HARRY GOLD, WAS, ESP. -R-. PHILIP LEVINE INTERVIEWED THIS MORNING BOSTON
DIVISION OFFICES BY SPECIAL AGENTS ROBERT G. LAWRENCE AND BRENTON S.
GORDON. INTERVIEW LASTED ONE HOUR THIRTY FIVE MINUTES DURING WHICH TIME
LEVINE WAS EVASIVE, APPREHENSIVE AND NON-COOPERATIVE. LEVINE CONFIRMED

PERSONAL HISTORY SET FORTH NEWARK LETTER TO NYC DATED JANUARY FOURTEENTH
LAST. HE ADMITTED EMPLOYMENT ABRAHAM BROTHMAN ASSOCIATED FROM SEPTEMBER,
NINETEEN FORTY SEVEN TO JUNE FORTY EIGHT. LEVINE ADMITTED FINDING
APARTMENT FOR GOLD AS INDICATED NYC TEL JUNE SECOND LAST. LEVINE INSISTED
THAT GOLD ATE NOT MORE THAN SIX MEALS AT LEVIN-S HOME IN SAME APARTMENT
BUILDING AND STATED ALL SUCH MEALS WERE EATEN IN LATTER PART OF LEVINE-S
EMPLOYMENT IN JUNE, FORTY EIGHT. LEVINE FURTHER ASSERTED HE FED GOLD
BECAUSE NEITHER OF THEM WAS BEING PAID BY BROTHMAN AND GOLD WAS SHORT

OF FUNDS. LEVINE ADVISES THAT DURING EMPLOYMENT WITH BROTHMAN HE LOANED
BROTHMAN SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS WHICH WAS REPAID PLUS NINE DOLLARS INTEREST
BUT RELUCTANTLY. IN ADDITION, LEVINE CLAIMS BROTHMAN OWES HIM MORE THAN
THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS IN BACK SALARY. LEVINE ALSO LOANED GOLD
APPROXIMATELY ONE HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS AT TIME GOLD CAME TO LIVE AT
FORTY FOURTH STREET APARTMENT, WHICH AMOUNT HE HAS NOT YET BEEN REPAID.
LEVINE STATED IN APPROXIMATELY MAY NINETEEN FORTY EIGHT BROTHMAN WENT
TO SWITZERLAND TO SOLICIT A CONTRACT, THAT DURING HIS ABSENCE LEVINE

WENT THROUGH BROTHMAN-S FILES AAND CAME TO THE CONCLUSION THAT BROTHMAN
WAS A QUOTE FRAUD UNQUOTE, THAT THE BROTHMAN COMPANY WAS A QUOTE
PRESENCE DURING LEVINE ALLEGES THAT HE MADE THE INFORMATION OBTAINED
BY HIM FROM ABOVE SEARCH AVAILABLE TO GOLD, OSCAR VAGO AND BILL ROHALL,

WHEN BROTHMAN RETURNED HE ATTEMPTED TO CONVINCE EACH OF FOREGOING AND LEVINE THAT HE WAS ON THE VERGE OF BUSINESS SUCCESS. GOLD, VAGO AND LEVINE WERE UNCONVINCED AND QUIT FIRM. SUBSEQUENTLY IN INTERVIEW LEVINE STATED THAT BROTHMAN WAS NEITHER A GOOD CHEMIST NOR A COMPETENT ENGINEER AND THAT HIS FIRM WAS NOT FRAUDULENT BUT RATHER EXISTED ON QUOTE HOPES UNQUOTE WHICH WERE NOT FOUNDED IN ANY FACTUAL PROMISE OF SUCCESS. LEVINE INSISTS THAT HE HAS NO KNOWLEDGE OF COMMUNIST OR ESPIONAGE ACTIVITIES ON THE PART OF GOLD OR ANY OTHER BROTHMAN ASSOCIATES. LEVINE STATES IT IS POSSIBLE THAT GOLD WAS THE PERSON WHO BROUGHT DAILY WORKER TO BROTHMAN COMPANY OFFICES AND PLANT. ASKED IF HE, HIMSELF, HAD EVER BEEN A MEMBER OF THE CP OR ANY OF ITS AFFILIATE ORGANIZATIONS, LEVINE SPECIFICALLY DENIED SUCH ASSOCIATION. ASKED IF HE HAD EVER BEEN A MEMBER OF THE SUNNYSIDE CLUB OF THE CPA, LEVINE REFUSED TO ANSWER AFFIRMATIVELY OR NEGATIVELY. LEVINE DESCRIBES GOLD AS QUIET, ⁰STUDIOUS, [^]HARD WORKING INDIVIDUAL WITH WHOM HIS ONLY CONVERSATIONS CONCERNED RESEARCH CHEMISTRY OR BROTHMAN-S LACK OF CAPITAL AND REIMBURSEMENT TO EACH OF THEM. THROUGHOUT INTERVIEW LEVINE CONSTANTLY ATTEMPTED BY QUESTIONS ON HIS PART TO DEVELOP THE EXTENT OF THE BUREAU-S KNOWLEDGE CONCERNING THE ACTIVITIES OF BROTHMAN AND HIS ASSOCIATES. HIS EFFORTS IN THE LATTER REGARD LEFT AN IMPRESSION THAT HE WAS POSSESSED OF ADDITIONAL KNOWLEDGE WHICH, IN VIEW OF HIS MANNER THROUGHOUT THE INTERVIEW, HE WAS UNWILLING TO FURNISH AT THIS TIME.

Re Knoxville letter dated June 10, 1950, in which it was set forth that WILLIAM T. KING, 1100 Midland Drive, Kingsport, Tennessee, present occupant of the house formerly occupied by the subject, was unable to identify pictures of HARRY GOLD.

GOLD has advised agents of the Philadelphia Office that he contacted the residents at 1100 Midland Drive around Christmas, 1943, and was informed by them that SLACK had moved. (From SLACK's employment records at Kingsport, it appears that GOLD is mistaken in this date, and that GOLD actually was referring to the period around Christmas of 1944.)

KING has stated that he first occupied SLACK's former residence, 1100 Midland Drive, on or about Thanksgiving of 1944, and that numerous individuals had personally called there to inquire as to the whereabouts of SLACK.

It would appear that HARRY GOLD actually contacted KING at 1100 Midland Drive. It is noted that the photographs of GOLD in the possession of the Knoxville Office, which were displayed to KING, are not too satisfactory. It is believed that better photographs of GOLD might be available elsewhere, and it is also believed that 16 millimeter films of HARRY GOLD are in the possession of the Bureau or Philadelphia.

Inasmuch as KING's identification of GOLD as one of the visitors at KING's home would appear to be such an important bit of corroborating evidence, it is suggested that the Bureau, Philadelphia and Albany Offices forward any additional photographs or movies of GOLD to be exhibited to KING.

JULES KORCHIEN was interviewed on May 16 and 17, 1950, for information regarding Abraham Brothman and Associates, Inc., New York City. At that time he was shown a photograph of HARRY GOLD and was questioned for knowledge of GOLD, with negative results.

HARRY GOLD, upon interview, advised that he was acquainted with JULES KORCHIEN while at Abraham Brothman and Associates, Inc. in New York City.

KORCHIEN was questioned at some length and in detail on June 20 for possible knowledge regarding his association with GOLD, at which time he said that he did not remember ever meeting GOLD either while GOLD was employed at Abraham Brothman and Associates, Inc. or elsewhere. KORCHIEN was shown photographs of GOLD and he said he did not recall ever having seen GOLD and that he could not identify the photographs.

KORCHIEN stated that he visited the laboratory connected with Abraham Brothman and Associates, Inc. on only two occasions, and that it is possible that GOLD was there at that time, but he did not remember anything about him.

KORCHIEN was again questioned for information regarding the Abraham Brothman and Associates, Inc., New York City, and individuals associated with this company, and he denied having any knowledge that the company or persons connected with the company were involved in espionage activity.

A copy of this report is being sent to Washington Field and San Francisco in accordance with Bureau instructions.

Enclosed herewith for both the New York and Philadelphia Offices are two photostatic copies each of the income tax returns, Form 1040, of Harry Gold for the years 1944, 1945 and 1946. In addition, there are enclosed two photostatic copies each of the withholding statements for wages paid and income tax withheld, Form W-2, filed by Gold for the years 1946 and 1947.

The Treasury Department has advised that income tax returns of Gold for the years 1931 to 1936, inclusive, and the years 1941, 1942, and 1943 are no longer available. It also was advised that the records of the Internal Revenue Bureau for the first internal revenue collection district of Pennsylvania do not disclose income tax returns of Harry Gold for the years 1939 and 1940. Also, it was advised that the income tax return of Harry Gold for 1949 is not available for copy purposes at this time.

