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



### AT ORLANDO, FLORIDA

FREIERICK STETSON, 321 E. Jackson Street, formerly Superintendent of the Industrial Alcohol Plant, Pennsylvania Sugar Company, advised that he had only been acquainted with GOLD at the plant and knew nothing of his outside activities. He said that he had never taken any business trips with the subject and that as far as he knew GOLD had never taken any trips West, to New York or to the New England States. STETSON could recall nothing about GOLD's vacations during 1944 and 1945.

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STETSON also advised that GOLD had been very friendly with

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a co-worker named DAUGHERTY at the Pennsylvania Sugar Company. He said - that GOLD and DAUTHERTY were together so often that the other workers called them the "Gold Dust Twins." STETSON could not remember DAUGHERTY's full name but said that DAUGHERTY and GOLD had worked for Dr. GUSTAV T. REICH at the Pennsylvania Sugar Company. Dr. REICH is now a Consulting Chemical Engineer located at 1420 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. STETSON was sure that Dr. REICH could give DAUGHERTY's full name.

The Attorney General The following additional information concerning technical information about atomic energy which Dr. Elane Fuchs admits passing to Barry Gald is set forth as follows: Puche admitted that in June, 1965, he met Gold in Santa Po, New Mexico and discussed the detonation plans by implosion. Tuchs has admitted that at the Foston seeting with Gold be gave Gold about six handwritten pages, including mostly what was known by him concerning implosion. 

In order that the Atomic Pherry Commission may be consulted as to the making public of any of the technical information concerning atomic energy which Fuchs passed to Gold, your epinion is requested as to what specific items of the technical information on atomic energy will be used in the drawing of an indictment against Gold. It would also be appreciated if you would advise what technical information will be used as swidence in the trial of Gold. The above clearance from the Atomic Energy Commission would appear to be necessary in view of the fact that most of the technical information on atomic energy passed by Pachs to Gold has been classified top secret.

To advise you of certain information furnished by SF-1620 appearing in Bureau files relative to Semen Semenov which is not included in the attached summary to Assistant Attorney General James M. McInerney.

Investigation of Semen Semenov was closed in December of 1944 after Semenov returned to Russia. The investigation was reopened at the Bureau upon receipt of a letter dated May 22, 1948, from the San Francisco D2 Office, which letter contained information from to the effect that LID Semen Semenov was supposed to have returned in some capacity to the United Hations conference in New York in 1947. Attributed this information to Olga Artemoff, who has not as yet been located, although extensive investigation has and is presently being conducted in an effort to locate her. (100-47083-11)

Upon receipt of the above information investigation was immediately instituted in an effort to identify Semenov as a member of the Russian Delegation to the United Nations or as being in some way connected with the Russian Delegation at the United Nations. Numerous photographs of UN personnel were compared with the PR-1 photograph of Semenov without effecting an identification. (100-47083-21)

This information was not included in the memorandum inasmuch as there has been no verification of Semenov's return to the United States subsequent to his departure in 1944.

There is attached a short summary of the information contained in the Bureau file for transmittal to the Department. It should be noted that there is considerable information concerning Semenov in the Comrap case. These files are presently being reviewed and any pertinent information concerning Semenov will be furnished to the Department upon completion of the file review.

Jensen dated May 31, 1950, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, entitled "Harry Gold, was., Replonage - R, a copy of which was forwarded to you under date of June 1, 1950. You will note that on pages 59 and 60 of this report informstion is set forth reflecting that Harry Gold received instructions from his. superior, who was identified as "Sam," relative to arrangements whereby Gold was to contact Dr. Klaus Fuchs. It is further noted that page 83 of the above report reflects that "Sam" was tentatively identified by Gold as being Semen Markovich Semenov, a Soviet official formerly employed in the United States by the Amtorg Trading Corporation. For your information, on June 2, 1950, Harry Gold positively identified Semen Markovich Semenov as the individual previously referred to under the name of "Sam." This identification was made after Gold viewed motion pictures of Semenov at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. **建筑的建筑设施设施设施设施,在** Tel from Phil The following is a summary of the available background information concerning Semen Markovich Semenovs ( Semen Markovich Semenov was born March 1, 1911, in Odessa, Russia He was admitted to the United States on a temporary wise at the Port of New York on January 19, 1938, and entered the Massachusetts Institute of Technology as a student upon his arrival in the United States. He obtained a Masters degree from the Massachusette Institute of Technology in 1940. On April 12, 1941, Semenov departed for Panama and was readmitted to the United States on April 30, 1941, for a period of one year as a purchasing agent for Wachinoimport. (100-47083-5, page 2) On September 17, 1941, the Department of State advised that Semenov's status had been changed from that of a temporary visitor to that of a foreign government efficial. The said of the sa Second was an official of the Antorg Trading Corporation and ras so designated in July of 1941. (100-47083-5, page 2) cc - file 100-47083

