[REDACTED] advised that the name of HELEN GROWING and [REDACTED] at 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, VIRGINIA, is listed on the indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. It is believed that the persons above referred to are the subject of this case and her husband.

[REDACTED] know [REDACTED] activity is known to the Bureau, advised that on the official records of the Communist Party for the District of Columbia for 1943 the name of subject appears as a member of the Party and as a Government worker.

[redacted] also advised that during April of 1943 the name of subject and her husband was mentioned in a discussion between two prominent members of the Communist Party of the District of Columbia.

[REDACTED] whose identity is known to the Bureau; advised a member of the Party that he wished to get in touch with [REDACTED]

The records of Civil Service Commission reflect an application signed by HELEN L. On this application she stated she was born at Washington, D.C. March 3, 1918 and that she attended the McKinley

Technical High School from 1931 to 1936 and at the Wilson Teachers College at Washington, D.C., from 1934 to 1939, where she received a B.S. Degree. Since 1940 she has taught in the Public Schools of Arlington, Virginia. The parents were listed as ALFRED K. VITTEK, Father, at 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia, born in Russia in 1885 and ROSE KETTER, Mother, 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia, born in Russia in 1889.

Under the reference listed on the application was the name of [REDACTED]

It will be noted that [REDACTED] has been reported to the Washington Field Division as a member of the Communist Party for many years and active in the International Workers Order.

The files of the Bureau of Standards which were made available by [REDACTED] at the Personnel Office reflect that subject has been a player at the Bureau of Standards since January 2, 1942. Subject entered on duty as a Laboratory Apprentice at \$1260.00 per annum. On July 24, 1942, she was promoted to Assistant Physical Science aide, \$1620 per annum and on December 24, 1942, she was promoted to Junior Physicist at \$2,000. per annum.

In view of the fact that it has been ascertained that subject is employed by the United States Government, this case is being closed and no further investigation is being conducted unless advised to do so by the Bureau.

SYNOPSIS OF CASE:

HELEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ, 2136 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia, a Government Employee since January 2, 1942, is presently employed as a Junior Physicist, Optics Division, National Bureau of Standards, Department of Commerce. Information has been received that she is associated with the Communist Party. Reliable confidential informants furnished information relating to official records of the Communist Party reflecting that the name of HELEN GUREWITZ appears therein.

[REDACTED] Mrs. Helen, formerly known as GUREWITZ, is Secretary of the Communist Political Association, formal successor to the Communist Party. She has associated with known members of the Communist Party, according to the informants. Former instructors of Mrs. GUREWITZ at Wilson Teachers College describe her as active in student discussion groups. They had no information regarding her possible membership in the Communist Party. Fellow workers have no information regarding her purported connection with the Communist Party. They say her work is performed satisfactorily. Neighborhood investigation reflects no derogatory information regarding her. In signed statement HELEN GUREWITZ denied membership in or participation in the activities of the Communist Party or the Communist Political Association, or that she has advocated the principles of the Communist Party.

DETAILS:

The title of this report has been marked changed in order that the name of HELEN LEVITTE GURENITZ may be dropped from the title. A review of Mrs. GURENITZ' file at the National Bureau of Standards reflects that the correct spelling of her name is HELEN LEVITOV GURENITZ, as shown in the title. The name of HELEN GURENITZ is added to the title in view of the use of that name by Informants of this office.

DETAILS AT WASHINGTON, D. C.I. PERSONAL HISTORY

A. A check of the records of the Civil Service Commission 7th and G Streets, N. W., reflected that HELEN LEVITOV GURENITZ was born March 3, 1918, at Washington, D. C. She attended the McKinley Technical High School from 1931 to 1934 and the Wilson Teachers College at Washington, D. C. from 1934 to 1939. She received a BS Degree from the latter institution in 1939. Her parents were listed as MAX LEVITOV, 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia, and ROSE ETIENNE LEVITOV of the same address. According to this record her father was born in Russia in 1885 and her mother was born in Russia in 1889. HELEN LEVITOV GURENITZ was married on February 21, 1938 to CLARENCE DARROW GURENITZ. A check of the records at the Personnel Office of the Bureau of Standards reflected that Mrs. GURENITZ presently resides at 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia.

