Re NY letter to Bureau, dæd 9/10/59, requesting authority to interview subject.

On 10/23/59, JAMES WEINSTEIN was interviewed by SAS DOUGLAS L. BURAU and WILLIAM E. FOLKNER.

After the Bureau's jurisdiction in matters concerning the internal security of the US was explained to WEINSTEIN, he agreed to discuss his activities, but was adamant in his decision to refuse to discuss the activities of others.

WEINSTEIN was very vague in discussing his activities with regard to dates and places and club names, apparently fearful that he would disclose the identities of his associates.

WEINSTEIN stated he joined the LYL in approximately 1950, "while in New York", and at one time held the position of Organizational Secretary of New York County LYL. He could not or would not recall dates this office was held, or explain the exact dates.

The subject advised he joined the CP in approximately 1953 and attended club meetings on the Lower East Side on practically a monthly basis. With regard to exact location and business discussed at the meeting WEINSTEIN would not elaborate. He could not recall any offices held in the CP.

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It is to be noted the subject, during the interview, implied that he considered the LYL an integral part of the CP and not a separate organization, even though some others did.

According to WEINSTEIN the overthrow of the US Government by force was not advocated by the CP organization; however, there were some individual members who did. He further stated the CP, USA, Never admitted to dominance by the USSR, but in his opinion in practice it, the CP, USA, was controlled by the USSR.

WEINSTEIN stated he withdrew from "CP and LYL activity in approximately 1956. He stated he never took any formal steps in withdrawing, but just became inactive. He gave as the reason, for the withdrawal, "political disgreement. WEINSTEIN stated he considers the CP a defunct organization.

WEINSTEIN was questioned regarding subscription to the "Daily Worker" which he denied. After further questioning he admitted subscribing to "The Worker" as late as 1954. He stated he had not been approached by anyone since that time with regard to renewal; however, he subsequently stated he had received correspondence in this effort.

Throughout the interview, WEINSTEIN continued to state he would not discuss others and he stated if any information concerning his wife (JACLYN CRONICK WEINSTEIN, Bureau file 100-411662; a current Security Index subject of the NYO) was desired, she would have to give the information.

As it was believed the subject had discussed his activities as far as he intended to at that time, the interview was concluded.

The subject was asked if he would consider discussing his activities further on a subsequent date. He stated he might, and "may change his mind about others".

The following description was obtained at the time of the interview:

Inamuch as the subject appeared to be cooperative, to a limited extent, he will be recontacted in the immediate future as a continuation of the past interview.

No steps toward directing the subject's activities will be made without prior Bureau approval, if he is cooperative, in compliance with existing instructions.

Subject was reinterviewed on 1/12/60 by SA WILLIAN E. FOLKNER in the vicinity of 97th Street and West End Avenue, NYC.

WEINSTEIN advised SA FOLKNER that he had not changed his mind since the last contact at which time he stated he may change his mind about giving information with regard to others in the CB.

WEINSTEIN stated that his beliefs are the same as previously reported, that is to say that the discussion of other members of the CP would be strictly political and he does not intend to discuss the political affiliations of other individuals at this time.

WEINSTEIN stated that if he receives any information that he considers of value to the FBI in the execution of its duties with regard to the internal security of the US, he would immediately report same to the FBI at the NYO.

During the course of the conversation WEINSTEIN advised that he continued his business of boat rental at his residence and he did not maintain any other employment.

Inasmuch as there are no additional leads in this case it is being placed in a closed status by the NYO.

Rerep of SA dated 8-30-60.

Our investigation has not uncovered any activity on the part of the subject in the Communist Party (CP) or front groups since 1956. When interviewed in October, 1959, subject admitted former membership in the Labor Yout's League from approximately 1950 to 1956, as well as membership in the CP from 1953 to 1956. In view of the foregoing, his Security Index card has been canceled at the Bureau and you should take similar action.

Subject reportedly inherited a great deal of money and in view of this, would be a logical target for solicitation by the CP for funds. You should remain alert for any renewed activity on subject's part, particularly in connection with CP funds.


COMMUNIST AND PRO-COMMUNIST CONNECTIONS

During the period from April, 1961 to June of 1962, MI T-2 advised that the name of JAMES WEINSTEIN has been listed on the Editorial Board of "Studies on the Left" (SOTL) since that publication first was printed in Madison, Wisconsin in 1960. The informant further advised that WEINSTEIN has been personally active in the business affairs of SOTL since early 1961 on an intermittent basis, and, in recent months, WEINSTEIN's activity in this capacity has increased to the point where the informant thinks that WEINSTEIN is actually the business manager of SOTL although WEINSTEIN does not use any title.

