



At approximately 4:30 P. M. today, Supervisor Granville called from New York directing attention to the report of Special Agent Norton dated July 7, 1950, at New York City, and specifically to page 18 which sets out a composite description of Rosenberg. In this description Rosenberg's birth date was listed as May 12, 1918, and also as May 2, 1918. Granville stated that the correct date was May 12, 1918, and his purpose in calling attention to this was that in the event a press release became necessary the Bureau would have the correct birth date. He requested that the Bureau's reports be corrected accordingly.

At the same time, Granville stated that the New York Office has been considering three possibilities with regard to prosecution against the Rosenbergs. He listed these possibilities as follows:

- l. Obtain warrants for the apprehension of both Julius Rosenberg and his wife, Ethel. Thereafter, make the apprehension of Rosenberg while he is at his place of business and apprehend Ethelenberg at the Rosenberg home. By following this plan, it will be possible to conduct a search incident to arrest of both the business and resident addresses.
- 2. File a complaint on Rosenberg and his wife. Thereafter, invite Julius Rosenberg to the office for the purpose of interviewing him. If he does not cooperate in the interview, immediately apprehend him. Serve the warrant of arrest on Mrs. Rosenberg at her home and conduct a search incident to arrest.
- 3. Obtain warrants of arrest for both Julius Rosenberg and Ethel Rosenberg and invite both to the New York Office for the purpose of interview. If they do not cooperate, apprehend them.

Supervisor Granville requested that the Bureau consider the three possibilities as outlined above in planning any prosecutive action against the Rosenbergs.

Rebulet July 31, 1950, instructing that certain information set forth in Paragraphs 2 and 3, Page 6, and Paragraph 1, Page 7, of the report of SA C. EDWARD NICHOLSON, JR., dated July 18, 1950, at Washington, be included in the details rather than under the heading, "Administrative".

It is respectfully requested the Bureau reconsider its decision that the material indicated be included in the details since the pertinency thereof has not been established. So far as is known, MILTON MANES was but a friend of the subject and had no connection with any of his espionage activities. The same can be said to be true of SIDNEY MACNES and, further, the nature of their club is unknown. The reference to MAX and HELENE ELITCHER is innocuous in that he does not attribute any relationship between these persons and ROSENBERG.

The Bureau's instructions have been very carefully considered and it is believed the pertinency of the material as reported has not been established.

This office will establish the nature of the relationship of the ROSENBERGS to SIDNEY MAGNES and MILTON MANES and if proper, will then set forth the information on Pages 6 and 7 in a report together with the results of investigative efforts reflecting that the relationship has some pertinency to the espionage activities of the subject, in such form that it can be disseminated.





- When, for the first time, did you become acquainted with Julius Rosenberg? I never knew Julius Rosenberg. - Why do you say that? I saw a picture of hosenberg in the papers.

Now, if there was no business to be transacted between the two of us, we were merely to stay on our respective corners, facing each other. The recognition signals were to be as follows: I was to be anoking a pipe with a curved stem and a large bowl. I have such a pipe. The other man was to be making a clear. I would like to note here that my Soviet contact had told me that there was a possibility, a good possibility that the person who would meet me would be unknown to me, and would not be this man with whom the meeting had been arranged. Now, there was also an arrangement for an emergency meeting. The means of my getting in touch with the Russian agent were as follows: I was to insert an ad running for three days, in the New York Times, This ad was to read as follows: Biochemist, age 32, Master's degree, desires work in food industry or related industrial field and one which involves research. Frimary consideration is the opportunity to do independent investigative work.
 - Now, who gave you these instructions? These instructions were the result of a long talk between the Russian agent and myself and they are the result of a suggestion which I made.

Has this been covered before? This has been covered before in great detail.

- Who gave the instructions to go and see Greenglass?
 They were given to me by a man whom I knew as John and whom I have since identified as Anatole Yakovlev.
- When and where did he give you these instructions?
 At a bar near Third Avenue near 42nd Street.
- When?
 A They were given to me on Saturday on the last Saturday
 in May.
- 19501

- What happened then?

 It was at this time that I had gone to meet John so that he might verify that I was going to see Puchs in Santa Fe. Before this meeting at the bar on Third Avenue, I had no indication that there was to be this side meeting. I knew I was going to see Puchs, which had been arranged in Cambridge, Emss., but I did not know ... have any idea of what was going to take place. This was a result of a side meeting.
- You are talking about this meeting on Third Avenue in February of 1945 when you went there - just exactly what did you say to this fellow John.

