROSENBERG in New York, declined to permit their client to answer further questions. On March 27, 1951, SA THOMAS E. BRYANT of the Los Angeles Office was advised by HARRY STEINGART's attorney, JACK TENNER, that neither HARRY STEINGART nor SYLVIA STEINGART would answer any additional questions unless they were served with a subpoens.

Since March, 1951, and prior thereto, the San Francisco Office has conducted extensive investigation of the subject. This has resulted in determining that the subject has been active in Communist Party and front group organizations and that she associates with persons also active in such groups. No information has been developed, either in San Francisco, New York or Los Angeles to corroborate the allegation of espionage.

It is noted that PAUL G. PINSKY and his wife, SARAH FISHER PINSKY,

It is noted that PAUL G. PINSKY and his wife, SARAH FISHER PINSKY, 768 Seventh Ave., San Francisco, are both subjects of Security Index cards. The Bureau file numbers for these persons are 100-25370 and 100-290542, respectively.

It is to be noted that the statement as made by GREENGLASS concerning ROSENBERG's mentioning that the friends on the West Coast to whom he had shipped furniture were engaged in espionage is specific and probably refers to the STEINGARTS, however, it is not felt that it contains information sufficient or concrete enough to question the STEINGARTS. Further, investigation to date has developed no corroboration of this information, nor has there been shown any evidence of current espionage activity on the part of SYLVIA.

STEINGART.

From the foregoing it would appear that the only person in a position to furnish direct evidence of Soviet espionage on the part of the subject in JULIUS ROSENBERG.

In view of the above a closing summary report is being prepared for this subject; that the case be followed through reports of confidential informants and established sources, being subject to reopening upon the receipt of corroborating evidence or information received from ROSENBERG.

UACB the San Francisco Office will submit a closing summary report on or before March 25, 1952.



KAUPMAN. On June 19, 1953, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were electrocuted at Sing Sing Prison. On Japany 2, 1952 there was an amountcement of the formation of the NCSJRC in the "Daily Worker", page 3, columns I and 5. JOSEPH ERAININ was appointed chairman, and the claim of this committee is that the ROSENBERGS were convicted because they were Jews and because of their political beliefs. The aim of this committee was to secure a new trial or clemency for the ROSENBERGS.



Information obtained from MAXILITCHER, who admitted that ROSENBERG attempted to recruit his for Soviet espionage, indicates that ROSENBERG was utilizing an apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City. This apartment was rented in the name of ALFRED SARANT from October 1943 to January 1950. SARANT, on interview, has advised he was a former member of the Village Branch of the CP, 1943-1944 and believes that he met JULIUS ROSENBERG through a mutual friend, JOHL BARR, or at a meeting of the FAECT. In 1946 SARANT moved to Ithaca, New York, and the apartment at 65 Morton Street was taken by JOHL BARR. ALFRED SARANT stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN was the finance of JOHL BARR.

WILLIAM PERL, mentioned above, is presently serving a five year sentence, United States Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana, in that he committed perjury before United States Federal Grand Jury in denying he knew JULIUS ROSENBERG.

B. DOCUMENTATION OF INDIVIDUALS REFERRED TO IN THIS REPORT

WILLIAM PERL

WILLIAM PERL was convicted of two counts of perjury on May 22, 1953, United States District Court, Southern District of New York, to wit; denying before a Federal Grand Jury that he was acquainted with JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL. On June 5, 1953, WILLIAM PERL was sentenced to five years imprisonment and is presently serving his sentence in the United States Correctional Institution, Terre Haute, Indiana.

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG

JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG and one MORTON SOBELL were found guilty in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, for conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the USSR on March 29, 1951. On April 5, 1951, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were sentenced to death and MORTON SOBELL to 30 years in prison.

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed June 19, 1953, at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, and MORTON SOBELL is presently serving his 30 years sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

DAVID GREENGLASS

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, have advised that they were recruited to work in the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. ETHEL ROSENBERG is the sister of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS was sentenced on April 6, 1951, in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, to 15 years in Prison, after entering a plea of guilty to conspiracy to commit

espionage in behalf of the USSR. He is currently serving his sentence in the United States Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania.



C. CONTACTS AND ASSOCIATES OF SUBJECT

WILLIAM PERL

On July 26, 1950, WILLIAM PERL advised that he first met VIVIAN GLASSMAN through one JOEL BARR sometime in approximately 1946 and saw her approximately three times. He stated he did not see her again until April, 1950 when he stayed at the home of ELEANOR GLASSMAN on East 8th Street, New York City. PERL explained that he had not known ELEANOR GLASSMAN prior to April 7, 1950, when he made her acquaintance as a casual pickup and lived with her for the week following.

On August 17, 1950, WILLIAM PERL advised he had met VIVIAN GLASSMAN's sister ELEANOR as a casual pickup acquaintance in a Greenwich Village restaurant in about February, 1950 but could not remember further details of this "pickup". He said that he subsequently met ELEANOR GLASSMAN in New York City in April, 1950 and that this meeting was by appointment.

On September 12, 1950, WILLIAM PERL advised that he had first met ELEANOR GLASSMAN about February, 1950 as a casual "pickup" acquaintance in a Greenwich Village restaurant and after returning to Cleveland, Ohio he received a letter from ELEANOR GLASSMAN possibly in March, 1950 inviting him to come to New York City during Easter week. ELEANOR GLASSMAN mentioned that she had a weeks vacation and PERL stated he proceeded to New York City and registered at the Statler Hotel where he telephoned ELEANOR GLASSMAN and then spent the next week at her apartment at 343 East 8th Street.

On July 28, 1950, WILLIAM PERL advised that on Sunday July 23, 1950, about noon as he was preparing food in the kitchen alcove of his apartment at 666 East 103rd Street, Cleveland, Ohio a woman appeared through the curtain which shields the alcove from the stairs leading to the street. The woman identified herself and he recognized her as VIVIAN GLASSMAN of New York City. He stated that he asked her to come in, which she did, and asked her what she wanted. He stated she reached for some paper that was lying on the table

and for a lapboard which was also nearby. She sat down on the couch in the apartment, motioned to PERL to sit next to her and indicated to him he was to read what she was writing. He stated she wrote approximately as follows:

That she had been instructed to communicate with him by writing rather than talking; that she had been approached by a stranger in New York City and told to go to Cleveland to see an aeronautical engineer; that she was to give him money and instructions which she had memorized and as to how he and a friend were to leave the country. In this connection PERL stated he recalled the word Mexico. He continued that she wrote that for identification she was to mention a ship incident in which she had been concerned with JOEL BARR and also the name JOHN. PERL continued that as nearly as he could remember she also wrote to the effect she knew JULIUS ROSENBERG. He stated he told her in effect that he did not know what she was talking about and hoped that she had a clear conscience and was not getting mixed up in anything. He stated he thought the whole thing was some kind of a trick and asked her to leave.

PERL also advised he was acquainted some years previously with JOEL BARR and one ALFRED SARANT. He stated that he had last seen BARR in 1947 and had met SARANT through BARR and subleased SARANT's apartment.

