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

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



"I felt that as and. ally I was only helping the Soviet Union obtain certain information that I thought it was entitled to," Gold was quoted as telling the Federal: Bureau of Investigation agents who arrested him for alleged espionage, Dr. Klaus Fuchs, convicted British spy employed by the Russians, made a somewhat similar explanation of his reason for betraying his government. This ideological motive for spying was stressed in the report of the Royal Canadian Commission on wartime espionage in Canada The commission found that most of the men and women recruited for the Canadian conspiracy experienced an inner struggle between loyalty to their native land and loyalty to the cause of communism. The Russian spy leaders succeeded in convincing these Communists or Communist sympathisers that loyalty to commuism—which meant loyalty to Bussia, too—should ALL INFORMATION CONTAINED be given priority over all other loyalties. Once HEREIN IS UNCLASSIPIED convinced of the rightness of this concept, it was relatively easy to induce the recruits to prove their supreme loyalty by serving the apy ring. It was so with Dr. Fuchs and it was apparently so with the man to whom Dr. Fuchs confessed delivering written and oral atomic bomb information. Gold had been under FBI surveillance for several years, because of his Red associations. 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

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

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PURPOSE:

To reply to your inquiry as to the source of the \$500 paid by Gold to a United States Army noncommissioned officer in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

BACKOROUND:

You will recall that by teletype dated May 31, 1950, the Philadelphia Office advised Harry Gold stated that he saw Fuchs in Santa Fe, New Mexico, in June, 1945, and that he stopped at the Hilton Hotel, Albuquerque, New Mexico. Gold further stated that his reason for doing so was that he picked up information from a United States Army noncommissioned officer who was living in Albuquerque. This information, according to Gold, was of a general nature on "installations." He gave the Army man \$500 for this information.

Under date of June 2, 1950, Special Agent Richard E. Brennan of the Philadelphia Office telephonically advised the Bureau that Harry Gold, during the course of an interview, stated that he had only one meeting with the unknown soldier who lived in Albuquerque. Prior to going to Santa Fe. at which time he contacted the noncommissioned officer who lived in Albuquerque. Gold received the \$500 from Anatole A Takovlev, a Soviet consular official in New York on the occasion of a meeting in a bar in New York City. He told Gold to contact the man in Santa Fe but not to let that assignment interfere in any way with his contacting Fuchs. Gold saw Fuchs in Santa Fe and then address had been given to him by Anatole A. Yakovlev. Gold stayed of night and was able to contact the individual on the following day, at which time he learned for the first time that the individual whom he was to contact in Albuquerque was a soldier in the United States Army. Gold stated that it was obvious that the soldier expected the money and that the information received from him pertained to the physical setup of the atomic energy installation at Los Alamos, which was the state of the st

There is some indication that the unknown soldier at Los Alamos may be one David Greenglass. An investigation is presently being conducted rt to either identify or eliminate him.

A review of the New York file entitled "PHILIP LEVING! SECURITY MATTER - C" reflects that on December 5, 1944, a highly confidential source of the New York Office furnished a copy of the membership card of PHILIP LEVINE in the Sunnyside, Long Island Club of the Communist Political Association. This card bears number 36222 and lists LEVINE'S address as 4853 Luth Street, Sunnyside, where as it has previously been stated, he later lived with HARRY GOLD. A photostatic copy of this membership card is being enclosed for the information and assistance of the Boston Office. In February, 1969, inquiry by the New York Office at the above-mentioned address of TEVINE revealed that he was then living there in apartment 1-L with his wife, EDITH; and a two-year-old daughter, PAULA The superintendent at that address, one FRANK PATKILA, stated that LEVINE had been living there for several years and that he was a chemist. PATRILA stated that LEVINE and his wife were then friendly with another family in the building whom PATELLA believed to be "Communistically inclined", although PATELIA had no specific information concerning LEVINE'S Communist tendencies. A main file index card for Harry Gold is contained in the Bureau indices reflecting that he is a subject in the Gregory Case. However, Gold was only briefly investigated during the Gregory investigation. Gold became involved in that investigation when Abraham Brothman, who was interviewed by Bureau agents on May 29, 1947, stated at that time that he, Brothman, turned over blueprints to Jacob Golos, known Soviet espionage agent. Brothman said that after several visits from Golos, Golos introduced him to "Helen", who thereafter obtained the blueprints from Brothman over a dozen times during 1938-1939-1940. Brothman said that sometime in 1940 "Helen" stopped coming to his office and an individual named Harry Gold came to his office and said that he represented Golos. Gold visited Brothman's Office on numerous occasions during 1940 and 1941 and obtained blueprints from Brothman.