 This meeting at the bar on Third Avenue had as its primary purpose the fact that I was actually going to Santa Pe to carry out a rendezvous with Dr. Klaus Fuchs, which rendezvous had been arranged by Fuchs and myself in Cambridge in January of 1945. At this time also, John told me that there existed in Albuquera man who was employed in the Atomic Energy Project. I assumed that he meant a civilian. He told me that after I had seen Dr. Fuchs, that I should return to Albuquerque, and that on that Saturday night I should wisit this man and pick up certain information which he had prepared. I further was instructed that should this man not be in Albuquerque, that his wife would be there and would have the information for me. In addition, I was given the sum of \$500, and was told that should either the man or his wife evince any need for the money, that I should give it to them.
- What denominations were the bills?
 The bills, I believe, were in small denominations mostly 10's and 20's, possibly a few 5's.
- Anything else?

(Off the record discussion)

- There was a means of recognition which I recall as follows: I was to tender a piece of cardboard cut in an irregular manner; this piece of cardboard was to be matched by a second piece which the person whom I met would have. Further, I was to state that I brought records from the person whose name I recall as Ben in Brooklyn. The piece of cardboard was received by Takovlev.
- and this all took place at the bar on Third Avenue?
 That's correct.
- And what did you receive yourself for doing this?
 A I received nothing for doing this mission.

- Who paid your expenses?



 I said that I brought greetings from Ben in Brooklyn, and I produced the irregular shaped piece of cardboard. Greenglass said, 'Oh, yes, come in' smiled. I entered the room and moticed a woman there whom I assumed to be Mrs. Greenglass She was already dressed in a housecoat of some kind, or a housedress. He went to his wallet and produced the matching piece of cardboard. I then asked him whether he had any information for me and he said that he did, but that he would not have it prepared until the afternoon. There then ensued a conversation between during which the following matters were covered. He explained to me that his wife had arrived there some months previous, and that they were running very short

of funds, and that it shortly would be impossible for her to remain any longer in Albuquerque. I them teld him I had a sum of money for him and gave him the \$500 in an envelope. At this juncture, I believe Mrs. Greenglass was in the very tiny kitchen. I cannot definitely say whather she was out of hearing or not, but I do believe that we were still on the subject of money when she returned to the room. I believe it was at that moment because Greenglass had a disappointed hook on his face that I stated that probably I would be back in Albuquerque in September and would then bring more money with me. He did say, however, that for the time being the \$500 would be sufficient and would be a great aid. He then told me with great enthusiasm or rather he did begin to tell me with great enthusiasm or rather he did begin to tell me with great enthusiasm of several other possible recruits - that is people who might also furnish information on atomic energy. I out him short because this was very contrary to any means or procedure which I had developed and which I had been steeped in during my long association with the Soviets. I told him never to attempt to enlist anyone and not to think of it in any form or manner. He agreed with me. He did not seem angry or taken aback by the rebuke. He said, "yes" I was right, that just previous a man whom he knew at Santa Fey had been broken to the ranks and had been gent elsewhere, possibly to a federal detention site. "Though I am not sure of this last. There was some conversation by Mrs. Greenglass during this interval. I believe she stated to me that she had recalled a julius, and I understood that Julius was a relative of hers.

You mentioned comething about "you believe", ean't you state definitely whether she actually say or didn't?
The word, "believe" was an unfortunate slip.
What I intended to say was I recall very definitely during this morning meeting that Mrs. Greenglass told me she had seen and spoken with a Julius in New York, just prior to her coming to Albuquerque in April, 1945.

Did she tell you what Julius had told her?
She did not say what Julius had told her, but I gathered that Julius had knowledge of the fact that information was to be passed from Greenglass to the Soviets.

This is at this particular meeting, in the morning?

Yes.

Did that end the conversation for the morning? This concludes the conversation in the morning with the exception of the fact that I agreed to meet about 3:30 or 4 in the afternoon at the Greenglass apartment.

What happened next?
I returned to the Greenglass apartment at the specified hour in the afternoon. I would like to

Q. state the first meeting was about 15 or 20 minutes duration. The second meeting involved a time interval of only about 5 minutes. I do not believe the Bronz was mentioned and I believe this is purely my guess that the phone number he gave me belonged to Julius.