ALFRED SARANT

ALFRED SARANT on July 28, 1950, advised SAS HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN and ROBERT F. ROYAL that he resided at 65 Morton Street, Apartment 61, New York City, from October, 1943 to September, 1946 and he subsequently sublessed it to JOEL BARR and WILLIAM PERL.







On September 8, 1950, RUTH GREENGLASS, wife of DAVID GREENGLASS, furnished SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON the following information concerning VIVIAN GLASSMAN:

He stated that during September, 1945 when her husband DAVID was on a furlough she had visited ETHEL ROSENBERG!s apartment at 10 Monroe Street, New York City, and VIVIAN GLASSMAN was present. She did not recall too much about the circumstances of the visit but did recall that her husband DAVID drove VIVIAN GLASSMAN home in RUTH GREENGLASS! father's car.

CAMEINGLE

She also stated that on one occasion JULIUS ROSENBERG told her that he was going to see VIVIAN in connection with a change in the then political situation. RUTH believed this was in 1945. She stated she again met VIVIAN GLASSMAN in ETHEL ROSENBERG's apartment in the fall of 1946 or the early part of 1947.

RUTH GREENGLASS stated that on another occasion, an evening during the Christmas holiday of 1947, she was in ETHEL ROSENBERG's apartment and VIVIAN GLASSMAN and JOEL BARR were also there. She recalled that VIVIAN brought clothes including ski pants, sweaters and other heavy clothing for ETHEL ROSENBERG who was going on a vacation with her husband JULIUS.

RUTH GREENGLASS stated that at the most she saw VIVIAN GLASSMAN on four or five occasions but that ETHEL ROSENBERG spoke about her quite often indicating that she was going out with VIVIAN.

On September 8, 1950, DAVID GREENGLASS identified a photograph of VIVIAN GREENGLASS. He stated he first met her when he came back from the army in March, 1916 and met her in the apartment of JULIUS ROSENBERG, 10 Monroe Street, New York City. He stated VIVIAN GLASSMAN was a girlfriend of JOEL BARR, and that he had only seen VIVIAN about four times.

On the evening of August 3, 1950, VIVIAN GLASSMAN was interviewed at her residence, 131 East 7th Street, New York City, by SAs ROBERT F. ROYAL and RICHARD T. HRADSKY. She admitted knowing ALFRED SARANT and stated she believes she met him at a house party at her residence, 320 Ocean Avenue, Long Branch, New Jersey, in about 1943 when she was employed by the United States Army Signal Corps at Ft. Monmouth, New Jersey. GLASSMAN stated she was in the company of SARANT on numerous occasions thereafter when she was dating JOEL BARR. She also stated she met ALFRED SARANT's wife LOUISE at their apartment located at 65 Morton Street, about 1945 or 1946 and was in this apartment on numerous occasion.

VIVIAN GLASSMAN was shown a rull length photograph of JULIUS ROSENBERG and she advised that she was very friendly with JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, and that she met them while canvassing the Knickerbocker Village apartment project for the American Labor Party (ALP) which which she was affiliated. She stated this was approximately 1945 and she became friendly with ROSENBERG's wife and frequently visited the ROSENBERGS socially thereafter. She denied that she had ever done any work for JULIUS ROSENBERG or that he had ever asked her to. She stated that ROSENBERG had been in her apartment at 131 East 7th Street on several occasions and he had taken her home from Knickerbocker Village late at night but denied that her apartment was ever used by ROSENBERG for photographic work or for any purpose. She emphasized she was more friendly with ETHEL than with JULIUS ROSENBERG.

She advised that about 7:30 or 8:00 p.m. on Friday, July 21, 1950, a man knocked on her apartment door while she was telephoning a friend, ERNEST PATAKI, 217 East 19th Street, New York City, (present husband). In reply to her request for the identity of the person knocking on the door a man stated he was a friend. VIVIAN said she advised PATAKI that a man was at her door who only stated he was a friend and she asked PATAKI if it would be safe to admit him. PATAKI, according to VIVIAN, advised her to leave the receiver off the hook and find out who was at the door.

She admitted the individual at the door and claimed his identity was unknown to her and that she had never seen him before. She stated she asked the stranger who he was and what he wanted, and that by way of introduction he asked if she knew "JOHN" and when she said no he made reference to JOEL BARR and she replied that BARR was her former fiance. The stranger then stated by way of identifying himself that at one time he was going to help JOEL BARR go to Europe. VIVIAN stated that although she did not know this man she thought she could trust him as long as he was a friend of JOEL BARR.

ELEANOR GLASSMAN appeared at WISE's office and met PERL at which time WISE related the event of VIVIAN's mission to PERL. ELEANOR said she was unable to offer any information concerning VIVIAN's trip but that she subsequently conferred with VIVIAN and VIVIAN acknowledged that she had made the trip at the request of a man whom she did not know and therefore could not identify but that she declined to discuss the relationship of her Cleveland trip to the FBI.

ELEANOR GLASSMAN stated that she received one telephone call of a social nature thereafter from PERL and had a date with PERL in the latter part of September or in early October, 1950, at which time PERL told her he was keeping company with a girl in New York City whom he had formerly been acquainted with, and that he planned to marry her. He stated she had not seen PERL since he told her about this girl whom he did not identify.

Concerning JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, ELEANOR GLASSMAN stated that the ROSENBERGS were not friends of hers and that she was not certain whether or not she had ever met them and could not say definitely that she had or had not as she had casually met some of VIVIAN's friends. She stated that she and her sister did not travel in the same social circles but occasionally met each others friends and that she may have possibly met the ROSENBERGS but could not recall having done so.

She stated that she had visited VIVIAN GLASSMAN at 131 East 7th Street, New York City, on numerous occasions but does not recall meeting anyone there.

ELEANOR GLASSMAN was exhibited a group of photographs of individuals known to have been associated with VIVIAN GLASSMAN and she advised that JOEL BARR, ALFRED SARANT, ERNEST PATAKI and WILLIAM PERL were the only persons she had ever metamong the photographs which she stated she did not recognize were photographs of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and RUTH and DAVID GREENGLASS.

G. MISCELL, NEOUS INFORMATION

The "New York Herald Tribune", edition of December 9, 1953, carried an article which reads in part as follows:

"Judge JOHN W. CL.NCY denied an injunction yester-day (December 8, 1953) in United States District Court to a former woman employee of the Signal Corps at Ft. Monmouth, New Jersey, who sought to prevent Senator JOSEPH R. McCARTHY from calling her as a witness at open hearings of the investigation into alleged espionage at the vital radar base.

"Judge CL. NCY ruled that: 'the court does not have the power to enjoin such a body (The Senate Permanent Investigation Sub-Committee) from calling a witness in open session, therefore the motion is denied.

"Must honor subpoens.

of 144 Henry Street, Brooklyn, must honor the Sub-Committee subpoens and testify whenever called. Open hearings are now being held in Washington. Mrs. HUTNER, a former inspector at Ft. Monmouth, was identified by HOY M. COHN, Chief Counsel for the Sub-Committee, as a sister of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, named at the espionage trial of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG as a close associate of the executed spice.

