

Information has been recently received to the effect that Joel Barr may have acted as a Soviet espionage agent in the United States prior to leaving the United States for Sweden in January, 1948. / U

Joel Barr was born January 1, 1916 in Brooklyn, New York. He attended elementary and high school in New York and from February, 1934 to June, 1938 attended City College of New York, graduating with a B.S.E.E. Degree. From October, 1938 to March, 1940 he was employed by the MPA in New York City as a junior draftsman. From April 1940 to July 1940 he was employed as a topographic draftsman by the Civil Aeronautics Authority in Washington, D. C. He was employed from July 1, 1940 to February 23, 1942 as an assistant electrical engineer at Fort Mormouth, New Jersey. He was dismissed after an investigation reflected he had signed a Communist petition for Peter Cacchione on August 9, 1939. Barr was employed as an engineer for the Hestern Klectric Company, 100 Central Street, Kearny, New Jersey from March 16, 1942 until October 10, 1945. From October, 1946 to May, 1947 he was employed by the Sperry Cyroscope Company, Incorporated, Lake Success, New York as a project engineer. (A)

Joel Barr applied for a United States passport on December 1, 1947, giving the reason for travel abroad as the desire to broaden his background by continuous study in Europe. He stated that he had applied to the University of Delft in Holland and the Kungl Technical University at Stockholm, Sweden. His tentative plans were given for studies for about two years. He desired to leave New York City on January 1, 1948 for Stockholm, Sweden for study of one year and then to go to the University of Delft for the second year. He was issued United States passport No. 133825 on December 8, 1947. It was ascertained in August, 1948 that Barr had been in Sweden but had gone to Finland for about two weeks.



His so-called wife during 1944 was one Elaine Coldfarb who lived with Barr at 145 Broadway, Iong Branch, New Jersey. Her present whereabouts are not known. The records of the Tuller Construction Company, 95 Mormouth Avenue, Red Bank, New Jersey, reflect that her name was spelled as Isine Coldfarb, that she was an American citizen, born on May 2, 1920, and the holder of Social Security card #577-22-6246. She was employed as a stonographer by this company from November 25, 1940, to April 11, 1941.



According to PERL, BARR made efforts to sell his motorcycleprior to departure but same was left at his former residence among his personal effects. BARR'S former landlady expected him to return sometime in the future but BARR did not leave any forwarding address.

Mrs. REBECCA BARR, 241 West 97th Street, New York City, mother of the subject, was interviewed by Special Agents DOUGLAS P. WHITE and FREDERICK C. BAUCKHAM on August 3, 1950 and advised that she had not heard from the subject in over a year. She stated that she does not write at all, not being able to, and reads very little, which is the reason she does not hear from her son. She advised that she had no idea as to his present address or any place that he might have intended to go to.

/ She stated that she has two other sons, namely BERNARD, and ARTHUR BARR, who work at 20 West 22nd Street, in the Bargo Press Company. She also has a daughter by the name of IRIS GILBERT or GILBOARD, who recently married, and is now living in Boston.

BERNARD BARR, 20 West 22nd Street, New York City, was interviewed on August 7, 1950 by Special Agents EDVARD C. MORGAN, JR, and FREDERICK C. BAUCKHAM and advised that he had not heard from the subject in over six months, and had no idea as to his present address. He stated he was never very close to the subject as he was older than JOEL and consequently knew very little about his activities. He recalled that JOEL had a girl friend by the name of VIVIAN, but could not recall the last name.

In regard to JOEL'S trip to Europe, he recalled that JOEL sold an automobile, phonograph records and his personal belongings to raise enough money to make this trip. He understood that JOEL was going to Europe to study music.

DAVID GREENGLASS, a self confessed Soviet espionage agent, in an interview conducted July 17, 1950 by Special Agents JOHN W. LEWIS and IEO H. FRUTKIN, stated that JULIUS ROSENBERG came to him and told him he would

have to leave the country. ROSENEERG, according to GREENGLASS, was a Soviet Agent who recruited GREENGLASS to do espionage for the Russians. GREENGLASS said he refused to leave the United States and when HARTY COLD'S picture appeared in the papers in connection with his arrest ROSENBERG came to him again and said that this was the man who contacted him in Albuquerque.
ROSENEERG again said he would have to leave the country and that more important persons than GREENGLASS have left the country already, such as JOEL BARR, who had left before FUCHS was arrested in England, and is doing work for the Pussians overseas.

Mrs. RUTH GREENGLASS, wife of DAVID GREENGLASS, on the same day advised Special Agents JOHN A. HARRINGTON and WILLIAM F. NORTON that JOEL BARR had a girl friend named VIVIAN, last name unknown, who is a social worker and formerly worked for the National Maritime Union in 1944 or 1945 and subsequent to that time worked for the Jewish Philanthropy. RUTH said that in about 1945 VIVIAN lived on the Northwest corner of Fifth Street and Avenue "C", New York City.

In interviews with DAVID GREENGLASS, conducted by Special Agents JOEN W. LETTS and LEO H. FRUTKIN, GREENGLASS has stated that when JOEL BARR left the United States, probably in 1949 JULIUS ROSENBERG told DAVID GREENGLASS that JOEL BARR had gone to Europe to study music under the famous composer SIBELIUS, who wrote "Finlandia". After the arrest of KLAUS FUCHS, JULIUS ROSENBERG told DAVID GREENGLASS, in February, 1950, that JOEL BARR had left the United States to do espionage work for the Russians in Europe and that BAPR had been one of ROSENBERG'S espionage contacts in the United States

GREENGLASS also stated that ROSENBERG told him that BARR is using his music studies as a cover for his espionage activities. GREENGLASS further advised that JOEL BARR is a very close friend of JULIUS ROSENBERG.

On July 25, 1950, JAMES'YATES was interviewed at 227 West 11th Street, New York City, by Special Agents ROBERT F. ROYAL and HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN, JR., and he advised that in connection with the store located at 227 West 11th Street, in about the latter part of 1946 a friend told him that the shop at 227 West 11th Street might be available for renting. He thereupon went to 227 West 11th Street and met JOEL BARR.

YATES identified a photograph of JOEL BARR shown to him by the Agents as the individual he knew as JOEL BARR.

YATES continued that he told BARR that he needed a place to work and when BARR told him he would let him use the shop if YATES would pay half the rent which was \$32.50 per month, he decided to work them and conducted his radio business. TATES continued that BARR had never mentioned anyone by the name of AIFRED SARANT to him, but that he saw the sign "SARANT LABORATORIES" on the window of the store and on all papers and letterheads lying around the store.

YATES further stated that BARR told him that he was not using the store but just had his things there. YATES said that after agreeing to BARR'S proposition he moved his equipment, which he described as a Tubetester, Signal-tracer, Signal Generator, Scope, and a few radios into the shop. He described the equipment that BARR had there as a work-bench with a wooden top, various tools and a large metal drill-press. YATES stated that the shop was very dirty and looked like it had not been used for a time. YATES said that he fixed radio sets at this place for about two months paying half of the \$32.50 rent to BARR in each.

He stated that BARR was not in the shop more than two or three times during these two menths and when BARR was in the shop he worked on a signal-tester that he was building. YATES continued that two menths after he started paying his rent a truck came and picked up the drill-press, a few tools and boxes which was everything that BARR had in the shop at the time and took them away. He could not describe the truck or give any information that would indicate the destination of this equipment, and he said he never saw BARR again. He stated that he never observed any photographic equipment in the shop and never at any time saw BARR with a camera.

FRANK GIBSON, Elevator Man, 241 West 7th Street, New York City, was contacted August 3, 1950 and advised that to his knowledge JOEL BANK had not returned to that address nor had he seen any mail coming to that address from Europe. One of GIBSON'S duties is to sort and deliver mail to the occupants of the building and in this way he can observe all mail going to BARR'S mether. GIBSON also advised that Mrs. BARR'S daughter IRIS GILEOARD, and her son-in-law (HAROLD), to his knowledge lived in Boston, Messachusetts.

VIVIAL GLASSMAN in an interview conducted August 3, 1950, at her rusidenco, 131 East 7th Street, Now York City, by Special Agents RICHARD T. HRADSKY and ROBERT F. ROYAL, advised that on July 21, 1950 at about 8 p.m. a man knocked on her apartment door and stated that he was a friend. This

stranger asked her if she knew JOHN" and when she said "no" he made reference to JOEL BARR and she advised that BARR was her former fiance. The stranger then stated by way of identifying himself that at one time he was going to help BARR go to Europe. She stated that although she did not know this man she thought she could trust him as long as he was a friend of JOEL BARR'S.

This stranger then asked her if she would go to Cleveland to visit her friend an aeronautical engineer who was interested in her sister. She believed that he was referring to her sister ELEANOR who was very fond of WILLIAM PERI. The stranger told her to tell PERL to go to Mexico and he gave her a roll of money and stated, here is \$2,000. He then departed.

She advised, in brief, that she took this trip to Cleveland and that WILLIAM PERL told her that she must be crazy to get mixed up in such a deal and told her to return to New York and wash her hands of the whole affair.

On the evening of July 27, 1950 she advised that the stranger again appeared at her apartment and asked her if she had gone to Cleveland and she related what PERL had told her, returned the \$2,000 and asked him not to come back. Thereupon the stranger departed.

She advised with regards to JOEL BARR that when BARR was planning to go to France to study in 1947 she also planned to go to France to study. She said she had reservations on one steamship line and he had reservations on another. When he learned that she was going to France, he changed his reservations to the line on which she had reservations. VIVIAN GLASSMAN stated that she thought BARR was going to marry her but had not done so by the sailing time and she cancelled her steamship reservations and they had personal differences. She stated that BARR has never corresponded with her since that time nor has she written to him.

