Reference is made to the summary report of Special Agent William P. Norton, Jr. dated at New York January 2, 1951, in the case entitled "Julius Rosenberg, et al, Espionage - R," New York file 65-15948. As a result of a review of this report with respect to the testimony relative to Sobell, there are being set forth hereinafter certain observations for your attention.

It is noted that on page 134 with respect to item No. 41, which is a receipt from the Bureau of Customs at Dallas, Texas, dated June 23, 1950, that the serial number of the Elmer lens is indicated as being 156589. In this regard your office was previously advised that a subsequent examination of this lens by the Legal Attache in Mexico City developed that the true serial number for instant lens is 156569. In the event the original or a copy of instant receipt is in the possession of your division, it is requested that same be carefully examined to verify the fact that the number as appearing in this Customs receipt is accurately reported in referenced summary report.

It is further noted that, on page 156, witness Arnold Van Der Mersch of the American Airlines, Mexico City, will be in the position to identify Morton Sobell as the person who on July 22, 1950, presented two tickets to be refunded. In this respect, on page 152 it is noted that witness Guillermo Saldivar of the Gran Hotel Diligencias, Veracruz, Mexico will introduce a registration card reflecting that Sobell was a guest at that hotel from July 22 to July 30, 1950. It would therefore appear that the identification of Van Der Mersch is incorrect as same would indicate Sobell was in Mexico City and Veracruz on the same date. This opinion as to the incorrectness of Van Der Mersch's identification is strengthened by the fact that Rolando Leal, Manager of the Ado Bus Line in Mexico City, has stated that an individual using the name Morris Sanders occupied seat No. 9 on

their bus from Mexico City to Veracruz leaving Mexico City at twelve midnight on July 21, 1950. As you are aware, Morris Sands is the name known to have been used by Sobell in obtaining his bus ticket and at the time of his registration in the Gran Hotel Diligencias, Veracruz. In addition, your attention is invited to page 130 of referenced summary report wherein the contents of a letter written to Sobell by his wife contains a statement that she signed his name to his check for the ticket (undoubtedly referring to the cashing of the refund ticket received from American Airlines). (S)u

In view of the apparent contradictory nature of the testimony as previously set forth, [the Legal Attache in Mexico City is being requested to immediately contact Mr. Van Der Marsch for the purpose of determining whether his identification of Sobell is positive or merely based on the similarity of appearance between an individual whom he recalls being in his office and the photograph of Sobell which was exhibited to him.] (S)u

PURPOSE

To secure authorization for the New York Office to interview William Spindel in view of the fact that David Greenglass has advised he believes he gave the name of Spindel to Gold as a possible recruit at Los Alamos.

DETAILS

When David Greenglass was contacted by Harry Gold in Albuquerque, New Mexico, in June, 1945, he suggested a few names to Gold as possible recruits for the Soviets at Los Alamos. Gold informed us that he was surprised and apprehensive concerning these suggestions on the part of Greenglass in view of the fact that he thought it might endanger the espionage operation. He told Greenglass to forget about the matter and not to attempt to recruit anyone. Greenglass has now advised that he believes he gave the name of William Spindel to Gold as a possible recruit, and that Spindel impressed him as being a "leftist."

We conducted an Atomic Energy Act investigation of Spindel in 1949. His PSQ reflects that he was employed at Los Alamos from April, 1944, to October, 1945. Our investigation of him reflected his wife was a member of the Communist Party in March, 1944. Spindel has admitted attending meetings of the American Students Union.

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Following his leaving Los Alamos in 1945, Spindel was an instructor at Columbia University until 1949, and since then has been an instructor at the Brooklyn Polytechnical Institute. He resides at 125 Lincoln Road, Brooklyn, New York. The New York Office has requested authorization to interview Spindel. 67-

RECOMMENDATION

Notwithstanding the reported activity of a Communistic nature on the part of Spindel and his wife, it is believed that we should interview him in connection with this investigation for information concerning his knowledge of David Greenglass and to determine if Spindel was ever approached to act as an espionage agent for the Soviets.

A memorandum to the New York Office is attached in line with the above, and they are being cautioned that their interview should be carefully conducted in view of Spindel's present employment in order to avoid any criticism of the Bureau.

Re New York letter of instant date to Bureau which recounts the receipt by SA ARMAND A. CAMMAROTA from JEROME EUGENE TARTAKOW of a note and scraps of paper.

For the information of the FBI Laboratory, TARTAKOW is currently lodged together with the above captioned subject in the Federal House of Detention at West Street, New York City.

TARTAKOW has stated that during conversations had with JULIUS ROSENBERG, ROSENBERG drew a sketch of the operational set-up of his espionage ring. When he finished explaining to TARTAKOW this set-up, ROSENBERG tore the note into small pieces and threw them in the toilet in TARTAKOW'S cell. TARTAKOW stated that ROSENBERG did not flush the toilet, and after he had left, TARTAKOW recovered the pieces of paper and kept them to dry in his cell. These scraps of paper were delivered by TARTAKOW to SA CAMMAROTA and were assembled in the New York Office by SE ALBERT E. FALLER. These scraps of paper could not be completely assembled and because of the texture and nature of the paper, it is possible that the outline as finally made up is not complete.

There is being forwarded herewith the scraps of paper as assembled together with the additional scraps of paper which could not be assembled. They are being forwarded in a plain white envelope in which they were delivered to SA CAMMAROTA.

EVERETT PALMIST CARSMAN was secretary to STEVE NELSON while NELSON was Communist Party Chairman at Alameda County, California. SAM CARSMAN is a veteran of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade and during 1943 was in almost daily contact with Communist Party headquarters in San Francisco.

