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

#### At Santa Fe, New Mexico

Investigation at Santa Fe, New Mexico, was conducted by Special Agents CLARENCE L. CRANDALL, HOMER K. MILLER, PHILIP B. DEILY, and J. H. BURTTRAY. 

The records of the De Vargas Hotel, Santa Re, New Mexico, were checked for the period from May 1, 1945, to September 1, 1946. No record was found for a ROBBINS who registered from any eastern city and no registration was found under the name of RECENSTREICH. On August 3, 1946, R. L. KERBER and J. ROBBINS, no address given, registered and were assigned to

The records of the La Fonda Hotel, Santa Fe, New Maxico, were checked for the period from May 1, 1945, through September 1, 1946. No registration was located for a ROBBINS from any eastern city and no registration was located under the name of RECENSTREICH. It was noted that one JOSEPH P. REGAN, 4935 Frankford Avenue, Philadelphia, Pa., registered at this hotel on March 12, 1946, and remained to March 18, 1946.

Suspect JOSEPH ARNOLD ROBBINS whose true name is JOSEPH HEGENSTREICH has a brother who uses the name ALFRED REGER.

The records of the Monteguma Hotel, Santa Fe, New Mexico, for the period from March 1, 1946 to September 15, 1946, were checked without finding any pertinent registrations. Records prior to March 1, 1946, had been destroyed.

Inquiry at the El Fidel Hotel, Santa Fe, New Mexico, reflected that all of their records for 1945 and 1946 had been destroyed.

The records of the Hope Hotel, Santa Fe, New Mexico, for the period from January 1, 1946, to September 1, 1946, were checked with negative results. Records prior to January 1, 1946, had been destroyed.


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

Confidential Informant advised on February 26.

1949 that the wife of ROBERT SOBLE had invited the GROSSES to her residence and had stated that MIRA and JACK SOBLE would be present.

The same informant reported on February 27, 1949 that MIRA SOBLE advised JACOB ALRAM that JACK SOBLE was at the ROBERT SOBLE residence. ALRAM asked if the SOBLES had contacted the GROSSES and MIRA stated "they are there".

The following descriptions of GROSS have been supplied by the indicated sources. It will be noted that a composite of these descriptions does not vary too greatly with the description of the supplied by TOP SEUR ROBERT and KRISTEL HEINEMAN and by EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS.

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SECRET May 23, 1950 LEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON MR. Declassification Indefinite Peyton Ford called regarding the leak concerning an imminent arre the Fuchs Case. He stated he had just talked to Dawson who had informed him that this information came from the highest official source to the President and to him alone. I stated there had to be a leak some place then and he commented that he did not press Dawson though he, Ford, felt he must be talking about the National Security Suncil, or Lay, or Souers and I stated they did not know a thing about this matter. I stated this whole thing was very secret because I wanted Clegg and Lamphere to work on Fuchs for two or three days and simultaneously we were working on Gold; here. Of course I said it took us quite some time to develop the identity of the man whom Fuchs contacted here in this country because Fuchs only knew him by a code name and it was only by various descriptions, size, appearance, occasions, et cetera, that we finally narrowed it down to about five people and then finally narrowed it down to two and on Sunday we got it down to one. I stated this was known only to about six people in the Bureau and to Mr. Clegg and Mr. Lamphere in London because we were afraid there might be some leak as Gold has given us a wealth of material involving a lot of other people he contacted as he had been working as a Soviet Agent back in the Thirties. I stated that we have been envious to run down these leads and Gold has been entirely willing to cooperate and now with a leak of this kind the only safe move we can make is an arrest but the case is practically lost from the point of view of developing a large espionage ring. I told Mr. Ford that the thing that concerned me was that even in the were very careful not to let it be known and Mr. Ford then asked if I had told the President and I advised him that I had not; that we had not talked to a single person about this matter. Further, I informed him that our plan was to develop the leads and then clear with the Attorney General and make the arrest somet next week and have the formal release made at the Department. Mr. Ford stated he was at the White House on another matter and was downstairs and was called up to Dawson's Office who said what do you know about the arrest in the Fuchs Case this afternoon. Ford advised me he said he did not know anything about it but the Attorney General was there and he would check on it, and upon asking the Attorney, General about it he was informed he knew nothing about it and he, Ford, was to call the Bureau and inform them that he, the Attorney General, was coming back in about thirty minutes and would find out about I stated I was very concerned because though we had had difficulty with the British in interviewing Tuche