Gold was interviewed on May 29, 1947, concerning Brothman's statements and admitted obtaining blueprints from Brothman for Golos which he evaluated on a chemical basis but he denied that he had any financial agreement with Golos.





On May 29, 1947, a signed statement was secured from Abraham Brothman following his interview by agents of the New York Office. In his signed statement Brothman stated that he owned and operated the Republic Chemical Machinery Company, which was associated with the Hendrick Manufacturing Company in 1938 or 1939. At that time he was approached by a man concerning contracts with the Russian Government. In order that he might obtain contracts from this man, Brothman stated that he turned over several blueprints which belonged to him. Subsequently, this unknown man appeared at Brothman's office accompanied by a woman named Helen, who represented the unknown man.

Brothman, after examination of photographs, identified the woman named Helen as the informant Gregory and the unknown man as Jacob Golos, a known Soviet Espionage Agent.

Between the years 1938 and 1940, Brothman stated that the woman "Helen" appeared at his office approximately a dozen times.

Brothman later became acquainted with Harry Gold, who contacted him and picked up various blueprints which were destined for Jacob Golos. Erothman stated that Harry Gold was employed as of the date of the interview at Brothman's Company as a chemist. According to Brothman's statement, Gold last picked up blueprints in 1941 or early 1942.

The above information concerning Erothman, Golos, Harry Gold and informant Gregory was set forth in a New York memorandum to the Bureau concerning arthur Phineas weber, a subject of an Atomic Energy Act - Employee investigation. It was set forth to show the nature of Brothman's activities concerning commercial espionage as reported in the Gregory Case.

Arthur Phineas Weber developed a close association with Brothman in February, 1941, when he was employed by the mendrick Monufacturing Company, 30 Church Street, New York City.

A copy of the report of Special Agent Francis J. Gallant dated at New York, September 19, 1949, entitled "Abraham Brothman, Security Matter - C" has been removed from Brothman's main file and placed in Gold's principal main file, (65-57449.) This report reflects information obtained during an interview with Brothman by Bureau Agents on May 29, 1947, at which time he made mention of Harry Gold and in particular contains a signed statement obtained from Brothman on May 29, 1947. This signed statement contains the information concerning the picking up of blue prints from Brothman by Harry Gold to be turned over to Jacob Golos, a known Soviet Espionage Agent.

Since a copy of this report is being placed in Gold's principal main file, it is not being summarized in this Correlation summary.

On page six of the February 13, 1950, issue of the "Washington Daily News," it is reflected that a bundle of photographs had been flown to London in an effort to jog Dr. Fuchs' memory regarding persons who may have assisted him. The article goes on to state that the package contained likenesses of many persons who had associated with Fuchs, and indicates the picture check was a precaution taken by the Bureau to make sure no such accomplice of Fuchs would slip through the Bureau's "dragnet."

Of the above it was stated that no package of pictures as such had been sent, although Mr. Whitson, while on route picked up a number of pictures in New York, including those of Abraham Brothman, Jules Korchien and Oscar J. Vago. It was also stated that there was going through the mail February 13, 1950, a series of three pictures on subject suspects, namely Gerhardt Wollan, Martin Deutsch and Harry Gold.

