





On 10/10/50, the Pederal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, indicted JULIUS HOSENBERG, ETHE ROSENBERG, ANATULY A. TAROVLEY, FORTON SOBELL, and DAVID GREEKOL SS for conspiracy to violate the wartime espionage statute, Sub-section A, Section 32, Title 50, U.S.C. On 3/2:/51, SOJELL and the MCSE/BERGS were found guilty we Federal Jury in the Southern District of M.Y. On 6/19/53, the ROSENBERGS were executed in accordance with their sentence.

MOTON SCHOOL

MAI ELITCHER a self-edmitted CP member, and essociate of both JULIUS ROSEMBERG and SOBELL stated that he was recruited into the CP by SOBELL. ELITCHER advised that ROSEMBERG informed him that SOBELL was elding ROSEMBERG in espionage work. ELITCHER further stated SOBELL was eldettempted to emlist him in espionage work by turning ever information to SOBELL obtained by ELITCHER in the source of his employment with the Nevy victed and sentenced to 30 years imprisonment on 3/29/51 for conspiracy to sometiment espionage.

SOLOHOW GREATBERG

GREENBERG formerly employed as an Electrical Engineer at FTL. an informant, of unknown reliability, advised JULIUS ROSEMBERG in discussing his contacts said, "You know a man by the name of GREENBERG, who is a big electrical engineer at General Electric in Newark." Investigation disclosed no GREENBERG at GE in or around Newark.

DAVID CREEKGLASS said JULIUS ROSEMBERG used a certain apartment in MIC for microfilming. Investigation disclosed ALFRED SARAMI was listed as the renter. ALFRED SARAMI's notebook contained SOLOMON GREENBERG's name and phone number. GREENBERG denied knowing SARAMI.


During the course of the instant interview, a number of individuals were mentioned and discussed with the subject and these are being set forth alphabetically below, along with his comments:
