Mrs. Page's husband, about whom no derogatory information is known, is reported to be employed as an Engineering Draftsman by the Bulova Watch Company, 6210 Woodside Ave., Long Island City, New York.


It is reported that while Mrs. Rosenberg and Mrs. Page resided at 111 South United Street, Brooklyn, New York, they distributed Communistic literature at the doors of the various apartments in that building. It is further reported that on April 13, 1939, while living at this address, they signed nominating petitions of the Communist party. In addition, Mrs. Page is said to have secured one page of signatures for the Communist Party candidate.

The Commission has made no investigations of these persons and has not verified the statements made herein.

During the course of an official investigation, it was determined from a reliable and confidential source that JULIUS ROSENBERG, of 10 Monroe Street, Manhattan, New York City, is a member of the Communist Party and transferred from Brach 16B of the Industrial Division of the Communist Party to the East Side Club of the First A. D., under transfer number 12179, February 1944.

Mrs. FLORENCE MCLAUCHLIN, secretary to the vice president of Knickeroocker Village, 10 Monroe Street, advised that JULIUS ROSEIBFRO had moved to this address as of April 15, 1942, at which time he signed a two-year lease for Apartment GE-11. At this time he stated that he was an Army Inspector for the United States Signal Corps, Newark, New Jersey.

Hrs. McIAUGHLIN stated that this employment was verified at the time the lease was signed and it was again verified by letter dated January 31, 1944, from Mr. SAMUFL FSTFR of the United States Signal Corps, 309 Washington Street, Newark. This letter advised that Mr. MCFMBFRG had been with the Signal Corps approximately three years.

This information is being submitted to your office for whatever action you deem advisable.

At 8:45 P. M., this evening, Assistant Director D. N. Ladd called from the Bureau, and stated that in October, 1944, the New York Office wrote to the Service Command of the War Department in this area concerning the captioned subject.

Subject is identified as living at 10 Monroe Street, in New York City. He was born May 12, 1918.

Mr. Ladd stated that apparently our letter to the Service Command indicated that on October 6, 1944, ROSENBURG was transferred from the 16th Industrial Branch of the Communist Party to the East Side Club.

As a result of our letter, the Army has allegedly suspended ROSENBURG, and the latter's attorney is now raising trouble at the Bureau.

Mr. Ladd stated that apparently the Bureau did not receive a copy of this letter, or if they did, it could not be found, and he therefore requested that a summary of the letter be immediately sent to the Bureau and that a copy of the original letter be forwarded tomorrow. He also requested that the source of our information concerning the subject be set forth.



At approximately 1:15 a.m. I discussed with Mr. Belmont the ramifications of the ROSENBERG allegations. I pointed out to him that in GREENGLASS' signed statement he states that his wife recruited him at the request and direction of his brother-in-law JULIUS ROSENBERG./ I pointed out that we do not have a picture of ROSENBERG although we have numerous references; that he is living at 10 Konroe Street Knickerbocker Village, and that it would be virtually impossible to pick him up on a surveillance tomorrow morning with any degree of certainty. It was my recommendation that we approach his apartment at approximately 8 a.m. and invite him to the office for an interview.

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Re: JULIUS ROSEIBERG ESPIONAGE -R

I called Fr. Belmont at 3:10 p.m. on June 16th and advised him that ROSEMBERG will not talk. He is talking about wanting to get an attorney. The agents advised that on one or two occasions they thought he was going to break over, but they are now satisfied that he is not going to talk. I pointed out to Belmont that we received a short subsequent statement from GREENGLASS further implicating ROSEMBERG, which statement was obtained just before he went down for arraignment. I read the statement to Belmont and told him I would put it on a teletype immediately.

Er. Belmont advised that we should tell ROSENBERG that we are merely attempting to secure his cooperation and if he does not want to cooperate with us, he is free to leave the office at any time, but we would like to obtain from him a written voluntary waiver of search and would accompany him right now up to his home to see if this thing could be cleaned up one way or the other; that we would like to continue to talk to him tomorrow or at any time at his convenience and want him to feel free to call us and we might call him; that we cannot assure him, if he does not want to cooperate with us, that the Grand Jury may decide to consider this matter and that being the case he could be called before the Grand Jury as a vitness. This information was passed on to SA William Nort on, who is handling the interview and I requested Norton to keep me advised.

I pointed out to Ir. Belmont that there was another alternative that being a complaint being filed against him and that he be lodged in jail under a bond like GRUNGLASS* and that pressure might help him crack.

Inspector A. H. Belmont of the Bureau called at approximately 5:10 P.M. and advised that we should open a full scale investigation on ROSENBERG's activities, concentrating on seeking corroborative evidence of his espionage activities. In general, this investigation can be much more open than the usual type of espionage investigation. We can, in general, openly interview people seeking the facts that we want. Belmont advised that the leads should be set out by teletype and the investigation should be pushed vigorously.

I advised Belmont that ROSENBERG did not agree to give us a coluntary waiver of search. He did want to leave our discussion and was permitted to do so, and it was discreetly ascertained that when he left the wilding, he went to visit an attorney who is believed to have represented m before.

Belmont requested that we forward to the Bureau, this evening, a teletype of the pertinent developments on this case to date.



Pursuant to telephone call from Inspector Felmont on 6/28/50, 0. John Rogge, attorney for DAVID GREENGLASS, was interviewed at his office, 401 Broadway, New York City, on the same day.

Mr. Rogge felt that GREENGLASS had not made complete divulgence of his activities. From the family relationship, namely RUTH GREENGLASS, DAVID, and JULIUS ROSENBERG, there are doubtless other items that might be disclosed by GREENGLASS according to Rogge and he feels the he, Rogge, will obtain these items in subsequent consultations with this client.

One item Rogge suggested that GOLD be questioned regarding is the identity of the person who gave GOLD the one half box top. Thus the Bureau may be able to identify the person of more importance than GREENGLASS. He offered this item as evidence of good faith to cooperate.

Rogge said there is only one other person that GREENGLASS can implicate and that is his brother-in-law JULIUS ROSENBERG.

Rogge said that he had not discussed his program of cooperation with GREFNGLASS before going to Washington on 6/27/50. He did, however, discuss the matter with RUTH GREENGLASS and she stated she was willing to cooperate by all means.

On June 28, 1950, Rogge took up the matter with GREENGLASS and now he has the authority of his client to offer his cooperation. Rogge said that until this program of cooperation is worked out he does not want the matter discussed with ROSENBERG.

Rogge said that there was one item that had not been disclosed to the Bureau agents and that was the fact that "they" wanted GRENGLASS to stay on at Los Alamos and that he refused. Rogge said he desired his client to cooperate with the Government because in so doing the identity of a more important individual or individuals might be disclosed. Rogge said that when he broached the matter of cooperation to RUTH GREENGLASS

he said that he could not promise her anything. He stated. He stated he cited to her one instance where he recommended that a client of his in the NILLIE BIOFF case cooperate with the Government and as a result received leniency.

GREENGLASS told Rogge that the identification of his contact at Los Alamos would be affected by the presentation of one half box top, OREENGLASS holding the matching one-half. Rogge said that the entire box top originated with GREENGLASS! brother-in-law. Rogge said that according to GREENGLASS, GOLD was not supposed to be the man to contact him at Los Alamos. He suggested therefore that GOLD be interviewed as to the identify of the person who gave him the one half box top. This person would be the important person in the case.

Rogge said he was now waiting for the decision of the Department regarding the program of cooperation outlined to them by Rogge.


