Department of Justice, St. Albans, Vermont, dated October, 1950, and addressed to all Officers in Charge, District Number 1, placing lookout notices against thirty-three individuals who allegedly were connected with the above Soviet espionage group. This letter instructs that Canadian officials should be notified to be on the alert to prevent the departure of any of these thirty-three persons from the United States.

These lookout notices were originally placed by the Criminal Division by letter of September 28, 1950, with the Department of State and the Immigration and Naturalization Service, with a request that if any of these persons attempt to leave the United States the Department of Justice should be notified. The Central Office of Immigration and Naturalization Service instructed its regional offices by letter dated October 4, 1950, to prevent these persons from leaving the United States. This list was reduced from thirty-three to twelve by letter from the Criminal Division to Commissioner R. M. Mackay, Immigration and Naturalization Service, dated October 9, 1951 (JUNICEVib-146-41-16-114).

On the program will be speeches by HIROTSU Kazuro and SAWA Keitaro, President of the Shinso Sha, Soviet music, and the Japanese film, "MUGEN NO HITOMI" (Eyes Looking Into Eternity). Admission fee will be 30 yen."

Investigation has previously been conducted by this Bureau concerning the persons named in this list, and the name of Kistiakowsky was not included. Greenglass furnished the name of Kistiakowsky only as the name of one of the scientists employed at Los Alamos and not as a possible recruit for espionage work.

Tells of Ministers Aiding Rosenbergs

Washington, Aug. 3 (U)—A former FBI informant said today a fellow Communist once told him he talked two Allentown, Pa., ministers into taking up church collections for the defense of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

Herman E. Thomas of Allentown told the House Un-American Activities Subcommittee that Irving Riskin, whom he identified as a Red, also advised him that the ministers "conducted sermons on behalf of the Rosenbergs." The clergymen were not identified.

Thomas, who said he spent 12 years in the Communist Party and informed for the FBI 10 of them, testified on the second day of public hearings into alleged Communist control of groups that fought the execution of the Rosenbergs, who were convicted of transmitting atomic secrets to Russia.

JERUSALEM, Nov. 12.—Twenty prominent rabbis and religious leaders in Jerusalem appealed to President Truman today to commute clemency on behalf of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. The New York couple is under sentence to die in Sing Sing Prison for passing atomic secrets to the Soviet Union. The petition, sponsored by Jerusalem rabbis of the orthodox and liberal faiths.

"We can hardly imagine that Jews anywhere in the world and especially in a glorious country like the United States should act against the interests of the state. At least we are not aware of such an instance in the long history of the Jewish people."

"Similarly, we are not aware of any precedent where a person has been condemned to death in a democratic country for offense alleged in this case to be of peace."

The rabbis appealed to the President's sense of humanity and noted that the prisoners could do no further harm if they remained in custody.

A FACT SHEET ON ANTI-SEMITISM IN THE CASE: NEWSPAPER COMMENT

Did anti-Semitism play a part in the case of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg and Morton Sobell (the Rosenbergs were sentenced to death, Sobell to 30 years for alleged atomic espionage)? The following newspaper comment, mainly from the Yiddish and the English-Jewish press, helps answer this question.

Although the following extract from the NEW YORK TIMES (December 25, 1951) does not refer directly to the case, it is relevant: "Oak Ridge, Tenn., Dec. 25 (UP) - The Government said today it was less concerned about Communists and saboteurs than about hoodlums. ... United States law enforcement officials gave two reasons for the apparent absence of Communists here: 1) a predominance of pure Anglo-Saxon stock. ..."

RABBI G. GEORGE FOX in the SENTINEL, Chicago English Jewish weekly, (Feb. 7, 1952): "...When Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were condemned to death for allegedly giving secret information to enemy spies, I condemned the verdict and accused the presiding judge, who happened to be a Jew, of leaning over backward in his desire to show that Jews condemn treason ... (His decision) will be found unjust, if not illegal ... I believe strongly that a grass roots letter and telegram protest to President Truman will get those who are moved by the injustice of the decision, to some action." (Feb. 14, 1952): "The Jewish angle is important as a matter of our public relations. The death of the Rosenbergs for treason, even though undeserved, will give our enemies a handle to a paddle which will never be out of use. Let us avoid such a possibility."

