On the afternoon of June 3, 1950, I called SAC Cornelius at Philadelphia and Supervisor Robert Granville at New York to advise them that it will, of course, be necessary to develop further information regarding the activities of ~~Black~~ ~~Black~~ and other contacts of Gold which he has now identified, apart from the Fuchs matter, before we turn reports on the activities of these contacts and their identification by Gold over to the Department. I suggested that they keep this in mind in connection with any reports furnished to the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York or in connection with any conversations that the Philadelphia Office might have with Judge McGranery or other officials in Philadelphia.

I also advised Mr. Cornelius that the New York Office has located a photograph of Greenglass and an agent from New York is bringing a photograph to Philadelphia this afternoon. Mr. Cornelius advised that the agents are continuing their interview with Gold this afternoon.

I talked with SAC Cornelius on the morning of June 2. I told him that it was imperative that the Philadelphia Office very closely follow developments in the present interviews with Gold and immediately set out the necessary leads in order to properly develop the information being furnished by Gold regarding his espionage contacts.

I instructed that a picture of Thomas L. Black be obtained immediately and furnished to the Bureau, New York and Baltimore in order that it can be used in the proposed interview with Whittaker Chambers whom Black said he knew in espionage work. Cornelius advised that Newark has stated they have a picture of Black available and that he will see to it that the pictures are forwarded today.

I told Mr. Cornelius to get instructions out to the Pittsburgh Office to have Howard Gochenaur identified and located and he stated this would be done today. I asked him what had been done to obtain information from our Albuquerque Office which would lead to identifying the unknown soldier who was connected with Gold in espionage activities. He said a teletype had been sent out on the night of June 1 to obtain maps of the city of Albuquerque. I told Mr. Cornelius in view of information which Gold has now furnished describing the location of the house in question that he should immediately call Albuquerque, arrange to have immediate inquiries made and photographs taken in order that the unknown soldier can be identified as rapidly as possible.

Mr. Cornelius informed me that Baltimore has stated that the Social Security records reflect that Al Slack, in September, 1949, was employed by the Sundure Paint Corporation, 619 West Fayette Street, Syracuse. I instructed that he immediately call the Albany Office and furnish the information to them and instruct them to discreetly locate and place Slack under surveillance.

I told Mr. Cornelius to talk to the Agents handling the interview and to impress upon them the possibility that Gold may have been involved in espionage later than 1946. I pointed out the importance of developing, if possible, any information which would indicate more recent espionage activities on his part.

SAC Wyly called from Albuquerque. He referred to the request from the Philadelphia Office to attempt to identify the unknown soldier described by Gold as being involved in espionage with him in September, 1945. He stated that inquiries have developed that the individual in question is in all probability one David Greenglass, whose wife's first name was Ruth, who lived at 207 North High Street, Albuquerque. Greenglass was in the Army, stationed at Los Alamos, and came to Albuquerque to spend week-ends. He stopped at this address from March, 1945, until March of 1946.

SAC Cornelius in Philadelphia was advised, that our files are presently being searched and Liaison is attempting to obtain from the Military files information regarding David Greenglass.

(45) In our investigation to identify Unsub, alias [REDACTED] information was developed regarding one David Greenglass, ASN 32882473, who was stationed at Los Alamos as Technician Fifth Grade. He was on furlough from December 30, 1944, to January 20, 1945. He was born on March 3, 1922, in New York City. His father was Russian, his mother was Austrian. The file review is continuing.

HARRY GOLD, WAS., ESPIONAGE - R. EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS INTERVIEWED MAY TWENTY TWO, LAST BY BUREAU REPRESENTATIVES AT WHICH TIME HE ADVISED THAT AT THE FIRST MEETING HIS AMERICAN CONTACT HAD A GLOVE. FURTHER, THAT FUCHS HAD SOME OTHER SIGNAL LIKE NEWSPAPER OR SOME WORDS, DETAILS OF WHICH HE HAS FORGOTTEN, BUT CONCLUDED BY STATING QUOTE CAN YOU TELL ME HOW TO GO TO GRAND CENTRAL STATION? UNQUOTE. THEN CONTACT TO REPLY IN UNUSUAL, NOT ENTIRELY RESPONSIVE MANNER, THEN FUCHS TO RESPOND IN COMPLETELY ABSURD MANNER AS PER INSTRUCTIONS FROM GIRL IN BANBURY. FUCHS STATED THAT THE FIRST CONTACT PROBABLY WAS AROUND CHRISTMAS, WITHIN ONE MONTH AFTER HIS ARRIVAL, ON HENRY STREET NEAR MARKET, LOWER EAST SIDE. HE STATED THAT HE AND THE CONTACT WALKED AROUND FOR ABOUT TWENTY MINUTES.

