

As a result of a review of this seport with respect to the testisony relative to Schell, there are being set forth bereinafter certain observations for your attention. It is noted that on page 134 with respect to Item No. 11, which is a receipt from the Bureau of Customs at Dalles, Texas, dated June 23, 1950, that the serial number of the Elm lens is indicated as being 156589. En this regard your offic was previously advised that a subsequent exemination of this lens by the Legal Attache in Mexico City developed that the true serial number for instant lens is 156569.] In the event the original or a copy of instant receipt if in the possession of your division, it is requested that same be carefully examined to verify the fact that the number as appearing in this Custom receipt is accurately reported in referenced summary report. It is further noted that, on page 156, witness Arnold Van Der Mersch of the American Airlines, Mexico City, will be in the position to identify Norton Sobell as the person who on July 22, 1950, presented two tickets to be refunded. In this respect, on page 152 it is noted that witness Guillerso Saldivar of the Gran Hotel Diligencias, Veracrus, Mexico will introduce a registration card reflecting that Bobell was a guest at that botel from July 22 to July 30, 1950. It would therefore appear that the identification of Van Der Mersch is incorrect as some would indicate Sobell was in Mexico City and Verserus on the same date. This opinion as to the incorrectness of Van Der Hersch's identification is strengthened by the fact that Rolando Leal, Manager of the Ado Bus Line in Mexico City, has stated that an individual using the name Morris Sandasoccupied seat Bo. 9 on 101-2483 Classified by \$355 Lec - 65-58236 S. In addition, your attention is invited to page 130 of referenced summary report wherein the contents of a letter written to Sobell by his wife contains a statement that she signed his name to his sheek for the ticket (undoubtedly referring to the cashing of the refund ticket received from American Airlines).

In view of the apparent contradictory nature of the testimony as previously set forth, the Legal Attache in Mexico city is being requested to immediately contect Mr. Van Der Mersch for the purpose of determining whether his identification of Sobell is positive or merely based on the similarity of appearance between an individual whom he recalls being in his office and the photograph of Sobell which was exhibited to him.





PURPOSE

To secure authorization for the New York Office to interview William Spinder in view of the fact that David Greenglass has advised he believes he gave the name of Spines to Gold as a possible recruit at Los Alamos.

DETAILS

When David Greenglass was contacted by Harry Gold. in Albuquerque, New Mexico, in June, 1945, he suggested a few names to Gold as possible recruits for the Soviets at Los Alamos. Gold informed us that he was supprised and apprehensive concerning these suggestions on the part of Greenglass in view of the fact that he thought it might endanger the espionage operation. He told Greenglass to forget about the matter and not to attempt to recruit anyone Greenglass has now advised that he believes he gave the name M of Willian spines to Gold as a possible recruit, and that indel impressed him as being a "leftist."



RECOMMENDATION

Notwithstanding the reported activity of a Communistic nature on the part of Spindel and his wife, it is believed that we should interview him in connection with this investigation for information concerning his knowledge of David Greenglass and to determine if Spindel was ever approached to act as an espionage agent for the Soviets.

A memorandum to the New York Office is attached in line with the above, and they are being cautioned that their interview should be carefully conducted in view of spindel's present employment in order to avoid any criticism of the Bureau.





Re New York letter of instant date to Bureau which recounts the receipt by SA ARMAND A. CAMMAROTA from JEROME EUGENE TARTAKOW of a note and scraps of paper.

For the information of the FBI Laboratory, TARTAKOW is currently lodged together with the above captioned subject in the Federal House of Detention at West Street, New York City.

TARTAKOW has stated that during conversations had with JULIUS ROSENBERG, ROSENBERG drew a sketch of the operational set-up of his espionage ring. When he finished explaining to TARTAKOW this set-up, ROSENBERG tore the note into small pieces and threw them in the toilet in TARTAKOW'S cell. TARTAKOW stated that ROSENBERG did not flush the toilet, and after he had left, TARTAKOW recovered the pieces of paper and kept them to dry in his cell. These scraps of paper were delivered by TARTAKOW to SA CAMMAROTA and were assembled in the New York Office by SE ALBERT E. FALLER. These scraps of paper could not be completely assembled and because of the texture and nature of the paper, it is possible that the outline as finally made up is not complete.