The only recent activity ascribed to GREENBERG, other than stated above, is that an automobile registered to him was observed by Special Agent JOHN B. O'DONOGHUE to be parked in the vicinity of the residence of HERMANN HAVILAND FIELD at which time a meeting of the Cleveland Council of Arts, Sciences and Professions was in session at the FIELD residence on May 22, 1949.

Dr. JOHN A. MUNTZ

Dr. MUNTZ is an assistant professor of Bio-Chemistry at Western Reserve University and has been in Cleveland since July, 1946. Prior to his arrival in Cleveland, he was employed as a research associate at the University of Chicago.

The Cleveland Plain Dealer, a metropolitan daily newspaper, in its issue of April 11, 1949, stated MUNTZ was chairman of a meeting of the Cleveland Council of Arts, Sciences and Professions, held at the Alcazar Hotel on April 10, 1949.

An automobile registered to JOHN MUNTZ was observed parked in the vicinity of HERMANN HAVILAND FIELD on May 22, 1950 by Special Agent JOHN B. O'DONOGHUE, at which time a meeting of the Cleveland Council of Arts, Sciences and Professions was in session at the FIELD residence.

Agents of the 109th Detachment CIC, Columbus, Ohio, furnished a photographic copy of the official transcript containing the testimony given before the Ohio Senate Judiciary Committee on May 25th and June 2, 1949 to the Cincinnati Office on June 16, 1949. The hearings were held for the purpose of determining the advisability of recommending the Bartunek Siebert Bill before the Ohio legislature. This bill was anti-Communist and during the hearings JOHN SE LAGI, Chairman of the Progressive Party of Ohio, furnished a letter from six Western Reserve University professors, including JOHN A. MUNTZ, protesting the Bartunek-Siebert Bill.

The May 7, 1950 issue of the Ohio edition of the Worker contained an article on Page 10, Columns 1 through 3, which listed the subject as one of several who protested the Mundt Bill.

Unless advised to the contrary, no further action will be taken in this matter. RUC

With reference to the utilization of the P.R.-1 photograph of YAKOVLEV, this matter will be discussed with the United States Attorney and the Bureau will be advised of his intentions.

The proposed testimony of a representative of the Atomic Energy Commission has been discussed with United States Attorney SAYPOL on innumerable occasions and it has been specifically pointed out to him that it was desirable to resolve this matter well in advance of the trial of this case. Also that the Atomic Energy Commission desired to clarify this testimony with the Department in advance of the trial, in order to protect classified information. Mr. SAYPOL has stated that he appreciated the wishes of the Atomic Energy Commission and the desirability of resolving this matter in advance of the trial of this case, but that he intended to handle this matter when he prepared the ROSENBERG case for trial, which would be at the completion of the REMINGTON case.

On January 15 last, United States Attorney SAYPOL instructed Chief Assistant United States Attorney MYLES LANE to prepare the VAGO and ROSENBERG cases for trial. Mr. LANE advised that he would begin the preparation of the ROSENBERG case on January 22nd. Also that the latter part of the week of January 22nd, Mr. LANE intends to go to Washington, D. C. to discuss the testimony of the Atomic Energy Commission representative with the Department of Justice.

David Greenglass, whose involvement in espionage with Julius Rosenberg, Harry Gold, and others, was detailed in our letter to you dated June 27, 1950, captioned, "David Greenglass, Espionage - R," has now advised that soon after his arrival at Los Alamos, New Mexico, on August 3, 1944, he received a "book of security regulations." Greenglass has been unable to furnish any details or more exact description of the book.

The United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York has requested that a copy of that book be obtained for his use in the prosecution of Rosenberg and the latter's codefendants, and has also requested that he be advised whether there is any objection to the introduction of the book into evidence in the forthcoming trial. As you are probably aware, Rosenberg and his wife, Ethel, Morton Sobell, David Greenglass and Anatoli Antonovich Yakovlev were indicted on espionage conspiracy charges by a Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York on October 10, 1950, and their trial in that indictment is presently scheduled for February 13, 1951.

It would be appreciated if you would furnish to the Bureau, for transmittal to the United States Attorney, a copy of the book which Greenglass has stated he received at Los Alamos. It would also be appreciated if you would advise whether you have any objection to the utilization of the book as evidence by the United States Attorney.

YAKOVLEV, also known as "John", DAVID OWEN GLASS and NORTON SOFFEL, the defendants herein, did, the United States of America then and there being at war, conspire, combine, confederate and agree with each other and with Harry Gold and Ruth Greenglass, named as co-conspirators but not as defendants, and with divers other persons presently to the Grand Jury unknown, to violate subsection (a) of Section 32, Title 50, United States Code, in that they did conspire, combine, confederate and agree, with intent and reason to believe that it would be used to the advantage of a foreign nation, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, to communicate, deliver and transmit to a foreign government, to wit, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and representatives and agents thereof, directly and indirectly, documents, writings, sketches, notes and information relating to the National Defense of the United States of America.

CRIMINAL ACTS

1. In pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the District of Columbia, on or about June 6, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG visited a building at 247 Delaware Avenue, Washington, D.C.

2. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about November 13, 1944, the defendants JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG conferred with Ruth Greenglass.

5. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about December 10, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG went to 266 Stanton Street, New York City.

6. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about December 10, 1944, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG received from Ruth Greenglass a paper containing written information.

7. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 5, 1945, the defendants JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG conferred with the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS and Ruth Greenglass.

8. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 5, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG gave Ruth Greenglass a portion of the side of a torn cardboard "Jello" box.

9. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 10, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG introduced the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS to a man on First Avenue, New York City.

10. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 12, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG conferred with the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS.

11. And further in pursuance of said conspiracy and to effect the objects thereof, in the Southern District of New York, on or about January 13, 1945, the defendant JULIUS ROSENBERG received from the defendant DAVID GREENGLASS a paper containing sketches of experiments conducted at the Los Alamos Project.