Corporation Secency was in contact with the E. C. Bedger and Sons Company, 500 5th Avenue, New York City. According to reliable information received by this Bureau, the E. B. Bedger and Sons Company was set up under Land-Lease arrangements with the Russian Covernment. Actually the E. B. Bedger and Sons Company office was the office of the United States Treasury and Sons Company office was the office of the United States Treasury Procurement Division, ecting by and through E. B. Bedger and Sons Company. An official of the company explained that this was a unique arrangement and was not generally known in the Treasury Department. A company official further advised that 30 or 40 Russian engineers came to the company for a preliminary training course and that they then spent the following six months studying cil refineries in various parts of the United States.

States until September of 1944.

On September 15, 1944, Semenov and his family left New York City for Chicago, Illinois, and then proceeded to Portland, Oregon, arriving en September 19, 1944. They remained in Portland until September 26, 1944, when they departed for Kalama, Weshington. The Semenove boarded the SS Valery Chkalov on September 26, 1944, to return to the Soviet Union.

Semen Markovich Semenov has been reliably reported to this Bureau as a close associate of Vassili W. Eubilin. Eubilin was a former Second Secretary at the Russian Embassy in Washington, D. C., and according to confidential informants of this Bureau was the General of the MKVD in the United States during the time that he was assigned to the embassy.

Semenov was also known to be in contact with Gregori W. Kheifets, Vice Consul of the San Francisco Consulate of the USSR. Kheifets was the subject of an investigation by this Bureau in connection with the espionage activities of the Soviet Government in the United States.

You will be advised of any further pertinent information received concerning Semen Markovich Semenov and his activities with Harry Cold.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Arthur L. Simmers, Sr., former fellow employee of Subject at Pa. Sugar Co., freendly with Gold, but has no knowledge of his activities outside of business hours. Recalls efforts of Gold to obtain information concerning construction of an alcohol plant. Considered Gold to be patriotic and loyal. Recalls Gold having mentioned trips to NYC, but has no knowledge of reason for such trips.

DETAILS:

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent LEO T. CLARK on June 3, 1950:

ARTHUR L. SIMMERS, SR., Box 48, Route 50, Petersburg, New Jersey, advised he first met HARRY GOLD in 1937 shortly after GOLD was employed at the Pennsylvania Sugar Company plant at Delaware Avenue and River Front, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Mr. SIMERS was an assistant to Dr. G. T. REICH, the Director of Research of the Pennsylvania Sugar Company, while HARRY GOLD was a chemist who first worked on the sugar bench at that company. He stated that in 1937 GOLD resided in South Philadelphia, later moving to North Philadelphia, and that he could not recall the exact addresses.

SIMMERS stated that his acquaintance with GOLD was only as a business associate and fellow employee. He stated they were friendly and had cordial relations during the time GOLD was employed at the company. He added that he visited the GOLD hame on only one occasion sometime about 1940 or 1941 when he accompanied Dr. REICH on a visit to GOLD, who was convalescing

R47 DEC 18 From severe burns suffered while experimenting with an

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extraction process at the Pennsylvania Sugar Company while attempting to extract CO2 from stack gases.

SIMMERS advised that as a gesture of friendliness, he invited GOLD to visit his home one week-end in the late spring or early fall of 1944 when he learned that GOLD was not familiar with suburban life. SIMMERS stated he resided on a farm near Elverson, in back of Warwick, Chester County, Pennsylvania, at the time his address being R. D. #1, Elverson, Pennsylvania, SIMMERS advised that GOLD accompanied him from Philadelphia to Pottstown by train where they were met by Mrs. SIMMERS and traveled by car to their residence. He stated that GOLD again visited his home at Elverson one Sunday in July, 1945 when he came to get a dog which SIMMERS had promised to give him.

According to SIMMERS, GOLD was a highly qualified and skilled chemist who was an excellent worker. SIMMERS recalled that when Dr. REICH retired from the Pennsylvania Sugar Company in 1944, GOLD attended a testimonial dinner with other employees as did SIMMERS.