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progress over here and I knew that sooner or later we would be asked about his contacts. I further stated that I had ordered this whole matter to be handled as top secret that as lew memorands were to be written as possible and only six men in the Bureau knew of it. I added that if anyone within the Bureau had talked about this it was in direct violation to my orders. Mr. Ford asked if I wanted him to go back to Dawson and I told him it was imperative that we know if we can where this information came from because we have no security until we do. Ford stated he would call Dawson back and ask him the direct question.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. MR. LADD MR. NICHOLS Control of the second s The Attorney General called me in regard to my previous convergation with him concerning the leas regarding an imminent arrest in the Fuchs Case. He stated that Peyton Ford told him that this afternoon just before he, Ford, saw the Attorney General at the White House Dawson told him this story and commented that he understood that this thing was imminent and when Dawson was asked where he got his information his answer was that he had gotten it from down-Stairs. The Attorney General stated that Ford did not ask any further questions although he believed he could. I stated I was most concerned about this as this information was known to only a very limited number even in the Bureau and a leak of this kind, with Clegg and Lamphere (4) in London interviewing Fuchs and our interviewing Gold at the same time 9 was very serious. I stated we had hoped that we would be able to hold this arrest until next week sometime and let Clegg and Lamphere finish (4) with Fuchs and until we had finished with Gold and then make the formal ( arrest as Gold was willing to do that and his brother and father were willing to have him do that. I further stated that I was concerned how ---this got known as we had made no distribution of the information to anyone, not even to the British Government and I was wondering in view of that

I told Ford it placed us in an ewfel predicament and practically ruins the development of the case. Dawson stated there was no way he could tall Ford but he could depend that It had gots to no one but the President and that we should have no qualms as to the secrecy. I stated I very definitely did as there was no way for Davison to find out except from some leak and that leak is apt to have given the informetion to semeone else. I stated it was impossible to find out from any source except from some deliberate leak on the thing. At 5:15 pm, May 24, 1950, I received a call from Miss Norma Abrams of the New York Daily News. She remonstrated over the fact that the press release in this case was made from Washington; that there was not a simultaneous press release in New York City; that she had been made to look like a fool in her office because she had no indication that a story of this nature was going to break and because there was no local comment in New York and she was left entirely out in the cold. She said that she had done numerous favors for the Bureau in the past and had secured favorable editorial comment for the Bureau. She felt that there was a lack of reciprocity, particularly in that there was no simultaneous release in New York in this case. The New York Office has enjoyed very favorable relations with Norma Abrams, as has the Bureau. She has always been very trustworthy in so far as I know, and has always been very friendly, although periodically when a story such as this breaks outside of New York, she remonstrates vehemently. This, of course, is common with other New York reporters. I told Miss Abrams that Gold was arrested in Philadelphia and that no release was made in Philadelphia either. I advised her that the release was made by the Attorney General, although we, of course, had furnished him with the information for the release. I pointed out that in matters of this importance it is up to the Attorney General where the release will be made and that the Department had instructed that there be no comment, even by the United States Attorney in New York. I advised Miss Abrams that we appreciated her cooperation and we most certainly hoped it would continue, but in instances of this type, there was simply nothing we could do. This has happened in the past and Miss Abrams has always come around after her temper subsides.

On May 15, 1950, the above-mentioned individuals were interviewed in an effort to identify Unknown Subject and these individuals were all associates of Brothman during that The results of these interviews, which have been furnished by teletype and, therefore, are not in complete detail, are being set out for your informa tion. Abraham Brothman Abraham Brothman and his secretary, Miriam Moskowitz, were contacted by the interviewing Agents at Brothman's office at 1:00 PM, May 15, 1950, at which time they declined to be interviewed pending advice from an attorney. They consulted Fowler Mamilton, New York attorney, who advised both to cooperate fully with the Bureau. (You will recall that Mr. Hamilton was appointed by

Judge Ryan in the Southern District of New York to prepare a brief for the Court with respect to the claim of Valentine A. Gubitchev that he had diplomatic immunity in connection with the Coplon-Gubitchev prosecution.) Preliminary interviews were subsequently had with Brothman and Moskowitz en the evening of May 15th at the New York Office.

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Brothman, along with the identities of all employees in the office and the A. Brothman and Associates Laboratory. He stated that the laboratory was are ass opened in Elmhurst, Long Island, in May or June 1945, for the purpose of water. handling a contract with the Chinese Government for the manufacture of lucite and plywood for aircraft. Brothman mentioned he was cheated by Henry Colwynne, President of Chemurgy Design Company, who denied Brothman fifty per-cent of the stock of that business as he had promised to Brothman. This occurred about August 1, 1944. Information was also obtained concerning the financial backing of A. Brothman and Associates. This information included an item of \$16,000 "risked capital" made available to Brothman in 1945 by Bernard Pidto at the inception of the contract for the Chinese Government. Brothman and Moskowitz both appeared cooperative and the interview was terminated to allow Brothman to handle expedite business affairs, with the understanding that the interview would be resumed the following day. Prior to terminating the interview, Brothman had agreed to make available the files and the books / U and records of his company for examination by the Agents.

On May 16, 1950, Brothman was again interviewed, this time at the plant of Water Chemical Company, Cliffwood, New Jersey, where he was working, in accordance with his request. The history of Brothman's contact with Jacob Golos and Elizabeth T. Bentley was reviewed with him. Brothman claimed that Golos was told by him in 1940 that Brothman needed a laboratory to perform experiments. Brothman was subsequently contacted by Earry Gold, who was employed by the Pennsylvania Sugar Refining Company, where; through the cooperation of his superior, Gold could perform extra experimental work. From 1940 to 1946, Brothman gave Gold several experiments to conduct and during this time he was in constant touch with Gold through correspondence, telephone, and in person. He said that Gold knew many details of his life, including the fact that Brothman had quit Chemurgy Design Company, because he had been cheated by his partners.