About the beginning of May, 1962, MI T-2 said that WHINSTEIN was reported to be on a trip to New York City to raise funds for SOTL.

On November 30, 1981 MI T-3 advised that SOTL had been given a check for \$500 signed by JAMES WEINSTEIN and drawn on the joint account of JAMES and JACLYN WEINSTEIN in the Bank of Commerce, New York City.

A characterization of SOTL is attached to the appendix section of this report.



Confidential informants acquainted with Communist and pro-Communist activities in the Madison, Wisconsin and New York areas were contacted during March, April and May, 1962 concerning Subject, but none of these informants had any information indicating any additional activity on the part of Subject.

STUDIES ON THE LEFT (SUIL)

The "Wisconsin State Journal," a daily newspaper published at Madison, Wisconsin, on November 26, 1959 announced that a new scholarly magazine, "Studies On the Left," a historical review dedicated to the leftist point of view, edited by present and former graduate exudents at the University of Wisconsin (UW), but having no connection with the UW itself, would begin publication soon.

Records of the Wisconsin Secretary of State reflect SOTL was incorporated under laws of Wisconsin July 16, 1959 as a non-stock, non-profit corporation with head-quarters P. O. Box 2121, Madison, Wisconsin. Three issues were published during the period December, 1959 to November, 1960. The first issue contained a policy statement of the editors stating SOTL was primarily a magazine for national circulation designed to give younger men with radical views a place to voice their opinions.

Publicly listed members of SOTL's Editorial Board SAUL LANDAU, JOAN BROMPERG, STEPHEN SCHEINBERG, MARTAN J. SKLAR and JAMES WEINSTEIN have been identified by sources previously as having participated in the activities of the Labor Youth League (LYL); while Editorial Board members DAVID EAKINS and MATTHEW CHAPPERON have been identified as active members of the Communist Party (CP). Another source has identified LANDAU and EAKINS as handling the finance and business affairs of SOTL.

The Labor Youth League has been designated by the Athorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A Pacifie for J. Edgar

RACE AND RADICALISM: The NAACP and the Communist Party in Conflict. By Wilson Record. Cornell University Press. 237 pp. \$5.95.

James Weinstein

John P. Roche tells us in the preface to this book that it was originally commissioned as a chapter for a larger work on Communist infiltration, but that Professor Record's unexpectedly lengthy manuscript so impressed his editors that they rushed it into print as a book. They rushed in the wrong direction. Even as a chapter, Record's material would probably have been redundant and superficial. How often, in this day and age, do we have to be reminded of "the American CP's subservience to the Soviet Union and . . . the incidental character of its concern with racial matters"? Certainly not on every fifth or sixth page.

Race and Radicalism teaches us nothing about either, although it is brimful of facts concerning the sinister twists and turns of the Communist Party since 1919, and the steady, admirable efforts of the NAACP to improve the lot of the Negro within the context of liberal capitalism while shrewdly avoiding contamination by the "radical" party. The latest volume in the series on Communism in American Life, sponsored by The Fund for the Republic, Record's book is at least consistent with most books in the series published to date. It is heavily descriptive; its point of view is entirely predictable; it fails to examine the social context in which its subjects act; it is filled with unexamined judgments and ideological assertions; it is dull. The only partial exceptions to this composite characterization of the series are Theodore Draper's two books on the early years of American communism, which have the faults listed but are also extremely valuable works of research, both painstailing and accurate; and Clinton Rossiter's delicious spoof: Marxism: The View from America, which is so densely uninformed and so delightfully pompous and trivial as to warrant a category all its own.

Race and Radicalism reads as if it were commissioned by the NAACP to answer J. Edgar Hoover's discovery that the civil rights movement is absolutely honeycombed with Reds. Lest anyone still be in doubt, let it be said: the NAACP is not now, and never has been, Red, successfully in-

filtrated by Reds or sympathetic to Reds (not even to black Reds). Indeed, Record goes so far as to tell us that "the NAACP and the CP have markedly different historical roots. The former was organized in 1909, eight years before the Bolshevik Revo-Jution and a decade before the tortured birth of the CPUSA." Moreover, the NAACP was never "led by people with binding commitments to either a Socialist or a Communist international apparatue." This last truth, however, could only have been told to obscure the fact that among the NAACP's outstanding founders and early leaders were many Socialists: Charles Edward Russell, William English Walling, Mary Ovington White, Florence Kelly, and even W. E. B. Du Bois, who was a party member until 1912. It is true, of course, that after 1916 the NAACP drifted away from Socialist influence and that its early history was unencumbered by contact with Communisis, and for this we are all to pat the Association on its head.

