STANG stated he was assigned to the Ordnance Division. He advised that instant division was separate and spart from the area in which the Subject worked, and further stated that he did not live in the same barracks as did GREENGLASS. STANG stated he knew GREENGLASS casually by sight but did not know him particularly by name and that he had no knowledge regarding his activities at Los Alamos.

SIDNEY IANCIT, 28 Bedford Terrace, Irvington, New Jersey, employed as Sales Manager, Iorstan Studio, 850 Broad Street, Boom 405, Newark, New Jersey, advised he was stationed at Ios Alamos as a technician, third class, from April or May 1944 to November 1945 when he received his Army discharge. IANCIT stated he worked in the Explosives Research Group. LANCIT further stated he did not work or live in the same area as did GREENGLASS.

HENRY SUMMERFORD, Manager, Savage Oil Company, 720 South Florence, residing 4201 Pershing Drive, both El Paso, Texas, furnished the following information when interviewed on November 20, 1950:

One day last summer, he and his sister, Mrs. UIL LANE, residing 626 North Alameda Street, Las Cruces, New Mexico, were discussing various Russian spies concerning whom the papers and magazines at the time had lengthy articles. During the conversation there was some speculation as to how one spy would know another, and HENRY SUMPERFORD mentioned that he had read somewhere that sometimes spies broke a bottle. After the bottle was broken one person kept one part and another part was taken away. Subsequently, when two individuals met and were able to fit the broken parts of the bottle together they knew that they were the right people. ETHEL'S letter regarding "CREENGLASS" apparently referred to SUMPERFORD'S remarks as set forth above.

Mr. SUMVERFORD stated that he did not know GREENGLASS at all and that he does not recognize the photograph of GREEN-GLASS.



On April 4th, 1951 a photograph of the captioned subject was exhibited to DAVID GRENGLASS and he recognized it as an individual named ARTHUR who had come to the apartment occupied by DAVID GREENGLASS and ETHEL GREENGLASS sometime during the 1930's on about four or five occasions. He recelled that he had played the piano and the violin and on one occasion had repaired a violin. He also recalled that ARTHUR was either an associute or a partner in the COMO AERONAUTICAL COMPANY on 17th Street, which was started by a Negro named WILLIAMS who was an aviator and that JULIUS ROSENEERG and MARK PAGE were also working in the COMO AERONAUTICAL COMPANY at that time.

and had a fallen out with both WILLIAKS and ARTRUR concerning the business in which they were engaged. GREENGLASS stated that he has not seen ARTRUR since JULIUS and ETHEL were married in 1939 and it may have been several years prior to that when he last saw ARTRUR. GREENGLASS was under the impression that ARTRUR is a Communist and thinks he heard some mention that ARTRUR was a Communist Party member.

GREENGLASS was also under the impression that all of the individuals connected with the COKO AERONAUTICAL COMPANY were Communists. GREENGLASS stated that he helicated that care from Genada and once GREENGLASS also recalled that Afrikh had been bonomian in character and he had been married several times.

dren all in the same mess—a son, a son-inlaw and a daughter." Someone said the ner daughter-in-law, Ruth Greenglass, had seemed like a nice person and she said:

"They're all nice," she said. "Nice and intelligent. But maybe they've been fooling themselves."

"Is it so much? Say they give them 30 years. He'll be 62 when he gets out—or more. My son will be there 15 years; I suppose he did wrong and he will pay for it, but those others . . . "

She could not reach the President; now she had to try and reach Julius Rosenberg; who could tell her that there would be any softness there?

"Tessie Greenglass stood up on the 23d floor of Rogge's Broadway office building and looked down on the lower Manhattan she does not often see from so far up.

She pointed to the Criminal Courts Building, and sold that her son had spent a year there. She pointed to the Federal Court Building where David Greenglass and the Rosenbergs had been tried and said, "Such a lot of steps."

Such a lot of steps for Tessie Greenglass, all leading at the end to the son-in-law she cannot be sure will see her. Even if he will, it will take a court order to get her in: the state taw is very clear in saying that only the most immediate family may see a prisoner in the death house.

For the last few months, she has left her Sheriff St. spartment for almost no other business but the case of her children. Blost of the day she sits there in the house behind what was once her husband's store.

"It is the same house; I have been living here

since-1914."

Ethel Rosenberg and David Greenglass were born there and grew up there; she is at home all day with nothing but the memory of them. For a little while after their arrest, she had Ethel and Julius' two sons to take care of; they have long since gone to a loster home.

"Such fine boys," she says. She will not judge her children or us who condemned them; she does not even now know for sure what they did.

"Who can take a man's lite?" she says. "They say it's communism. communism... communism." What is all this—the crime and the twisted marryrdom—to old Tessie Greenglass, alone on Sheria St.?

Her eyes with their heavy glasses looked out the window; after a while, she got up and said, "It's a quarter to four, already; I have to go home and cook supper." Someone suggested taking her home. Tessie Greenglass said she did not want to bother anybody; she could take the bus on the corner and be right there.

Tomorrow she would start the effort just to see Julius, whatever happened after that; for the rest of it, the Supreme Court appeal, for all the courts, "There is," she said, "nothing more to say." Nothing more meant to real hope but Julius.

She went downstairs in the elevator and walked in the cold toward the bus, a little red feather in her hat, her coat dark, her shoes old and black and carefully kept, her walk slow and tired and patient. She stopped at the corner and looked in her purse for the dime. She was on her way back to Sheriff St.

"I hope," she said at the end, "that I will see you in a happier time."

That happier time when somebody would have mercy. And, for Tessie Greenglass, there was nobody left to show any mercy except her son-inlaw Julius—if he would see her.



Arrangements now are being made to bring Greenglass to New York next week to testify at a televisel heading. He will be held in a place other than the Federal Rouse of Detention, because of the recent askault on Communist leader. Robert Thompson there . . . Greenglass showed the visitors his small cell, and said to his lawyer: "I've seen worse rooms than this in the Catskills."