Rebulet January 19, 1951, which requests that the Bureau be advised whether DAVID GREENGLASS had made any elaboration of the statements that ROSENBERG had told him that some of GREENGLASS' associates at Los Alamos were studying at the University of Chicago and that GREENGLASS, if he had been attending said university, would be in a position to obtain information regarding the atom bomb through these former associates.

GREENGLASS was interviewed by SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON at the New York City Tombs. He stated that the only persons whom he recalls that ROSENBERG told him about were THOMAS FINEBERG and EMANUEL SCHWARTZ.

GREENGLASS stated that FINEBERG had been a student at Chicago University at the time he was drafted into the Army, and that he was certain that FINEBERG told him that, when he was discharged, he would return to the university to continue his studies.

He stated that EMANUEL SCHWARTZ was a Mathematical Biophysicist and had been an instructor at Chicago University before he was attached to Los Alamos. GREENGLASS advised that SCHWARTZ left Los Alamos before he did, and that he gave GREENGLASS his telephone number, suggesting that GREENGLASS call him if he was ever in Chicago.

GREENGLASS stated that on his way home from Los Alamos he stopped off at Chicago and called SCHWARTZ. He stated that the telephone was answered by Mrs. SCHWARTZ, who advised GREENGLASS that her husband was then working at Chicago University. GREENGLASS stated that he has never seen or heard from SCHWARTZ since that day.

GREENGLASS was questioned carefully concerning the possible espionage activities of FINEBERG and SCHWARTZ, and he stated that, to his knowledge, neither of these men was engaged in espionage. He explained that, when ROSENBERG told him that these men were studying at the University of Chicago and that,

If he, DAVID GREENGLASS, attended the college, he would be in a position to obtain information from them concerning their work on atomic energy. ROSENBERG said this because DAVID GREENGLASS had been friendly with these men at Los Alamos and, in all probability, they would discuss with him the work that they were doing at the university. GREENGLASS stated that it was not because these men were espionage agents that he would obtain information from them, but rather because of his personal relationship with them from Los Alamos.

The Bureau is advised that both FINEBERG and SCHWARTZ have been interviewed thoroughly by the Chicago Office. The Bureau's attention is directed to the reports of SA W. RULON PAXMAN dated December 19, 1950, and January 20, 1951, submitted under the title "DAVID GREENGLASS, was; ESPIONAGE - R", which report results of interview with FINEBERG. The Bureau's attention is also directed to the report of SA JEREMIAH J. HURLEY dated August 6, 1950, at Chicago, and submitted in the case of "JULIUS ROSENBERG; ESPIONAGE - R". This last report refers to the interview of EMANUEL SCHWARTZ by Chicago Agents.

Chief Assistant United States Attorney Hyles J. Lane of the Southern District of New York has advised our New York Division that in the prosecution of Julius Rosenberg, et al, on the espionage conspiracy indictment returned in the Southern District of New York on October 10, 1950, he intends to establish the relationship and espionage activities of Harry Gold and Dr. Klaus Emil Julius Fuchs. You will recall that Fuchs was sentenced on March 1, 1950, by Lord Chief Justice Goddard in Old Bailey, London, England, to a term of fourteen years imprisonment on his plea of guilty to an indictment charging four violations of the Official Secrets Act of 1911.

Mr. Lane has requested that he be furnished with an exemplified copy, suitable for introduction into evidence at the trial of Rosenberg, et al, of the court records which establish the indictment, plea of guilty, sentence and final judgment of Fuchs.

It is respectfully suggested that the Department of State be requested to obtain the above-described documents for Mr. Lane's use. There is attached for your signature a letter to the Secretary of State requesting that the specified documents be secured and forwarded for use in the forthcoming prosecution.

PURPOSE

To suggest that an exemplified copy of the British court records reflecting the indictment, guilty plea, sentence, and final judgment of Dr. Fuchs on March 1, 1950, which records were requested by Chief Assistant United States Attorney Lane, Southern District of New York, for use in the Rosenberg prosecution 2/13/51, be secured by the Department through the Department of State.

DETAILS

Chief AUSA Lane, Southern District of New York, informed the New York Division he intends, in the forthcoming prosecution of Rosenberg, et al, to establish the relationship and espionage activities of Harry Gold and Fuchs. Mr. Lane requested that he be furnished with an exemplified copy of British court records establishing the indictment, plea of guilty, sentence, and final judgement of Fuchs, for his use in the Rosenberg trial.

The Foreign Service Desk has advised that our Legat in London is temporarily in Paris on an important special assignment and the date of his return to London is indefinite.

Inasmuch as the Rosenberg trial is presently scheduled to commence 2/13/51, it is believed that the documents specified by Mr. Lane can best be secured by the State Department upon request of the Attorney General. Accordingly, there are attached appropriate letters for that purpose.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Department of State be requested by the Attorney General to secure the court records desired by Mr. Lane. If you approve, there are attached a memorandum to the Attorney General, advising him of Mr. Lane's desires, and a letter to the Secretary of State for the signature of the Attorney General.

they learned that the American Peace Committee occupied a room on the second floor of the Lincoln Congregational Temple at 1701 14th Street, Northwest. They also learned that the American Peace Committee is sponsored by the local Communist Party, Washington, D. C., The Washington Youth Council, and the National Council for Prevention of War. This investigation reflected that the organization had obtained 12,000 leaflets ready to be distributed. These leaflets were to be distributed by CHARLOTTE YOUNG, Executive Secretary of the Committee. CHARLOTTE YOUNG has been described by Confidential Informants of the Washington Field Office as having been active in Communist circles in Washington, D. C. for many years and is reported to be a member of the Communist Party. She was assisted by LUCAS COCK, Executive Secretary of the D. C. Branch of the League for Peace and Democracy. [This file further reflected that TED OZMUN, who was described as the Head of the Communist Party in the District of Columbia, had been very active in establishing this Committee. This Committee was reported to hold meetings each first and third Thursday of the month at the Mount Pleasant Public Library, 16th and Irving Street, Northwest. During the course of this investigation, Mrs. FRANCES S. OSBORNE, Librarian at the Mount Pleasant Library, stated that the persons attending these meetings are usually Negroes or Jewish. She also stated that during the last meeting held at the Library, among those present were Congressman GIER of California, and Rev. GEORGE A. [redacted], Assistant Minister of the Mount Pleasant Congregational Church. She advised this Committee was known to the Mount Pleasant Peace Committee.]