Record's simple-mindedness extends beyond his account of the Communists and goes to the core of the political and ideological problems of the Negro movement in the United States. He views the Black Nationalist tendencies of the Garvey movement in the early 1920s and the Black Muslims today entirely in terms of their rivalry with the NAACP and, therefore, as villains. First, Record informs us that the NAACP was -handicapped in the early 1920s by "extremist groups operating among both whites and Negroes." On the white side was the Ku Klux Klan, one of whose chief targets "in addition to Catholics, Jews, and 'foreigners,' was Negroes-and the NAACP." (No kidding!) But, "as if this were not enough," the NAACP came under attack from the Garvey movement, too. Then follows a recounting of some facts about Garvey and his movement, without the slightest analysis of why Garvey's appeal to race pride and self-esteem, his rejection of the dominant white culture, and his identification of American Negroes with the anti-colonial movement: ... Africa, had an immeasurably grea: appeal to the Negro masses

the 1920s than did the NAACP. To top this off, Record displays his sense of historical continuity by concluding that "Garvey's present-day counterpart, Elijah Muhammad (Poole) of the Black Muslims . . . presents the same kind of challenge, and is willing to make the same kind of alliances, in this case with George Rockwell and the American Nazis."

History, like life, is almost endlessly complex. In order to make sense of it the historian, like the social critic, must select his facts, identify trends and find order by evaluating the relative importance of his data. To clarify and make coherent the events of the past, however, requires an appreciation of its complexity. A historian can easily conclude that the NAACP better answered the needs of the Negro people in the United States than did the Communist Party in the years from 1919 to 1964. But to present everything the Communists did simply as a cynical maneuver to capture un-. witting support for the Soviet Union, and everything the NAACP did as the best possible under the circumstances. is to make a caricature of history and to obscure its relevance to the present.

An example is Record's treatment of the roles of the NAACP and the CP in the Scottsboro case. In this instance, as in all others, our hero (the NAACP) is out to save the nine defendants in an orderly and respectable manner. On the other hand, the vilian (the CP) is out to make propaganda for the Russians. The fact that in the course of making propaganda that is, by organizing demonstrations. throughout the United States and Europe, and by stressing the political nature of Negro oppression-the Communists saved the lives of the Scottsboro boys, is ignored. Worse, Record's obsession with kicking the corpse of the Communist Party leads him to announce that "obviously" one "cannot simultaneously pursue and denounce established legal procedures." How can serious appeals be made, Record asks, "when the appellants are at the same time denying that the courts can act independently of political considerations"? That might have been a good question to ask before the emergence of SNCC and CORE, or before to whole series of desegregation decisions running back to the school decision of 1954, although even then it would have been nawowiy self-serving and an impedi-tion serves only to expose the ac at to ridicule.

through the Negro section of to were recognized by the crowd that had gathered near Williams' house as people who had carried an "Open Season on Coons" banner on their car the day before. Williams, as he relates the story, saved the couple from the angry crowd by inviting them into his house. Following a telephone conversation with the Chief of Police, in which that official threatened his life. Williams fled Monroe, made his way to Canada, and finally to Cuba where he lives today. Shortly after leaving Monroe, Williams was indicted-with four others-for kidnaping the white couple. Those four (Mae Mallory, Richard Crowder, Harold Reape and John Lowry, who is white) were recently tried and convicted in Monroe.