Brothman also admitted contacts with Vladimir Antonovich Teverianovich, of Amtorg, during 1946, for the purpose of obtaining contracts to set up a vitamin plant in Russia. This contract never materialized, however. Information concerning the identity and description of other contacts of Brothman

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was obtained, but none appeared to tally with the description of Unknown Subject Arrangements were made to review all of Brothman's files and records today, May 17th, when he will again be interviewed.

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Harry Gold

Gold was interviewed on May 15, 1950. In connection with the infor-

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that in October 1944 he attempted to call from Philadelphia to Brothman at the Chemurgy Design Company, New York City, and learned that Brothman was no longer employed there. He then telephoned Brothman at his home and in a matter of a few days went to New York where he met Brothman and had dinner with him in a restaurant near 52nd Street and 4th Avenue. After dinner he and Brothman took a long walk and talked for hours, during which Brothman told him he had left Chemurgy Design becausa Golwyn (Henry Golwynne) and Weber (Arthur Phineas Weber) had cheated him and attempted to obtain from him the rights on the aerosol bomb process which Brothman had invented.

Brothman also advised Gold that he had been doing some work on the aerosol bomb with Theodore Epilig, who also endeavored to chest Brothman in the matter. Gold stated that Brothman had actually been discharged by Golwynne from Chemurgy Design as a result of the differences on the aerosel bomb matter. Gold stated that to the best of his knowledge, Brothman never was interested in the buna-5 process, but that Brothman had told him he had worked for the Rubber Reserve Commission. Gold related that when Brothman broke with Chemurgy, he continued his work on the aerosol bomb with Theodore Heilig, of Regal Chemical Company, Brooklyn, New York. Gold did not know whether the aerosol matter was ever finished, but that Brothman lost interest in it shortly after he formed the new company (A. Brothman and Associates).

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A. Brothman and Associates. Just prior to the time Brothman left Chemney, Brothman was visited by Gold in New York and Gold learned that Brothman had set up a very small laboratory while still working at Chemney. He said this laboratory was located in the same place where the headquarters of the new laboratory was later set up. He said that he was in this small laboratory and Brothman had one colored chemist working there by the name of Gibbs. He said this small laboratory was said this small laboratory was opened by Brothman in May or June of 1944.

Concerning the formation of A. Brothman and Associates, Gold said that Brothman was the only one of the partners who was able to supply any reasonable amount of capital. He said this capital came principally from Bridgeport Brass Company and Graver Tank Company. He also understood that Brothman had some other money which he had gained from royalties and which he invested in the company. Gold said that the other partners, Vago, Barish, Korchien, and Wollan, supplied approximately \$100 each and immediately withdrew this amount in salaries. It will be noted that according to

could not be determined what this referred to. Gold appeared to have the facts of the formation of A. Brothman and Associates well in mind and needed only slight refreshment to recall names of individuals and companies and pertinent dates.

With respect to the information from

in 1936 or 1937 he became interested in the process of thermal diffusion and began a detailed study of it. He had become interested in it from the standpoint of recovering valuable chemicals discharged by industrial plant flues through the process of thermal diffusion of gases. He said that he had talked this over with Dr. Gustav To Reich, Chief Chemist and Gold's superior at the Pennsylvania Sugar Refining Company, Philadelphia. He said his main purpose in the research was to put the process in a condition so that he could approach someone to apply the process to actual production.

He said that in 1946, when he became employed by Brothman, he brought with him a brochure on the process of thermal diffusion which was about ten typed pages. He could not recall the exact title of this brochure, but thought it might be something like "Thermal Diffusion Prospectus." (It is believed that this brochure is the document made available to the New York Office by a highly confidential informant as being in the possession of Abraham Brothman.) Gold said that he endeavored to interest Brothman in this process, but Brothman apparently never became interested in it, probably because it was not Brothman's idea. He said the brochure was not written in strict chemical language, but was written in such a way that it could be made available to a plant manager or manufacturer and would present the practical aspects of such a process when applied to production. Gold said that he had also presented this brochure on thermal diffusion to one John McCabe, an employee at Publicker Alcohol Industries, Philadelphia, but that nothing ever came of it.

Gold said that it had always been his desire to set up an independent laboratory, but that he had not been able to do so because of lack of funds. He also said that he had a preliminary discussion with Brothman about setting up an independent partnership, but he was vague about this and could give no details. He said there was never any prolonged discussion along these lines, but he did recall specifically that Brothman at one time wanted to collaborate with Gold in writing a book on processes, the chemical background for which would be furnished by Gold.