B. The personnel records at the Bureau of Standards also reflected that Mrs. GURENITZ was employed as a salesgirl and buyer from September, 1940, to September, 1941, at the New York Bargain House, 3135 M Street, N. W., which store was owned by J. GURENITZ, 3214 18th Street, N. W. As a matter of possible interest, it is noted that J. GURENITZ is the father-in-law of HELEN LEVITOV GURENITZ.

Mrs. GURENITZ entered on duty January 2, 1942, as an Under-Laboratory Apprentice in the Optics Division of the Bureau of Standards at a salary of \$1260.00 per annum. On July 24, 1942, she was promoted to Assistant Physical Science Aid (Physics) at a salary of \$1620.00 per annum. On December 24, 1942, she was promoted to Junior Physicist (Optics) at a salary of \$2000.00 per annum and on July 1, 1944, she was given a within grade raise in salary to \$2100.00 per annum.

II. BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION

Information was received from a confidential informant, hereinafter designated as [REDACTED] that the name of HELEN GURENITZ, identified therein as a Government Employee at the Bureau of Standards, appeared in organizational memorandums in the possession of a known member of the Communist Party.

III. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

[redacted] advised that he had observed organizational references [redacted] of a known member of the Communist Party [redacted]. b7c

[redacted] further advised that the name of EKLEN GUREWITZ, [redacted] herein as a Government Employee at the Bureau of Standards, appeared in the memorandum mentioned above. b7c

It is noted that CLARENCE DARROW GUREWITZ, whose nick name is "CASEY", is the husband of EKLEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ, and he is Secretary of the Communist Political Association in the District of Columbia, according to the current letterhead of that organization. CASEY GUREWITZ has been known as an active leader in the affairs of the Communist Party in the District of Columbia for several years.

[redacted] advised that the name EULIA TUNICK [redacted] appeared in the active indices of the Washington Chapter of the American Peace Mobilization. As a matter of possible interest the same informant advised that the name CLARENCE GUREWITZ appeared likewise in the active indices of the Washington Chapter of the American Peace Mobilization, and it is believed that this individual is identical with the husband of EKLEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ. It is also noted that the American Peace Mobilization is further described as that organization which picketed the White House for several days, discontinuing this activity on the day Germany invaded Russia. The name of this organization was then changed to the American Peoples Mobilization. b7c

[redacted] provided information that the names EKLEN GUREWITZ and CLARENCE GUREWITZ, 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia, were listed in the indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. The Washington Committee for Democratic Action is further described as the successor organization to the American Peoples Mobilization. b7c

that in May, 1944, the Informant observed the official membership records of the Communist Party of the District of Columbia and the name of HELEN GUREVITZ, 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia, appears therein with the names of other individuals designated therein and by the Informant as connected with the White Collar Workers Branch No. 12 of the Communist Party.

an instructor at the Wilson Teachers College, who is acquainted with Mrs. GUREVITZ and regards the latter on the basis of her college activities.

the Bureau of Standards, provided substantially the same information as that provided by [redacted]. This Informant stated that Mrs. GURENITZ has done a high grade of work for the Bureau of Standards, having recently published a technical article in a Bureau publication.

[redacted] provided substantially the same information as provided by [redacted]

[redacted] provided substantially the same information as that provided in the interviews with [redacted]

[redacted] advised that she has known the latter for about ten years. She stated that she did not know Mrs. GURENITZ very well, but that she knew of nothing regarding her that would indicate that she is not loyal to this country. [redacted] were contacted. All of them stated that they had known Mrs. GURENITZ casually for several years, and that they regarded her as a loyal citizen. They furnished no derogatory information regarding her.

[redacted] have advised that meetings were held on numerous occasions in the home at this address while Mrs. GURENITZ resided there.

IV. INTERVIEW WITH EMPLOYEE

On November 3, 1944, EKLEN LEVITOW GURENITZ was afforded an interview at the Washington Field Office. The stenographic notes of the interview were transcribed and on November 8, 1944, she returned to the Washington Field Office, at which time she read the statement, stated it was correct, signed the second page and initialed the first page. The original copy of this statement is being retained in the files of the Washington Field Office. Her statement is as follows:

Interview with Mrs. EILEEN LEVITOV GUREVITZ at the Washington Field Office, Federal Bureau of Investigation, November 3, 1944, in the presence of Special Agent LOUIS J. LANE and Stenographer PHILLIS R. THOMPSON, of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Questions by Agent LANE.

