For Chicago's information, on September 30, 1949, KATIE MAE MORTON, 605 - 15th Street, Denver, Colorado, gave the books and records of "THE CHALLENGE" newspaper to Special Agents LOUIS D. WELAN, G. EDWARD SMART, and JOSEPH C. LEARNED. These records had been left in her possession during the latter part of 1947 by RAE H. GWTNN, Circulation and Business Manager. Mrs. NORTON advised that she had been unable to contact either RAE H. GWYNN or GRAWAN P. DOLAN, Editor, to ascertain what disposition should be made of these records and inasmuch as she was in the process of destroying the records anyway, she readily agreed to give them to the above-named Agents.

THE CHALLENGE", originally a weekly but subsequently changed to a bi-weekly newspaper, was published by the Rocky Mountain Toundation for a Free Press, Denver, Colorado, from March 24, 1946, to September 6, 1947. Investigation has determined and the signed statement of EDWARD J. CURRIE, former Business Manager of "THE CHALLENGE" and a self-admitted former Communist Party member, has substantiated the domination of the newspaper by the Communist Party. CURRIE, together with other informants, has identified the following members of the news-. paper's staff as being members of the Communist Party who frequently conferred with ARTHUR BARY, Regional Director, Rocky Mountain Region, Communist Party, USA, concerning the paper's policy and adhered to his direction:


On 5/21/53 MAURICE NALKIN, former member of the Central Committee of the CP, USA, was interviewed by SA JAMES G. FITZCERALD and the writer and supplied the following information concerning the captioned organization.

The National Lawyers Guild was the new name assumed by the International Juridical Association after it, the IJA, became known as a communist front. The personnel in the newly formed NLG was the same only the name was changed. The IJA was formed in 1932 in the office of JOSEPH BRODSKY (deceased), 799 Broadway, New York City. Among the members of the Organization Committee at this initial meeting in 1932 were himself, JOSEPH BRODSKY, ELIAS SC. LATZBART, CAROL KING, EDMAN KUNTZ, ALIAN TANE and several other individuals whose names he could not recall. The purpose in forming the IJA was to draw attorneys into the organization so as to educate them on the Warxist approach to current problems so as to enable them to better defend communists, to have the members 'bore from within' in the Bar Associations, and to join Communist Fronts so as to spread the CP's influence.

JOSEPH BRODSKY in his position as Secret member of the Central Committee was able to utilize Communist Party funds for the organizing of the NLG. It was the Communist Party's duty and function to obtain funds for the defense of its accused members and since this would be a heavy drain upon the funds the party needed attorneys sympathetic to them and willing . to accept the cases at a much lower fee. BRODSKY, who was in charge of the legal defense of CP members and who was the legal brains of the party therefore was the guiding force behind the formation of the NLG.

The NLG was definitely organized, controlled and directed by the Communist Party ..

YUDITCH, the Manager of the Chicago Morning Freiheit, M. REZNIKOFF and that the Justice Dept. is trying to take away the citizenship from NOVICK and ALMAZOR" (believed to be ALMAZOFF).

Aaron Goodelman, member of the Ikuf Presidium and instructor at the Jefferson School and member of the Sholom Aleichem C.P. Club told me of a meeting of the Morning Freiheit he attended on March 11th, 1954 at the Adelphi Hall in New York.

The meeting was called by the Morning Freiheit for the purpose of "starting a national campaign to protect the freedom of speech and the press".

Goodelman said that over 200 people, leaders of different Jewish mass organizations, trade unions, Societies and cultural groups came to this meeting.

Goodelman said that the speakers at this meeting underlined that the fight to protect the Morning Freiheit, its editor P. Novick and Yuditch and Almazor, members of the Horning Freiheit editorial board is "a fight that concerns everyone and especially every Jew in the country; that the movement against the persecution of the Horning Freiheit and its writers will strenghten the movement against the fascist Walter-Mc Carran law. Some of the speakers stated that under this law not only progressive people, writers and workers of the progressive press, but even members of the Arbeiter Ring and the National Workers Verband (right wing Jewish Organizations) are being hunted and persecuted".