SIMMERS advised that when HARRY GOLD was attending Kavier University, he visited Philadelphia on one occasion, at which time he had dinner with GOLD at Kugler's Restaurant in Philadelphia. SIMMERS recalled that to the best of his recollection he wrote only two letters to HARRY GOLD, and these were written to him when GOLD was attending Xavier University and SIMMERS wanted to get some figures and data from GOLD regarding the experiments in recovered CO<sub>2</sub> from stack gases.

SIMMERS advised that the only other employee or other person whom he knew was friendly with HARRY GOLD was another chemist named MERRILL DOUGHERTY, who worked at the Pennsylvania Sugar Plant with HARRY GOLD on the research projects. He stated that GOLD and DOUGHERTY were very friendly.

SIMMERS recalled that shortly after Dr. REICH left the Pennsylvania Sugar Company in 1944. DOUGHERTY and GOLD evidenced considerable interest

in the Alcohol Plant. SIMMERS stated that they came to him for data on the construction of an alcohol plant, but were very reluctant to disclose why they wanted this information and were reluctant to divulge the identity of the person for whom they wished this information. SIMMERS recalled that GOLD and DOUGHERTY told him they were designing an alcohol plant for someone in North Jersey and were trying to get information for this interested party. SIMMERS stated that he could not understand why two chemists with no previous experience in construction of an alcohol plant would want this information, so he refused to divulge it to them. He remembers that shortly thereafter, DOUGHERTY and GOLD were discharged from the company.

After GOLD and DOUGHERTY were let out about 1946, SIMMERS recalls that he recommended HARRY GOLD for employment. He recalled that he filled out a government questionnaire, which was received through the mails, and that he served as a reference for GOLD. SIMMERS claimed that he restricted his recommendation to GOLD's ability as a workman, inasmuch as he did not know anything about his personal or private life.

SIMMERS advised that during his acquaintance with HARRY GOLD, GOLD never mentioned Russia or Communism, and that they never had any discussions on politics or Communism. SIMMERS said he never questioned GOLD's patriotism or loyalty, and that GOLD's recent arrest was a shock to him. SIMMERS expressed the opinion that GOLD would not knowingly or willingly engage in espionage activity. He further stated that if GOLD had engaged in espionage, he thought it would only be because of compulsion or obligation to some foreign group. He added that such foreign group would probably be of Russian origin, inasmuch as GOLD was born in Russia.

SIMMERS remembered that HARRY GOLD often mentioned having made week-end trips to New York City, but never mentioned his destination or his contacts. He stated that GOLD never mentioned any trips to any other cities and that he knows of no trips abroad or outside the United States taken by GOLD. He added he does not recall where HARRY GOLD said he spent his vacations. He added that he knows of no girlfriends or women acquaint-ances of GOLD and no knowledge of GOLD's outside interests, activities or associates.

In connection with GOLD's vacation in Atlantic City in 1945, the following investigation was conducted on June 1, 1950 by SA LEO T. CLARK;

CHARLES W. STITZER, JR., owner and manager of the Holmhurst Hotel, 123 South Pennsylvania Avenue, Atlantic City, New Jersey, advised that a search of the records failed to disclose any registration card for the spring of 1945 for any member of the GOLD family. He stated that he located registration #7076 for 1938 in the name of JOSEPH GOLD, 5032 North Boudinot Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, who occupied Room 306 from July 6, 1938 to July 14, 1938. On the back of the card was a notation reflecting that he and another person occupied Room 103 from August 14 to August 15, 1937.

Registration card #13061 was found for 1941, which reflected that Mrs. CELIA/GOLD and son, HARRY, of 5032 North Boudinot Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, occupied Room 118 from June 19, to June 26, 1941.

Mr. STITZER was unable to find any other records reflecting HARRY GOLD's residence at the Holmhurst Hotel on any other dates.

## ADMINISTRATIVE DATA

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In connection with the sale of a filter to the Pennsylvania Sugar Company in 1945 by the F. R. Hormann Company, the following investigation was conducted on June 2, 1950 by SA JOHN P. DEVLIN:

MONROE COBLENS, President of the F. R. Hormann Company, 17
Stone Street, Newark, New Jersey, advised that this company is presently operated as a subsidiary of the Republic Seitz Filter Corporation. COBLENS stated he was not with the company in 1945 and, hence, has no personal recollection of the sale of a filter to the Pennsylvania Sugar Company at that time. COBLENS made records available which indicate that negotiations occurred in August, 1945, a filter having been ordered by the Pennsylvania Sugar Company on August 30, 1945 and shipped August 31, 1945. Filter sheets were subsequently ordered and shipped on October 16, 1945. All orders were marked to the attention of Mr. DOUGHERTY or Mr. GOLD of the Pennsylvania Sugar Company and the sale was credited to LOUIS KEELER, 112 East Greenwood Avenue, Lansdowne, Pennsylvania, telephone Madison 3-0842, the area salesman of the Hormann Company.