On July 22, 1950 Special Agents PAUL J. BLASCO and MICHALFI MC DOWAGH reviewed the Manhattan Telephone Directory's at the New York Public Library at 42nd Street and Fifth Avenue, for the years 1940 to 1950 against the name of JOEL BARR but found no listing under that name.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known relimbility, was shown the photograph of JOEL BARR but was unable to recognize him.

Miss WEIR SPENCE, on July 25, 1950 was contacted by SA'S HERMAN C. LITTLEJOHN, JR, and ROBERT F. ROYAL and when shown the picture of JOEL BARR identified him as the individual entering and leaving the ALFRED SARANT apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City from the time of its occupancy up to about two years ago.

Mr. ALLEN MANZAVINOS, 86 Madison Avenue, New York City, advised that he had been a fellow student at C.C.N.Y. with JULIUS ROSENBERG and that he believed JOEL BARR, WILLIAM MUTTERPERL and MAY ELITCHER, were all in a leftist group at the university.



Also she attended a State Personnel Training Course for Party Leadership, CPA in 1945.

The New York Office has a closed Security Tatter case concerning LADE FRIEDMAN, was. the last report of which is dated October 26, 1948 or (Bufile 100-333728) and at that time there was no indication she was active in the Communist Party. Since that time nothing has come to the attention of the New York Office indicating any activity in the Communist Party.

It should be noted that FIAIR CTID ARB posed as the wife of the subject during 1940 and 1941 at Long Branch, New Jersey when subject was located at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey and employed by the Signal Service at large. GCID ARB married GEORGE MORRISTED AR on May 29, 1942.

business consisted of a machine which JULIUS ROSEMBERG built for him when ROSENBERG operated the Pitt Machine Company of 370 East Houston Street, New York City. BERNARD BARK further advised that he was very dissatisfied with the machine which had caused him a lot of trouble and that he had had a fight with ROSENBERG concerning the price. He never had any more dealings with ROSENBERG and had not seen him since. (U)

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised that JOEL BARR had applied for a \$2500 loan from the Chase National Bank, 18 Pine Street, New York City, on March 1, 1947. At that time, BARR indicated that he was 31 years of age, single, with no dependents, and resided at Penthouse Apartment, 15K, 241 West 97th Street, New York City, for the past four years. His previous residence was 85 Bristol Street, Brooklyn. He indicated that he had been employed for the last four months by the Sperry Gyroscope Corporation, Lake Success, as a project engineer, Repair Department, at a salary of \$5400 per annum. He gave his previous employment as an engineer with the Western Electric Company, Kearny, New Jersey, from March 1942 to October 1945.

BARR further indicated that he maintained a special checking account at the 96th Street Branch of the National City Bank of New York, and he maintained a \$5000 life insurance with the Hartford Travellers. He stated he owned no real estate or automobile at that time. He gave the purpose for this loan the desire to repay Mr. THOMAS WALLEN, 165 Rutland Road, Hempstead, New York, who was a personal friend. He further stated that WALLEN'S loan amounted to \$3500 and the present balance was \$2500. A co-maker for this proposed loan was given as BERNARD BARR, who was the brother of JOEL BARR. The loan was rejected because the present co-maker was not satisfactory and the bank heard nothing further from JOEL BARR. (U)

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that on March 5, 1945, a loan in the amount of \$540 was made by the Industrial Bank of Commerce, 5 Union Square, New York City, to a Miss JOEL BARR, 241 West 97th Street. This informant believed that this was a clerical error and the word Miss had been inserted on the card. Because the records at the bank on loan applications had been destroyed, he could not verify this. The comaker on this loan was given as ALFREDYSARANT, 65 Morton Street, New York City, telephone number ER 9-9300. A check issued for this loan was endorsed first by JOEL BARR and secondly by ROSEYBARR, and was received for deposit by the National City Bank, New York City, on March 8, 1945. (A)

In addition to the above loan, Confidential Informant T-2 advised that there had been additional loans of \$115.56 made September 29, 1941 and \$153.41 made November 27, 1941 to JOEL BARR.

In interviews with ALFRED SARANT, SARANT Advised that in regards to the Sarant Laboratory located at 227 West 11th Street, that BARR located the building at this address and that he and BARR jointly rented the place. He stated that they used it as a work shop and that BARR had had gold letters placed on the window of the building indicating the name Sarant Laboratories. He further stated that BARR and himself had bought a lathe for about \$160 and a bench with steel legs and a wooden top for this laboratory. (U

SARANT further advised that in regards to the apartment at 65 Morton Street that he had received rent from either JOEL BARR or WILLIAM PERL (U)

but he could not recall which one. He stated he and BARR shared the apartment originally, but he gave up the apartment when he went to Ithaca, New York in September 1946.