There is being forwarded herewith the scraps of paper as assembled together with the additional scraps of paper which could not be assembled. They are being forwarded in a plain white envelope in which they were delivered to SA CAMMAROTA.

It is requested that the FBI Asboratory makes them.

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



A review of Cleveland files and inquiry through established sources in Cleveland, Toledo, and Akron have failed to identify the unknown professor referred to by DAVID GREENGLASS.

The following possibilities are noted; however, it is pointed out that the very general restrictions placed on the identification by DAVID GREENGLASS preclude a positive identification.

Dr. GOODWIN RESERT SPEENBERG

GREENBERG was born in Damube, Minnesota, June 23, 1918 and was awarded the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Master of Science, and Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Minnesota, the latter in 1944. He is employed as a professor in the co-themistry Section of the Western Reserve University Medical School. From 1944 to 1945 he was employed at the Univer sity of Utah and while there allegedly performed research for the United States Army Chemical Warfare Service, which research was classified secret. RENPERS operates a "ham" radio station from his home and is assigned call tters W 8 Z13

An anonymous complainant advised on January 13, 1948 that the MERNERG's baby sitter (unknown) had stated GREENBERG collects information for a foreign government. Investigation revealed one Camara Desciscio, cappor of the dipolisances had occasionally cared for the CHARLING Child a Cheir absence. Miss Description denied making the above statements on interview.



With reference to the utilization of the P.R.-1 photograph of YAKOVLEV, this matter will be discussed with the United States Attorney and the Bureau will be advised of his intentions.

Atomic Energy Commission has been discussed with United States Attorney SAYPOL on innumerable occasions and it has been specifically pointed out to him that it was desirable to resolve this matter well in advance of the trial of this case. Also that the Atomic Energy Commission desired to clarify this testimony with the Department in advance of the trial, in order to protect classified information. Mr. SAYPOL has stated that he appreciated the wishes of the Atomic Energy Commission and the desirability of resolving this matter in advance of the trial of this case, but that he intended to handle this matter when he prepared the ROSENBERG case for trial, which would be at the completion of the REMINGTON case.

On January 15 last, United States Attorney SAYPOL instructed Chief Assistant United States Attorney MYLES LANE to prepare the VAGO and ROSENGERG cases for trial. Mr. LANE advised that he would begin the preparation of the ROSENBERG case on January 22nd. Also that the latter part of the week of January 22nd, Mr. LANE intends to go to Washington, D. David Greenglass, whose involvement in espionage with Julius Rosenberg, Harry Gold, and others, was detailed in our letter to you dated June 27, 1950, captioned, "David Greenglass, Espionage - R," has now advised that soon after his arrival at Los Alamos, New Nexico, on August 5, 1944, he received a "book of security regulations." Greenglass has been unable to furnish any details or more exact description of the book.

The United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York has requested that a copy of that book be obtained for his use in the prosecution of Rosenberg and the latter's codefendants, and has also requested that he be advised whether there is any objection to the introduction of the book into evidence in the forthcoming trial. As you are probably aware, Rosenberg and his wife, Ethel, Norton Sobell, David Greenglass and Anatoli Antonovich Takovlev were indicted on espionage conspiracy charges by a Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York on October 10, 1950, and their trial on that indictment is presently scheduled for February 13, 1951.

It would be appreciated if you would furnish to the Bureau, for transmittal to the United States of the page, a copy of the book which Greenglass has stated he received at Los Alamos. It would also be appreciated if you would allow whether you have any objection to the utilization of the book as evidence by the United States Attorney.

You will recall that Fuchs was sentenced on March 1, 1950, by Lord Chief Justice Goddard in Old Bailey, London, England, to a term of fourteen years imprisonment on his plea of guilty to an indictment charging four violations of the Official Secrets Act of 1911.

For Lane has requested that he be furnished with an exemplified copy, suitable for introduction into evidence at the trial of Rosenberg, et al, of the court records which establish the indictment, plea of guilty, sentence and final judgment of Fuchs.

