

I. RESIDENCE AND EMPLOYMENT

The 1960-1961 New York City Telephone Directory for the Borough of Manhattan contains a listing on Page 1529, for Mrs. HELEN SORELL, 30 Charlton Street, telephone WAtkins 9-9061.



A characterization of the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SORELL (hereinafter referred to as the CSJMS) is set forth in the Appendix hereto.

advised on July 18, 1960, that the CSJMS is an organization engaged in activities to secure the release of MORTON SORELL from prison. MORTON SORELL was convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage with his co-defendant, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and sentenced to serve. 30 years in prison. The committee was formed about ten years ago to secure the freedom of all three persons — ETHEL ROSENBERG, JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL, but a few years ago it was decided that concentration should be on the living person and after he was freed, concentration of the committee would be on vindication of the names of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG.

The committee hopes to secure MORTON SORKIL's release by retrial (new trial) of the case or by petitioning the President of the United States for executive elemency or pardon, during the Christmas amnesty.period.

The headquarters of the CSJMS is 940 Broadway, Room D, New York City. This national headquarters is also used as the meeting place for the New York Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SORELL, usually the first Wednesday of each month and a work committee meeting every two weeks.



The subject is a salaried member of the National Staff of the committee. She travels extensively, giving television, radio and newspaper interviews to interested people in the case and to raise funds over and above her travel expenses.

Officers of the CSJMS are ROSE and HELEN SOBELL, MORTON SOBELL's mother and wife. Their names appear on committee letterhead stationery as chairmen, along with a partial listing of sponsors.

There are functioning affiliates of the CSJMS in many of the cities of the United States and elsewhere and in March of 1960, the SOBELL committees were structured into regions and representatives attended national conferences held at the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA), Mc Burney Branch, 23rd Street, New York City, where they received a timetable of work to explore and agree on the MORTON SOBELL freedom campaign for 1960.

The representatives were told how to build regional committee activities so their efforts would all coordinate into a strong power of results, rather than independent diffused activities. They were told methods of increasing and coordinating work through paid and voluntary personnel; how to plan special projects, such as tours and use of the available printed materials.

Eastern Regional Committees to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL, are located in Boston, Miami, New York, Philadelphia, Syracuse, Toronto, Washington, D. C., Atlants and New Haven. Midwestern Regional Committees are located in Chicago, Detroit, Milwaukee, Minnesota, St. Louis and Cleveland. The western region includes Los Angeles, San Francisco, Fresno, Portland, San Diego, Seattle, Vancouver, Phoenix, Tuscon, Salt Lake City and Denver. In addition, there are group activities in Israel and England. These committees are all independent of the National Committee but receive publicity releases and program suggestions for fund raising campaigns and clergy appeal help, as well as literature for sale from the National Committee staff.


A. Appeals

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advised on February 10, 1960, that
HELEN SOBELL had written a letter to President EISENHOWER
regarding the MORTON SOBELL case. According to the informant,

advised on May 16, 1960, that on that date a luncheon and meeting, under the sponsorship of the CSJMS, was held at the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church; Washington, D. C. A number of prominent ministers of the Washington, D. C. area attended this affair. The informant went on to furnished the following additional information:


Mrs. MORTON SOBELL also spoke at this affair and urged persons in attendance to sign an appeal to the President requesting commutation for sentence of her husband. Mrs. SOBELL mentioned that a group of persons had visited Pardons Attorney REED COZART, at 10:00 a.m., May 16, 1960, with the request that MORTON SOBELL be granted a pardon. She said that she did not know what action would be given to their request.

Mrs. SOBELL was questioned as to whether she and her husband were Communist Party (CP) members at any time or had any affiliation with the CP in any manner. She replied that neither had been a member of the CP but that during their student days, they were affiliated with organizations interested in civil rights. She left the impression that these organizations were subsequently designated by the Attorney General and that this fact was held against SOBELL at his trial.