Mrs. ALFRED, SARANT was also interviewed and advised that she knew JOEL BARR and had been on a canoe trip in the fall or late summer of 1945. She stated that she did not know if BARR was a member of the Communist Party although she admitted that she had been in 1944 and 1945. She stated that she never saw BARR or her husband making document photographs in the apartment at 65 Morton Street. (U)

In the subsequent interviews, ALFRED SARANT advised that BARR possessed a Leica camera in 1944 and 1945. He stated he had no knowledge of where BARR obtained this camera and further advised that BARR did some portrait work in the apartment at 65 Morton Street, but never did any document work. He said they also did some developing together. (U)

Mr. RONALD EUGENE RORDIC, 12-01 12th Street, Fairlawn, New Jersey, was interviewed at his office, 1100 McGraw-Hill Building, 330 West 42nd Street, New York City, by SA HERMAN LITTLEJOHN. Mr. BURDIC advised that he had been a resident of apartment 6H at 65 Morton Street, New York City, from approximately the fall of 1941 until February 1946. He stated while he was a resident at this address he met ALFRED SARANT and JOEL BARR. He further stated that to all appearances, SARANT and BARR shared the apartment 6I at this address.

Mr. BURDIC continued that during the summer months while the doors of the apartments at 65 Morton Street were generally left open, he and his wife heard classicial music being played on a phonograph in the SARANT apartment and because of the mutual interest in such music, he and his wife became friendly with ALFRED SARANT. He further stated that he and his wife had been invited to the SARANT'S apartment before SARANT'S marriage and that there only had been JOEL BARR and SARANT in the apartment. After SARANT'S marriage, however, Mr. BURDIC said that the apartment was occupied by Mr. and Mrs. SARANT only.

Mr. BURDIC further related that he had been told about an old store that BARR and SARANT had rented where they could conduct experiments. He

said they both felt that they had inventive genius in the electronics field. He stated that after SARANT'S marriage, JOEL BARR appeared to stop visiting the SARANT apartment and he saw very little of them. (ω)

The father and brothers of ALFRED SARANT, namely, Mr. N. G. SARANT, GEORGE RICHARD, SARANT, and WILLIAM, SARANT were interviewed by SAS DANIEL F. O'CONNOR and FREDERICK C. BAUCKHAM and the only information they could furnish was that they had met JOEL BARR a few times when he came out to visit with ALFRED SARANT. They had no knowledge of JOEL BARR'S background or activities. (4)

In interviews conducted with MAX FLITCHER, ELITCHER stated that he knew BARR at College of the City of New York, but did not associate with him. He recalled that BARR graduated from the College of the City of New York in 1938 with a degree in engineering. He did not see BARR from 1938 until about 1944 or 1945, at which time he was brought in contact with BARR again through JULIUS ROSENBERG. (4)

ELITCHER stated that BARR was intelligent, capable, sociable and good company and he and his wife, HELENTELITCHER, both liked BARR. He further stated that he associated with JOEL BARR on two visits to ALFRED SARANT'S apartment, inasmuch as BARR was present and was a close friend of ALFRED SARANT. He also recalled that BARR was present on one occasion at a social gathering in the home of JULIUS ROSENBERG some time around the end of the year 1946. ELITCHER could not recall meeting BARR except at social functions. He also advised that BARR appeared to be very close to JULIUS ROSENBERG, although he thought that BARR was superior to ROSENBERG intellectually. (U)

ELITCHER was able to recall on one occasion when he and his wife went to the home of BARR'S parents which he said was located west of Broadway around 99th Street in New York City. He said at the time there was a small party in progress and to the best of his recollection, WILLIAM FERL was present at this party, but ROSENBERG was not. He further recalled that after refreshments had been served at BARR'S house, they decided to go to see JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife. Thereafter, he said he and his wife with JOEL BARR and WILLIAM PERL went to JULIUS ROSENBERG'S apartment and he believed when they arrived there that MORTON SOBELL was also present. ELITCHER could furnish no further information concerning BARR.

DAVIL GREENGLASS when interviewed on August 31, 1950 by SA LEO H. FRUTKIN advised that he recalled while the G & R Engineering Company was still /U)

in existence, JOEL BARR came in a few times to use the lathe to make some bushings for a fishing rod or something of that nature. GREENGLASS also recalled that JOEL BARR used to putter at a bench in the rear of the G & R shop working on what appeared to be a radio chassis. GREENGLASS stated that BARR was never employed by the G & R Engineering Company. (U)

Mrs. RUTH SHEENGLASS, wife of DAVID GREENGLASS, in an interview by SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON, advised that one night during the Christmas holidays of 1947, she was in ETHEL ROSENBERG'S apartment and that VIVIAN GLASSMAN and JOEL BARR were also there. She recalled that VIVIAN brought clothes, including ski pants, sweaters and other heavy clothes for ETHEL who was going on a vacation with her husband, JULIUS. RUTH stated that she knew nothing else about this proposed vacation. She stated that at most she saw VIVIAN on four or five occasions, but that ETREL ROSENBERG spoke about her quite often, indicating that she was going out with VIVIAN. (1)

Mrs. GREENGLASS recalled on one occasion when DAVID and she had little funds and apparently JULIUS and ETHEL also had little funds, JOEL BARR and VIVIAN came to ETHEL'S house and BARR bought the whole dinner for everybody. She said that ETHEL told her about this. She stated that on another occasion about two and a half years ago when she was in ETHEL'S house, JOEL BARR and VIVIAN came to the house and brought ETHEL a pressure cooker. She further stated that she did not think that JOEL BARR was working with JULIUS ROSENBERG because BARR seemed to have money and to be on the same level with JULIUS ROSENBERG.