Gold said that he continued to see Brothman from the latter part of 1940 or the early part of 1941, up until June 2, 1948, when he quit working for Brothman in New York. He claims that he has not seen Brothman since. He said that when making trips during this period to contact Brothman, and when going out with Brothman, he asked Brothman to introduce him under the name of Frank Resslar. He explained that he went under this name when dealing with Brothman, inasmuch as Gold's superior, Reich, was well-known in chemical circles, as was Brothman, and Gold was ebligated to turn ever to Pennsylvania Sugar Refining Company any processes he thought of. Therefore, he did not want Reich to know or ever find out that he was conferring

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with another industrial chemist. He also said that he was conducting experiments, at the request of Brothman, in the laboratory of the Pennsylvania Sugar Refining Company and that this was an unethical practice.

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The state of the s With respect to the period covered by the information of namely, 1944 through the early part of 1945, Gold stated that after seeing Brothman in New York in October 1944 he continued to visit How York at fairly regular intervals up to the time that he finally became employed by Brothman in 1946. Many of these trips were made on either Sundays or evenings during the week. He could recall only one occasion when he went to Brothman's office. He stated that about eight or ten months prior to June 1948, Brothman had been unable to pay any of his help and all worked for nothing. In May 1948, Brothman and his secretary, Miriam Moskowitz, went to Switzerland, and while there he, Gold, and other employees; namely, Vago, Philip Pevine, and William Rowall, found out that Brothman contemplated selling the company. Gold said he and the others had been led to believe that they were partners in the business and would share in the income. On Brothman's return, the employees confronted him with the information and then all left the company.

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Gold was shown photographs of Fuchs, Elizabeth T. Bentley, Jacob Golds and seven or eight Russian nationals of no investigative significance. He readily identified the photograph of Golds as being the person who introduced him to Brothman. He studied Bentley's photograph and stated that he had never met the woman, but believed her to be Elizabeth Sentley. He studied Fuchs' picture for some time and said, "That is a very unusual licture; that is that English spy." He also was shown a photograph of Joseph Arnold Robbins and he studied it for some time, finally stating that he had never seen the man. It was observed by the interviewing Agents that there is a definite similarity between the facial expressions of Joseph Robbins and Harry Gold, and further that Gold walks with the same definite

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Gold is presently employed at the Philadelphia General Hospital, doing chemical research with regard to serious cardiac cases. His hours

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ere very long and his job requires constant attention due to the serious condition of the patients. The interview was discontinued when it was necessary for Gold to return to the hospital on the night of May 15th and Gold will be unavailable for an interview of any length until Friday night, at which time he will be recontacted. At this point, Gold appears to be of the epinion that the Bureau's primary interest is in Brothman and possibly Funhs. It is contemplated that he will be reinterviewed on the evening of May 19th.

#### Miriam Moskowitz

Moskowitz, who is presently a partner of Abraham Brothman, was interviewed on the afternoon of May 16th. Further details concerning her association with A. Brothman and Associates were obtained, along with information concerning the partnership, employees, and contacts of the firm and laboratory. Information was also obtained concerning the contracts, business dealings, and research work conducted by A. Brothman and Associates.

Moskowitz advised that she knew nothing concerning the association of Brothman and Harry Gold prior to the time of Gold's employment as head of A. Brothman and Associates Laboratory at Elmhurst, Long Island, about May 1946. She said that about May 1947, the firm had no money, but Gold nevertheless stayed on with the expectation of future payments and a share in profits if something materialized. Gold finally left in May 1948 to return to Philadelphia as he had no money and no source of income. The firm still owes Gold approximately \$2,500, representing about a half-year's salary.

Moskowitz related that when Gold came with the firm in 1946, he frequently spoke of his wife, a former model at Gimbels Store, presumably Philadelphia, and his twin children, Essie and David. He also claimed his brother, a paratrooper, had been killed in the Pacific. Subsequently, when filling out a withholding tax form for Gold, Moskowitz requested of

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him information concerning his dependents, and Gold stated that he had none.
Moskowitz then asked him why he would not list his wife and children as dependents, and Gold thereupon became "hysterical" and insisted that she forget his family. She related that she subsequently attended the funeral of Gold's mother in Philadelphia and there met Gold's brother who supposedly had been killed. She stated that the alleged wife and children of Gold were not present at the funeral and she feels certain that they are non-existent.

Moskowitz was unable to furnish any information about Gold's research work, other than work done for the firm. She stated that during the latter part of employment with Brothman, Gold was "frantic for cash" to repay a loan to an unknown bank. She was unable to give further details on this.

### Jules Korchien

Korchien was interviewed briefly in Los Angeles and an appointment for further interview has been arranged. The initial interview was terminated in view of a business appointment on the part of Korchien.

Korchien stated that he set Abraham Brothman about 1942. At that time Korchien was employed by Henry Af Golwinne as an architect on the Befert Chemical Company project on which Brothman was associated as a chemical engineer. He said that he was responsible for the hiring of Oscar Pago as a structural engineer (apparently on the Rufert Chemical Company project). He stated that he had known Vago since late 1930 and that Vago was unknown to Brothman.