The files of the Washington Field Office contained no reference to the Mount Pleasant Peace Committee. These files also contained no information which could connect JULIUS ROSENBERG with the Emergency Peace Committee. RUC

Mr. ROBERT MEAGHER, Present & Company, Inc., 1115 Temple Building, Rochester, stated that an examination of their records disclosed that they received, by Perraux Invoice No. P-2524 dated June 28, 1944, a Model No. 352, 14 Karat pink gold diamond watch. The invoice did not reflect whether the watch contained a Driva movement or not. Mr. MEAGHER advised that inasmuch as the Present & Company did not maintain a running inventory it would be virtually impossible to ascertain by records the persons to whom watches are sold by that company. Mr. MEAGHER advised that he had no personal recollection of the above mentioned watch.

Mr. BERYL PRESENT, one of the proprietors of the company, likewise stated that he had no personal recollection concerning the above mentioned watch and could not state whether it contained a Driva or Perraux movement. Photographs of the watch in the possession of ETHEL ROSENBERG were shown both to Mr. MEAGHER and Mr. PRESENT without identification.

On January 27, 1951, SA CHARLES J. HAWKINS contacted Mr. GORDON PRESENT, President of Present & Company, who advised that he did not remember the watch in question but stated that he did not recall ever receiving a Perraux watch with a Driva movement therein.

RE: JELLO BOXES

New York teletype to Buffalo dated January 13, 1951 requested that the General Foods Plant, LeRoy, N.Y. be contacted and all descriptive information concerning jello boxes in use during the years 1944 and 1945 be obtained.

AT LEROY, NEW YORK

The following investigation was conducted by SA THOMAS J. JORDAN:

There is no Mr. BARLEY at the Jello Plant, General Foods Corp., LeRoy, New York.

KARL G. BRIERLEY, Superintendent of Carton Manufacturing, advised he is the person competent to testify in court regarding Jello boxes and he has been notified by the General Foods Corp. attorneys in New York City that he can expect a subpoena to testify at the ROSENBERG trial next month.

BRIERLEY explained that until May, 1941 Jello boxes had the following dimensions:

Flat - 6 1/16" x 8 7/8"
Folded - Height 2 13/16"
Width 3 3/8"
Thickness 1 5/16"

From May, 1941 to the present Jello boxes have the following dimensions:

Flat - 4 29/32" x 8 1/8"
Folded - Height 2 3/16"
Width 3 3/8"
Thickness 1"

Prior to 1942 some Jello cartons were manufactured by the Postum Cereal Division, General Foods Corp., Battle Creek, Michigan. In 1950 the U.S. Printing & Lithograph Corp., Mineola, Long Island, manufactured for the Jello Division on a sub-contract basis sixteen million cartons marked Orange, eighteen million cartons marked Lemon and sixteen million cartons marked Lime. These cartons manufactured at Mineola are identified by the letter "P" on the glue flap of the carton.

Mr. BRIERLEY explained that the cartons manufactured by the Jello Division are identified according to form number. In this connection he explained the various form numbers as follows:

Form #10

The first carton of Form #10 was printed for the Lemon flavor on July 12, 1943. This form differed from the previous form in that the number seven flavor "Cola" was discontinued as the seventh flavor and the type of the ingredient lines were increased from six point to eight point (increased to one-ninth of an inch). The cartons manufactured for the other flavors were first printed on the following dates:

Form #11

On September 11, 1944 the Jello Plant began to print one hundred twelve million cartons known as the "Special Edition", which carried a reference to "The Kate Smith Hour". This edition was discontinued on December 21, 1944 and the inventories of Form #10 were then used up.

Form #11 cartons first appeared in the following order:

Form #12

Copies of all flavors except Lime are being transmitted to your office of this form number. This form contains a series of recipes to replace the advertisement for "The Kate Smith Hour" listed on Form #11. The first paragraph of the directions panel and the sub-headings of the second and third paragraphs are set forth in bold-face type. Other changes were made in the type matter pertaining to the directions.

This form number was manufactured from March 15, 1945 to May 6, 1946.

Form #13

The only change on this form is that the word "Dextrose" was omitted from the ingredient line in all flavors. These cartons were manufactured from March 7, 1946 to September 3, 1946.

This form number is identified by the Symbol LR-13 located on the glue flap of the carton, identifying the carton as Form #13 made at the LeRoy, New York Plant. All other cartons made subsequent to Form #13 are identified in this manner.

Form #14

This form is not being transmitted as it is a carton made for a "Surc-Jell" solution and is not a jello.

Form #15

This form is the same as #13 except that the recipes were omitted and the top panel contains an advertisement of the "New Baby Snooks Show".

These cartons were manufactured from September 3, 1946 to April 24, 1947 when they were discontinued.

Form #16

Only one flavor (Cherry) is available of this form. The only change in the form is the word "tartaric" is dropped from the ingredient line on all flavors.

