[REDACTED] b7d of known reliability, advised SAS PAUL L. BRINTON and ROBERT F. ROYAL on January 7 and 8, 1954, that he had met WEINSTEIN while attending Cornell University in about the Fall of 1948.

WEINSTEIN was believed by this informant to have been the Chairman of the WPA group on the Cornell Campus in approximately the Fall of 1948. WEINSTEIN at that time had a Buick Convertible and lived on College Avenue. He roomed with, at approximately this time, one BARRY FEIDEN, who was also a student at Cornell. WEINSTEIN and FEIDEN were students at the New York School of Labor Industrial Relations at Cornell.

Informant vaguely recalls seeing WEINSTEIN at other CP functions of a social nature, however, he was unable to give any specific details concerning these.

Informant believes that WEINSTEIN is a member of the CP, while he was a student at Cornell University, during the 1948-1949 period, however, informant is unable to recall any specific meeting which WEINSTEIN attended.

Informant also recalls that WEINSTEIN resided with MAX FINESTONE at an apartment located at 418 East 9th Street, New York City, during 1950. Information.



On 2/19/54 [redacted] orally advised the writer that he had attended the pre-convention rally of the 2nd LYL National on 2/19/54 at Hunts Point Palace, 953 Southern Blvd., Bronx, NY, where there were approximately 1,500 people in attendance.

Informant continued that during the course of the evening, speeches were given by the following individuals:

STELLA JONES or JOHN, white female, 5'6", 130, brown hair, National Organizational Secretary of the LYL, spoke on the kidnapping of the ROSENBERG children by detectives and Welfare agents to place them in an institution as a further act of vengeance against the convicted Atom spies. STELLA JONES urged everyone present to join in the protest at Foley Square on Saturday, February 20, to assist in the protest of the unjust action against the ROSENBERG children.

LEON WOLFSKY, white male, 6', 30 years, 165, brown hair, National Chairman of the LYL. WOLFSKY spoke on the unemployment of three million six hundred thousand unemployed individuals of whom 10% were youth under 25, and claimed that a statistician's report described anywhere from 6% unemployed should be considered a critical area. WOLFSKY also pointed out an article from "Life" magazine

declaring America "is a paradise for youth with pick of any type job, etc". WOLFSKY declared that we are strangers in this paradise, etc.

PETTIS PERRY, Negro, male, 5'6", white hair, 65 years old, well known CP member. PERRY spoke on cuts on housing appropriations, increase in military appropriations and pointed out that the Soviet Union which has been in existence for 36 years, has always been our friend and we will always fight for them. He further declared that the Soviet Union will never attack the US because our economic situation will be our own downfall.

PAUL ROBESON who is reportedly the head of the LYL paper, "The Challenge" and a well known singer in the NY area, gave a speech on how much has been done and will be done for our youth because they are the future. He also pointed out how imperialists misled by attributing present economic crisis to Communist aggressors and how the imperialists will start war in Indo-China or elsewhere in the near future in order to avert a depression. The informant also noted that ROBESON sang five or six songs.

own request, interviewed by SA'S PAUL L. BRINTON and ROBERT F. ROYAL on 3-29-54) advised on 3-29-54 that she met EDWARD JAMES WEINSTEIN during 1950 while he was residing with MAX FINESTONE at 418 East 9th Street, NYC. T-1 stated that she visited the apartment of WEINSTEIN-FINESTONE [REDACTED] 70

This visit was probably during an evening and they all had dinner together in their apartment and thereafter spent the evening visiting together. (Possibly on this occasion T-1 met DANIEL MARIEN and two girls who also lived in the 418 East 9th Street apartment building. MARIEN was dating one of these girls.)