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## Greenglass Won't Testify Here Life Threatened: M'Carthy

The life of David Greenglass, convicted A-bomb spy who is scheduled to "tie up the Rosenberg spy ring directly to the Army Signal Corps," has been threatened, it was revealed Tuesday by Sen. Joseph McCarthy, chairman of the Senate Permanent Investigations Subcommittee.

McCarthy said he had learned from a "completely reliable source" that Greenglass' life might be in danger if he leaves the Federal penitentiary at Lewisburg to testify before the Senate group and that therefore the committee will go to the prison next week instead of summoning Greenglass here for a hearing as planned.

"WE DON'T want anyone tak-ing potshots at Greenglass," said McCarthy. He added that Green-glass told the committee's special counsel, Roy Cohn, that he could establish that extremely important material stolen from Fort Monmouth was put into the hands of Soviet espionage agents.

Meanwhile, it was disclosed that a man believed to be Abraham Brothman, who has been linked to the Rosenberg spy ring by confessed atom spy Harry Gold, will appear before the committee Wednesday.

It was revealed that Brothman, who reaptly completed a two-

who recently completed a two-year sentence for conspiring to obstruct justice in an espionage probe, has been working at the Techni-Flex Co. plant in Port

Jervis, N. J.
A plant official, who asked to remain anonymous, said Brothman has the confidence of all who know him. Brothman is a chemical engineer. The spokesman said the plant does some work for Republic Aviation, but has no connection with radar production.

"We make some government material," he added, "but nothing of any importance."

THE MOMENT we heard Brothman was free and working in a radar plant, we called the Techni-Flex Co. and one of his CLIPPING FROM THE

superiors said the Brothman employed in the plant was the same one who had served time on the conspiracy charge," said Mc-Carthy.

McCarthy said about eight witnesses were called Tuesday. He declared he will go to Washington on Friday to quiz members of the Army's loyalty board, particu-larly a suspended civilian member, in connection with the Fort Monmouth investigation.

It was also learned that key radar and guided-missile research scientist at Fort Monmouth allegedly has been identi-

> fied as a Communist despite his denials and that he also will be summoned before the Senate probers. He was named by

an ex-Red, now living in Maml, as a member of a secret Red cell with spies Julius Rosen-berg and Morton Sobell.

Assistant Director L. B. Nichols telephoned at 1:00 P.M., 11/4/53, and referred to a story written by EDWARD RANZAL, which appeared in the NY Times, 11/3/53. Mr. Nichols advised that the article was, in effect, deprecating the work of the Senate Investigating Committee. Mr. Nichols advised he had received a "rumble" that, although RANZAL's information was purportedly received from 0. John Rogge, actually RANZAL had not obtained the information from Mr. Rogge, but had obtained it from some employee of the NYO of the FEI.

I advised Mr. Nichols that I had no information concerning any employee giving any information to RANZAL, but aht I would have a check made and let him know.

I requested SA Thomas J. McAndrews to make inquiry concerning the possibility of any Agent having furnished such information to RANZAL.

This same date, at approximately 3:30 P.M., I telephoned Mr. Nichols and advised him I had not been able to locate anybody in the NYO who had been in contact recently with RANZAL. I did advise him that supervisor Thomas J. McAndrews had run into RANZAL this noon while at lunch and, thereafter, Mr. McAndrews furnished the following information to Mr. Nichols:-

#### ADDENDUM BY SA THOMAS J. MCANDREWS:

At approximately 3:30 P.M., ASAC Ian D. MacLennan teferred a telephone call from Asst. Dir. L. B. Nichols, Bureau, to the writer. Mr. Nichols had inquired of Mr. MacLennan whether or not there could have been a leak of information from the MYO to Edward Ranzal, reporter of the NY Times, which resulted in the story in the New York Times Deprecating the activities of the McCarthy Committee in its recent inquiries in New York. Mr. Nichols also indicated that Ranzal might not have contacted O. John Rogge for his story as he reported in the article which appeared in the NY Times, 11/3/53.

I told Mr. Nichols that neither I nor any of the Supervisors had been in touch with RANZAL in the recent past. I pointed out to him that RANZAL had covered the U.S. Court House for many years for the NY Times, was known to many Agents of NYO. I also told him that RANZAL had covered the ROSKNBERG trial and was entirely familiar with the personalities and the attorneys involved in this trial. I then advised him that on 11/4/53, I had met RANZAL and he had furnished me the following information voluntarily.

RANZAL learned from the press and from his contacts in the Court House that Roy Cohn, Chief Counsel, McCarthy Committee; O. John Rogge, Attorney for DAVID GREENGLASS; and others were going to Lewisburg Penitentiary on Thursday, 10/29/53 to interview DAVID GREENGLASS concerning his knowledge of Espionage at Fort Monmouth. RANZAL stated that when he heard this, he reviewed the testimony on DAVID GREENGLASS in the trial of the ROSENBERGS at the office of AUSA James B. Kilsheimer, III, in the Court House. On Friday, 10/30/53, in the evening, he telephonically contacted the office of O. John Rogge, Attorney for David Greenglass, and asked to be advised what information, if any, Mr. Rogge could provide him with concerning GREENGLASS' statements to representatives of the McCarthy Committee. Mr. Rogge was not present in the office, being in South Carolina. RAMZAL talked to Mr. FABRICANT, a partner of O. John Rogge; and while they were talking, Rogge called his office long distance. RANZALL, through FAERICANT, interviewed ROGGE, and obtained information as to what material GREENGLASS had supplied the McCarthy Committee on 10/39/53. Mr. Rogge asked RANZAL to hold off printing the story until Rogge had a chance to discuss the matter with him. This, Ranzal agreed to do.

RANZAL pointed out that Rogge had a client who was due to appear before the McCarthy Committee and that he did not care to jeopardize this client's welfare by authorizing a story for RANZAL unless he had time to think it out carefully. I told Mr. Nichols this client was probably FRED JOSEPH KITTY, a figure in the ROSENBERG case. RANZAL then told me that on Monday, 11/2/53, he bad contacted Rogge and Rogge had authorized his story which appeared in the NY Times of 11/3/53. This story indicated that the McCarthy Committee had not obtained new information from DAVID GREENGLASS and that at the time GREEN-GLASS had only furnished information to which he had testified in the ROSENEERG trial. RANZAL told me that on 11/3/53, he received a phone call from Mr. Roy Cohn in which Cohn stated Rogge had not approved the story and was angered with RANZAL for printing it. RANZAL told COHN this was not true and thathe had ROGGE's approval for the story. COHN had indicated to RANZAL that ROGGE had called COHN and protested the story. RANZAL, following his telk with COHN, called ROGGE and found that COHN had called ROGGE and protested the story, and not that Rogge had called Cohn.