COBLENS advised that FRANK HORMANN, presently Chief Engineer, Schrader Company, Vanderbilt and Atlantic Avenues, Brooklyn, New York, was President of the Hormann Company in 1945 and may possibly have handled the sale. He stated that a JOSEPH LAMRERTINE and a HENRY STAPOWICK were associated with the company at the time and may have knowledge of the sale. He stated that Mr. HORMANN would probably know the extent of their knowledge in this regard and their present whereabouts.

EDWIN KEIL, the only present employee of the F. R. Hormann Company who was with the company in 1945, stated that he does not recall details of the sale to the Pennsylvania Sugar Company and could not identify GOLD.

Special Agent LEO T. CLARK obtained the following information regarding ARTHUR L. SIMMERS, SR. during interview of the latter:

Mr. SIMMERS is now retired due to a heart condition. He is a white man, 66 years old, born January 10, 1884 at Warwick Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania. He lives with his wife, MARGARET MARSHALL SIMMERS on a small farm. They have two married sons, CHARLES DONALD SIMMERS, age 31, an engineer who resides at Three Bridges, New Jersey,

At 1:10 P.M., June 10, 1950, Supervisor Robert Granville of the New York Office, in my absence, telephonically contacted Supervisor W. A. Branigan. Granville related that upon receipt of information from Harry Gold that unknown subjects were involved in espionage activities, the New York Office opened separate unknown subject files for the purpose of reporting the investigation conducted concerning the individuals named by Gold. Subsequently, when certain of the unknown subjects were identified, particularly Semen Semenov and Yakolev, the New York Office reopened its investigation of these two cases. Granville related that it has now been observed that the Bureau has sent out leads which pertain to the individual investigations of those connected with Gold and these leads have been set out in the Bureau under the Gold caption. He stated that he was specifically referring to a teletype to the Philadelphia Office dated June 8, 1950, which requested that Carl Mounsen be reinterviewed concerning Yakolev. Also, he was referring to a teletype dated June 9, which instructed that a review be made by the New York Office of the case file on Semen Semenov for the purpose of identifying the unknown contacts of Semenov. In this regard. New York was instructed to submit a report in the Gold

Granville stated that the New York Office has followed the practice of reporting the investigation concerning the individuals connected with Gold in their separate case files and he stated he was of the opinion that this was the desirable procedure. He inquired if the Bureau had decided on another practice; namely, of carrying all of the investigations under the Gold heading. He requested advice concerning this.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that we advise the New York Office concerning the policy adopted to report the investigations in the Gold matter.

Results of Examination:

It was concluded that the handwriting on specimen Q1 was written by HARRY GOLD, K2, Bureau file 65-57449.

It was also concluded that the A. D. SLACK signature on the second page of the typewritten report entitled "Recovery of 2 M 3 Removable Jet Scrap, Report Mo.2," which is a part of specimen Q2, was written by ALFRED DEAN SLACK, whose known handwriting is found on specimens Kcl through Kc3, K6, K8, Kcl1, K13 and K20 in this case. It may be noted that this conclusion was also reported in Laboratory Report, dated June 16, 1950, directed to the Albany Office. It was concluded that none of the other handwriting on specimen Q2 was written by RICHARD M. ERIGGS, HOWARD W. GOCHEMOUR, STANLEY EARL GLASS or ALFRED DEAN SLACK. The known handwriting of RICHARD M. HRIGGS is found on specimens K7 and K21. The handwriting of STANLEY EARL GLASS appears on specimen K18. The handwriting of HOWARD W. GOCHEMOUR is found on specimens K5, Kc9 and K16.

No conclusion could be reached whether the handwriting on specimen Q3 was written by HARRY COLD, because the questioned writing is so small that most of the handwriting characteristics are concealed. However, characteristics of sufficient significance to warrant the obtaining of additional known writing from HARRY GOLD for comparison with Q3 were noted in the examination. If such specimens are obtainable, they should be prepared in the same wording as on Q3 with pencil and on the same size card as Q3.

A definite conclusion could not be reached whether the handprinting appearing on the inside covers of specimens Q4 and Q5 was prepared by ALFRED DRAN SLACK, because of the limited nature of the questioned handprinting. A number of significant characteristics were noted in the examination.

