Rebutel June 6, 1950, to Albuquerque.

Enclosed herewith will be found the "Hilton Hotel Registration Card #65841" which reflects the registration of "HARRY GOLD" giving the address of #6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia 24, Pa. and setting forth the name of his firm as "Terry and Seibert." The face of the card carries the penciled notation that this man arrived on June 3, 1945, and occupied Room 1001 at the rate of \$1.50 with the notation day rate until 8:00 P.M.

On the reverse side of this card there is the stamped impression of "Received June 4, 12:36 P.M. 45, Hilton Hotel, Albuquerque." Mr. FLETCHER BRUMIT, Resident Manager, has placed his initials in pencil on the reverse side of this card for purposes of future identification. He explained that all registration cards received on June 3, 1945 were stamped "June 4." He could only offer the opinion that through mechanical error the time and date stamp machine had erroneously set the date as June 4 rather than the correct date of June 3.

The proper persons to be served with subpoena duces tecum to produce this card according to BRUMIT, are H. O. BEASLEY, Auditor, MARC NEAL, Assistant Manager in charge of Rooms Department, Mr. COBY BRIENT Executive Assistant Manager, or himself, FLETCHER ERUMIT, Resident Manager. It was requested by BRUMIT that he be contacted shortly prior to the issuance of any subpoena in order that he at that time might designate which of the above-listed should be served with such subpoens since he could not tell at the time of the contact which man would be most readily available.

It is requested that the Bureau prepare appropriate photostatic or photographic copies of this registration card and conduct any handwriting examination desired thereafter return the card to the Albuquerque Office in order that it may be returned to Mr. HRUMIT. This latter individual has stated the card will be available for use in any proceedings desired but that the hotel would prefer to maintain the card in their possession until that time.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent Robert C. Jensen, dated May 31, 1980, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and to the summary report of Special Agent Joseph C. Walsh, dated June 8, 1980, at New York City, captioned as above, which have been forwarded to you.

As you know, John, mentioned in the above-referenced reports, has been positively identified by Harry Gold as Anatoli Antonovich Takovlev. The following background information regarding Takovlev is set forths

The PR-1 Form maintained at the Department of State reveals that Yakovlev was born May 31, 1911, at Borisoglebak, USBR; that he was a student at the Engineering and Roomomic Institute, Moscow, Russia, from 1936 to 1941. Takovlev and his wife, Anastacia Ivanova Yakovlev, entered the United States at San Pedro, California, aboard the SS Equador Pebruary 4, 1941. He assumed his duties as a clerk at the Soviet Consulate in New York City Pebruary 8, 1941.

Investigation has revealed that Ansstacia was employed at the Antorg Trading Corporation, New York City, as a translator, as of 1946.

The records of the Emigration & Saturalisation Service reveal that
Yekovlev left the United States by plane for Moscow, Bussis, May 28, 1946, and
that he returned to the United States July 26, 1946, arriving at La Guardia
Field, New York City. Upon Yakovlev's reentry he informed the Immigration &
Haturalisation Service that he was the Assistant Consul General of the Soviet
Consulate in New York City.

The State Department advised on July 26, 1946, that the Soviet Embassy had advised the State Department of the appointment of Ametoly Antonovich Takovlev as Vice Consul of the USSE in New York. Takovlev has been determined to be identical with Yakovlev.

On December 27, 1946, Takovlev reportedly departed from the Mited States destined for Paris, France, and the State Department has advited that as of July, 1948, Takovlev was serving as Second Secretary at the Sovjet Embassy in Paris.

The records of the Hilton Hotel, Albuquerons, New Lowlon, For Hot Registration Card No. 65841, dated June 3, 1948, which reveals the registration of Harry Gold, 6828 Kindred Street, Philadelphia 24 Pannsylvents of the firm Terry & Seibert is listed as the place of employment of Gold. The FBI laboratory has concluded that the handwriting appearing on this registration card is identical with the known handwriting of Harry Gold 10

HARRY GOLD, WAS., ESP - R. GOLD QUESTIONED TODAY CONCERNING WHAT HE IDENTIFIED AS ROUGH DRAFT REPORTS HE SUBMITTED TO SOVIETS IN THIRTY EIGHT AS POSSIBLE RECRUITS. #### THE GRAND JURY CHARGES!

Reginning on or about December 1945 and continuing thereafter for a considerable period, the exact period being to the Grand Jury unknown, but in no event subsequent to Hovember 80, 1947, in the Bastern District of New York, within the jurisdiction of this Court, in the Borough of Nanhattan, New York City, in Santa Fe, Hew Mexico, in Boston and Cambridge, Massachusetts, and divers other places to the Grand Jury unknown, HARRY GOLD, JOHE DOE, alies "John" and RICHARD ROB, alies "SAM", the defendants berein, th true and correct names of the latter two defendants being to the Grand Jury unknown, did, the United States then and there being at war, conspire, combine, confederate and agree together and with EMIL JULIUS KIAUS FUCHS and divers other persons to the Grand July unknown, to violate Subsection (a) of Section 52, Title 50, United States Code, in that they did conspire, combine, confederate and agree, with intent and reason to believe that it would be used to the advantage of a foreign nation, to-wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republies, to communicate, deliver and transmit, and attempt to communicate, deliver and transmit, and aid and induce others to communicate, deliver and transmit to a foreign government, to-wit, the Union of Soviet Socielist Republics and representatives and agents thereof, directly and indirectly, documents, writings, sketches, notes and information relating to the national defense of the United States, to-wit documents, writings, sketches, notes and information relating to atomic energy and nuclear fission.

B. Pursuant to the said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, at the times and places herein below indicated, the defendants and co-conspirators did commit, among others, the following overt acts:

Borough of Manhattan, New York City, the defendant HARRY GOLD met and sonferred with the defendant RICHARD ROE, alies "MAN".


b. In or about the month of February or March, 1944, the exact date being to the Grand Jury unknown, in the Borough of Manhattan, Hew York City, the defendant HARRY OQLD met and conferred with RMIL JULIUS KIAUS FUCHS.







made available by Mr. R. J. FELLINGER, Registrar, reflected that the subject was born December 12, 1910 at Berne, Switzerland. On one of the records, however, the name Buenplatz, Switzerland, appears, as GOLD's place of birth rather than Berne.

#### Family:

The registration card of the Xavier University, prepared by GOLD, set forth that his father is SAN GOLD, with occupation as cabinet maker-RCA-Victor Corporation, Camden, New Jersey. GOLD's mother was listed as CELIA OMANSKY and the record indicated that GOLD has one younger brother.

#### Residence:

5032 North Boudinot Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

This address was listed by the subject in the records of Xavier University as his home address during his attendance at that school from 1938 to 1940.

#### 49 Glendale Street, Cincinnati, Ohio

The address 49 Glendale Street, Cincinnati, was noted by the subject as a local address while attending Xavier University from September, 1938 to June, 1940.