Mr. LANE: Mrs. GUREVITZ, we have requested your voluntary appearance here today, not for the purpose of conducting a hearing but in order that you may answer such questions concerning an investigation currently being made by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and to enable you to make such comments as you might wish to make concerning this inquiry. You may decline to answer any questions propounded to you. As you may be aware, the Federal Bureau of Investigation is required by Presidential Directive to investigate matters coming within the purview of Public Law No. 252, 76th Congress. This law prohibits membership on the part of any Federal employee in a political party or organization which advocates the overthrow of our constitutional form of government in the United States. A copy of the report of this investigation, which will include your statement, will be furnished the Interdepartmental Committee on Employee Investigations and the agency by which you are employed. After the notes of the interview have been transcribed you will be given an opportunity to read them and make such changes as you may desire.

In order that the statements made by you may have particular credence, you will be placed under oath if you have no objection.

Will you please stand and raise your right hand. Do you solemnly swear to tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?

Q. Are you a member of any organization which you have reason to believe may be controlled by or its policies dictated by a foreign government?
A. No.

Q. Do you presently advocate or have you ever advocated any change in the constitutional form of government which we have in the United States.
A. No.

Q. Mrs. GUREVITZ, do you desire to relate the names of organizations, other than labor unions or churches, in which you presently hold membership?
A. I don't believe there are any such. There are no such. I am chairman of a Red Cross knitting group but would that fall in that category?

Mr. LUCE: Well, you can just list any organizations you desire.
A. That would be the only thing.

Q. Mrs. GUREVITZ, is there anything further that you would like to say which you feel may be pertinent to this inquiry and which may be necessary to fully clarify the circumstances surrounding it? Any voluntary statement on your part that you would like to make will be included.
A. I don't know of anything else pertinent to this that I might have to say.

On page 8 of the report, [redacted] reported as having stated he observed an organizational memorandum containing the name Helen Gurewitz identified as a government employee at the Bureau of Standards, in the possession of a known member of the Communist Party. The Informant observed the name and the description in the records mentioned and there is no doubt about the accuracy of the Informant's statement. This Bureau, of course, cannot vouch for the accuracy of the records themselves.

In the same report, [redacted] reported as stating that the name Helen Gurewitz appeared in the files of the Washington chapter of the American Peace Mobilization. Again there is no doubt about the accuracy of the Informant's statement, but as in the case of the records of the Communist Party, this Bureau cannot vouch for the accuracy of the records of the American Peace Mobilization. It is further pointed out that these informants are of such a nature that no further additional information concerning the Party membership could be ascertained from them.

It is noted, however, that [redacted] b7D whose identity is known to the Bureau and who is regarded as highly reliable, has advised this office that subject is not at the present time a member of the open Communist Party membership or the White Collar units. This informant also advised that subject's husband is now one of the leading members of the Communist Party in Washington, D. C.

The indices of the Washington Field Division failed to reflect any further activity on the part of the subject in the Communist Party.

The records of the Reeves Instrument Company also reflect she attended Tennessee Polytechnic Institute from March 1946 to June 1947. These same records indicated she had visited Mexico in July 1938 and Canada in July 1946, in each instance as a tourist.

While she and her husband were employed at the Reeves Instrument Company, they resided at 164-17 73d Avenue, Flushing, New York.

On June 22, 1950, she and her husband and daughter flew to Mexico City. On August 17, 1950, her husband was deported from Mexico and on August 18, 1950, he was arrested by Bureau agents at Laredo, Texas. Thereafter her home at 164-17 73d Avenue was sold and she resided with LOUIS and ROSE GORELL, parents of her husband, at 240 Davison Avenue, Bronx, New York. In the Spring of 1952, she moved to 506 West 135th Street, New York City.

The records of the Federal House of Detention reflect that she gave this address as late as November 25, 1952.

The writer observed this address and it is a large tenement house, six stories high and has been converted into a rooming house.

The records of the Federal House of Detention reflected that at one time the subject indicated she lived in Apartment 3 at the above address.

[REDACTED] fact that she has been traveling throughout the country making speeches in connection with the NCSJRC; the latter organization is being considered as her employer. The address of this committee is 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York City. b7D

This committee was formed after a series of articles appeared in the newspaper, "the National Guardian" commencing in August 1951. These articles were written by WILLIAM A. REUBEN.