P. Novick told the meeting that every Jewish leader of different political beliefs came out against the Walter-Mc Carran Act. He said that this act "is a menace to all foreign born; that under this law the government is trying to deport the labor editor of the Morning Freiheit, P. Yuditch, the manager of the Chicago Morning Freiheit M. Reznikoff and that the Justice Department is trying to take away the citizenship from Movick and Almazor. The fact that the Justice Department is out to get the Morning Freiheit underlines the fascist-anti-Semitic nature of the Walter-Mc Carran law. Novick stated that in the present drive of reaction every Jewish newspaper is in danger".

In his speech Novick called upon the people "to a determined struggle against the dark forces of reaction-against Mc Carthyism".

Almezor stated in his speech that that "the progressive writers are struggling to protect the freedom and the rights of the people."

Edward Kuntz; lawyer, stated the attacks being made against the Morning Freiheit and the accussations against the paper are baseless. That the aim of these attacks is the destruction of democracy in this country and that the nation can not have this to happen.

Chaim Suller, manager of the Morning Freiheit, told the meeting that "the warning given by many that readtions will not stop with the attack upon communists only is now coming into realization by many who thought that the persecutions are being simed against the most advanced elements of the progressive movement only. Even Wechsler of the N.Y. Post was dregged before Senator Mc Carthy. Not only this a former president of the United States is being attacked. A general and the whole army is being insulted. This is reaction in action. No one is immune from attacks by Mc Carthyism". Suller called upon the people to fight against reaction; to build the Morning Freiheit; to complete as soon as possible to Morning Freiheit 3175,000 fund drive and to make the Carnegie 32nd celebration of the Morning Freiheit (April 10th) "a people's demonstration for the right and freedom of the nation".

Goodelman told me that the meeting elected a committee of 50 with the understanding that this committee will be enlarged "as the struggle developes". The task of this committee is the creation of a national movement to fight for the Morning Freiheit and its workers.

Local committees for this purpose will be set up in every Jewish community all over the country.



During the course of an interview by Bureau, Agents on 7/19/50, with "ALFRED EPAMINONDAS SARANT, was, ET AL; ESPIONAGE-R" (Bufile 65-59242, NYfile 65-15360), he executed a waiver authorizing Bureau Agents to conduct a search of his home at Cayuga Heights Road, RD #1, Ithaca, NY. Among items located was a Bates List Finder containing names, addresses, and telephone numbers, among which was the following:

"DALE c/o KUNTZ, 201 West 16th Street, WA 9-7557"

As noted in rerep, subject has a daughter, DALE KUNTZ. This individual's married name is DALE GALSTON.

In an effort to ascertain DALE GALSTON's association with ALFRED SARANT, SAS HAROLD F. DODGE and BERLE M. GOODENOW endeavored to interview Mrs. GALSTON at her residence, 323 West Montana Street, Pasadena, California, on 10/1/54. As soon as the Agents identified themselves, Mrs. GALSTON stated "I'm sorry, I have nothing to say to you." When it was brought to her attention that she was not aware of the purpose of the interview, she stated "I have nothing to say that would interest you," and closed the door.

In view of the nature of the foregoing information concerning subject's daughter, DALE GALSTON, it was not included in details of rerep.

The foregoing information furnished by the state of included in details of rerep in order to insure protection of that source's identity.

On 8/3/50, Former ND 426 furnished SA M.A. THOMPSON and SE STEPHEN W. JENNINGS a 44-page pamphlet entitled "Mid Century Ball." It was issued by the NY County ALP and presents the 1950 policy of the ALP-NY's Progressive Party. On page 36 of instantial pamphlet, EDWARD KUNTZ, not further identified, is listed among the "Boosters for American Labor Party."

Inasmuch as subject's son is also named EDWARD KUNTZ, the foregoing was not included in details of rerep since it is not known whether this information pertains to the subject.