Mrs. ALYS BROOKES, 49 Glendale Street, advised that HARRY GOLD had a room and boarded in her home while he was at Xavier University. She could not recall the exact dates; however, it was her recollection that he came there at the time he started school and she remembered that he left on the day he graduated from the University. Mrs. BROOKES related that she did not remember the circumstances through which GOLD happened to come to her home but she did recall that someone from the University called her and GOLD them came out to see her. She stated her husband died in August, 1938 and shortly thereafter, she decided to rent a room in her home, preferably to a student.

Mrs. BROOKES further stated that since her home is located in the Hartwell Section of the City, she pointed out to the subject it was a rather long distance from there to commute to the University each day but that he decided to stay there because he desired to be where it was quiet so that he could study. It is noted that the subject attended Xavier

University from September 14, 1938 to June 5, 1940. Mrs. BROOKES stated that GOLD lived at her home continuously from the time he started living there until he left in June, 1940 and during that period left there only briefly during school holidays and vacations at which times it was her impression he visited at his home in Philadelphia. On graduation day, as Mrs. BROOKES recalls, GOLD departed from her home, presumably to return to Philadelphia.

#### Education:

#### High School

The records of Xavier University, Cincinnati, reflected that the subject graduated from the Philadelphia High School for Boys, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in 1928.

#### College

University of Pennsylvania. Included in the records of Kavier University is a transcript of work taken by GOLD at the University of Pennsylvania, for the year 1930-31 and the first term of the school year 1931-32.

Drexel Institute, Evening School, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. An additional transcript of courses from the Drexel Institute reflecting work taken during the 1933-34 and 1935-36 school years appears among the records of Xavier University.

Xavier University, Cincinnati. According to the files of the Xavier University, HARRY GOLD entered that school on September 14, 1938 for the purpose of completing work toward his Bachelor of Science degree in the field of Chemistry. The subject's registration stated that he wished to make Chemistry his life's work. His landlady, Mrs. BROOKES, and Mr. ROBERT PIENING, class-mate of GOLD, both advised that they understood he chose Xavier University because that school accepted the transfer of certain of his courses, which other schools had refused.

On June 5, 1940, GOLD received a Bachelor of Science degree (summa cum laude) from Xavier University. He ranked tenth in a class

of eighty-three students. Minors of Mathematics and English were noted among his studies, with the Major of Chemistry. Twenty-five hours of the courses completed at Xavier were noted to be in the field of Chemistry. There follows a summary of the courses taken by the subject at Xavier University:

During the 1938-39 school year, from September 14, 1938 to June, 1939, GOLD carried sixteen hours the first semester and nineteen during the second.

#### Extra Curricular Activities:

At the time of registering at the University, GOLD expressed an interest in the outside activities of Publications, Basketball, and Track.

#### Chess Club:

The only other reference to GOLD in the 1940 Xavier Year Book was to the effect that he was a member of the committee for the 1940 Chess tournament.

Mr. WILLIAM J. F. ROLL, Sales Department, Crosley Division, Avco Corporation, advised that he was a member of the Xavier class of 1910 and served on the Chess committee with GOLD. ROLL stated the Chess Club consisted of approximately twenty-five students at Xavier, who participated in a Chess tournament, which lasted from January to approximately June of each year. He advised that all matches were played in the school library, generally during school hours. ROLL recalled GOLD as an avid Chess player and stated that this was the only activity outside of the class room in which he had noted GOLD to participate. He stated that at no time did he see GOLD at a school social function. ROLL advised that he made a review of each issue of the Xavier University weekly school publication, printed during the period of GOLD's attendance at the school and only once did he find GOLD's name mentioned, this being in connection with the Chess tournament.

#### Associates:

The following persons were interviewed in an effort to determine the subject's associates during the time he resided in Cincinnati.

Mrs. ALYS BROOKES, Landlady, 49 Glendale Street, Cincinnati Miss AUDREY G. BROOKES, her daughter

Mr. R. J. FELLINGER, Registrar, Xavier University.
Reverend FREDERICK N. MILLER, Head of Chemistry Department,
Xavier University.

Reverend PAUL SWEENEY, Head of English Department, Xavier University, during 1940.

Mr. PAUL C. BECKMAN, Attorney, 1714 First National Bank Building, Cincinnati, President, Xavier class of 1940.

Mr. ROBERT INKROT, 218 W. McMillan Street, Cincinnati, Secretary, Xavier class of 1940.

Mr. ROBERT PIENING, Chemist, Burger Brewing Company, Cincinnati, and RALPH KLINGENBERG, 713 Sixth Street, Dayton, Kentucky, fellow students of subject in the field of Chemistry, while at Xavier University.

Dr. JOSEPH J. KLINCENBERG and IRVING BEUMER, both currently connected with Xavier University; WILLIAM J. F. ROLL, Crosley Corporation, all students at Xavier University at the time of subject's attendance there.

Mrs. BROOKES stated that GOID was extremely studious and at no time, to her recollection, did he bring either a male or female companion to her home nor did he mention anyone to her as being an associate. She advised that GOLD received a certain amount of mail, which she believed to be from his family in Philadelphia. Mrs. BROOKES remarked that GOLD was in his room, apparently studying, until late at night during most of the time he resided in her home. According to her, his week ends were also spent in this manner and he left the house, as far as she knew, only to take a walk or to attend an occasional movie.

Reverend MILLER and Reverend SWEENEY both stated that they recall GOLD very well. He was regarded as an intense student, who was cooperative and anxious to fit himself in with the school, despite the fact he was not a Catholic and was several years older than the average students. They could recall no one with whom the subject associated closely while at school. Reverend MILLER pointed out that GOLD carried an above average work load at school and, consequently, it was necessary for him to spend an exceptional amount of time in studying in order to obtain the grades which he was successful in maintaining at school.

Mr. PIENING and Mr. RALPH KLINGENBERG likewise readily recalled GOLD and stated they were associated very closely with him in connection with the pursuit of Chemistry courses at Xavier University. They advised, however, that outside of school work, they could recall no time when they went out with the subject socially or otherwise associated with him. PIENING related that GOLD carried a photograph of a girl friend, who was believed to be residing somewhere in the Eastern part of the United States.



Arrangements were made among several of the Chemistry students, including GOLD, to go out together following the graduation exercises at school and the girl, whose photograph GOLD carried, was to come to Cincinnati for the graduation. According to PIENING, the girl did not come as planned and GOLD failed to appear at the get-together.

The others interviewed were unable to add anything to that already set forth. They all agreed that GOLD was a very quiet individual and seldon spoke unless he was approached. These individuals related they have had no contact with GOLD since the time of his graduation from Xavier.

#### Credit:

The records of the Credit Bureau of Cincinnati failed to reflect any record of the subject.