On January 1, 1952, the formation of the committee was announced to the press with JOSEPH BRAVIN as Chairman and DAVID ALMAN as Executive Secretary. The stated purposes of this committee were to secure funds to prosecute the appeal of the ROSENBERGS and SOBELL, to secure new trials for them, or to secure clemency for them.

It is noted that the ROSENBERGS were legally executed in the electric chair at Sing Sing Prison, New York, on June 19, 1953.

The 1949 Report of a California Committee on Un-American Activities cited the "National Guardian" as a "publication launched in New York City in 1946, aiming at national circulation which they found to be from its inception notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management and content." (1949 Report of California Senate Fact-finding Committee on Un-American Activities, page 394).

III. COMMUNIST PARTY AFFILIATION

[REDACTED] of known reliability, advised that he had observed an organizational memorandum in the possession of a known member of the Communist Party.

[REDACTED] advised that the name of HELEN GUREWITZ, identified therein as a government employee at the Bureau of Standards, appeared in the memorandum above mentioned.

CLARENCE DARRON GUREWITZ, former husband of subject and whose nickname is "CASEY", was the secretary of the Communist Political Association in the District of Columbia, according to a letterhead of such organization in the year 1944.

The Communist Party is an organization designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 10450.

Concerning the Communist Political Association, the following appears in a booklet entitled "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, May 14, 1951:

"1. Cited as a 'subversive,' 'Communist' organization which sought to alter the form of government of the United States by unconstitutional means. (Attorney General Tom Clark, letter to Loyalty Review Board, released September 21, 1948.)

"2. * * * after assuming the name of the Communist Political Association on May 20-23, 1944, for strategic reasons the party resumed the name of the Communist Party of the United States on July 26-28, 1945. (Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities, Report No. 209, April 1, 1947, p. 29.)"

[REDACTED] of known reliability, advised that the name HELEN GUREWITZ appeared in the active indices of the Washington Chapter of the American Peace Mobilization. Informant further advised that the name CLARENCE GUREWITZ likewise appeared in the above mentioned indices. The name of this organization was later changed to the American Peoples Mobilization after Germany invaded Russia June 21, 1941.

Regarding the American Peace Mobilization, the following is contained in the "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, May 14, 1951:

"1. Cited as subversive and Communist." (Attorney General Tom Clark, letters to Loyalty Review Board, released December 4, 1947, and September 21, 1948.)

"2. 'Formed in the summer of 1940 under the auspices of the Communist Party and the Young Communist League as a 'front' organization designed to mold American opinion against participation in the war against Germany. * * * The most conspicuous activity of American Peace Mobilization was the picketing of the White House, which began in April, 1941, in protest against lend-lease and the entire national defense program * * * on the afternoon of June 21, 1941, he (Frederick V. Field, national secretary) suddenly called off the picket line around the White House.' (Attorney General Francis Biddle, Congressional Record, September 24, 1942, p. 7684.)

"3. Cited as 'one of the most seditious organizations which ever operated in the United States' and 'instrument of the Communist Party prior to Hitler's attack on Russia.' (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, March 29, 1944, p. 5; also cited in Reports, June 25, 1942, p. 13; and January 2, 1943, pp. 8 and 9.)

"4. Cited as a Communist front. (United States Secretary of Labor, decision in the case of HELEN MILLER, August 1, 1941.)

"5. 'One of the boldest and most flagrant of all Communist fronts * * * organized for the purpose of supporting Soviet Russia during the Stalin-Hitler pact.' (California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1948, p. 161.)

- "6. Cited as a 'Communist-controlled, pseudo-pacifist group.'

[redacted] of known reliability, advised that the names HELEN GUREWITZ and CLARENCE GUREWITZ of 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia, were listed in the indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. This organization is the successor to the American Peoples Mobilization.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, May 14, 1951, contains the following concerning the Washington Committee for Democratic Action:

- "1. Cited as subversive and Communist.
(Attorney General Tom Clark, letters to Loyalty Review Board, released December 4, 1947, and September 21, 1948.)

- "2. An 'affiliate' or 'local chapter' of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties. The program of the Washington committee followed that of the national federation. National Communist leaders have addressed its meetings, and conferences sponsored by it have been attended by representatives of prominent Communist-front organizations. Many of its members were active in the American Peace Mobilization.

(Attorney General Francis Biddle, Congressional Record, September 24, 1942, pp. 7688 and 7689.)

