CITIZENS COMMITTEE TO PRESERVE AMERICAN FREEDOMS

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations", revised, December 1, 1961, pp.43-44, describes this committee as follows:

"The Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms * * * specializes in propaganda aimed at abolishing the Committee on Un-American Activities and discrediting the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Created in Los Angeles in 1952, the front organization is run by FRANK WILKINSON. an identified Communist who recently resumed the full-time, paid post of executive secretary after approximately a year's leave of absence to assist in a similar campaign by another front in New York City, the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee.

"When the Committee on Un-American Activities held hearings in Los Angeles, September 2-5, 1958, to inquire into the nature of the Party's recent reorganization in California, the Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms sponsored a series of public meetings to protest the hearings and the very existence of the Committee. Communists subpoensed as witnesses were guests of honor.

"At this time, leaders of the party's Southern California District, were mobilizing Communists in the area for participation in an intensified campaign to abolish this committee of Congress. How the Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms served the party in this effort was revealed by (Communist Party) District Chairman DOROTHY HEALEY in a report to the party's Southern California District Council on September 21, 1958. Mrs. HEALEY declared that the party preferred public protest meetings to be held by the Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms rather than under party auspices because Communists could attend without danger of being exposed as members of the She also noted that Communists scheduled as congressional committee witnesses could not appear beforehand at openly Communist rallies without creating the impression that the party was conspiring with witnesses to withhold information from the committee."





"On Feb. 22, 1964 I attended a program at the home of DAVID GOIDBERG, 400 Fountain St., New Haven, Conn. This gathering was for the purpose of raising funds to carry on MORTON SOBELL's quest for release from prison. JOHN MARSALKA introduced DAVID GOLDBERG as the prime mover of the 'Committee for Social Action', who rose and read a short poem by CLARENCE DARROW. This poem said in effect that people cannot expect perfect justice but must keep trying to attain it if not for themselves then for other.

"A 30 minute film was shown depicting interviews with several persons who all invariably stated that the 30 year sentence was all out proportion. This film was made by professionals who we were led to believe all donated their services.

"HELEN SUBELL was then introduced and spoke for about an hour telling the circumstances surrounding her husband's arrest, that is the immediate circumstances. She described the effect on her son who is now 14½ years old but it was very noticeable to me that she didn't go into SOBELL's life previous to his arrest,

read quite a bit about SOBELL in the National Guardian and have received requests for donations in the mails from time to time and didn't actually learn anything new from her talk.

"Mrs. SOBELL was in Europe last year or the year before and had a folio full of clippings taken from newspaper in Italy, England & France.

"LOU ZEMEL had preceded her in Europe to lay the groundwork as she put it and she was very well received. I also noticed that not once did she mention the Soviet Union.

"LOU ZEMEL then got up to speak and also to act as the fund-raiser.



"She spoke ofher trip to Europe last year and had many newspaper and magazine clippings in a portfolio which she showed to her audience.







APPENDIX

COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR MORTON SOBELL

A source advised on August 19, 1953, that the Los Angeles Sobell Committee is the Los Angeles, California, affiliate of captioned organization.

Following the execution of atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENDING in June, 1953, the "Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBELL," the ROSENBERGS' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg case - a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953 and "then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case."



In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the current name, "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell," first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

> Big Meeting At Cooper Union Calls For by A. STRAUSS Liberation of Morton Sobell

Three thousand signatures on petitions to free Morton Sobell, victim of the 1951 Mc Carthy-hysteria, were presented to his wife, Helen Sobell, at a big meeting at Cooper Union, on Thursday evening, April 23rd. Sobell has been behind bars for fourteen years on a 30 year sentence. The almost one thousand people gave an ovation to the appeal by Mrs. Sobell, (whose two children were seated on the platform), that they continue to collect thousands of signatures in this country, and abroad, demanding the liberation of her husband and the father of his two children.

Pointing out that it was Roy Cohn, who is now being tried for perjury and denying facts, who, as assistant prosecutor, helped in the conspiracy against Ethel and Julius Rosenberg and against her husband, Morton Sobell, that after they illegally kidnapped Sobell, they requested that he testify against the Rosenbergs, then they would not try him and he would be freed of the charges.

Mr. Marshall Perlin, chief Sobell defense lewyer, in a powerful speech, related that on his last visit to his client, a short time ago, at the Springfield Jail, in Missouri, he found Sobell in better health. He pointed our that Sobell categorically refused to make any concessions what soever in conjunction with the fight to free himself — and that the only condition for his liberation is a full person and lifting of the charges that he participated in espionage against the land of his birth - the United States.

Powerful speeches were also delivered by: the famous intellectual, Prof. Fred. Rodell, of Yale University, who demanded that Roy Cohn now fill Morton Sobell's jail cell; Dr. B. Dunham, who pointed out that the conscience of America must be aroused by the frightful injustice of keeping an innocent peace-fighter in jail on the basis of a Mc Carthy-false-accusation of espionage.

Chairlady Donna Allen read telegrams from the famous authors and humanists, Bertrand Russell, Arnold Wesser, author of "Chips With Everything"; Robert Bolt, author of "A Man For All Seasons"; and from the president of Local #142, Longshoremen's Union, in Hawaii, who demanded the liberation of Morton Sobell in the name of the 22,000 members of his union.

The theme of the rally was SOBELL's innocence.

DONNA ALLEN, from Washington D.C., was the chairman. Mrs ALLEN indicated that the government killed the ROSENEERGS, therefore, how can they free SOBELL. She pointed out that the prosecuting attorney at the trial, ROY COHN, is presently on trial himself for fraud and perjury.

MARSHALL PERLIN followed Mrs ALLEN. Mr PERLIN reviewed the trial, pointing out the kidnapping from Mexico, the only witness, a perjurer, who connected SOBELL with the ROSENBERGS. Mr PERLIN indicated that the government told SOBELL plead guilty and they would be easy on him.

COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR MORTON SOBELL

A source advised on August 19, 1963, that the Los Angeles Sobell Committee is the Los Angeles, California, affiliate of captioned organization.

Following the execution of atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG in June, 1953, the "Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBELL," the ROSENBERGS' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Roseberg case a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953 and "then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case."

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the current name, "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell," first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

The Address Telephone Directory for the Borough of Manhattan, New York City, as published by the New York Telephone Company on April 16, 1963, lists the "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" as being located at 940 Broadway, New York, New York.
