ROSARD advised that in January, 1948 he took a trip to France to visit his parents. He said that he sailed on the S. S. AMERICA from New York as a tourist class passenger. He stated the trip took approximately six days. The cabin was shared by four people. The only person in this group that ROSARD stated he became acquainted with to any degree was a cabin mate with an Italian sounding name. ROSARD said he was unable to recall this person's name and he has had no subsequent contact with this person or any of his other cabin mates.

ROSARD was shown a photograph of JOEL BARR. He was able to identify BARR as one of his cabin mates. He stated he did not actively associate himself with BARR and as a result knew very little of what BARR did while on board ship. He was able to recall that BARR had indicated he was an Electrical Engineer going abroad to study. BARR gave the inference he was going to Holland to study for an advanced degree.

DANIEL DAVID ROSARD said he could not recall the circumstances under which he met BARR. He said that upon boarding the S. S. AMERICA he went directly to his cabin. He said he could not remember whether BARR was in the cabin nor not at this time. However, he said that if BARR came to the cabin after he (ROSARD) was there, BARR did so alone. ROSARD was quite sure that no group of people visited the cabin to say goodbye to BARR.

According to ROS/RD, BARR was not overly friendly with any of the people sharing the cabin. ROSARD said that in general the four people in the cabin saw one another upon arising in the morning and at bed time in the evening. They had little contact with one another during the day.

The S. S. :MERICA disembarked some passengers at Cherbourg, France. ROSARD left the ship there and took a boat train to Paris, France. He stated he had no recollection of having seen BARR disembark nor could he recall having seen BARR on the boat train.

ROS/RD stated he believed BARR, if he actually went to Holland, may have disembarked from the S. S. AMERICA at Southampton, England. According to ROS/RD, it was easier to get direct transportation to Holland from Southampton, England, than from France.

ARTHUR_BARR, brother of JOEL BARR, had advised that many persons, whose identity he did not know, were present at the time of his brother's departure in January, 1948. fccordingly, photographs of the following people

Re Philadelphia report 5/9/51, in instant matter.

DANIEL DAVID ROSARD, during the interview conducted on 4/30/51, advised that on approximately seven different occasions he had received checks in the amounts of \$1,000. He stated he did not know the person from whom these checks were received. Five checks were sent to him by mail from New York City and two checks were drawn on Philadelphia banks. ROSARD stated he believed that in no instance were they from the same person.

ROSARD stated that the various checks he received, in actuality, was money belonging to his father in France. He stated that his father had transferred funds to different families in France. These families in turn had notified relatives in America. The American relatives of the French families who received money from his father had in turn paid him, ROSARD, money owed his father. ROSARD said this was an arrangement used by many people in Europe planning to come to America. He said immigrants were restricted in the amount of money which they could take with them upon leaving Europe. Therefore, the idea of leaving the money in Europe and yet having money in the United States upon arrival was devised.

The principle of this exchange of money is to avoid the restrictions and yet not violate the law relative to funds leaving a European country said ROSARD.

ROSARD said that he, himself, has had absolutely no contact with any of the people from whom he had received these checks. He said that upon his father's arrival in this country the money was turned over to him.

ROSARD advised that at one time he recalled there was a delay in receiving a check. He then wrote his father in France and shortly thereafter the check did appear. He repeated that he had had no personal contact nor did he know any of the people from whom these checks were received. He also stated that he, himself, had never been approached by anyone re espionage or Communist activities.

ROSENBERG, aka., ROSARD, maintains a special checking account at the Corn Exchange National Bank and Trust Company, Philadelphia. The ledger cards of this account were reviewed. This account was opened on 4/29/49, with

a deposit of \$7.37. On 7/21/49 this account reflected a deposit of a \$1,250.00 check drawn upon the Land Title Bank of Philadelphia. In addition to the deposit on 11/2/49 of a \$1,000.00 check drawn on the Public National Bank and Trust Company of New York City, ROSARD's account also reflected these deposits:

On 9/20/49, \$1,000.00 check drawn on the Royal Industrial Bank of New York. On 1/6/50, \$1,000.00 check drawn on the Chase National Bank of New York.

He also maintains an account at the Quaker City Federal Savings and Loan Association, Philadelphia, under Account #15927. This account was opened on 12/14/48. This account reflects deposits of a \$1,000.00 check on 5/9/49, drawn upon the First National Bank of Philadelphia; a \$1,000.00 check on 5/19/49, drawn upon the Royal Industrial Bank of New York; a \$1,000.00 check on 10/24/49, drawn upon the Chase National Bank of New York, and a \$1,000.00 check on 2/6/50, drawn on his account at the Corn Exchange National Bank and Trust Company, Philadelphia.