- "3. When the American League for Peace and Democracy was dissolved in February 1940 its successor in Washington was called the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. The latter was affiliated with the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties.

(Special Committee on Un-American Activities Reports, June 25, 1942, p. 22, and March 29, 1944, p. 143.)

- "4. Cited as a Communist front.
(California Committee on Un-American Activities Report, 1948, pp. 335 and 342.)"

Informant further advised that in September 1943, one [REDACTED] had taken the position of membership director of the Communist Party in the District of Columbia and that arrangements had been made within the party for HELEN GUREWITZ to assist [REDACTED] in handling the bookkeeping connected with the membership activities of the party.

[REDACTED] of known reliability, advised that in March of 1944, HELEN GUREWITZ was acquainted with one [REDACTED] the wife of a known member of the Communist Party and who was active among the white collar workers of the Communist Party.

[REDACTED] of known reliability, advised that in May, 1944, he observed the official membership records of the Communist Party for the District of Columbia and the name HELEN GUREWITZ, 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia, appeared therein with the names of other individuals designated therein and by the informant as connected with the White Collar Workers Branch number 12 of the Communist Party.

[redacted] of known reliability, [redacted] had been acquainted with Mrs. GUREWITZ and on the basis of her college activities, believes that she was a "liberal" but not a "radical". [redacted] recalled no statements made by subject that would lead her to believe that she was a Communist. Informant recalled that subject had been president of the Round Table during one of the years she attended Wilson Teachers College. Informant advised that this group usually discussed social problems and quite often discussed the governmental structure of Russia. Informant advised that the Round Table was organized to take care of students at the college who desired some form to express their social and economic viewpoints. [redacted] did not recall subject expressed herself as radically as other members of the Round Table had been known to express themselves at time. b7D

[redacted] of known reliability, advised that he was unable to recall any specific statements made by subject during the time she attended Wilson Teachers College with reference to her social and economic viewpoints. He considered her, however, as part of the "student opposition" to the college administration. b7D

[redacted] of known reliability, advised they were acquainted with the subject when she attended Wilson College but could not supplement or add to the information given by informants above. b7D

[redacted] of known reliability, advised that he had known subject since she came to work for the Bureau of Standards. He stated his only contact with her was during working hours and he observed nothing that would indicate that she was not a loyal citizen of this country. He had no information that would indicate she was a member of the Communist Party and had no knowledge of any of her activities outside of the office. b7D

[redacted] of known reliability, advised that subject had performed a high grade of work for the Bureau of Standards but had no other information concerning her or her activities. b7D

[redacted] of known reliability provide the same information as given by [redacted]. b7D

[redacted] of known reliability, advised [redacted] had known subject for about ten years but was not in very close contact with her. [redacted] advised that she knew of nothing that would indicate that subject was not a loyal American. b7D

IV. INTERVIEW AND STATEMENT SIGNED BY SUBJECT DENYING MEMBERSHIP IN COMMUNIST PARTY

On November 3, 1944, HELEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ was afforded an interview at the Washington Field Office. The stenographic notes of the interview were transcribed and on November 8, 1944, she returned to the Washington Field Office, at which time she read the statement, stated it was correct, signed the second page and initialed the first page. The original copy of this statement is being retained in the files of the Washington Field Office. Her statement is as follows:

Interview with Mrs. HELEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ at the Washington Field Office, Federal Bureau of Investigation, November 3, 1944, in the presence of Special Agent LOGAN J. LANE and Stenographer PHYLLIS H. THOMPSON, of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Questions by Agent LANE.

Mr. LANE: Mrs. GUREWITZ, we have requested your voluntary appearance here today, not for the purpose of conducting a hearing but in order that you may answer some questions concerning an investigation currently being made by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and to enable you to make such comments as you might wish to make concerning this inquiry. You may decline to answer any questions propounded to you. As you may be aware, the Federal Bureau of Investigation is required by Presidential Directive to investigate matters coming within the purview of Public Law No. 252, 76th Congress. This law prohibits membership on the part of any Federal employee in a political party or organization which advocates the overthrow of our constitutional form of government in the United States. A copy of the report of this investigation, which will include your statement, will be furnished the Interdepartmental Committee on Employee Investigations and the agency by which you are employed.

After the notes of the interview have been transcribed you will be given an opportunity to read them and make such changes as you may desire.