NOTHING PASSED BY FUCHS ON THE FIRST MEETING. HE STATED THAT THEY MET A TOTAL OF FIVE MEETINGS, MAYBE ONE OR TWO MORE IN NEW YORK. ANOTHER MEETING TOOK PLACE NEAR QUEENSBORO BRIDGE ON STREET. THEY WALKED UNDER THIS BRIDGE ON FIRST AVENUE DURING THE CONTACT. ANOTHER MEETING TOOK PLACE ON A STREET NEAR THE ENTRANCE TO A SUBWAY STATION QUOTE MUSEUM

UNQUOTE STOP, INDEPENDENT SUBWAY LINE, CENTRAL PARK WEST. ANOTHER COPIES DESTROYED

R 47 MEETING TOOK PLACE IN THE BRONX NEAR A CINEMA, POSSIBLY ON GRAND

CONCOURSE, NEAR ONE HUNDRED FIFTY NINTH OR ONE HUNDRED SIXTY FIRST

STREET. ANOTHER MEETING WAS ARRANGED FOR IN BROOKLYN, POSSIBLY NEAR

BOBO HALL, TALL BUILDINGS AND HEAVY TRAFFIC IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD.

The Attorney General, J. Howard McGrath, and J. Edgar Hoover, Director of the FBI, announced the arrest of Harry Gold, 39, by FBI Agents in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, today on charges of espionage.

J. Edgar Hoover, Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation, in discussing the background of the case stated that Dr. Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs turned over secrets of the atomic bomb to Harry Gold in the United States. Dr. Fuchs was arrested in England on February 2, 1950, and confessed to turning over highly restricted data on the development of the atomic bomb for the use of the Soviet Union to an unidentified contact in the United States. Fuchs was first identified by the FBI and full details were furnished to British security authorities to whom Fuchs made a full confession.

Harry Gold has admitted his contacts with Dr. Fuchs and has given a detailed account of his activities. Gold was used over a period of time by the Soviet Intelligence Service as an intermediary to make important contacts.

Early in 1944, Gold first met Dr. Fuchs on the East Side of New York. Other meetings were held in Brooklyn, the Bronx, Manhattan, and Queens.

Gold later met Fuchs in Cambridge, Massachusetts, at which time he received both written and oral information which Fuchs provided as a result of his work at Los Alamos, New Mexico.

In 1945, Gold again met Fuchs in Santa Fe and Fuchs turned over information to Gold.

The last meeting Gold had with Fuchs occurred in September, 1945.

As an explanation for his activities, Gold has advised FBI Agents that "I thought that I would be helping a nation whose final aims I approved, along the road to industrial strength. Particularly was I taken with the idea that whatever I did would go to help make living conditions far more advanced along the road as we know them here in the United States." Gold also stated that he "felt that as an ally I was only helping the Soviet Union obtain certain information that I thought it was entitled to."

Gold will be arraigned at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, today, based upon a complaint filed before the United States Commissioner for the Eastern District of New York, charging violation of Section 34, Title 50, U. S. Code.

Background

Harry Gold

Harry Gold was born on December 12, 1910 in Switzerland. His parents were both born in Russia. He came to the United States in 1914 with his parents and claims derivative citizenship in the United States as a result of the naturalization of his parents at which time the family name of Golodnitsky was changed to Gold.

Gold attended night school at the Drexel Institute in Philadelphia, the University of Pennsylvania and Columbia University while employed in a laboratory in Philadelphia. From 1938 to 1940 he attended Xavier University, Cincinnati, Ohio where he received a Bachelor of Science degree Summa Cum Laude in June 1940.