On 3/19/51, Former CSNY 26 furnished SA ALBERT J. KLEIN a copy of a Western Union telegram, dated 3/17/51, sent out by HENRY ABRAMS, 884 West End Avenue, NYC, the text of which follows:

LETTER TO DIRECTOR, PBI NY 100 57195

"MARCANTONIO WILL ADDRESS NEXT CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT MEETING AT PIFTH SOUTH THURSDAY MARCH 22ND IMPERATIVE EVERY EXECUTIVE MEMBER ATTEND."

EDWARD KUNTZ, 201 West 16th Street, NYC, was among those to whom above telegram was sent.

The foregoing information furnished by Former CSNY 26 was not included in details of rerep in order to insure protection of that source's identity.

On 2/19/51, Former ND 516 advised SA ALFRED B. NOVAK that SOPHIE STEINBERG, wife of SIDNEY STEINBERG, was at the office of EDWARD KUNTZ, attorney, 207 4th Avenue, NYC, and that this informant believed that STEINBERG's wife possibly worked for KUNTZ.

On 7/5/51, EDWARD KUNTZ was interviewed by SA JOHN T. MURPHY at which time KUNTZ stated that he did not know SIDNEY STEINBERG and that he did not employ STEINBERG's wife. He stated that an individual named MORRIS GREENBAUM, a lawyer and an accountant, occupies space in the same room as he.

On 7/9/51, KUNTZ advised that he had talked with GREENBAUM, who had told him that Mrs. STEINBERG was working for a client of GREENBAUM. At this time, Mrs. STEINBERG worked in GREENBAUM's office for a period of about eight or nine days. He stated that she then moved to the main office of the client at 80 Fifth Avenue. KUNTZ further stated that GREENBAUM was then an auditor for the IWO.

The foregoing information was not included in details of rerep, inasmuch as it is substantially negative in nature.

On 11/2/51, Mr. EDWARD TAYLOR, Associated Reporting Company, Press Building, Washington, D.C.,

furnished WFO with copies of addressograph plates used in the mailing of the "Hungarian Bulletin" and "New Hungary," propaganda tabloids disseminated by the Hungarian Legation, Washington, D.C. Since August, 1951, the title "New Hungary" has been used exclusively and the Legation transmits the aforementioned periodicals to some individuals from whom no specific request was received for the paper.

The name of EDWARD KUNTZ, 207 4th Avenue, NYC, was among those on the aforementioned mailing plates, but inasmuch as subject may not have specifically requested the above periodicals, as explained above, this information was not included in details of rerep.

On 11/10/52, CSNY 48 furnished SA JAMES E. GIBLER and SE K.F. BUCKLEY a list which is believed to be a list of persons and organizations solicited to purchase tickets for a GUS HALL testimonial during the course of his trial under the Smith Act of 1940, inasmuch as the name GUS HALL appears in upper right hand corner of this list. On this list appears the notations "Edward Kuntz ALP 313-8th Ave Wa 4-2595" beside which appear the notations "sent (5) tickets" and "to late."

Inasmuch as the significance of the foregoing information furnished by CSNY 48 is uncertain, same was not included in details of rerep.

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

REIMER:

That is correct.

TAVENNER:

Were you a member of the Communist Party at the time you became employed by the National Labor Relations Board?

Will you tell the committee when you became a member of the Communist Party, and under what circumstances?

RIEMER:

I became a member of the Communist Party late in 1935 or early in 1936. I cannot give this committee the exact date of that step. But as this committee knows, the mid-1930's was a period of great unemployment, unrest, confusion, and indecision, and I was particularly disturbed by those conditions domestically, and I was disturbed by events abroad particularly in Germany. As a

Jew, I was deeply concerned. And it was represented to me that the Communist Party had a program, an effective one to contribute to a solution of some of those ills; and I was solicited to join and I did so.



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I am glad now of the opportunity to make known what I did, and to explain to the committee how and under the circumstances it occurred.

TAVENNER:

Where was this group or cell of the Communist Party of which you became a member located in the city of New York?

RIEMER:

Some time after I became a member, I was assigned or directed to a lawyers group.

TAVENNER:

In what area?

RIEMER:

It was in Manhattan -- I know that.

TAVEN NER:

Before we go further I think that you should tell the committee by whom you were recruited into the Communist Party.