New York, as the office of origin, should review the enclosures and initiate any necessary investigation or interrogation.

Also enclosed for the Philadelphia Office are two copies of the photograph of Stanislaw Shumovsky (Shumovsky), who has been identified by Benjamin Smilg. Philadelphia should display these photographs to Harry Gold for possible identification.

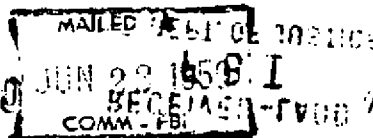

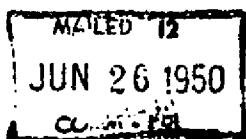

Ray Whearty called from the Department today. He requested advice as to whether the Bureau had in its possession registration cards of Harry Gold at the Palmer House Hotel in Chicago and the Hilton Hotel in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He further requested the identity of the Laboratory handwriting expert who could testify that the handwriting on these registration cards is identical with the handwriting of Gold.

I checked with Mr. Parsons in the Laboratory and informed Mr. Whearty that the Bureau has the original registration card from the Hilton Hotel dated September 15, 1945, and that we have a photographic copy of the registration card from the Palmer House. I told him that SA Hilding L. Dahlgren is the handwriting expert who can testify regarding the handwriting of Gold. Mr. Whearty then stated that the case will be presented to the Grand Jury in the Eastern District of New York on Friday morning June 9 at 10:00 A.M. He requested that Dahlgren be present at that time.

Mr. Whearty advised that the Department is considering requesting SA Robert Lamphere to testify before the Grand Jury regarding the interview with Fuchs and to make a statement that Fuchs said he met Gold, where and when, and that he gave Gold information relating to atomic matters. He said that the Department will later advise if Lamphere's testimony is desired.

Whearty stated that the Department is considering the question of whether a check should be made on the new Grand Jury in the Eastern District of New York for security purposes since evidence to be presented to them will involve atomic energy matters. He stated that he felt that it would probably not be necessary to make a check on these Grand Jurors since in all probability no classified material will be submitted before this Grand Jury. However, he wanted the Bureau to have an opportunity to express an opinion in this regard.

Mr. Whearty stated that he is of the opinion that when the indictment is returned in New York on Friday, June 9, that the Marshal should be instructed to remove Gold immediately to New York without the formality of a removal hearing since he felt that this comes under Rule 40 of the Rules of Procedure. In this connection, he wondered if the FBI

through our Philadelphia Office could approach Gold's attorney, Hamilton, and ascertain from him if his commitments were such that he would want to represent Gold in the Eastern District of New York, point out to him the possibility that an indictment will be returned, and ascertain his feelings as to whether he would want a formal hearing. I told Whearty that I felt any discussions with attorney Hamilton regarding legal proceedings should be had by a representative of the Department and not by the FBI.

ACTION:

I have advised Mr. Parsons of the Laboratory to arrange to have Dahlgren available to testify in the Eastern District of New York on Friday, June 9, at 9:00 A.M. He said Dahlgren would be available.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that Whearty be advised that the question of directing a check on the members of the Grand Jury is a question to be answered by the Department depending upon the nature of the testimony which they contemplate presenting before the Grand Jury. Whearty should also be definitely informed that any dealings regarding legal matters with John Hamilton should be by a representative of the Department.

SAC Cornelius called at 5:30 P.M. on June 6. He referred to his teletype on the afternoon of June 6 recording a letter from attorney John Hamilton, in which Hamilton requested that he be allowed to see any statements made by Gold which have not as yet been signed by him and any statements made in the future. In this letter Hamilton also requested that he be allowed to see the statement which Gold has previously furnished. Cornelius said that Hamilton called him on the afternoon of June 6, referring to the letter of June 5, and requested that the restrictions placed by him be withdrawn. He said that he had talked with Gold since writing the letter and that Gold definitely wants no restrictions placed on the information to be furnished to the FBI. Hamilton now requests (1) that in the event any statement is to be signed by Gold which contains a statement as to motive or intent that that portion pertaining to motive or intent be shown to Hamilton before Gold signs the statement. (2) Hamilton requested that he be allowed to see that part of Gold's statement which was made on May 22, which goes into intent and/or motive.

Cornelius pointed out that the part of the statement referred to begins on page eight of Gold's statement. Cornelius further stated that he feels that the first request of Hamilton will have to be complied with and he advised Hamilton that his second request would have to be referred to Department attorneys for an answer.

Cornelius requested that he be informed on June 7 regarding the Department's decision in this matter since Hamilton requested that he be advised on that date so that he will be able to prepare for the defense of Gold.

Hamilton further requested that he be advised of the identity of the Department representative who will handle the removal hearing on June 12 so that he can make appropriate contact with him.

SAC Cornelius has advised that the following statements have been obtained from Gold:

(1) Statement dated May 22. This is the first statement obtained. It deals generally with Gold's contacts with the Russians and Fuchs, and beginning on page eight contains information regarding his motives and intent in connection with his espionage activities. Gold states in part: "I thought I would be helping a nation whose final aim I approved, along the road to industrial strength. A copy of this statement is attached."

(2) Statement dated June 2. This statement relates to espionage activities of Thomas L. Black. It refers to Black attempting to get Gold to join the CP, Black's recruitment of Gold as an espionage agent, and Black explaining to Gold that espionage work was a chance to help the Russians along the road to industrialization.

(3) Statement dated June 4. This statement furnishes additional information regarding Black.

(4) Statement dated June 5. This statement is a supplement to the one dated June 4 regarding Thomas L. Black. In this statement Gold states he told Black after Fuchs' arrest about Gold's dealings with Fuchs, that Black said Gold should deny these dealings if questioned. Gold indicated his principal concern was for his family.

(5) Statement dated June 2. This statement relates to espionage activities with Alfred Dean Slack. Gold states herein that he gave Slack two pep talks regarding the Soviet Union, that he principally received industrial information from Slack and also received information regarding explosives.

(6) Statement dated June 2. This statement deals with the espionage involvement of an unidentified soldier (possibly David Greenglass) at Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Mr. Cornelius pointed out that attorney Hamilton advised that Gold had told him that the only statement which he, Gold, had furnished bearing upon intent and/or motive was the statement on May 22, 1950.

ACTION:

The identity of the Department representative handling the case has been obtained from the Department and Mr. Cornelius has been informed that Hamilton should discuss any legal matters with USA Gleason of Philadelphia. This is in accordance with advice from Mr. Ray Whearty of the Department.

OBSERVATIONS:

At the present time surveillances are being maintained on the subjects Thomas L. Black, Alfred Dean Slack, and David Greenglass. David Greenglass is possibly identical with the unknown soldier described by Gold as furnishing information to him in Albuquerque, New Mexico, in September, 1945. Intensive investigation is being conducted on these

individuals and special attention is being given in an effort to definitely determine if Greenglass is the individual described by Gold.

The Department has not been informed of the statements received from Gold involving these individuals.

The statement dated June 5 furnishing information regarding Gold having told Black after Fuchs' arrest that he, Gold, was the individual who received the atomic information from Fuchs is of special significance in connection with the prosecution of Gold. This statement of Gold, of course, would be significant only if Black will admit this conversation when questioned.

It is pointed out that attorney Hamilton was appointed to represent Gold on June 1, 1950. Consequently any statements taken from subject Gold after that time, which includes all statements except the first, were taken with the consent of attorney Hamilton who could have insisted that he be present during the taking of the statements and that he be furnished a copy of the statements. Furthermore, the information contained in these statements regarding the activities of Thomas Black, Alfred Slack, and the unknown soldier could be furnished at any time by Gold to attorney Hamilton. It would not seem to be desirable to play peekaboo with attorney Hamilton by allowing him to read only a sentence here and there from the statements covering that portion of the statement which we feel deals with intent. Attorney Hamilton may have a different idea of intent and could later claim that we did not comply with his request and if we had shown him additional phrases in the statements he would not have consented to the continued cooperation of Gold.

If we allow attorney Hamilton to read all of the statements we are, of course, informing him regarding the activities of Black, Slack, and any others whom Gold names, with the resultant possibility of publicity or a leak concerning this information. It is quite possible, in fact probable, that attorney Hamilton will discuss this information with Departmental attorneys or the USA unless we caution him not to do so. It would not be desirable for us to so caution him.