I told Mr. Nichols that the above was volunteered by RANZAL; that no comments had been made by the Agent and, further, RANZAL had indicated that he had been requested to write an article for the Sunday Times, date unknown, indicating that the McCarthy Committee was not producing new information. This also was received without comment by the Agent. Mr. Nichols was asked whether or not he desired any further material on this and he said he did not. He instructed the writer to be certain that all Agents having business with the McCarthy Committee or the press be most careful not to indicate any attitude for or against the Committee. I told him NYO was aware of the desire of the Bureau for this procedure to be followed closely. He then said the Bureau had to walk down the middle of the road with reference to the McCarthy Committee. I told him NYO would follow the Bureau's instructions in this matter.

At 1:40 P.M., 11/5/53, I telephonically furnished the following information to Assistant Director A. H. Belmont, Bureau.

I told Mr. Belmont that, unsolicited, O. John Rogge, Attorney for DAVID GREENGLASS, had telephonically contacted SA John A. Harrington on this date and had advised SA Harrington that he was calling to ask him whether or not he knew the McCarthy Committee was going to feinterview DAVID GREENGLASS at levisburg Penitentiary. SA Harrington explained to Mr. Roggee that we had no information available on the movements of the McCarthy Committee and could not be of assistance to him in this request. Mr. Rogge then stated he believed the McCarthy Committee was going to reinterview DAVID GREENGLASS at Lewisburg and that he had not bee invited to participate as yet in that interview. Mr. Rogge mentioned that he was thinking of calling or writing the authorities at Levisburg Penitentiary and requesting them not to permit DAVID GREENGLASS to be interviewed by any member of the McCarthy Committee unless he, O. John Rogge, was present. To this, SA Harrington made no comment.

Mr. Rogge further stated he had been requested by the NY Times to prepare an article on the McCarthy Committee's interview of DAVID GREENGLASS, which occurred on 10/29/53, and Mr. Roggee intended, in this article, to indicate that DAVID GREENGLASS had told the McCarthy Committee only the information to which he had testified in the trial of the ROSENBERGS. Mr. Rogge further indicated that he was upset by the innuendos appearing in the public press that his client, DAVID GREENGLASS, had information other than that to which he had testified in the ROSENBERG trial. He, as attorney, for DAVID GREENGLASS, thought it was a matter of soncern, in that he did not wish to have DAVID GREENGLASS represented in anything but an accurate light. (It is to be noted that as attorney, he is concerned about DAVID GREENGLASS' parole and release from the penitentiary.) To this, No comment was made by SA Harrington.

Mr. Rogge offered a copy of the article he was preparing for the NY Times to SA Harrington. No committeent was made to accept this article, nor will the article be accepted. Mr. Rogge further added that his article will also deal with the role of the Senate Committee in such matters and will express the opinion that matters of espionage are beyond the scope of the Committee and within the investigative jurisdiction of the FBI.

Mr. Belmont said it would not be necessary to furnish the above information to the Bureau in teletype form.

A file review was conducted on these individuals and as a result, the Newark, New York and Bureau submitted blind memoranda concerning the results of their file reviews. The above individual was one of these considered suspect by the CIC.

The above mentioned memoranda and any additional correspondence resulting from this project are attached and are being incorporated in the individual's case file.

### Greenglass, Spy Con, Asks Parole

Washington, April 2 (AP).

David Greenglass, 34, key figure in the Rosenberg espionage trial, has applied for parole from the Lewisburg (Pa.) Federal Penitentiary, where he is serving 15 years as an admitted spy. He was sentenced in 1951, Greenglass was the government's star witness in the New York trial which resulted in the conviction of his sister Ethel Rosenberg, and her hubard, Julius Rosenberg, on charges of passing U. S. atomic secrets to Russia. The Rosenbergs were executed in June, 1953.

# Greenglass, in Prison, 5 Yrs., Loses Parole Plea

WASHINGTON, Apr. 3 U.— The Federal Parole Board today denied a parole to David Greenglass, who slipped atomic secrets to the Soviet spy ring headed by Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. The eight-member board gave no reason for its denial of Greenglass' parole petition.

Greenglass has served five years of his fifteen-year prison sentence for his part in the Rosenberg spy ring. He freely admitted his espionage activities. The Rosenbergs were executed in Sing Sing in June, 1953, partly on the basis of his testimony.

Greenglass, a brother of Ethel Rosenberg, testified at their 1951 trial that he was recruited into the ring by his brother-in-law, Julius.

He testified that while serving as an Army sergeant at the Los Alamos, N. M., atomic bomb base, he slipped vital secrets to the Rosenbergs and to Harry Gold, Philadelphia blochemist now serving a twenty-five-year term.

Under the law, Greenglass automatically became eligible for parole this month, when he finished one-third of his term. His parole petition will not be reviewed by the parole board for at least one year, unless new vidence is presented that wirants it.

## 2 Atomic Spies Questioned By Senate Group

WASHINGTON, April 25 (INS), --Convicted atom spies Harry Gold and David Greenglass were brought from their penitentiary cells and questioned behind closed doors Wednesday by Senate investigators.

The Senate Internal Security subcommittee said that Gold will testify in public on Thursday and Greenglass on Friday in its investigation of the use which Soviet intelligence has made of American citizens.

SUBCOMMITTEE COUNSEL Rocert Morris said both men were "very responsive witnesses" when he questioned them following their arrival from the Federal Penitentiary at Lewisburg,

Gold, who was arrested by the FBI in May, 1950, is serving a 30-year term. He was convicted of relaying atom-bomb secrets from Greenglass and British spy Klaus Fuchs to

Russian intelligence.