During the interviews with FLOYD EIWYN, Sr., former Superintendent of 65 Morton Street when he was shown a photograph of JOEL BARR, he advised that this could be a photograph of a man or his twin who used to visit with two single girls who resided in apartment 60 at 85 Barrow Street from 1938 to 1942. He stated that this man was called FMADMAN and that FELDMAN received mail at that address either in the care of the two girls mentioned above or in the care of ARTHUR/GRAVES, apartment 1-0, 85 Barrow Street. ELWYN stated that GRAVES had admitted to him personally that he was "Red and Red as hell" in 1938.

A search of ALFRED SARANT'S home at Cayuga Heights Road, RD #1, Ithaca, New York, was conducted after he executed a waiver of search authorizing SAS JOHN D. MAHONEY and PETER F. MAXSON to make such a search. The search disclosed a photograph of IRIS BARR, JOEL BARR and JOEL BARR with VIVIAN GLASSMAN. There was also a letter of five pages dated January 28, 1945 addressed "Dear JOE" signed GIL. The subject stated that this letter was to JOEL BARR from GHAGOODMAN who worked or lived in Bayonne, New Jersey.

Mr. STANLEY ROBERT RICH was interviewed in Hartford, Connecticut, August 28, 1950 by SAS LEO FRUTKIN and JOHN HARRINGTON with SA EDWARD R. WHALEN of the New Haven office, and RICH advised in this interview that he only recalled BARR as a fellow student at the College of the City of New York with whom he had little contact and he had not seen him since graduation from the College of the City of New York.

The photograph of BARR was exhibited to the following people, but they could not identify him: HARRY GOLD, ALFRED DEAN SLACK, ELIZABETH BENTLEY, J. DAVID WHITTAKER CHAMBERS and WARK GRAUBAPD, who has admitted that he was engaged in Russian espionage in the 1930's.

Confidential Informants T-3 and T-4, both of known reliability, were also shown the photograph of BAIR, but could not identify him. (U

WALLOGIEC NUTT was also shown the photograph of BARR and although he stated he knew VULIUS ROSENBERG, he could not identify the photograph of BARR. (U)



It is noted that on Page 5 of referenced report information is set out concerning delivery to Mrs. Rebecca Barr, 241 West 97th Street, Ecv York City, of a letter addressed to Miss Below Kaln, care of Mrs. Barr. The addressor of this letter is W. Berg, Brackenhill Ec. 40, Eig Barn Lane, Mansfield, Wales. Wrtel of September 6, 1950, advised that your files contain no information regarding Belon Kaln. Your office apparently has conducted no investigation to determine her identity, and referenced report sets out no leads for that purpose.

In view of the information developed to date regarding subject, and particularly the statement reportedly made by Julius Bosenberg to Buth Greenglass in the late Spring of 1950 that Joel Barr was in Europe working for the Russians and using his music studies as a cover for espionage, all leads to locate Barr must be given careful attention. Accordingly, you should discreetly identify Bolen Kalm and thereafter determine whether further investigation of her appears warranted. Bureau files contain no identifiable fata regarding Helen Kalm.

Our Legal Attache in London has been informed of subject's background and probable espicator involvement, and is presently attempting to determine whether W. Barg may be identical with subject.

By letter from New York to the Dureau dated 7/24/50, captioned ANATOLI ANTUNOVICE YAROVLEY, was, ESPICEAGE - R, the Her York Office advised that stops were being placed by the basington Field Office with the U. S. Customs Service and Immigration and Saturalisation Service at all ports of entry and departure from the United States.

As of 9/22/50 no stops have been received here by the Customs Service or Immigration and Naturalization Service at the Port of San Juan to be placed against this subject.

This information is brought to the attention of the Burem and the office of origin in view of the fact that air lines operating direct from Europe use San Juan as their United States port of entry, and in addition, several foreign air lines operate directly from Europe to maighboring islands in the Caribbean which connect with Puerto Rico through feeder lines. In addition many foreign vessels from European ports sake their United States entry at the port of San Juan, or the free port at St. Thomas, Virgin Islands.

In view of the above it has been felt that the delay in having stops placed at this port could be very detrimental to the successful investigation of this case, and local stops have been placed by this office.

By letter from New York to Washington Field dated 8/50, this office was advised that similar stops with Immigration and Katuralization Service, and the United States Customs Service were being placed against subject JOEL BARR.