This brings us to the conclusion that it may be desirable at this time to advise the Department of the additional information furnished by Gold, particularly as some of the information may be pertinent to prosecution, specifically Gold's statement that he told Black about his involvement in the Fuchs' case and Gold's statement about the unknown soldier in Albuquerque whom he contacted while he was handling Fuchs.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that attorney Hamilton be allowed to read the signed statements furnished by Gold with the caution that matters contained therein are the subjects of continued investigation and that the information is being made available to him solely to reflect the extent of cooperation by Gold and Gold's statements concerning his intent while engaging in espionage activities.

It is further recommended that we not advise the Department concerning the additional identifications by Gold at this time. The Department has stated it has sufficient information for indictment purposes. We are pursuing investigations of the individuals mentioned by Gold vigorously and will undoubtedly interview them in the near future. Should it be necessary to advise the Department prior to the trial of Gold, if such a trial occurs, we will be in a better position from the standpoint of investigation and publicity to advise the Department at that time.

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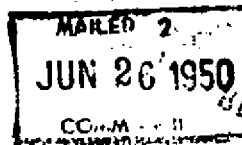

On June 13, 1950, Mr. Raymond Whearty, of the Department, advised that in a discussion with U. S. Attorney Gleason, of Philadelphia, Mr. Gleason indicated that as yet he had not received any FBI investigative reports in this case. Mr. Whearty wanted to know whether we had furnished reports to Mr. Gleason. I advised him we had not. I pointed out to Mr. Whearty that the Department had made direct arrangements with Judge McGranery in the handling of the arraignment of Gold and the only part that U. S. Attorney Gleason has played in this case to date is in appearing for the government at the removal hearing of Gold yesterday, June 12; that Gleason had not needed any FBI reports for this, inasmuch as he had a certified copy of the indictment and Agents were made available to testify concerning the identity of Gold. I advised Mr. Whearty that Mr. Gleason has not requested any reports of us, and I inquired whether the Department desires us to furnish Gleason with reports at this time.

Mr. Whearty advised that he was of the opinion that we should furnish a copy of the summary report to Gleason, but that we should not furnish it at the present time, but rather wait until the Department makes a written request of us to do so. I pointed out to Mr. Whearty that we had been following the Department's desires in this matter right along and we would continue to do so.

DETAILS: <u>SUBJECT'S EMPLOYMENT AT HOLBROOK MANUFACTURING COMPANY</u> Basis of this investigation is information received to the effect that the personnel records of the Pennsylvania Sugar Company, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania reflected the employment of HARRY GOLD by the Holbrook Manufacturing Company, Jersey City, New Jersey in 1932 or 1933. JAMES S. MacINTOSH, 17 DeBell Court, Passaic, New Jersey has advised that he was the former president of the Holbrook Manufacturing Company, Coles and 18th Streets, Jersey City, New Jersey. He stated that the company, which specialized in the manufacture of industrial soaps, went into receivership in 1936 and eventually ceased operating in 1942. He added that the records of this company were destroyed in approximately 1945. From a small journal MacINTOSH had retained, he recalled that HARRY GOLD was employed as a chemist by the Holbrook Manufacturing Company for several months in 1933 and that he was released after less than one year due to being inadequately qualified for the position.

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MacINTOSH was unable to recall any personal data concerning GOLD and expressed the belief that one FREDERICK A. STETSON would be the only employee of the company in a position to comment upon GOLD'S activities. MacINTOSH stated that he has retained no record of HARRY GOLD'S residence during the period of this employment.

FREDERICK A. STETSON, 146 Ege Avenue, Jersey City, New Jersey, who was interviewed by the writer and Special Agent DONALD G. HARRIS, advised that he was employed as assistant manager of the Holbrook Manufacturing Company during the period of HARRY GOLD'S employment at that firm in 1933. He stated that he became well acquainted with GOLD and on several occasions accompanied him to parties and social functions. STETSON was unable to account for any of the activities attributed to GOLD in recent newspaper reports, stating that on the basis of his association with GOLD in 1933 he regarded GOLD as a personable and entirely loyal American.

STETSON stated that GOLD'S friends during the period were young people of his age and their interests apparently never touched on serious discussions or other than light conversation. STETSON stated that he had never visited GOLD'S residence but it was his belief that GOLD retained a furnished room someplace in Jersey City, New Jersey during the short time of his employment at the Holbrook Manufacturing Company. He added that he has never seen or heard from HARRY GOLD since 1933.

BACKGROUND DATA CONCERNING SAM GOLD

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JAMES B. OAKLEY:

FRANK M. CROGHAN, employment manager, RCA Manufacturing Corporation, RCA Victor Division, Camden, New Jersey advised that SAMUEL GOLD has been employed as follows:

December 24, 1916 to May 11, 1918 - quit
March 21, 1919 to April 25, 1921 - laid off
May 11, 1921 to July 21, 1925 - quit
November 25, 1925 to February 7, 1929 - laid off
September 25, 1929 to December 20, 1929 - laid off
August 16, 1930 to March 30, 1931 - laid off
September 25, 1931 to December 21, 1932 - laid off

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February 1, 1933 to June 30, 1933 - laid off
August 31, 1933 to March 6, 1936 - laid off
May 16, 1936 to March 14, 1942 - laid off

During the above period he was employed as a hand sander for the Victor Talking Machine Company (now RCA), Camden, New Jersey, and this occupation was in the Cabinet Making Department. From April 17, 1942 until July 25, 1942 he was employed as a wire man trainee and assembler, and from July 25, 1942 until January 31, 1946 he was employed as an unskilled laborer-stock handler.

Nothing of a derogatory nature as to work, conduct, attitude, character or loyalty was indicated during his entire periods of employment. The Departments in which he worked handled some Government work, but also included RCA products for civilian purposes.

His medical record reflected only minor industrial accidents, such as splinters and lacerations of fingers.

Mr. CROGHAN stated he believed the South Second Street address was the original address at which GOLD lived when he entered employment for the first time. He was employed under Social Security Number 160-05-4276 and furnished naturalization data reflecting that he had been naturalized in 1922 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania under Certificate Number 1591271, Volume Number 193, Petition Number 48016. He is presently receiving a pension of \$25.96 from RCA, and under Certificate of Insurance his beneficiaries are listed as sons, HENRY and JOSEPH, GOLD, each to receive half of the \$2500 life insurance policy carried with the Travelers Insurance Company under Group Policy G 103.

Former employments were listed as follows:

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March, 1929 to September, 1929 - GEORGE WEISS, Girard and Berks Streets, Philadelphia, Pa.
as a hand sander

January 1, 1930 to April, 1930 - Philco Radio Corporation, E and Ontario Streets, Philadelphia, Pa.

Mr. CROGHAN advised that from his knowledge of the departments, there was no chance that he knew of that SAMUEL GOLD would have had access to any confidential information, although some of the contracts in the departments in which he worked were of a restricted nature.

STEPHEN L. LAWRENCE, General Security Officer, RCA, advised he had received no information to indicate that GOLD had ever been in any position to obtain confidential information. He stated that from recent publicity he believed that former employment supervisors would have advised him if any suspicions had been directed toward SAMUEL GOLD.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent OLIN E. JESSUP:

ESTHER TOMAR, 3904 Camden Avenue, Pennsauken Township, New Jersey stated that her father and HARRY GOLD'S mother were brother and sister, thus making her a cousin of HARRY GOLD. ESTHER TOMAR also advised that she has not seen HARRY GOLD for the past 14 years and that he has neither been in her home nor has she been in his home. The last time she saw HARRY GOLD was prior to her marriage which was 13 years ago.

ESTHER TOMAR stated that to her knowledge she is the only relative of HARRY GOLD who resides in the state of New Jersey. She also stated that she has no idea if HARRY GOLD has any friends or contacts in the state of New Jersey and neither does she know if he has ever been in the state of New Jersey.

According to ESTHER TOMAR, she has no sisters but has four brothers, JOSEPH LOUIS UMIN, Baltimore, Maryland; RICHARD ROBERT UMIN, New York, New York; ALBERT UMIN, New York, New York; and FRANK UMIN, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

- REFERRED UPON COMPLETION TO THE OFFICE OF ORIGIN -

ADMINISTRATIVE

By teletype dated May 25, 1950 the Philadelphia office advised that investigation at the Franklin Institute, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania reflects that GOLD had been noticeably intimate with one THOMAS L. BLACK during the few weeks prior to his arrest.

WALTER F. SMITH, rent manager, Chellis Austin Apartments, 624 Raymond Boulevard, Newark, New Jersey advised that THOMAS L. BLACK rented Apartment E3 in that apartment project at 17 Oxford Street, Newark, New Jersey from July 1, 1937 to January 31, 1949.