#### Criminal:

A check of the Eureau of Records and Identification Division records, Cincinnati Police Department, failed to reflect any information concerning the subject.

#### COMMUNIST PARTY ACTIVITIES:

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, who was acquainted with Communist Party activities during the time GOLD resided in Cincinneti, advised on May 25, 1950 that he could not recall the subject either by name or photograph as having been involved in any Communist Party activity in Cincinnati.

#### LOYALTY

The individuals listed under the heading of Associates as having been interviewed in that connection all advised that at no time during the subject's attendance at Xavier University did anything come to their attention which would reflect on GOLD's loyalty to the United States.

#### Associates:

Mr. ROBERT PIEMING, fellow student of the subject while at Kavier University, related that he recalled that the subject, while at Xavier, was in correspondence with a Dr. REICH. According to PIEMING, GOLD had an interview with REICH during a convention of the American Chemical Society in Cincinnati in about April, 1940. PIEMING thought that GOLD's contacts with REICH had to do with employment, which GOLD was seeking upon graduation from school. GOLD, according to PIEMING and Reverend MILLER, was believed to have obtained employment with a Pennsylvania sugar refining corporation after graduating from Xavier.

No lead is being set out to identify REICH or to determine the nature of his connections with the subject. This is being left to the discretion of the office of origin.

#### Residence:

#### 19 Glendale Street, Cincinnati.

The Philadelphia Office by retel, dated May 25, 1950, advised that the subject furnished the address 19 Glendale Street, Cincinnati, for the summer of 1936. A search of the City Directories for the years 1935 through 1949 reflects that there has never been a residence listed at 19 Glendale Street. These directories further indicate that Glendale Street consists of one short block, extending from 8250 Vine Street to Burns Avenue. The reporting agent observed that the house numbers at the present time are numbered from 2 to 67 on Glendale Street and on the odd numbered side of the street run in the order 7,9.13,17,25 etc.

Mrs. BROOKES stated that it is her opinion that the subject had not been on Glendale Street prior to the time he came to reside at her home in September, 1938. She pointed out that she has lived there for the past twenty-six years and has known everyone on the block, who resided there during that period. She further advised that the first time GOLD came to her home to see about obtaining his room, while attending school, he used a city map in order to locate her address and he appeared to be entirely unfamiliar with that part of the city.

Mrs. BROOKES advised that SAMUEL B. MILLIGAN, who resided at 17 Glendale Street in 1936 and Mr. WILLIAM L. KEMPER, who lived at 25 Glendale

at that time, are both dead.

Mr. ADAM KUHN, 543 East 13th Street, Cincinnati, retired Cincinnati Police Officer and present time house detective at the Netherland-Plaza Hotel, stated that he resided at 16 Glendale Street from 1931 to 1942, He related that during 1936, he knew most of the residents of that area and patrolled Glendale Street as part of his police duties. It was his opinion that the subject was not residing in that section for any length of time during the summer of 1936.

#### Employment:

Retel, from the Philadelphia Office, dated May 25, 1950 further advised that subject had been employed at the Moormeir Dairy Company for one year and ten months, dates not given, and requested necessary investigation be conducted.

Mr. NATHAN W. FESSENDEN, 1912 Dana Avenue, Cincinnati, advised that he was the manager of the Moormeier Brothers Dairy Company, 1914 Dana Avenue, from 1932 to 1940, at which time the company went out of business. He reported that he made a search of all available records of the driry company and has failed to locate any reference to the subject as having been employed there. FESSENDEN related that the company was a rather small concern and that he got to know promotily all of the employees while they were employed there. He stated he is positive that he would recall any person employed there for any length of time during the period he operated the dairy and he does not recall GOLD either by name or from photographs which have appeared in recent newspapers in connection with GOLD's arrest.

According to FESSENDEN, the only capacity in which GOLD might have been employed and he would not recall him, would be that of a Solicitor. FESSENDEN advised he did hire several persons for approximately one week's time to solicit customers for the dairy and he has no record of who these persons were.

In addition to the above, Mr. FESSENDEN searched the payroll records of the Dairy Bar, Inc., 1912 Dana Avenue, which he has operated since 1935, for a time in conjunction with the dairy company, and he advised that he was unable to locate any record of GOLD being employed there either.

FESSENDEN stated he made inquiry of his wife, who has been

Reference is made to Philadelphia letter dated June 15, 1950 requesting that THOMAS M. BRUCE, Jr., of the Guaranty Union Life Insurance Company, 107 North San Vincente, be interviewed regarding WERNER KRONENBERG, in connection with the above matter. Special Agents GILLER G. ROBINSON and HAROLD F. DODGE interviewed THOMAS M. BRUCE on June 20, 1950 at the above address, at which time the following information was developed.

Mr. BRUCE stated that in 1948 he and his wife were living at 4703 Cedar Avenue in Philadelphia, and while living at this address became acquainted with Mr. and Mrs. WERNER TRONENBERG, of the same address.

Mr. BRUCE advised that Mr. KRONENBERG was a German refugee who was engaged in the import - export business, with offices in the Stock Exchange Building, 1111 Walnut Street, Philadelphia.

Mr. BRUCE said that he frequently engaged KRONENBERG in political discussions and that he was of the opinion that KRONENBERG was a Socialist, if not actually a Communist. Mr. ERUCE based his opinion on KRONENBERG's pro-WALLACE views and his critical attitude of the United States' foreign policy. Mr. BRUCE could furnish no further information regarding the above. Informant stated that they were so far apart in their political views that every time he engaged KRONENEERG in a discussion an agrument would ensue and would end in terminating the conversation.

Mr. BRUCE advised that the KRONENBERGS did not appear to have a large income, but that KRONENBERG was frequently away from Philadelphia on trips and that some of these trips appeared to be of a "secret nature". Mr. ERUCE could furnish no information to justify his suspicions regarding these trips only to mention that he had learned on one occasion KRONENBERG had been to South America. Mr. BRUCE further advised that KRONENBERG received many long distance telephone calls; that he entertained foreign looking people and that he had heard what he believed to be a wireless set emanating from the bedroom of KRONENBERG.

With reference to HARRY GOLD, Mr. BRUCE advised that he had never observed GOLD himself nor did he have any first-hand knowledge of GOLD's association with KRONENBERG. BRUCE stated that his wife was in the hospital in Philadelphia at the time GOLD was arrested and that she had written him to say that she believed she had seen GOLD on several occasions sitting on the porch talking to KRONENBERG while living at 4703 Cedar Avenue.

A photograph of GOLD was shown to ERUCE and he advised that he recognized this as being the same individual whose picture appeared in the Philadelphia Inquirer and that he had personally never seen the individual.