This form was first printed on April 24, 1947.

Form #17

The change in this form affects only the Lemon cartons. The words "vegetable color" are omitted from the ingredient line and the words "U. S. certified color" are added.

These cartons were printed from April 28, 1947 to May 19, 1947.

Form #18

This form has the word "Dextrose" and the words "Sodium citrate and/or phosphate" added to the ingredient line of all flavors.

This form was first printed on May 12, 1947 and was discontinued on November 14, 1947.

An extra flavor of Grape was made and shipped in carton #18. However, only 50,400 cartons were manufactured and all of these were shipped to the Chicago area on July 11, 1947. The carton with the Grape Jello contains the lettering "Seven delicious flavors". The other cartons all contain the lettering "Six delicious flavors".

Form #19

This form contains a change in recipe only, affecting all flavors.

This carton was originally manufactured on November 14, 1947.

BU 65-2000

Form #20

This form number has not been transmitted as it is a Jello Tapioca and not a jello.

Form #21

The only change in this form is that the ribbon is inverted and the word "Brand" is set in blue over the ribbon.

Cartons of this type were first made on December 30, 1947 and were discontinued in August, 1948.

Form #22

This form is for a carton used on "Sure-Jell" and is not being transmitted.

Form #23

The only difference in this carton is the word "Brand" is changed in lettering from blue to red. It remains in the same position on the carton.

The first carton of this type was manufactured on March 26, 1948.

Form #24

On this carton the word "Dextrose" was dropped from the ingredient line.

This carton was first made on November 26, 1948.

Forms #25 - #34

Forms #25 through #34 are cartons being used for products made by this company other than Jello.

Form #35

This form is a carton used only for Grape Jello as the company is still experimenting with the sales of this type of Jello. The carton contains the lettering "Six delicious flavors" rather than "Seven" when this flavor was previously used.

BU 65-2000

Form #36

This is the form listed for the cartons manufactured at Lincoln Long Island by the U. S. Printing and Lithograph Corp. These cartons are identified by the letter "P" on the glue flap of the carton.

Mr. BRIERLEY explained that these cartons are usually delivered to the retail stores approximately sixty days after their manufacture at this plant. However, cartons remain on the shelves of retail stores indefinitely.

BRIERLEY also stated that he furnished photostats of Forms #8 and #9 together with samples of all other subsequent cartons to Mr. E. M. SCHWITZ, General Foods Corp. Office 16-13 located at 250 Park Ave., New York, N.Y. These cartons were subsequently furnished to one of the corporation attorneys, whom he identified as ARTHUR D. WINGEBACH, Office 7-2 located in the same building.

Due to the numerous changes in the Jello boxes during the past ten years, Mr. BRIERLEY requested that if it were possible he would appreciate information regarding the type, size, flavor, and form number of the Jello box he may be called upon to identify at the trial of ROSENBERG in order that he might be better prepared to testify.

Mr. BRIERLEY requested that the boxes be returned to him when they have served their purpose as their supply of these samples has been depleted.

The above mentioned samples were furnished to the New York Office as an enclosure to Buffalo letter to New York dated January 19, 1951.

When served with a subpoena duces tecum, Miss PERRIN advised that she could produce the file copy of the above quoted memorandum or could testify from the copy which she prepared as above described, inasmuch as she had personally compared the copy prepared by her with the file copy above described.

Mrs. ELSA THOMPSON, Librarian, Albuquerque Public Library, 423 East Central, Albuquerque, New Mexico, or Mrs. CHARLOTTE LAWTON KELLEY, Assistant Librarian and cataloguer, same address, residence 902 South Girard, Albuquerque, New Mexico, when served with a subpoena duces tecum, will produce the Library's copy of "The Albuquerque Tribune", volume 23, Number 52, dated Monday, June 4, 1945. In the center of page 1 of this issue will be found an article entitled: "Catholics of City Honor Eucharist in Public Rites". Included in this article will be found what purports to be three photographs of the parade and rites. The article states the photographs were made by Doctor CHESTER BEBBER.

On page 2 at the head of column three of the same issue, June 4, 1945, will be found a second article entitled: "City Catholics Held Eucharist". The by-line is by A. C. DE COLA, in which the parade and the rites are described.

AQ# 65-45

Doctor CHESTER F. BEBBER, 204-5 Sunshine Building, Albuquerque, New Mexico, advised that he is an optometrist by profession and an amateur photographer by hobby. On a Sunday afternoon early in June, 1945, precise date not recalled, he stated that a parade was held by all Catholic groups in the Albuquerque area which began at Saint Charles Church, 1808 East Coal, then proceeded in a northerly direction to the grounds of the University of New Mexico, located between 1800 and 3000 East Central Avenue, then proceeded west on Central Avenue, passing beneath the railroad tracks at the Santa Fe overpass on Central Avenue, continuing to a point approximately 900 West Central where the final rites were held. During the course of this parade and the rites, he stated he made a number of photographs, several of which were made while standing on the railroad tracks of the Santa Fe Railroad at the point where Central Avenue passes thereunder. The camera was pointed in an easterly direction and shows portions of the parade, as well as a portion of the east approach to the Central Avenue underpass above referred to. He stated that the negatives of these photographs were delivered to Archbishop EDWIN V. BYRNE at Santa Fe, New Mexico. These prints were made and were then on display in the vestibule of Saint Charles Church, 1818 East Coal. In the vestibule of this church, Dr. BEBBER pointed out the photographs to which he referred. They were observed to consist of twenty-one photographs mounted in a frame, bearing the captioned date of June 3, 1945. Three of the photographs were observed to have been made from a position on the railroad tracks of the Santa Fe Railroad at the point where Central Avenue passes thereunder, the camera being pointed in an easterly direction.