A rental application dated June 21, 1937 disclosed that BLACK was 30 years of age at that time, having been born in Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania. His occupation was listed as bacteriological chemist and employment was shown as National Oil Products Company, Harrison, New Jersey.

SMITH stated that BLACK was a very quiet and anti-social individual, having a reputation as a "very odd person". He stated that BLACK was known to keep many small animals such as snakes and mice in his apartment for reasons unknown to the other tenants.

SMITH'S records contained no forwarding address for BLACK.

LEWIS M. CARTER, personnel manager, NOPCO Chemical Company, Harrison, New Jersey, formerly National Oil Products Company, produced records reflecting employment of THOMAS L. BLACK from February 30, 1933 to June 30, 1944 as a chemist in the Control Lab. CARTER stated that BLACK was known as "a mystery worker" whose activities seemed to be carefully concealed and the results of his work were seldom noted by his superiors. According to CARTER, BLACK was discharged when it was discovered that many of his reports concerning his research had been falsified.

CARTER further advised that BLACK had been severely burned in approximately 1938 as a result of an explosion in his laboratory following which he was hospitalized for several weeks.

The following is a description of THOMAS L. BLACK as obtained from the files of NOPCO Chemical Company:

It is significant that during interview of CARTER he volunteered the remark that "TOM BLACK came to mind for the first time in several years when reading recent newspaper accounts of the HARRY GOLD case". CARTER elaborated by stating that the background and activities of BLACK bear an amazing parallel to GOLD. It is further noted that the name of GOLD was not mentioned by interviewing Agents.

Of further significance is the fact that JAMES S. MacINTOSH, previously mentioned, advised that HARRY GOLD was preceded by THOMAS L. BLACK as chemist of the Holbrook Manufacturing Company, Jersey City, New Jersey, BLACK having held the position from 1929 to 1933. MacINTOSH was not aware of any connection between GOLD and BLACK at that time, although FREDERICK A. STETSON, previously mentioned, advised that BLACK was a friend of GOLD in 1933 and that GOLD was often present at social gatherings held at BLACK'S apartment.

CARTER stated that THOMAS L. BLACK was friendly with one ERNEST SEGESSEMAN who was a chemist at NOPCO Chemical Company from 1928 to 1942 with whom BLACK shared an apartment at one time. STETSON stated during interview that GOLD was also very friendly with SEGESSEMAN and that the latter, a Swiss, was an individual whom he would not readily trust.

Records of the NOPCO Chemical Company reflect SEGESSEMAN as having been born March 28, 1901, a member of the American Chemical Society, and whose mailing address was indicated as 213 East 19th Street, New York 3, New York.

Reference Philadelphia teletype indicated that THOMAS L. BLACK recently gave an address of 177 East Railway Avenue, Paterson, New Jersey. Investigation has disclosed that this address is occupied by the Spruce Chemical Company, a business which began operation approximately two weeks ago in a small, one-story building only partially completed at the date of this report. A business card on the door of this address reflects the name "P. A. DITTMAN, Chemical Engineering and Water Conditioning".

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By pretext telephone call, it was learned that the Spruce Chemical Company is operated by DITTMAN and a Mr. FASS and that THOMAS L. BLACK is associated with the company only in a consultant capacity. It was learned that BLACK resides in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and is present in Paterson, New Jersey infrequently.

Reference to Philadelphia Telephone Directory discloses a THOMAS L. BLACK as residing at 2072 North 62nd Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

A teletype lead has previously been set forth for the Philadelphia office to verify BLACK'S residence in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

No record of the Spruce Chemical Company appears in the files of the Secretary of State, State House, Trenton, New Jersey; Dun and Bradstreet, Inc., Newark, New Jersey; Passaic and Bergen County Credit Bureau, or the Chamber of Commerce, both Paterson, New Jersey.

The records of RCA, Camden, New Jersey reflected that SAMUEL GOLD'S average salary at date of retirement was \$40 to \$50 per week. His work record reflected that he was unable to qualify as a wire man and assembler, apparently due to lack of ability. Mr. CROGHAN pointed out that if he had qualified in any measure from a technical standpoint he would not have been transferred as an assembler to an unskilled laborer. On his retirement he was given an Excellent and Very Good commentary on his work ability and promotions were steady during his periods of employment.

Mr. CROGHAN advised from the appearance of GOLD'S record he would be unable to mentally comprehend anything of a technical nature or appreciate the value of any technical instruments within RCA. His employment record reflected that he was born in Ruff, Russia, January 1, 1881. His father, HENRY, and mother, ANNA, were also born in Russia. He entered the United States in 1914 and on date of retirement resided at 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He was married, and his wife's name was given as CELIA. His two sons were listed as HENRY and JOSEPH.

Mr. CROGHAN summarized SAMUEL GOLD'S activities as being a labeling man who was unable to qualify in testing, inspection, and assembling work, which work he attempted for only a period of approximately five months when he was made a stock clerk.

Newark indices are negative concerning BLACK, SEGESSEMAN, STETSON, DITTMAN, FASS, and the Spruce Chemical Company.

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No further investigation of THOMAS L. BLACK, his associates, or the Spruce Chemical Company will be conducted unless requested by the office of origin.

GOLD RECEIVED IMPRESSION THAT THIS WOMAN WAS POSSIBLY A HOUSEKEEPER. GOLD RETURNED TO NYC AND TRANSMITTED THIS INFO TO JOHN IN A MATTER OF A FEW DAYS OR A WEEK. GOLD SAID AT HIS NEXT SCHEDULED MEETING WITH JOHN AFTER HAVING INFORMED LATTER OF RESULTS OF INQUIRY IN CAMBRIDGE, JOHN INSTRUCTED HIM TO AGAIN GO TO CAMBRIDGE. THIS WAS IN OCT. OR NOV. OF NINETEEN FORTY FOUR. GOLD STATED JOHN GAVE HIM A NAME AND TELEPHONE NO. TOGETHER WITH

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INSTRUCTIONS THAT THIS SHOULD BE LEFT AT HEINEMAN HOME IF FUCHS NOT THERE. JOHN INSTRUCTED GOLD THAT A NOTATION SHOULD BE PLACED WITH NAME AND TELEPHONE NUMBER THAT CALL SHOULD BE MADE BY FUCHS BETWEEN HOURS OF EIGHT AND EIGHT-THIRTY OR EIGHT TO NINE, BOTH IN MORNING, WHICH GAVE GOLD IMPRESSION THAT INDIVIDUAL TO BE CALLED WAS TO GO TO WORK AFTER THAT PERIOD. GOLD SAID HE THOUGHT THE LAST NAME OF THE INDIVIDUAL ON THIS PIECE OF PAPER WAS SOMETHING LIKE ~~KAPLUN~~ AND THAT THE FIRST NAME WAS A NAME LIKE JEROME OR ANOTHER NAME BEGINNING WITH A J. GOLD OF IMPRESSION THAT TELEPHONE EXCHANGE IN NUMBER WAS QUOTE COLUMBUS UNQUOTE. GOLD SAID HE DID NOT KNOW WHO THIS PERSON WAS, THAT JOHN DID NOT TELL HIM ANYTHING ABOUT THE PERSON AND THAT HE GOLD, NEVER SAW KAPLUN. GOLD ALSO DOES NOT KNOW WHETHER FUCHS, AFTER RECEIVING THIS MESSAGE EVER CALLED THE NUMBER. GOLD SAID SHORTLY AFTER SEEING JOHN ON THIS OCCASION IN A MATTER OF DAYS HE WENT TO CMABRIDGE CARRYING THE NOTE IN A SEALED ENVELOPE. GOLD SAID ON THIS OCCASION HE WENT TO THE HEINEMAN RESIDENCE AND THER MET MRS. HEINEMAN. HE RECALLS HE WENT IN, TALKED TO MRS. HEINEMAN AND GAVE HER THE NOTE FOR FUCHS. GOLD ALSO RECALLS ON THIS OCCASION MEETING HEINEMAN-S CHILDREN AND BELIEVES NAME OF ONE OF THEM WAS STEVE. HE REMEMBERS PROMISING CHILDREN LITTLE GLASS PIG AND STATED HE PROBABLY TOOK A BOOK OR BOX OF CANDY WITH HIM ON THIS TRIP AS A GIFT, STATING IT WAS ALWAYS HIS CUSTOM TO DO SO. GOLD SAID HE INTRODUCED HIMSELF TO MRS. HEINEMAN USING NAME RAYMOND BUT CAN NOT RECALL WHETHER HE USED A FIRST NAME. GOLD RECALLED MRS. HEINEMAN TOLD HIM THEY EXPECTED FUCHS AT THEIR HOME IN CAMBRIDGE FOR CHRISTMAS AND THAT HE HAD BEEN TRANS-