Mrs. SORELL was questioned as to how the organization derived its funds, and she replied that funds were obtained voluntarily and from rummage sales and the like. She stated that at the conclusion of this meeting, a delegation would visit DAVID W. KENDALL, Special Counsellor to President EISENHOWER, and present an appeal with respect to the SORELL case.

meeting of the CSJMS was held at 940 Broadway, New York City, on June 8, 1960. According to the informant, the subject attended this meeting



reception and banquet was held by the CSJMS at the Hotel Shoreham, Washington, D. C. on November 19, 1960. The informant said that approximately 100 persons were in attendance at the reception and about 150 attended the banquet. According to the subject spoke at this banquet and emphasized the "injustice" of the accusation against her husband and stated; that she had appealed to the President to have her husband released from prison before Christmas.



B. Publicity

The January 10, 1960, issue of "The Worker" contained a notice on Page 15, Column 5 that HELEN SOBELL would speak about the MORTON SOBELL case on January 15, 1960, at a meeting sponsored by the New England Committee for MORTON SOBELL at the Community Church, 565 Roylston Street, Boston, Massachusetts.


"The Worker" is an east coast Communist weekly newspaper.

several members of the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee had contacted representatives of Philadelphia radio stations, in an attempt to obtain speaking time for HELLN SOBELL on one of these stations. According to the informant, these efforts were unsuccessful as of January 12, 1960.

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The June 20, 1960 issue of the "New York Times", a daily newspaper published in New York City, contained a half page, paid advertisement, captioned "An Urgent Public Issue: Freedom for MORTON SOBELL". This advertisement described itself as a summary of a meeting attended by 600 persons, which was held on May 24, 1960, at the Community Church of New York for the purpose of discussing the MORTON SOBELL case. The advertisement concluded by urging its readers, who believed SOBELL should be released, to write to the President.

Philadelphia SOBELL Committee had scheduled a meeting at 8:30 p.m., November 5, 1960, at 1804 68th Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, at which HELEN SOBELL would be the featured speaker. The announcement of this meeting indicated there would be a report on the National Freedom Appeal to be held in Washington, D. C., by the CSJMS.

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January 17, 1961, a meeting of the Upper East Side Section Committee, CP, was held at 340 East 66th Street, New York City.




The application was dated November 15, 1960, and contained the following information:

She stated that she planned to depart New York City about January 5, 1961, by Pan American jet for three weeks in England, France and Italy as a tourist. She stated that she was not travelling on an organized tour and that she expected to take another trip abroad within two years.

COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR MORTON SOBELL

"Following the execution of atomic spies Ethel and Julius Rosenberg in June 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell,' the Rosenbergs' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg case - a communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October 1953 and 'then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg case'"

"Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" dated January 2, 1957, issued by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 50.)

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the current name, "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell," first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

The 1959-1960 Borough of Manhattan telephone directory lists the "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" as being located at 940 Broadway, New York, New York.

WASHINGTON AREA FORUM, also known as Washington Area Citizens Forum, Washington Citizens Forum

A source reported on December 14, 1955, that the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia (PPDC) would be dissolved and a new organization formed from the PPDC in order to have a voice in civil rights matters and political campaigns in Virginia and Maryland. A second source advised on December 17, 1955, that the PPDC was to be dissolved because of the stigma attached to the name of the Progressive Party and it was hoped that the new organization replacing the PPDC would be more acceptable to persons not previously participating in PPDC activity. The first source reported on February 8, 1956, that the PPDC was dissolved on February 7, 1956.

A third source reported on March 13, 1956, that the Washington Area Citizens Forum was formed on March 12, 1956, at a meeting of the defunct Executive Committee of the PPDC. This source reported on May 10, 1956, that the name of the Washington Area Citizens Forum was shortened to that of Washington Citizens Forum at a meeting held May 3, 1956. On June 11, 1956, the first source made available information revealing that the Washington Area Citizens Forum was at that time being called Washington Area Forum.

The first source stated on May 17, 1960, that the Washington Area Forum remains in existence in Washington, D. C., and periodically holds meetings. This source stated he regards the Washington Area Forum as a communist front organization inasmuch as the speakers presented by this organization in recent months follow the Communist Party line. This source added that the officers of the Washington area Forum, who are responsible for securing the speakers, have never secured as a speaker anyone who was critical of the Communist Party or the aims and objectives of the Communist Party.