In order that the statements made by you may have particular credence, you will be placed under oath if you have no objection.

Q. Will you please stand and raise your right hand. Do you solemnly swear to tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth.

A. I do.

Q. What is your name, please?
A. HELEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ.

Q. And what is your present address?
A. 2135 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia.

Q. By what department of the United States Government are you employed?

A. It is the Department of Commerce, National Bureau of Standards.

Q. And in what particular capacity?
A. I am a physicist.

Q. Mrs. GUREWITZ, are you now or have you ever been a member of the Communist Party or the Communist Political Association?

A. I am not and I never have been.

Q. Do you now or have you ever participated in the activities of the Communist Party or the Communist Political Association?

A. I have not.

Q. Are you a member of any organization which you have reason to believe is dominated by the Communist Party or the Communist Political Association?
A. None whatsoever.

Q. Are you a member of any organization which you have reason to believe may be controlled by, or its policies dictated by a foreign government?

A. No.

Q. Do you presently advocate or have you ever advocated any change in the constitutional form of government which we have in the United States

Q. Mrs. GUREWITZ, do you desire to relate the names of organizations, other than labor unions or churches, in which you presently hold membership?

A. I don't believe there are any such. There are no such. I am chairman of a Red Cross knitting group but would that fall in that category?

Mr. LANE: Well, you can just list any organizations you desire.

A. That would be the only thing.

Q. Mrs. GUREWITZ, is there anything further that you would like to say which you feel may be pertinent to this inquiry and which may be necessary to fully clarify the circumstances surrounding it? Any voluntary statement on your part that you would like to make will be included.

A. I don't know of anything else pertinent to this that I might have to say.

[REDACTED] was interviewed at the Washington Field Office on December 28, 1950, and furnished the following signed statement. b7D

"Washington, D. C.

I [REDACTED] make the following statement to ROBERT H. PAUL, JOHN E. HOWARD, and LEWIS E. GLENN, who have identified themselves to me to be Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice. I make this statement of my own free will, no threats or promises having been made, and I realize it."

"can be used in a court of law. I have been advised that I do not have to make a statement and that I have a right to be represented by an attorney.

"I am personally acquainted with a man by the name of CASEY GUREWITZ and I know that he has been a member of the Communist Party in the District of Columbia. I knew CASEY GUREWITZ' first wife, HELEN, from about 1940 until I went into the Army in September, 1943. During the time I knew this HELEN GUREWITZ she was a member of the Young Communist League in the District of Columbia. I know this because I was also a member of the Young Communist League, as well as being a member of the Communist Party, during the time HELEN GUREWITZ (CASEY's first wife) was a member. To the best of my recollection I have attended meetings of the Young Communist League at which the first HELEN GUREWITZ was present. It is also my recollection that she represented her Young Communist League club on the City Committee of the Communist Party.

"When I returned to Washington from being in the Army, which was in December, 1945, I learned that the former HELEN GUREWITZ had married a man by the name of MORTON SOBELL and they were living somewhere in New York and he was working for some electrical company. I have not seen the former HELEN GUREWITZ since I left in September, 1943, to go into the Army. I do not know any of the members of her family, although I do seem to recall meeting a sister of hers on one occasion at the home of CASEY GUREWITZ during the time he and his first wife resided on Reservoir Road in Washington, D. C.

"I vaguely recall that the former HELEN GUREWITZ was an officer in the Young Communist League club of which she was a member, possibly secretary. I cannot recall any specific dates on which she attended meetings of the Young Communist League, but it is my recollection that she was very active in the League and attended meetings regularly. Meetings of the Young Communist League were held during that time at 1421 T Street N. W. in Washington, D. C., and it is my recollection that she attended some meetings at that address."

"I have never met MORTON SOBELL and do not know him at all. I had heard about him prior to the time I went into

"the Army and I seem to recall that I had heard he was very anti-Communist; therefore, I was surprised when I read in the paper that he had been arrested on a charge of espionage. I have been shown a photograph of MORTON SOBELL and although his face looks familiar, I do not recognize him as being anyone I know. I have also been shown a photograph of HELEN SOBELL and I recognize her as being the first wife of CASEY GUREWITZ and the person I have described above as being a member of the Young Communist League."