TOP SECRET Brothman during the period 1938-1942 operated a company known as the Republic Chemical Machinery Company which did designing work on chemical machines. In June 1942 Brothman severed his relationship with the Republic Chemical Machinery Company and became associated with Henry A. Golwynne and Arthur Phineas Weber in the operation of the Chemurgy Design Corporation at 420 Lexington Avenue, New York City. In August 1944 Brothman organized his own firm, Abraham Brothman and Associates, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City. He later moved his offices to 29-28 - 41st Street, Long Island City, New York, where he was located as of February 1950. Brothman first came to the attention of the Bureau as a result of the allegations of Elizabeth T. Bentley. Bentley stated that she was introduced to one Abe Brothman about May 1940 by Jacob Golos. From the early summer of 1940 through the fall of 1940, she met Brothman on about ten occasions when he delivered to her blueprints. She said Erothman was on other occasions contacted by Golos.

Sometime during the course of her various meetings with Brothman she learned from either Brothman or Golos that the blueprints which Brothman had been delivering to her pertained to a certain type of commercial vat.

During the fall of 1940, according to Bentley, Golos informed her that he was becoming disgusted with his dealings with Brothman and told her that he was going to turn Brothman over to someone else. She stated that she did not learn from Golos or anyone else to whom Brothman was then directed.

However, during an interview with Brothman by Bureau Agents in May 1947, he stated that he was contacted by Harry Gold following the termination of his association with Elizabeth Bentley. Gold informed Brothman that he had been sent to Brothman by Golos. Gold then, according to Brothman, began to pick up blueprints until the early part of 1942.

Although Gold did not pick up any blueprints from Brothman

subsequent to 1942, they remained in contact with each other and Gold was hired by Brothman in 1942 as a chemist. He was still presumably employed by Brothman as of February 1950. Brothman testified before the Special Federal Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York on July 22, 1947, relative to his associations with Bentley and Golos.

Gold was interviewed on May 29, 1947 by Agents of the New York Office. During his interview, Gold advised that he was born December 12, 1910, in <u>Switzerland</u>, the son of Sam and Celia Gold, natives of Russia. He said that he arrived in the United States in 1914.

Gold attended might school at the Drexel Institute in Philadelphia; the University of Pennsylvania; Columbia University; and Xavier University in Cincinnati, where he received a Bachelor of Science, Summa Cum Laude, Degree in 1940. From 1929 until the time he joined the Abraham Brothman Associates, Gold was employed by the Pennsylvania Sugar Company in their laboratories at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Gold, when interviewed by the Agents of the New York Office and when testifying before the Grand Jury, gave substantially the same information concerning his association with Brothman as had been given by Brothman.

Figure Fuchs, according to information provided the Boston Office on February 9, 1950, described his contact in the United States as a person who is not a nuclear physicist, but one who has knowledge of chemistry and engineering. Fuchs stated that his contact was not inside the Atomic Energy Project. Fuchs further stated that his contact was age - about 40 to 45; height - possibly 5 10°; build - fairly broad; and face - round. Fuchs further stated that he felt that his contact was possibly the first generation American, but he could not establish his ancestry.

In this connection it was mentioned that it is likely that the contact referred to is identical with the but this is not conclusive as Fuchs may well have had more than one contact.

Mrs. Heineman stated that approximately two or three weeks before Klans Fuchs visited her on February 12, 1945, she was looking out the window of her home at 144 Lakeview Avenue, Cambridge, Massachusetta. She noticed a man walking down the street, whom she did not know, and was, therefore, surprised when he came to her door and rang the bell. The time was just before noon and she would fix the time at sometime between approximately Jamuary 20, 1945, and the first days in February, 1945. She answered the door and the Unchem asked her if she were Mrs. Heineman, the sister of Klans Fuchs. She responded affirmatively and thereupon introduced himself by stating he was a chemist who had worked with Klaus Fuchs and was anxious to see him.

Mrs. Heineman stated that the foregoing represented the facts of the visit and she was under the impression at the time, she believes, that the Unchem worked with Fuchs at Los Alamos, but she has no basis in fact in her recollection for this opinion.

In a further effort to identify Unchem, photographs of numerous individuals submitted by various field divisions, following the furnishing of the above information to the field by the Bureau, were exhibited to the Heinemans. One of the individuals whose photograph was shown the Heinemans was that of Harry Gold. Robert Heineman, husband of Mrs. Heineman, selected Avram Risselgoff because of the shape of the latter's face and his hair line. Prior to his observation of Kisselgoff, however, Heineman had set aside for further consideration photographs of Joseph Greenspan, Morris U. Cohen, Harry Gold and G. L. Laserson.