"Mrs. HUTNER brought the suit further on the grounds that the Sub-Committee lacked the power 'to conduct any investigation into matters relating to espionage or subversive activities'. She said she had testified in closed sessions of the Sub-Committee and denied having committed espionage against the United States or having given classified material to any person unauthorized to receive them."

T-12, of known reliability, has advised that open session hearings were held by the McCarthy Hearings on December 15, 1953, at the United States District Court, Foley Square, New York, and among the witnesses appearing at the hearing was ELE/NOR HUTNER, lith Henry Street, Brooklyn, New York. According to the informant ELE/NOR HUTNER read a prepared statement concerning an objection to the McCarthy Committee's jurisdiction but she was interrupted by Senator McCaRThy who ruled that the statement was not pertinent.

Informant advised that in answer to the Committee's question AUTNER stated she had been employed at Ft. Monmouth in 1942-1943. She testified she did not handle classified material while employed there and did not know whether she had been cleared for access to secret or confidential material. She testified that her maiden name was ELEANOR GLASSMAN and that she is the sister of VIVIAN GLASSMAN. She invoked the Fifth Amendment in refusing to answer whether VIVIAN GLASSMAN was a member of the Communist Party while VIVIAN GLASSMAN was a member of the Communist o informant ELEANOR HUTNER invoked the Fifth Amendment in refusing to answer numerous questions which included the following:

- 1; Did JULIUS ROSENBERG discuss your employment at Mon-mouth with you?
- 2. Did JULIUS ROSENBERG suggest that you go to work at Monmouth?
- 3. Were you a member of the Communist Party with JULIUS ROSENBERG?
- 4. Were you a member of a Communist Party cell with JULIUS ROSHNBERG and VIVIAN GLASSMAN?
- 5: Whether she was a member of the Communist Party while at Ft. Monmouth.







II. COMMUNIST PARTY (CP) OR RELATED ACTIVITIES

A. BAY AREA COUNCIL SOBELL COMMITTEE:

A characterization of the Bay Area Council Sobell Committee (BACSC) is contained in the appendix page of this report.

The Subject attended a public affair sponsored by the BACSC held at the Town House Hotel, 8th and Market Streets, San Francisco on June 21, 1963. At this affair a film was shown explaining the SOBELL case. According to the speakers in the film, SOBELL was convicted on his brother-in-law DAVID GREENGLASS! testimony. GREENGLASS had testified that MORTON SOBELL one day thought that men were following him and he had a can of film which he thought he better get rid of pertaining to atomic information which he brought to the RBSENBERG's home. It was on this that SOBELL was convicted.

In the film SOBELL's wife explained their trip to Mexico prior to his arrest and stated that they had thought about leaving Mexico City and going to a foreign country under forged passport.

A new book on the ROSENBERG case was also reviewed briefly and some prose reportedly written by the ROSENBERGs before their execution was read.

BAY AREA COUNCIL OF SOBELL COMMITTEES aka Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, Northern California Council of Sobell Committees

A source advised on October 31, 1955, that the Bay Area Council of Sobell Committees (BACSC) was formed on October 17, 1955, in San Francisco, California, as the local affiliate of the National Sobell Committee, to carry out the policies of the National Committee to obtain the freedom of MORTON SOHELL.

On May 9, 1963, a second source advised that the BACSC has its headquarters at 345 Franklin Street, San Francisco, California, and is continuing to function and plan future Sobell affairs.

On December 18, 1959, a third source advised that MARY KRVAR, a member of the Warehouse Club, Communist Party (CP) East Bay Region, Oakland, California, and the paid organizer for the BACSC, has stated that the CP is interested in controlling the BACSC so that the BACSC will continue to follow the line of the National Sobell Committee in attempting to obtain the freedom of MORTON SOBELL.

APPENDIX

COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR MORTON SOBELL

"Following the execution of atomic spies Ethel and Julius Rosenberg in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell,' the Rosenbergs' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a communist front which has been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and 'then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case'..."

("Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" dated December 1, 1961, issued by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 116.)

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the current name, "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell," first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

- C. INFORMATION REGARDING SUBJECT'S MEETING WITH JULIUS ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR AND ALFRED SARANT

MAX RLITCHER, 164-18 72nd Avenue, Flushing, New York, has advised agents of the FBI that he was a member of the Communist Party, Washington D.C., from the latter part of 1939 until the summer of 1948. From the fall of 1942 to June, 1948 of the aforementioned period he was a member of the Navy Department cell of the Communist Party. He has admitted being approached about June, 1944 by JULIUS ROSENBERG for recruitment into Soviet espionage and subsequently on several other occasions up to May, 1948. MAX KLITCHER has also advised he was a college associate at the College of the City of New York of JULIUS ROSENBERG, MORTON SOERL and WILLIAM PERL. HELENE ELITCHER, wife of MAX ELITCHER, has advised agents of the FBI that she was a member of the May Department cell of the Communist Party from the end of 1943 until March, 1946. She subsequently was a member of the housewives group of the Communist Party during 1947 and until she moved to New York City in September, 1948. She has stated she met JULIUS ROSENBERG for the first time in approximately 1944 and saw him on several social occasions thereafter in company with her husband.

MAX and HELRNE ELITCHER advised SAS VINCENT J. CARTLE and ROBERT P. ROYAL in September, 1950 that during the summer of 19hh they met JULIUS ROSENBERG at the sorner of 6th Avenue and 42nd Street, New York City. At that time they were accompanied by MAX ELITCHER's sister-in-law, RUTH ALSCHER. They were subsequently joined by WILLIAM PERL and an individual in an army uniform who was introduced to them as WILLIAM PERL's younger brother. They believed his name was SAM but could not make a positive statement or identify a photograph of SAMUEL PERL, but they were positive he was introduced as WILLIAM PERL's younger brother.

Fernos, 236 Rast 52nd Street, New York City, but because theywere not properly dressed were not admitted. They then walked to the Bird In Hand Restaurant located at 1659 Broadway, New York City, and had dinner. Sometime during dinner or shortly thereafter the RLITCHERS recalled that JULIUS ROSENBERG made a telephone call to JOEL BARR and a short time later JOEL BARR joined the group at the restaurant. BARR invited the group to his apartment which was located off Broadway in the vicinity of 100th Street. (It is to be noted that JOEL BARR resided at 241 West 97th Street, New York City, located near Broadway.) They recalled that the group walked up Broadway to Columbus Circle, went inside Central Park, and sat down on the grass for a short time. Thereafter they boarded a streetcar at Columbus Circle and Broadway and rode to a stop near BARR's home.