By that I mean this, did you know that he had been a Communist before that?
Well, I never saw a card but it was commonly assumed in the family that he was. I know that he was propagandizing my husband when he was about 12 or 13 years old; bringing literature in the house, terrific amount of pressure. They were always talking about friends of theirs that were Communists; never doubted that they were. I didn't think they would give the impression if it wasn't so.

David and Ruth Greenglass have executed signed statements with espect to their recruitment by Julius Rosenberg and the results of their activities at the instigation of Rosenberg. On the basis of this information Rosenberg was arrested and arraigned on July 17, 1950, being held in lieu of \$100,000 bail. Based on information from the Greenglasses, supplemented by information from the state of the state o supplemented by information from himself has prused to furnish any information.

David and Ruth Greenglass state they believe that Rosenberg had two apartments - one in the area of 12th Street and Avenue Boward the other in the area of Greenwich Village which he used for microfilm/in connection with his espionage activities. Investigation to locate these apartments is continuing. However, an apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City (which is in the Village) appears to be possibly one of the apartments used. apartment was leased by Alfred Sarant in 1943 and held by him until January, 1950, although he did not live there during the greater portion of this period. He left this apartment in September, 1946, when he moved to Ithaca, New York. At that time Sarant turned the apartment over to Joel Barr, who in turn let William Perl take over the apartment. The superintendent for the building at 65 Morton Street advised that the apartment was very sparsely furnished and on one occasion when he was in the apartment to make repairs he saw a porcelain kitchen table in the middle of the living room with a photo-flood type lamp fixed so as to shine a beam on the table. another occasion the superintendent entered the apartment and saw about seven men sleeping on the floor in sleeping bags. On shother occasion an

individual who gave his name as Alfred Sarant came to the superintendent and asked for the key to the apartment. This individual has been identified by the superintendent from photographs as Michael Sidorovich.

Investigation to locate the apartment on the East Side of New York City has resulted in the superintendent covering the address of 131 East 7th Street positively identifying Rosenberg as a tenant who occupied Apartment 4A in that building for about six to eight months in 1946. Vivian Glassman, the paramour of Joel Barr, presently is occupying this apartment.

New York City, has also positively identified a photograph of Alfred Sarant as a former tenant who resided in Apartment 14 at that address under the name of Walton until about one and a half years ago and had been there for two and one-half years. The superintendent has identified a photograph of Julius Rosenberg as a visitor at the Walton apartment. He has identified a photograph of Mrs. Alfred Sarant as a friend of Walton. Sarant allegedly was residing in Ithaca, New York, during this time, but there are some indications that he may have been in New York City. Further investigation is being conducted with respect to the aforementioned (U) apartment and their use of it.

Max Elitcher

attempted to recruit Elitcher as a Soviet espionage agent.

Elitcher was employed by the Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, In Washington, D. C., until September, 1948, and since that time he has been employed by the Reeves Instrument Corp. in New York City, working on classified Naval contracts.

Blitcher, in a signed statement dated July 20, 1950, admitted that he was approached by Rosenberg in the Summer of 1944 to act as a source of information for the Soviets. He also admitted that he has been approached on about seven occasions since that time by Rosenberg. He claimed that he never furnished Rosenberg any information. Elitcher did admit that one of Elitcher's close friends, Morton Sobell, was furnishing information to Rosenberg. Elitcher also stated that he attended social gatherings on two or three occasions during the period 1945 to 1946, and that other persons attending these meetings were Morton Sobell, Joel Barr, William Perl, and Alfred Sarant. Elitcher gained the impression that all of these persons were cooperating with Rosenberg and that the purpose of these social gatherings was to make him feel more secure with respect to cooperating with Rosenberg. (U)

Morton Sobell

Morton Sobell attended City College of New York from 1934 to 1938, receiving a BEE Degree. He worked for the Bureau of Naval Ordnance, until 1941, and in 1942 he was employed by the General Electric Co. in Schenectady, New York, and he later was employed by the Reeves Instrument Co. in New York City. There is considerable information available to reflect his activities in Communist front organizations. According to Elitcher, Sobell was cooperating with Rosenberg and was furnishing information to Rosenberg for the Soviets. Sobell told Elitcher on one occasion, "Julie (Rosenberg) wants to talk to you about the same thing he was talking to you before." On another occasion Rosenberg indicated to Elitcher that Sobell was furnishing information to Rosenberg. Elitcher, in a subsequent conversation, mentioned this to Sobell and Sobell became quite angry. Elitcher said that upon the arrest of David Greenglass, Sobell became very nervous and left his residence, allegedly to go to the country to take a rest.