Dr. BEBBER advised that when served with a subpoena duces tecum, he would arrange to obtain temporary possession of these prints from the officials of the Saint Charles Church or would arrange to obtain the negatives of these prints from Archbishop BYRNE of Santa Fe, New Mexico, for use in any judicial proceeding. The photographs during the interim will remain in the vestibule of Saint Charles Church.

Inclosures to New York: Copy of the memorandum dated June 1, 1945, from City Manager CHARLES E. WELLS to the Chief of Police, advising that a parade and city-wide rites would be held by Catholic groups in Albuquerque on June 3, 1945, as described above.

Re New York letter to Director with copy to Miami, dated January 17, 1951.

Mr. MAX RICH, Manager, SUTTON Jewelry Company, Miami, Florida, advised that he had secured the records of Mr. DERBY SUTTON and had checked for the watches received from the PERRAUX Watch Company of New York City.

Mr. RICH advised that two watches were received from the PERRAUX Watch Company and that both of these watches were natural gold, had no diamonds in the case, and had black-cord bands, rather than the gold, snake-type band.

In connection with the forthcoming prosecution of Julius Rosenberg, et al in the Southern District of New York on an espionage conspiracy indictment, it is respectfully requested that the Department of State secure and make available to this Department an exemplified copy of the British court records which establish the indictment, plea of guilty, sentence and final judgment of Dr. Klaus Emil Julius Fuchs.

You will recall that Dr. Fuchs pleaded guilty on March 1, 1950, before Lord Chief Justice Goddard in Old Bailey, London, England, to a four-count indictment charging violations of the Official Secrets Act of 1911, and was sentenced on that date to a term of fourteen years imprisonment.

Inasmuch as the trial of Rosenberg and his co-defendants is scheduled to begin on February 13, 1951, it will be greatly appreciated if the above-described documents can be made available for use at that time.

Mr. WILLIAM KOPPMAN, Manager, Koppman Jewelry Company, 6519 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California, made his records available to SA JOE B. ABERNATHY, and an invoice dated June 6, 1944, was located in the stock records reflecting the delivery of one Model 352 yellow gold ladies wrist watch from the Perreux Watch Company, New York City. Mr. KOPPMAN advised that this watch had been sold; however, he had no records concerning the sale, and does not know the identity of the purchaser. No other invoice from the Perreux Watch Company during the pertinent period could be located, nor were the individual sales slips for the years 1944 - 1946 available for review. It is noted that the watch which was in possession of subject's wife is pink gold, whereas the above invoice indicated the Perreux watch received by the Koppman Company was yellow gold. No mention was made on this invoice as to whether the watch contained a Driva movement.

Mr. DAVID PEARL, Owner, Hart's Jewelry Company, 6362 Van Nuys Boulevard, Van Nuys, California, checked his records, and with the assistance of SA JOE B. ABERNATHY located an invoice from the Perreux Watch Company dated June 7, 1944, reflecting the receipt of one Model No. 352 pink gold ladies wrist watch. This watch was described as a "Perreux" rather than a "Driva." The records further reflected that on June 10, 1944,

this watch was transferred to his Alhambra store at 40 East Main Street, Alhambra, California.

Mr. J. HOWLAND, Credit and Office Manager, Harts Jewelry Company, 40 East Main Street, Alhambra, after checking his records advised SA JOE B. ABERNATHY that his stock records prior to 1945 were burned about six months ago. A search of the sales slips from June, 1944, through 1945 was made with negative results. Records of watches sold on credit during this period were examined with negative results. Mr. HOWLAND stated he knew of no way to determine the purchaser of this watch.

Mr. SAM COHEN, Owner, Birks Diamond Company, 4723 Whittier Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, advised SA JOE B. ABERNATHY that he has no records dating back as far as 1944, and was unable to furnish any information concerning the Model No. 352 watches his company purchased from Perreux Watch Company by invoice dated June 7, 1944.

Mr. HARRY HARTMAN, SR., Owner, Hartman Jewelry Company, 315 West Fifth Street, located the original invoice No. P2474, which reflected one Model No. 352 Perreux wrist watch made of pink gold, cost \$52.00, was received from Perreux Company. The date of this invoice was June 22, 1944.

The sales tickets for the months of June through December, 1944, were checked at the Hartman Jewelry Company, by SA JOE B. ABERNATHY and the writer, and the only watch sale possibly identical with instant watch was one sold to L. E. ROBERTSON, 6000 North Figueroa, Los Angeles, on July 15, 1944. This watch was listed as a ladies watch, price \$99.00, plus \$19.80 Federal tax and \$2.48 sales tax.

L. E. ROBERTSON advised SA JOE B. ABERNATHY on January 16, 1951, that he had purchased this watch for BEULAH E. MIDDLEWORTH, who was his girl friend at the time. However, he did not remember the make or description of this watch.

It was subsequently determined that BEULAH E. MIDDLEWORTH had been deceased for one month. However, she left the watch to her sister, Mrs. VERA HENDERSON, 1117 1/2 North Alexandria, Hollywood, California.

Mrs. HENDERSON was interviewed by SA JOE B. ABERNATHY on January 17, 1951, and she exhibited instant watch which was found to be a yellow gold watch containing a Perreux movement, and not a Driva movement.

Mr. IRVING ROSS, Manager, Macy Jewelry Company, 6384 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California, produced his invoice records, and same were checked by Mr. ROSS and the writer. An invoice dated June 6, 1944,

from the Perreux Watch Company, New York City, was located indicating receipt of one Model No. 352 ladies watch, price \$52.00. Individual sales slips for the Macy Jewelry Company for the months June through December, 1944, were checked by Special Agents THOMAS J. COONEY, PAUL T. GARRITY, MELVIN JOHNSON, and the writer. The only possible sale of interest located was the sale of a ladies watch on September 15, 1944, to HELEN FEINBERG, 829 Croft, Los Angeles. Inquiry at this address by the writer resulted in information that FEINBERG now resides at 456 1/2 Curson Avenue, Los Angeles, California.