The ELITCHERS recalled that BARR lived in a penthouse type apartment which had an outside terrace. They spent a good deal of the time out on the terrace playing records, dancing, eating and engaging in general conversation. At approximately midnight with the group still consisting of JULIUS ROSENBERG, MAX ELITCHER, HELENE ELITCHER, RUTH ALSCHER, WILLIAM PERL, SAMUEL PERL and JOEL BARR, they left BARR's home and took a taxi to 65 Morton Street, Greenwich Village, New York, where a friend of BARR's named AL SARANT was then residing. The ELITCHERS recalled that they dropped RUTH ALSCHER off at her home enroute to SARANT's residence. The ELITCHERS recalled that SARANT resided on the fifth or sixth floor of a walk-up apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York

City. They could not recall whether JOEL BARR had a key to the apartment or whether SARANT admitted them; however, when they entered the apartment they were introduced to AL SARANT who appeared to have just arisen from bed. SARANT entertained them for a short while playing his guitar. After this the group left the apartment and separated, MAX and HELENE ELITCHER going home.

MAX and HRLENE ELITCHER could not recall whether SAMUEL PERL was introduced to JULIUS ROSENBERG or was previously acquainted with him.

RUTH ALSCHER was interviewed on several occasions concerning this meeting but was uncooperative.

T-3, of known reliability, advised that WILLIAM PERL, 104 East 36th Street, New York City, received correspondence from SAMUEL PERL on August 20, 1950, and August 13, 1952. According to T-3 SAMUEL PERL's addresses were:

August 20, 1950 - SAMUEL PERL, American Express, Hlszer Strasse 9 Wien IX Vienna, Austria

August 13, 1952 - SAMUEL PERL, American Express, Carrera, San Geronimo Madrid, Spain

JULIUS ROSKNBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBEL

JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBEL were found guilty in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, for Conspiracy to Committ Espionage in behalf of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic on March 29, 1951. On April 5, 1941, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were sentenced to death and MORTON SOBEL to 30 years imprisonment. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed June 19, 1953, at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, and MORTON SOBEL is presently serving his 30 year sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

WILLIAM PERL

WILLIAM PERL was convicted of two counts of perjury on May 22, 1953, in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, to wit denying before a Southern District of New York, to wit denying before a Southern Grand Jury that he was acquainted with JULIUS Federal Grand Jury that he was acquainted with JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBEL. On June 5, 1953, WILLIAM PERL was sentenced to five years imprihonment and is presently serving his sentence in the United States Ponitentiary, Terra Haute, Indiana.

ALFRED SARAHT

ALFRED SARANT on July 26, 1950, advised Sas HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN and ROBERT F. ROYAL that he resided at 65 Morton Street, Apartment 6-I, New York City, from October, 1943 to September, 1946 and he subsequently sub-lessed his apartment to JOEL BARR and WILLIAM PERL.

The records of Consolidated Edison Company, New York City, were checked by SA ALEXANDER C. BURLINSON on July 25, 1950, at which time it was noted that ALFRED SARANT, 65 Morton Street, Apartment 6-I, utilized facilities of this company (gas and electricity) from October 2, 1943, to February 1, 1950.

T-4, of unknown reliability, advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that ALFRED SARANT was a member of his espionage apparatus. T-4 added that JULIUS ROSENBERG also told him that SARANT was safe in Europe.

Merrick, Baldwin, Long Island, advised on August 4, 1950, that ALFRED SARANT had been visiting his relatives at Baldwin, Long Island, in the latter part of July, 1950. During this visit he was joined by one takes DAYTON, Mife of WENDELL BRUCE DAYTON, a next door neighbor at Ithaca, New York. It is to be noted that ALFRED SARANT during this period of time was residing in Ithaca, New York. According to Mrs. JAYSON, ALFRED SARANT and CAROL DAYTON departed from Baldwin, Long Island, on August 4, 1950, to return to their

respective homes in Ithaca, New York, but apparently their itenarary was changed at this point and instead of returning to Ithaca they proceeded in SARANT's automobile to the home of Mr. and Mrs. DONALD JAMES HAINES, 2805 Drahman Street, Tucson, Arisons, arriving there on August 7, 1950.

It is to be noted that DONALD HAINES was formerly married to CAROL DAYTON's sister who is now deceased.

Mrs. HAINES and CAROL DAYTON went to the Mexican Consulate in Tucson, Arizons, on August 8, 1950, where CAROL DAYTON obtained two visitors permits under the name of CAROL DAYTON and BHUCE DAYTON in order that CAROL DAYTON and ALFRED SARANT might enter Mexico. On August 9, 1950, Mrs. HAINES advised that she and her husband drove ALFRED SARANT and CAROL DAYTON from Tucson, Arizons, to Hermosillo, Mexico, in Mr. HAINES: 1950 Buick. They left SARANT and CAROL DAYTON at the Di Anzo Hotel in Hermosillo and returned to Tucson, Arizons, the same day.

JOEL BARR

DAVID GREENGLASS in July, 1950 advised SAs JOHN W.
LEWIS and LEO H. FRUTKIN that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him
in February, 1950 that JOEL BARR had left the United States
in 1948 to do espionage work for the Russians in Europe and
that BARR had been one of ROSENBERG's espionage contacts.
GREENGLASS also stated that JOEL BARR was a close friend of
JULIUS ROSENBERG.

T-4 advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that JOKL BARR was a courier for the Russians and was in Europe.

DAVID GREENGLASS and RUTH GREENGLASS

DAVID GREENGLASS and his wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, have advised that they were recruited to work in the Soviet espionage apparatus by JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. ETHEL

ROSENBERG is the sister of DAVID GREENGLASS. DAVID GREENGLASS was sentenced on April 6, 1951, in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, to 15 years imprisonment after entering a plea of guilty to Conspiracy to Committ Espionage. He is currently serving sentence in the United States Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania.

D. INTERVIEWS OF SAMUEL PERL

T-5, of known reliability, advised that he interviewed SAMUEL PERL on July 29, 1950, at Paris, France, and that PERL furnished him the following information:

SAMURL PERL had met JOEL BARR through PERL's brother, WILLIAM PERL, in New York City, about 1939. This was at a music recital in a private residence in New York City and WILLIAM PERL was present. SAMUEL PERL could not recall exactly where this recital had taken place but believed that it may have been in JOEL BARR's apartment.

SAMUEL PERL stated that JOEL BARR and WILLIAM PERL were friends, both having gone to the College of the City of New York at the same time and later having done graduate work at Columbia University. Prior to SAMUEL PERL's going to Europe in September, 1949 and knowing that JOEL BARR was in Paris, SAMUEL PERL wrote BARR that he intended to be in Paris studying music and advised him as to when he expected to arrive. BARR met SAMUEL PERL at the railroad station in Paris in September, 1949 and took him to live with him at his quarters in a private residence, 16 Rue de la Pelcuse, Neuilly - Plaisance (Seine et Oise) in the suburbs of Paris.

SAMUEL PERL stated that prior to going to Europe he had not seen BARR more than six or seven times in the United States and that BARR on these occasions was always in the company of WILLIAM PERL.

SAMURL PERL continued that he lived with BARR at this residence for about three weeks but found it so inconveniently located from the city and being without personal transportation he decided to move to Paris. His first address was 53

Rue Notre Dame de Lorette, Paris, and he later moved to 81 Rue Maubeuge, his address at that time. FERL stated he saw very little of BARR after he, PERL, moved into Paris and explained that they were attending different music schools and lived far removed from each other.