What does Monroe mean? Here are men who work and demonstrate for their rights in a town with a history of Klan influence-and they take their guns with them. In the context of the story as related by Robert Williams this makes sense. The working class (and unemployed) composition of the Monroe group was obviously the most important factor in the evolution of the tactics they used. There are very real differences in the orientation of the Negro middle class and the Negro lower class. Furthermore, the climax of the Monroe story might have been entirely different if the Freedom Riders hadn't come into the picture. Williams' tactics were carefully timed and applied; the Freedom Riders, despite their good intentions, only managed to take the situation out of his hands, and when it came back to him a week later, things had already gotten out of con-

An argument frequencia heard against Williams' self-defense, and in favor of King's masochistic actiude of "if blood must be, shed, then let it be ours," is that the former will alienate white liberal support for the civil rights movement. D when deprivation of the Negro's nights is sustained by violence, who is a limit his choice to either inaction or martyrdom? Williams says repeatedly in his book that he is in favor of nonviolence where it works. But selfdefense of life and property-an established American right-should not be an ejorically excluded from the Near actical arsenal. Today, selfdefense does seem to be the mood the Negro rank and file even if is not the policy of the national organizations. 3

If it requires guns in black hands to bring federal authority into the South, then guns must be readied in every community where the Negro is prevented by physical terror from becoming a viable political force. It should also be apparent that terror is practiced and condoned, in verying degrees, from St. Augustine to New York. In the North, certain militant groups will want to concentrate on pushing all forms of white power out of their communities. They will learn karate; they will arm; they will shoot policemen. Some innocent whites will be hurt but so many more innocent Negroes have been and will be burt that, from the Negro viewpoint, white casualties won't matter.

Negroes With Guns was edited by Marc Schleifer; I've heard the tapes from which he worked and he has put them together in a readable manner. The book includes excerpts from an article and a speech by Martin Luther King, who rejects Williams' position on the grounds that there are alternatives besides submissiveness and guns, as well as because "there is more power in socially organized masses on the march than there is in guns in the hands of a few desperate men." There is also a statement by author Truman Nelson, who supports Williams over King, and photographs.

Williams' presence in Cuba today has clouded the Issue raised by his tactics and philosophy with cold-war politics. It is also unfortunate that the façade of this book—its sensational-sounding title and the American Minuteman on the cover—is perhaps too much of a camp. The definitive history of Monroe and Williams has yet to be written, but Negroes With Guns remains a personal statement of great significance.

James Boggs's The American Revolution is not about the rights movement per se. It is a rambling series of brilliant and startling insights into the American past and the probable American future. Boggs, who contributed to the recent Triple Revolution statement, is a radical's radical. He starts from an assumption that the American power elite is innately evil, and he is not addre-ing people who might think otherwise. Nor does he expect much from groups which are supposed to be ap-. plying pressure, whether the AFL-CIO. NAACP or Marxists.

The AFL-CIO, Boggs notes in a lengthy survey of American labor, represents very little of the labor force,

its leadership today is more concerned with securing pensions than with protecting jobs. Membership and influence have thereby declined. Millions of workers in the South remain outside the unions. What will they do? Boggs answers, "Historically, workers move ahead by the new. That is, they bypass existing organizations and form new ones uncorrupted by past habits and customs."

Boggs believes that the NAACP has been by-passed by harsh realities today. He sees an imminent armed conflict and he believes the Monroe movement and the nationalist movements are more realistic than the NAACP. ". . . the Negro revolt will load to armed struggle between Negroes and whites, Negroes and Negroes, and federal troops and armed civilians, and will have to move through political power and economic power." In industrial centers like Detroit (where Boggs works in an auto factory) and Chicago, which have over 20 per cent unemployment, such conflict seems almost logical.

Though some of his premises and conclusions are Marxist, Boggs sees conventional American Marxism as suffering from crippling misconceptions, the most important of which is expressed in the old slogan, "Black and White, Unite and Fight." There is little evidence that white workers anywhere in America are at all interested in forming a united front with Negro workers.

In Boggs's view—a now familiar one—the unemployment produced by automation, combined with social revolutionary movements here and abroad, will bring about the American Revolution. He sees no realization of Negro goals within the present limits of our society; the Negro revolution is inherently, by definition, a movement toward a classless society.

The answer to the question, can the race problem be solved in American society as we now know it, appears to be no. The choice is more and more between stumbling liber and pouring money into welfare achieves which will certainly benefit some but won't break the ghettos—and fascism: tripland the police forces to cope with Negro militants who reject nonviolence.

Or so it appears from Harlem.

FORGED LETTERS TO THOMAS A. BRADY

In attached letter captioned individual forwards a copy of one of the forged letters to Brady which have appeared in the left-wing press in South America. He asks for comments on the authenticity and contents of the document. He states if we affirm it is fraudulent he will destroy other copies in his possession.