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FERRED SOMEWHERE IN THE SOUTHWEST PART OF U. S. GOLD RECALLS ON THIS SECOND TRIP TO HEINEMAN RESIDENCE IN CAMBRIDGE HE HAD SOMETHING TO EAT ALTHOUGH HE CAN NOT RECALL WHETHER IT WAS LUNCH OR MERELY A SMALL SNACK. GOLD THEN RETURNED TO NY AND REPORTED WHAT TRANSPIRED IN CAMBRIDGE TO JOHN, AT WHICH TIME ANOTHER MEETING WAS ARRANGED BETWEEN JOHN AND GOLD. GOLD SAID AT HIS NEXT OR A SUBSEQUENT MEETING WITH JOHN, HE CAN NOT RECALL, HE WAS INSTRUCTED BY JOHN TO GO TO CAMBRIDGE. GOLD RECALLED THAT HE WENT TO CAMBRIDGE BETWEEN XMAS DAY AND NEW YEARS OR POSSIBLY SHORTLY AFTER NEW YEARS DAY, FORTYFIVE. AT THIS TIME GOLD SAID FUCHS WAS AT HEINEMAN HOME. MRS. HEINEMAN WAS THERE BRIEFLY BUT FUCHS SUGGESTED SHE LEAVE AND GO PICK UP CHILDREN AT SCHOOL OR GO SHOPPING. THIS MEETING WITH FUCHS LASTED NOT MORE THAN TWENTY MINUTES. DURING THIS MEETING GOLD OFFERED FUCHS FIFTEEN HUNDRED DOLLARS WHICH JOHN HAD GIVEN GOLD JUST PRIOR TO GOLD GOING TO CAMBRIDGE FOR THIS MEETING WITH FUCHS. GOLD SAID FUCHS TURNED DOWN THIS OFFER AND GAVE GOLD ANOTHER PACKET OF PAPERS. GOLD SAID FUCHS INFORMED HIM HE WAS STATIONED AT A PLACE CALLED LOS ALAMOS IN NEW MEXICO WHERE RESEARCH ON ATOMIC ENERGY WAS BEING CARRIED ON. FUCHES THEN TOOK OUT A MAP OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE WHICH GOLD STATES WAS SAME TYPE AS THAT SEIZED BY AGENTS IN GOLD-S HOME, MAY TWENTY TWO LAST. FUCHS HAD MARKED MAP DESIGNATING SPOT WHERE MEETING BETWEEN GOLD AND FUCHS WAS TO TAKE PLACE. GOLD CAN NOT RECALL WHETHER FUCHS GAVE HIM THIS MAP BUT STATED THERE WAS A POSSIBILITY HE DID. THE MEETING IN SANTA FE WAS SCHEDULED THE FOLLOWING JUNE IN

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FORTY FIVE AND WAS SCHEDULED THEN BECAUSE GOLD COULD NOT GET AWAY FROM BUSINESS UNTIL THAT TIME AND ADDED THAT FUCHS WAS ALSO TIED UP. GOLD RETURNED TO NY SAME DAY FROM CAMBRIDGE AND BELIEVES HE MET JOHN SAME DAY ALTHOUGH HE DOES NOT RECALL THE EXACT PLACE WHERE HE MET JOHN. AT THIS MEETING HE GAVE JOHN THE INFO FUCHS HAD GIVEN HIM AND ALSO RETURNED THE FIFTEEN HUNDRED DOLLARS TO JOHN AND INFORMED JOHN OF WHAT TRANSPIRED IN CAMBRIDGE. GOLD SAID FROM THIS MEETING WITH JOHN TO THE TIME HE WENT TO SANTA FE, HE BELIEVES HE ONLY SAW JOHN ONCE DURING THIS PERIOD. THIS MEETING OCCURRED WITH JOHN IN A BAR ON THIRD AVENUE SOMEWHERE IN FORTIES IN NYC AND JUST A FEW DAYS BEFORE GOLD WENT TO SANTA FE. GOLD SAID PRINCIPAL PURPOSES FOR THIS MEETING WITH JOHN IN THE BAR WERE ONE THAT JOHN WISHED TO MAKE SURE THAT GOLD WOULD GO TO SANTA FE AND TWO TO MAKE MUTUALLY AGREEABLE ARRANGEMENTS FOR GOLD TO MEET JOHN ON THE FORMER-S RETURN TO NY. GOLD SAID THE NAME METROPOLITAN AVE., BROOKLYN STIRS HIS MEMORY AND HE FEELS THIS MIGHT HAVE BEEN PLACE AGREED UPON AT THAT TIME FOR GOLD TO MEET JOHN AND TURN OVER INFO WHICH HE WAS TO RECEIVE FROM FUCHS IN SANTA FE. GOLD SAID ON THE OCCASION WHEN HE MET FUCHS IN CAMBRIDGE THE TWO DISCUSSED PLANS FOR A FURTHER MEETING IN CAMBRIDGE WHOULD ONE BE NECESSARY. GOLD SAID HE HAD PREVIOUSLY BEEN TOLD BY JOHN THAT CONTACTING FUCHS AT HIS SISTER-S HOME WAS ONLY A MATTER OF EMERGENCY AND SHOULD NOT BECOME ANY ESTABLISHED PROCEDURE. GOLD SAID FUCHS ALSO WAS NOT FOND OF MEETINGS OCCURRING AT HIS SISTER-S HOME. GOLD SAID HE AND FUCHS DISCUSSED PLANS FOR THE EVENTUALITY OF ANOTHER MEETING IN CAMBRIDGE AND DECIDED THAT THE MEETING WOULD OCCUR IF ONE WAS NECESSARY IN BOSTON. GOLD CAN NOT RECALL EXACT PLACE AGREED UPON FOR THIS MEETING BUT SAID NAME CHARLES RIVER STANDS OUT IN HIS MIND TOGETHER WITH NAME OF SOME BUILDING. GOLD SAID IT WAS NOT BLDG. OF SUCH HISTORICAL NOTE AS FANEUIL HALL. GOLD SAID THESE ARRANGEMENTS WERE UNDOUBTEDLY MADE BY FUCHS SINCE GOLD WAS NOT FAMILIAR TO ANY EXTENT WITH CITY OF BOSTON. GOLD FURTHER STATED NO SUCH MEETING

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EVER OCCURRED. RELATIVE TO GOLD-S FIRST TRIP TO SANTA FE, N. M. TO MEET FUCHS, GOLD SAID IT WAS ACCOMPLISHED IN FOLLOWING MANNER. HE WENT BY TRAIN FROM PHILA. TO CHICAGO AND THERE CHANGED TO THE SANTA FE LINE AND RODE TO ALBUQUERQUE, NEW MEXICO. AT ALBUQUERQUE, GOLD GOT OFF THE TRAIN AND TOOK A BUS TO SANTA FE. GOLD SAID THE REASON HE GOT OFF THE TRAIN AT ALBUQUERQUE AND TOOK BUS TO SANTA FE WAS THAT THE TRAIN ON THIS RUN WAS OCCUPIED ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY BY MILITARY PERSONNEL AND HE DID NOT WISH TO APPEAR OBVIOUS. HE SAID THE BUS WAS A BETTER CHOICE BECAUSE IT DISCHARGED AND PICKED UP MAY CIVILIAN PASSENGERS ENROUTE FROM ALBUQUERQUE TO SANTA FE. GOLD SAID ON ARRIVAL IN SANTA FE HE STOPPED AT A MUSEUM AND LOOKED AROUND THE MUSEUM FOR SOME TIME. WHILE THERE HE BOUGHT A MAP OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO WHICH WAS SAME TYPE MAP AS THAT EITHER SHOWN HIM OR GIVEN HIM BY FUCHS IN CAMBRIDGE. GOLD SAID HE HAS FAINT RECOLLECTION OF DESTROYING A MAP OF THIS TYPE AND IF HE DID, HE DESTROYED ONE FUCHS GAVE HIM THEN, AND AGENTS FOUND THE ONE HE PURCHASED IN NEW MEXICO. GOLD SAID IN THE LATE AFTERNOON, AFTER ARRIVING AT SANTA FE, HE MET FUCHS IN THE APPOINTED SPOT AT THE APPOINTED TIME. GOLD WAS SHOWN THE MAP OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE WHICH HAD BEEN SEIZED BY THE AGENTS DURING THE SEARCH OF HIS HOME. HE PLACED THE MEETING PLACE AS SOMEWHERE ALONG THE ALAMEDA PARENTHESIS ST. CLOSE PARENTHESIS NEAR DELGADO ST. GOLD RECALLS THE ALAMEDA RUNS ALONG THE RIO SANTA FE WHICH HE DESCRIBED AS AN EXTREMELY SHALLOW STREAM. GOLD SAID THAT FUCHS ARRIVED IN AN AUTOMOBILE AND PICKED HIM UP, WHEREUPON THE TWO DROVE ON A COMBINATION ST. AND BRIDGE ACROSS THE RIO SANTA FE, AND DROVE A SHORT DISTANCE. GOLD SAID THEY STOPPED THE CAR AND THE TWO CONVERSED. GOLD SAID DURING THIS CONVERSATION, FUCHS DESCRIBED SOME OF THE PHYSICAL SETUP AT LOS ALAMOS AND SOME OF FUCHS-S DUTIES AT LOS ALAMOS. FUCHS