BRUCE described KRONFNBERG as being about 40 years of age, 517\*, weight 150 lbs., hair crinkly brown, married, one small child about four years of age. Mr. BRUCE advised that his wife would be in a position to furnish further information regarding HARRY GOLD.

Mrs. THOMAS M. BRUCE, Jr., 2653 Patricia Avenue, advised that she recognized the picture of HARRY GOLD in the Philadelphia Inquirer as "looking like the same man" who had visited KRONENBERG during the fall of 1948. Mrs. BRUCE was shown several photographs of HARRY GOLD and she said she was "almost positive" it was the same man. She advised that she had never been introduced to GOLD and that the only information she had learned regarding this person, now believed to be GOLD, was second handed. She said that this information came from a friend to the effect that the visitor of KHONENBERG was a doctor at the University (Pennsylvania). Mrs. BRUCE was questioned for further information which might assist in identifying HARRY GOLD, with negative results.

Mrs. ERUCE stated that Mr. and Mrs. GROVES, of 4703 Cedar Avenue in Philadelphia could furnish further information regarding KRONENBERG.

The Philadelphia Office should consider interviewing Mr. and Mrs. GROVES to develop further information regarding WERNER KRONENEERG and to determine whether or not the person referred to by Mrs. BRUCE is possibly identical with the subject of this case.



At 3:35 pm, SAC Cornelius called to savise that Judge McGranery just called him to inform him that John D. M. Hamilton had been appointed attorney for Harry Gold. Mr. Cornelius advised that Hamilton is former National Chairman of the Republican Party who is presently a very reputable practicing attorney in Philadelphia.

Mr. Cornelius advised that acting on the invitation of Judge McGranery, he and Special Agent T. Scott Willer are leaving immediately for the Judge's chambers for the purpose of meeting Attorney Hamilton. Mr. Cornelius will bring up the question of further interviews with Gold and will further bring up the question as to a continuance of the search of Gold's home.

With reference to the question as to why the search of Gold's home was discontinued, I queried Mr. Cornelius on this score. He advised that the questioning of Gold in his home and the search had been set up by the interviewing Agents at a time when Gold's father and brother would not be home. As you know, Gold was interrogated on items found as the search progressed, and through this technique, it was possible to secure his confession. As soon as Gold started to confess, the Agents felt it urgently necessary to immediately remove him to the Philadelphia Office for the purpose of getting his confession down in a signed statement before he cooled off or changed his mind. Gold was questioned continuously from that time until he was apprehended and there was no opportunity to continue the search. Mr. Cornelius advised that it was felt undesirable to again take Gold to his home, particularly in the presence of his father and brother who were not acquainted with Gold's complicity in this case until after Gold had been questioned for some time at the Philadelphia Office. The Agents were of the opinion that the most important and urgent problem was to secure as much information from Gold as possible while he was willing to talk and in the time available before he was arrested and brought before a committing official. Mr. Cornelius advised that additional Agents were not designated to continue the search in Gold's absence because it was felt that either he or a representative of the Gold family should be present during the search. Once Gold was apprehended, it was felt necessary to consult with any attorney he might secure before again entering the home.

John D. M. Hamilton is, of course, a well known public figure. There are undoubtedly numerous references in Bureau files concerning him. In the event you desire, a memorandum will be prepared, furnishing his general background and reflecting any derogatory information we may have. recorded - **56** INDEXED - 56



As you are aware, we have been holding up any further interviews with Harry Gold in view of Attorney Hamilton's letter dated June 7, 1950, in effect, restricting Gold from making statements involving his intent while engaged in espionage activities without first clearing with his attorney.

On the afternoon of June 10, SAC Cornelius advised me that Agents Miller and Brennan are standing by for the purpose of further interviews with Gold, which interviews Cornelius believes are highly desirable. Mr. Cornelius pointed out that from his discussions with Hamilton, the latest being on the afternoon of June 9, he is sure that Hamilton is not seeking to restrict the interviews with Gold in any manner, nor is he restricting any type of questioning of Gold, whether as to intent or otherwise. Hamilton has continually expressed his desire to cooperate and has pointed out to Cornelius that Gold has flatly stated that he wants to continue interviews with the Agents. Inasmuch as Hamilton has been appointed to represent Gold, his only concern is that he, as Gold's attorney, will have the opportunity of reviewing any statements made by Gold dealing with the matter of intent before Gold signs such statements.

It is noted that in so far as Gold's intent is concerned, that this is included in the first signed statement of May 22, and the contemplated questioning of Gold is along lines of his associates and contacts and in all probability, will not go further into the matter of intent.

Mr. Cornelius advised that on the afternoon of June 9, Mr. Hamilton told him that when Hamilton was interviewing Gold on Thursday, June 8, Gold recalled a number of items which he wanted to tell the Agents and kept making notes of matters he wanted to tell the Agents. Cornelius inquired whether Hamilton was going to interview Gold on June 9 or 10, and Hamilton replied that he was not and urged Cornelius to have the Agents continue the interview with Gold.

Mr. Cornelius advised that he felt that the interviews should continue at once in view of the fact that we have a number of pertinent



inquiries to make of Gold, particularly with respect to securing from Gold complete and detailed information regarding Black, Slack, Brothman, and Greenglass in preparation for our contemplated interviews with these individuals.

Hamilton has consistently stated that Gold wants to cooperate fully and completely with the Agents and unquestionably this is going to be used by Hamilton as a mitigating circumstance in his plea for a lighter sentence. It is my recommendation that we continue the interviews with Gold. Agent Miller has advised me that Gold is like a lemon—every time you squeeze him, there is some juice left. I would suggest that the interviews be resumed at once and that Cornelius keep a careful weather eye out for any change in Hamilton's attitude or any attempt to place restrictions on the interviews.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

### ADMINISTRATIVE

WOLLAM was interviewed at Glenwood, Minnesota, and advised that his brother, GERHARD, got him a job with Abraham Brothman and Associates at their laboratory, 8503 57th Avenue, Elmhurst, New York, in the last part of November, 1945. He was employed as a laboratory technician there until about the middle of June, 1947. ROLF WOLLAN knew HARRY GOLD as an employee of Brothman and Associates and believed him to be a Communist inasmuch as he was closely associated with ABE BROTHMAN. ROLF WOLLAN believed nearly all of the employees at Brothman and Associates were Communist or at least Communist sympathizers. RULF'S brother, GERHARD, was known to him as a Communist for many years and a follower of BROWDER. When BROWDER was expelled from the Communist Party GERHARD WOLLAN quit attending Communist meetings and did not get along with BROTHMAN thereafter. ROLF WOLLAN had no information as to contacts on the part of HARRY GOLD or any Communist activity on his part.