We presently are conducting investigation to locate Sobell, but have not succeeded in doing so to date. In connection with his disappearance, it is to be recalled that Rosenberg attempted to get Greenglass to leave the country, giving Greenglass five thousand dollars in all and telling him to go to Mexico, where he was to establish contact with the Soviet Embassy there and thereby obtain an American passport to travel to Europe. We have issued instructions to our Legal Attache in Mexico to ascertain if Sobell is now in Mexico.

William Perl

An Atomic Energy Act investigation was instituted on William
Perl on December, 1, 1949. During this investigation we found that Perl
had been associated with Alfred Sarant, Joel Barr and Max Elitcher.
The have also recently received information from

the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics since 1939.

Perl was interviewed on July 19, 1950, at which time he denied any knowledge of Rosenberg but admitted knowing Joel Barr, Max Elitcher, and Alfred Sarant. He stated that in the Fall of 1946 Barr introduced him to Sarant who had an apartment at 65 Morton Street, New York City. He took over this apartment in 1946 but claims he paid no rent to Sarant until the early part of 1948. He claimed there was no photographic equipment in the apartment at 65 Morton Street. His denial that he knows Rosenberg is interesting in view of the fact that Max Elitcher definitely stated he attended social gatherings with the Rosenbergs and that Perl was included in this group. Perl also denied knowing Michael Sidorovich who, at the present time, is residing in Cleveland, Ohio.

Alfred Sarant

The investigation of Alfred Sarant was recently instituted on the basis of information from

is living just outside of Ithaca, New York. He was interviewed first on July 19, 1950, and has been interviewed twice since then. He is wery evasive. He admitted knowing Julius Rosenberg, Joel Barr, and william Perl. During the course of the initial interview with him he was asked whether Rosenberg ever propositioned him. He replied that Rosenberg did one evening while they were walking together on New York City's Lower East Side. During the conversation between the two men he said he got the impression that Rosenberg was sounding him out politically and he stated, "I did not bite." Sarant was unable to explain if he were just being sounded out on a political level how he knew that Rosenberg was propositioning him to act as a Soviet espionage agent. Sarant claimed he knew Joel Barr was a member of the Communist Party and admitted that he himself has been active in the Party.

Sarant furnished some details concerning the apartment at 65 Morton Street and it is noted that his story and the story of William Perl do not entirely coincide with respect to the payment of rent for this apartment. Sarant executed a signed statement in which he stated positively that he never has known or heard of Max and Helene Elitcher. Here again it is to be noted that Elitcher definitely places him at the social gatherings given by the Rosenbergs.

Sarant also advised that he and Joel Barr set up a firm called the Sarant Laboratories, Inc., in New York City. This firm never was incorporated and Sarant said they never did any real business and used it only as a hobby shop. Further investigation is being conducted to determine if this company was being used as a Soviet cover firm. (W)

OC Sarant also admitted that while he was at the 65 Morton Street apartment he had two sets of flood lamps, a developing tank, and two cameras. He also admitted that Joel Barr had a Leica camera. He denied that this equipment was used for espionage purposes.

JOEL BARR

We originally instituted our investigation of Joel Barr during 1948 in view of the fact that we

determined that Barr was a Communist and had left the United States for Sweden in January, 1948. Barr is presently believed to be residing in Paris, France.

David Greenglass has told us that Rosenberg informed him that Barr was part of Rosenberg's network and had found it necessary to be ave the United States. As mentioned heretofore, we have determined that Vivian Glassman was the girl friend of Joel Barr in 1944 and 1945, and that she is presently residing in the apartment which had been occupied by Rosenberg at 131 East 7th Street, New York City. It is contemplated that she will be interviewed in the immediate future.

Michael and Anne Sidorovich



Ruth Greenglass informed us that she and her husband went to the Rosenberg apartment at 10 Monroe Street during January, 1945. A woman by the name of Anne was present at that time and after she left Rosenberg got out the side of a Jello box which he cut into two parts. Rosenberg said that Anne would be given one portion of this Jello box which would serve as a means of identification. Anne never made this contact, however. Ruth and David Greenglass have also stated that Anne's husband was one Mike who was subsequently identified by David as Michael Sidorovich. Information recently was secured from

Investigation of Sidorovich has reflected (75) that he and his wife, in the period from January, 1944, to January, 1945, resided at Chappaqua, New York, and that Sidorovich sold his home prior to moving to Cleveland, Ohio, in January, 1945. Investigation of Sidorovich has reflected that he fought in Spain as a member of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade. Instructions have been issued to Cleveland to interview Michael Sidorovich and his wife, Anne, assisted by two Agents from the New York Office on July 24, 1950.