T-1 further advised that she attending one or two parties at the WEINSTEIN-FINESTONE apartment during the later part of the summer of 1950. These parties were of a social nature and there were other friends of WEINSTEIN and FINESTONE. She was unable to furnish the names of any others who were present inasmuch as they were friends of WEINSTEIN and FINESTONE. [REDACTED] 70

T-1 recalled that WEINSTEIN belonged the Tompkins Square YPA club and on one occasion she attended a dance sponsored by this club. WEINSTEIN was Organizational Secretary of this YPA club or held some similar post. He also was organizing the dances sponsored by this club. She explained that they rented a hall in the Tompkins Square area for a meeting place and for dances. [REDACTED] 70

Concerning FINESTONE, [REDACTED] his parents, HUGH & ANN CHAFFIN who lived on a farm out from Ithaca, N.Y. She believes that they were part of an ALP Movie group in Ithaca. The CHAFFIN'S also would make available their living room for the purpose of having meetings of the Cornell LYL meetings during the 1950-51 period. They were also members of the ALP in Ithaca. T-1 met FINESTONE independently as stated above.

T-1 had heard from heresay that FINESTONE was at one time leader of the CP Student group at Cornell University. This leadership would have been prior to 1950-51 period.

T-1 may be classified as of known reliability, and information should be suitably covered.

Mrs. HELEN LEVY KLEINBERG who resides with her mother, Mrs. HARRY LEVY, 935 Riverside Drive, was interviewed at the NYO on 3/20, 25 and 31/54 by SA's FRANK C. KEIBER and CHESTER A. REILLY. She had previously applied for Passport to rejoin her husband in Brazil and had given the State Department an affidavit admitting Communist Party membership while a student at Cornell University.

Mrs. KLEINBERG in a signed statement dated 3/31/54 admitted joining the AYD in the spring of 1945 and membership in the Student Section of the Communist Party at Cornell University from the end of 1945 or early 1946 until June, 1949.

Mrs. KLEINBERG reviewed photographs in Cornell Year Books and identified 34 persons as being attendants at meetings of the Student Section of the Communist Party at Cornell. She said she could not say they were members because she had not seen their Communist Party cards, but assumed they were members because they attended the meetings. Although numerous meetings were held at the apartment of Mrs. KLEINBERG she was not able to give specific information on most persons and was unable to give dates or places of meetings where she had seen them. She thought many of these persons had originally lived in New York City.

The statement signed by Mrs. KLEINBERG is being retained as an exhibit in 100-112435.

The following information appears in said statement on the above subject:

JAMES WEINSTEIN was a regular attendant at meetings of the Student Section of the Communist Party at Cornell University. He was from New York City and a member of the class of 1949. He was very wealthy and was ashamed of it. For some reason the rest of us could not understand, he had been exempt from attending meetings. He had been a member of the Student Section of the Communist Party some time before we became aware that he was a member and attended meetings.

KESSLER stated he had resided at his present address for two to three years. He had formerly resided at 85-14 135th Ave., Ozone Park, from approximately 1951 to 1955 and had resided at Menahan Street, Brooklyn, for approximately ten years prior to this time. He stated he was 68 years old, had a wife named JEAN, who resides with him, and conducts a mail order business in shoelaces. He stated he had never been a member of the CP or any affiliated organizations. He stated he had never heard of JACK and MYRA SOBIECHOWSKI or JACOB ALBAM and was unable to identify photographs of these individuals. He explained that in the course of conducting his mail order business, he uses each borough directory and goes through same designating mail to each person listed therein, requesting they purchase shoelaces from him as this is his only means of support. (It is noted that KESSLER's arms have been amputated below the elbows and his legs have been amputated above the knees).



"The National Convention of the LABOR YOUTH LEAGUE, meeting for the two day period February 23-24, 1957, was held at the Broadway Central Hotel (the offices of the New Challenge), 673 Broadway and Fourth, Room 509.

"A head-count by HARVEY COHEN, who also collected the delegates fees, revealed that over a two day period, a total of forty-seven people attended this convention, although this number, he added, varied slightly from one day to the other. The California delegate, for instance, left on

"Saturday evening, casting his vote for dissolution, by proxy, through EARL DURHAM. Of the forty-seven individuals present, there were as HARVEY COHEN further indicated in his financial report, seven districts represented (this besides New York City). This meant that a sum total of twenty-seven votes could be cast, although not all these districts were fully represented at the convention. JIM JONES, for instance, representing New York City, was able to cast a total of six votes (this included his own) for the dissolution of the LEAGUE.