Greenglass, a former Aimy corporal who was a government witness against Gold and Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, was sentenced to 15 years.

Mrs. Rosenberg, who was electrocuted with her husband in 1953, was Greenglass's sister.

GOLD, NOW 45, pleaded guilty to charges that he was a spy courier, but the Swiss-born chemist said he felt howas "only helping" Russia "obtain certain information that I thought it was entitled to" as a wartime ally of the U.S.







### David Greenglass Forsaken by U. S.

#### By GEORGE E. SOKOLSKY

PPARENTLY one must be an unrelented Communist to enjoy the benefit of a favorable decision, Those who served this party or the government it represents and broke with it, for one reason or another, and aided the FBI or the Department of Justice or a Congressional committee are not even to be given a parole, despite the general tendency of parole boards to be easy on the wicked and to return them to society to do what comes naturally to them.

David Greenglass was the brother of Mrs. Julius Rosenberg who, with her husband, organized the theft of the atom bomb for Soviet Russia. Greenglass and Harry Gold aided the government in getting a conviction of the Rosenbergs who were no doubt important spies. Each was sentenced to fairly long terms. I have been informed that Greenglass was promised that if he testified truthfully he would get only five years. He got 15. I do not know who made the promise.

### Parole Bid Rejected

He has recently applied for a parole and was turned down. No reason has been given publicly as to why he was turned down. Were Greenglass a Communist, there would be a Committee to Free Greenglass which would collect funds and hire expensive lawyers and make a great noise, but as he was a government witness he gets no such benefits and no such pressure is exerted in his favor.

Also, the way he is being treated must be a discouragement to others who may want to be government witnesses, as it is obvious that the government does not stand behind those who help it win cases

against Communists or spies.

Judge Robert Morris, chief counsel of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee, who fights Communists and spies professionally, spoke up to the U.S. Board of Parole in favor of David Greenglass. He said that the sentence of 15 years was unjust; that Greenglass cooperated with the FBI from the moment they first approached him.

The question then arises whether these various decisions are related to justice or to policy. I am now engaged in reading all the decisions handed down by the courts in cases involving Communists and find curious phenomenon, namely, that a sharp change took place in 1953 which was like a sharp knife cutting through a cheese. Apparently, prior to 1953 courts followed one pattern; subsequent to 1953, courts followed another pattern. The line of demarcation is too noticeable to be meaningless and I am now trying to discover whether there was a reason for the shift of attitude. Also, after the 1956 election, no Congressional committee has been effective in any anti-Communist activity, not even the experienced House Committee on Un-American Activities.

#### Sen. McCarthy a Victim

I am not discussing the rightness or wrongness of the changed attitude but am reporting a state of mind, an attitude, a characteristic of an era. Senator Joe McCarthy was killed off by the Army-McCarthy hearings and eventually by the act of condemnation, which ultimately destroyed him as a person. Joe would be the last man in the world to want to be regarded as a martyr. As only his most intimate friends and perhaps objective psychologists can know. Joe was a modest man, perhaps not a little frightened by his success, notoriety or acclaim, as one wishes to state it. At his height, he was as important as the President of the United States; at his lowest, he was not even invited to a general and really insignificant White House affair.

The exaggeration of McCarthy's achievements and the vindictiveness after his defeat have had the effect of literally scaring many public figures, particularly Senators, into adopting an apathetic attitude not only to McCarthy's favorite subjects but to anything that may evoke White House displeasure. Thus, a Senator speaking privately against a measure which he sincerely opposed but which he publicly favored, made the point that opposition to the President. offends and embarrasses the President very much, and that once the President has proclaimed his position in a speech or a press conference, a wide difference of opinion, however justified, becomes a personal matter with him and his staff. When asked, what about the separation of powers as stipulated in he Constitution, the Senator replied: "Someday some one will have the courage 'o break through. I am not that man."

Senate Internal Security subcommittee called today for new laws to make desertion to the West more appealing to the citizens of Communist countries.
"The American government has

been remiss in its policy of encouraging individuals to come forward and reveal the inner workings of the Communist con-spiracy," the subcommittee said in Section 10 of its 1957 report. ""Continued failure of our government to have a clear-cut offer to would-be defectors from the Soviets and their satellites militates against our obtaining on our side these valuable

Urge Sanctuary Guarantee The subcommittee recommended that Congress enact laws "to assure sanctuary in the United States and a decent standard of living to Communist defectors who bring us valuable informa-


knowledgeable people," it said.

It also called for a law permit-ting Congressional investigating committees "after consultation with the Attorney General, to bring into the United States aliens whose testimony is desired and whose admission will not endan-ger the national security."

The subcommittee said the predicament of convicted atom spies Harry Gold and David Greenglass represents a case in point of Communist defectors. who are treated worse than Communists he chose not to cooperate with U.S. officials.

It said several convicted spies already had been released from prison, under U.S. Supreme Court decisions while Gold and Greenglass who "have cooperated in every way with all federal agencies" still are in prison.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25 (UPI). — David Greenglass, brother of executed atom-spy Ethel Rosenberg, will be released from prison Nov. 16, 6 Justice Department official said today.

Greanglass, thirty-eight, was sentenced to fifteen years in prison for conspiring with the Rosenbergs to steal atomic secrets for Russia. He is serving his sentence at the Lewisburg, Pa., Federal Penltentiary.

#### Admitted Lesser Charge

He started his prison sentance on July 6, 1951. Under the law, the mandatory date for his release is May 1, 1961. But a Justice Department official said he will be released Nov. 16 "because of credits for good behavior."

Although he is not being released by action of the Federal Parole Board, Greenglass will temain under Federal supervision until Nov. 5, 1965, and will have to report periodically to a parole officer.



# Rosenberg Accomplice Out of Jail

One of the three all-but-forgotten accomplices in the celebrated Rosenberg spy case will be freed today after nearly a decade in prison.

David Greenglass, now 38, was a brilliant technician and an Army sergeant, when during wartime he picked up data on the A-bomb and slipped it to the Rosenbergs.

HE WAS SENTENCED to 15 years in jail, and has served nine years and four months. Today, he is being freed from the Federal House of Dentention on parole, his sentence cut down for good behavior.