On 5/1/51, ROS/RD telephonically contacted this office and advised that he hoped his apparent lack of knowledge concerning JOEL BARR would not reflect adversely upon him. He stated that he considered himself a loyal American citizen and was willing to assist the FBI in any way possible but he actually did not remember anything concerning BARR.





Lieutenant CHARLES PIERCE, Detective Bureau, Miami Beach Police Department, Florida, advised that the daily reports for the month of December, 1947, at the Miami Beach Police Department under the date of December 18, 1947, revealed the following information:

4:55 p.m.--Mr. J. BARR, 241 West 97th Street, New York

"4:55 p.m.--Mr. J. BARR, 241 West 97th Street, New York City, reported his car broken into while parked at 7th Street and Collins Avenue, Miami Beach. Loss consisted of \$42 cash, wallet, and Longine wristwatch. Ident Bureau checked this car for prints." (u)

Lieutenant PIERCE advised there is no other information available concerning the theft from BARR's car. It should be noted that the subject left for Europe shortly after this on January 21, 1948. (u)

Confidential Informant T-3, of unknown reliability, advised that he was told by JULIUS ROSENBERG, convicted espionage agent, that JOEL BARR is a courier for the Russians who is now in Europe and probably Russia. The same informant also advised that he understood from JULIUS ROSENBERG that ARTHUR BARR gave money, which was furnished by ROSENBERG, to the subject. ROSENBERG described ARTHUR BARR to the informant as a "solid person" and as a result ROSENBERG did not believe that ARTHUR BARR would relate this information to anyone.

He advised that although his real name was YANKEL JOSEPHEKREITENBERGER, he had used the name JOSEPH KELETY shortly after he arrived in the United States and had subsequently abbreviated it to KELEY, which name he has used for some time. He stated he was born in Maramoros, Hungary, December 31, 1897, and entered the United States March 9, 1921, at New York City. He stated he lived at the following addresses in New York: 27 Neptune Terrace, Brooklyn; 17 New Street, Brooklyn; 481-85th Street, Brooklyn; 41-21 13th Avenue, Borough Park, Brooklyn, and at his present address, 419 Church Avenue, Brooklyn, for the past year. (U)

He stated he took a trip to Paris, leaving on the S.S.: AMERICA, January 21, 1948. In regard to this trip, he stated he shared a tourist cabin with three other men. At first he could not recall their names but when the name JOEL BARR was specifically mentioned to him, he did believe that that was the name of one of his cabin mates. The names DAVID ROSARD and DANIEL ROSENBERG were also mentioned but he could not recall those names. The name IJIGI TOFANI was also mentioned to him but he could not recall that name other than the fact that there was an Italian boy in the cabin with them. He was also shown a photograph of JOEL BARR and after examining it, he stated that this looks somewhat like the JOEL BARR who was in the cabin with him except that he thought he looked younger than the photograph. (U)

He stated that when he boarded the ship he put a small bag in the cabin and at that time there was no one in the cabin. He then went on deck and visited with his brother-in-law, who was seeing him off, and at no time did he see anyone in the cabin. When the ship left the dock he returned to the cabin and it was shortly after that that the other individuals who were sharing the cabin with him also came into the cabin. He said there was no indication that there had ever been any kind of a farewell party in the cabin and he doubts very much if there was such party. (4)

He stated that during the trip to Europe he did converse with JOEL BARR occasionally for the first two or three days; however, he met some other people from Hungary on the ship and for the balance of the trip he saw very little of BARR. He stated that during his conversations with BARR he was told by BARR that he was going to Switzerland as a student. At the time he asked BARR why he did not go to Paris and BARR replied that he did not have time to stop off in Paris inasmuch as he had to register in at a school as soon as he could. KELEY could not recall that BARR ever mentioned what school he was going to or what town in Switzerland. He stated that he noticed that BARR had a great deal of luggage and personal belongings and as a matter of fact had specifically mentioned to BARR that he thought he had too much luggage with him for the time he was going to stay in Europe to study, which he understood to be approximately a year or two at the most.

As far as he could recall, he was sure that BARR disembarked from the ship at Cherbourg and although he did not specifically see him come off the ship or get on the train that was waiting at Cherbourg, he did know that all four of them that were in the cabin (\mathcal{U})

left the ship at this port. He could furnish no further information concerning BARR or the cabin mates. In conclusion, he stated that he was not regularly employed at the present time but acted as a cantor in a Jewish synagogue in the Bay Ridge section of Brooklyn.