"The personnel [REDACTED] b7d

[REDACTED] during this two day period, is as follows. C-C (A Negress. She explained that she was a shop worker. C-C is portly, full of good humor), ROZ (A thinish White Woman), AL (possibly of Mexican origin. AL during a conversation Saturday evening told me he was chairman of one of the two LYL Clubs in Chicago), and HANK BERRY (Negro), were the delegates from CHICAGO. CHICAGO had a total of six votes to cast. [REDACTED] b7d

"MARV ENGEL (one time resident of Flint and Detroit), and CORA (A Negress inclined to chattering at the drop of a pin), were the delegates from WISCONSIN. [REDACTED] b7d

"The NEW YORKERS present [REDACTED] b7d

EARL DURHAM, HARVEY COHEN, JULIE LOWITT, JUDY TREISMAN, TEDDY (white, balding, moustached, with glasses, and heavy set cigar smoking man), HERBIE (short, thinish, pleasant looking, receding hairline with splashes of grey breaking through)

"JIM JONES (Negro). JUDY TREISMAN is a student at Columbia, is white, and at one time was liked by ██████████ MARK SOLOMON. JULIE, TEDDY, and HERBIE were continually referred to as being "Founding fathers of the LABOR YOUTH LEAGUE." Also attending the convention (on Sunday only) were three students representing City College, ██████████ b7d

"The State of WASHINGTON had three official delegates, whose names I cannot remember. However, the spokesman for the group is a shortish fellow with glasses (5'6" I would guess), sandy haired. He is one of seven children, all of whom are LABOR YOUTH LEAGUE members. He hails from Seattle, and I believe he is the chairman of one of the Washington Clubs. His companion at the convention was a sixteen year old girl, although I cannot supply you with anymore information. If memory serves, MIKE MILLER called her 'LUCY.' I know nothing of the other delegate.

"The state of NEW JERSEY had two delegates at the convention. The spokesman for this state is a fattish fellow, rather sloppily dressed. His name is HANK, and in Newark his occupation is that of auto mechanic. His companion, a white male, was not more than fifteen years of age, short, pimply and thin.

"The lone delegate from CALIFORNIA was MERTON GOOSHIS. SOLOMON later confirmed that MERTON is a transplanted Brooklynite. The California delegate lives in San Francisco. His sandy hair is closely cropped, he stands about five-six, and is inclined to be described as 'fat.'

"BOB ALBERT was the sole delegate from the state of Connecticut. BOB is once more living in Brooklyn, and since the fall (it was explained by MARK) has been the direct cause of two broken engagements. I don't personally see why, he has a low hairline (black thick hair), stoutish, and sloppily dressed.


"The state of OHIO had one representative, GEORGE a former boxer (small sandy-reddish haired fellow) and one unofficial delegate, his wife SANDY. SANDY, a one time Detroit (Wayne University Student) had been married to STAN GOETZ.


"There was one delegate from BALTIMORE. His name is FRANK. FRANK is possibly non-Jewish, he is married, and is a heavy-set fellow, wearing tweeds both days I saw him.

"Upper NEW YORK STATE had one delegate. TEDDY is a short balding fellow with glasses, youngish, who speaks in a halting manner, choosing his words carefully. He made a great deal of sense, more than other speakers.

"The WEINSTIENS, about to become parents, are a young Jewish couple. JIMMY is attending classes at Columbia, post graduate work, and hopes to become a lawyer. b7d

"THE FIRST SESSION - 23 February 1957

"A procedure was set up during the opening moments of the Convention. EARL DURHAM would read the main report, this dealing with the History of the LABOR YOUTH LEAGUE. We would then break for a one hour lunch period, return at two o'clock and have a discussion for the remainder of the day. If further discussion was needed, we would meet again on Sunday, the time set at eleven.