Korchien stated that A. Brothman and Associates, Inc., was organized in late 1943 or possibly 1944, the original partners being Brothman, Vago, Wollen and Korchien. He said that Gus Wollan had been unknown to him until Brothman introduced them. He was vague and reluctant to discuss the financial structure of A. Brothman and Associates but stated that when the company was formed Brothman had an agreement with the Chinese Government to furnish designs for plastic and chemical processes. However, he did not know any of the Chinese officials involved in this and stated that the business contacts were handled by Brothman. After repeated questioning, he said that he believed that about \$30,000 was paid to A. Brothman and Associates at various times for the work on this Chinese contract. He denied that he, himself, had ever received any money for wages or services. He said he performed no work on the Chinese contract. He recalled that the company also had a contract with the Bridgeport Brass Company. He claimed never to have taken active part in the operations of the business and to have ceased his partnership in the company when it moved to Queens. He said that he and Brothman had both advanced loans to the company and that the company is indebted to him for \$1800 at the present time. He said there were other persons associated with or employed by Abraham Brothman and Associates but that they were unknown to him. He also said that at about the time the firm was organized a laboratory was set up near Elmhurst, Long Island, and that Wollan and others worked there. He also recalled that Brothman was friendly with an editor of the Shemical and Metallurgical Journal to which magazine Brothman submitted articles. He could not recall the name of this editor however. Korchien made the statement that he would be surprised if Brothman were involved in the Fuchs matter.

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On May 15, 1950, Wollan was interviewed by Agents of the Atlanta Office. At that time he supplied information concerning the contacts of Brothman as known to him. He did not reveal any additional contacts not already known to the Bureau. He denied knowing Fuchs or Heineman or ever having been in the states of Massachusetts or New Mexico.

Follan identified a photograph of Harry Gold as a person known to him as Frank Keppler and Harry Gold. He did not know the reason for the use of the two names but believed that it was because of marital difficulties. He said Gold had been employed by Brothman personally in the Winter of 1945 or the Spring of 1946 to work with A. Brothman and Associates. At first Gold worked only a day or two at a time commuting from Philadelphia and conducting experiments, making sketches, et cetera, of his own allegedly for Brothman. Wollan did not know the details of this work. Gold was later employed full time, but still maintained his home in Philadelphia. He said that Brothman appeared to have known Gold for some time prior to this employment but that he, Wollan, had not known Gold prior to

Wollan advised that his brother. Rolf Wollan, who was considered as a possible suspect for Unknown Subject in view of his employment with A. Brothman and Associates and the fact that in 1943 he had been in England, was presently in Glenwood, Minnesota. He also advised that his brother had been in the United States Army Signal Corps until 1945 and had been stationed in England for two years during his Army service. He agreed to locate a photograph of his brother and an appointment was made for May 16, 1950, with the interviewing Agents. (U

### Oscar J. Vago

Vego was interviewed in New York City, May 15, 1950, and at that time he advised that he had been hired by Brothman on a spare time job on the recommendation of a friend in 1941. (The friend is probably Jules Korchien in view of information

Vago did not recontact Brothman until February, 1944, when Brothman hired him for the Regal Chemical Corporation, New York City. In August, 1944, Brothman invited Vago to join him in A. Brothman and Associates, promising retainers from Graver Tank Company and Bridgeport Brass Company, which Brothman was already receiving. Brothman also promised to obtain more new business. He stated that the firm was set up with no capital and entirely on the above retainers which were lost in late 1945. He estimated the retainers at \$1,100 monthly. He said the firm 

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did a heavy business in proposals and never received payments in most of them because the proposals were not accepted. In 1944 the firm had a contract with the Chinese Government concerning aircraft for which \$70,000 was received in 1947. The firm also received \$10,000 in 1947 for work on the Toni Permanent process and \$500 from an Indian chemical company, also in 1947. He said this was the sole income of the company during his connection with it with possible minor exceptions.

Vago stated that Brothman borrowed money continually to meet such items as telephone and rent. Brothman told the partners that he borrowed money from his friends on his own credit and Vago stated that the lenders were unknown to him. He said that Brothman was careful to keep business contacts from meeting other partners with the exception of Miriam Moscowitz.

Vago said that the firm set up a laboratory in late 1945 and that the laboratory was run by Wollan until his departure and then by Harry Gold. Vago (U) identified a photograph of Joseph Arnolds Robbins as being Harry Gold.

Vago was unable to furnish the nature of Brothman's contacts at Chemurgy Design Corporation or at A. Brothman and Associates. He stated Brothman travelled very little and that the other partners and employees did not travel at all on firm business. Further interview of Vago is contemplated.

#### Emil Z. Barish

Barish was interviewed May 15, 1950, at the New York Office. He furnished personal background information substantially as already known. He said he first met Brothman at New York City in 1941, at a "social gathering," which he declined to identify further. At that time he was employed by the M. W. Kellogg, New York City, and Brothman was chief engineer at Hendrick Manufacturing Company. When Brothman went with Themurgy Design Corporation in 1942 he was instrumental in obtaining employment of Barish at Chemurgy as a mechanical engineer. In Chemurgy Design Corporation Barish was employed with Brothman, Arthur P. Weber, Bob Townsend. Oscar Vago, Jules Korchien and a woman known only as Ruth, whose last name he could not recall. Vago and Korchien were employed on a consultant basis only.