DAVID GREENGLASS, who pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit espionage and was recently sentenced, advised in an interview on March 9, 1951 conducted by SAS ROBERT F. ROYAL and RICHARD T. HRADSKY, at the City Prison, New York City, that in the fall of 1947, JOEL BARR brought to the Pitt Machine Products Company a metal tool box containing some tools, an oscilloscope, a wave meter, a photographic contact printer, some developing pans, some clamp-on floodlights, and a considerable amount of literature on photography. DAVID stated that this material was stored in the basement of the Pitt Machine Products Corporation, which was located at 370 East Houston Street, New York City. DAVID also recalled that about this time, BARR told him he also had an enlarger but, however, DAVID did not see any enlarger stored at the Pitt Machine Products Corporation. DAVID further stated that after BARR left the United States, JULIUS ROSENBERG told him that he could take the material that BARR had left at the Pitt Machine Products Company. DAVID stated that he gave the above-mentioned items to his brother-in-law, LOUIS-MBEL, who resides at 87 Columbia Street, New York City. /u/

DAVID GREENGLASS further stated that he also knows that ARTHUR BARR, the brother of JOEL BARR, is acquainted with JULIUS ROSENBERG as he once saw JOEL BARR and JULIUS leave the Pitt Machine Products Corporation and go over to talk to ARTHUR BARR who was waiting in an automobile outside the plant. GREENGLASS stated that JULIUS ROSEMBERG once told him that ARTHUR BARR was a nice guy but that BERNARD was a ----- BERNARD is ARTHUR and JOEL's brother. (U

GREENGLASS further/advised that he recalled that just before JOEL BARR left New York for Europe in January, 1948, he took a vacation in Miami, Florida. DAVID stated that he did not know if JULIUS ROSENBERG or VIVIAN GLASSMAN were present when JOEL BARR sailed because he, himself, did not go to see BARR off, but in connection with BARR's sailing, he did recall that shortly after BARR sailed ROSENBERG told him that he had given BARR some money to make the trip to Europe. DAVID advised that on another occasion he asked JULIUS ROSENBERG, sometime in 1947 and just prior to BARR's trip to Europe, if JOEL BARR and VIVIAN GLASSMAN were in the espionage setup. ROSENBERG answered sharply "No"; however, a short time later ROSENBERG told DAVID that JOEL BARR was active in the

espionage network. DAVID said that when ROSENBERG answered "No" to his question concerning JOEL BARR and VIVIAN GLASSMAN, and the manner in which he did, he meant that BARR and GLASSMAN were involved, but that he did not want to talk about it. (V)

A short time afterward, ROSENBERG admitted to DAVID that BARR was a Soviet agent but he did not again mention VIVIAN GLASSMAN in connection with his espionage work. (U)

GREENGLASS also advised that JULIUS ROSENBERG stated that GLASSMAN received some correspondence from JOEL BARR while BARR was in Sweden but did not elaborate further. (It is noted that this is contrary to information received from VIVIAN GLASSMAN at the time of her interview on August 3, 1950, when she denied that she had ever received any correspondence from JOEL BARR.)

On March 17, 1951, NATHAN SUSSMAN, who resides at 56-55
205th Street, Bayside, Long Island, New York, was interviewed at
the New York Office by SAS BERT S. TAYLOR and ROBERT F. ROYAL, and
SUSSMAN advised at this interview that in the latter part of 1942
a branch of the Communist Party known as 16B of the Industrial
Division, Communist Party, USA, was organized. He stated that either
JULIUS ROSENBERG or JOEL BARR had invited him to become a member of
Branch 16B. SUSSMAN stated that among the small membership of this
group were JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR, ALFRED SARANT,
and SUSSMAN's wife, GERTRUDE SUSSMAN. SUSSMAN stated that meetings
were held monthly, usually at the home of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG,
10 Monroe Street, New York City. He also advised that he recalled
that Branch 16B had a farewell party in 1944 at Bonats Restaurant,
which he believed was then located on 32nd or 33rd Street between
Eighth and Ninth Avenues, in New York City. He recalled that JULIUS
and ETHEL ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR, ALFRED SARANT and others, including
his wife and himself, attended this private dinner. / U

It is to be noted that the Communist Party has been declared by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.(U)

On March 22, 1951, MAX/ELITCHER was interviewed in the New York Office by SA VINCENT J. CAHILL and gave the following information in regard to JOEL BARR:

In July or September of 1944, when he and his wife were in New York City, he telephoned JULIUS ROSENBERG and arranged to meet |u|

ROSENBERG at 42nd Street and Eighth Avenue in the late afternoon of the same day. He recalled that ROSENBERG said he would try to get in touch with some of their former classmates so that they could all get together. Subsequently, he met JULIUS ROSENBERG at the corner of 42nd Street and Eighth Avenue in New York City and shortly thereafter WILLIAM PERL and his younger brother, who was in an Army uniform at the time, arrived. They then walked to the Bird-In-Hand Restaurant, 1658 Broadway, New York City, where they had dinner.