"I remember only a few of the statements verbatim of EARL's Report. 'Under attack,' He said, 'We spoke out and did not close up--- We were against Jim Crow

"and for Negro-White Unity." Later on, 'One of our concepts was to develop interest in Marxism.' But because of certain developments, the League's unsuccessful fight for legality, the twentieth Congress, it became impossible to continue. It was agreed that because of the Mc Carren Act, this hanging over EARL's head, no mention would be made of any other organization. The lawyers told EARL to dissolve the LEAGUE and that to discuss the forming of another organization during this convention would be unlawful. EARL warned that this would be out of the question, no delegate was to attempt to form any type of association at this meeting. If anyone had such plans, he suggested that they talk about it over coffee, out of the building, and include him OUT. Therefore a restriction was placed on the delegates. They could not discuss any other group to be formed, nor could they disclose the name or type of organization in which they now served. The purpose of this convention was to dissolve. After EARL's report, we broke for lunch.

"During the moments in which people silently shuffled out of the room I saw LEON LETWIN, camera in hand. LEON was taking pictures for historical memory. LEON, it was explained by MARK only wanted to record this convention on film for historical purposes.

"At the beginning of the afternoon session, a chairman was elected. MARV ENGIL accepted the post only after LEON LETWIN, MARK SOLOMON, and HANK BERRY had refused to chair the session. The discussion for the most part was a haltering one. At times there was dead silence in the room, no one having anything new to add, to expound, or delve into.

"The content of the various speeches varied from direct attacks on EARL, 'the founding fathers,' and at times a confused expression of grave concern as to what is in order now with the League about to become a thing of the past.

"HANK, New Jersey, spoke about the League and the concept of the Vanguard Role. Had the League played a Vanguard Role? In the playing of this Vanguard Role was the League aping the Communist Party? If so, we were in effect a 'Youth Arm of the Communist Party' and nothing else? HANK felt our purpose in the LYL had been to train and enlighten the Youth of America to Socialism. How successful had been this accomplished? If the League, in effect, did model itself after the Communist Party, we did create our own obstacles, which in the end saw our defeat.

"The Seattle Washington delegate spoke in terms of the positive experiences of the past months. There is, in the Washington Club, an increase in membership, renewed activity and a 'new approach.' This delegate criticised the National Office for their poor communication with the Washingtonians. It wasn't until two months ago that the Washington Club had heard of the proposed disbandment. He ended his speech by stating that he was for the continuation of the League and believed that if we sat down and really put our heads together we could 'lick the problem.'

"MERTON (California) spoke about the economic factors of this Country as being uncompatible to Socialist growth. He agreed with EARL's statement that the 20th Congress did get us all balled up. But for the principle point, his speech was concerned with the economic factors. MERTON held that America being one of the wealthiest countries in the world, with such a high living standard, had much to offer youth. The wealth that this country offered the youth was too much, and proved to be the main factor in the lack of Socialist growth. The objective desire to gain wealth, power, etc., overpowered the American youth, and Socialism faced with this factor, cannot grow.

"TEDDY, a founding father, spoke briefly about the original concept of the LYL. This was done in order to straighten up the concepts various people had concerning the LEAGUE. It was not a 'Youth Arm of the Communist Party,' it was an organization dedicated to the study of Marxism. This was the purpose for which it was formed -- to train the youth in the spirit of Marxism and Leninism.

"JULIE more or less echoed the same sentiments. However, JULIE spoke for a longer period of time. JULIE called himself 'The founding father', and said that in November, 1949 when he had formed the organization he had in mind an organization dedicated to the fight of equal rights, etc. To a great extent, he is not dissatisfied at the results. For during this time we did exist, no one can deny that. If one could name the one reason for the disbandment of the League, JULIE thought it was this. 'We have run against a wall. There is a loss of fresh ideas. Without fresh ideas no organization, no matter how great their membership records, financial reports, or what have you, can keep in operation.'

"HERBIE, another founding father, spoke next. His speech, not very long, nonetheless was in the same vein. HERBIE felt that the one thing we had not lost, which is manifest in this meeting was our integrity, no one could take this away from us.

"FRANK (Baltimore) held the floor next. FRANK felt that a great deal of our trouble, both past and present stemmed from our being stand-patters. Our conceptions of the American youth, were furthermore based on a skimpy knowledge of pre-war (II) youth. We were totally out of touch with the youth, and this was one reason for our failure. To illustrate his point he told a joke, (this having to do with a Jehovah witness who upon being asked why he did not advertise his ware by verbal or visual motions, answered that he would serve God in the manner in which he wanted.).