A part of specimen Q6 consists of nine yellow sheets of typewriting bearing a number of handwritten notations. Because of the limited nature of these notations, no conclusion could be reached whether they were written by AIFRED DEAN SIACK, HOWARD W. GOCHENOUR, RICHAED E. BRIGGS or STANLEY EARL GLASS.

Another portion of specimen Q6 consists of three pages of a handwritten report entitled "Jacket for Silver Tubing of Urea Converter." It was concluded that the handwriting on these pages was not written by ALFRED DEAN SLACK, RICHARD M. HRIGGS, HOWARD W. GOCHENOUR or STANLEY EARL GLASS.

inine page typewritten article entitled "Manufacture of Synthetic Ures" is also included as a part of Q6. A handwritten chemical equation appears on the first page of this article, but no conclusion could be reached whether it was written by ALFRED BEAN SLACK, RICHARD M. BRIGGS, HOWARD W. GOCHENOUR or STANLEY RARL GLASS, because the questioned writing is too limited for comparison

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AND THE RESERVE OF THE PARTY OF Also included with specimen Qo are several data sheets ruled with red vertical lines and blue-green horizontal lines. Five of these sheets are attached to typewritten memoranda and two of the sheets are stapled to three other documents consisting of a 3" by 5" card, a 4" by 6" sheet of paper and 3" by 5" slip of paper. Nothing of significance was found in comparing the limited amount of handwriting on these items with the known writing of ALFRED DEAN SLACK, HOWARD W. GOCHENOUR, RICHARD M. BRIGGS and STANLEY BARL GLASS with the exception of the following writing: "Chemical No. 73 - 28% Ammonium hydroxide" written in pencil on the data sheet dated 11/17/41 and "Experimental only" written in pencil on data sheet dated 1/12/42. Significant characteristics were found in this writing when compared with the known writing of ALFRED DEAN SLACK, but because of the limited nature of the questioned writing, a definite conclusion could not be reached whether the writing was prepared by SLACK. If it is desired that this writing be further compared with the known writing of ALFRED DRAN SLACK, it is suggested that additional known specimens in the wording of the questioned writing be obtained from this individual.

Another portion of Q6 consists of a color photograph of a graph of the Paramount West Coast Laboratory stapled to a sheet of white paper. On this paper there is written in pencil "Get Explanation of T." It was concluded that this writing was written by HARRY GOLD, K2, Bureau file 65-57449.

Another part of Q6 is a circular diagram pertaining to "Circulation of Solvent" which contains handprinting. It was concluded that this handprinting was not prepared by ALYRED DEAN SLACK. No conclusion was reached whether this handprinting was prepared by STANLEY BARL GLASS, HOWARD W. GOCHENOUR or RICHARD M. BRIGGS because the available known handprinting of GOCHENOUR is too limited and no handprinting of GLASS or BRIGGS has been submitted.

It was concluded that the handwriting on the graphs comprising Q7 was not written by ALPRED DEAN SLACK, HOWARD W. GOCHENOUR, RICHARD M. BRIGGS or STANLEY BARL GLASS.

A small amount of handwriting in black ink appears on the manila envelope included with Q8. Because of the limited nature of this writing, no conclusion

sould be reached whether it was written by AlFRED DBAN SLACK, HOWARD W. BOOHENOUR, RICHARD M. BRIGGS or STANLEY EARL GLASS. A small amount of pencilled writing also is found on this manila envelope. Significant sharacteristics were noted in comparing this pencilled writing with the known writing of HARRY BOLD, but due to the limited nature of the questioned writing, a definite conclusion could not be reached whether it was written by GOLD.

A part of Q9 consists of seven graphs which contain handprinting. Ho conclusion could be reached whether this handprinting was prepared by ALFRED DEAN SLACK, because of variations which could not be accounted for. No conclusion could be reached whether this handprinting was prepared by HOWARD W. GOCHENGUR, because the available known handprinting of this individual is not adequate for comparison. No handprinting of RICHARD M. HRIGGS or STANLEY BAHL GLASS is available for comparison.

Also included with Q9 is a photostatic copy of a triangular - shaped graph attached to a typewritten report entitled "Method of Operating Machines above the Upper Explosive Limit." It was concluded that the handprinting on this graph was not prepared by ALFRED DEAN SLACK. No conclusion could be reached whether this handprinting was prepared by HOWARD W. GOCHENOUR, RICHARD M. HRIGGS or STANLEY EARL GLASS, because the submitted known handprinting of GOCHENOUR is inadequate and because no handprinting of ERIGGS or GLASS has been submitted for comparison.