Mrs. HELEN FEINBERG stated instant watch was purchased as a gift for her sister, Mrs. MARTIN CRAMER, 414 Spaulding Avenue, Los Angeles. Mrs. CRAMER exhibited this watch, which was found to contain a Perreux movement.

The following information was obtained from MYLES J. LANE, Chief Assistant United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, and is being furnished to the Bureau for its information.

On January 29, 1951, Mr. LANE conferred with the officials of the Atomic Energy Commission at Washington, D. C., at which time he discussed with them the introduction into evidence at the trial of ROSENBERG of the material which DAVID GREENGLASS had given to both HARRY GOLD and JULIUS ROSENBERG.

As a result of this conference, the Atomic Energy Commission, February 3, 1951, sent five of its representatives to New York City to interrogate DAVID GREENGLASS in order to extract from him all of his knowledge concerning the atom bomb. At the termination of this conference which was held in Mr. LANE'S office, the representatives of the Atomic Energy Commission advised that they would make known to the Atomic Energy Commission the result of their interview of DAVID GREENGLASS.

They stated that the information supplied by DAVID GREENGLASS was 80% to 90% accurate. They also stated that the Secretary of Defense, GEORGE C. MARSHALL, had been made aware of the instant problem pertaining to the introduction of this evidence and he was reported to have said that the information should be declassified for the purposes of the trial because to do otherwise would lead the people of the United States to have a false sense of security.

Secretary MARSHALL also indicated that he favored the death penalty for the defendants in this case.

At the direction of the Department of Justice, Mr. LANE appeared in Washington, D. C., before Commissioners MURRAY, DEAN, and PIKE, of the Atomic Energy Commission, on the morning of February 8, 1951.

At this conference, Mr. LANE discussed the information which GREENGLASS had given to HARRY GOLD and JULIUS ROSENBERG. The commissioners were concerned about the possibility of individuals presently working on the H-bomb project being engaged in similar Soviet espionage activities.

Mr. LANE informed the commissioners that ROSENBERG had not divulged any information concerning his Soviet espionage activities and that he believed ROSENBERG would not divulge any information unless he received the death penalty and his wife, ETHEL ROSENBERG, received a substantial sentence.

Mr. LANE explained to the commissioners that in order to secure a severe sentence, it would be necessary to introduce into evidence the fact that DAVID GREENGLASS had turned over information concerning the atom bomb.

The commissioners asked Mr. LANE if the death sentence would be requested by the government at the trial. Mr. LANE stated that he did not know since he was only an Assistant United States Attorney from the Southern District of New York, and that he would have to obtain the answer from the Department of Justice.

Mr. LANE advised that he then called Mr. PEYTON FORD at the Department. Mr. FORD told him that he should tell the commissioners that the Department of Justice would recommend the death sentence in this case.

Mr. LANE said that at the termination of this conference, he and the commissioners proceeded to a closed meeting of the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy which was also attended by representatives of the Army and Navy. Mr. LANE addressed this meeting and explained the problem. He stated he was questioned by various Senators and Congressmen, including Senators HICKENLOOPER and BRICKER. Among the questions asked Mr. LANE, by the Senators and Congressmen, were:

- (1). Was the death penalty going to be recommended by the government?
- (2). Who was going to try the case and when?
- (3). What judge would preside at the trial?

Mr. LANE advised that Senator BRICKER recommended that the Joint Committee should go on record of absolving the Department of any criticism for introducing into the trial classified material concerning the atom bomb.

Mr. LANE stated that if the Atomic Energy Commission declassifies the information required for the trial, it will be solely for the introduction into evidence at the trial and the information will again be classified at the termination of the case.

Mr. LANE is now awaiting the final decision of the Atomic Energy Commission which he expects to receive during the week of February 12th next.

The Bureau will be advised of the decision of the Atomic Energy Commission.

Mr. LANE advised that the transcription of the discussions had before the Atomic Energy Commission and the Joint Congressional Committee will probably be furnished to the Department. It is suggested that the Bureau obtain a copy of these transcriptions for its further information.

JOHN PATRICK FITZPATRICK, presently employed by the Atomic Energy Commission at the Argonne National Laboratory, was interviewed by Special Agents ANDREW A. ARMSTRONG and ROBERT K. MC QUEEN on January 26, 1951. FITZPATRICK advised that DAVID GREENGLASS was assigned to his group from approximately May, 1944 to May, 1945. This section was formerly called the X Service Group, the E5 Division, and finally the X Division, Experimental Section. The group was responsible for purchasing equipment needed in experimental programs, designing and developing special equipment and maintaining records on the explosives. About twenty men were in the group, of which about five were assigned to the machine shop, where GREENGLASS was employed.

FITZPATRICK advised that he had no recollection of GREENGLASS being selected to go to the Pacific to aid in the assembly of the Atomic Bomb. He said that no one from his group was selected and, as a matter of fact, he was not aware who made the selections or upon what they were based. He said that GREENGLASS had no special ability which would have caused him to be selected.

MR S DAVID

FITZPATRICK stated that he never met Mrs. GREENGLASS and knew nothing about her, but was aware that GREENGLASS was married. He was positive that he never knew that Mrs. GREENGLASS had suffered a miscarriage.