The defection of Igor Gouzenko, a Russian code clerk in Offawa, Ont., gave authorities in this country the tip on the syp ring involving Greenglass, his sister Ethel Rosenberg, her husband Julius, and two others, Morton Sobell and Harry Gold.

Greenglass admitted he picked up information about the A-bomb in Los Alamo, N. M., and passed it to the Rosenbergs. He said Julius had given him money and an escape route to a Communist country when authorities began to close in on them, but he decided not to run. Instead, he testified against the Rosenbergs. They were both executed at Sing Sing in 1953. Sobell and Gold each drew 30 years.

Another member of the ring, physicist Klaus Fuchs, was seized in England in 1950 and imprisoned there. Since his term ended, he has gone to East Germany.

# Red Spy Greenglass Freed Amid Curses from Crowd

# Refuses to Tell Of Future Plans

David Greenglass, atom bomb spy whose testimony helped send his sister and brother-in-law, Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, to the electric chair, was released today after having served nine years and four months in Federal prison.

His hat pulled down over his eyes and his coat collar turned up, the 38-year-old former Brooklyn machinist left the Federal House of Detention at 8:30 a.m. in the company of his lawyer, O. John Rogge.

He did nothing but shake his head in response to the questions fired at him about his future plans, shifting from one foot to the other and looking extremely uneasy.

### WON'T TELL PLANS

His lawyer made the only statement. Said Mr. Rogge:

"David Greenglass has been given a mandatory release. He does not now have and he will not have any statement concerning his plans."

Greenglass lost 30 pounds during the years he spent in Federal prison at Lewisburg, Pa., for wartime espionage. He had been sentenced to 15 years.

# Atomic-Spy Greenglass Out of Prison

David Greenglass, thirtyeight, convicted atom spy, yesterday was released from Federal custody after serving nine
years and four months of a fifteen-year prison sentence. His
term was shortened because of
good behavior.

During World War II, Greenglass gave atom-bomb secrets to a Russian-recruited spy ring that included his sister and brother-in-law, Ethel and Julius Rosenberg. His testimony in 1951 helped send the Rosenbergs to the electric chair in Sing Sing Prison, in June, 1953.

# A-Spy Freed; Crowd Is Hostile

Silent and meek-looking, David Greenglass, convicted atom spy, was freed vester-day at 8:35 A.M. from the Federal House of Dentention at 427 West St. after 5/2 years in prison.

Attorney O. John Rogge hustled the short, 38-year-old Greenglass to a waiting taxicab. Faced by about 60 reporters and photographers, they stoppe just long enough for Rogge to declare that there would be go statement "now or later."

Greenglass cringed in the cab as hostile shouts came from a crowd of longshoremen, and truckers. He pulled the collar of his blue topcoat up nearly to his eyes and peered out from under the brim of his pulled-down fedora.

Helped Send 2 to Chair

"Drop dead, you lousy Communist," shouted one of the group.

"Drive him off the pier, right into the river, the dirty Red rat." another yelled at the taxi driver.

The taxi drave off after some difficulty caused by vehicles which had stopped while their drivers watched.

Greenglass, former Brooklyn machinist and Army technician, helped send his sister. Ethel, and her husband, Julius Rosenberg, to the electric chair as atom spies. He pleaded guilty to complicity in the theft of U.S. atomic secrets and was the government's ter witness at the Rosenberg trial. The Rosenberg were electrocuted at Sing Sing in June, 1953.

Served at Federal Pen

Geenglass was sentenced to 15 years, but got out earlier of good behavior. He served his time at the Lewisburg, Pa., Federal Penitentiary, from which he was transferred last weekend.

Convicted with the Rosenbergs and sentenced to 30 years was Morton Sobell, a radar expert.
Harry Gold, a Philadelphia biochemist, received an 8-10-30-year sentence for his role in the conspiracy. Sobell and Gold are still in prison.

Greenglass was late in leaving because Rouge was a half hour late in arriving at the House of Detention. The freed man wore a worn blue suit and carried a mall blue zipper hag.

He didn't speak on emersing,

# The Curious Case Of David Greenglass

# Should Atom Bomb Spy Be Free After Only Nine Years?

## By RUTH REYNOLDS

THERE is disagreement concerning justice in the recent release of David Greenglass from a federal penitentiary after serving approximately nine years of his sentence.

Some hold that by giving top secret Information on atom bomb lenses to Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, who forwarded the facts to Russia. Greenglass was just as guilty as they of espionage in wartime aud, therefore, deserved to die with his sister and brother-in-law in the electric chair. As minimum punishment, in their opinion, the 15-year sentence he received should have been doubled.

### Long Overdue

There are others who say the release of Greenglass was long overdue, that he was only a dupe of his relatives and he was badly used by the government. Without his testimony as a prosecution witness, the Rosenbergs might not have been convicted, in exchange for his evidence Greenglass was promised a sentence of on more than five years. But his judge thought he deserved more. Apparently members of the federal parole board thought so too, for they turned down his applications six times without stating a reason.

His story properly begins in 1939, when his sister, Ethel, 23, and his addred brother-in-law, Julius, 21, joined the Communist Party. David, then a 17 year-old learning to be a mechanic, became a niember of the Young Communists' League. He listened eager-

Julius and Ethel talked of the superiority of Russian socialism over U. S. capitalism.

The nation heard shocking news by radio on the Sunday afternoon of Dec. 7, 1941—the Japanese had bombed Pearl Harbor. Among the millions who listened were three later to become known to David—30-year-old Dr. Klaus Fuchs of London, 28 Yoar-old Harry Gold of Cincinsati, a d 23-year-old Morton Sobell of Washington.

Fuchs, a physicist who had fled Hitler's Germany, was heart and soul for the Soviet, although he was planning to take out British citizenship. Gold, a junior in biochemistry at Cincinnati's Navier University, had worked for 10 years as a Soviet spy in the United States. And Sobell had become a Communist Party member in 1939, stong with Rosenberg, his classmate in electrical engineering at City College in New York.