RABBI LOUIS D. GROSS, publisher of the JEWISH EXAMINER, (March 14, 1952): "After plowing through volumes of the evidence presented in this tragic case, I am not convinced, beyond a shadow of a doubt, that the Rosenbergs are guilty ... It is quite possible, and very disturbing, to feel that the hapless Rosenberg couple may have been victimized by the anti-Communist hysteria which has been sweeping this country with deadly effect ... Why did Judge Kaufman in this case impose the extreme penalty? ... Did he think the death sentence against the Rosenbergs was necessary to counteract the anti-Semitic charge of Communism against Jews in general? Apparently this jurist has not learned that anti-Semitism has nothing to do with the truth."

JEWISH DAILY FORWARD (April 6, 1951): "When we editors got the news that Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were sentenced to death, a shudder passed through all of us ... We are certain that every Jew who read this sad news felt this way. From our hearts came the words, 'Death sentence, too horrible' ... Every Jewish home will be shattered by this tragedy."

THE JEWISH DAY, editorial (April 8, 1951): "Judge Kaufman's verdict is more in harmony with the time in which we live at present than with the time during which the crime was committed. We hope that a way will be found to set aside the death sentence."

PHINEAS J. BIRON, Syndicated English-Jewish columnist, in the INDIANAPOLIS JEWISH CHRONICLE (March 7, 1952): "... Not a single jury member was Jewish and this in the city of New York, which has a Jewish population amounting to one third of the total population ... Strange, or rather sinister, if you ask us." (November 9, 1951): "It is not for us to decide whether the Rosenbergs are guilty, but from what we have read of the legal proceedings we have come to the conclusion that more than reasonable doubt exists as to their guilt."

SAMUEL B. GACH, publisher of the CALIFORNIA JEWISH VOICE, (February 29, 1952): "My only concern was why a Jewish judge had to ... decide a death penalty for peacetime espionage and so scribe a shameful precedent on the pages of American jurisprudence. It could only have been because the legal killer, Judge Irving Kaufman, is a Jew, and the defendants were Jews; and to prove that he was unbiased, he acquiesced to legal murder in time of national hysteria and only because the bearded and politically appointed punk was a scared and synthetic American

and a weaker than no-good Jew ... I abhor the death sentence and despise the judge who proclaimed it." (March 7, 1952) (In reply to criticism for his position on the case): "Was Judge Kaufman in full command of his emotional balance when he passed sentence? Are any of us vacuumed against the witch-hunting hysteria? ... " (March 14, 1952): "The domestic Hitlers and anti-Semites will wield the degradation of the Rosenbergs as a cudgel with which to bludgeon ALL Jews ... We shall continue NOT to be silent."

M. DANZIS, then Editor, in the JEWISH DAY (April 12, 1951): "The death sentence which Judge Kaufman passed on the Rosenbergs left bitter doubts as to the justice of the verdict and above all, about the note which the judge sounded in his summary before the jury. ... The fact is, that the Rosenberg trial was Jewish throughout because of the fact that the accused, the judge, the prosecutor and the lawyer were all Jewish. The press made a point of it. In Hearst's Daily Mirror there was an editorial saying that those who do not wish to accuse all Jews of Communism because of the Rosenbergs, should not forget that the prosecutor who conducted the trial against the Rosenbergs, and the judge who condemned them to death, are themselves Jewish. In other words, that Judge Kaufman and prosecutor Saypol are atoning not only for the sins of the Rosenbergs, but of all other Jews."

"The death sentence which Judge Kaufman issued left the feeling that precisely because he is a Jew, he went to an extreme and applied the heavy hand of judgment, ... There is a suspicion that the fact that Judge Kaufman is a Jew perhaps unconsciously motivated him to issue a verdict which, in the opinion of many, is considered to be unjust and brutal. ... One cannot overlook the Jewish element in this unfortunate, tragic Rosenberg trial. ... if the Rosenbergs are, as Judge Kaufman has said, guilty of the death of 50,000 American soldiers in Korea, one can easily hold the Rosenbergs and their like responsible for the atom war against America."

"Has Judge Kaufman considered to what his speech can lead?"