It was determined on 9/22/50 that a stop had been placed against BARR with the U. S. Customs Service, but up to date no stop had been received by the District Office of the Immigration and Maturalization Service.



PURPOSE

To recommend the authorization for the New York Office .to interview Laine Friedman, nee Laine Goldfarb, for information concerning Joel Barr.

BACKGROUND

G. 1, 7, -10

You will recall that Joel Barr has been implicated as part of the espionage network headed by Julius Rosenberg. Barr's last known address was in Paris, France. His present whereabouts are unknown. During our investigation of him information was developed that during the early 1940's he was living with a woman by the name of Laine Goldfarb, who was purported to be his wife. However, in 1944 Barr was allegedly going with Vivian Glassman, who also has been implicated in the Rosenberg network.

An investigation of Laine Goldfarb has reflected Communist Party activities on her part, the most important of which being that she was President of the Queensbridge Club, CPA, in January, 1945, and had attended the State Personnel Training Course for Party leadership, CPA, in 1945.

A review also has been made of the Bufiles regarding this woman without developing any information which would indicate that she is or has been engaged in espionage activities.

RECOMMENDATION

It is believed desirable to interview this woman for information concerning Joel Barr because of her alleged close association with him. This recommendation is being made notwithstanding the Communist Party activities on the part of this woman as it is not felt that we can in any way jeopardize our investigation, as members of the Rosenberg network are aware of our interest in Joel Barr.

There is attached for your approval a teletype to the New York Office authorizing their interview of this woman.

SUBJECT: SPECIAL SECTION OF THE SECURITY INDEX

65-59453

PURPOSE:

To provide for a review of all cases involving subjects currently in the Special Section of the Security Index for the purpose of determining whether or not they are properly included therein and to provide for instructions to be issued to the field to submit information in summary type reports suitable for distribution concerning these subjects.

CENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

As you are aware, the Special Section of the Security Index contains the names of individuals who should be given special consideration as to the desirability of their apprehension in the event of hostilities. This Special Section is broken down into six categories as follows:

Espionage Subjects
Government Employees
Prominent Individuals
Atomic Energy Employees
Foreign Government Employees
United Nations Personnel

There are over 200 names in the Special Section and since the Bureau will be taking the responsibility for allowing these people to be at large after the start of hostilities while separate consideration is given to the desirability of apprehending them, the investigative files regarding these subjects should be examined now, for the purpose of determining whether the national security might better be served by including the names of various individuals now in the Special Section along with the others in the Security Index.

Each Supervisor should review those cases of individuals assigned to him who are now in the Special Section of the Security Index to determine if they are properly included therein. At the conclusion of the review, each case should be the subject of a memorandum which will indicate why the name should be deleted from the Special Section or why the name should be continued in the Special Section. These memorands will then be correlated by Supervisor Whitson, Room 1647, and a summary memorandum of recommendations will be prepared.

It will then be necessary for each Supervisor to whom any of the subjects now included in the Special Section of the Security Index are assigned to issue instructions to the Field for summary type reports concerning those subjects to be continued in the Special Section so that these reports will be readily available for dissemination in the event of an emergency. These instructions should also provide that periodic reports suitable for dissemination be submitted covering the activities of those subjects retained in the Special Section.

With regard to those individuals who are to be deleted from the Special Section and placed in the Security Index for apprehension in the event of an emergency, each Supervisor, in reviewing his case files should determine whether reports now in the file are suitable for dissemination. If necessary, the Field should be instructed to prepare a summary type report suitable for dissemination on such subjects as are being placed in the regular Security Index.

Factors to Consider in Connection with Review:

With regard to all subjects now in the Special Section of the Security Index, you should consider the following five factors in determining whether they should be continued in the Special Section:

- 1. Is the category in which they are placed supported by the facts of the case?
- 2. Are any members of their households in the Security Index? If so, are they in the Special Section?
 - 3. Have we ever attempted to interview the subject?
- 4. Could we adequately cover the subject's activities during the opening days of hostilities?
- 5. With regard to the application of the Emergoncy Detention Act of 1950, do we have evidence of the following:
- A. Instructions or assignment in the Espionage, Counterespionage or Sabotage service or procedures of a foreign country, foreign political party or the Communist Party, USA.
- B. Any past acts of Espionage or Sabotage or participation in any attempt or conspiracy to commit Espionage or Sabotage.
- C. Holding of membership at any time after January 1, 1949 in the Communist Party, USA or any other organization seeking the overthrow of the Government of the United States by force or violence.

Espionage subjects are in the Special Section because:

- l. Apprehension would destroy chances of penetration and control of an operating Soviet Espionage parallel, or
- 2. Apprehension would destroy known chances of penetration and control of a "sleeper" parallel.