In the 24 months which followed Pearl Harbor, Fuchs, Gold, Sobell and the Rosenbergs continued their work for Russia. Sobell, already employed in the Navy Ordnance Bureau, became a radar expert. Julius worked as a civilian engineering inspector in the Army Signal Corps. Ethel attended party meetings.

David, who had become a good mechanic in the family-owned machine shop, narried the former Ruth Protz. He had not joined the Communist Party, chiefly, as he was to say later, because he was too lazy to accept party discipline. Had "rather lie in bed on Sanday morning than deliver the Daily Worker from door to door." But his brother-in-law was still his hero.

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Then David was drafted into the Aumy, with the prospect of hattle servicd ahead. However, by July, 1944, he was able to tell Ruth that he was being kept in the U. S. on an assignment so top secret he didn't know what the

undertaking was.

First, he went as a machinist and technical sergeant to the Manhattan District Project at Oak Ridge, Tenn. Then, he was transferred to Los Alamos, N. M., where he was made assistant foreman in a machine shop casting molds for lenses. He was told as much as necessary about His job, but nothing more -- for, with the opperation of Britain and Canada, the Inited States had started production of the atom bomb. Russia, the other major ally in World War II, was excluded from the secret.

Dn Nov. 29, 1941-three months after Tech. Sgt. Greenglass' transfer to the Los Alamos project—Ruth arrived in Albuquerque for their second wedding anniversary-and something else.

She told David, "Julius says he's doing what he always wanted to dohe's giving information to the Soviet Union." Julius knew David was working on the atomic bomb, and he wanted all the information David could give, so it could be sent on to Russia. Julius' argument was that if all nations had atomic information, no one power could threaten others with the bomb.

#### He Was Scared

"I can't do it, Ruth," David said at first, because he was scared. But later, his admiration for Julius overcame his fear. He didn't want his hero to fail at anything he tried.

So, David gave Ruth a description of the Los Alamos plant, the approximate number of workers and the heretofore secret names of scientists connected with the project. Ruth memorized this information and repeated it to Julius.

Two months later David returned to New York on leave. He gave Julius a number of sketches of a flat-type lens mold being used in the atomic experiments. He also gave his brother-in-law a list of 20 to 25 possible spy recruits at Los Alamos. "I recognized them by their Communist Party catch phrases," he was

to say much later.

At the end of his leave, David returned to Los Alamos. He Jidn't know that Dr. Fuchs was there, and Harry Gold, too. In February, 1945, Ruth got a government job in Albumarque with the Office of Price Administration and found in apartment there. David commuted the 100 miles from the homb proving ground each weekend to see her.

Gold came to see Greenglass in Albuquerque. "I have come from Julius Have you any information for me?"

David again drew sketches-this sime of an improved lens mold on which he was working. He described in writing how this lens was used to trigger the homb. Also, he added to his list of promising spy recruits. Gold included this information in a thick packet of atomic bomb secrets he had just received from Dr. Fuchs and took the whole to Julius

Atomic bombs were dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Now the war was done-but espionage was not. In New York, on furlough, in September, 1945. David gave Julius a sketch of a crosssection of the Nagasaki bomb. "Very good!" his hero complimented

FERRUARY, 1945, found Greenglass honorably discharged and back in New York with his wife and baby, Steven. He had thought the family machine shop would provide him with a comfortable living, but somehow, by legal but sharp practice, Julius had become sole owner. There was quite a let of resentment over

Aithough there has been no mention here of security work done by representatives of the Federal Bureau of Inves-tigation and Scotland Yard, they were exceedingly busy. The fruits of their activity first showed in 1947, when 11 Communist Party leaders were indicted by a federal grand jury in New York. But the Rosenbergs felt they had nothing to worry about - until they heard that Dr. Fuchs, arrested in London on Feb. 3, 1950, had given the FBI names of 124 Americans with whom he worked, 12 of them spies.

Rosenberg hurried to David's apartment in Rivington St., pressed \$1,000 on him, urged him to go to Mexico, and provided him with cloak-and-dagger instructions

"When you reach Mexico City." Julius directed, "write a letter to the Soviet

ambassador. Say something favorable about the Soviet role in the United Nations and sign your letter I. Jackson. Three days later, stand beside the statue of Columbus, with a travel guide in your hand.

I "You will be approached by a stranger," Julius continued. "Say the statue is magnificent and that you are from Oklahoma. He will say 'There are more beautiful statues in Paris.' Then he will give you money and a passport. Go to Vera Cruz and take a ship for Sweden. When you get to Stockholm, follow the same routine at the statue of Linnaeus. You will be taken to Czechoslovakia."

Ruth in Hospital

Greenglass told his brother-in-law that he couldn't possibly leave New York then. Ruth, expecting her second child, had been hadly burned when she upset a gasoline stove and was in a hospita!.

David used the \$1,000 to pay bills. He felt he was justified in keeping the money. He had, thus far, received only \$500 (from Gold) for helping Julius.

In April, when Ruth was a little hetter, Rosenberg again urged David to flee. Julius figured (correctly) that Fuchs would identify Gold as a courier, and that, sooner or later. Gold would identify Greenglass as an informer, and David might mention Rosenberg.

Gold was arrested on May 23, 1950.

The next day Julius hurried to the hospital to see Ruth. Her baby had been born, but she was still hospitalized

because of her hurns.
"David will be next if you don't get to Mexico," he warned.

John Rogge, retained as a lawyer for Greenglass. That day, Greenglass talked, and the next elening FBI agents called on the Rosenbergs just as they were putting their young Village apartment. Thus was the first U. S. married couple arrested on spy charges.

On Aug. 18, Julius, David and Ethel were indicted on counts of conspiracy to commit espionage in wartime. Also indicted were two fugitives, Sobell, tha radar expert, and Anatolia li. Yakovlev, Russian vice consul in New York during 1944-46. Under the Espionage Act of 1917, the penalty, if the defendants were found guilty, could be anything from 30 years to death. Late that month Fobell was picked up in Mexico. Yakovlev na

long since returned to Russia.

Harry Gold pleaded pilty and, in October, David Greenglass took the said step.

Why?