H. LEIVIK, well-known Yiddish poet, in the JEWISH DAY, (April 16, 1951): "What led the judge to give the extreme penalty (to Ethel Rosenberg)? Is it not perhaps the fact that the judge is a Jew and the defendants are Jews? The judge was confronted with the bitter fact that those tried for treason were Jews. He himself, a Jew struggling with his duty to be objective and did not have the strength to rise above himself, did not have the power to free himself from today's heated tensions in the land, and was also afraid that perhaps, if he were not to give them the death penalty, he would be suspected of not having done so because he is a Jew ... Precisely because against the accused Jews stood Jewish accusers and a Jewish judge, whose loyalty to America is beyond a shadow of a doubt -- precisely because the judge should have been free from every Jewish complex, - he should under no circumstances have issued the death sentence in this trial against the mother of two children... It is hard to accept the severity of the verdict ... The death penalty should be changed."

LOUIS HARAP, Managing Editor of JEWISH LIFE, (January 1952): "It has been said that no anti-Semitism intruded into the trial itself. But this is to overlook the fact that Irving Saypol, the Jewish prosecutor, did not permit a single Jew, of the three hundred jurors in the panel, to sit on the jury ... Irving Saypol, as is now widely known, was admonished by the Court of Appeals in August 1951, for his appeals, to 'racial prejudice' against a Jewish witness in the Remington case."

"In an article in the CANADIAN JEWISH WEEKLY (February 22, 1952): "A study of the details of the case shows that it will go down in history as a parallel to the Dreyfus case -- and the Sacco-Vanzetti case."

driver also pockets his judgment.
He is, mistakenly, that the road
engineer has solved his driving
problems for him.

I am not recommending that we
all go back to forty miles an hour
on straightaways or that Sunday
drivers and antiquated cars be al-
lowed to demoralize traffic on busy
highways. I am arguing for recog-
nition by the authorities of, and
education of drivers in, the above
unalterable facts of driving. If we
could count on all drivers being
mature and seasoned drivers,
blessed with good eyesight, re-
flexes and judgment, no speed
limits need ever be posted, as each
driver would adjust his speed ac-
cording to the circumstances.
Speed limits are always for those
who want to go faster no matter
what speed is indicated under the
circumstances. Fifty miles an hour
is possibly rather slow for a well
engineered road of today, but, hu-
man nature being what it is, the
fifty-mile-an-hour limit may keep
the speedsters down to sixty, which
is, anywhere, where other cars
share the road, plenty fast enough.

AMICUS BRIEF* in the ROSENBERG CASE

WE BELIEVE that the trial of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and Morton Sobell on a charge of conspiring to commit espionage, which resulted in death sentences for the Rosenbergs and a 30 year sentence for their co-defendant, lacked guarantees of fairness which all Americans have a right to expect under the Constitution.

WE BELIEVE that the Prosecutor and Trial Judge permitted fear and prejudice to dominate the trial by 1) attributing to the defendants social beliefs which are today the target of virtually every public tribunal, and 2) attributing to them reversals and casualties suffered in Korea.

WE BELIEVE that transient political and social passions have no place in our courts, that to deprive even one American of the right to a fair trial is to injure the rights of all Americans.

Dear Friends:

We, the Washington Heights and Inwood representa-
tives of the National Committee to Secure Justice
in the Rosenberg Case wish to call to your atten-
tion the fact that Julius and Ethel Rosenberg
will be executed in less than three weeks unless
we in this community rally with all justice-
seeking people in the country to prevent it.

Our desire to prevent this execution is motivated
by our intense devotion to our great American
traditions and by an exhaustive and objective
study of this case. We believe that:

- 1) The verdict of guilty was based on incomplete
and unfair evidence. This obviously negates
the American juridical tradition that an in-
dividual is innocent unless proven guilty
beyond a reasonable doubt.
- 2) Even if a fair and impartial trial would
subsequently prove the Rosenbergs guilty
beyond a reasonable doubt, the death sentence
is cruel and unusual punishment. No one has
ever been executed for espionage. And even for
the grave crime of treason, no one has ever
been executed during peacetime. (We should
also recall the short sentences given "Axis
Sally", "Tokyo Rose" and others who were con-
victed of treason and espionage during World
War II.)

Our contentions are well-founded and are proved in
the enclosed fact sheets, which we urge you to read.

It is our duty as loyal Americans to help save the
lives of these parents of two young sons, and to
guarantee them a fair day in court.

This can be done by:

- Wiring the Justice Department urging a retrial.
- Speaking to the members of your Congregation or
organization about this case, and urging them to
wire the Justice Department.
- Cooperating with our Committee when we call upon you.

All informants utilized in this report have furnished reliable information in the past unless otherwise indicated.