DETAILS

ROLF SIDNEY WOLLAN was interviewed on May 29, 1950, at Glenwood, Minnesota, by Special Agents MARTIN J. LUKOSKIE and ROY O. STURRE. At this time WOLLAN advised that he was born on November 14, 1911, at Glenwood, Minnesota; attended Luther College, Decorah, Iowa, graduating in 1934; taught school at St. Minnesota, from 1936 to 1941, and at Verndale, Minnesota, in 1941 and 1942

TOLLAN stated that in high school he was nicknamed "GOOF," and in college he was nicknamed "Pro." He stated that he is now nicknamed "The Professor," and that he believed this is due to the fact that he liked to play pool and billiards, and most of the fellows who hang around pool halls were not college graduates. Accordingly, they called him "The Professor." WOLLAN is presently unemployed:

WOLLAN went into the United States Army on June 13, 1942, and rose to the rank of Second Lieutenant. He was connected with the 349th Signal Intelligence Corps Allied Force Headquarters. On October 12, 1945, he was released from the Army at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey. He returned to Glenwood, Minnesota, where he remained until the last part of November, 1945, when he went to New York City:

WOLLAN advised that his brother, GERHARD WOLLAN, got him a job with Abraham Brothman and Associates at their laboratory, 8503 57th Avenue, Elmhurst, New York. At this time Brothman and Associates' office was in Manhattan, but later it was moved to 2928 list Avenue, Long Island City: WOLLAN was employed as a laboratory technician at \$50.00 a week until the middle of June, 1947, when he left, principally because he was homesick and also because Brothman and Associates was low on funds and he was not being paid regularly. He stated that Brothman and Associates still owe him more than \$500.00 in back salary.

During the time that ROLF WOLLAN was connected with Brothman and Associates he resided at 23 Reeve Place, Brooklyn, New York, with his brother, GERHARD, until GERHARD moved in about September or October, 1916. ROLF then moved to Woodside, Long Island, on about 61th Street or Wenue-he could not remember which. He lived with a man by the name of HAMS HAMER and rented this room through an advertisement in the newspaper. HANS HAMER, according to ROLF WOLLAN, was not connected in any way with Brothman and Associates.

ROLF WOLLAN also advised that his brother, GERHAND, was in charge of the laboratory and was a partner in Abraham Brothman and Associates. GERHARD WOLLAN, ABE BROTHMAN, BILL ROHAL, BERNIE PIDTO, SOLFRACCHEL, and ROLF played handball on several occasions, and after finishing would usually go some place to eat. At this time a discussion usually took place; and this would concern Communism and Soviet Russia. ROLF stated that almost all of the fellows employed by Brothman and Associates were Communists; and ROLF believed that to be an associate in Brothman and Associates one would have to be a Communist. He stated that he knew his brother, GERHARD, was a Communist during the late 1930's and up until about 1945. GERHARD was a follower of BROWDER; and when BROWDER was expelled from the Communist Party GERHARD discontinued going to any of the Communist Party meetings.

According to ROLF, GERH AD was also at odds with ABE BROTHMAN, OSCAR VAGOE, SOL FRANCHEL, and MERIAM MOSCOWITZ who were associates in the company after BROWDER was expelled from the Communist Party. The above four individuals continued to be active Communists or at least seemed to be active Communists, according to ROLF WOLLIN. ROLF also advised that BILL ROHAL, who was employed by Brothman and Associates, and he, ROLF, were probably the only two individuals employed by that concern who were not Communists or who were not at least closely associated with the Communists or sympathetic to them.

ROLF WOLLIN stated that H/RRY GOLD was employed by Brothman and Associates and commuted for a short time from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Thereafter he got a room in New York City and stayed there instead of commuting back and forth to Philadelphia. He stated that H/RRY GOLD was a person who appeared to be interested only in the laboratory at Brothman and Associates and also in the company itself. He stated that GOLD at no time in his presence ever discussed Communism nor did he ever mention that he in any way was connected with the Communist Party. ROLF stated that he believed that GOLD must have been a Communist, however, in view of the fact that he was very friendly and closely associated with ABE PROTATION and also with SOL FRANCHEL, MERIAM MOSCOWITZ and OSCAR VAGOE. He stated that he did not believe that GOLD would have been employed by Brothman and Associates in a responsible position unless he had been a Communist or at least close to the Communists. ROLF stated that he believed GOLD formerly worked for Hiram Walker as a chemist during the war.

MOLLIN stated that he never knew HERRY GOLD or IBE BROTHMIN to meet with anyone who could have been a functionary in the Communist Party or who was an official of the Communist Party. He stated that he never, himself, knew any functionaries in the Communist Party, so he would be in no position to make any accurate statement concerning this. In the late summer of 1946 ROLF was in his brother's, GERHARD'S living room when a man who was organizer for his brother's old Communist Party club in Brooklyn, tried to get GERHARD to rejoin the Communist Party. In argument took place, and GERHARD did not rejoin the Communist Party. GERHARD'S wife, HELENALYER, who originally came from Cape Girardeau, Missouri, and who attended Columbia University in New York City, was also a member of the Communist Party but broke off from the Communist Party when her husband left this organization. He stated that GERHARD originally converted her to Communism.

After the split in the Communist Party and BROWDER was expelled, GERHARD and ABE BROTHMAN were not in harmony. Before that time they were very close friends and associates. ROLF stated that he did not know whether or not HARRY GOLD was ever closely associated with his brother, GERHARD.

ABE BROTHMAN tried to get contracts with the Soviet Government Purchasing Commission at one time but was unable to get any of these contracts.

He stated he didn't know who BROTHLIN contacted in the Soviet Purchasing Commission.

According to ROLF WOLLAN, a man by the name of DR FOM or POMERASKI (ph.) from the Great Western Stores in England was trying to do business with Brothman and Associates. DR. POM asked BROTHMAN for a sample of their work. Instead of sending the sample from the laboratory at Brothman and Associates, BROTHMAN went out and bought a Dupont product and sent it as a sample from their own laboratory. ROLF WOLLAN advised that although he did not know much about chemistry and about the products which were being made by Brothman and Associates, he stated he did not believe they were operating on a sound basis or that they actually had any good product; and he mentioned this incident concerning the Great Western Stores as an example of the type of activity that Brothman and Associates engaged in.

ROLF WOLLAN advised that he was never closely associated with HARRY GOLD and that the only reason he suspected him of being a Communist was the fact that he was so closely associated with and so friendly with ABE BROTHMAN. He stated that he knew nothing of GOLD'S activities other than the fact that he worked at Brothman and Associates.



FREANEY dated June 19, 1950 at New York setting forth information that the records of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology reflects that subject was born March 1. 1901 at Odessa, Russia. This information is carried in the details of the report and was furnished the New York Office by teletype from the Boston Office dated June 7, 1950.

A subsequent administrative report entitled "SEMION MARCK SEMIONOV, was.; ESPIONAGE - R\* submitted by SA BRENTON S. GORDON of the Boston Office on June 15, 1950, reflects that the records of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology failed to indicate the year of subject's birth.

The report also notes that the regulations of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology provide that information in its files are confidential and cannot be obtained other than by subpoena and that the informants of the Boston Office who have furnished the information are jeopardizing their position by violating the M.I.T. rule.

On the morning of June 8, 1950, in the absence of SAC Scheidt and ASAC Whelan, I spoke to Supervisor Granville, of the New York Office. I advised him that at the Grand Jury hearing on June 9, the following witnesses are scheduled:

Special Agents T. Scott Miller and Richard Brennan, who interviewed Gold; Special Agent Dahlgren, of the Laboratory, relative to the hotel registration cards signed by Gold; and, Special Agent Robert Lamphere, relative to his interview of Fuchs.

Lamphere will testify that Fuchs identified Gold as his contact and will testify relative to the meetings between Fuchs and Gold. He will not testify concerning classified information, except in a general way to reflect that Fuchs did pass confidential information to Gold.

Mr. Granville was advised that at the request of the Department we have learned that the AEC representative will be John A. Derry, Executive Officer with the Division of Biology and Research. Mr. Derry will testify concerning the fact that information in Gold's statement setting forth information that Fuchs passed to Gold was of a classified nature at the time it was passed. Mr. Granville was advised that Mr. Derry is now in New York and has been given Granville's name so that the New York Office can assist Mr. Derry in consulting with Mr. Frank Parker, of the EDNY, tomorrow morning.

According to LOESCH, the Cincinnati Club is a private club and non-members are not permitted to stay at the Club without the sponsorship of a Club member. He advised that his records indicated that COLD had been referred to the Club by a person then employed at the Union Terminal Railroad Station in Cincinnati. This individual resided at the Cincinnati Club and from time to time recommended the Club to persons who made inquiry at the Station for a place to stay. Through this individual arrangements were made to have an official of the Club sign as a sponsor, which was the case with GOLD, according to LOESCH.

The registration for HARRY GOLD at the Cincinnati Club was shown to be sponsored by "C. PEDRETTI, per O. OSBORNE." Mr. JOHN LOESCH, Assistant Manager, stated that O. OSBORNE was actually a Mrs. OSBORNE, who had been employed at the Union Terminal in Cincinnati.

Mrs. EILA STEINS, Manager's Office, Union Terminal, advised that Mrs. ORA M. OSBORNE, Social Security Number 706-16-1989, had been employed at the Terminal as Information Clerk until February 8, 1939, at which time she retired.

Mr. JAMES MONHALLEN, Railroad Retirement Board, 1011 Vine Street, Cincinnati, stated that in the event Mrs. OSBORNE was currently receiving a pension, her address could be obtained from the Railroad Retirement Board, 44 Rush Street, Chicago 11, Illinois. Mr. LOESCH stated that he understood Mrs. OSBORNE was in Florida at the present time.

The name "C. PEDRETTI," according to Mr. LOESCH, referred to CHARLES A. PEDRETTI, local Cincinnati interior decorator, who during 1938 was a Director of the Cincinnati Club. LOESCH advised that PEDRETTI is no longer living. LOESCH exhibited to the reporting Agent several other registrations at the Cincinnati Club during this period bearing the same sponsor as that for GOLD. LOESCH stated he recalled that Mrs. OSBORNE occasionaly referred persons making inquiry of her at the Union Terminal for a place to stay to the Cincinnati Club and arranged for PEDRETTI to act as a sponsor for such individuals.

No further effort is being made to locate Mrs. OSBORNE in view of the explanation offered by LOESCH for sponsorship of GOLD at the Cincinnati Club.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE PACE (CON'T)

By teletype dated June 13, 1950, in the case entitled "ALFRED DEAN SLACK, Espionage - R," the Philadelphia Office advised that HARRY GOLD stated he possibly had registered at the Cincinnati Club on a Sunday morning during the first week of May, 1943. GOLD further stated he thought he registered under the name of HARRY GOLD, but that he had not spent the night at the Club.

On June 14, 1950, Mr. LOESCH stated he was unable to locate registration records for the year 1943. On June 19, 1950, LOESCH stated together with other employees of the Cincinnati Club he had made a thorough search of the room in which the old records are maintained, but that he was unsuccessful in locating the 1943 records. He stated it had been determined that it was in 1943 the Club changed its system of registration from register sheets to the use of individual registration cards. Through inquiry among other employees, it was concluded by LOESCH that the 1943 records had been destroyed at the time the record room was cleaned out approximately a year ago. LOESCH further advised that he was unable to find an advance registration for GOLD in a special book maintained for that purpose for the year 1943.

LOESCH pointed out that it was his opinion that neither Mrs. OSBORNE nor Mr. PEDRETTI were in Cincinnati during 1943 and that it would have been necessary for a non-member such as GOLD to again obtain additional sponsorhsip in order to stop at the Club.

Mr. BRIEHN said that he did not believe that these records have been destroyed and he will continue to search for these records. Mr. BRIEHN located the carbon copy sheets of the folio reflecting the hotel registration of HARRY GOID for June 3 and 4, 1945, and for September 19, 1945. These folio records did not reflect a long distance telephone call. The folio for September 19, 1945, reflected one local call for which lie was charged. Mr. BRIEHN stated that the identity of this local call would be in the same jacket with the hotel telephone records and accordingly it could not be located or identified until the other records are located.

T-2 stated that in 1945 the records of Western Union, Albuquerque were retained for six months only and then destroyed. He said that the Western Union Office would have no record of GOLD or anyone else receiving money by telegraphic order in 1945. T-2 said that he believed in 1945 the telegraphic money order records were kept by the auditor of each Western Union division and should such order have come from New York or Philadelphia, this record would be found in the auditor's office in New York City. T-2 stated that the present policy is to send all such records to the general auditor of Western Union in Minneapolis, Minnesota, but he believes that this general office was not established in 1945 and would have no records prior to the date of its establishment.

T-3 informed that in 1945 the policy of the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company, Albuquerque, was to destroy all telephone records after one year. T-3 stated that it is possible that such records might be found in their home office in El Paso, Texas.

## ADMINISTRATIVE PAGE

The Philadelphia Division advised by teletype June 16, 1950, in substance the following information: THOMAS L. BLACK in a signed statement admitted he knew that GOID made a trip to Albuquerque, New Mexico, sometime before the test atomic bomb was exploded in New Mexico. GOID telephoned BLACK from a hotel in Albuquerque and asked him to telegraph some funds, probably \$50. BLACK did not respond. BLACK believed the telephone call was made to his home, 17 Oxford Street, Newark, New Jersey, telephone number believed to have been KArket 3-5710.