RIEMER:

I was solicited to join the Communist Party by a man by the name of Gerson, his first name was Simon, who was, at that time if I am not mistaken, the city hall reporter of the New York Daily Worker.

I had met him during the summer of 1935. I was living that summer in Croton, N. Y., a summer community, and I used to commute daily between New York City and there, a distance of about 35 or 40 miles. I met Gerson, and he would be on the train going one way or coming the other, and I got to know him. We used to play golf together as a matter of fact, and he was the one who solicited my membership.

TAVENNER:

Were you immediately assigned to this group of lawyers composing a cell of the Communist Party?

RIEMER:

No, I don't think that I was immediately assigned. I think that there was a reriod or agap in there. How long it was, I do not know.

TAVENNER:

Was this group to which you were assigned made up entirely of members of the legal

profession?

RIEHER:

Yes, I would say exclusively.

TAVENNER:

Will you tell the committee approximately the number of attorneys who belonged to this group, or cell, of the Communist

Party?

RIEMER:

I would place it in the neighborhood of

15 to 20.

RIEMER:

In the period between my first participation

and late 1936.

TAVENNER:

When did your first participation begin?

Were a 11 of these persons members of the legal profession?

Yes. Martin Kurasch, K-u-r-s-s-c-h, although I must say with respect to him that I did not know him at that time, and I think I met him for the first time only after I came to Washington. I did not know him in New York.

TAVENNER:

Let us confine ourselves for the moment to those in the legal profession who were members with you in your group in New York.

RIEMER:

I will continue.

TAVENNER:

So Martin Kurasch would come out of the list?

RIEMER:

Yes. Martin Popper, P-o-p-p-e-r. Alex Racobin, R-a-c-o-b-i-n. Harry Sacher, S-a-c-h-e-r.

Mr. SCHERER:

Is that the same Harry Sacner who was sentenced for contempt as a result of his conduct before Judge Medina in the trial of the original 11 Communists in New York?

RIEMER:

Yes, sir.

Mr. SCHERER:

The same Harry Sacher representing persons who have appeared before this committee?

TAVENNER:

Yes, sir.

Mr. SCHERER:

I remember him very well.

RIEMER:

I think the last name I gave you was Sacher. The next name on my list is Frank Scheiner, S-c-h-e-i-n-e-r. David Scribner, S-c-r-i-b-n-e-r.

Mr. SCHERER:

Isn't he the present general counsel for the United Electrical, Radio, and Machine Workers of America?

RIEMER:

I believe he is.

Mr. SCHERER:

The United Electrical Workers as we all know was expelled some time ago by the CIO because of its Communist domination, and we all remember Mr. Ecribner from his numerous appearances before this committee in various parts of the country, representing identified Communists. I think this identification of Mr. Scribner now explains some of his conduct and attitude in representing these individuels before this committee over the years.

RIEMER:

Robert Silberstein, S-i-1-b-e-r-s-t-e-i-n.

TAVENNER:

Do you know whether this is the same Robert Silberstein who became executive secretary of the National Lawyers Guild?

RIEMER:

No, I cannot answer that. Once I ceased my connection with it, I Trankly paid no more attention to it, and I cannot

answer or verify that. It would be a matter of documentary evidence, I am sure.

It is Robert J. Silberstein.

TAVENNER:

Do you know that his middle initial was $n_{J}^{n_{2}}$

That is right.

TAVENNER:

Fir. Chairman, you will no doubt recall that we subpensed Mr. Robert J. Silberstein, the executive secretary of the National Lawyers Guild before the committee in 1952. He refused to answer any material questions, relying upon the fifth amendment.

RIEMER:

Joseph Tauber, T-a-u-b-e-r. Abraham Unger, U-n-g-e-r, and Arthur Silverman, S-i-i-v-e-r-m-a-n. Now, that would complete my list of positive recollection.

TAVENNER:

Did Simon Gerson have any connection with the operation of this cell?

RIEMER:

Absolutely not to my knowledge.

TAVEHNER:

Was there any liaison between this group and higher authority in the Communist Party?

RIEMER:

Not to my knowledge.

TAVENNER:

At least you had no personal knowledge of it?