Arthur Phineas Weber on March 3, 1950, was interviewed by an Agent of the Cincinnati Office. He said that Keppler was a personal friend of Brothman and there was no business connection between the two although Weber believed that both Keppler and Brothman were in similar businesses. Weber stated he last saw Keppler in the early part of 1944. He described Keppler as follows:

Gold, according to Confidential Informant Gregory, acted on behalf of Jacob Golos, known Soviet Agent now deceased, in 1940 and 1941 in picking up blueprints from Abraham Brothman. Gold admits he did this in 1940 and 1941, making trips to Philadelphia and New York to see Brothman for this purpose. Gold stated that it was on Golos' instruction that he, Gold, evaluated these blueprints before turning them over to Golos. It is Gold's contention, however, that Golos showed no interest in these blueprints.

News flashes from various chapters of the North American Spanish Aid Committee reflected an item of information from Philadelphia wherein it was stated that the Delaware County Chapter at Chester, Pennsylvania was breaking into the local press quite frequently with news items, letters and editorials about the medburo (medical Buream to Aid Spanish Democracy). The news flash indicated that the Delaware County Chapter was led by Dr. Gold and had raised about \$500. The same news flash indicated a meeting was held at the Friends Meeting House in Swarthmore, Pennsylvania at which Professors Manning and Anderson and Harold Laski spoke. At this same meeting Dr. Gold gave a talk on the Medburo.

Dr. Gold of Chester, Pennsylvania is described as an official in the Philadelphia Chapter of the North American Committee.

Klizabeth Terrill Bentley, an admitted Soviet espionage agent and courier, stated that she became acquainted with Major Duncan Lee during the latter part of 1942, at which time Lee was employed in the Office of Strategic Services in an advisory capacity to General William J. Donovan. She alleged that after her first meeting with Lee he began supplying her with OSS information of a varied nature. She advised that she saw Lee at intervals in Washington, D. C. and about January, 1943, she met Lee at the Old Homestead Restaurant at 9th Avenue in New York City. Jacob Golos, the individual to whom Bentley furnished espionage information obtained by her, was also present at this meeting and was introduced to Lee. So far as Bentley could recall this was Golos' first meeting with Lee and she stated that Golos was usually introduced as John. She stated further that after this meeting Lee would call her at her residence and they would arrange to see each other in some restaurant in New York. She advised that her last meeting with Lee occurred probably in January, 1945, at the Longchamps Restaurant on Fifth Avenue at 12th Street. She related that when she first met Lee she introduced herself as Helen.

Duncan Chaplin Lee was interviewed by Bureau Agents on May 29, 1947, at which time he identified a photograph of Bentley as the person known to him as Helen. He recalled having met her in the Old Homestead Restaurant on 9th Avenue in New York City on one occasion, at which time she introduced him to an individual whom he knows only by the name of John. He could not recall whether he heard this individual's last name. He was asked specifically if it could have been Colos or Cold and he said he could not recall. He recalled having seen John only on one other occasion which was in the fall of 1943, in a restaurant located at 823 15th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. He stated that he knew nothing concerning John's background except that John appeared to be a very good friend of Helen.

Lee testified before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in August, 1948, at which time he identified a photograph of Jacob Golos as a friend of Elisabeth Bentley and he stated he first met Golos at the 823 Restaurant on 15th Street in Washington, D. C. He testified that Golos was introduced under the name of John and Lee was unable to recall John's last name. He testified that some months later he again met John in New York City.



A memorandum to the Director dated February 15, 1946, from the El Paso Office entitled "CINRAD" reflected that a photographic copy had been obtained of reports and personnel data in the files of certain designated individuals formerly associated with the Los Alamos DSU, Los Alamos, New Mexico. One of the files was that of Charlotte Serber. In her file was a memorandum for the Officer in Charge dated August 3, 1943, from John J. McLaughlin, Jr., Special Agent, CIC. The memorandum reflects an interview with SA Mace Scovel of the Philadelphia Office, FBI. The memorandum indicated that Charlotte Serber was the daughter of Morris V.