It is respectfully suggested that the Department of State be requested to obtain the above-described documents for Mr. Lane's use. Mr. ROBERT MFAGHER, Present & Company, Inc., 1115 Temple Building, Rochester, stated that an examination of their records disclosed that they received, by Perraux Invoice No. P-2524 dated June 28, 1944, a Model No. 352, 14 Karat pink gold diamond watch. The invoice did not reflect whether the watch contained a Driva movement or not. Mr. MEAGHER advised that inasmich as the Present & Company did not maintain a running inventory it would be virtually impossible to ascertain by records the persons to whom watches are sold by that company. Mr. MEAGHER advised that he had no personal recollection of the above mentioned watch.

Mr. BERYL RESENT, one of the proprietors of the company, likewise stated that he had no personal recollection concerning the above mentioned watch and could not state whether it contained a Driva or Perraux movement. Photographs of the watch in the possession of ETHEL ROSENBERG were shown both to Mr. MEAGHER and Mr. PRESENT without identification.

On January 27, 1951, SA CHAPLES J. HARKINS contacted Mr. GORDON PRESENT, President of Present & Company, who advised that he did not remember the watch in question but stated that he did not recall ever receiving a Perraux watch with a Driva movement therein.

Prior to 1942 some Jello cartons were manufactured by the Postum Cereal Division, General Foods Corp., Battle Creek, Michigan. In 1950 the U.S. Printing & Lithograph Corp., Mineola, Long Island, manufactured for the Jello Division on a sub-contract basis sixteen million cartons marked Orange, eighteen million cartons marked Lemon and sixteen million cartons marked Lime. These cartons manufactured at Mineola are identified by the letter "P" on the glue flap of the carton.

Mr. BRIERIEY explained that the cartons manufactured by the Jello Division are identified according to form number. In this connection he explained the various form numbers as follows:

Form #10

The first carton of Form #10 was printed for the Lemon flavor on July 12, 1943. This form differed from the previous form in that the number seven flavor "Cola" was discontinued as the seventh flavor and the type of the ingredient lines were increased from six point to eight point (increased to one-ninth of an inch). The cartons manufactured for the other flavors were first printed on the following dates:

Strawberry August 6, 1943 Cherry July 12, 1943 Lime September 2, 1943 Raspberry July 12, 1943 Orange July 12, 1943.

Form #11

On September 11, 1944 the Jello Plant began to print one hundred twelve million cartons known as the "Special Edition", which carried a reference to "The Kate Smith Hour". This edition was discontinued on December 21, 1944 and the inventories of Form #10 were then used up.

Form #11 cartons first appeared in the following order:

Copies of all flavers except Lime are being transmitted to your office of this form number. This form contains a series of recipes to replace the advertisement for "The Kata Smith Hour" listed on Form #11. The first paragraph of the directions panel and the sub-headings of the second and third paragraphs are set forth in bold-face type. Other changes were made in the type matter pertaining to the directions.

This form number was manufactured from March 15, 1945 to May 6, 1946.

Form #13

The only change on this form is that the word "Dextrose" was omitted from the ingredient line in all flavors. These cartons were manufacture from March 7, 1946 to September 3, 1946.

This form number is identified by the Symbol LR-13 located on the glue flap of the carton, identifying the carton as Form #13 made at the LeRoy, New York Plant. All other cartons made subsequent to Form #13 are identified in this manner.

Form #14

This form is not being transmitted as it is a carton made for a "Sure-Jell" solution and is not a jello.

Form #15

This form is the same as #13 except that the recipes were omitted and the top panel contains an advertisement of the "New Baby Snocks Show".

These cartons were manufactured from September 3. 1945 to April 24, 1947 when they were discontinued.

Form #16

Only one flavor (Cherry) is available of this form. The only change in the form is the word "tartaric" is dropped from the ingredient line on all flavors.

This form was first printed on April 24, 1947.

Form #17

The change in this form affects only the Lemon cartons. The words "vegetable color" are omitted from the ingredient line and the words "U.S. certified color" are added.

These cartons were printed from April 28, 1947 to Hay 19, 1947.