A number of typewritten "Sub Conference Reports" dated November 29, 1935 through September 24, 1937 are included with specimen 29. Some of the pages included with these reports contain handwritten and handprinted notations of a limited nature, prepared for the most part in ink. A definite conclusion could not be reached whether any of these handwritten or handprinted notations were prepared by ALFRED DEAN SLACK, because of the limited nature of the questioned specimens. A number of significant characteristics were noted, however, which would warrant the obtaining of further known writing from SLACK in the exact wording of these notations, if this is advisable at this stage of the investigation. Nothing of significance was neted in comparing these notations with the handwriting of HOWARD W. GOCHENOUR, EICHARD M. BRIGGS or STANLEY RARL GLASS.

It was concluded that the handwriting on the pages of ruled paper comprising a part of Q10, with the exception of the diagram on page 3, was written by HARRY GOLD, K2, Bureau file 65-57449. It is noted that these ruled pages comprise a six-page report on "Magnesium Powder Plant." It was concluded that the handprinting on the diagram on page of the report entitled "Magnesium Powder Plant" was not prepared by HARRY GOLD or ALFRED DEAN SLACK. No conclusion was reached whether this handprinting was prepared by GLASS, GOCHENOUR or HRIGGS because no known handprinting of GLASS and BRIGGS is available and because the evailable handprinting of GCCHENOUR is too limited.

It was concluded that the unruled pages containing a list of chemicals, handwritten in pencil, comprising the other part of QlO, were not written by HARRY GOLD, HOWARD W. GOCHENOUR, STANLEY BARL GLASS, ALFRED DEAN SLACK or RICHARD M. BRIGGS.

It was concluded that the ALFRED D. SLACK signature on Qc12 and the handprinting and signature of the applicant on Qc13 were written by ALFRED DRAN 6LACK.

The handprinting and handwriting of AIFRED DEAN SLACK have previously been compared with the appropriate sections of the Mational Security File without effecting an identification. Photographic copies of this handprinting and handwriting have been added to this file for future reference and comparison.

In accordance with Albany teletype to the Bureau dated June 28, 1950, the handwriting of REGINALD ARTHUR ERIGOS was not compared with specimens Q1 through Q10 listed above. The known handwriting of REGINALD ARTHUR ERIGOS appears on specimens Kclo and Kcl5 listed above.

Reference is made in Pittsburgh letter dated June 21, 1950, to a check drawn on the account of the Russian Embassy on July 2, 1947, in the amount of \$75.00, made payable to "Mrs. GOCHENOUR." This check has not yet been received in the Laboratory. However, as soon as this specimen is received the requested comparison will be made with the known writing of Mrs. LEAH E. GOCHENOUR, K17, and a report will be furnished to the interested offices.

It was concluded that none of the typewriting on the various specimens included with Q1 through Q10 was prepared on the typewriter used to prepare specimen K19 listed above.

Specimens Q1 through Q10 will be returned under separate cover to the Philadelphia Office within the next several days, as soon as appropriate photographic copies have been made and further typewriting comparisons conducted.

The search is continuing. Wall advised that Agents have interviewed the ex-wife of Slack from whom he was divorced in 1939; that she has no knowledge of his activities (Slack agrees to this). Slack is in fefault of alimony payment and the sherid has a judgment to serve on him. Agents secured a typewriter which Slack used from 1931 to 1937, and some papers which the former Mrs. Slack furnished which appear to have been written by Briggs. Mr. Wall advised that Slack has identified a photograph of Semon Semenov as "Robert," to whom he was introduced by Gold in New York City. He understood from Gold that "Robert", was white deup in is aptonage. Slack claims that his last contact with Gold occurred in Kingsport, Tennessee, in the latter part of 1944, while he was at the Holston Ordnance.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that we furnish the attached memorandum to the Department, reflecting the activities of Slack, and that we orally advise the Department of the additional information we have received since the preparation of this memorandum; further, that immediate arrangements be made to file a complaint and get a warrant for Slack, preferably in the Federal Me triot in Tennessee, However, it is suggested that the Department decide in this instance where venue would best lie.

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Gold a sample of this explosive material in two rubber containers. Sold advised that before the sample could actually be used, there might have been one more step of a chemical or physical nature which had to be taken and that Slack mentioned to him what the final step was. He commented that the might have put this information in written form. Gold stated that all of the information obtained from Slack and the sample of the explosive material were given to "Sem" in Manhattan, Now York, a few days later.

Gold advised that he had reported to "Sem" the belief of Slack that the latter was to be transferred to a highly secret project, and that shortly thereafter, Gold was ordered to forget Slack. In this regard, you will recall that Gold has advised that in the latter part of 1943, "Sam" instructed Gold to drop all of his other contacts preliminary to a highly important new assignment, which, of course, was the obtaining of the atomic information made available by Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs.