ORIGIN AND DEVELOPMENT

It is to be noted that T-1 reported on October 10, 1953, that the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was formed in January, 1952, to raise funds for the defense of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, who were convicted, together with MORTON SOBELL, on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and executed on June 19, 1953. MORTON SOBELL was sentenced to serve thirty years in the custody of the Attorney General of the United States.

T-1 also advised on October 10, 1953, that the Chicago Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was the Chicago affiliate of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

T-2 advised on October 11, 1953, that the National Conference on the Rosenberg-Sobell Case, which was called by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, was held at the Fine Arts Building, 410 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, on October 10-11, 1953.

T-1 advised on October 11, 1953, that the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee was formed at the above conference on October 11, 1953, and the Chicago Rosenberg-Sobell Committee is the local affiliate of the organization.

T-3 advised on February 3, 1955, that the Chicago Rosenberg-Sobell Committee, formerly located at 410 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, until August, 1954, was the forerunner of the Chicago Sobell Committee, now located in Room 1301 at 20 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois.

LOCATION OF CHICAGO SOBELL COMMITTEE

On September 10, 1955, Mrs. LILLIAN PEARSON, Secretary to HENRY MANN, Manager, Great Northern Property Building, 20 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois, advised that the lease executed by the Chicago Sobell Committee on August 31, 1954, expired on September 1, 1955. Mrs. PEARSON further advised that the CSC has instructed the Great Northern Building management to renew its lease in the Great Northern Building for another year. Mrs. PEARSON stated that to her knowledge SYLVIA LEVINSON and DAVID C. SOLTNER, acting for the CSC and who signed last year's lease, would be the co-signers to the aforementioned renewed lease. Mrs. PEARSON advised that the CSC was still located in Room 1301 of the Great Northern Office Building, 20 West Jackson Boulevard.

Support of Chicago Sobell
Committee by Individuals
and/or Organizations

On May 3, 1955, T-5 advised that he had learned that WILLIAM REUBEN, author of the recently published book, "The Atom Spy Hoax," was the [redacted] and [redacted] on April [redacted] 1955, at the home of [redacted] Chicago. According to the informant, the purpose of this meeting was to promote the sale of the aforementioned book to raise funds for the CSC. The informant reported that various individuals purchased up to twenty copies of this book for distributional purposes.

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T-5 also advised that he knew MANDEL TERMAN to be chairman of the Board of Directors of the Chicago Council of American-Soviet Friendship.

On April 28, 1955, T-6 furnished substantially the same information as above.

On May 12, 1955, T-7 advised that the Chicago Council of American-Soviet Friendship, since its inception in Chicago in the 1940's has never failed to propagandize for Russia and the Russian way of life. This informant further advised that the CCASF has been using speakers who were known to the informant as members of the Communist Party since the first meeting in the 1940's. This informant advised that the program of the CCASF has always included speakers, movies, and pamphlets praising every aspect of Russia, including its foreign policy, and has been extremely critical of the United States domestic and foreign policy.

Testimonial Dinner Honoring
Dr. HAROLD C. UREY

On March 2, 1955, T-8 advised that he had learned that the testimonial dinner in honor of Dr. HAROLD C. UREY, held under the auspices of the CSC on February 12, 1955, at the Hotel Hamilton in Chicago, had successfully raised \$11,000.00, which was to be utilized by the CSC for MORTON SOBELL. The informant stated that most of this money was obtained through ticket sales and donations.

AFFILIATION OF OFFICERS OF
THE CHICAGO SOBELL COMMITTEE

It should be noted that the Communist Party and the Communist Political Association have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

RUTH ROTHSTEIN, nee RUTH MERSON.

On August 7, 1951, [REDACTED],
Cleveland, Ohio, who is a self-admitted former CP member, advised that he was a CP member in Ohio

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from 1944 until 1950. The informant stated that he knew RUTH MERSON (RUTH ROTHSTEIN) to have been a CP member and active in the affairs of the SP, but that he, the informant, was unable to supply specific dates relating to her membership in the CP.

T-10, who is a self-admitted former CP member, advised on July 14, 1950, that he knew RUTH MERSON, CP staff member, as a CP member in UERMWA in the Ohio area.

It should be noted that at the recent HCUA hearings held on August 2, 3, and 4, 1955, regarding the National Committee in Washington, D.C., RUTH ROTHSTEIN was subpoenaed to testify and invoked the Fifth Amendment.