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TOLD GOLD HE WAS DUBIOUS ABOUT THE POSSIBILITIES FOR ANY REAL OR IMMEDIATE UTILIZATION OF ATOMIC ENERGY IN THE FORM OF A WEAPON. FUCHS HAD NO DOUBT, HOWEVER, OF THE EVENTUAL SUCCESS OF UTILIZING ATOMIC ENERGY IN THIS MANNER BUT DOUBTED THAT IT COULD BE REALIZED BEFORE THE WAR WOULD BE OVER. BEFORE THE TWO SEPARATED THEY AGREED ON THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE FOR THEIR NEXT MEETING, WHICH WOULD BE IN SANTA FE IN SEPT. FORTY FIVE. GOLD SAID ON THE OCCASION OF THIS MEETING FUCHS GAVE HIM A PACKET OF PAPERS CONTAINING INFO RELATIVE TO WORK BEING DONE AT LOS ALAMOS. GOLD DOES NOT RECALL EXACTLY WHERE HE AND FUCHS PARTED COMPANY THAT DAY. GOLD RETURNED TO ALBUQUERQUE FROM SANTA FE AND STAYED OVERNIGHT IN A ROOMING HOUSE IN ALBUQUERQUE. THE NEXT DAY, GOLD TOOK THE SANTA FE RAILROAD FROM ALBUQUERQUE TO CHICAGO AND AT CHICAGO TOOK A PLANE TO WASH., D. C. AT WASH. GOLD TOOK A TRAIN FROM WASH. TO NY AND TURNED OVER THE INFO TO JOHN WHICH HE HAD RECEIVED FROM FUCHS IN SANTA FE. GOLD SAID HE TURNED OVER THIS INFO TO JOHN SOMEWHERE ON METROPOLITAN AVE. IN BROOKLYN. GOLD SAID SOMETIME DURING THE SUMMER OF FORTYFIVE, AFTER HE RETURNED FROM SANTA FE, HE MET WITH JOHN IN NYC AND JOHN GAVE HIM A DEFINITE INDICATION THAT FUCHS WAS TO RETURN TO ENGLAND NOW THAT THE WORK ON THE ATOMIC BOMB IN THIS COUNTRY WAS APPROACHING AN END. GOLD ALSO BELIEVES JOHN GAVE HIM CERTAIN INSTRUCTIONS TO GIVE TO FUCHS

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DURING THE NEXT MEETING OR AT LEAST ASKED BY JOHN TO ARRIVE AT A PLAN WITH FUCHS RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING CONTACT WITH FUCHS UPON HIS RETURN TO ENGLAND. GOLD SAID HE LEFT PHILA IN SEPT. FORTY FIVE TO MAKE HIS SECOND MEETING WITH FUCHS IN SANTA FE. GOLD SAID HE LEFT PHILA BY TRAIN AND WENT TO CHICAGO, WHERE HE STAYED A FULL DAY AT THE PALMER HOUSE IN CHICAGO. GOLD SAID THAT SOMETIME DURING THE EVENING OF THE DAY THAT HE HAD SPENT AT THE PALMER HOUSE, HE LEFT CHICAGO BY TRAIN AND WENT TO ALBUQUERQUE. AT ALBUQUERQUE, GOLD TOOK THE BUS FROM THAT CITY TO SANTA FE FOR THE SAME REASON HE HAD TAKEN THE BUS ON HIS FIRST TRIP. GOLD MET FUCHS AGAIN AT THE APPOINTED SPOT AND AT THE APPOINTED TIME. GOLD SAID THAT AT THIS MEETING, FUCHS WAS APPROXIMATELY FIVE MINUTES LATE, WHICH WAS MOST UNUSUAL FOR HIM AS HE WAS VERY PRECISE IN KEEPING HIS APPOINTMENTS ON TIME. GOLD SAID THIS MEETING OCCURRED IN THE LATE EVENING AND THAT FUCHS AGAIN PICKED HIM UP IN AN AUTOMOBILE. GOLD RECALLS THERE WERE SOME BOTTLES OF WHISKEY IN THE BACK OF THE AUTOMOBILE WHICH WERE TO BE USED AT A PARTY TO CELEBRATE THE SUCCESS OF THE LOS ALAMOS WORK. GOLD SAID HE AND FUCHS DROVE WELL INTO THE OUTSKIRTS OF SANTA FE AND OUT ON A HILL, OR, AS GOLD RECALLED, FARTHER UP ON THE SIDE OF THE MOUNTAIN ON WHICH SANTA FE IS BUILT. GOLD RECALLS THAT FROM THE SPOT WHERE HE AND FUCHS STOPPED THEY COULD SEE THE LIGHTS OF SANTA FE. FUCHS TOLD GOLD THAT HE HAD BEEN PRESENT AT THE INITIAL LARGE-SCALE TRIAL OF NUCLEAR FISSION AT ALAMOGORDO IN NEW MEXICO AND ALSO

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DESCRIBED TO GOLD THE TREMENDOUS WONDERMENT THAT HAD DESCENDED UPON EVEN THOSE WHO HAD THE MOST INTIMATE KNOWLEDGE OF THE POTENTIALITIES OF THE WEAPON, MOST ESPECIALLY ON THE OCCASION OF THE DROPPING OF THE BOMB ON HIROSHIMA. IT WAS GOLD-S UNDERSTANDING THAT FUCHS WAS ACTUALLY PRESENT WITH THE GROUP OR CERTAINLY NEAR THE GROUP THAT SET OFF THE TRIAL BOMB AT ALAMOGORDO. FUCHS TOLD GOLD THAT HE HAD BEEN SPEAKING TO A SECURITY OFFICER AT LOS ALAMOS IN A VERY OFFHAND FASHION AND THE OFFICER TOLD FUCHS THAT WHILE ARMY INTELLIGENCE REALIZED THERE WERE HUNDREDS OF SOVIET AGENTS IN THE U. S. AND ENGLAND, THERE WAS ONLY ONE AGENT OF THE U. S. OR GREAT BRITAIN IN THE SOVIET UNION ITSELF. FUCHS LAUGHED WHEN HE TOLD GOLD THIS AND SAID HE DID NOT KNOW WHETHER THAT MEANT ANYTHING. DURING THE COURSE OF THIS MEETING, FUCHS GAVE GOLD A PACKET OF INFO CONCERNING THE ATOMIC PROJECT AT LOS ALAMOS. ALSO DURING THIS MEETING, GOLD DISCUSSED WITH FUCHS IN ACCORDANCE WITH INSTRUCTIONS HE HAD RECEIVED FROM JOHN, PLANS FOR FUTURE CONTACT OF FUCHS UPON THE LATTER-S RETURN TO ENGLAND. GOLD IS NOT CLEAR ON THE EXACT LOCATION IN ENGLAND WHERE THIS MEETING WAS TO OCCUR, BUT BELIEVES IT WAS TO BE IN LONDON AND SAID THE NAMES PADDINGTON OR TEDDINGTON CRESCENT STAND OUT IN HIS MEMORY. GOLD BELIEVES ARRANGEMENTS CONSISTED OF EITHER FUCHS OR THE PERSON WHO WAS TO CONTACT HIM IN ENGLAND CARRYING FOUR OR FIVE BOOKS BOUND TOGETHER BY A STRING UNDER ONE ARM, AND CARRYING A SINGLE BOOK IN THE OTHER HAND. GOLD ALSO RECALLS THAT TENTATIVE SCHEDULE SET