T-l stated that he believed that a JCHNNIE MICHAELS who is a politician in Albuquerque possibly requested the hotel reservation at the Hilton Hotel for HARRY GOLD in 1945. T-l said that when he first read in the newspaper regarding the apprehension of HARRY GOLD, he immediately thought of MICHAELS as having been the person who contacted the hotel. T-l stated he was not sure and would not state positively that MICHAELS made this reservation for GOLD but he had that impression the first time he heard of HARRY GCLD being arrested.

"I, JAMES CHARLES CHIRBAS, wish to make the following voluntary statement to Special Agents W. WINTON WARREN and FRANK DOUGLAS HEREFORD of the Federal Bureau of Investigation concerning HARRY GOLD.

"Around 11:55 AM, June 2, 1950, I was seated at the table in the RAFB Cafeteria. At the time I ate lunch with HARRY DIEROY (phonetic) who is employed in the Kaintenance Division of the Warner Robins Air Materiel Area, and who, I am advised, resides at Forsyth, Georgia.

"I mentioned to him that the government in this country was uncovering a bunch of spys, or words to that effect. He asked me "You mean HARRY GOLD?" I told him "Yes," and he added that he knew HARRY COLD, that he had known him in Philadelphia, Penna., and used to go over to drug store in Philadelphia which is operated by one of the family. I supposed that he meant one of

the GOID family. He said he had overheard HARRY GOLD and GOID's friends talking on a number of occasions in the Drug Store and had heard HARRY GOLD say that RUSSIA would eventially dominate the World. He said he knew some of HARRY GOLD's friends and named two or three of such persons, but I can't recall the names he named to me. One of the names sounded something like SOKOLOSKI who he said was an architect. He added that he would not be surprised if some of these persons would be indicted for espionage along with HARRY GOLD. He did not tell me whether he had known GOLD and the latter's associates at places other than at the drug store. He said his acquaintance with GOLD had centered around the drug store and had not known GOLD socially.

"I telephonically advised Special Agent W. W. WARREN of the above information on this date and later telephonically advised him of the name, HARRY OLEROY (phonetic). Between the first and second telephone call to Special Agent WARREN, I telephonically contacted Major PAUL KUBALA, Base Intelligence Officer, around 1:15 PM and told him substantially the same information as that stated above.

"I told him that I had called the FBI Office in Macon and had given the FBI some information and had obtained the name OLEROY in order to give it to the FBI Agent, Special Agent WARREN, who had requested that I get the man's name with whom I had talked. Major KUBALA then told me to keep the FBI out of this. He said, "you are not supposed to get in touch with the FBI on the Field." I understood that he meant that it would not be a good idea for me to try to get in touch with the FBI while I was working on the field. He indicated that any thing happening on Robins Field came under his jurisdiction and that he would be the proper person to be notified.

"I told him I wanted to telephone the FBI Office to give them the OLEROY (Phonetic) name, and he told me not to.

\*After talking with Major KUBALA, I telephonically advised SA W. W. WARREN of the name HARRY OLEROY.

Maround 2:15 PM, Captain WALSH telephonically requested me to ge to the OSI Office, which I did. He questioned me for full details concerning OLEROY and the information which he had related to me on this date. Records of the Robins Air Force Base, Warner Robins, Georgia, were negative as to HARRY OLEROY but did reflect the name of HARRY K. OLDROYD, employed in a civilian capacity as an apprentice in the Maintenance Department at Robins Field, who resides at 35 South Lee Street, Forsyth, Georgia.

HARRY K. OLDROYD was interviewed at Forsyth, Georgia, on June 2, 1950 and the following signed statement was obtained.

"Forsyth, Georgia June 2, 1950

"I, HARRY KNOX OLDROYD, make the following voluntary statement to W. W. WARREN, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, concerning HARRY GOLD whom I know casually in Philadelphia, Penna.

"I reside at 35 South Lee St., Forsyth, Georgia." I am employed as an electrician, Maintenance Division, Warner Robins Air Materiel Area, USAF, Robins Field, Ga. AT 66-1383

T was born in Philadelphia September 25, 1919 and resided there until September 1941, when I entered the Army of the United States. I have not lived regularly there since entering the Army although I have been there on a number of occasions since then.

ALEXANDER ELINSKY's Drug Store at the corner of Rising Sun and Sheldon Streets in Philadelphia. I saw HARRY GOLD at this drug store once in a while, about 7 or 8 times I imagine. It seemed to be a hang-out of HARRY GOLD and two other men who were or appeared to be associates of GOLD. One of these two men was JOE AXELROD. The other was SAM AXELROD, brother of JOE AXELROD. I have heard these three persons in conversation 1 or 5 times at least. I heard HARRY GOLD and JOE AXELROD state that Russia would eventually be rulers of the world. I do not recall that either of these persons discussed Marxism, Capitalism, or Communism. I do not know whether any of these persons advocated Communism inasmuch they never discussed it to my knowledge. Sometimes I heard these persons talking in a foreign language which thought was either Russian or Hebrew.

"A Doctor GORDON who resided at Roosevelt Blvd at Rising Sun Avenue, Philadelphia, seemed to be acquainted with the AXELRODS and was possibly acquainted with HARRY GOLD. I don't believe that Dr. GORDON was any more than a casual acquaintance of the AXELRODS and, maybe, HARRY GOLD.

"At that time, HARRY GOLD was around the middle 30's in age. I thought he was a salesman at the time, although I never did have any personal centact, that is, conversations, with him. He appeared to be around 5'7" or 5'8" tall and was of medium frame. I estimate his weight as around 165 or 170 pounds. His face was moderately full and he had dark complexion. It appeared that he usually needed a shave, probably due to his complexion.

As indicated in my teletype dated June 2, 1950 I contacted General R. V. IGNICO, Commanding Officer at the Warner Robins Air Base on June 2, 1950 and made a personal protest regarding the situation which had arisen as a result of instructions allegedly issued by Major PAUL KUBAIA, Base Intelligence Officer at Robins Air Base. I pointed out to General IGNICO that inasmuch as there were civilians involved in this situation and because it was an espionage matter involving civilians, the matter appeared to be one of primary jurisdiction with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. It was further pointed out to General IGNICO that information had come to the attention of this office that Major KUBAIA had given instructions to a civilian not to report information to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, which information was of interest to and within the primary jurisdiction of the FBI.

General IGNICO expressed his appreciation for being personally contacted in this connection and stated that he would immediately look into the situation and advise this office. Later on the same day Colonel EUGENE C. CROPPER, Commanding Officer, OSI, USAF, oth Air Force District, Robins Field, Georgia, telephonically contacted this office and stated that he had been instructed by General IGNICO to contact me after

obtaining complete information in this matter. Colonel CROPPER stated that he would like to clear up any misunderstanding which might exists regarding statements allegedly made by Major KUBAIA to one JAMES CHIRBAS. He stated that CHIRBAS is known to the OSI at Robins Field as a "screw ball around the base", and as a "typical informant". Colonel CROPPER advised that when CHIRBAS had told Major KUBAIA earlier on that date about his information regarding OIDROYD, that Major KUBAIA, knowing the type person CHIRBAS was, suggested that CHIRBAS come by the OSI Office and give them any information he might have. Colonel CROPPER states specifically that no one connected with Base Intelligence or OSI at Robins Field had told CHIRBAS not to contact the FBI.

