"Invitation to an Inquest" had been published, the CSJMS utilized the book as a springboard to demand a hearing for MORTON SOBELL. Numerous pamphlets were issued by the CSJMS in this connection.

Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBEL', the ROSENBERGS' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg - Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and 'then the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case'..."

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953. MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence in the custody of the United States Attorney General.

On April 27, 1967, a Special Agent (SA) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) determined that Mrs. HELEN SOBELL was employed as a teacher at the Little Red School House, 196 Bleeker Street, NY, NY.67E

HELEN SOBELL will not be teaching school during the summer vacation period of July and August, 1967.



Activities on Behalf of CFMS

During June, 1966, HELEN SOBELL was instrumental in having the name of the committee changed from Committee to Secure Justice For Morton Sobell to Committee to Free Morton Sobell.



sponsored by CFMS was held at the Sheraton-Atlantic Hotel, NYC. Between 300 and 400 attended. HELEN SOBELL was one of the speakers. She praised the ROSENBERGS. She claimed the Government had attempted to thwart her attempts to see her husband when he was temporarily incarcerated in NYC during June, 1966. She claimed it was too late to give justice to MORTON SOBELL and therefore, the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell would henceforth be called Committee to Free Morton Sobell. She called for support for this committee and asked for financial contributions.




On February 14, 1967, United States District Judge EDWARD WEINFELD, USDC, SDNY, by written decision denied the petition of MORTON SOBELL for relief from his conviction or for a new trial under Section 2255, Title 28, United States. Code.

On March 2, 1967, Judge WEINFELD denied SOBELL's petition for bail which was requested pending the appeal of Judge WEINFELD's decision of February 14, 1967.



During February, 1967, CFMS circulated a reprint of the "New York Times" which reported the rejection of MORTON SOBELL's motion for a new trial. The article reported that SOBELL's attorneys had been serving without fee. HELEN SOBELL attached a note to the CFMS reprint which pointed out that the "New York Times" was incorrect and the CFMS had been paying attorneys' fees.

A rally of approximately 1,500 people was held at Hunter College Auditorium, 69th Street at Lexington Avenue, NYC, on April 11, 1967, to celebrate the 50th birthday of MORTON SOBELL. The rally was sponsored by CFMS. All the speakers criticized the Government's case against MORTON SOBELL. Among the speakers was HELEN SOBELL, who reported that her husband was active in his prison life. She also made a request for contributions to CFMS and a collection was taken.



On June 26, 1967, the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit rendered a decision denying MORTON SOBELL's appeal and affirming the opinion of United States District Judge Weinfeld dated February 14, 1967.

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APPENDIX

LITTLE RED SCHOOL HOUSE AND ELIZABETH IRWIN HIGH SCHOOL

Records of the New York State Department of Education, Albany, New York, disclose that the Little Red School House, 196-198 Bleeker Street, New York, New York, was granted a provisional charter to operate as an educational institution on November 17, 1932, by the New York State Board of Regents and an absolute charter on May 20, 1938. The records also disclosed that the school operated a nursery and elementary school at the Bleeker Street address and the Elizabeth Irwin High School at 40 Carlton Street, New York, New York.

A source advised on May 4, 1953, that the Little Red School House, while not actually controlled by the Communist Party (CP), was however controlled by the influence of the instructors and parents, the majority of whom were CP members.

During October, 1956, several sources, who are acquainted with CP activities in the New York City area, advised they knew of no affiliation between the CP and the above-mentioned schools at that time.

Some informants familiar with certain phases of CP activity in the NYC area were contacted in October, 1959, and advised they had no information indicating a renewed interest by the CP in the above-mentioned schools.