DAVID LEE SOLTNER

In 1942 information was received from the Office of Naval Intelligence, Chicago, Illinois, reflecting that DAVID LEE SOLTNER was at that time a Communist.

RUTH BELLMAN, with alias
RUTH BELMONT

T-12 advised in December, 1946, that RUTH BELMONT was a registered member of the Dave White Club, CP, at Detroit, Michigan, with 1946 Registration #54834. This informant related that BELMONT had recently been issued a new registration card for 1947 with Registration #68709 in the Dave White Club, CP. According to this informant, RUTH BELMONT had been a member of the CP for five years prior to 1946.

PHYLLIS PILDES
(Mrs. SIDNEY SOLOMON)

T-13 reported in March, 1946, that PHYLLIS PILDES, 850 East 40th Street, Chicago, was a registered member of the Oak Lawn-Kenwood Club, Communist Political Association, South Side Section, Chicago, Illinois, with Card #51735, dated November 25, 1944. This informant also stated that

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PHYLLIS PILDES had CP Card #59412 dated October 4, 1945.

GERTRUDE GUNTER, also
known as GERTRUDE
GUNTER SOLTKE

T-14 advised on February 6, 1946, that GERTRUDE GUNTER SOLTKE, wife of DAVID LEE SOLTKE, first joined the CP in 1934 in Chicago, Illinois. As of November, 1937, her membership in the CP had been uninterrupted as she held the position of Unit Organizer of Unit 129, Section 1, District #8, CP, Chicago. She was then an actress with the Chicago Repertory Group, Inc. On March 15, 1938, she was expelled from the CP for having disregarded Party discipline, being in disagreement with unit decisions, having sent in a letter of resignation from the CP and having an individualist attitude. The Party's decision on her expulsion carried provisions for her reapplication for membership after three months.

T-14 continued that GERTRUDE GUNTER, upon re-applying for Party membership, had claimed that she always had a deep respect for the CP. GERTRUDE GUNTER further claimed that she had done much work on Party campaigns and programs for Spain, May Day and Memorial Day events. The informant related that GERTRUDE GUNTER further claimed that after having been dropped from the Party, she attempted to continue her political development by reading such publications as "New Masses," "The Record," BROWDER's "Peoples' Front" and the "Communist." The informant stated that Miss GUNTER felt that the only place for her was in the CP and she was readmitted to CP membership in August, 1938.

It may be noted that the Congressional Record of September 24, 1942, on page 7688, quotes the Attorney General as stating that "New Masses" is a Communist periodical.

It may be further noted that LOUIS F. BUDENZ, Assistant Professor, Fordham University, New York, New York, a former Party functionary, during his ten years as a CP member from 1935 to 1945, testified during the trial of the eleven Communist leaders in New York that the "Midwest Daily Record" was published from February,

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1938, through September, 1939, as a daily, and from September, 1939, through January, 1940, as a weekly. It was set up and completely financed by the CP. All staff members were CP members, and Mr. BUDENZ was editor of the paper during its entire life.

ANN MARKIN, nee ANN HALL

T-15 stated on January 12, 1945, that ANN MARKIN, nee ANN HALL, 2012 South Peoria Street, Chicago, Illinois, was a registered member of the CPA in 1944.

ACTIVITY

Second Memorial to the
Deaths of the ROSENBERGs
held June 19, 1955,
Curtiss Hall, 410 South
Michigan Avenue, Chicago,
Illinois

On June 22, 1955, T-16, another agency which collects security information in the Chicago area, reported that a meeting of the Second Memorial to the Deaths of the ROSENBERGs was held on June 19, 1955, at the Fine Arts Building, 410 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, under the auspices of the Chicago Sobell Committee.

According to the informant, it was reported that approximately 265 persons were in attendance at this affair. It was reported that an American flag adorned the left-hand side of the stage with a picture of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG with the caption below the picture, "Never let them change the truth of our innocence."

The informant reported that the meeting was held for the purpose of collecting funds to vindicate the name of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and to finance a new trial for MORTON SOBELL, who is now serving a 30 year prison term in Alcatraz for his participation in the conspiracy to commit espionage. The informant also reported that this meeting was to commemorate the second memorial to the death of the ROSENBERGs.