SAMUEL PERL continued that in April, 1950 he received a letter from his brother WILLIAM dated April 26, 1950, in which WILLIAM PERL advised that during an Atomic Energy Applicant investigation by the FBI allegations were made that he, WILLIAM, had connections with Communists including JOEL BARR and ALFRED SARANT and as a result WILLIAM PERL's loyalty was being rechecked. At that time WILLIAM PERL was employed by the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, Cleveland, Ohio. WILLIAM PERL requested SAMUEL PERL to interview JOEL BARR regarding this matter and especially to determine the whereabouts of SARANT. SAMUEL PERL stated that the allegations against his brother came as a complete surprise to him and that he had never received any information that his brother or any of his associates were Communistically inclined.

SAMUEL PERL stated that he interviewed JOEL BARR when they met in the student's restaurant and BARR denied he had ever been a Communist but did admit that he had been discharged from a Civil Service job in the Federal Government due to a false accusation on the part of the Government that he was a Communist. BARR told PERL that in his opinion he got a "raw deal". BARR told PERL he left the United States because he could not get a job in private industry or in government service after being black-listed as a Communist.

SAMUEL PERL stated that he last saw JOEL BARR in the Students Cite Club, Paris, on or about June, 1950. At that time BARR advised PERL he was leaving Paris and talked about wanting to sell his motorbike. PERL expressed an interest in buying the motorbike but BARR discouraged him, saying he did not want to sell it to a friend, saying that it was not in good mechanical condition and would cause too much trouble to keep it in running order. PERL asked BARR where he was going and the latter replied to the effect that it would be better if PERL did not know his intended destination. PERL stated that since BARR left Paris some of the music students who knew him have asked if he knew BARR's whereabouts and

have advised PERL that they have not received any word from him.

On December 18, 1950, SAMUEL FERL was again interviewed by T-5 and FERL advised he had no further information as to where BARR had gone or the reason for his mysterious disappearance

On July 15 and 16, 1951, PERL was again interviewed by T-5. At this time SAMUEL PERL denied knowing MAX and HELENE ELITCHER and RUTH ALSCHER. He denied ever having attended a dinner in the Bird In Hand Restaurant, New York City.

Relative to WILLIAM PERL's use of the Apartment at 65 Morton Street, SAMUEL PERL stated that he did not recall that his brother WILLIAM was actually renting the apartment from BARR, at least he did not think it was rented on a commercial basis as it was not WILLIAM PERL's habitual residence. PERL stated he used the apartment to entertain girlfriends when his brother permitted him to do so. SAMUEL PERL stated he had attended several soirees at JOEL BARR's residence which was in BARR's mother's residence. This address he recalled was in the vicinity of 97th Street in New York City. soirees he attended at BARR's place were musical affairs and took place in the penthouse. He recalled that BARR had a good record player and many good records and that he, SAMUEL PERL, attended probably four of these affairs. He denied being in the company of his brother WILLIAM when it was alleged that SAMUEL and WILLIAM PERL and several others visited at the roof garden apartment of JOEL BARR. He stated he did not know JULIUS ROSENBERG and advised that he could not recognize photographs of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG when they were exhibited to him. PERL further stated he did not know ALFRED SARANT but admitted he had been in the SARANT apartment on several occasions in 1947.

SAMUEL PRRL was re-interviewed in Paris, France, on October 1 and 2, 1951, by T-5. PERL reiterated his previous contention that he did not remember having attended a dinner party at the Bird In Hand Restaurant in New York City. He denied knowledge of the existence of such a restaurant in

New York City and reiterated his previous denials of acquaintances with the other individuals previously mentioned except JOEL BARR. He stated he has had no contact with JOEL BARR since the spring of 1950 in Paris and had no knowledge of BARR's whereabouts.

SAMUEL PERL indicated that he planned to remain in Paris, France, during the academic year 1951-1952 in order to continue his musical studies,

During the interview SAMUEL PERL remarked that he holds his older brother WILLIAM in special esteem as compared to other members of his immediate family, indicating he would be extremely reluctant to furnish any data which might be harmful to his brother.

T-1, of known reliability, advised that JOEL BARR of 553 Hopkinsen Avenue, Brocklyn, New York, was a Communist petition signer of number 2133 for PHIER CAGCHIONE dated August 9, 1939, 23rd Assembly District, of the 25th Election District.

Mr. NATHAN SUSSMAN, 56-55'205th Street, Bayside, Long Island, New York, advised SAS BURT S. TAYLOR and ROBERT F. ROYAL that in the latter half of 1942 a branch known as 16B of the Industrial Division, Communist Party, USA was organized. He stated that either JULIUS ROSENHERG, convicted Soviet espionage agent, or JOEL BARR had invited him to become a member of this branch. In instant interview conducted on March 30, 1951 SUSSMAN advised he recalled that 16B had a farewell party in 1944. He recalled that JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR and others, including himself and his wife, attended this private dimer.

On March 27, 1951 ISRAEL L. TANNENHAUM was interviewed by SAS TAYLOR and ROYAL. He stated that he had been active in the Young Communist League at Cooper Union Cellege where he graduated in June 1939. In 1942 he was invited to join a study or discussion group of the Communist Party

and meetings of this group were held at JULIUS MOSENEERO'S apartment at 10 Monroe Street, New York City. TANNENBAUM identified a photograph of JOKL BARR as among those why were active in this Communist Party sell, which he believed was known as branch 165.

The Young Communist League has been designated by the Atterney General pursuant to Executive Order 10650s /

agent new serving a fifteen year sentence at the United States Femiteatiary, Lewisburg, Femnsylvania, having pied guilty to a conspiracy to commit espionage charge, in an interview conducted July 17, 1950 by SAS JOHN W. LEWIS and LEO H. FRUTKIN, advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG came to him and told him he would have to leave the country. ROSENBERG, according to CHEKNGLASS, was a Soviet agent and recruited GREENGLASS to do espionage work for the hussians. ROSENBERG on several occasions told GREENGLASS to leave the country and said that more important persons than GREENGLASS had left the country already such as JOEL BARR who had left before KLAUS FUCHS had been arrested in England. According to GREENGLASS, ROSENBERG told him that BARR was doing work for the Russians overseas. He believed BARR left the country around 1949, and that JULIUS ROSENBERG had told him that BARR had been one of RUSENBERG'S espionage contacts in the United States and was sent to Europe to do espionage work there for the Russian government.

T-3, of unknown reliability, but who was friendly with JULIUS ROSENBERG, advised in various interviews that ROSENBERG had told him that JOEL BARR was a courier for the Russians and in 1950 was in Europe where he was working for the Russian government.

On April 6, 1951 JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife, ETHEL ROSENBERG, were sentenced to death in the Federal Court, Southern District of New York, for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were executed on June 19, 1953.