The obvious answer was that X wanted to save his own skin, but Green glass denied that his motive was selfish lie said, much later, that his belief in Communism began to crumble in 1941 when he realized he was steeling for "devastation on a tremendous scale. I'm not a violent man and when I think ethe things I did by non-violence, I wonder at myseif."

At any rate, Greenglass agreed to to a government witness.

THE TRIAL of the Rosenbergs and Sobell began on March 6, 1951, is Manhattan before Federal Judge Irvins R. Kaufman. The government called 20 witnesses, including Ruth and Davie, Greenglass.

In cross-examination. Rosenberg: lawyer, Emanuel H. Bloch, sought to show that Greengiass, who had flunked eight out of eight subjects at Brookly: Polytechnic Institute, was not sufficiently equipped scholastically to steal and relay complex atomic data.

Judge Kaufman out short this line of questioning, reminding the larges that David confessed stealing, and passing on, top secret on terial. The indictment didn't specify that the material, once stolen, had to be accurately delivered.

said the judge.

Bloch then attempted to show that Greenglass had lied to get revenge on his prother-in-law because of the family machine shop deal, and because Rose bork, on one occasion, refused to lead him \$2,000.

When Rosenbery took the stand he made a blanker devial of everythingevery single arise thing. He never areamed of asking amone to furnish him secrets of national defense. He didn't even know his treather-in-law cas of Lor Alamosi He knew nothing about Russi except what he read in the New York PC 14.78.

Both Wary

But he and Ethel were extremely wary when cross-examined by the prosecutor, U. S. Attorney Irving H. Saypol.

Mrs. Rosenberg accused her brother of lying when he said she typed up the material he gave Julius about atomic bombs and national defense. "I once loved my brother." she said, "but I'd be pretty unnatural if I hadn't changed."

In summation, Bloch said the wrong couple were on trial and he castigated Greenglass in a curious way. "He loved his wife more than he loved himself." Bloch shouted. "He was willing to sacrince his sister and her husband to save his wife. Look at that terrible spy," Poch waved toward F'hel, "and then compare her with Mrs. Greenglass, who came here til dolled up, arrogant, an eager bedver.

"Not only are the Greenglasses selfonfessed spies, they are mercenary spies! They'd do anything for money. They'd harder people for money and they are

lying to murder people for muley!" Bloch charged.

Of Rosenberg, his lawyer spoke ten-darly, saying he was "like a schnook [aupe]" obligingly doing things for Greenglass.

Saypol took quite the opposite view. He said the Rosenbergs, so long admired and adored by David, "dragged a voung soldier into the sordid business of hetraying his own country."

Counsel for Sobell did not deny that the radar expert was a low order spy, but he did stress that not one witness linked Sobell with the atom spying.

## Out Overnight

In conclusion, Judge Kaufman reminded the jurors that the fact that illusing was an ally was immaterial; that the defendants handed top secret information over to anybody was material.

The jury was out overnight. Then they pronounced the defendants guilty. Judge Kaufman retired to pray for guidance.

In the end, he sentenced Greenglass to 15 years; Subell and Gold to 30 . . .

and the Rosenbergs to death.

For two years and three months, the Rosenbergs fought for their lives. Their case was reviewed 16 times, on various points, by the U.S. District Court and seven times by the U.S. Court of appeals. Seven times the U.S. Suprepare Court turned down petitions for review and twice the President of the United States turned down appeals for clemency,

Ethel's mother fought, too. At Sing Sing she begged her daughter to "talk like David did."

"You're not my mother!" Ethel raged.

"I don't want anything more to do with you. You're as had as Dave!"

The Rosenbergs were electrocated on

June 19, 1953.

"She's no daughter of mine," sobbed the mother, and she refused to sit Shiva (to observe the traditional Jewish mourning) for Ethel .---

As the years passed. Greenglass and Gold, both in the federal penitentiary at Lewisburg, Pa., talked with many federal investigators, and several times ap-

peared at Senate subcommittee hearings, "Before bringing myself to testify," David once said, "I thought quite a while. And, at times, after testifying, I was sorry I testified-because these people were my flesh and blood. I felt affection for them, and I still do."

Then, turning on his dead kinfolk, he said, "But if these people had not wanted to be martyre they could have just put up their hands and said 'Stop!' and told the truth. It's hard to be called a murderer by people." said Greenglass, referving to himself, but to deliberately martyr nourself for an erroneous cause is the most hypocritical thing a person can do."


Well, David Greenglass is free new. Some people say he paid too much for his crime; some say he paid too little. But such is the attitude of Americans toward traitors, even toward those who regret their deeds, Greengiass probably will keep on paying and paying. At least, he has a long way to go to get into the good graces of his countryment under his own identity.

ROGGE and advised him that she would not cooperate by participating in the TV broadcast of Channel 13 in any way. She also told him that at the present time she was a private citizen and if Channel 13 went ahead with their broadcast and exposed her identity and residence that she would take whatever action was appropriate against them for violating her right of (P)(1)(c)privacy.

He indicated he was under pressure from the Department to make available to ALVIN GOLDSTEIN, TV producer for Channel 13, copies of the interviews of GREENGLASS by Bureau Agents. The Department was taking the position that these should be made available to GOLDSTEIN unless the Bureau could present reasons why not. Further, they alleged that it was not the Department who would be giving these interviews publicity, but Channel 13.

Mr. DENNIS was advised that on the first point the GREENGLASS family were being barassed by threatening and abusive phone calls. In collaboration with their attorney, O. JOHN ROGGE, it was decided they should change their name and address. This was done also to protect the children. It was also understood since we were in at the inception of this plan that the Bureau would not divulge the new identity. This was reaffirmed on numerous occasions throughout the years.

It was also pointed out that several members of the ROSENBERG apparatus had never been prosecuted because of a lack of corroborating witnesses. Should one or two be found, GREENGLASS might again be a witness, but he is still in the status of a confidential informant. The violations being wartime espionage, the Statute of Limitations does not apply.

/ Mr. DENNIS expressed his gratitude and stated he will do all in his power to protect the GREENGLASS family.