Other Individuals

David Greenglass has informed us that Rosenberg on one occasions told him that he had an espionage contact who had flown to Egypt to act as a consultant on a dam there for the Egyptian Government for two hundred dollars per day. The man allegedly left for Egypt in the Summer sometime between 1946 and 1949. We have instituted an investigation to identify this individual and have learned that the dam is the Aswan Dam Project which is being built by European firms, and the two main companies in the United States which have been interested in this development are the Republic Steel Co. and the Westinghouse Electric Co. We have not identified the consulting engineer to date. All leads with respect to this are being closely followed.

Greenglass also has advised us that he saw an individual by the name of Russell MoNutt in 1946. Greenglass at that time was working with Rosenberg in the G & R Engineering Company. Rosenberg later told Greenglass that MoNutt was ok, meaning a Communist. Greenglass believes

MoNutt had gone to school with Rosenberg. McNutt wanted backing to set up a firm for exporting machinery to South America. This proposition never went through. Later, McNutt set up a land development proposition in Westchester County in New York City, to which Rosenberg furnished money. Greenglass believes McNutt may or may not have been an espionage contact of Rosenberg. McNutt previously has been the subject of investigation by us based upon his Communist Party leanings, and his former employment as a design engineer on an MED project. He previously had been investigated by Army Intelligence. We closed our investigation in 1947 when we learned that McNutt had left for Venezuela. In view of the fact that McNutt had worked for Republic Steel Co. we are conducting investigation to determine if he could be the consultant who went to Egypt, as mentioned by David Greenglass.

Information also has been received through David Greenglass to the effect that Rosenberg told him that he had a contact who was working in connection with a project in upstate New York with regard to an air platform which was to be suspended in the air at the point where the earth's gravity ceased to exist. We are attempting to learn, through various U.S. agencies, as to whether such a project is being undertaken by the U.S. Government.

ACTION

All leads with respect to this case are being given the fullest possible attention. We are continuing to interview such persons as Alfred Sarant and William Perl in an effort to secure their cooperation. We intend to conduct further interviews with Max Elitcher to secure further details from him. We are attempting to locate Morton Sobell, and Michael and Anne Sidorovich are being interviewed on July 24, 1950. We are conducting further investigation with respect to the apartments which we have located in New York City to determine if they are being or have been used for microfilm work by Rosenberg. We are attempting to determine the consultant who flew to Egypt. We are conducting investigation of Russell McNutt. Any information which is received sufficient for prosecutive action will be immediately forwarded to the Criminal Division for their opinion.

There is attached hereto for your approval a teletype to the Legal Attaches in Paris and Madrid, instructing them to interview Samuel Perl, the brother of William Perl, and also instructing the Paris office to interview Joel Barr.

GRADUATED IN NINETEEN THIRTYEIGHT AND DID NOT SEE OR HEAR FROM ROSEN-BERG AGAIN UNTIL THE SUMMER OF FORTYFOUR AT WHICH TIME I WAS LIVING AT TWO FOUR SEVEN DELAWARE AVE., SW, WASHINGTON, DC. I WAS AT THIS TIME EMPLOYED BY THE BUREAU OF ORDNANCE NAVY DEPT, AS AN ASSOCIATE ENGINEER. ON THIS OCCASION HE TELEPHONED ME AT MY HOME, IDENTIFIED HIMSELF AS AN OLD CLASSMATE OF MINE AND REQUESTED TO SEE ME. A SHORT TIME LATER HE APPEARED AT MY HOME, AND WE HAD A CONVERSATION LASTING ABOUT THREE QUARTERS OF AN HOUR. ROSENBERG INQUIRED AS TO MY WORK AND I TOLD HIM THAT I WAS WORKING ON DESIGN OF FIRE CONTROL EQUIPMENT FOR NAVY VESSELS. THIS WORK DEALT WITH THE AUTOMATIC AIMING AND FIRING OF NAVY GUNS. ROSENBERG THEN WENT ON TO SPEAK OF THE GREAT ROLE RUSSIA WAS PLAYING IN THE WAR, AND THE GREAT SACRIFICES SHE WAS MAKING. HE STATED THAT SOME PERSONS WERE CONTRIBUTING TO THE RUSSIAN WAR EFFORT BY GIVING INFORMATION CONCERNING SECRET MATERIAL AND DEVELOPMENTS TO THE RUSSIANS, WHICH THEY WOULD NOT ORDINARILY RECEIVE. HE ASKED ME IF I WOULD CON-TRIBUTE IN THIS WAY BY GIVING HIM REPORTS AND DRAWINGS CONCERNING THE WORK IN WHICH I WAS ENGAGED. I DO NOT BELIEVE MY WORK AT THAT TIME WAS CONFIDENTIAL, BUT I HAD ACCESS TO CONFIDENTIAL MATERIAL. I WAS SOMEWHAT