A fourth source in September 1958, reported that on September 12, 1958, HELEN GUREWITZ discussional the Communist Party in Washington, D. C., area with GEORGE MYERS, Acting Chairman of the Communist Party District of Maryland and the District of Columbia. This source advised GUREWITZ stated in this regard:
"We have the Washington Area Forum and that's all."

PROGRESSIVE PARTY OF DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA (PPDC)

On January 15, 1948, Mrs. MARY STALCUP MARKWARD, an admitted member of the Communist Party (CP) and Communist Political Association (CPA) in Washington, D. C., from 1943-1949, advised that at a meeting of the City Committee of the CP of the District of Columbia on January 11, 1948, motions were passed to set up a Political Action Committee in Washington, D. C., for the purpose of coordinating all activity with regard to the "Third Party Movement." It was decided to set up "Walbce for President Clubs" in Washington, D. C. These groups subsequently became the PPDC. On December 17, 1951, Mrs. MARKWARD advised that the PPDC, during the years 1948 and 1949, was dominated and controlled by the CP of the District of Columbia.

A source on February 25, 1952, November 14, 1952, November 27, 1953, and January 31, 1955, identified the leaders of the PPDC, as of the above dates, as either Communist Party members & Communist Party sympathizers. This source added that the PPDC has never opposed the CP on any issue or program.

It is noted that another source on February 8, 1956, reported that the PPDC was dissolved on February 7, 1956.

PROGRESSIVE PARTY

Regarding the Progressive Party, nationally, the "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," prepared and released on January 2,1957, by the Committee on Un-American Activities, U. S. House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., on page 74, states:

"1. 'Communist dissimulation extends into the field of political parties forming political front organizations such as the Progressive Party.'- * * * The Communists are thus enabled to present their candidates for elective office under other than a straight Communist label.'

CAMP MIDVALE

On March 26, 1954, a confidential source made available a copy of the March, 1954, issue of the "Camp Midvale News," official organ of Camp Midvale, Midvale, New Jersey, which, on page 1, states that the recently formed Metropolitan Recreation Association (MRA) is the organization which owns and operates Camp Midvale.

The records of the New York County Clerk's Office, Supreme Court Building, New York City, reflect that a certificate of dissolution for Nature Friends of America, Inc. (NFA) was filed with the Secretary of State, State of New York, on February 23, 1954.

A confidential source advised on March 12, 1954, that at a meeting of the former New York local of NFA, held on February 25, 1954, in New York City, a successor organization known as the MRA was set up and all assets and real property formerly belonging to the New York local of NFA were transferred to the MRA.

On November 4, 1957, a confidential source made available a copy of the constitution of the MRA, which was adopted in 1957, and which, under Article II, sets forth the aims of the organization as follows:

"The purpose of the association is to bring together people without regard to race, color, national origin, religion, or beliefs, having a common interest in outdoor sports, recreational and cultural activities, and the fullest use of leisure time for the furtherance of the welfare and well-being of the members; to encourage the study of nature and of the natural sciences, and of the modes of living and customs and cultures of the people of the United States, past and present.

The MRA, as of May 12, 1960, continues to utilize General Post Office Box 634, New York City, as its mailing address.

NFA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.








A characterization of the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL (hereinafter referred to as the CSJMS) is set forth in the Appendix hereto.

advised on July 18, 1960, that the CSJMS is an organization engaged in activities to secure the release of MORTON SORELL from prison. MORTON SORELL was convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage with his co-defendant, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and sentenced to serve 30 years in prison. The committee was formed about ten years ago to secure the freedom of all three persons - ETHEL ROSENBERG, JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SORELL, but a few years ago it was decided that concentration should be on the living person and after he was freed, concentration of the committee would be on vindication of the names of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG.

The committee hopes to secure MORTON SOBELL's release by retrial (new trial) of the case or by petitioning the President of the United States for executive elemency or pardon, during the Christmas amnesty period.