Either during dinner or shortly thereafter ROSENBERG made a telephone call to JOEL BARR and BARR subsequently joined them at the restaurant. When dinner was over, BARR invited the entire group back to his parents' apartment. BARR at that time was residing on West 97th Street, New York City, off Broadway. ELITCHER stated that while at BARR's home, the group entered into a discussion of the war, general politics, and a discussion of the study of music. He recalled that BARR was studying music at that time and that BARR brought out some music textbooks. They also discussed schoolmates who attended the College of the City of New York with them. He also recalled that BARR had a radio-phonograph combination in the apartment and that he played a number of classical records on that occasion. He stated that while the group was present, BARR's mother and father came home and he also recalled that BARR's sister came home, but he was not sure whether the sister arrived with the parents.

That same night he recalled the entire group left BARR's apartment and at BARR's suggestion started out for Greenwich Village to visit a friend of BARR named ALFRED SARANT. ELITCHER's recollection is that when they arrived at SARANT's apartment on Morton Street, Greenwich Village, BARR went ahead up to the apartment and admitted himself with a key. When the rest of them arrived in the apartment they found that SARANT had apparently been asleep in bed but he got up, dressed, and joined them and entertained them with his guitar playing. The people present at SARANT's apartment were MAX and HELENE ELITCHER, WILLIAM PERL, JULIUS ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR and ALFRED SARANT. (U)

At another time, near the end of December, 1946, he and his wife were again in New York and by some pre-arrangement met JULIUS ROSENBERG on the street outside of ALFRED SARANT's apartment house in Greenwich Village. They went around the corner to a restaurant where they met HELEN and MORTON-SOBELL, WILLIAM PERL and JOEL BARR. All of them had dinner together at this restaurant, which / U

ELITCHER recalled as being "The Blue Mill". They left the restaurant quite late and the entire group went to JULIUS ROSENBERG's apartment at 10 Monroe Street, Knickerbocker Village. He recalls that during that evening a general discussion took place in which everyone took part. He recalled that general world politics were discussed and that there was also a discussion which centered around schoolmates who had graduated from CCNY.

HELENE ELITCHER was also interviewed and advised substantially the same facts that her husband, MAX ELITCHER, had given. (u)

It should be noted that on March 8 and 9, 1951, MAX ELITCHER testified as one of a number of Government witnesses in the Federal District Court, Southern District of New York, in the espionage-conspiracy trial of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL. On March 29, 1951, the jury returned a verdict of guilty on all three defendants. On April 5, 1951, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were sentenced to death and MORTON SOBELL was sentenced to thirty years imprisonment by Judge IRVING R. KAUFMAN of the Southern District of New York. (U)







In connection with the above named subject, the Philadelphia Office is not aware that information relative to BARR'S funds while in Europe has been considered as a possibility for locating his whereabouts.

This office suglests that BARR may have had his funds in the form of American Express Money Orders which are negotiable in practically all European countries without difficulty. It is likewise suggested that if BARR's funds were in this form, the Express Money Order would eventually pass through a clearing house in New York City.

It is suggested the New York Office, if it has not already done so, make inquiry at the main offices of the American Express Company to determine if a record of money orders negotiated by BARR is available. In the event a record is located, it is believed information as to the place in which the money orders were negotiated may assist in locating BARR.

David Greggenss, confessed with respect to Berr, David Greggy ass, confessed Soutet agent, has advised that Resembers told him in February, 1950, that Borr had been one of high espionage, contacts in this country and had left the United States in order to take on

Jerone Lugene Fertellow, a former fallow privater with Rosenberg at the Rederal House of Detention, New York City, informed that Rosenberg advised him that Joel Darr was a courier for the Russians who was now in Turope or Russia. This informant also indicated that, according to Rosenberg, there had been two copianage units operating in the Lew York area and that he, Rosenberg, handed one of these units and the other unit was headed by two men, one of whom was then in Europe and the other had fled one week prior to Rosenberg's arrest. From the information available, it definitely appears that Rosenberg in this latter statement was making reference to Berr and Sarant.

For your information, Berr sailed from the United States on the S.S. America on January 21, 1948, and is known to have gone to Paris, France. In June, 1950, Barr left Paris for an unknown destination, leaving behind most of his personal belongings. His present whereabouts is unknown.