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UP FOR FIRST MEETING IN ENGLAND WAS FOR A SATURDAY NIGHT, AND THAT THIS WAS THE FIRST TIME ANY SUCH SCHEDULE AS THE FIRST SATURDAY IN JUNE OR THE THIRD SATURDAY IN JUNE HAD BEEN MENTIONED. GOLD SAID PRIOR TO THAT ALL HIS MEETINGS WERE ARRANGED ON DEFINITE DATES, SUCH AS THE TENTH OF JUNE OR TWENTIETH OF JUNE, AS THE CASE MIGHT BE. GOLD SAID THESE ARRANGEMENTS UNDOUBTEDLY SUGGESTED BY FUCHS, SINCE HE HAD NO KNOWLEDGE OF ENGLAND AND WOULD HAVE BEEN UNABLE TO MAKE ANY SUCH SUGGESTIONS. GOLD ALSO OF BELIEF THAT THESE FUTURE MEETINGS WHICH FUCHS WAS TO HAVE IN ENGLAND WERE TO OCCUR ON REGULAR BASIS. GOLD ALSO SAID DURING THIS CONVERSATION WITH FUCHS IN SANTA FE IN SEPT. FORTYFIVE, TENTATIVE ARRANGEMENTS WERE MADE FOR GOLD TO RECONTACT FUCHS IN CAMBRIDGE, MASS. IN LATE FORTYFIVE OR EARLY FORTYSIX, IF SUCH A MEETING SHOULD BE NECESSARY. FUCHS SAID THAT ALTHOUGH HE DID NOT KNOW EXACTLY WHEN HE WAS RETURNING TO ENGLAND, GOLD COULD PAY A CALL ON HIS SISTER IN CAMBRIDGE AND COULD FIND OUT JUST WHEN. GOLD SAID HE RETURNED TO ALBUQUERQUE FROM SANTA FE THAT SAME NIGHT AND STAYED AT THE HILTON HOTEL IN ALBUQUERQUE, WHERE HE SAID HE REGISTERED UNDER HIS OWN NAME. HE STAYED AT THE HILTON HOTEL OVERNIGHT. THE NEXT DAY, GOLD WENT BY AIRPLANE FROM ALBUQUERQUE TO KANSAS CITY, MO., WHERE HE TOOK THE TRAIN FROM K. C. TO CHICAGO. GOLD THEN TOOK THE TRAIN FROM CHICAGO TO NYC, VIA NY CENTRAL. GOLD ARRIVED TOO LATE TO KEEP HIS PRE-ARRANGED MEETING WITH JOHN FOR PURPOSE OF TURNING OVER INFO SO WENT ON TO PHILA AND MET JOHN SHORT.

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TIME LATER AT ALTERNATE MEETING IN QUEENS OUT BEYOND JACKSON HEIGHTS, NYC. HE GAVE INFO TO JOHN AT WHICH TIME HE INFORMED JOHN OF HIS ARRANGEMENTS FOR FUCHS-S BEING MET IN LONDON AS WELL AS OTHER INFO FUCHS HAD GIVEN HIM ORALLY. GOLD SAID SUBSEQUENT TO HIS MEETING JOHN IN JACKSON HEIGHTS, REFERRED TO ABOVE, HE HAD A LATER MEETING WITH JOHN AND BELIEVES THAT THIS POSSIBLY TOOK PLACE SOMEWHERE NEAR THE HOTEL ST. GEORGE IN BROOKLYN, AND THAT THIS MEETING TOOK PLACE SOMETIME BEFORE THE FIRST OF JAN. FORTYSIX. HE SAID AT THAT TIME JOHN WAS VERY TOUCHY AND VERY APPREHENSIVE AND DURING THIS MEETING, JOHN TOLD HIM THEY HAD TO BE EXTREMELY CAREFUL AND GOLD GOT DEFINITE IMPRESSION JOHN HAD THE QUOTE WIND UP UNQUOTE FOR SOME PARTICULAR REASON. GOLD SAID JOHN MADE A COUPLE OF OTHER APPOINTMENTS WITH HIM AT THAT TIME AND REMEMBERS THAT ONE WAS IN JAMAICA AND THAT ONE WAS NEAR THE EARLE THEATER IN THE BRONX, BUT THAT JOHN DID NOT KEEP ANY OF THESE APPOINTMENTS. NY AND BU SHOULD NOTE THAT INFO AT THIS TIME RELATIVE TO GOLD BEING RECONTACTED BY JOHN SUBSEQUENT TO JAN. ONE, FORTY SIX, IS LIMITED AND WILL BE FULLY EXPLORED TOMORROW UPON INTERVIEW WITH GOLD. GOLD SAID IN JAN. OR FEB. OF FORTY SIX, HE AGAIN WENT TO CAMBRIDGE, MASS., TO DETERMINE THE LOCATION OF FUCHS AND TO DETERMINE WHETHER FUCHS WAS STILL IN THIS COUNTRY. GOLD DID NOT SEE FUCHS ON THIS OCCASION. GOLD RECALLED

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THAT DURING THIS VISIT TO THE HEINEMAN HOME IN CAMBRIDGE, HE MET AN INDIVIDUAL THERE WHOM HE BELIEVED TO BE GREEK OR OF GREEK ANCESTRY. WHEN SEVERAL NAMES WERE MENTIONED TO GOLD, HE SEIZED UPON THE NAME ~~YE~~CONSTANTINE AS BEING THE FIRST NAME OF THIS INDIVIDUAL. HE RECALLED THE LAST NAME AS BEING A PECULIARLY GREEK SOUNDING NAME. THE ATTENTION OF THE NYO IS DIRECTED TO THE FACT THAT INVESTIGATION HAS REFLECTED THAT THIS INDIVIDUAL IS PROBABLY ~~CONSTANTINE~~LAFAZANOS. GOLD RECALLS HE TOLD HEINEMAN AND LAFAZANOS HE WAS FROM PITTSBURGH AREA AND THAT HE WAS A CHEMIST OR BIOCHEMIST IN PITTSBURGH AREA. HE SAID HE ALSO RECALLS ONE OF SUBJECTS DISCUSSED AT THAT TIME DEALT WITH A RECENT INCREASE IN PRICE OF STEEL AND ANOTHER SUBJECT WAS MUSIC. GOLD SAID THE GREEK INDIVIDUAL HAD CLOSE CROPPED HAIR LYING FLAT ON HIS HEAD, HAD STOCKLY BUILD, WORE A JACKET AND SPOKE WITH A GREEK ACCENT. GOLD SAID THIS INDIVIDUAL WAS PRESENT FOR ABOUT FIFTEEN OR TWENTY MINUTES AND THAT DURING SOME OF THIS TIME ROBERT HEINEMAN WAS PRESENT. GOLD SAID GREEK APPEARED TO BE CLOSE FRIEND OF HEINEMAN FAMILY. GOLD SAID WHILE HE WAS AT THE HEINEMAN HOME IN CAMBRIDGE, HE ADVISED THEM THAT HE WAS MARRIED AND HAD TWO CHILDREN. GOLD SAID HE HAD FREQUENTLY TOLD PEOPLE WITH WHOM HE WAS IN CONTACT RELATIVE TO HIS WORK FOR SOVIET UNION HE WAS MARRIED AND HAD TWO CHILDREN, IN ORDER TO CREATE AN OBSTACLE TOWARD HIS DISCOVERY OR IDENTIFICATION. GOLD SAID HE LEFT BOSTON AND RETURNED TO NY AND THENCE TO PHILA. GOLD HAS STATED THAT SUBSEQUENT TO HIS

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SECOND MEETING WITH FUCHS IN SANTA FE HE NEVER SAW FUCHS AGAIN AND HAS NOT SEEN HIM TO THIS DATE. GOLD ALSO STATED HE DID NOT SEE JOHN AFTER HIS VISIT TO HEINEMAN HOME IN EARLY FORTYSIX. GOLD ADVISED HE WAS ABLE TO TAKE THE TWO SANTA FE TRIPS TO MEET FUCHS BY TAKING A SPLIT VACATION FROM PA. SUGAR CO. DURING EARLY FORTYFIVE.