The headquarters of the CSJMS is 940 Broadway, Room D, New York City. This national headquarters is also used as the meeting place for the New York Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBKIL, usually the first Wednesday of each month and a work committee meeting every two weeks.



The subject is a salaried member of the National Staff of the committee. She travels extensively, giving television, radio and newspaper interviews to interested people in the case and to raise funds over and above her travel expenses.

Officers of the CSJMS are ROSE and HELEN SOBELL, MORTON SOBELL's mother and wife. Their names appear on committee letterhead stationery as chairmen, along with a partial listing of sponsors.

There are functioning affiliates of the CSJMS in many of the cities of the United States and elsewhere and in March of 1960, the SORELL committees were structured into regions and representatives attended national conferences held at the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA), Mc Burney Branch, 23rd Street, New York City, where they received a timetable of work to explore and agree on the MORTON SORELL freedom campaign for 1960.

The representatives were told how to build regional committee activities so their efforts would all coordinate into a strong power of results, rather than independent diffused activities. They were told methods of increasing and coordinating work through paid and voluntary personnel; how to plan special projects, such as tours and use of the available printed materials.

Eastern Regional Committees to Secure Justice for MORTON SORELL, are located in Boston, Miami, New York, Philadelphia, Syracuse, Toronto, Washington, D. C., Atlanta and New Haven. Midwestern Regional Committees are located in Chicago, Detroit, Milwaukee, Minnesota, St. Louis and Cleveland. The western region includes Los Angeles, San Francisco, Presno, Portland, San Diego, Seattle, Vancouver, Phoenix, Tuscon, Salt Lake City and Denver. In addition, there are group activities in Israel and England. These committees are all independent of the National Committee but receive publicity releases and program suggestions for fund raising campaigns and clergy appeal help, as well as literature for sale from the National Committee staff.




Appeals

advised on February 10, 1960, that HELEN SOBELL had written a letter to President EISENHOWER regarding the MORTON SOBELL case. According to the informant, subject's letter was acknowledged by Mr. KENDALL, an assistant to the President, who stated that the file on the SOBELL case was being referred to Mrs COZART, United States Pardons Attorney.

advised on May 16, 1960, that on that date a luncheon and meeting, under the sponsorship of the CSJMS, was held at the New York Avenue Presbyterian Churchy Washington, D. C. A number of prominent ministers of the Washington, D. C. area attended this affair. The informant went on to furnish the following additional information:

Unitarian Minister of Los Angeles, Callionnia, was the principal speaker and he stated he ... becames. interested in the MORTON SORFLL case because of his acquaintanceship with Chaplain scared that he had while SOBELL was at Alcatraz. given one entire sermon on the West coast concerning the MORTON SOBELL case and that he thought SOBELL's sentence was too severe. He urged the ministers in attendance to sign an appeal to the President requesting commutation of MORTON SOBELL's sentence.

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Mrs. MORTON SORELL also spoke at this affair and urged persons in attendance to sign an appeal to the President requesting commutation for sentence of her husband. Mrs. SORELL mentioned that a group of persons had visited Pardons Attorney REED COZART, at 10:00 a.m., May 16, 1960, with the request that MORTON SORELL be granted a pardon. She said that she did not know what action would be given to their request.

Mrs. SOBRIL was questioned as to whether she and her husband were Communist Party (CP) members at any time or had any affiliation with the CP in any manner. She replied that neither had been a member of the CP but that during their student days, they were affiliated with organizations interested in civil rights. She left the impression that these organizations were subsequently designated by the Attorney General and that this fact was held against SOBELL at his trial.