Gold was associated with a New York laboratory from 1946 to 1948 and prior to that spent considerable time in New York City.

At the time of his arrest Gold was engaged in chemical research in connection with serious cardiac cases in a Philadelphia Hospital.

He is single and resides at 6829 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Reference is made to New York City teletype dated May 27, 1950, which suggested that all pertinent material regarding the case be forwarded to New York City for inclusion in the prosecutive summary report.

The Department of Justice has been furnished with information regarding the technical information on atomic energy which Fuchs has admitted transmitting to Gold and the opinion of the Department has been solicited as to which information must be used to obtain an indictment and as to which information will be essential for use in a trial. When the Department renders its opinion, the Atomic Energy Commission will be consulted regarding clearance for the disclosure of the information.

New York City will be advised if any of the technical information on atomic energy should be included in the prosecutive summary.

The names of the appropriate officials of the Atomic Energy Commission or the Manhattan Engineer District who can introduce the technical atomic information into evidence if it is cleared by the Atomic Energy Commission will also be furnished to New York City.

A list of documents furnished by Fuchs to Gold has been furnished to the Atomic Energy Commission for their aid in identifying the information.

In view of the fact that Gold has stated that he did not look at the information Fuchs gave him except on one occasion, the Atomic Energy Commission will not be contacted to obtain clearance for the exhibition of Atomic Energy Commission documents to Gold.

Philadelphia should ask Gold if he believes he could recognize any AEC documents if they were exhibited to him. If he indicates that he could identify any documents, further consideration will be given this request.

The names of the individuals who worked in Fuchs' superior's during 1944 and 1945 and who could testify as to the dates, places, and nature of work done by Fuchs will be obtained from the Atomic Energy Commission at the time the Commission is contacted regarding clearance of the technical information on atomic energy.

Mr. McGuire was requested telephonically this morning by Mr. Parker of Time and Life magazine as to whether it would be possible to furnish Life with a copy of the artist's conception or drawing the Bureau had made on the description obtained from Dr. Fuchs of the person with whom he had made his contacts with in turning over atomic bomb details, which could be compared with the face photograph of subject Harry Gold. He also asked for a photograph of the mass of files pertaining to Harry Gold which could be placed on top of a desk to give some idea of the voluminous information in the Bureau's possession. Parker stated, of course, they did not want to show anything inside the files but merely a bulk file type of picture. He also asked advice as to where Gold's parents were naturalized and how the FBI knew Gold attended Columbia University since Columbia University now states he never received a degree from Columbia nor did they know of his ever having studied there. Mr. McGuire told Mr. Parker that his request would be made known to the Director and we would advise him.

Dean Schedler subsequently called Mr. McGuire advising that Mr. Parker had asked him the identical questions above and that he, Schedler, was advising Parker that Gold's parents were naturalized in Philadelphia on June 6, 1922, and that as far as Columbia University was concerned that Gold had said he had attended Columbia University and that was his statement.

Mr. McGuire told Schedler that the question of the drawing of Gold and the comparison with Gold's photograph as well as the question of photographing a mass of files would be handled over here.

Enclosed for the Philadelphia Office are photographs of VLADIMIR SERGEEVICH PRAVDIN and OLGA BORISOVNA PRAVDINA which were to be displayed to HARRY GOLD. It is believed that VLADIMIR PRAVDIN might possibly be identical with unknown subject JOHN, named by HARRY GOLD inasmuch as PRAVDIN has a daughter by the name of VICTORIA. GOLD has stated that his contact, JOHN, had a daughter named VICTORIA who was age 2 in 1944.

Investigation is continuing here in an endeavor to locate information to establish the age of PRAVDIN's daughter, VICTORIA in 1944. It is suggested that the New York Office may desire to review the PRAVDIN file in an effort to establish whether or not PRAVDIN may be identical with the unknown subject, JOHN. It is further suggested that in reviewing the New York PRAVDIN file, observations be made to establish whether or not PRAVDIN was in New York at the time of GOLD's contacts with JOHN.

SAC Cornelius called from Philadelphia at 5:20 P.M. He advised that he had just returned from Judge McGranery's chambers. He said that John B. M. Hamilton has been appointed and accepted as Gold's attorney. Hamilton has an associate who will assist in the case, one Augustus S. Ballard.