This informant reported that there was considerable literature set up at a table at the entrance at the hall along with two books that were on display. The names of the books were "False Witness," published by ANGUS CAMERON. The author of the other book was JOHN WEXLEY. The informant reported that WEXLEY was writing on the results of 3 years of investigation into the ROSENBERG-SOBELL Case in a book entitled "The Judgement of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG."

According to the informant, the above meeting commenced at 8:45 p.m. and the invocation was read by Rabbi BURR S. YAMPOL. The informant reported that seated beside the speaker's platform were GALE SONDERGAARD, who is the wife of HERBERT BIEBERMAN, who recently produced the Communist Party propaganda film, "Salt of the Earth," ANGUS CAMERON and SYLVIA FISHER, who according to the informant, appears to have taken over as head of the Chicago Sobell Committee.

The informant reported that Rabbi YAMPOL chaired the meeting and introduced GALE SONDERGAARD, whom he stated had just arrived from Los Angeles where she spoke at a meeting similar to this one which was sponsored by the Los Angeles Sobell Committee. It was reported that the title of SONDERGAARD's speech was "Fraternity and Brotherhood of the World."

SONDERGAARD, in her speech, stated that she was convinced that Fraternity and Brotherhood certainly existed in the United States and went on to say that the picture in which she was so proud to have taken part in was the "Life of EMIL ZOLA," in which she appeared as the wife of ALFRED DREYFUSS, who languished in prison for 12 years before the French people finally decided to do something about it. According to SONDERGAARD, the DREYFUSS Case paralleled that of the present MORTON SOBELL Case, who is now spending his life on Alcatraz Island. She further stated in her speech that it will be the American people who will finally free MORTON SOBELL, the same as the French people secured the release of ALFRED DREYFUSS.

SONDERGAARD continued on with a dramatic speech concerning JOHN BROWN, who was executed in the year of

1859 for attempting to seize an arsenal at Harpers Ferry. According to SONDERGAARD, JOHN BROWN's one ambition in life was to fight for the freedom of the Negro people. She also plugged the movie, "Salt of the Earth," produced by her husband, and stated that millions of people have seen this picture depicting the struggles of the American workers. According to SONDERGAARD, it has been shown in Paris, Berlin, and all the large cities of Europe and even some parts of Asia. The informant reported that Miss SONDERGAARD then stated that even a movie as great as this is, is still barred even in the great city of Chicago, but eventually the people will finally force the showing of this film.

The informant reported that Miss SONDERGAARD concluded by saying that she had attended a large meeting in Los Angeles just a few days ago at which there were approximately 1500 persons in attendance. She stated that it was a meeting the same as this, sponsored by the Los Angeles Sobell Committee, and stated that people everywhere are rallying to the defense of MORTON SOBELL and the vindication of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG.

The informant reported that Miss SONDERGAARD was given a standing ovation from the audience and highly praised by Rabbi BURR S. YAMPOL.

The informant reported that Rabbi YAMPOL then introduced SYLVIA FISHER, who stated that "The Committee" had at last found a law firm that was willing to take over the case of MORTON SOBELL, and that due to this, much money was needed. According to FISHER, it was estimated that it would cost \$100.00 a day to retain these lawyers and she also mentioned that the Chicago Sobell Committee had a reception for GALE SONDERGAARD the previous evening on June 18 where the sum of \$600.00 was raised.

SYLVIA FISHER stated that the Chicago Sobell Committee has pledged to raise \$1500.00 or more within the next few months and then called for donations starting from \$100.00.

The informant reported that the Hyde Park-Kenwood Chapter of the Chicago Sobell Committee donated

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the first \$100.00. It was reported that MANDEL TERMAN of the CCASF sent a note pledging \$50.00.

SYLVIA FISHER concluded by stating that during the next few months various chapters of the Chicago Sobell Committee would hold various fund raising affairs to enable them to raise approximately \$5,000.00 for the defense of MORTON SOBELL and the vindication of the ROSENBERGS.

The informant reported that Rabbi YAMPOL introduced ANGUS CAMERON, one of the featured speakers of the evening who stated that he wanted to praise and compliment Mrs. SONDERGAARD for the fine speech that she had given. CAMERON stated that he remembered a time in this country when it was easy to publish a book but since then times have changed, thanks to BROWNELL, VELDE, JENNER, MC CARTHY, and all the rest, including members of the Senate Internal Security Sub-Committee, members of the Un-American Activities Committee, together with Agents of the FBI and Immigration and Naturalization Service. He further stated that a person spends most of his time on a train from wherever he is riding to the offices of one of these agencies in Washington.