In this regard, Alfred Dean Slack has admitted knowing Harry Gold, whose photograph he has identified. He has further admitted that in approximately the Spring of 1941, he had furnished to Gold a sample of RIM which he had picked up from the Holston Ordnance Works, Kingsport, Tennessee, where he was then employed. Slack stated that along with the sample, he gave Gold the data on how RDM was made. HIM was a new emplosive which was classified at that time.

From the foregoing, it would appear that Alfred Dean Slack could be prosecuted under the wartime espionage statute, in the same manner as Harry Gold. It would further appear, insofar as wenne is concerned, that it would lie in the judicial district covering Tennessee or in the Southern District of New York. It will be noted that both Slack and Gold have admitted the transmission of classified information in Tennessee, thus clearly establishing wenne there. In addition, Gold has admitted furnishing the information obtained from Slack to Semen Semenov in Manhattan. As you know, Semenov departed from the United States in September, 1944.



It is requested that the F.B.I. Laboratory search these letters through the anonymous letter file in an effort to determine the identity of the author. Also, it is desired that these letters be retained at the F.B.I. Laboratory and that they be made a part of the enonymous letter file to be of assistance in the event other letters of a similar nature are received by the victims.

It should be noted that HARRY GOLD, one of the victims in this case, is the subject of an Espionage case in the Philadelphia office (Bureau file #65-58805; Philadelphia file #65-4307). It should be further noted that the facts of this case were discussed with AUSA, EDWARD A. KaiLICK, EDPA, Philadelphia, Pa., who declined prosecution on both letters on the basis that the letters are purely crank letters, obviously resulting from the recent publicity concerning the HARRY GOID Espionage case.

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at Philadelphia, which indicated he emigrated to the United States from Antwerp on the SS Lapland arriving at the port of New York on July 14, 1914. This declaration revealed last foreign residence as Kief, Russia, and Philadelphia residence as 2623 South Philip Street. SANGOLD's description contained in the declaration revealed that he was 5'6", 140 pounds, had brown hair and hazel eyes and was born January 1, 1881, and that his wife, CELIA, was born in Russia.

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A Petition for Naturalization, number 48016, dated June 9, 1921, reflected SAM GOLD's residence as 2649 South Philip Street and further reflected that his wife, CELIA, was born July 29, 1883, and sons, HENRICH, born December 12, 1910, in Switzerland; and YOUSEF, born February 10, 1917, at Philadelphia. Witnesses to the petition: HARRY BOLATIN, ironworker, 2423 South Fourth Street, and ABRAHAM FINEMAN, carpenter, 2385 South Marsh, both Philadelphia.

Certificate of Naturalization number 1591271, dated June 16, 1922, at Philadelphia, was issued to SAM GOLD. The Immigration and Naturalization Service file did not contain any photographs concerning SAM GOLD and his family. The Immigration and Naturalization Service files were negative according to Miss DAYTON with respect to derivative citizenship of HARRY GOLD and in an effort to locate any such record the Immigration and Naturalization Service files were searched under the following names: HARRY GOLD, HARRY GOLDNITSKY, HARRY GOLDNITSKY, HARRY MARTIN, HARRY RAYMOND, FRANK KEPPLER and FRANK KESSLER.

The passport files of the State Department were searched under the above mentioned aliases of HARRY GOLD as well as under the names SAM and CELIA GOLD, with alias GOLDNITSKY, and JOSEPH GOLD, with alias GOLDNITSKY, parents and brother of HARRY GOLD, respectively. The search failed to locate any passport files identifiable under the above names.

Special Agent WILLIAM P. SPRINGSTON made inquiry at the United States Coast Guard and was told that the Coast Guard had no record of HARRY GOLD.

Special Agent CARL W. BUCHHOLZ

501D changed his address to 5032 Boudinot Street, Philadelphia, and on September 11, 1944, changed his address to 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, at which time GOLD was employed as Chief Chemist with A. SROTHMAN and Associates of New York City. There has been no change of address since 1944 and the records failed to reflect any correspondence with the subject.