Hamilton stated to Mr. Cornelius that he wants the FBI to continue interviews with Gold and tentative arrangements were made to continue the interview on the morning of June 2.

Hamilton was asked regarding any objections he had to the completion of the search of Gold's house and Hamilton stated that he would get in touch with Joseph Gold and would advise Mr. Cornelius on the night of June 1 regarding arrangements for a further search.

Harry Gold indicated during the conference in chambers that he wanted to talk briefly with Agent Scott Miller, and Miller was able to talk with Gold for about four minutes at that time. This conversation was over the hearing of Gold's counsel.

Gold stated that he wanted to furnish information regarding three of his espionage contacts. He furnished information as follows:

(1) Al Slack. Gold stated he received information from Slack regularly and paid him regularly upon delivery. He is the individual previously mentioned by Gold as being "Martin" whom he had contacted in Rochester. He said that information was not correct and that actually Al Slack knew him, Gold, as "Martin." He said he contacted Slack six or seven times at various places; first at Rochester while Slack was with Eastman Kodak, and later in Tennessee where Slack worked for the Holston Ordnance Works at Kingsport, Tennessee, and later at Oak Ridge, Tennessee. While at Kingsport and Oak Ridge, Gold received information from Slack regarding explosives. He was in contact with Slack from 1941 to 1943 and possibly later.

(2) A soldier, non-commissioned, married, no children (name not now recalled.) Gold stated that he contacted this individual at Albuquerque, New Mexico, on the trip to Santa Fe, when he met Fuchs in September of 1945, when he, Gold, stayed at the Hilton Hotel. He picked up information from this soldier described by Gold as "general information on installation." He states that if supplied with a map of Albuquerque, New Mexico, he can show where this soldier lived. He paid the soldier \$500 for the information obtained.

(3) Thomas L. Black. This individual was identified by Gold as the man who introduced him to Paul Smith in 1936 when Gold originally started Soviet espionage activities. Gold states that Black went into Soviet espionage in 1935. Gold thinks that Black's activities were later diverted to "Trotsky activities for the Russians."

Mr. Cornelius advised that Black's name came into the instant investigation of Gold when the Philadelphia Office was originally checking into Gold's background. Information was received that Black and Gold had been seen together frequently during the past weeks and as of May 9, an address was obtained for Black in New Jersey. The Newark Office endeavored to obtain information regarding him there but was unsuccessful. The Philadelphia Office later learned that Black was living in Philadelphia, although he had furnished an address in New Jersey. Black was interviewed by the Philadelphia Office on May 31 regarding his knowledge of Gold. Black stated that he is a consulting chemist for the Charles W. Berg Laboratories, 1827 N. 5th Street, and he resides at 1929 N. 6th Street, Philadelphia, which he described as a rooming house. He said he has known Gold since 1933, that he is a fine upstanding individual, a chemist, that he never had any reason to doubt Gold's loyalty. Black admitted that he was a member of the Communist Party from 1933 to about 1936 or 1937 in Jersey City, N.J. He said he belonged to one of the three sections there and was well acquainted with the Party members. He said that he first became acquainted with Gold when Gold took over a job which he, Black, had in the Holbrook Manufacturing Company in Jersey City, and while breaking Gold in on the job, he got acquainted with him. He said Gold never indicated any interest in CP activities and he has no information that Gold was a CP member.

During the year 1935 he met Gold frequently and they became quite good friends. After 1935 and until about 1945 he and Gold had scattered meetings and he renewed acquaintance with Gold in 1945 in Philadelphia when he became acquainted with Gold's brother and family.

Black had information regarding only one trip which Gold took which he thinks was in September or October, 1945. He states he did not know where Gold went but he thought he went to New York to the Horman Equipment Company. At the completion of the interview Black advised the Agents that he could not supply more specific information, that he would be willing to testify regarding his knowledge of Gold, but requested that his CP activities not be divulged.

Inquiries which were made at the Franklin Institute, which is a professional society, the library of which is frequently used by Black, resulted in information being developed that Black had an intense interest in British patents.