Mrs. SORELL was questioned as to how the organization derived its funds, and she replied that funds were obtained voluntarily and from rummage sales and the like. She stated that at the conclusion of this meeting, a delegation would visit DAVID W. KENDALL, Special Counsellor to President EISENHOWER, and present an appeal with respect to the SORELL case.

meeting of the CSJMS was held at 940 Broadway, New York City, on June 8, 1960. According to the informant, the subject attended this meeting

advised on November 20, 1960, that a reception and banquet was held by the CSJMS at the Hotel Shoreham, Washington, D. C. on November 19, 1960. The informant said that approximately 100 persons were in attendance at the reception and about 150 attended the banquet. According to the subject spoke at this banquet and emphasized the "injustice" of the accusation against her husband and stated; that she had appealed to the President to have her husband released from prison before Christmas.

also advised that subject attended the above function, the purpose of which was to raise funds for the continued work of the CSJMS.

advised that at the above affair, the subject made a plea for funds and stated that pressure must be placed on the White House to secure MORTON SORRLL's release.

advised on December 22, 1960, that on December 18, 1960, the Subject attended an exhibition called "Americans Appeal for MORTON SOBELL", which was both held at the Christian Association Building, of the University of Pennsylvania, 3601 Locust Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The informant reported that literature regarding the MORTON SOBELL case was distributed at this meeting and that the subject greeted each person as he came into the auditorium.

on February 17, 1961, advised that HELEN SOBELL spoke at a luncheon sponsored by the CSJMS, which was held on February 12, 1961, at the Brighton Beach Community Center, 3200 Coney Island Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. The informant said that subject spoke of efforts being made and work being done by the committee. She also remarked that there was a changed atmosphere in Washington and that she hoped the new administration would listen with some favor regarding MORTON SOBELL's plea for freedom.

B. Publicity

The January 10, 1950, issue of "The Worker" contained a notice on Page 15, Column 5 that HELEN SOBELL would speak about the MORTON SOBELL case on January 15, 1960, at a meeting sponsored by the New England Committee for MORTON SOBELL at the Community Church, 565 . Poylston Street, Boston, Massachusetts.

"The Worker" is an east coast Communist weekly newspaper.

advised on January 12, 1960, that several members of the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee had contacted representatives of Philadelphia radio stations, in an attempt to obtain speaking time for HELEN SOBELL on one of these stations. According to the informant, these efforts were unsuccessful as of January 12, 1960.

The June 20, 1960 issue of the "New York Times", a daily newspaper published in New York City, contained a half page, paid advertisement, captioned "An Urgent Public Issue: Freedom for MORTON SOBELL". This advertisement described itself as a summary of a meeting attended by 600 persons, which was held on May 24, 1960, at the Community Church of New York for the purpose of discussing the MORTON SOBELL case. The advertisement concluded by urging its readers, who believed SOBELL should be released, to write to the President.

Philadelphia SOBELL Committee had scheduled a meeting at 8:30 p.m., November 5, 1960, at 1804 68th Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, at which HELEN SORELL would be the featured speaker. The announcement of this meeting indicated there would be a report on the National Freedom Appeal to be held in Washington, D. C., by the CSJMS.

advised on November 1, 1960, that a meeting of the District Executive Committee, CP of Eastern Fennsylvania of and Delaware, was held November 1, 1960, at 1145 West Suggehanna Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

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January 17, 1961, a meeting of the Upper East Side Section Committee, CP, was held at 340 East 66th Street, New York City.



A source reported on December 14, 1955, that the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia (PPDC) would be dissolved and a new organization formed from the PPDC in order to have a voice in civil rights matters and political campaigns in Virginia and Maryland. A second source advised on December 17, 1955, that the PPDC was to be dissolved because of the stigma attached to the name of the Progressive Party and it was hoped that the new organization replacing the PPDC would be more acceptable to persons not previously participating in PPDC activity. The first source reported on February 8, 1956, that the PPDC was dissolved on February 7, 1956.

A third source reported on March 13, 1956, that the Washington Area Citizens Forum was formed on March 12, 1956, at a meeting of the defunct Executive Committee of the PPDC. This source reported on May 10, 1956, that the name of the Washington Area Citizens Forum was shortened to that of Washington Citizens Forum at a meeting held May 3, 1956. On June 11, 1956, the first source made available information revealing that the Washington Area Citizens Forum was at that time being called Washington Area Forum.

The first source stated on May 17, 1960, that the Washington Area Forum remains in existence in Washington, D. C., and periodically holds meetings. This source stated he regards the Washington Area Forum as a communist front organization inasmuch as the speakers presented by this organization in recent months follow the Communist Party line. This source added that the officers of the Washington Area Forum, who are responsible for securing the speakers, have never secured as a speaker anyone who was critical of the Communist Party or the aims and objectives of the Communist Party.