Dr. EDWARD TELLER is presently the Assistant Director for Weapon Development of the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory, University of California, Los Alamos, New Mexico. The Los Alamos Laboratory is the principal Atomic Energy Commission facility for weapon development and in his position, Dr. TELLER has complete information concerning all past and advanced plans for development of Atomic and Hydrogen Bombs. He is probably better informed concerning Hydrogen and Atomic development than any other person in the Atomic Energy program at the present time. Information has been received that Dr. TELLER may be a member of the Communist Party and that if this is true, he could furnish the Russian Government with almost, if not all, of this country's Atomic Energy secrets.

The purpose of this letter is to summarize available information indicating that TELLER may be a member of the Communist Party or sympathetic towards Communism and to set out certain leads in an attempt to establish Communist smypathies on the part of TELLER. In view of TELLER's position, it is believed imperative that he be identified or eliminated as being identical with the EDWARD TELLER whose name appeared on the roster of teachers of the Workers' School in New York City in 1941.

EDWARD TELLER was born on January 15, 1908, at Budapest, Hungary. He was naturalized March 4, 1941, at Washington, D.C. He was employed as a physicist by the University of California at Los Alamos, New Mexico, from April 1, 1943, to January 31, 1946, at which time he terminated and went to the University of Chicago. He continued that he was deeply concerned about the war situation because of the attitude of Russia and that his fear about what the present tension or what the war might result in led him to lay aside his work at the University of Chicago for a year or so and to return to Los Alamos to assist in the Atomic Energy program. He stated that he felt in returning to Los Alamos he did not want to be in the position where he felt he could not read anything about Russia or Communism or Communist publications as he wanted to know as much about the developments in Communism and what was going on in Russia. Further, he did not want to be placed in the position where he could not associate with his friends who had definite political views or if they were sympathetic towards Communism, as he did not discuss his work and Atomic Energy with anyone who was not cleared for such discussion,

On February 14, 1950, Mrs. AUGUSTA TELLER was interviewed concerning EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS who has simitted Soviet Espionage activities. She advised at that time that in the latter part of November 1945 she had made a trip with FUCHS and Mr. and Mrs. RUDLOPE PETERELS to Mexico City. She also stated in November 1947, at which time FUCHS was back in the United States he had had dinner at her home on two occasions in Chicago, Illinois.

Dr. EDWARD TELLER was also interviewed concerning FUCHS on February 14, 1950, at which time he advised that he had first met FUCHS at Los Alamos in 1944 and that he had had some business and social contact with him during the time FUCHS was at Los Alamos. TELLER stated that he was in England during the summer 1949 and that he saw a lot of FUCHS at that time. He stated FUCHS had. met him at the American Embassy in London shortly after TELLER's arrival in England and that later they had official contact at Harwell. One evening during TELLER's stay at Harwell, he had spent several hours with FUCHS at FUCH's flat.

THEODORE ALVIN/HALL has been identified as a Soviet Expionage agent while at the Los Alamos Project.

THEODORE ALVIN HALL gave the name of EDWARD TELLER as a reference at the time he applied for Federal Security Agency Fellowship #2218 on December 18, 1949. In a letter dated January 24, 1950, EDWARD TELLER stated that he had been acquainted with RALL for a few years both in the Los Alamos Laboratory and

TELLER stated that he next saw TISZA in 1940 or 1941 when TISZA came to the UnitedStates and lived with TELLER for a period of about two months in Washington, D.C. TISZA later obtained a position at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, Massachusetts. TELLER concluded that he was as sure as anyone could be that TISZA is no longer interested in Communism and, in fact, is definitely against it.

During the same interview, TEILER advised that he was closely acquainted with one DEAN BURK in Washington, D.C., from 1935 to 1941, at which time BURK was employed as a biologist at the Fixed Nitrogen Laboratory of the United States Department of Agriculture. TELLER stated he did not know whether BURK was ever a member of the Communist Party but that BURK would have clear-cut Russian sympathies and was always supporting the foreign policy of Russia. BURK was particularly strong in his defense of Russia's entering into a pact with Germany in 1939. TELLER stated that he felt that BURK is a straight-forward honest individual even though he is sympathetic towards Communism, would not do anything to injure the United States.

Subject TELLER is at the present time very outspoken against Russia, which appears strange in view of TELLER's position in the Atomic Energy set-up and in view of the fact that his and his wife's parents, as well as other relatives, are presently in Hungary under Russian domination.

During all the time that TELLER has worked at Los Alamos, he has made frequent trips away from the Project and was in New York City on a number of occasions during the latter part of 1944 and the first part of 1945 during the same period that DAVID ERFENGLASS and THEODORE ALVIN HALL were being recruited as Soviet Espionage Agents.

LEWIS dated June 26, 1950 at New York reflects that the name of HENRY LINSHITZ, 880 West 181st Street, New York appeared in a small telephone book which was found in the GREENGLASS apartment by SA LEO FRUTKIN during a search of that apartment on June 15, 1950.

Report of SA LEO H. FRUTKIN dated August 5, 1950 at New York in the GREENGLASS case relates that GREENGLASS said HENRY LINSHITZ was one of the physicists employed at Los Alamos, Atom Bomb Project, and whom he understood was inclined to Leftist tendencies politically.

During an interview with GREENGLASS, conducted by SA FRUTKIN on August 22, August 31, and September 1, 1950 in case entitled, "JULIUS ROSENBERG; ETHEL ROSENBERG, was., ESPIONAGE-R", GREENGLASS said he has no actual basis to substantiate his previous statement as to LINSCHITZ' Leftist tendencies.

GREENGLASS advised SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON on August 31, 1950 that he believed he gave the name of Dr. HENRY LINSCHUTZ (LINSCHITZ) to HARRY GOLD as a possible recruit at Los Alamos.

In his statment made to United States Attorney NYLES J. IANE, Southern District of New York, in the presence of SA WILLIAM F. NORTON on August 4, 1950, CREENGLASS mentioned the name of Dr. LINSHITZ as among scientists who discussed various component parts of bombs at various times. This information is contained in report of SA JOHN W. LEWIS dated September 26, 1950 at New York in the GREENGLASS case.

The New York indices fail to reflect any comments made by HARRIGOLD concerning HENRY LINSCHITZ.

The above information is furnished by letter rather than report inasmuch as it concerns DAVID GREENGLASS and HARRY GOLD, subjects of major espionage cases.

DAVID CREENCLASS, who has been convicted of Soviet espionage, advised agents of the FBI that he had furnished the names of eighteen or nineteen potential espionage recruits at Los Alamos to JULIUS ROSENBERG and HARRY GOID, both of whom have been convicted of Soviet espionage. GREENGLASS said that he did not know that any of the potential recruits mentioned by him were Communist but that he had learned through either working with them or living with them in the barracks at Los Alamos, or both, that they were liberal and believed in a welfare state. One of the names was that of THOMAS ALIAN FINEBERG.

