





Confidential Informant T-7 furnished a post card with an attachment urging a vote for the ALP candidates and the sending of the attached post card to "President Harry S. Truman, White House, Washington, D. C." This post card asked the President, "Why must more blood be shed while the negotiators in Korea settle the last remaining difference between them? Can't we stop the shooting and killing now, continue and finish the negotiations, and end the war in Korea without any more deaths? Millions are asking to end the war. Add my name."

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that on March 27, 1952, the First Assembly District Club of the ALP sent a telegram to former Attorney General HOWARD MC GRATH, urging a new trial for ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG and for MORTON SOBEL.

It is to be noted that ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG are convicted Soviet espionage agents.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

The "UKRAINIAN DAILY NEWS" (UDN) continues to be published daily excepting Saturday and certain holidays by the "UKRAINIAN DAILY NEWS" Incorporated, 85 East 4th Street, New York 3, New York. Officers of the UDN continue unchanged with MICHAEL TKACH, Editor, MICHAEL TKACH, Managing Editor, and MICHAEL KNIAZEWICH, Business Manager. Average circulation shown as 3400. Owners of the UDN, Incorporated shown as MICHAEL KNIAZEWICH, KATHERINE SMOLLEY, P. ILCEUK, J. TRUFYK, and L. TOLOPO.

The UDN continues its reputation of being a pro-Communist newspaper among Ukrainian-Americans in New York City. Numerous articles have appeared in the UDN opposing the execution of the ROSENBERGS.

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D. Articles Concerning Domestic Issues

1. The ROSENBERG Case

ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG were executed after being sentenced to death for passing Atomic secrets to the Russian Government.

The UDN has constantly fought for clemency for ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG up to and through the time that the ROSENBERGS were executed. Every issue of the UDN carried articles and editorials in their behalf.

Since the execution of the ROSENBERGS, the UDN has carried various articles supporting a fight for their vindication.

The following are summaries of only a few of these articles showing the degree to which the UDN defended the ROSENBERGS.

The UDN in its February 17, 1953, issue on page four, columns one and two, sets forth an editorial entitled "Error Which May Be Easily Corrected". This editorial pleads for clemency on behalf of the ROSENBERGS, stating that the ROSENBERG case is the case of the workers and democracy. The editorial concludes with the statement that "The death penalty imposed on them should be commuted".

The UDN in its March 2, 1953 issue on page four, column one, sets forth an article entitled "People Can Still Defeat Conspiracy Against ROSENBERGS".

This article claims that there is a two fold purpose behind suppressing the clemency appeals of the Chief Rabbis of France and Pope Pius:

"To obscure the extent of the world wide demand for clemency and to maintain the false argument that only Communists or Communist inspired groups are behind the movement to save the lives of the ROSENBERGS."

The UDN in its April 22, 1953 issue on page four, columns one and two, sets forth an article entitled "ROSENBERG Case". This article states that the ROSENBERGS are innocent victims of war hysteria instigated by such enemies of the people as Senators MC CARTHY and MC CARRAN.

The UDN in its May 31, 1953 issue on page eight, columns one and two, sets forth an article entitled "Save The ROSENBERGS". This article is an appeal to sign petitions for the ROSENBERGS and concludes with the statement that "there is not an honest man, who, regardless of his political and religious convictions would not sign these petitions for clemency."

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ALBERT CEZAR was interviewed in September, 1950, at the Electronic Transformer Company, 207 West 25th Street, New York City, in connection with an investigation of MORTON SOBELL. It will be noted that MORTON SOBELL was convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, in March, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage (Title 50, Section 34, United States Code, 1946 Edition). CEZAR stated he had first heard of MORTON SOBELL in 1945 or 1946, when SOBELL was in Schenectady, New York. At that time CEZAR was looking for an engineer to work for his company. The name of SOBELL had been recommended by an affiliate of the company who formerly employed SOBELL. In the course of considering SOBELL for employment, CEZAR traveled to Schenectady and talked to SOBELL for about two and a half or three hours, at the end of which SOBELL stated he was not interested in the position. CEZAR stated the interview with SOBELL, as far as he, CEZAR, was concerned, was an unpleasant one. Later CEZAR had considerable dealings with SOBELL'S former company, and conferred by telephone with SOBELL, according to CEZAR.

The Electronic Transformer Company, Inc. manufactures transformer parts for use in electric, radio and industrial transformer vacuum tubes and photoelectric cells, United States Standard Industrial Classification #3661. It distributes on a nation-wide basis to one hundred fifty industrial and commercial firms, and the Government. Seventy-five percent of the total volume of work done by this company is for the United States Government on a direct contract and indirectly through subcontractors. This company has a force of one hundred twenty employees.