FLATTERED AT THIS REQUEST AND DID BELIEVE I WANTED TO CONRIBUTE TO THE RUSSIAN WAR EFFORT, BUT I COULD NOT SEE MY WAY CLEAR TO COOPERATING IN THIS WAY. I DID NOT FLATLY REFUSE ROSENBERG, BUT PUT HIM OFF WITH STATEMENTS THAT PERHAPS ANY INFORMATION I COULD GET WOULD NOT BE USEFUL, THAT I WOULD THINK ABOUT IT, ETC. HE LEFT, STATING THAT HE WOULD DROP IN AND SEE ME AGAIN, WITHOUT SETTING A DEFINITE DATE. ABOUT THREE MONTHS LATER, ROSENBERG AGAIN VISITED ME BRIEFLY AT THE RESIDENCE MEN-TIONED ABOVE. HE ASKED ME IF I HAD ANY MATERIAL FOR HIM. THAT I HAD NONE, SINCE I HAD NOT INTENDED TO OBTAIN IT. HE MENTIONED AGAIN THE GREAT NEED OF THE RUSSIANS FOR CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION IN CONNECTION WITH MY WORK, AND AGAIN REQUESTED ME TO OBTAIN IT FOR HIM. I GAVE HIM A VAGUE REPLY TO THE EFFECT THAT I WOULD GIVE THE MATTER CONSIDERATION. HE REQUESTED ME TO GET IN TOUCH WITH HIM IF I CAME TO NY AND SAID HE WOULD PROBABLY DROP IN ON ME AGAIN AT WASHINGTON, DC. EARLY IN NINETEEN FORTYFIVE I WAS IN NY ON A BUSINESS TRIP FOR A SHORT TIME. I WAS STILL EMPLOYED AT THE BUREAU OF ORDNANCE ON THE FIRE CONTROL PROJECT. I VISITED ROSENBERG AT HIS HOME ON MONROE ST, NYC. ROSENBERG AGAIN RENEWED HIS REQUESTS FOR INFORMATION, BUT I PUT HIM OFF AGAIN. I SAW ROSENBERG AGAIN ABOUT SIX TIMES, THE LAST TIME BEING

IN THE SPRING OF NINETEEN FORTYEIGHT. ON ALL OF THESE OCCASIONS ROSEN-BERG REPEATED HIS REQUESTS FOR INFORMATION, REFERRING ALWAYS IN SOME FASHION TO THE GREAT NEED FOR SUCH INFORMATION BY THE RUSSIANS. ON ONE OCCASION HE TOLD ME THAT I NEED NOT WORRY ABOUT MONEY, WHICH I UNDERSTOOD TO BE AN OFFER TO PAY MONEY FOR INFORMATION IF NECESSARY. ON THE OCCASION OF OUR LAST INTERVIEW, I TOLD ROSENBERG THAT I HAD DECIDED DEFINITELY THAT I COULD NOT COOPERATE WITH HIM. I ALSO TOLD HIM I HAD DECIDED TO LEAVE MY POSITION WITH THE BUREAU OF ORDNANCE AND MOVE TO NYC, TO WORK FOR THE REEVES INSTRUMENT CORP. ON PARALLEL TYPE OF FIRE CONTROL EQUIPMENT. ROSENBERG WAS PLAINLY DISAPPOINTED AND IN-DICATED THAT HE WOULD MUCH PREFER I STAYED IN THE BUREAU OF ORDNANCE. HE ALSO ASKED ME WHERE IMPORTANT WORK ON FIRE CONTROL APPARATUS WAS BEING DONE. I MENTIONED THE BELL LABORATORY AT WHIPPANY, NJ SINCE I WAS SURE THIS INFORMATION WAS COMMONLY KNOWN TO ANYONE INTERESTED. I TOLD ROSENBERG I MIGHT GET A JOB THERE /AT BELL/, REALIZING THAT I WOULD NOT. ROSENBERG EXPRESSED PLEASURE AT SUCH A PROSPECT, BUT I TOLD HIM THIS MERELY TO TERMINATE THE CONVERSATION. IN ADDITION TO THE CONTACTS WITH ROSENBERG MENTIONED ABOVE, THERE WERE TWO OR THREE SOCIAL CONTACTS DURING THE PERIOD OF MY ACQUAINTANCE WITH ROSENBERG BUT AT THESE TIMES THE QUESTION OF OBTAINING INFORMATION WAS NOT DISCUSSED.