Cn 1/31/74, Supervisor RICHARD DENNIS of the Bureau advised the writer he had contacted JOHN A. MINTS, Inspector in Charge, Office of Legal Counsel and received the following opinions regarding action the Bureau might take in the forthcoming Impact TV special:

- 1) The Bureau would have no legal status for bring-ing an injunction against Impact to prohibit their disclosing subject's current identity. Such injunction would have to be brought by DAVID GREENGLASS.
- 2) The Bureau would be ill-advised to contact Impact with a request that GREENGLASS's identity not be disclosed since this could result in Impact making the Bureau's request known either in the documentary itself or otherwise and a relationship between GREENGLASS and the Bureau might be misinterpreted as other than the actual one that exist.

Supervisor DENNIS advised that ALVIN GOLDSTEIN, the Impact director, had indicated he did not intend to make GREENGLASS's current identity and address known but this has not been confirmed in writing.

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### TV's Newest Folk Heroes—the Rosenbergs

The most unlikely set of heroes in the whole bizarre history of television "journalism" is emerging. They are Julius and Ethel Resenberg, the couple who were found guilty of conspiracy to pass atomic secrets to the Soviets during a trial in 1951 and were executed in 1953.

On Jan. 28, the ABC-TV network showed a two-hour-long dramatization of the trial of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg which made the two atom spies seem to be Heidi and Tom Sawyer with a generous mixture of Romeo and Juliet thrown in. The point of the creators of the show, apparently, was that Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were two harmless, intensely lovable people caught in a web of jealousy and perjury and national hysteria through which their innocence shone forth like a beacon light.

The most penetrating tool of the television propagandist's art—showing only one side of an issue, set the mood throughout. The Rosen-

bergs were shown modestly denying any inconvernent in the atomic theft conspiracy. Whenever they took the stand, they answered in a steady and clear tone, making just the right amount of eye contact to show their sin-

Their accusers and the prosecutors were cast perfectly as television heavies—either swarthy and bloated or thin and bloodless, never normal.

The TV script skimmed lightly over the unanimous finding of guilly by a jury of the Rosenbergs' peers and its consistent affirmance by higher courts including the Supreme Court, which refused to order a stay of execution. Every time the Rosenbergs took the Fifth amendment as to their possible Continuist affiliations, the commentator-narrator reminded the audience that the pair were exercising a constitutional right.

No mention was made of the world consequences of the Soviets' early possession of the a'om bomb. Moreover, the program made a selective cut of the letters the Rosenbergs exchanged while they were awaiting execution in prison: "I love you and the children" was the gist of the touching exenunges we heard on the air. Missing were the sections of the letters to each other that were loaded with Communist jargon. Yet surely if we are invited to look beyond the factual evidence produced at the trial, these things are relevant.

The result was that a person unfamiliar with the case would surely have concluded that the Rosenbergs were innocent victims of a legally sanctioned lynding.

A lar .... fully done piece of work by the National Public Affairs Center for Television has been produced by Alvin Goldstein, a former CPS newscan and his colleagues. It is "The Unquiet Death of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg" and will be aired on Feb. 25. This show is a chronology of the events leading up to the conspiracy, the trial and the execution. It features interviews with the participants in the case, the lawyers for both sides and the juriers.

A narration written by the producer links the parts. But even in this program, the commentary is a veritable parody of impartiality. The Communist affiliations of the Rosenbergs were formed as a result of their witnessing the "complete failure of unbridled capitalism" or words to that effect, says the narrator. To prove the point that the capitalist system "lays waste to peoples" lives," the producers call upon a mean with was a Communist during the 1930s to say how poor his family had been.

The producers clearly intend to show the Rosenbergs not only innocent, but heroic. They are, however, undone by their own thorougeness. One particularly eloquent jurar recalls that he had a hard time finding a woman guilty of a capital crime. Then he says, "But I thought of how what she had done might lead to the death of my children, and millions of children all over the world, and maybe even her children."

It is puzzling indeed to speculate where all the interest in the Rosenbergs comes from after 20 years. Two books, one pro and one anti-Rosenberg recently have been published. But the incentive for the television shows may be a bit different.

Alvin Goldstein said he was inspired to do "The Unquiet Death" by his work in rebroad-casting the Watergate hearings for educational TV. He reasoned that if people within the government had done illegal things to their political opponents in 1972, perhaps they had also done them in 1951. Perhaps, he thought, the government had also do the trial of the Rosenbergs because of their political views.

Mr. Goldstein realizes that there was a great deal of factual evidence to convict the Rosenbergs, but he says that is essentially irrelevant. Guilt or innocence of the charge is not the real issue, he says. The real guts of the matter is that the Beserbergs were being tried for their political views "... and that is what is happening today," he says.

It may be that people are being pilloried for their political views today, but it's altogether likely that the victims may not be the ones Mr. Goldstein thinks they are. Could there be an analog to the tormenting of people without regard to their guilt or innocence, but solely on the basis of a superheated political climate of retribution, in what we've seen on the TV news in the last 12 months? Who else could play the role today of all thory witnesses before congressional committees in the 1950s who were trotted out to generate publicity?

But television has not yet made that scemingly obvious connection. With shows like the ones about the Rosenbergs, television exener-

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ates those found guilty by a mry of their peers with due process of law. With its "news" shows, television can mete out the punishment of embarrassment, humiliation, loss of friends and status, in a word, all the things the now-despised congressional committees of the '50s once dispensed Or, as in the case of the Rosenbergs, splusian can give a whole generation, unfamiliar with the facts of the era or their trial, the approximation that the U.S. government murdered two innocent people.

This leads to a further point about the Rosenbergs' TV renaissance. The producers of "The Unquiet Death" think that it is important to see shows about the late '40s and early '50s because "... that was when our current leaders were formed and they are still running things."

Richard Nixon is shown as a young Senator, talking about Communists at the State Department. The point of that snippet, one is told, is that the same repressive forces were at work then and now. That viewpoint is undoubtedly sincere and widely held, especially in the circles that might watch "The "nquiet Death."

"Repression" is an odd point for the producers of "The Unquiet Death" to be making, hough. This show which is bitterly criticall of the American system of economics, justical and government was funded 100% by federal government money through the Corporation for Public Breadcasting. Some repression!