"ROZ (Chicago) stated in her speech that she felt there was no place for Socialistic growth in the present period. She too posed a problem, what is to become of the youth? Are the youth, interested in Socialism to be put up for grabs, any organization claiming them? This presented a grave problem, which ROZ felt should be settled before we left.

"MARK held the floor a few moments and told about our positive experience in both Student activities and Teenage Work. He spoke glowingly about our teenage club. (The LEAGUE TEENS) and about the Student Group (Wayne) in which positive influence was being made. He further indicated that another group, a teenage club was also being influenced. (MIKE MILLER made mention of attending two meetings of this nameless club). MARK ended by stating that Marxist ideals do have a place in this period, and that each of us should search out new ways to influence and bring to the youth the message of Socialism.

"TEDDY (New York State) had a story to tell. This was the tale of the corpse, who in his will stipulated that he be buried upright behind the wheel of his cadillac. As the car was being lowered into the ground, there was an exchange between attendants. One attendant turned to the other and stated, 'That guy sure knows how to live.' This same thing can be applied to the situation of the Labor Youth League today. TEDDY naturally feels horrible about the disbandment of the LYL, yet he sees no way out.

"JIM JONES spoke up next. He was emotionally distraught so that by the end of his speech he was screeching. He defied the true culprits to be named. They were the real killers of the League. Instead of sticking around when the trouble started, they took off. 'They turned tail and ran, that's what they did.' These culprits were named.

" 'LEON WOLFSY and BOB FOGEL that's who they are.' 'Why aren't they around to face the music?' Now visibly shaking, his voice losing its tenor, JIM JONES concluded that he stood for the concepts of Marxism-Leninism and not any G-D-tactics, he believed in being forthright and not running as soon as the trouble started.

"JULIE's answer was short and to the point. Both BOB FOGEL and LEON WOLFSY did not run. Both men were out of the picture long before talk of dissolution had begun. They were not present today because, 'Their field of work, and interests had directed them to other paths of work.'


"Following on the tail of this little incident, after a few minor statements from other delegates was CORA (Wisconsin). She spoke in a gush of words about her two year experience in the LEAGUE. Perhaps she was stating that the LEAGUE had never met her needs and that the LEAGUE had no enthusiasm, and was isolated. I can only summarize this, for she continually coupled her grief with such statements as 'I can talk all day if you let me' or 'Just ask me, I may be wrong, but I'll give you an answer.'

"It was growing late, people were becoming restless. The chair made a motion to adjourn until tomorrow (Sunday). When MARK SOLOMON tried to object, MARV informed MARK that he could not do this unless he challenged the chair. EARL then informed the convention audience that the rule was that in challenging the chair, the challenger would have to state his reasons in five minutes. In truth, I say the chair was challenged by MARK, for MARK made the challenging speech, but in truth the challenge came from MIKE MILLER. MARK's statement in substance stated that he wished to see the convention end this evening as Michigan delegates had a long way to travel by car. MARK felt a night session, say for three hours or so would complete the business. MARV ENGEL,

"stepping aside (speaking merely as a delegate) spoke at length about doing things decently. Sure he knew that the LEAGUE was a thing of the past, but why rush things, remember the people back home had a right to know. A five minute recess was called, and delegates conferred in whispers about the proposal. The proposal was defeated, a rollcall vote being taken. MARV was in the act of adjourning the meeting when another challenge by MIKE MILLER was voiced. MARK SOLOMON again answered the challenge and stated that the Michigan delegation would like to leave as early as possible on Sunday afternoon. This challenge was successful, for the starting time for the Sunday session was moved up from eleven to ten o'clock.

"The meeting was then adjourned.

"THE SECOND SESSION - 24 February 1957

"HANK BERRY" (Chicago) was elected as chairman of this meeting. The discussion of Saturday was more or less continued. The main feeling, one could easily see, was not one so much to infuse life into a 'dead' thing, but one of shock. Since people were out until all hours on Saturday, there was an air of sleepiness about the place. The haggling was at a slower pitch. Some people spoke about positive experiences, others were convinced that the LEAGUE should be buried, but with kindness. Washington was against any thought of dissolution, he doggedly spoke in terms of paying back bills the LEAGUE owed, all was not hopeless, etc.