I NEVER GAVE ROSENBERG ANY MATERIAL OF ANY KIND, RELATING TO MY WORK OR ANY OTHER WORK BEING DONE BY THE BUREAU OF ORDNANCE OR ANY OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY OR PRIVATE CORPORATION. ORALLY, I NEVER GAVE ANY INFORMATION TO ROSENBERG EXCEPT THAT I WAS ENGAGED IN A FIRE CONTROL PROJECT. I NEVER WENT INTO ANY DETAILS, NOR DID HE PRESS ME FOR ANY DURING OUR DISCUSSION, APPARENTLY BEING WILLING TO ACCEPT WHATEVER WRITTEN MATERIAL I COULD SUPPLY. I HAVE READ THE ABOVE STATEMENT OF SIX PAGES AND HAVE INITIALLED EACH PAGE. IT IS TRUE TO THE BEST OF MY RECOLLECTION. SIGNED MAX ELITCHER. IN ADDITION ELITCHER STATED MORTON SOBELL HAD BEEN A CLASSMATE OF HIS AND ROSENBERG AT COLLEGE OF CITY OF MY AND HAD BEEN A FELLOW ROKER WITH HIM AT BUREAU OF ORDNANCE, NAVY DEPT, WASH, DC, FROM THIRTYNINE TO FORTYONE, AT WHICH TIME SOBELL WENT TO SCHENECTADY TO WORK FOR THE GENERAL ELECTIC COMPANY ON NAVY CONTRACTS. DURING THE PERIOD SOBELL WAS IN WASHINGTON HE AND ELITCHER WERE QUITE FRIENDLY AND WERE ROOMMATES PART OF THIS TIME. AFTER SOBELL LEFT WASHINGTON HE AND ELITCHER MAINTAINED CONTACT WITH EACH OTHER AND FREQUENTLY SAW EACH OTHER ON THE OCCASION OF ELITCHER-S BUSINESS TRIPS TO SCHENECTADY AND TO NYC. ELITCHER STATED THAT SOME OF THE INTERVIEWS WHICH HE HAD WITH ROSENBERG AT NYC WERE ARRANGED BY SOBELL AND THAT SOBELL WAS APPARENTLY A VERY GOOD FRIEND OF ROSENBERG. ELITCHER ALSO