The above is being furnished to yet for your information.



COFFACTS: JOHN MELVILLE, former employee at Sperry Gyroscope Corporation, states met subject at Columbia University in fall of 1945 and later saw subject frequently at Sperry Gyroscope Corp., but was not close friend of BARR. Unable to furnish information concerning BARR's associates and activities, but furnished names of two Sperry employees who defended BARR at time of his dismissal from Sperry.

Details:

Mr. JOHN MELVILLE, 3552 Purdue Avenue, West Los Angeles, Californie, advised that he met the subject in the fall of 1945 when subject enrolled at Columbia University. MELVILLE recalled that BARR enrolled one month late for the fall term and that he did not become personally acquainted with him until about January of 1946. MELVILLE stated that he and BARR worked several engineering problems together during school; however, they did not go out together socially and he did not consider BARR a close personal friend. MELVILLE stated that he left Columbia in May of 1946 and in October of 1946 went to work for the Sperry Gyroscope Corporation, at which time BARR was already employed by this company. He stated he did see BARR every three or four days, however, he did not work in the same section with BARR but knew that the latter was employed on an advanced and highly confidential radar project.

MELVILLE stated that BARR suddenly left the Sperry Gyroscope Corporation and there was considerable speculation as to the reason for his sudden departure and among the rumors was one to the effect that BARR had previously

been dismissed by some company or possibly the Signal Corps in the United States Army, as a bad security rick and he had failed to put this information on his application for employment with the Sperry Gyroscope Corporation, resulting in his dismissal. MELVILLE stated that among the employees who worked with BARR was a girl named DORIS EVANS, who was friendly with BARR and subsequent to his departure expressed criticism of the company for dismissing BARR and appeared to MELVILLE to be strongly defending BARR regardless of the alleged danger to the national security. MELVILLE vaguely recalls EVANS stating that she had called BARR on the telephone subsequent to his departure and in this connection vaguely recalls that EVANS stated BARR was unable to obtain employment as a result of his dismissal from Sperry. MELVILLE stated the rumor also circulated that BARR had gone to Holland to obtain employment.

MELVILLE stated he also had one or two arguments with an employee named MARUS NEUMANN concerning the BARR incident, MELVILLE taking the position that if the Government considered BARR a risk, they had the right to dismiss him; however, NEUMANN staunchly defended BARR and MELVILLE stated he felt MEUMANN appeared to know considerable information concerning BARR, especially in view of the fact that NEUMANN was not employed at Sperry at the time BARK had been there.

In connection with DORIS EVANS, mentioned above, it was MELVILLE's recollection that subsequent to BARR's departure, EVANS had failed to turn in some report which she herself had prepared and as a result was dismissed by Sperry Gyroscope Corporation. NEUMANN, mentioned above, was also discharged, according to MELVILLE.

MELVILLE stated that there were two or three students at Columbia who were more friendly with PARK than himself, among whom was LARRY O'NEILL. O'NEILL, according to MELVILLE, was a student in the Electrical Engineering Department and remained at Columbia as an instructor. MELVILLE stated he felt O'NEILL may still be so employed, but if not, could be located through the Engineering Department at Columbia. MELVILLE could not recall the names of the other students friendly with HARR but felt that O'NEILL could furnish this information.

MELVILLE state: he never recalled being introduced to anyone by BARR and in all his conversations with BARR there was no indication that BARR was engaged in any suspicious activity. He stated he recalled going to a dance on one occasion and after arriving he met BARR. At the conclusion of the dance he and BARR took three girls to BARR's apartment and listened to the latter's expensive collection of records; however, he did not feel that PARR remained in contact with any of these girls and he does not recall their names.

MELVILLE stated he was aware, from a remark made by BARR, that BARR had possibly used his name as reference; however, he stated he was not personally familiar with PARR's associates and any discussion between the two was usually of a technical nature.

It is noted that one John Melville, a former fellow employee with Barr at the Sperry Gyroscope Company in New York, upon interview advised that one Manus Newmann was believed to possess considerable information relative to subject Barr. In addition, it was mentioned by Melville that one Doris Evans, who also had been an employee at Sperry Gyroscope Company in 1948, was reported to have been very friendly with this subject.

A review has been made of Bufiles concerning Manus Neumann but no identifiable information was located therein. You are therefore requested to make an immediate effort to identify and locate this individual. Thereafter, if your files contain no derogatory information which would make such action incdvisable, you are authorized to interview Neumann concerning his knowledge as to the activities and associates of Barr.