A report of the Seditious Activities Investigation Commission of the Illinois State Legislature prepared in 1948 by Mr. CHARLES E. KRUGER, contained information pertaining to members of the Communist Club at the University of Chicago. This information includes the following:

On March 26, 1951, Confidential Informant 7-7, of unknown reliability, advised that he had formerly lived in the same barracks as subject CREENGIASS at Los Alames. He stated that NORMAN (REENSPAN, WILLIAM STINUEL and CREENGIASS lived in the same corner of the barracks and associated with each other almost continuously. He stated that they were all filthy in their personal habits and that most of the other men in the barracks had little to do with them. He stated that another associate of CREENGIASS at Los Alamos was THOMAS A FINEBERG. He advised that FINEBERG bragged about the fact that he was a liberal and had stated that he had a let of the same ideas as the Communist. FINEBERG also commented that he had his ideas first and that the fact that they coincided with the ideas of the Communist was an accident. T-7 said that he had heard that at one time while FINEBERG was in the United States Army he had made a trip through the south and had demanded that he be allowed to bit in the Negre cars on trains.

T-7 vaguely recalled that when either FINEBERG or CREENGIASS would read an article in some magazine, they would call it to the other's attention and discuss the articles with each other.

During an interview with SAS DONALD G. HARRIS and JAMES H. HIGDON, JR. during August, 1950, JAVNA advised that he had been acquainted with JULIUS ROSENBERG when they were classmates at City College of New York. He stated that at that time he knew ROSENBERG only casually. JAVNA advised that he formed his company, the Magnetic Devices Corporation, during 1945 and obtained a sub-contract to manufacture solenoid parts for the Curtiss-Wright Propeller Division of Caldwell, New Jersey. JAVNA stated that his company was first located in Elmhurst, New York, moved to 232 Broad Avenue, Palisades Park, New Jersey, and then to 101-103 South Van Brunt Street, Englewood, New Jersey.

JAVNA advised that sometime in the summer of 1946, JULIUS ROSENBERG visited him at his apartment at 131 East 7th Street, New York City. At this time, JAVNA stated ROSENBERG advised JAVNA that he and his brother-in-law, DAVID GREENGLASS, owned and operated the G and R Engineering Company on the lower east side of Manhattan, and were engaged in machine shop operations. JAVNA stated that prior to August, 1946, he wisited the G and R Engineering Company, at which time he met DAVID GREENGLASS for the first time.

JAVNA advised that during 1946, he gave a purchase order to the G and R Engineering Company for the manufacture of caps and cores.

JAVNA advised that his dealings with the G and R Engineering Company lasted from approximately August, 1946 until February or March of 1948 when, because of the unsatisfactory work done by this company, he decided to manufacture the entire solenoid including caps and cores himself.

ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG were convicted for conspiracy to commit espionage against the United States Government and were executed at Sing Sing Prison on June 19, 1953:

DAVID GREENGLASS was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury for the Southern District of New York on October 10, 1950 for conspiracy to commit espionage. GREENGLASS entered a plea of guilty to this indictment on October 18, 1950 in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, and was sentenced on April 6, 1951 to fifteen years in a penal institution by Federal Judge IRVING R. KAUFMAN.





DAVID GREENGLASS, 265 Rivington Street, New York City, advised the writer that while he was a member of the United States Army he was assigned to the Los Alamos project in July or August, 1944, under Mr. FITZPATRICK, who was the section leader. He recalled that he worked in the machine shop at Los Alamos, and that on one occasion he had some work done on an uranium hemisphere in this shop, which work was performed by CHARLES SHROEDER. He stated that he looked and touched this piece of uranium hemisphere out of curiosity, but that he never had any in his possession, and he never removed any uranium hemispheres or normal uranium from the Los Alamos project.

He stated that he saw hemispheres of various sizes in the technical area and in the laboratories which he believes were probably referred to

URPOSE:

To recommend that a preliminary inquiry be conducted on the appointee who is related to a subject in a pending Espionage case.

BACKGROUND:

A loyalty form has been received concerning the appointee and a check of the Bureau files reflects that she is related to Anne Hanusiak Idorovich, a subject in the case entitled "Michael AlexandriaxSidorovich, with aliases, Anne Hanusiak Sidorovich, Espionage -R,

Bureau files indicate that in an interview with David and Ruth Greenglass it was determined that Anne Sidorovich was the individual who was originally scheduled to contact Ruth in Albuquerque, New Mexico, to secure information from David for Julius Rosenberg. Actually, Harry Gold made the contact. It was also indicated that Michael Sidorovich may have been photographing material for the Soviets in 1944. When interviewed and also when testifying before a Federal Grand Jury the Sidorovichs denied engaging in Espionage and also denied knowing William Farl, an individual believed to be involved in the Rosenberg Network. Consideration is presently being given to prosecuting the Sidorovichs for perjury because of their denying Parl.

During the course of interviews conducted with David Greenglass following his arrest for espionage he told of two lists of names he prepared of potential espionage recruits who were employed by the Manhattan Engineer District at Los Alamos, New Mexico. Ne said there were 18 or 19 individuals included on the two lists. The first list he gave to Harry Gold at Albuquerque, New Mexico, in June, 1945. The second list he gave to Julius Rosenberg in New York City.

Greenglass said he did not know that any of the potential recruits listed by him were Communists but that he had learned through either working or living with them at the barracks at Los Alamos that "they were liberal and believed in a welfare state."

Harry Gold when interviewed recalled he did receive a written report from Greenglass at Albuquerque, New Mexico, in June, 1945. He believes the report did include a list of names. He does not recall the names on the list and the only information he can furnish with respect to the names is that the complete report was turned over to Anatoli A. Yakovlev, his Soviet espionage superior. He does not know of any action taken by the Soviets with respect to the names.

III. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

At Ios Alamos, New Mexico

The files of the Atomic Energy Commission Records Center reflect that the appointee was a soldier in the Special Engineer Detachment, Manhattan Engineer District, U. S. Army Engineers, and stationed at Ios Alamos, New Maxico, from January 1945 to March 7, 1946. While stationed at Ios Alamos, he was assigned to work in the Ios Alamos Scientific Laboratory.

There were approximately fifteen barracks occupied by soldiers in the Special Engineer Detachment at Los Alamos, and no record could be found in the Atomic Energy Commission Records Center as to the barracks in which the appointee resided while at Los Alamos.

JAMES S. CHURCH, Section Leader, Ios Alamos Scientific Laboratory, and a former member of the Special Engineer Detachment at Los Alamos, advised that the appointée had worked under him while at Los Alamos. He continued that to the best of his recollection, the appointee appeared to be loyal to the United States and to believe in the democratic form of government as practiced in the United States. CHURCH stated that he bases this opinion on the fact that the appointee appeared to have little, if any, interest in politics or foreign affairs, and certainly did not make any remarks indicating disloyalty to the United States or favoring any foreign governments. CHURCH also stated that he was acquainted with DAVID EMERNIASS, who was convicted of espionage in early 1951, while CREENGIASS was a soldier at Los Alamos, and that although the appointee was acquainted with CHEENGIASS as a fellow soldier the same as he, CHURCH, was, he never considered the appointee to be a friend or associate of CREENGIASS.