GOLD SAID ARRANGEMENTS FOR ALL MEETINGS BETWEEN HIM AND JOHN WERE MADE IN ADVANCE. GOLD SAID HE WOULD MEET WITH JOHN PRIOR TO A TIME WHEN HE WAS DUE TO MEET FUCHS DURING THIS MEETING, GOLD WOULD ADVISE JOHN IF HE WAS TO GET INFO FROM FUCHS ON THE NEXT SCHEDULED MEETING. ALSO ON THIS OCCASION THE PLANS WERE MADE FOR THE NEXT MEETING BETWEEN GOLD AND JOHN AND PLANS FOR AN ALTERNATE MEETING WERE ALSO SET UP. GOLD SAID ON THE OCCASIONS WHEN HE WAS DUE TO RECEIVE INFO FROM FUCHS HE AND JOHN WOULD PLAN A MEETING TO TAKE PLACE ON THE SAME NIGHT THAT GOLD WAS TO RECEIVE INFO, THAT IS, WHEN HE WAS RECEIVING INFO IN NYC. GOLD SAID THAT THIS MEETING WITH JOHN WOULD OCCUR NOT MORE THAN AN HOUR AFTER GOLD-S MEETING WITH FUCHS AND SOMETIMES IN AS SHORT A TIME AS FIFTEEN MINUTES. GOLD SAID UPON LEAVING FUCHS WITH THE INFO HE WOULD IMMEDIATELY KEEP THE MEETING WITH JOHN AND QUICKLY TRANSFER TO JOHN THE INFO WHICH GOLD HAD RECEIVED FROM FUCHS. GOLD SAID THERE WAS NO CONVERSATION CONDUCTED BETWEEN JOHN AND HIMSELF ON THE OCCASION OF THE MEETINGS WHEN HE TURNED OVER INFO TO JOHN. GOLD SAID HOWEVER, THAT ALSO AT THE MEETING PRIOR TO THE TIME WHEN HE WOULD PICK UP INFO FROM FUCHS, GOLD AND JOHN WOULD ARRANGE FOR A MEETING SUBSEQUENT TO THE ONE WHERE GOLD TURNED OVER THE INFO TO JOHN. THIS WOULD BE A MATTER OF A FEW DAYS OR A WEEK AT THE MOST. GOLD ALSO SAID THAT ON THE

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OCCASIONS WHEN HE WOULD MEET FUCHS AND FUCHS WOULD INFORM HIM THAT HE WAS GIVING HIM INFO ON THE NEXT MEETING, PLANS FOR A FUTURE MEETING WITH FUCHS WOULD BE ARRANGED AT THAT TIME TO OBTAIN THE NECESSITY OF THE TWO SPENDING ANY MORE TIME TOGETHER THAN WAS ESSENTIAL. WHEN FUCHS WAS TRANSFERRING INFO TO GOLD. GOLD ALSO SAID IN ALL THESE ARRANGEMENTS AN ALTERNATE MEETING PLACE AND TIME WAS ESTABLISHED FOR EVERY MEETING THAT WAS ARRANGED FOR IN THE FUTURE. THIS ALTERNATE MEETING ALWAYS OCCURRED WITHIN TWO WEEKS AFTER THE ORIGINALLY PLANNED MEETING. GOLD SAID JOHN HAD EFFECTED AN ARRANGEMENT WITH HIM WHEREBY JOHN COULD GET IN TOUCH WITH GOLD ON AN EMERGENCY BASIS TO ARRANGE FOR AN UNSCHEDULED MEETING OR TO ADVANCE THE TIME OF A SCHEDULED MEETING. GOLD SAID THESE ARRANGEMENTS CONSISTED OF JOHN SENDING GOLD SOME THEATER TICKETS OR TICKETS TO SOME AFFAIR IN NYC. GOLD SAID IT DID NOT MATTER WHAT THE TICKETS WERE FOR AS LONG AS THEY HAD A DATE PRINTED ON THEM. GOLD SAID THE DATE PRINTED ON THESE TICKETS WOULD INDICATE TO HIM THAT HE WAS TO MEET JOHN TWO OR THREE DAYS AS THE CASE MIGHT BE SUBSEQUENT TO THE DATE PRINTED ON THE TICKETS. GOLD SAID THERE ALWAYS WAS A SET MEETING PLACE AND HOUR FOR THESE EMERGENCY MEETINGS. GOLD RECALLS THAT THIS MEETING PLACE WAS A SEAFOOD RESTAURANT SOMEWHERE ACROSS THE ST. FROM THE BROADWAY STOP ON THE ASTORIA ELEVATED LINE. GOLD RECALLED ON ONE OCCASION HE RECEIVED TWO SUCH TICKETS IN AN ENVELOPE BUT THEY WERE DELIVERED TO HIS HOME IN PHILA. SEVERAL DAYS AFTER TIME HE WOULD HAVE MET JOHN HAD HE RECEIVED TICKETS IN TIME. GOLD SAID THE STREET NUMBERS OF HIS ADDRESS WERE TRANSPOSED WHICH DELAYED DELIVERY OF THE LETTER. GOLD SAID HE TOOK ELABORATE PRECAUTIONS PRIOR TO TIME HE WOULD MEET FUCHS. GOLD SAID WITH REFERENCE TO THE NY MEETINGS HE WOULD TRAVEL BY SUBWAY IN THE GENERAL DIRECTION OF THE MEETING PLACE. GOLD WOULD GET OFF THE SUBWAY AT DESERTED STOPS AND WAIT THERE ON THE PLATFORM READING NEWSPAPERS ALLOWING SEVERAL TRAINS TO GO BY. HE ALSO WOULD JUMP ON SUBWAY TRAINS JUST AS DOORS WERE CLOSING AND LEAVE THEM IN SAME FASHION. HE WOULD THEN TRAVEL IN OPPOSITE DIRECTION FROM MEETING PLACE USUALLY BY DIFFERENT MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION SUCH AS BUS, STREETCAR OR TAXI CAB AND THEN BEING ASSURED HE WAS NOT FOLLOWED WOULD GO DIRECTLY TO MEETING PLACE. GOLD SAID ONLY ONE TIME DID HE BECOME ALARMED THAT HE WAS BEING FOLLOWED AND ON THIS OCCASION AFTER LEAVING FUCHS HE RODE THE FIFTH AVE. BUS UP RIVERSIDE DRIVE TO END OF LINE AND THEN RETURNED. GOLD RECALLS INCIDENT IN ONE OF HIS MEETINGS WITH FUCHS AT WHICH TIME THE TWO WENT TO A SMALL BAR ON UPPER MADISON

AVE. NEAR SEVENTYSEVENTH ST. GOLD RECALLED THIS WAS RAINY NIGHT AND WAS TIME WHEN FUCHS DID NOT PASS INFO. FUCHS LEFT BAR FIRST AND AFTER SHORT PERIOD OF TIME GOLD LEFT. IN SUMMATION, GOLD RECALLS MEETING FUCHS EIGHT TIMES IN USA, FIVE TIMES IN NYC AND SURROUNDING BOROUGHES, ONCE IN CAMBRIDGE, MASS. AND TWICE IN SANTA FE. GOLD RECALLS HE RECEIVED INFO FROM FUCHS ON TWO OCCASIONS IN NYC . ON ONE OCCASION IN CAMBRIDGE AND ON TWO OCCASIONS IN SANTA FE. GOLD STATED POSSIBLY HE MIGHT HAVE HAD ONE MORE MEETING IN NYC WITH FUCHS BUT COULD NOT RECALL THE CIRCUMSTANCES AND BELIEVES HE DID NOT RECEIVE INFO FROM FUCHS AT THAT TIME.

The following information is being submitted to the Bureau and to interested offices for information purposes:

On June 21, 1950, an individual who identified himself as [REDACTED] telephonically contacted the Washington Field Office and requested to know if Mr. CLEGG or Agent LAMPHERE were in charge of the KLAUS FUCHS Case. He was informed that this information could not be given to him. [REDACTED] then informed that about ten days ago he had contacted the FBI and furnished some information regarding an elevator operator in Philadelphia named JAMES GIVENS who, he claimed, was an associate of HARRY GOLD and had gone to Asbury Park, New Jersey, with GOLD.

[REDACTED] thereafter rambled on about being the inventor of the basic atom bomb theory. He stated that the purpose of his call was to see to it that the FBI conducted an investigation concerning GIVENS, and that he had furnished the writer information previously, including his own address, and that he did not wish to repeat it.

The files of this office reflect that a [REDACTED], who lives at [REDACTED], and who may be identical with the above mentioned [REDACTED], was a complainant in an impersonation matter. It has been indicated that the latter [REDACTED]

PURPOSE:

To set out the results of a file review on the above subject. The file review was requested by Supervisor Robert Lamphere.

BACKGROUND:

On June 5, 1950, the Philadelphia Office advised by teletype that Harry Gold stated that he had submitted to the Soviets the name of Howard Dalske with a biographical sketch of him; further that he had gone to Drexel in Philadelphia with Howard Dalske. At the time the sketch was given to the Soviets Dalske worked for Charles Lennig Company, which manufactured acids and heavy chemicals; further, that Dalske presently works for E. F. Houghton Company. Gold stated that he submitted the name of Dalske and others to the Soviets when he was being pressed for possible recruits to be used in Soviet espionage but that at the time he had very little idea of actually trying to get these individuals to work for the Soviets.