"JIM JONES posed the question of those stranded between the LEAGUE and the Party. What would happen to them? Where would they drift?

"JUDY TREISMAN held the floor a few moments. She stated that we did not have the answers anymore. Intellectuals were in a crisis today, no longer did they hold that man's inheritance was purely Social, but of a Social-Biological nature. This theory suits JUDY more than the Socialist doctrines of Marx and Engels. 'We just don't have the answers that's all.'

"EARL DURHAM, looking terribly ill, asked to speak. This type of searching discussion, he felt, could continue indefinitely, we would do well to move on to the other points on the agenda. A financial report was made up by HARVEY on the Subway [REDACTED] \$1100.00 is owed to the lawyers. Their offices are at 505 5th Avenue, New York City. Another debt of \$450.00 is owed to the leaders for backpay. \$150.00 alone is owed ALETHIA LETWIN (no explanation given)... In cash the National Office has some \$133.00. D

"It was at this point that HARVEY told the delegation about the attendance of the convention, naming off the seven districts present.

"There was little discussion about this point.

"EARL then read the various resolutions submitted by the various districts.

Bu

The only resolution against the dissolution of the LEAGUE was that of Washington.

"Also read was a document prepared by the National Office. This statement is to be forwarded to all districts and read to all members now that the LEAGUE is dissolved. In substance this document said that no one club or person in this country can call himself by the name of LABOR YOUTH LEAGUE after the date 24th February 1957, except for the explicit purpose of dissolving their particular club. All documents pertaining to LYL business, or personal matters are to be referred to the Law Firm on 5th Avenue with EARL as sole executor. All assets and office equipment must be removed from the premises of the League Headquarters by the 28th of this month. The only individual who can transact business, as yet uncompleted is EARL DURHAM (in the name of the LYL).

"Another shorter resolution reading somewhat as follows 'We resolve that all copies of New Challenge by turned over to the Library of Congress and the New York City Library for the use of future historians' met with great approval.

"There was some discussion about the resolutions.

"HANK BERRY wisely kept the discussion keyed only to the resolutions. Several of the Brooklyn students attempted to infiltrate their speeches with other issues. They spoke about the League on the Campus of City College, and were about to expound further on this subject, but BERRY silenced them. He reminded them of the resolution before the committee and that they could only talk about this specific issue. Silenced on this front, they in turn demanded to know about the statements to the Press. How would they be worded. EARL felt this could be worked out after a vote on the resolution to disband the League was taken. The Brooklyn students wanted to make certain that the press received the story correctly. The true purpose of disbandment was due to Mc Cart yism, the 20th Congress, etc. It was felt that this point was bogging down progress, and that it would be well to argue this out afterwards.

"The chairman, HANK BERRY, felt that the only vote which would be valid was a roll call of votes.

"Chicago? He said. Chicago casts its six votes for dissolv_ment, AL said.

"Wisconsin? The great state of Cheese and McCarthy, Wisconsin casts two vote_ for disbandment, MARV said.

"Michigan? Michigan casts three votes for disbandment, one vote for retention. (MIKE MILLEK was the odd ball).

"Washington? The Washington delegate cast his three votes for retention of the League.

"Baltimore? FRANK said, 'Nine tenths of Baltimore casts it's vote for disbandment. The remaining one tenth is hit right here (indicating his heart) and votes for retention.

"TEDDY from Buffalo also voted for dissolution.

"GEORGE from Ohio voted for dissolution.

"MERTON, voting by proxy, also cast his vote in favor of dissolution.

"New York? JIM JONES got to his feet. 'The Great and Glorious State of New York casts its six votes for dissolution.'

"There were three abstentions. From whom, I don't know, although I feel the three Brooklyn students were the abstainers. In the process it was discovered that New York was allowed only six votes. The totals then are as follows: For dissolution of the LYL: 20, for retention: 4 votes, abstentions: 3.

"MIKE MILLER rose to his feet. The Michigan delegation wished to be excused. CORA from Wisconsin quickly made a motion to adjourn. It was affirmatively voted on, and the meeting ended with the Michigan delegation receiving a merry round of applause.