A fourth source in September 1958, reported that on September 12, 1958, HELEN GUREWITZ discussed; the Communist Party in Washington, D. C., area with GEORGE MYERS, Acting Chairman of the Communist Party District of Maryland and the District of Columbia. This source advised GUREWITZ stated in this regard:
"We have the Washington Area Forum and that's all."

PROGRESSIVE PARTY OF DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA (PPDC)

On January 15, 1948, Mrs. MARY STALCUP MARKWARD, an admitted member of the Communist Party (CP) and Communist Political Association (CPA) in Washington, D. C., from 1943-1949, advised that at a meeting of the City Committee of the CP of the District of Columbia on January 11, 1948, motions were passed to set up a Political Action Committee in Washington, D. C., for the purpose of coordinating all activity with regard to the "Third Party Movement." It was decided to set up "Walkee for President Clubs" in Washington, D. C. These groups subsequently became the PPDC. On December 17, 1951, Mrs. MARKWARD advised that the PPDC, during the years 1948 and 1949, was dominated and controlled by the CP of the District of Columbia.

A source on February 25, 1952, November 14, 1952, November 27, 1953, and January 31, 1955, identified the leaders of the PPDC, as of the above dates, as either Communist Party members of Communist Party sympathizers. This source added that the PPDC has never opposed the CP on any issue or program.

It is noted that another source on February 8, 1956, reported that the PPDC was dissolved on February 7, 1956.



On March 26, 1954, a confidential source made available a copy of the March, 1954, issue of the "Camp Midvale News," official organ of Camp Midvale, Midvale, New Jersey, which, on page 1, states that the recently formed Metropolitan Recreation Association (MRA) is the organization which owns and operates Camp Midvale.

The records of the New York County Clerk's Office, Supreme Court Building, New York City, reflect that a certificate of dissolution for Nature Friends of America, Inc. (NFA) was filed with the Secretary of State, State of New York, on February 23, 1954.

A confidential source advised on March 12, 1954, that at a meeting of the former New York local of NFA, held on February 25, 1954, in New York City, a successor organization known as the MRA was set up and all assets and real property formerly belonging to the New York local of NFA were transferred to the MRA.

On November 4, 1957, a confidential source made available a copy of the constitution of the MRA, which was adopted in 1957, and which, under Article II, sets forth the aims of the organization as follows:

"The purpose of the association is to bring together people without regard to race, color, national origin, religion, or beliefs, having a common interest in outdoor sports, recreational and cultural activities, and the fullest use of leisure time for the furtherance of the welfare and well-being of the members; to encourage the study of nature and of the natural sciences, and of the modes of living and customs and cultures of the people of the United States, past and present.

The MRA, as of May 12, 1960, continues to utilize General Post Office Box 634, New York City, as its mailing address.

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

The horror of the Rosenberg atom-spy case brushed against the front pages again recently, when David Greenglass, Ethel Rosenberg's brother who confessed, was released after nearly ten years in jail. He had been sentenced to fifteen. Still in prison, on a sentence double that of Greenglass, is Morton Sobell, in any view of the case its most marginal and pitiable figure.

The jury found Sobell guilty - and quite probably he was - of something or other having to do with spying for the Russians. The evidence was meager, but there was at any rate mone to link him with the atom bomb spying conspiracy in which the Rosenbergs and Greenglass were involved. Hence it was exceedingly prejudicial, and, as at least one judge, the late Jerome Frank, thought, illegal to try Sobell together with the Rosenbergs. Be that as it may, the gravely nagging sense of injustice left behind by the whole sorry affair was generated not by the verdict but by the sentences. These were brutal and erratic. There is no way for society to expiate the ghastly fact that the Rosenbergs were electrocuted. But Sobell's sentence - as barbaric in its fashion, considering the nature of the case against him can be commuted to time served. This the President has been asked to do. We hope he will. It is a question not enerely of humane feelings, but of a measure of justice.