Henry Golwyn (Golwynne), President of Chemurgy, had been working on plans for construction of a plant for Rufert Chemical Company, in which company Golwynne had some financial interest. According to Barish as a result of

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inefficiency of Rufert's chemical engineers in supplying the necessary information and in view of the financial interest in Rufert pressing for completion of the plant, Colwynne and Brothman had violent disagreement resulting in Brothman's separation. Brothman left Chemurgy in the Summer of 1944, according to Barish.

While still employed at Chemurgy Brothman had a personal consultant contract with Graver Tank Company and had set up a small laboratory on East 32nd Street. New York City. Also while with Chemurgy, Brothman had a separate personal agreement with Theodore Heilig from which Brothman received \$100 or \$150 per week, which he had been receiving for about one and one-half years.

Several weeks after Brothman left Chemurgy, Barish, who was also dissatisfied at Chemurgy, separated and joined A. Brothman and Associates. Barish stated that this firm was formed because Brothman had the Graver contract and also a contract with Bridgeport Brass Company. He could not recall any other business connections. He believed that Brothman would obtain additional business through Brothman's contact in the trade and, therefore, desired to associate with Brothman, whom he described as "near genius." The other associates in the business were Wollan, who had come from Theodore Heilig's company and who was friendly with Brothman; Vago, who was probably unemployed at the time and Korchien, an independent architect. Korchien was not to draw any money from the partnership and Barish believes Korchien may have loamed funds to Brothman for the business. Barish stated that Miriam Moscowitz started as a secretary or stenographer during the early months of the new business and believed she was introduced to Brothman through her friendship with Vago. He stated that Wollan drew \$75 or \$80 per meek. that Vago drew \$100 per week, that Brothman drew \$125 per week and that he, himself. drew \$90 per week.

Barish stated he severed his connections with A. Brothman and Associates about December, 1944, at which time he was owed \$450 in back wages. The separation was through mutual agreement and through a friendly basis as the firm could not support all the partners.

Barish stated that the only contacts with Brothman whom he knew during the above period were Ted Olive, Editor of "Chemical Engineering", Professor Toopman, Professor of Mathematics at Columbia University, one Malgren of Graver Tank Company and one Reynolds of Bridgeport Brass Company. Barish did not recognize the name Frank Reppler. He did not know of any connections of Brothman with Amtorg Trading Corporation and he stated that the only trips made by Brothman during the above period were business trips to Bridgeport, Connecticut, and East Chicago, Illinois. He said none of the other members of the organization travelled except for one trip he, himself made to the Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C., in connection with DDT.

Memorandum to the Director

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Subsequent to Barish's separation from A. Brothman and Associates, the firm secured a "Chinese contract" and also made a report for a South American organization to be used for the reclaiming of fish waste. Barish had no further information concerning these matters and did not know any of the details concerning the establishment of Brothman's laboratory in Elmhurst, Long Island, as that occurred after he left the firm.

Barish said that the firm employed one Bob Townsend, mentioned above as an employee of Chemurgy, one Saul fanschel, and Harry Gold. He first met Gold in 1946 or 1947 when Gold was employed by Brothman. He also recalled an accountant, whose name he could not recall, who drew up the tax returns of Brothman and also those of himself. He knew of no contact of Brothman who was interested in establishing his own laboratory. He said that the photograph of Gold resembled (4) Harry Gold but that he believed Gold was shorter than 5' 6" as shown in the

Barish advised that Brothman had told him that about two years ago he had been interviewed by Bureau Agents and questioned before a Grand Jury. Brothman stated that this arose from the accusations of Elizabeth Bentley. Apparently Barish felt there was no basis for the accusations. He said Brothman was a "radical" and explained this by saying he considered Brothman a "left winger." He declined to further elaborate on these terms. Arrangements have been made for further questioning of Barish after correlation of the results of all of the interviews.

### Analysis of Information Obtained

While it cannot be conclusively stated, it would appear from the information obtained in these interviews, together with the previously known information concerning Gold, that Gold may be identical with Unknown Subject

It will be recalled that information from Elizabeth T. Bentley and from both Brothman and Gold, who were interviewed in 1947 concerning the Bentley information, establishes that in 1941 Brothman was furnishing blue-prints via Gold to Jacob Golos, known Soviet agent. In other words, the origin of the association between Brothman and Gold was an espionage matter, though they did not admit that it was such when interviewed in 1947.

In 1944, according to

By the admissions of Brothman and Gold,

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they continued their association after the furnishing of blueprints allegedly ceased in 1941. Inasumoh as Brothman appears to have been an active agent in 1944, it would seem most reasonable that Gold likewise was still active at that time.