"I have read this statement consisting of this and one other page and found it to be a true statement of what I said." [REDACTED] b7D

V. INFORMATION REGARDING SUBJECT FROM GENERAL ELECTRIC COMPANY

[REDACTED] HELEN SOBELL had been employed as an Engineering Assistant in the Production Section of the Electro Mechanical Division of the General Engineering and Consulting Laboratory from March 29, 1945, to May 14, 1946, when she was granted a leave of absence to attend Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. He advised she submitted her resignation on June 10, 1946. On her application dated March 24, 1945, she listed her name as HELEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ SOBELL, residing at 411 Division Street, Schenectady, New York. She

stated that she was born March 13, 1918, at Washington, D. C., and that her parents were born in Russia. She was described as 5' 1", 112 pounds, and had Social Security Number 230-16-0049. She listed the following education:

 Wilson Technical College - 4 years, graduated 1939,

Under former employment she stated she had been employed from September, 1940, to September, 1941, by JOSEPH GUREWITZ, 2214-38th Street, Washington, D. C. She stated that Mr. GUREWITZ was her immediate supervisor, that she was employed as a Sales Manager at 65¢ per hour, and that she had left this position because she had little chance for advancement. She advised that she was employed from January 2, 1942, to March 9, 1945, by the National Bureau of Standards, Washington, D. C., under the supervision of Dr. I. C. GARDNER, that she worked on refractive index lens design, and that she received \$1.20 per hour. She advised that she left this position to move to Schenectady.

She listed the immediate members of her family as follows:

GUREWITZ, the daughter of CLARENCE D. GUREWITZ and HELEN LEVITOV GUREWITZ, born October 21, 1939, at Washington, D. C. The file reflected that she was employed as a Laboratory Assistant in Building 5, at \$35.00 per week. On October 1, 1945, she was paid at the rate of \$38.00 per week, and on December 31, 1945, was paid at the rate of \$42.00 a week, until the date of her resignation.

[REDACTED] HELEN SOBELL had been employed as an Engineering Assistant in development work in the Products Section of the Electro Mechanical Division. [REDACTED] she worked immediately under [REDACTED] the supervision of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] a review of her personnel file [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was acquainted with [REDACTED] upon her loyalty. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was acquainted with [REDACTED] HELEN SOBELL, and considered her to be a person of good technical ability, intelligence, and well informed, but stated that she had an unfortunate ability to antagonize her fellow employees in her dealings with them.

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] HELEN SOBELL was employed there. [REDACTED] He advised that he had limited contact with her. He stated that he had no reason at any time to question her loyalty, and had no doubt that she may have compromised any information available to her in the course of her duties. He advised she had no access to any restricted information or material during her employment with the General Electric and Consulting Laboratory.

[REDACTED] advised that HELEN SOBELL had worked [REDACTED] for a period of one year. He

stated that she was a capable and efficient employee of good technical ability. He stated she was very industrious, but was inclined to be antagonistic and very tactless in her dealings with fellow employees. He stated that she was assigned as an Engineering Assistant, and worked on certain tests in connection with the damping characteristics of silicon oils. He advised that he had no reason or occasion to question her loyalty and stated that she never appeared to be unduly curious, or seeking information in addition to that connected with her own application.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both former fellow employees of HELEN SOBELL advised that they had considerable contact with her during the course of her employment at the General Electric Company. They stated they had no occasion to question her loyalty at any time and had no reason to suspect that she might have been attempting to secure information against the best interests of either the country or the General Electric Company. b7D

[REDACTED] advised that she had considerable contact with HELEN SOBELL during the course of her employment at General Electric Company and stated that she never had any occasion to question her loyalty. b7D

[REDACTED] advised that her records reflect that HELEN SOBELL failed to return to the company her patent notebook, which had been issued to her at the beginning of her employment and in which all employees make personal notations concerning their various experiments and ideas as a proof of such work in the event of any need of verification for patent matters. She stated that in her opinion, HELEN SOBELL would not have had much occasion to make use of this patent book in her position as Engineering Assistant. b7D

[REDACTED] advised that he had limited contact with HELEN SOBELL during the period of her employment in his Division, stating he had absolutely no reason or occasion to question her loyalty either to the country or to the General Electric Company. b7D

There was a notation to the effect that a transcript of her record had been sent to Columbia University on March 31, 1947, at her request. The records reflected that Mrs. SOBELL maintained an extremely high average in the special course in the Physics Department. b7D