Form #18

This form has the word "Dextrese" and the words "Sodium citrate and/or phosphate" added to the ingredient line of all flavors.

This form was first printed on May 12, 1947 and was discontinued on Movember 14, 1947.

An extra flavor of Grape was made and shipped in carton #18. However, only 50,400 cartons were manufactured and all of these were shipped to the Chicago area on July 11, 1947. The carton with the Grape Jello contains the lettering "Seven delicious flavors". The other cartons all contain the lettering "Six delicious flavors".

Form #19 .

This form contains a change in recipe only, affecting all flavors.

This carton was originally manufactured on November 14. 1947.

Form #20

This form number has not been transmitted as it is a Jello Tapioca and not a jello.

Form #21

The only change in this form is that the ribbon is inverted and the word "Brand" is set in blue over the ribbon.

Cartons of this type were first made on December 30, 1947 and were discontinued in August, 1948.

Form #22

This form is for a carton used on "Sure-Jell" and is not being transmitted.

Form #23

The only difference in this carton is the word "Brand" is changed in lettering from blue to red. It remains in the same position on the carton.

The first carton of this type was manufactured on Harch 26, 1948.

Form #24

On this carton the word "Dextress" was dropped from the ingredient line.

This carton was first made on November 26, 1948.

Forms #25 - #34

Forms #25 through #34 are cartons being used for products made by this company other than Jello.

Form //35

This form is a carton used only for Grape Jello as the company is still experimenting with the sales of this type of Jello. The carton contains the lettering "Six delicious flavors" rather than "Seven" when this flavor was previously used.

Form #36

This is the form listed for the cartons manufactured at incclations Island by the U.S. Printing and Lithograph Corp. These carters are identified by the letter "P" on the glue flap of the carton.

Hr. BRIERLEY explained that these cartons are usually delivered to the retail stores approximately sixty days after their manufacture at this plant. However, cartons remain on the shelves of retail stores indefinitely.

Included in this article will be found what purports to be three photographs of the parade and rites. The article states the photographs were made by Doctor CHESTER BEBBER.

On page 2 at the head of column three of the same issue, June 4, 1945, will be found a second article entitled: "City Catholics Held Eucharist". The by-line is by A. C. DE COLA, in which the parade and the rites are described.

Doctor CHESTER F. BEBBER, 204-5 Sunshine Building, Albuquerque, New Mexico, advised that he is an optometrist by profession and an amateur photographer by hobby. On a Sunday afternoon early in June, 1945, precise date not recalled, he stated that a parade was held by all Catholic groups in the Albuquerque area which began at Saint Charles Church, 1808 East Coal, then proceeded in a northerly direction to the grounds of the University of New Mexico, located between 1800 and 3000 East Central Avenue, then proceeded west on Central Avenue, passing beneath the railroad tracks at the Santa Fe overpass on Central Avenue, continuing to a point approximately 900 West Central where the final rites were held. During the course of this parade and the rites, he stated he made a number of photographs, several of which were made while standing on the railroad tracks of the Santa Fe Railroad at the point where Central Avenue passes thereunder. The camera was pointed in an easterly direction and shows portions of the parade, as well as a portion of the east approach to the Central Avenue underpass above referred to. He stated that the negatives of these photographs were delivered to Archbishop EDWIN V. BYRNE at Santa Fe, New Mexico. These prints were made and were then on display in the vestibule of Saint Charles Church, 1818 East Coal. In the vestibule of this church, Dr. BEBBER pointed out the photographs to which he referred. They were observed to consist of twenty-one photographs mounted in a frame, bearing the captioned date of June 3, 1945. Three of the photographs were observed to have been made from a position on the railroad tracks of the Santa Fe Railroad at the point where Central Avenue passes thereunder, the camera being pointed in an easterly direction.

Dr. BEBBER advised that when served with a subpoena duces tecum, he would arrange to obtain temporary possession of these prints from the officials of the Saint Charles Church or would arrange to obtain the negatives of these prints from Archbishop BYRNE of Santa Fe, New Mexico, for use in any judicial proceeding. The photographs during the interim will remain in the vestibule of Saint Charles Church.