STATED IT WAS HIS DEFINITE UNDERSTANDING THAT SOBELL WAS FURNISHING INFO TO ROSENBERG AND THAT SOBELL WAS COGNIZANT OF ROSENBERG-S ATTEMPTS TO OBTAIN INFO FROM ELITCHER. ELITCHER WAS EXTREMELY VAGUE AS TO THE DATES AND MANNER IN WHICH SOBELL ARRANGED INTERVIEWS FOR HIM WITH ROSEN-BERG. HE IS ALSO QUITE VAGUE AS TO THE BASIS FOR HIS DEFINITE UNDER-STANDING THAT SOBELL WAS FURNISHING INFO TO ROSENBERG AND WAS COGNIZANT OF ROSENBERG-S EFFORT'S TO OBTAIN INFO FROM ELITCHER HIMSELF. HOWEVER, HE DOES RECALL DEFINITELY THAT ON ONE OF THE OCCASIONS WHEN SOBELL ARRANGED FOR HIM TO MEET ROSENBERG SOBELL STATED "JULIE WANTS TO TALK TO YOU ABOUT THE SAME THING HE WAS TALKING TO YOU BEFORE OR SIMILAR PHRASEOLOGY, INDICATING TO ELITCHER A KNOWLEDGE ON SOBELL-S PART OF ROSENBERG-S ACTIVITIES. ELITCHER ALSO STATED THAT ROSENBERG INDICATED TO HIM IN SOME WAY WHICH HE CANNOT RECALL THAT SOBELL WAS FURNISHING INFORMATION TO ROSENBERG AND THAT ROSENBERG DIVULGED THIS INFO PERHAPS WITH THE VIEW OF PERSUADING ELITCHER TO DO LIKEWISE. ELITCHER STATED THAT WHEN, IN A SUBSEQUENT CONVERSATION WITH SOBELL, HE INDICATED TO SOBELL THAT ROSENBERG HAD TOLD HIM THIS, SOBELL BECAME QUITE ANGRY. ELITCHER STATED THAT SOBELL HAD BEEN ABSENT FROM HIS WORK AT REEVES INSTRUMENT CORP, NY, DURING THE WEEK OF JUNE EIGHTEEN TO TWENTYTHREE. ON OR ABOUT THE LATTER DATE AT SOBELL-S REQUEST, ELITCHER BROUGHT SOBELL-S PAYCHECK TO SOBELL-S HOME. SOBELL, HIS WIFE AND CHILD AND

STEPDAUGHTER LEFT FOR AN UNKNOWN DESTINATION IN SOBELL-S CAR SOMETIME DURING THIS WEEKEND AND TO DATE HAVE NOT RETURNED. THE REEVES INSTRU-MENT CORP HAS ADVISED THAT THEY RECD A NOTE FROM SOBELL STATING HE HAD BEEN SICK AND WAS GOING AWAY TO RECUPERATE FOR A FEW WEEKS. DID NOT STATE WHERE HE COULD BE REACHED. ELITCHER STATES HE HEARD FROM NEIGHBORS THAT SOBELL WENT AWAY TO A FARM FOR A FEW WEEKS TO REPOVER FROM AN ILLNESS. ELITCHER ALSO STATES THAT EDIT LEVITOV OR LEMITOV, THE SISTER OF SOBELL-S WIFE, WHO WAS FORMERLY A STENOGRAPHER AT THE UNITED NATIONS AND RECENTLY A STUDENT AT BROOKLYN COLLEGE, HAD BEEN RESIDING WITH THE SOBELLS BUT IS APPARENTLY NOT RESIDING THERE NOW. IN ADDITION TO THE MEETINGS WITH ROSENBERG MENTIONED IN SIGNED STATE-MENT ELITCHER STATED THAT ON TWO OR THREE OCCASIONS DURING THE PERIOD FORTYFIVE TO FORTYSIX, HE AND HIS WIFE SOCIALIZED WITH ROSENBERG AND A GROUP OF HIS FRIENDS AT NO. ELITCHER DEFINITELY IDENTIFIED THESE PEOPLE AS MORTON SOBELL, JOEP BARR, WILLIAM MUTTERPERL AND ALFRED SARANT. HE STATED HE REMEMBERED MUTTERPERL AND BARR AS FELLOW STUDENTS AT CCNY. HE RECALLED THESE EVENTS AS PARTIES AT BARR-S HOME IN NYC, AT SARANT-S APARTMENT AT SIXTYFIVE MORTON ST, AT ROSENBERG-S APART-MENT AT TEN MONROE ST, AND AT RESTAURANTS. ON THESE OCCASIONS ELITCHER

STATED THAT THE NAMES OF MIKE AND ANNE SIDOROVICH WERE COMPLETELY UN-KNOWN TO HIM NOR DID HE KNOW OF ANY COUPLE BY THE NAMES OF MIKE AND ANNE. HE LATER IDENTIFIED PHOTOS OF ROSENBERG, MUTTERPERL AND BARR. A SEPARATE CASE FILE HAS BEEN OPENED IN THIS OFFICE ON SOBELL AND IN-VESTIGATION IS BEING CONDUCTED TO DETERMINE HIS PRESENT WHEREABOUTS. ELITCHER WILL BE REINTERVIEWED JULY TWO ONE IN ORDER TO OBTAIN MORE DEFINITE INFO IF POSSIBLE IN THE FORM OF A SIGNED STATEMENT RE HIS KNOWLEDGE OF SOBELL AND ANY OTHER PERSONS POSSIBLY CONNECTED WITH THE APPARATUS.