FITZPATRICK could not suggest the names of persons who might have been aware of selections for the Pacific Group, but stated that WENDELL MARSHMAN, Expediter in the machine shop, and ROBERT HOLLAND (FITZPATRICK believes that ROBERT was HOLLAND's middle name and could not recall his given name), who was in charge of the machine shop, would have had closer contact with GREENGLASS. He advised that he believes that MARSHMAN is now employed in New York City and living in Pompton Plains, New Jersey and that HOLLAND is working and resides in or around New York City.

The Atomic Energy Commission has furnished to the Bureau a 4 page booklet on security regulations which the Commission believes, on the basis of an interview of David Greenglass on 2-2-51 by its representatives, is similar to the "book on security regulations" which Greenglass told your division he received on or about 8-5-44 at Los Alamos. The Commission has advised that it has been informed by its Santa Fe Operations Office that the booklet was probably prepared in August, 1943, and noted that enclosed with the booklet furnished to the Bureau was an insert dated 8-9-43 captioned, "To Former Residents of Nearty Communities," signed by D. Hawkins.

The Commission has advised that it has no objection to the utilization of the booklet as evidence by the U. S. Attorney, but has requested that an effort be made to return the booklet to the AEC after it has served its purpose, inasmuch as it is a record copy.

The above-described booklet is being transmitted herewith so that your office may exhibit it to David Greenglass at the earliest opportunity to determine if it is of the type he recalls having received at Los Alamos. You should advise the Bureau promptly of the results of your interview of Greenglass on this matter.

In the event the USA, SDNY, desires to subpoena the Selective Service file it is requested that the subpoena be issued in conformity with instructions contained in WFO teletype to New York dated February 17, 1951, in matter captioned MAX ELITCHER, et al. ESPIONAGE - R.

To secure DANZIGER's Navy "Loyalty File", a subpoena should be directed to the Honorable FRANCIS MATTHEWS, Secretary of Navy and CHARLES PIOZET, Special Assistant, Office Industrial Relations, USN, Pentagon.

New York will note that DANZIGER was not removed from position at Naval Ordnance Laboratory by NOL Loyalty Board, but was dismissed under provisions Public Law 808, 77th Congress which authorizes heads of Government departments to dismiss employees believed to be security risks.

New York will also note that this file may not be complete as portions of it have been forwarded to NSD, Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania. Navy file here contains Bureau reports reflecting results of loyalty investigation. These reports have not been photostated. However, Navy will have to produce Bureau reports to honor subpoena and consequently USA and Bureau should be advised before subpoena is issued for DANZIGER's Navy security file.

PURPOSE

The New York Office has requested authority to interview one Ryman Adler. David Greenglass advised he believes he gave the name of Adler, who was stationed at Los Alamos at the same time as Greenglass, to Harry Gold as a possible recruit for Soviet espionage. Greenglass stated he was friendly with Adler at Los Alamos and that Adler was not a Communist Party sympathizer. Bufiles reflect NYC PD records reflect Ryman Adler, 134 Elliot Place, Bronx, New York, signed CP petition on 10/1/40. Notwithstanding this fact, it is believed advisable to interview Adler in view of the pending Rosenberg trial to determine if he were ever approached to engage in Soviet espionage.

DETAILS

David Greenglass advised that while stationed at the atomic bomb project in Los Alamos in 1945 he believes he gave the name of Ryman Adler, who was also stationed at Los Alamos, to Harry Gold as a possible recruit for Soviet espionage. Greenglass stated that he was very friendly with Adler at Los Alamos and that Adler was not a CP sympathizer. However, Greenglass has advised that he believed Adler was a Communist in thought.

Adler is presently residing at 647 Faile Street, Bronx, New York, and is reportedly attending the City College of New York Night School of Engineering. He was born August 16, 1915, at New York City and he was in the United States Army from September 2, 1941, until March 9, 1946. He was employed by the Electronics Corporation of America from 1936 to 1943. It is to be noted that the Electronics Corporation of America was headed by Samuel Novack who was implicated in the espionage activities of Arthur A. Adams. There is, however, no known connection between Adler's employment and the espionage activities of Novack. The files of the New York Office reflect that one Ryman Adler, born in 1915, was a member of LNU Lodge 52 in 1949. The records of the NYC PD reflect that Ryman Adler, 134 Elliot Place, New York, signed a CP petition on 10/1/40. It is known that Adler has listed an address of 134 Elliot Place, Bronx, New York.

Harry Gold has stated that, when he contacted Greenglass in Albuquerque, he gained the impression that Greenglass was somewhat naive because he suggested to Gold that the latter recruit another individual who was assigned to the same section at Los Alamos. Gold has further stated that he took the information which was furnished by Greenglass and turned it over to Yakovlev.

The New York Office, in a teletype dated 2/15/51, requested authority to interview Adler. (65-59028-193, 294, 307, 332)

RECOMMENDATION

Notwithstanding the fact that Adler has signed a CP petition, and is described by Greenglass as a Communist in thought, it would appear advisable to interview Adler to determine if he has ever been approached by anyone to act as an espionage agent, and particularly whether he knows anything concerning Greenglass' espionage activities or the espionage activities of Julius Rosenberg.

There is attached hereto a teletype to the New York Office authorizing this interview.

In connection with this matter, it has been learned that by letter dated September 28, 1950, to Mrs. Ruth B. Shipley, Chief, Passport Division, Department of State, the Criminal Division requested notification in the event of a passport application by any of 33 persons whose names came up in this and related cases.

It has also come to our attention that the Criminal Division has supplied the names of these same individuals to the Immigration and Naturalization Service with the following request: "If any of these persons should attempt to leave the United States, their departure should be prevented and the nearest office of the FBI and the Central office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service notified. (This applies to those still in the United States.)"

As there is no outstanding process for any of the individuals mentioned, you are requested to advise immediately, for the guidance of the Bureau, the specific action you desire taken in the event that the Bureau receives notification that any of those persons is attempting to leave the United States.