Bufiles reflect a closed Security Matter-C case on James Weinstein. He has been the subject of a Reserve Index card. In 1959, he was interviewed by the FBI and stated he had been a member of the Communist Party from about 1953 to 1956, when he withdrew because of political disagreement. He is reflected in Bufiles as a member of the editorial board of "Studies on the Left" which is described as a quarterly publication in New York dedicated to the leftist point of view. Bufiles also reflect that various editorial board members of this publication have been identified either as active members of the Communist Party or having participated in the activities of the Labor Youth League which has been designated as subversive pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

When the forged Brady letters first appeared in South America, we determined that we do not have an Agent named Thomas A. Brady. A clerk, Thomas Anthony Brady, terminated in 9-46, and an Agent, Thomas Aquinas Brady, terminated in 2-47. We have had no other employees with this name. State Department, after checking with us, authorized U. S. Embassies in South America to deny authenticity of Brady letters and state that neither Mr. Hoover nor anyone else in the U.S. Government wrote them. Correspondent only inquires about the 4-15-64 letter which purports to congratulate Brady and indicate participation by the Bureau and CIA in an operation called "Overhaul" in Brazil. REC 4

This is the second inquiry received in two days iroin individuals with subversive backgrounds inquiring about the authenticity of these forged letters to "Bradv."

RECOMMENDATION: 🐣

That Weinstein be furnished a communication denying the authenticity of the letter in question and advising him that we do not have an Agent named Thomas A. Brady and of the action taken by the State Department in South America denying its authenticity.

Upon appearance of the letter you enclosed in some South American newspapers, the U.S. State Department, after confirmation from this Bureau, authorized United States Embassies in South America to deny its authenticity and to state that neither I nor anyone else in the United States Government had ever written such a letter.







New York City, and reportedly had 210 students registered. The article also indicated that the funds for establishing the FUNY and funds for its operation were supplied in part by non-salaried faculty members most of whom contributed 330 each and also by the students who pay \$24 for each eight week course.

The May 28, 1965, issue of "Newsday", a daily Long Island, New York, newspaper, contained an article entitled, "Krebs To Open Mis Own School. This article related that ALLEM KREBS, a former Adelphi University professor, who claimed he was fired from Adelphi University for his avowed Marxist views, was planning to open a university of his own in a rented Manhattan, New York, loft.

The New York Times, in its issue dated December 12, 1965, contained an article entitled, Students Of Left Set Up Colleges. This article indicated that a number of Counter Universities or "Anti-Universities have been established in various cities throughout the United States like the FUNY. The article mentioned that these institutions vary in many ways. Some are operated under the auspices of a specific organization belonging to the so-called New Left however, others like the FUNY say they are independent of any organization and try to offer courses of a broader cultural orientation.

A source advised on March 14, 1966, that ALLEN KREBS, an expelled former secret member of the Progressive Labor Party (PLP), is the Director of the FUNY.

Source one advised on January 7 and 8, 1954, that he believed Weinstein was a member of the CP while a student at Cornell University during 1948 and 1949, but was unable to recall Weinstein's attendance at any specific CP meetings.

Source one advised on October 20, 1954, that while attending a Labor Youth League (LYL) dance on December 18, 1953, Weinstein



Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The Rosenbergs were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951.

Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 15, 1953.

The "Wisconsin State Journal," a daily newspaper published at Madison, Wisconsin, on November 26, 1959, announced that a new scholarly magazine, "Studies on the Left," (SOTE) a historical review dedicated to the leftist point of virw, edited by present and former graduate students at the University of Wisconsin (UW), but having no connection with the UW itself, would begin publication soon.

Records of the Wisconsin Secretary of State reflect SOTL was incorporated under law of Wisconsin July 16, 1959, as a non-stock, non-profit corporation with headquarters P.O. Box 2121, Madison, Wisconsin. The first issue contained a policy statement from the editors stating SOTL was primarily a magazine for national circulation designed to give younger men with radical views a place to voice their opinions.

Volume #3, Number 2 issue of SOTL, published in February, 1963, contained an announcement that effective March 1, 1963, the new mailing address of SOTL would be "Studies on the Left," Box 33, Planetarium Station, New York 24, New York.

A source advised on May 7, 1965, that SOTE has the mailing address Box 33, Planetarium Station, New York 26, New York, and that JAMES WEINSTEIN is President and MARTIN UNLESS in Secretary-Treasurer of SOTE.