CHURCH also advised that he believes the appointee resided in "E" barracks while at Los Alamos, but that undoubtedly he had lived in several barracks, as had all the soldiers at Los Alamos.

Dear

I regret exceedingly that I am not able to sign this letter (what follows will indicate the reasons why).

I think it my duty to tell you what follows, at this moment when general war threatens to break out.

They are about to nominate to the War Department Mrs.

Anna Rosenberg. This is a case - as you doubtless know better
than I - of a Jewish woman originally from Hungary. She keeps
indirect relations with two Hungarian Ministers: Hakos. (real
name, Bosenkranz) and Erno Gero (real name, Singer), both are
Jews. Mrs. Anna Rosenberg may also be corresponding through
persons in Israel with Anna Pauker, Minister of Foreign Affairs
in Bucharest, also a Jew. The latter's father and brother are
established in Israel.

Conclusion: atomic espionage has been practised, as you know, by Kurt Fuchs, David Green lass, Sidney Wolnbaum, Prof. Pontecorvo, etc., all without a single exception Jews.

Even as I write you these lines, the Russians are getting possession (after having gained atomic secrets, thanks to the above mentioned spies) of information concerning the American Department of War, thanks to Mrs. Ama Rosenberg.

If you think, ... that this letter is addressed to you by a madman, throw it in the fire; if not, please consider the information given you by one who is au courant of what is going on. Is there not in the United States a single genuine American who could be nominated Under Secretary in the Department of Mar, especially at a time like this through which we are passing.

II. BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION

This investigation was conducted based on information received from DAVID GREENGLASS that he, GREENGLASS, at the request of JULIUS ROSENBERG, compiled lists of individuals whom he believed ideologically suited for recruitment into the Soviet Espionage System, who were employed at the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project, New Mexico. Included within these lists was the name of WILLIAM SPINDEL.

Concerning DAVID GREENGLASS, on January 31, 1951, the Federal Grand Jury for the Southern District of New York, handed down a second superseding indictment charging DAVID GREENGLASS with conspiracy to commit espionage between June 6, 1944 and June 16, 1950.

On February 2, 1951 DAVID GREENGLASS entered a plea of guilty to the indictment handed down on January 31, 1951, before United States District Judge, HENRY W. GODDARD of the Southern District of New York.

Concerning JULIUS ROSENBERG, he was convicted in the Federal District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, on charges of espionage. He was sentenced to death by Federal Judge, IRVING B. KAUFMAN on April 5, 1952. This sentence was upheld by the United States District Circuit Court of Appeals on February 25, 1952. After various unsuccessfu appeals, JULIUS ROSENBERG was convicted on June 19, 1953.

III. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

In 1951, during the course of a previous investigated conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, DAVID GREENGLASS was interviewed and he advised that at the request of JULIUS ROSENBERG, he compiled lists of individuals working at the Los Alamos Atom Bomb Project in 1944 and 1945, whom he believed to be ideologically suited for recruitment into the Soviet Espionage System.

GREENGLASS stated that he furnished these lists, one to JULIUS ROSENBERG in January of 1945 and the other to another individual on June 3, 1945, but is unable to recall which names were included in which lists. He said that he did not know that any of the potential recruits mentioned by him were Communists but that he had learned through either working with them or living with them in the barracks at Los Alamos, New Mexico, or both, that they were "liberal" and believed in a "Welfare State". He stated that some names are included in both lists. Included within these lists was the name of WILLIAM SPINDEL.

DAVID GREENGLASS further advised that WILLIAM SPINDEL impressed him as a "leftist", but he was unable to state whether he was a member of the Communist Party. He advised that as far as he knew WILLIAM SPINDEL was unknown to JULIUS ROSENBERG.

DAYID GREENGLASS further advised that his wife came to Albuquerque, New Mexico in about February of 1945. She had difficulty in finding a place to live, so resided for a while with the wife of WILLIAM SPINDEL on West Coal Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico. DAVID GREENGLASS stated that his wife subsequently moved to 209 North High Street, Albuquerque, New Mexico. He further mentioned that he, WILLIAM SPINDEL, and a tall red-headed fellow had been partners in the purchase of an automobile.

DAVID GREENGLASS further advised that Mrs. SARA SPINDEL had been active in the American Student Union, at one time.







cousin and would possibly have some information
concerning friends of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG at
Knickerbocker Village.

Mrs. ESTHER ENDE was contacted in 1951 and advised that she has lived in Knickerbocker Village since about 1953 but that she never associated with JULIUS or ETHEL ROSENBERG. She stated she knows who they are and has been them on the street. She also observed that she seldom saw JULIUS or ETHEL with any neighbors in the house and those people she did observe them with were unknown to her.

On February 2, 1951, DAVID GREENGLASS plead guilty to an indictment charging DAVID GREENGLASS and others with conspiracy to commit espionage in behalf of the Soviet Union and on April 6, 1951, was sentenced to 15 years imprisonment on this charge. He was given a Conditional Release on November 16, 1960.

His wife, RUTH GREENGLASS, was named as a coconspirator but not, a defendant in the above mentioned indictment.

ETHEL GREENGLASS ROSENBERG, sister of DAVID GREENGLASS, and her husband, JULIUS ROSENBERG, were convited on March 29, 1951 of conspiracy to commit espionage in behalf of the Soviet Union. On April 5, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were sentenced to death JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Singuisting Prison. Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953.



Mr. Rogge said that Greenglass had been cooperative when questioned last Thursday by staff members of the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations at the Federal Prison at Lewisburg, Pa. He added however, that the Federal Bureau of Investigation had covered in great detail every subject explored by the subcommittee.

Toward the close of the two-hour interrogation, Mr. Rogge said, Warden G. W. Humphrey, who was present throughout, observed that the prisoner had told the same story many times before to the F.B. IV







FREDERICK PALMER WEBER was helping advise business men on economic affairs from the fall of 1951 until Dec. 1952 as a research economist employed by the American Management Counsel, Inc...which makes marketing analyses, location studies and does other types of research for business firms.

WEBER recently appeared before the Internal Security subcommittee in its probe of Communist infiltration of Congressional committee staffs.

He first refused to answer on grounds of self-incrimination all questions about his Communist activities prior to Jan, 1951. He later refused to answer questions about his Communist associations since that time.

WEBER was on the staff of three Congressional committees between 1940 and 1943. He did advisory and research work for a Senate Military Affairs subcommittee, the Senate Committee on Education and Labor and the House Committee on Interstate Migratory Labor.

from 1946 to 1948. At the same time he was research director of the Mat'l

Office and Professional Workers of America which was ousted from the CIO in
1950 as Communist-controlled.

WEBER has been an official of several Communist fronts. He was an advisory associate of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, the biggest and most successful front operation of the Communist Party (CP) in the South. He served on the board of directors of People's Songs, the party's own entertainment agency. He was a member of the initiating committee of a conference on civil, labor and minority rights staged by the CP's Civil Rights Congress. During the 1948 election campaign he was the representative of the Communist-directed Progressive Party in eleven states in the South.