GOLD attended the semi-annual national meeting of the american Chemical Society, at Philadelphia, on April 9, 1950. At that time GOLD stated he was employed by the Philadelphia Ceneral Hospital. 34th and Curie Avenue, Philadelphia. The GOLD is not a



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Mr. ERNEST M. ALLEN, Assistant Chief, Division of Research, Grants and Fellowship, National Heart Institute, National Institute of Health, Bethesda, Maryland, upon interview by Special Agent CARL W. BUCHHOLZ, advised that HARRY GOLD had not been given a fellowship or a research grant by the National Heart Institute. Mr. ALLEN pointed out that the

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institute has given a grant to the Philadelphia General Hospital, Heart Station, Philadelphia, for a project directed by Dr. THOMAS McMILLAN, Chief, Division of Cardiology, and that GOLD was employed by the hospital on this project.

Special Agent RAPHAEL I. NIXON made inquiry at the House Committee on Un-American Activities and was furnished the following information as appearing in the files of the committee under the names HARRY GOLD and H. GOLD.

The "New Pioneer" of May, 1933, page 21, lists an H. GOLD as a member of the Red Honor Roll". "New Pioneer" was cited by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities in Report 1311, March 29, 1944, page 121, as "the Communist Party's official publication for children, which was edited by HELEN KAY, a member of the Communist Party for at least 12 years".

According to Lt. MAKE MILLS Chicago files, an H. GOLD of Trenton, New Jersey, was a member of the Communist Party (AVIF Lune 19, 1930).

The Los Angeles office files of the Dies Committee list an H. B. GOLD of 2626 Bronson Avenue, Los Angeles, California, as a signer of a 1932 Communist Party Election Petition Number 134C.

According to "The Interne", a HARRY GOLD is a member of the Scientific Editorial Board ("The Interne", December, 1949, page 299). He is also the writer of an article which appeared in the December, 1949, page 310, issue of "The Interne". "The Interne" is the organ of the Association of Internes and Medical Students, and neither the organization nor the publication have been officially cited as Communist fronts.

The "National Republic" of April, 1948, page 20, carries the record of Communist activities in the U.S. Army of a HARRY COLD.

HARRY GOLD, of 2449 North 18th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, was registered at an International Workers Order Camp, as shown by a Registration Card dated August 31, 1940. The International Workers Order was cited as subversive and

MFO 65-5395 ADMINISTRATIVE PAGE Communist by Attorney General CLARK in letters to the Loyalty Review Board, released December 4, 1947, and September 21, 1948, as well as by Attorney General BIDDLE who called it "one of the strongest Communist organizations" in the Congressional Record of September 24, 1942, page 7688. The Special Committee on Un-American Activities also cited it as "one of the most effective and closely knitted organizations among the Communist 'front' movements. It claims a membership of 150,000, bound together through an insurance and social plan. \*\*\* It has contributed large sums of money to Communist Party campaigns, and \*\*\* regularly sponsors Communist Party endorsed candidates for public office. In 1944, its president and general secretary, respectively, were WILLIAM WEINER, former Communist Party treasurer, and MAX BEDACHT, former Party secretary." (See Reports, January 3, 1939, page 79; March 29, 1944, page 181; also cited in Reports of January 3, 1940, page 9; and June 25, 1942, page 19).

Also, a HARRY GOLD of Chicago, Illinois, was a member of the International Workers Order Lodge Number 1, according to an investigator's report.

Lt. MAKE MILLS! Chicago files also reveal that a HARRY GOLD of 6515 Blackstone Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, was a member of the Jackson Park Section of the American League for Peace and Democracy. This organization was cited as subversive and Communist by Attorney General CLARK in letters to the Loyalty Review Board, released June 1, 1948, and September 21, 1948. Attorney General BIDDLE said of it: "established in the United States in 1937 as successor to the American League Against War and Fascism in an effort to create public sentiment on behalf of a foreign policy adapted to the interests of the Soviet Union . The American League for Peace and Democracy \*\*\* was designed to conceal Communist control, in accordance with the new tactics of the Communist International, (Congressional Record, September 24, 1942, pages 7683-7684). This organization was also cited by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities in Reports of January 3, 1939, pages 69-71; March 29, 1944, page 37; January 3, 1940, page 10; January 3, 1941, page 21; June 25, 1942, pages 14-16; and January 2, 1943, page 8.

The aliases of HARRY GOLD, namely HARRY GOLDNITSKY. HARRY GOLODNITSKY, FRANK KESSLER, FRANK KEPPLER were also checked with the House Committee on Un-American Activities;

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however, the House Committee on Un-American Activities records were negative with respect to these aliases.

The Philadelphia office by teletype on this matter, dated June 6, 1950, requested investigation concerning unknown Russian Number 1 a 1949 contact of HARRY GOLD. The requested investigation will be conducted in relation to a case entitled "Unknown Russian No. 1, HARRY GOLD, Informant".