RIEMER:

I had no personal knowledge of it; no, sir.

TAVENNER:

Was this group addressed from time to time by leaders of the Communist Party on a higher level?

RIEMER:

Not to my knowledge, and in my presence; no, sir.

TAVENNER:

When you became a member of this group, were you given a card or was any record made of your membership?

RIEMER:

I do not think so. As a matter of fact, I cannot recall, actually filling out an application card, but if it was the practice to do so in those days, undoubtedly I did. But I have no recoilection of having received back either a membership card or a book or anything of that sort. I don't think that they were issued.

TAVENNER:

Do you recall whether or not the suggestion was made to you as to the use of a pseudonym instead of your real name?

RIEMER:

I think so. I used one.

TAVENNER:

What would be the occasion for your using an assumed name?

RIEMER:

Actually I do not know. That is, I never used the pseudonym myself.

TAVENNER:

As between you and these other members were you all on such terms that you knew each other without the necessity of using an assumed name?

RIEMER:

That is correct.

TAVENNER:

If there was any record kept for purposes of checking on dues payments or for any other purpose, would you then have used the assumed name?

RIEMER:

I never used it.

TAVENNER:

You did not?

RIEMER:

No.

TAVENNER:

I thought I understood you to say that you did?

RIEMER:

Perhaps I misspoke. I had a pseudonym, but in fact I me ver used it because there was never any occasion to use it.

TAVENNER:

What was your name?

RIEMER:

Robert Mortimer.

TAVENNER:

Do you recall whether these other attorneys in this group also used fictitious names?

RIEMER:

That I do not know.

TAVENNER:

Did you at any time hold any position in this group?

RIEMER:

No, sir.

TAVENNER:

How frequently did this group meet?

RIEMER:

This entire group did not meet together. My recollection is that at the most, perhaps 7 or 8 would meet.

TAVENNER:

At one time?

RIEMER:

At one time, yes. and it would meet perhaps once a week, possibly once every 2 weeks. I am not sure.

TAVENNER:

Where were the meetings held?

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RIEMER:

Mr. Silberstein.

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TAVENNER:

Do you recall the specific courses or documents with which you dealt?

RIEMER:

There was no course but the Communist Party had voluminous publications, leaflets, pamphlets, and what not. They would be distributed at meetings. On 1/10/57, which was the has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that EDDIE AURIE had reportedly died of a brain tumor and that funeral services were to be held at Universal Chapel, 52nd St. and Lexington Ave. at 2 PM on 1/11/57.

On 5/1/57 the writer observed that the "New York Times" issue of h/11/57, p. 31, col. 2, carries the following article: ".......Edward Kunts, a lawyer here for forty years, died yesterday at Memorial Hospital. His age was 62. He lived at 201 West Sixteenth Street and had an office at 207 Fourth Avenue.

Whr. Kunts participated in many cases involving civil liberties and labor union matters. During the existence of the Legal Staff of the International Labor Defense, he was one of its trial counsels.

"A number of Mr. Kunts' cases involved pickets arrested during strikes in the Mineteen Thirties. He also defended a man arrested during the riots that followed the tearing down of a Maxi flag on the liner Bremen at its North River pier in 1935.

"Mr. Kuntz was one of the two attorneys for Morton Sobell when he steed trial in 1951 with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg on charges of espionage for the Soviet Union. The Rosenbergs were executed on July 19, 1953. Sobell is ferving a thirty-pear term in Alcatraz prison.

"In 1936, Mr. Kuntz was an unsuccessful candidate for the Court of General Sessions on the All Peopless party ticket. He was also unsaccessful as an American Labor party candidate for the Municipal Court in 1918; the Supreme Court in 1951; the Court of General Sessions in 1952, and for the post of Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals in 1953.

"Surviving are his widow, Beatrice; a son, Edward Jr.; a daughter, Dale; his mother Mrs. Kakie Kunts, and four grandchildren."

Page 31, col. 6 of same issue states: "Kuntz- Edward on April 10, 1957, beloved husband of Beatrice, father of Dale Gateton and Edward Kuntz Jr...."