According to the informant, CAMERON played a Mr. SAYPOL, who, according to CAMERON, prosecuted and won the conviction of the ROSENBERGS and MORTON SOBELL. CAMERON stated that had the ROSENBERG jury known that HARRY GOLD was a "psychopathic liar" they would have never convicted the ROSENBERGS or SOBELL. CAMERON then stated that there was a jury of 12 men and women who recently branded H. GOLD as a liar and it was GOLD's testimony that helped convict the ROSENBERGS and SOBELL.

The informant reported that after the speech by CAMERON, he, CAMERON, came back to present a book to both GALE SONDERGAARD and Rabbi BURR YAMPOL the title of which was "The Judgment of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG" written by JOHN WEXLEY.

The informant reported that at the conclusion of the meeting, SYLVIA FISHER took the speakers stand and announced that a total of \$1030.00 had been collected at this affair and together with the \$600.00 collected the previous night, made a total of \$1630.00 that will be used to help defray the expenses in obtaining a new

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trial for MORTON SOBELL.

The informant reported that the affair ended in an orderly manner at approximately 10:50 p.m.

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On June 18, 1954, T-16 advised that Rabbi S. BURR YAMPOL was a Communist sympathizer, member of the Chicago-Sobell Committee, and a member of the Midwest Committee for Protection of Foreign Born.

On May 27, 1948, T-7 advised that the Midwest Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (MCPFB) is the Midwest organization of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (ACPFB), which has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On June 22, 1955, T-16 advised that GALE SONDERGAARD was from Los Angeles, an actress who appeared in the movie, "Emil Zola", and is the wife of HERBERT BIBERMAN, who recently produced the movie, "Salt of the Earth".

The "Chicago Sun-Times", Three Star Final issue, dated June 27, 1954, contained an article which reflected that the film "Salt of the Earth" was a movie which had been shown in New York and San Francisco and has been reviewed in the "New York Times" and the "San Francisco Chronicle" as a heavy-handed, pro-labor, special-interest movie. It is about a mine strike that actually happened in Silver City, New Mexico, in 1951, in which women replaced men on the picket line and were arrested.

The Chicago Operators Union objects to the movie because it was sponsored by the Mine, Mill, and Smelter Workers Union, which was expelled from the CIO in the purge of left-wingers, and because the Director, HERBERT BIBERMAN, and the Producer, PAUL GARRICO, were identified before the HCUA as past or present Communists. BIBERMAN was one of the Hollywood people who was jailed for contempt after refusing to testify before the Committee.

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It should be noted that ANGUS CAMERON is one of the partners in the firm Cameron and Kahn, New York publishers, who published the books "False Witness," written by HARVEY MATUSOW and "The Judgement of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg," written by JOHN WEXLEY from New York.

On June 15, 1949, T-25 advised that SYLVIA FISHER was at that time a Communist Party member.

Evidence of Support
of CSC by CP

On June 17, 1955, T-26 reported that at a meeting held in June, 1955, by a leading Communist Party Club in Chicago, the Chairman requested all present to attend the ROSENBERG Memorial to be held June 19, 1955, at Curtis Hall, 410 South Michigan Avenue, in Chicago, Illinois. The Chairman stated that the memory of the ROSENBERGs must be kept alive, adding that if it was not for the ROSENBERGs not talking many more people would have been put on trial. The Chairman also sold tickets to the aforementioned affair at this meeting.

On August 17, 1955, this informant advised that at another leading Communist Party Club meeting held in Chicago in August, 1955, the Chairman told those present that the Communist Party members of his group had to participate financially, in the CP Fund Drive, "The Worker" Fund Drive and to raise funds for the Sobell Defense.

On October 22, 1953, T-7 advised that Doctor HAROLD C. UREY, noted nuclear scientist at the University of Chicago and Nobel prize winner, had taken an active interest in Chicago Sobell Committee in its efforts to free MORTON SOBELL since at least December, 1952.

On December 16, 1953, T-33 advised that in December, 1953, Doctor HAROLD C. UREY had written to HARRY PIERCE, Co-Chairman of the Los Angeles Rosenberg-Sobell Committee, in reference to an invitation by the Los Angeles Committee for UREY to speak.
