The files of the Passport Office, United States Department of State reflect that on November 18, 1960, passport number 126 9164, issued to Helen Levitov Sobell on November 24, 1958, was renewed at New York City to be valid for a period of four years from the date of issue.

The application was dated November 15, 1960, and contained the following information:

Mrs. Sobell's address was 30 Charlton Street, New York City. The person she wanted notified in the event of death or accident was Rose Levitov, her mother, at 1079 Ruatan Street, Silver Spring, Maryland.

She stated that she planned to depart New York City about January 5, 1961, by Pan American Jet for three-weeks in England, France and Italy, as a tourist. She said she was not travelling on an organized tour. She stated she expected to take another trip abroad within 2 years.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Pertinent reports and memoranda regarding the subject have been furnished to your Department and the Central Intelligence Agency previously.

According to the records of the Passport Office of your Department, subject's Passport Number 1289164 was renewed at New York City on November 18, 1960. At that time subject planned to depart from New York on January 5, 1961, for a three-week trip which would include visits in England, France and Italy for tourist purposes. She intended to travel via Pan American World Airways jet.

This matter has been referred to the Legal Attaches at London, Paris and Rome, so that appropriate security services can be alerted to subject's contemplated travel.

For Legal Attaches' information, subject's name is included in the Security Index. She is the wife of Morton Sobell, who was convicted along with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg on charges of having conspired to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. Morton Sobell is currently serving a 30-year prison sentence at the Atlanta Federal Penitentiary. Since his conviction and imprisonment, subject has been working and agitating full time for his release or for a new trial. In this connection, she has traveled far and wide and has received the full cooperation of the Communist Party in various fund-raising and speaking tours. It is possible that she will attempt to propagandize on behalf of her husband, in the event she does travel abroad. She is described as follows: born March 13, 1918, Washington, D. C.; height, five feet, three inches; to five feet, four inches; weight, 125 to 130; hair, dark brown; eyes, brown; unkempt appearance.

You should alert your sources regarding the subject's anticipated travel and you may furnish them with the above information regarding her activities on behalf of her husband. In the event you should receive information that Sobell plans travel in countries other than those mentioned above, the Central Intelligence Agency locally and/or appropriate Legal Attaches should be immediately notified.

New York should achieve the necessary coverage so that subject's actual departure will be verified. Submit pertinent information regarding this and any other aspects of her travel plans in letterhead memorandum.

NOTE ON YELLOW: New York was previously alerted to subject's intended travel plans, and is currently conducting investigation to verify same. State and CIA are in possession of all pertinent information regarding the subject.