The interviews have developed that Harry Gold learned of Brothman's termination at Chemurgy Design Company by a phone call to New York City, following which he visited New York and was informed by Brothman, in October 1941, of the details of Brothman's business situation. These same details were reported on

has advised that the A. Brothman and Associates Laboratory was organized in May or June 1945. It might also be noted that Brothman has advised that in 1940 he had told Jacob Golos that he needed a laboratory to perform experiments.

The thermal diffusion brochure prepared by Gold and furnished to Brothman is no doubt the document in Brothman's possession at the present time, made available by a highly confidential source. This document, the title of which has been obliterated, concerns itself with the industrial application of thermal diffusion. Gold's description of the brochure he prepared on thermal diffusion was that it would present the practical aspects of the thermal diffusion process when applied to production.

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Momo to the Director

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The Agents who interviewed Harry Gold have observed that there is a definite similarity between the facial appearance of Harry Gold and Joseph Arnold Robbins. A photograph of Robbins had previously been identified by Fuchs with very fair certainty as being his American contact. In addition, the photograph of Robbins was identified by Occar J. Vago as being Harry Gold. This similarity in appearance undoubtedly explains the identification of Robbins previously made by Fuchs.

In connection with Gold's Statement that Brothman introduced him as Frank Kessler in order to prevent the connection between Gold and Brothman being known to Gold's superior at the Pennsylvania Sugar Refining Company, and further because Gold was conducting experiments for Brothman at the Pennsylvania Sugar Refining Company, which he said was an unethical practice, it will be noted that Brothman has stated that while Gold was employed by the Pennsylvania Sugar Refining Company he performed extra experimental work there through the cooperation of his superior. It would not appear that Gold's explanation of the use of the alias is truthful. In this same connection, both Arthur Phineas Weber and Gerhard Wollan have advised that they knew Gold under the name of Frank Keppler. Gold is apparently untruthful in furnishing the name of Kessler.

Miriam Moskowitz furnished information reflecting that Gold had claimed to have a wife and twins, but that she seriously doubted their existence. This is of interest in that the Heinemans recalled the contact of Fuchs mentioning a wife and children.

#### ACTION

The immediate steps being taken, in view of the results to date of the above interviews, are as follows:

(1) The additional interviews with all of the above-mentioned individuals will, of course, be continued until all available information

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is obtained. In connection with the interviews of Brothman and Gold, in particular, all efforts will be made to obtain complete confessions and () signed statements.

- (2) The information will, of course, be utilized in the contemplated interview of Fuchs and new photographs of Gold will be shown to Fuchs. The Philadelphia Office has already been instructed to forward such photographs to the Bureau and to the New York Office where they can be picked up if necessary. All efforts will be made to corroborate the apparent identification of Gold as through the interview with Fuchs (5)
- (5) The new photographs of Harry Gold will also be displayed to the Heinemans to again corroborate the apparent identification. Consideration will also be given to having Robert Heineman view Gold in person if necessary.
- (4) Appropriate laboratory examinations will be conducted concerning the document on thermal diffusion if and when it is obtained from Brothmen in line with his offer to make his books and records available.
- (5) The investigation of Abraham Brothman and A. Brothman and Associates will be intensively carried out in order to develop all possible information concerning the activities of Brothman, the company, and its employees. Complete and intensive investigation will be conducted into the background and activities of Harry Gold. All leads resulting from the detailed results of these interviews will be set out and closely followed.
- (6) The Philadelphia Field Division has been telephonically divised today to establish appropriate coverage in order to insure that Harry Gold will be available for further interview on Friday, next.
- (7) As soon as corroboration of the identification is obtained, the New York Office will be instructed to prepare ismediately the prosecutive summary for referral to the Department for its opinion as to prosecution, bearing in mind that the espionage activities involved were carried out in wortime.

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
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


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
· ALL INFORMATION CONTAINE BROTHMAN SAC Cornelius of Philadelphia called at 12:55 P.M. today and referred to the call of Mr. Hemmrich to ASAC Hinze regarding coverage to be afforded Harry Gold by the Philadelphia Office. Mr. Cornelius explained that Gold is employed as the head of one of the laboratories in the Philadelphia General Hospital. which is a large institution in Philadelphia. He said that Mr. Gold works irregular hours, sometimes being called in on an emergency basis in the middle of the night. Furthermore, because of his position as a ranking official in the laboratory, it necessitates his visiting other sections of the hospital from time to time during the day. To afford complete coverage of Gold, Mr. Cornelius stated, it would mean that Agents would have to be stationed at either end of the corridor to enable them to observe the laboratory where Gold works. To do this and maintain a full-time surveillance without the knowledge of Gold would be impossible. Therefore, Mr. Cornelius said, unless the Bureau instructs to the contrary, a spot check type of surveillance will be maintained. By this he meant the Philadelphia Office would maintain a surveillance on Gold's home in the morning and take him from his residence to work. Similarly, the surveillance would be reinstituted in the late afternoon and early evening for the purpose of observing Gold when he leaves the hospital and covering his activities until he reaches his Mr. Cornelius stated that if this type coverage was not sufficient for the Bureau's purposes, the Philadelphia Office would appreciate being advised. I told Mr. Cornelius that I was not aware of the instructions issued concerning Gold nor was I familiar with the necessity for the surveillance. He was advised that in the event the coverage suggested by him was not sufficient for Bureau purposes he would be informed. 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

GCID was arrested on May 23, 1950 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and charged with Conspiracy to Violate the Espionage Statute.