A check of Bufiles reflected that the Doris Evans referred to by Melville was undoubtedly identical with one Doris Louise Evans who was the subject of a Security Matter - C investigation (NY file 100-64780). This investigation developed that Evans was a member of the North Jamaica Club of the Queens County CIA in 1945, and was Youth Director of the Queens County CF in 1847. It was noted that no investigation has been conducted concerning Evans since November, 1946, at which time no information was obtained indicating that she was then engaged in Communist activities. The latest information in this file reflected that as of June 18, 1951, Evans was residing at 214-47 Khitchall Terrace, Queens Village, New York City.







advised that FRED MARION and L. D. WILLIAMS were CLINE'S assistants. In 1943, ARCEHLING advised, Departments 9680 to 9683 moved to 11th Avenue, N.Y.C. where Mr. F. F. O'AEEFE was the chief and FRED MARION was the assistant. In 1945, AROEHLING stated, Department 9681 was at 11th Ave., N.Y.C. and BENJAMIN G. GRIFFITH was the chief of this department and TED TAYLOR was his assistant.

Mr. FRED MUNION advised that the above departments worked on radar sets number 517, 520, 717, 720, and Project Q13 which was a low altitude bombing attachment for radar. He also stated that radar links were manufactured for the Coast Guard and also single side band radio transmitters used in the North African landings were manufactured. He stated that the Mod. II computer was an airborne computer for bombing by means of radar and was also manufactured in these departments.

Mr. RALPH C. GLASIER advised that BARK worked for CLAIR R. EVANS who is now at the Western Electric Hawthorne Works at Chicago, Ill. He stated that BARK also must have worked for TED TAYLOR who is now at N.Y.C. working for Western Electric. He advised that the Bayonne and 11th Avenue plants all worked on airborne radar sets, Q7 a bombing radar set, Q13, a later model, and the 720, a search radar set. They also manufactured a ground radar set for the Army and Navy. This latter set was also used by the Marine Corps.

Fir. GLISIER advised that the Mod. II computer went with the Q7 and Q13 radar sets. He advised that the Q7 was used on B29s and the 720 set, mentioned above, was used on night fighters.

Mr. RALPH BRADER and Mr. DONALD ROBB advised that the Bayonne and 11th avenue shops worked on the AI-10 airborne radar which was an early model and a predecessor to set 517 which was a Navy job. They also manufactured an SCR520 which was an army type set similar to number 517. These shops also manufactured the 717 and 721 as well as the Q13 and the Q7. All of these sets were manufactured

in 10, 3, and 1 centimeter wave lengths, that is ultrahigh frequency bands.

It was the opinion of all men interviewed that if an individual knew the Model 720, he knew practically every other set that was built by Western Electric. None of the individuals interviewed with the exception of DONALD ROEE could remember JOEL BARR.

Mr. ROBB stated that BARR was an engineer who worked under BEN GRIFFITH at Western Electric on the Mod. II computer and previously for FRAMA O'AEEFE. He stated that BARR would know all circuits of the Mod. II computer for the AP 613 radar which was used on the B29 bomber. He stated that BARR was considered to be a bright fellow and was leaned on very heavily by the officials of Western Electric while he worked there.

Mr. HENRY EWING, Industrial Relations Department, advised that the following individuels who are now employed by Western Electric Co. in Winston-Salem, North Carolina worked on the same projects with BARR. However, he could not state whether they would remember EARR or how close they were to him:

He stated that the subject came in the division over which he (TAYLOR) was head. He stated that while working on this project, BARR, along with the other engineers working in that department, had complete freedom in the plant and were permitted to go into any other sections, and to constantly check to find out if there were any errors in the use of the computer or the Norden Bombsight in order that they might correct any of these errors.

He also advised that the engineers were in the habit of taking papers and plans out of the plant with the idea that they might or would work on them at home. Under these conditions, he stated that BARR, along with the other engineers, could have carried briefcases out of the plant at any time without question.

He stated that he could furnish no information as to the character of BARR or whether he was loyal to the United States or not. The only thing that he could recall concerning BARR was that he was a fair worker and he never had any complaints in regard to the work that BARR did.

Mr. ERIC J. ISBISTER, Department Head in the Radio Engineering Division at Sperry Gyroscope Company, Lake Success, New York, was contacted by SA J. GARTH GRAY and advised that while BARR was employed at Sperry Gyroscope he worked on a study program for the Air Force, which consisted of research in regard to long range radar. This study was being conducted for the Watson Laboratories of Red Bank, New Jersey, and was conducted under Air Force contract W-28-099-AC-454

Mr. ISBISTER stated that this study program was top secret at Sperry at the time that BARR worked on it and still is. In fact, he stated that it was considered secret of the highest classification.