Additional considerations with regard to Espionage subjects are:

- 1. Can we present the facts concerning the subject's Espionage activity to the Attorney General now?
- 2. If subject is a member of the Communist Party, USA, or an official of a party front, are others in a comparable position in the Communist Party, USA, or front in his locality in the Security Index?
- 3. Do we have sufficient data exclusive of the subject's Espionage connections to hold the subject under the Detention Program?
- 4. Is the subject employed by a foreign government or employed by or accredited to an international organization?

Government employees are in the Special Section because:

- 1. The case is still pending under the Loyalty Program, or
- 2. The case has been determined in the subject's favor by the Loyalty Board.

Additional consideration to be given Government employees is the question of whether our investigation has developed additional evidence or pertinent information since the last referral to the Government Board.

Also, in the case of Government employees, is there any logical objection to presenting the name of the Government employee, at this time, to the Attorney General for inclusion on his Master Warrant of Arrest?



Prominent individuals are in the Special Section because:

- 1. Apprehension might be attended by considerable publicity tending to make a martyr of the subject, or
- 2. Apprehension might affect adversely other persons not on the Security Index who are necessary to the war effort.

Additional considerations in regard to prominent individuals are as follows:

- 1. Why, specifically, is the subject considered a prominent individual?
- 2. Is the person whom the subject's arrest might affect adversely still necessary to the war effort?
- 3. What elements need to be developed in order to make the case against the subject a strong case?
- 4. What could the subject reasonably be expected to do during the first few days of hostilities that could injure the United States and thereby embarrass the Bureau, assuming he was not apprehended at the outset of the Detention Program?
- 5. What is the reasonable chance of developing data sufficient to make a strong case in the first few days after the outbreak of hostilities?

Atomic Energy employees are in the Special Section because their apprehension must be cleared with Atomic Energy Commission representatives in order to avoid interference with Atomic Energy work. With regard to these individuals, the following additional matters should be considered:

- 1. Is the subject working for the Atomic Energy Commission, for a contractor, or for a subcontractor? If so, where?
 - 2. Does the subject have access to restricted material?
 - 3. Does the subject have access to restricted areas?

Foreign Government employees are in the Special Section because we can only apprehend those employed by Governments with which we are at war. Additional matters to be considered in connection with



- 1. Is the subject secretly serving the Soviets though in the employ of a nonsatellite nation which may be friendly or neutral in the event of war?
- 2. Does the subject have access to classified material which might relate to the conduct of the war by the United States and its allies?


United Nations and international organization employees are in the Special Section by reason of the fact that they are employees of international organizations regardless of their national origin, and notification must be given to the Secretary of the United Nations regarding their detention.


In reviewing cases involving United Nations employees regardless of their national origin, you should consider the advisability of presenting their names at this time to the Attorney General for inclusion in his master Warrant of Arrest in order that he can take the necessary steps regarding notification to the Department of State and the United Nations in the event of emergency.

ACTION:

Memoranda regarding each of the subjects assigned to any Supervisor should be submitted no later than the close of business Wednesday, October 11, 1950. The memoranda should contain a recommendation to continue the individual subject in the Special Section or should contain a recommendation that he be removed from the Special Section and placed in the regular Security Index. Each memorandum should show that consideration has been given to each of the items set forth in the preceding portion of these instructions.

Instructions to the field regarding summaries will be sent after the correlated summary is approved.





Reference is made to your memorandum dated June 30, 1949, number 30 DB-14407a, concerning captioned subject.

It has now been ascertained that in connection with his attempts to persuade David and Ruth Greenglass to flee from the United States immediately after the arrest of Harry Gold on May 23, 1950, Julius Rosenberg told them that more important people than they had already left the country, that Joel Barr was then in Europe working for the Russians, and that Barr was using his music studies as a gover for espionage activity. (U) RECORDED - 6

Joel Barr was seen by an acquaintance in the Students Cite Cless, Iocated on the corner of Boule vard Malethertes and Boulevard Courcelles in approximately Tune, 1950. Barr told this acquaintance that he was leasting Farist, but avoided giving a direct answer when asked about him intended destination. The individual with phen Borr spoke on this occasion has expressed the opinion that Barr may have returned to Sweden inasmuch as he spoke Swedish fairly well and liked the country.





At 3:00 F.M. on January 19, 1951, SAC Lorton of Houston called to advise that as a result of a stop placed with Customs the Houston Office had just received a call from Customs to state that there is a Barr, first name unknown, scheduled to depart from Houston for Mexico City via Pan-American Airlines at 3:30 F.M., Houston time. This call was, of course, a result of a stop placed on Joel Barr with Customs. (4)



On March 19, 1951, ARTHUR BARR, BERNARD BARR, and ROSE BARR, wife of ARTHUR, were interviewed at 601 Bast 20th Street. New York City, in the apartment of ARTHUR BARR, at 7:30 p.m. by SA RICHARD T. HRADSKY and SA FREDERICK C. BAUCKHAM.

of JOEL BAR in January, 1948, for Paris, that they saw him leave by ship, but the people he shared his quarters with were all strangers to them and they did not believe JOEL knew them either. They said there was a considerable crowd in the room, but they was could not recall knowing anyone or having known anyone previously. They were questioned as to how JOEL raised the money for this trip and they stated that they recalled JOEL sold practically everything he owned, including a collection of musical records. which were considered fairly valuable.