In view of the fact that HARRY OLDROYD was not in possession of any substantial information in this matter and inasmuch as the alleged instructions of Major KUBALA have been discussed with General IGNICO and Colonel CROPPER, both of whom stated that it was their policy to immediately advise the FBI of any matter within the jurisdiction of this Bureau, no further action is contemplated.

ROBERT ANTHONY BENKESER, Assistant Professor, Chemistry, Purdue University, knew subject as fellow student at Mavier University, Cincinnati. Did not see or hear from subject until April 12, 1950 when BENKESER attended American Chemical Society convention in Philadelphia. Met subject in lobby of hotel, talked to him about one-half hour, and exchanged addresses with him. BENKESER could furnish no information concerning activities of subject.

ROBERT ANTHONY BENKESER, Building 21, Apartment 11, Ross-Ade Drive, West Lafayette, Indiana, was interviewed and furnished the following information:

He met subject in 1938 or 1939, when both were attending Xavier University, Cincinnati, and both majoring in Chemistry. HENKESER lived in town with his parents; and subject was rooming at a boarding house, the address of which BENKESER was ignorant inasmuch as he stated he had never been there. BENKESER stated that he would usually get to school anywhere from one-half to an hour early and go to the Chemistry Department to study. Subject also always came early, and they would study together, and subject would assist BENKESER with his work. BENKESER stated that subject was exceptionally intelligent and a hard worker and was universally liked by the students and professors. would just talk for a while. Subject never, in any of his discussions, gave any indication of any outside activity and gave no indication that he was other than a loyal and patriotic citizen of the United States. Their discussions were mainly concerned with Chemistry, the professors and other students; and BENKESER was unable to remember any time the discussion concerned politics or ideologies.

BENKESER wondered why, subject, an older man, and a resident of the East would have come to a school like Xavier, especially inasmuch as it is Catholic, rather than completing his education in the East. He asked subject one time, and subject stated he had stopped over in Cincinnati sometime before, liked the town and had tried to get into the University of Cincinnati. He was not accepted because too great a length of time had passed since his last schooling. He then learned of Xavier and applied there and was accepted.

BENKESER went on to say that subject left school before he did; and he heard nothing of him, or from him, until this year. While in Cincinnati, BENKESER was only with subject once on a social occasion, at which time, BENKESER took subject to his home for dinner. He only did this on one occasion and never had any contact with him outside of school, except for that one occasion. While attending Xavier, subject was supposedly engaged to a girl back East and received quite a few letters from her. BENKESER said subject never mentioned her by name, or, if he did, BENKESER has forgotten it.

Thus, as far as BENKESER can remember, subject had very few friends other than those he met at school. Inasmuch as BENKESER had no contact with him outside of school, he was unable to furnish any information concerning subject's outside activities and whether or not he had any.

BENKESER attended a convention of the American Chemical Society in Philadelphia on April 10 - 12, 1950; and on the latter date, some time in the afternoon, he saw subject in the lobby of the hotel, which was the convention headquarters, believed by BENKESER to have been the Bellvue Stratford. Inasmuch as he had seen or heard nothing from subject since he left Xavier, BENKESER went up to subject and talked to him. Subject did not recognize him at first but when BENKESER mentioned his name, subject recognized him instantly. They talked in the lobby of the hotel for about half an hour, discussing Xavier, former students and professors. EENKESER asked subject if he

were married, and subject stated he was not. When he had returned from Cincinnati, his mother had told him that the girl had married someone else; and he had never married.

BENKESER asked him if he had gotten his same job back when he returned East from Cincinnati; and subject said yes, but that later, due to a re-organization, he had lost the job. He then said he had worked for some chemical company in New York but that failed; and he was, at the present time, working at a hospital in Philadelphia. After about half an hour of talk, BENKESER said he had to leave to go to another hotel where the Purdue delegates to the convention were having a cocktail party. Subject volunteered to show him the way inasmuch as subject was going that way on his way back to work. They exchanged addresses but BENKESER could not remember whether he wrote his out for GOLD or whether subject wrote it down at BENKESER's direction. Subject walked with BENKESER to the other hotel and left him at the door. BENKESER has not seen or heard from subject since that time. BENKESER remembers the date he saw subject because he left Philadelphia that evening and returned to Lafayette. BENKESER indicated a willingness to assist in any way possible, but stated that the half hour in Philadelphia was the only contact he has had with subject in the last ten years.

The records of the President, Purdue University, West Lafayette, Indiana, reflect that ROBERT ANTHONY BENKESER, born February 16, 1920, Cincinnati, Ohio, was employed on September 1, 1946 as an instructor in the Chemistry Department. On July 1, 1948, he was made an assistant professor, which rank he now holds. BENKESER received a BS in Chemistry and Mathematics from Xavier University, Cincinnati, in 1942, an MS in Organic Chemistry from the University of Detroit in 1944 and a Ph.D in Organic Chemistry from Iowa State College in 1947. Nothing derogatory could be found in the file.

E. T. McBEE, Head, Chemistry Department, Purdue University, advised that BENKESER was an outstanding young man, both as a teacher and as an individual. He was above average as to character and intelligence, is honest and trustworthy and has never given any indication of being other than intensely loyal to this country. He has been on the staff for four years and is very highly considered in every respect.

According to BENKESER, while at Xavier, subject was very friendly with a ROBERT KASKE, an English major. BENKESER did not know KASKE's present whereabouts but believes he is taking a doctorate at some eastern university at the present time. Subject, while at Xavier, was very hard working and industrious, and put in long hours.



While talking with SAC Cornelius of Philadelphia on the morning of June 6, 1950, he informed me that he had received a letter from John Hamilton, attorney for Gold. The letter was dated June 5, and was received in the Philadelphia Office at 9:05 A.M. today.

This letter related that Hamilton has been appointed attorney for Gold, that in his capacity as attorney, he is desirous of Gold's cooperation with the Agents. He pointed out that the cooperation of Gold would not only confirm his admission of guilt but would also affect peralties imposed upon him. Having in mind his responsibilities as Gold's attorney, he requested that he be allowed to review any statements in the future prior to their being signed by Gold and that any statements which have been reduced to writing and not yet signed by Gold be reviewed by him prior to such signing. He also requested that he be allowed to review statements previously given by Gold.

## ACTION:

I instructed that Mr. Cornelius transmit by teletype to the Bureau the letter in full in order that it would be available for the consideration of the Bureau as to what answer should be given to attorney Hamilton.