He advised that BARR reported to him and that he found him to be a brilliant engineer. He could furnish no information regarding BARR'S character or loyalty and he

had never heard or seen anything reflecting on BARR'S character or loyalty while BARR was employed at the plant.

He furnished the names of three individuals who he recalled worked with BARR on the study program at Sperry, namely:

BOWARD BARLOW / WILLIAM GRAHAM JOHN MALLETT

He stated the above individuals were no longer employed at the Sperry Gyroscope Company. He further advised that when BARR, obtained his employment at Sperry, he gave the information that in 1942 he had been employed by the Western Electric Company and had left this employment to attend school. He also stated that from September 1940 to February 1942 he was with the Signal Corps Laboratories and that he left this position for a better offer.

Mr. LOUIS ABEL, 87 Columbia Street, New York City, advised in an interview conducted by SA ROBERT F. ROYAL and the writer that the only equipment his brother-in-law, DAVID GREENGLASS, convicted Soviet espionage agent, had given him was a printing box for making prints from small negatives. He displayed this printing box, which is made by the Albert Specialty Company of Chicago, Illinois.


He stated that when DAVID gave this to him, DAVID told him that a friend or customer had left the equipment at the Pitt Machine Products Company and that he was loaning it to him. He could not recall whether DAVID brought the box to him or whether he picked it up from the company. He stated that there was no other item that he received from DAVID and he did not recall whether there were other items which he could have had but did not take.

He stated he did not see any enlarger or any other photographic equipment if he did pick the printing box

up from the company. In conclusion, he stated that he did not know that this printing box originally belonged to JOEL BARR.



Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that the relatives of the subject, namely, Mrs. REBECCA BARR, mother, ARTHUBEBARR, brother, and BERNARD BARR, brother, had not received any correspondence from anyone outside of the United States.

In reference to DORIS EVANS, who, according to JOHN MELVILLE, a former employee at Sperry Gyroscope Corporation, was a close friend of the subject. Investigation has disclosed that as of March 23, 1951 DORIS EVANS, whose full name is DORIS LOUISE EVANS, resided at 311 East 73rd Street, New York City from Monday through Friday, and on Saturday and Sunday resides in the care of F. D. EVANS, 214-47 Whitehall Terrace, Queens Village, Long Island. The last address is the home of her mother, ROYA EVANS.

At this time she was employed in the Cancer Research of Mount Sinai Hospital, Fifth Avenue and 100th Street, New York City, from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and teaches school at the School of Industrial Technology, 149 East 26th Street, New York City, from 7:00 p.m. to 10:30 p.m.

Mr. FRANK FHILBIN, Security Director of Sperry Gyroscope Company, Inc., Lake Success, New York, advised on February 8, 1950 that DORIS EVANS had been employed as an Assistant Project Engineer in the Radio Engineering Department from February 1946 to March 1948.

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised that one DORIS EVANS held a Communist Political Association Membership Card No. 29896 in the North Jamaica Club, Queens County, dated July 3, 1944.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that DORIS EVANS of 214-47 Whitehall Terrace, Queens Village, Long Island, was a member of the North Jamaica Club of the Queens County Communist Political Association in 1945. No information has been received in the last two years reflecting that DORIS EVANS is still active in the Communist Party.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, who is acquainted with Communist matters in Queens County, advised on October 4, 1951 that no information has come to the informant's attention in regard to DORIS EVANS and that the informant has never met her and knows nothing about her.

Mrs. FELEX ANDINO, Superintendent of the building at 311 East 73rd Street, New York City, advised on October 2, 1951 that DORIS EVANS stays with a family by the name of WOLFE in Apartment 5 at 311 East 73rd Street, but she could furnish no further information regarding either the WOLFE or EVANS.

Mr. JOHN STEWART of the American Express Company advised that it was impossible for their office to check any American Express money orders unless the number of the money order was known or at least the location and date of issue, and, therefore, he could not check the records to ascertain if any American Express checks had been cashed by the subject.

Mr. ARTHUR BARR, brother of the subject was contacted October 16, 1951 and he refused to discuss his brother, JOEL, and stated he did not want to be contacted in regard to his brother and he was not going to discuss the matter further.

HAYES stated he never heard BARR discuss Communism other than he dimly recalled that BARR had stated that some things the Communist Party did were good.

HAYES advised that BARR and the rest of the engineers had complete freedom of the plant and were permitted to take any information they wished out of the plant, which included plans, drawings or specifications.

