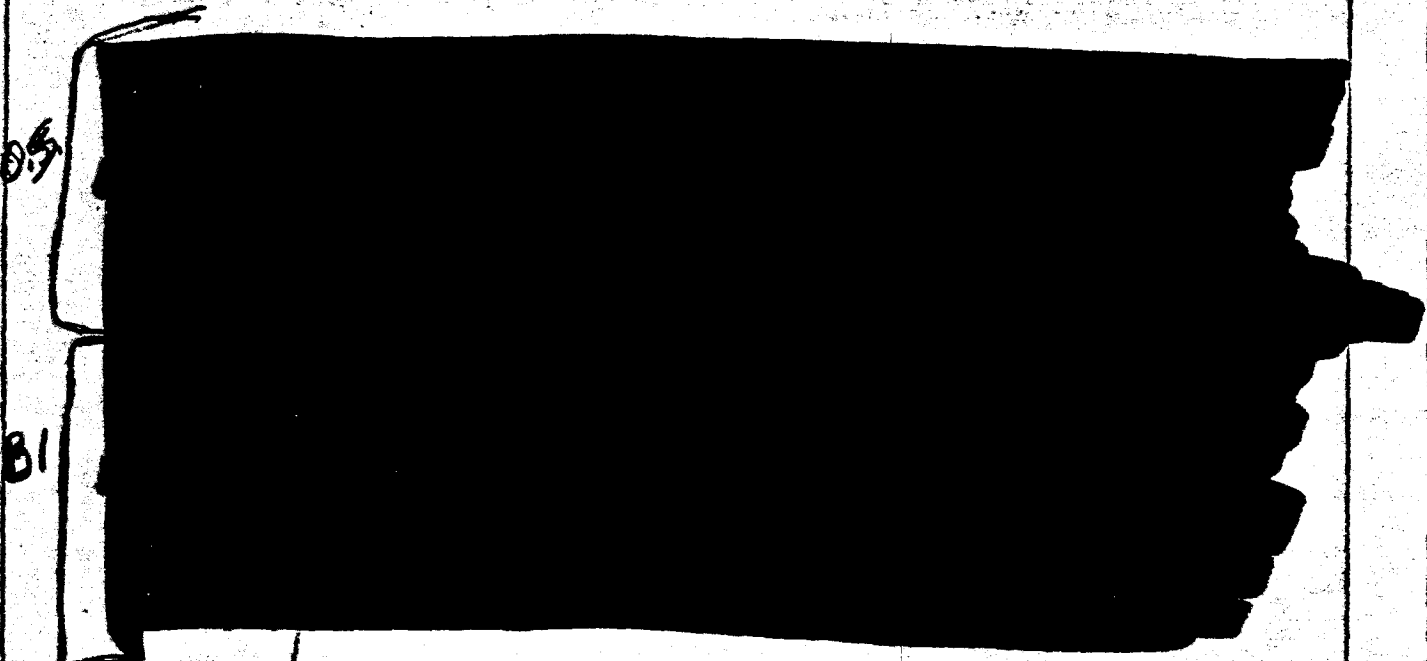

It is to be noted that records of the office of the United States Clerk of Court, Southern District of New York reviewed on December 3, 1952 by SA EDGAR C. FOREST reflects the following concerning ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV. Criminal numbers C 13-293 reflect that an indictment was filed on October 10, 1950 charging JULIUS ROSENBERG, ETHEL ROSENBERG, ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV, also known as "JOHN", DAVID GREENGLASS, and MORTON SOBELL with a violation of Title 50, Section 34, United States Code in that they had conspired to communicate, deliver, and transmit to a foreign government, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republic, documents, writings, et cetera, relating to the national defense of the United States. A branch warrant was issued for the arrest of ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV on December 5, 1952.



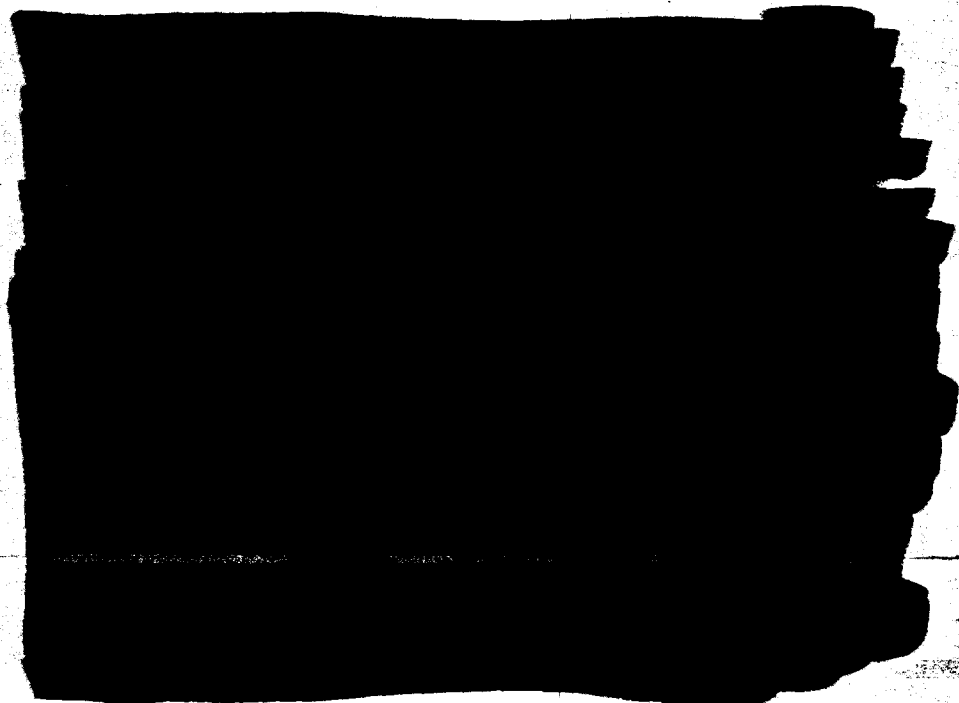

MAX ELITCHER, admitted former Communist Party (CP) member, Washington, D.C. 1939 through 1944, who attended the City College of New York from 1934 through September, 1939, when he graduated with a Degree in Electrical Engineering, and a former acquaintance of JULIUS ROSENBERG. (Interviewed January 6, 1956, by SA VINCENT J. CAHILL.)