Inclosures to New York: : Copy of the memorandum dated June 1, 1945, from City Manager CHARLES E. WELLS to the Chief of Police, advising that a parade and city-wide rites would be held by Catholic groups in Albuquerque on June 3, 1945, as described above.





This watch was listed as a ladies watch, price \$99.00, plus \$19.80 Federal tax and \$2.48 sales tax.





Mr. LANE advised that he then called Mr. PEYTON FORD at the Department. Mr. FORD told him that he should tell the commissioners that the Department of Justice would recommend the death sentence in this case.

Mr. LANE said that at the termination of this conference, he and the commissioners proceeded to a closed meeting of the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy which was also attended by representatives of the Army and Navy. Mr. LANE addressed this meeting and explained the problem. He stated he was questioned by various Senators and Congressmen, including Senators HICKENLOOPER and BRICKER. Among the questions asked Mr. LANE, by the Senators and Congressmen, were:

- (1), Was the death penalty going to be recommended by the
- (2). Who was going to try the case and when?
- (3). What judge would preside at the trial?

If. LANE advised that Senator BRICKER recommended that the Joint Committee should go on record of absolving the Department of any criticism for introducing into the trial classified material concerning the atom bomb.



PITZPATRICE advised that he had no recollection of UREENULASS being selected to go to the Pacific to aid in the assembly of the Atomic Bomb. He said that no one from his group was selected and, as a matter of fact, he was not aware who made the selections or upon what they were based. He said that GREENGLASS had no special ability which would have caused him to be selected.

PITZPATRICK stated that he never met Wis GREENGLASS and knew nothing about her, but was aware that GREENGLASS was married. He was positive that he never knew that Mrs. GREENGLASS had suffered a miscarriage.

PITZPATRICK could not suggest the names of persons who might have been aware of selections for the Pacific Group, but stated that WENDELL MARSHMAN, Expediter in the machine shop, and ROBERT HOLLAND (FITZPATRICK believes that ROBERT was HOLLAND's middle name and could not recall his given name), who was in charge of the machine shop, would have had closer contact with GREENGLASS. He advised that he believes that MARSHMAN is now employed in New York City and living in Pompton Plains, New Jersey and that HOLLAND is working and resides in or around New York City.



DETAILS

David Greenglass advised that while stationed at the atomic bomb project in Los Alamos in 1945 he believes he gave the name of Hyman Adler, who was also stationed at Los Alamos, to Harry Gold as possible recruit for Soviet espionage. Greenglass stated that he was very friendly with Adler at Los Alamos and that Adler was not a CP sympathiser. However, Greenglass has advised that be believed Adler was a Communist in thought.

Adler is presently residing at 647 Faile Street, Bronx, New York, and is reportedly attending the City College of New York Wight School of Engineering. He was born August 16, 1915, at May York City in he was in the United States Army from September 2, 14 52 until arch 9, 1946. He was employed by the Electronics Corporation of imerica from 1936 to 1943. It is to be neglectivat the Electronics Corporation of America was headed by Samuel Hovack who was implicated " the espionage activities of Arthur A. Adams. There is, however, no own connection between Adler's employment and the espionage activities Moyack. The files of the New York Office reflect that one Ryman Adles to form in 1915, was a member of 190 Lodge 52 in 1949. The records E MIC PD reflect that Ryman Adler, 134 Elliot Place, New York, signed a CP petition on 10/1/40. It is known that Adler has listed an address 134 Miliot Place, Bronx, New york. 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
Harry Gold has stated that, when he contacted Greenglass in Albuquerque, he gained the impression that Greenglass was somewhat naive because he suggested to Gold that the latter recruit another individual who was assigned to the same section at Ios Alamos. Gold has further stated that he took the information which was furnished by Greenglass and turned it over to Yakovlev.



RECOMMENDATION

Motwithstanding the fact that Adler has signed a CP petition, and is described by Greenglass as a Communist in thought, it would appear advisable to interview Adler to determine if he has ever been approached by anyone to act as an espionage agent, and particularly whether he knows anything concerning Greenglass' espionage activities or the espionage activities of Julius Rosenberg.