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

Enclosed herewith for the Bureau is one photograph of GARRETT BIRKHOFF, which was obtained from the Post Intelligence Office at Aberdeen Proving Ground. One copy of this photograph is also being furnished to the Boston Office, and two copies are being furnished to the New York Office.





From the above descriptions it appears that neither RERS nor SPIEGEL met the general physical attributes of the unknown subject with alias and therefore no photographs of them are being submitted for exhibit to FUCHS and the HEINEWANS.

It is noted, however, that referenced New York letter states that it was the President and Chief Engineer of the Chicago Pump Company with whom WEEER and BROTHMAN had dealt in their dealings with the Chicago Pump Company in 1943. Accordingly efforts have been made to identify the Chief Engineer of the Chicago Pump Company during 1943.

Hills - McCanna Company, Chicago, Illinois, who has previously furnished reliable information to the Chicago office and who is acquainted with personnel in the Chicago Pump Company, advised

that the Chief Engineer of the Chicago Pump Company during 1943 and 1944 was one HUGO LEOPOID. This information was verified by a War Department Loyalty and Character report on HUGO FERDINAND (LEOPOID, dated June 5, 1943 which reflected that IEOPOID was "Senior Engineer" at the Chicago Pump Company, Chicago, Illinois commencing on February 1, 1943.

The Chicago indices reflect that HUGO FERDINAND EDWARD IFOPOID, engineer, designer at the Chicago Pump Company, was the subject of an investigation under the character ALIEN ENEMY CONTROL (G); ESPIONAGE (G); FOREIGN FUNDS; SABOTAGE, in which case Des Moines was the office of origin, Bufile number 65-5299, Des Moines file 65-344. This case was closed by the Des Moines office by report, dated April 30, 1945.

For the information of the New York office LEOPOID was a German alien who immigrated to the United States in 1929. On several occasions from 1939 to 1941 he was reported to the F.B.I. as Pro-Nazi and on December 9, 1941 he was apprehended as a German alien and incarcerated at Fort Des Moines, Iowa. On March 15, 1942 he was paroled at the order of the Attorney General and released from custody. His parole was removed in accordance with the Attorney General's order of November 16, 1945 suspending the parole of alien enemies.

A description of HUGO LEOPOLD as of 1941 is as follows:



UPON BEING SHOWN THE PICTURE OF FUCHS, GOLD AGAIN SAID "THAT IS THAT ENGLISH SPY", AND RECALLS SEEING THE PICTURE IN NEWS WEEK WEEK MAGAZINE. HE WAS QUESTIONED

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ONCERNING HIS SUSPICIOUS SOCIATION WITH GOLOS AT GREAT LENGT AND BROTHMAN IN AN ATTEMPT TO GET HIM TO ADMIT CONTACT WITH HEINEMANS AND FUCHS BUT HE STEADFASTLY DENIED THAT HE EVER KNEW OR SAW THEM. GOLD DENIED THAT HE HAD EVER GIVEN ANY MONEY TO BROTHMAN TO AID IN FORMATION OF BROTHMAN-S COMPANY NINETEEN FORTY FOUR AND STATED THAT DURING HIS ACQUAINTANCESHIP WITH BROTHMAN HE GAVE BROTHMAN THE TOTAL OF THREE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS, TWO HUNDRED OF WHICH HAS BEEN REPAID. HE SAID THE BROTHMAN DOES OWE HIM FOUR THOUSAND DOLLARS IN BACK PAY. HE WAS QUESTIONED IN DETAIL CONCERNING POSSIBLE FINANCIAL AID HE MIGHT HAVE GIVEN BROTHMAN, BUT HE DENIED SUCH. SHE RESIDES WITH HER PARENTS AT ONE EIGHT FOUR ONE SOUTH ALDEN, PHILA. IS PRESENTLY MRS. JACKYGLADFELTER ANDAGOLD REFUSED TO SIGN A...

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WAIVER OF SEARCH FOR HIS EFFECTS AT HIS APARTMENT UNLESS SEARCH WAS MADE WHEN HIS FATHER AND BROTHER WERE NOT PRESENT. GOLD HAD TO WORK AT HOSPITAL MORNING OF MAY TWENTY AND STATED HIS FATHER AND BROTHER WORKED HALF DAY THEN. HE OFFERED TO ALLOW AGENTS TO SEARCH HOME, BUT HE COULD NOT ACCOMPANY THEM. THIS OFFICE DID NOT DEEM IT ADVISEABLE TO MAKE SEARCH UNLESS GOLD