ACTION:

I told Mr. Cornelius that he should immediately arrange to interview Gold further tonight if this is possible. I further told him that physical surveillance coverage should be instituted on Thomas L. Black immediately.

I instructed that a teletype setting forth details regarding these developments be furnished immediately to the Bureau and other interested offices in order that immediate investigation might be instituted to verify the information furnished by Gold.

I instructed Cornelius to advise by telephone of any developments in this matter.

This afternoon Special Agent T. Scott Miller, who is interviewing Harry Gold, called from Philadelphia to advise that the recent photograph forwarded by the New York Office of David Greenglass had been shown to Gold, together with some 1940 photographs of Greenglass at the time of his graduation from school. Gold said that there were many similarities between the photographs of Greenglass and the unknown soldier at Albuquerque, but he could not say positively that he was the same individual. He pointed out that Greenglass is a great deal heavier than the unknown soldier. Philadelphia is continuing appropriate checks on this.

Agent Miller advises that attorneys Hamilton and Ballard came to Holmesburg Prison to talk to Gold as a result of which the Agents discontinued their interview. However, just prior to the appearance of Hamilton and Ballard, Gold was asked if he were holding out on anything further. Agent Miller advised that interviewing Gold was like squeezing a lemon; there was always a drop or two left. Gold stated that he had held out on some information and in the few minutes before Hamilton and Ballard interviewed Gold, the subject told the Agents as follows. This information will be further developed in additional interviews with Gold.

(1) Gold said he was active as a Soviet agent from 1938 to 1940, when he was going to Xavier College in Cincinnati. (This is contrary to his previous statements.) He stated he was handled by unknown subject "Fred" and was in contact with an individual by the name of Ben Smilg at Wright Field, Dayton, Ohio, in an attempt to have Smilg furnish him information. He said Smilg did not give him information. However, in 1940, unsub "Sam" sent him back to Dayton, at which time Gold tried to blackmail Smilg into giving him information.

(2) Gold now says he was recontacted by unsub "John" after the period he previously gave the Agents.

(3) Gold said that in November, 1949, he was contacted by an unknown Russian whose purpose was to find out how much Gold had told the Federal Grand Jury in 1947. The Russian specifically asked if Gold had given information to the Grand Jury regarding Fuchs and whether any questions were asked regarding Fuchs. Gold thinks he might be able to identify this unknown Russian if a photograph is shown to him.

(4) Gold said that he never knew Jacob Golos; that the reason he testified that he knew Golos before the Grand Jury and so informed Agents on previous occasions was because Abraham Brothman contacted Gold after Agents had interviewed Brothman in 1947 and before the Agents had interviewed Gold. Brothman told Gold that "that woman must have spilled her guts," referring to Elizabeth Bentley. Brothman gave Gold the name of Golos and Helen and built up the story with Gold that Gold had taken over the contact with Brothman from Helen.

(5) Gold said that when he went to Fuchs' home on 155th Street, he took a book entitled "Joseph and His Brothers," by Thomas Mann. On the inside cover he had

written "K. V. Fuchs, 128 West 77th Street." He was going to use this book as an excuse for calling at Fuchs' residence in the event he had to, by stating that he had found the book and was returning it to the owner. Gold thinks he still has the book but stated that when he brought the book back to his home, he took a razor and scratched out the name and address. The Agents are attempting to get the book and will send it to the Laboratory.

Mr. Miller advised that in the few minutes available to the Agents before Hamilton and Ballard talked to Gold, this was all the information they could get but they will amplify on the information when they get back to interview Gold.

SAC Cornelius called on the afternoon of June 6 with reference to a report which is being prepared by the Philadelphia Office setting forth in detail information pertinent to the prosecution of Gold, which was not included in Special Agent Jensen's first report in this matter. [REDACTED] I told him that this information should go in the report and that the report should be transmitted to the Bureau calling attention to the fact that this information in the report might jeopardize the investigative operation of the New York Office, with a carbon copy to New York with instructions that they hold dissemination to the U. S. Attorney in abeyance pending instructions to the Bureau.

He requested advice as to whether passwords used between Fuchs and Gold should be set forth in the report and I told him yes. He said the report would be prepared and would be out of the Philadelphia Office by the night of June 7.
