Dear Sirs:

NYT 457 has advised that on January 28, 1948, subject ZLOTOWSKI, (who was until Dec. 31, 1947, the Polish Delegate to the United Nations Atomic Energy Commission, and who is known to have sent information to Poland concerning American progress in atomic energy research,) advised ABE BROTHMAN, a subject in the Gregory Case, that he had received a cable from Warsaw specifying what Warsaw was interested in, and what it was not interested in. On February 2, according to the informant, BROTHMAN proposed bringing "the material" to ZLOTOWSKI'S apartment at 3 PM, but the latter suggested that BROTHMAN arrive at 7 AM since another visitor would be at the apartment at 9 AM, which fact might cause a disturbance. ZLOTOWSKI stated that the material would be transmitted to Warsaw by a courier leaving on February 3.

The same informant advised that at 12:12 AM on February 3, BROTHMAN arranged with ZLOTOWSKI to bring "the material" to ZLOTOWSKI'S apartment at approximately 9 AM that day. ZLOTOWSKI stated that he would communicate with BROTHMAN after Warsaw received the material and replied to it.

A surveillance at ZLOTOWSKI'S residence at 150 West 80th St., NYC, disclosed that he left his apartment at approximately 8:45 AM on February 3. MR. JACK AHLL, elevator operator at that address, advised that ZLOTOWSKI was still away when, at 9:35 AM, a short, heavy

man, apparently Jewish, left a manila envelope with instructions that it be placed under ZLOTOWSKI's door. MR. AHILL furnished the envelope to agents of this office who photographed this envelope and its contents and returned it to MR. AHILL.

Attached hereto are two photostatic copies of a photographic copy of the memorandum which was in the envelope. This handwritten memorandum constitutes an offer by BROTHMAN to the Polish Government to establish in Poland an organization similar to "A. BROTHMAN and Associates - Chemical and Mechanical Engineers," which organization BROTHMAN operates in this country. He also discusses the possibility that the Polish Government might wish to avail itself of certain of the exclusive processes and "know-how" possessed by the BROTHMAN organization. He proposes that 5 persons from his organization go to Poland as part of the unit.

It should be noted that BROTHMAN has been known to have had in his possession plans for the construction in Palestine of a plant for the manufacture of TNT, apparently in connection with which the following statement is known to have been made: "Other plants were required to be operated jointly with the above mentioned ones to act as plausible shields for the original plants." The above information was previously reported to the Bureau on page 6 of the report of SA JOHN F. KILSEY dated 8/16/46 at NYC - Gregory Case. In view of the above, it is felt that the Bureau may wish to submit the description of the BROTHMAN organization (which is included in the attached memorandum) to authorities of the Atomic Energy Commission or the Bureau's Technical Laboratory, who may be able to ascertain whether or not the organization has facilities which would be useful for military production, or which may be restricted as to export. In this connection, it should be noted that the memorandum refers to a "pilot plant" on page 12. The Bureau may also wish to consider placing stops against the issuance of passports to any of the five persons who are proposed for the five year stay in Poland.

Any further information concerning the above matter which is furnished by NY 457 will be furnished to the Bureau promptly. Copies of the above described memorandum are being furnished for the Bureau's files on ZLOTOWSKI and the Gregory Case.



By letter dated February 11, 1948 the Bureau was advised that ABE BROTHMAN, subject in the GREGORY case, had furnished to ZLOTOWSKI a handwritten memo which constituted an offer by BROTHMAN to the Polish Government to establish in Poland an organization similar to "A. It should be noted that BROTHMAN has been known to have had in his possession plans for the construction in Palestine of a plant for the manufacture of TNT, apparently in connection with which the following statement is known to have been made: "Other plants were required to be operated jointly with the above-mentioned ones to act as plausible shields for the original plants". JERZY NEYMAN [REDACTED] advised that NEYMAN had contacted J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER, informing him that a Polish physicist named PIENKOWSKI [REDACTED] as arriving in San Francisco on August 12, 1946. OPPENHEIMER stated that he knew PIENKOWSKI and suggested arranging a party for him. NEYMAN was described as head of the Statistical Division of the University of California and former member of the American Election Committee investigating the post-war elections in Greece. He was discharged from this position in Greece for some unsanctioned remarks which were played up by the Communist press as discrediting the United States Commission.



The PR-1 form submitted on March 20, 1941 with regard to YAKOLEV reveals that he was born in Borisoglebsk, Russia, on May 31, 1911. He arrived in the United States at San Pedro, California, on February 4, 1941. He assumed his present duties as a clerk at the USSR

Consulate, New York City, on February 8, 1941. From 1936 to 1941 he was a student at the Engineering Economic Institute, Moscow. His wife is ANASTACIA YAKOLEVA. They have no children. At the time the PR-1 form was filed in 1941 they resided at 6 East 87th Street, New York City.

As of May 16, 1944 Confidential Informant T-2 advised that YAKOLEV and his wife took a summer residence at 37 Beck Avenue, Rye, New York.

According to Confidential Source of Information T-1, YAKOLEV handles information for people who are looking for relatives in Russia. Recently he was sent as a representative of the Consulate to a function held in New York City. He has not served in this capacity often. His wife is employed at the AMTORG TRADING CORPORATION.