They were also asked if JOEL, had received help from anyone else and specifically from JULIUS ROSENBERG. They advised that they were sure he had not received any other help, and they based this opinion on the fact that he had sold the abovementioned collection of records, which he valued highly. The above question was specifically asked inasmuch as DAVID GREENGIASS, in a very recent interview conducted by Agents RICHARD T. HRADSKY and ROBERT F. ROYAL, stated that JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that he had given money to JOEL BARR to help him on his trip to Europe.:

ARTHUR and ROSE BARR were also asked if they had any knowledge that JOEL BARR had lived at any other residence in the New York City, besides his home, 241 West 97th Street, and 65 Morton Street. They stated that they did not know any other residences than the above, at which JOEL had lived.

They advised that they had been at the address. 65 Morton Street, a few times but had never observed anything COPPENSION TROYEDY photographic equipment. They did not know the

type of camera JOEL owned, and did not know whether he had any equipment which would enable him to take pictures of documents. They further stated that there was always a large group of people in the apartment and it was usually considered a musical get-to-gether.

All three were asked if they knew NATHAN SUSSMAN, and GLADYS MEYER, and were at the same time shown photographs of the above named persons, but they advised that they have never met or heard of either NATHAN SUSSMAN or GLADYS MEYER and they had no knowledge of these individuals.

They also had no knowledge of any parties, which were held at JOEL's home, 241 West 96th Street, and in fact were in doubt that any parties had been held there due to the fact that JOEL and his father did not get along very well, and his father objected to having guests in the home.

They were also asked if they had any knowledge that JOEL was connected with the Communist Party, and they replied that they had never had any indication or knowledge that JOEL was in any way connected with the Communist Party.

In regard to ARTHUR and ROSE BARR's contact with VIVIAN GLASSMAN, they advised that the day after MRS. REBECCA BARR, the mother of JOEL, was contacted by the FBI, ARTHUR's wife, ROSE, contacted some social agencies and finally located GLASSMAN at the United Service For New Americans. They advised they had not seen GLASSMAN up to this time for a long time, but did recall that she worked for some social agency, and that was the reason for ROSE BARR finally locating GLASSMAN through the United Service For New Americans. ROSE BARR advised that she talked to GLASSMAN on the telephone and said they would like to meet with her and discuss why the FBI was interested in JOEL, and possibly find out what it was all about.

Both ARTHUR and ROSE BARR said that they contacted VIVIAN GLASSMAN because she was the only one they could think of who might know something about JOEL, inasmuch as GLASSMAN was a former girlfriend of JOEL, and the only one that they knew of. On the telephone GLASSMAN told ROSE BARR that she also had been visited by the FBI and they made arrangements to meet that night, which was August 4, 1950. Subsequently both ARTHUR and ROSE BARR met GLASSMAN at 23d Street and Third Avenue, in ARTHUR's car,

and they drove to a restaurant somewhere on 29th Street, the name of which they could not recall. GLASSMAN told them right in the beginning that she did not have more than an hour to give then, and in view of the time spent in getting to the restaurant, it turned out to be a very hurried discussion and the only person mentioned by them was JOEL BARR.

ROSE BARR advised that GLASSMAN appeared considerably upset and excited at the time and ROSE admitted that she was in this state also. ROSE stated that she asked GLASSMAN pointblank what the FBI wanted to see MRS. BARR about and why they were interested in JOEL, but GLASSMAN did not give them any answers. They believed that GLASSMAN did mention, however, that it was a serious matter and that she intended to see a lawyer. They did not recall and did not believe that GLASSMAN told them to get a lawyer too. They were sure that GLASSMAN did not tell them not to talk to the FBI until they had seen a lawyer. ROSE further advised that GLASSMAN left within the hour and that the meeting with GLASSMAN was very unsatisfactory from their standpoint. When GLASSMAN left, they said she indicated she did not want to talk with them or meet with them again.

At the conclusion of the interview it should be noted that ARTHUR advised that he and ROSE had been married in 1943, and as a result they had not had much contact with JOEL BARR inasmuch as JOEL did not fit into their group of friends or activities. BERNARD BARR also stated that he had had very little contact with JOEL as he was also married and was involved in running his father's business, the Barco Press.

They also advised that if possible JOEL's mother, MRS. REBECCA BARR, should not be contacted again, inasmuch as she is in very poor health and the mere mention of JOEL upsets her, because she has no idea where he is and believes he is hurt or dead. BERNARD BARR stated that they would cooperate all they could and if they received any information whatsoever that would indicate where JOEL is at the present time, they would immediately let the FBI know, and they would be very anxious to have JOEL BARR questioned so that he might be able to clear up any facts or charges against him.