IRVING SUSSMAN, admitted former member of the Young Communist League, who in 1935 joined the "Main Unit" of the Young Communist League at the City College of New York, and in 1937 was elected President of the City College of New York Club of the Young Communist League. SUSSMAN entered the City College of New York in September, 1933, and in September, 1938, received the degree of Master of Electrical Engineering. SUSSMAN was a former classmate of JULIUS ROSENBERG, whom SUSSMAN met on various occasions after graduation from the City College of New York, during the period 1938 through 1942. SUSSMAN is an admitted former CP and Communist Political Association (CPA) member from 1942 to about January, 1945, when SUSSMAN resigned. (Interviewed January 11, 1956, by SA VINCENT J. CAHILL.)

HELENE ELITCHER, residing on Furnace Dock Road, Peekskill, New York, wife of MAX ELITCHER, mentioned above. (Interviewed January 24, 1956, by SA ROBERT L. STEVENSON.)

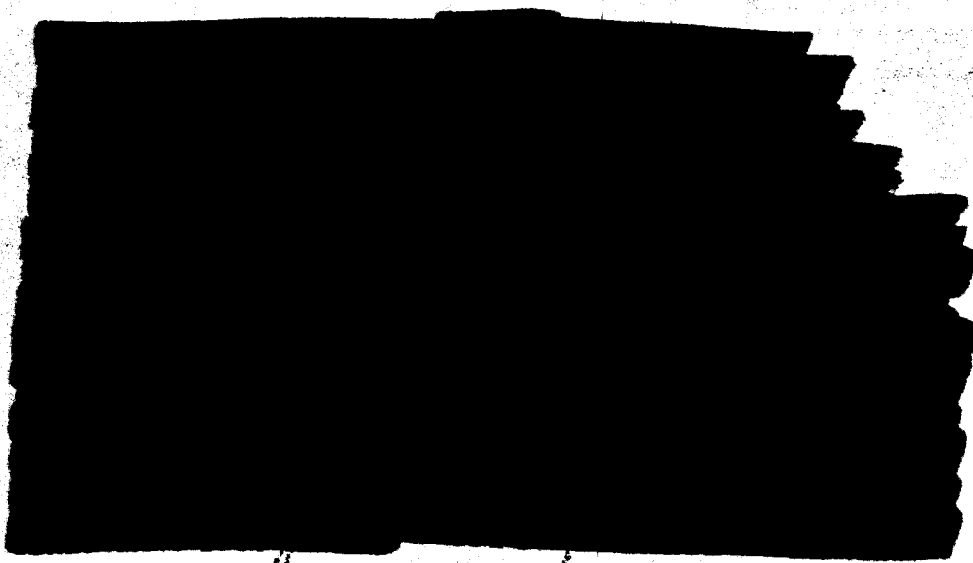

Also contained in this publication is an article, Page 2, on the nullification by the United States Supreme Court of the sentence imposed on WILLARD UPHAM in January 1958 by a Superior Court in New Hampshire. The article stated that the high court did not write a separate opinion but advised the New Hampshire Supreme Court to reconsider the case in the light of the decision in the PAUL SWEEZY case.

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Indices of the New York Office disclosed that on 3/9/51, SA WALTER P. GAVIN made inquiry of the General Register Corporation at 43-01 22nd St., NYC. This inquiry was made since a business card of ~~the~~ corporation was found among the effects of JULIUS ROSENBERG, who was subsequently convicted of Conspiracy to Commit Espionage in behalf of the Soviet Union, and ~~was~~ was executed for this offense in 1953.

Mr. SAUL HAMMER, Secretary of the General Register Corporation, explained at that time that in connection with the manufacture of several thousand coin operated machines, which automatically issued transfers, the Pitt Machine Products, Inc., 370 E. Houston St., NYC, made a few parts for General Register. Mr. HAMMER produced records which reflected a total of eight transactions between the two concerns in June and July, 1948. HAMMER said that he saw ROSENBERG who operated the Pitt Machine Products, Inc., at the

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General Register Corporation on two occasions, but never had any conversations with him. HAMMER said that ALFRED QUITNER, Project Engineer for General Register Corporation, had discussed the purchases of the aforementioned parts from Pitt Machine Products with ROSENBERG.

Mr. RICHARD WEINART, Chairman of the Board of the General Register Corporation, then advised that Pitt Machine Products, Inc., had been recommended to him for the purpose of making certain parts by one Mr. LIFTON, who was described as the New York representative of the National Slug Rejection Company of 5100 San Francisco Avenue, St. Louis, Missouri.

Mr. ALFRED QUITNER, Project Engineer for the General Register Corporation, then advised SA GAVIN that he had spoken to JULIUS ROSENBERG on three or four occasions at the General Register Corporation plant in connection with the aforementioned purchase of parts. No further information was obtained at that time and it is not known if ALFRED QUITNER of the General Register Corporation is possibly identical with captioned subject.

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