He stated he never saw BARR after he left the Sperry Company and the only thing he heard was that someone whom he could not recall mentioned that BARR had gone to Holland. He also advised that BARR had never asked him for any specific information which was probably due to the fact that BARR had access to any information that he, HAYES, could have given him anyway.

Miss DORIS LOUISE EVANE was interviewed at New Brunswick, New Jersey, by the reporting agent and SA JOHN R. LYONS of the Newark office on June 30, 1952. She advised that she had been employed at the Sperry Gyroscope Company from January, 1946 to March, 1948 as a microwave engineer. She stated at this time BARR was working in the Radar Section and although this was all part of the Engineering Division, she did not have very much contact with BARR.

One incident that she recalled was that he had bought a tent for a camping trip and when she saw it she asked him if he could get her one and she gave him \$10.00 to buy it. Subsequently, he did get the tent for her and they tested it on the sperry grounds with the water hose to see if it leaked.

She advised that she never knew BARR before the time she worked at Sperry's and that after BARR left Sperry she never saw him again. She did recall that she heard that BARR had been fired from the Sperry Corporation for some security reason which she never knew.

She also recalled that someone had told her, although she could not remember who it was, that BARR was going to Europe. She stated, however, that she might have

heard it when, in the Summer of 1948, she received a call from an individual whom she believed was JOEL'S brother and who offered to sell her JOEL'S folding boat. She stated that she did not buy the boat and told him that she was not interested in it. She stated that she had never met any of JOEL'S relatives and she just assumed it was JOEL'S brother from the conversation she had with him, although she cannot recall the conversation in detail at this time.

From the brief contacts she had with BARR which were all confined to the Sperry Company's plant, she never heard any comments by BARR in regard to Communism and she doubted if he was even interested in it.

Miss EVANS immediately recognized the photograph of JULIUS ROSENBERG, his wife ETHEL and DAVID GREENGLESS as the atom spies who had been convicted and whose planness were in the newspapers. She stated she never met them or heard of them except through the newspapers and she recognized their pictures strictly through the fact that she had seen them in the newspapers.

Miss EVANS could furnish no further information in regard to JOEL BARR.

Mr. SAMUEL SACHS was interviewed on May 27, 1952 by the reporting agent and SA WILLIAM L. EDDY. He advised that he had known JOEL BARR in New Jersey in 1940 and 1941. He stated he had never met him before this time and has never seen him since.

He advised that they both were employed at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and that since BARR was looking for a place to stay he had offered to share his apartment in Long Branch, New Jersey, with BARR. He stated that BARR had moved in with him with a girl by the name of MAINE who at first he understood to be BARR'S wife. He later learned, however, that they were not married.

SACHS advised that he did not have very much contact with BARR even though they lived together, and that he never met any friends of BARR or his family. He did recall that BARR was extremely interested in sending messages by infra-red ray and he believed that BARR was doing some of this type of work at the laboratory at Fort Monmouth, New Jerspy.

He advised that during the time BARR lived with him he never approached him with any questions in regard to his, SACHS', work and rever gave any indication of being interested in the work that he was doing.

SACHS ended the interview by stating that he has no knowledge of any Communist activity on the part of BARR and that he personally hates the Communist Party at the present time.

Mr. TED TAYLOR, Engineering Division of the Western Electric Company, 195 Broadway, New York City, was interviewed on July 9, 1952 by SA ROBERT S. ROYAL and the represent agent, and he advised that although their divisitions not manufacturing any tubes they had access to all these of radar tubes.

One of these tubes was the 730-A radar tube, also known as the magnatron tube, which was used in the Q7 and Q13 radar units. He stated that all parts and specifications of these parts used in this engineering division were available to all engineers. He stated that BARR would have access, therefore, to any designs of the tube or drawings of the tube at any time.

TAYLOR also advised that the Q7 and Q13 radar computer units were classified as secret, and under this classification any of the parts going into the manufacture of the units would also be classified as secret.

TAYLOR advised that he was the head of the division in which BARR worked when BARR was at the Western Electric Company.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised that no information has been received up to the present time as to the whereabouts of the subject.

of the Manufacturers Trust Company, 130 Fifth Avenue, New York City, advised that ARTHUR BARR (brother of JOEL BARR) maintained a special checking account which had been opened in September, 1947, at their branch of the Manufacturers Trust Company. He stated that there were no unusual deposits or withdrawals and from an observation of the account, it was his opinion that the account was used for household bills and the like.

He particularly checked the period from May, 1948 to December, 1949. This period was checked in view of the fact that the subject left the United States in December, 1948.
