Re: JULIUS ROSENBERG ESPIONAGE-R

T-1, a Confidential Informant of unknown reliability, furnished the information set out below with reference to JULIUS ROSENBERG. T-1 has emphatically stated that he does not wish to testify in the court to any of this information but that he is furnishing it to the writer for whatever value it may be. T-1 should only be contacted by the writer and his identity should be protected in setting out information furnished by him in reports:

T-1 was interviewed by the writer on 3/22/51 and he stated that ROSENBERG had discussed the trial with him and that ROSENBERG had volunteered the following:

According to ROSENBERG, he and his wife ETHEL are the only two persons who are going to testify in the trial. ROSENBERG is considering the possibility of introducing his mother as a witness but, no decision had been reached and, according to ROSENBERG, was only a remote possibility that his mother would be called.

ROSENBERG had previously considered calling MORTON SOBELL and a man named SCHREIER. Neither of these individuals, according to present plans, will be called as witnesses. ROSENBERG is contending that the whole thing does not exist and, therefore, there would be no logic in calling witnesses to testify to something he is completely denying.

ROSENBERG stated that the reason SOBELL was not going on the stand was that SOBELL'S attorney feels that the government has not established a prima facie case against him (SOBELL). The attorney, therefore, does not desire to leave SOBEIL open to questioning by putting him on the stand in the ROSENBERG trial.

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ROSENBERG stated that the reason SCHREIER is not being called is that because SCHREIER is an active member of the Communist Party and is a school teacher. SCHREIER'S attorney, a man named ATKINS, had conferred with MANNY BLOCH concerning this and they reached the opinion that SCHREIER would in all probability be asked if he were a Communist Party member. They were afraid that his answer would ruin him since if he refuses to answer on the grounds that he would be incriminating himself, such an answer is self-evident. If he answers that he is not a Communist Party member, he would be leaving himself open to a charge of perjury since they are quite sure that the FBI already knows he is a Communist Party member and that the FBI can prove it.

T-1 stated that JULIUS ROSENBERG, SCHREIER, ATKINS, and the doctor who was called on to testify as a government witness all live in Knickerbocker Village and are close friends.

ROSENBERG stated that there are two questions he would refuse to answer in court on the grounds that they would tend to incriminate him. The first was as to whether or not he is a member of the Communist Party. The second was as to whether or not he knows WILLIAM PERL.

In reference to the doctor's testimony, ROSENBERG is at a loss to explain why the doctor is testifying against him. He stated that he feels that the doctor could have escaped testifying by claiming an immunity privilege based on his relationship as a doctor to his patient. ROSENBERG is extremely upset and concerned over why the doctor has testified against him. ROSENBERG intends to just deny the doctor's testimony.

ROSENBERG feels that he will be asked to explain six trips which he took. Two of these trips were to Washington, D. C. and the other four were to Ithaca, New York, and Cleveland, Ohio. ROSENBERG advised that one of the trips to Washington was legitimate and can be easily explained. The other trip to Washington and all of his trips to Cleveland and Ithaca were concerned with Russian espionage and, therefore, if asked to explain them, he will have to think up a story concerning them.

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ROSENBERG intends to claim that his second trip to Washington was made to see Congressman DICKSTEW(Ph.) and also to call at the office of his architect's union. (FA.E C.T.)

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According to T-1, ROSENBERG has not offered what explanation he will give with reference to his trips to Ithaca and Cleveland.

ROSENBERG is also concerned over testifying as to the wrist watches which he and his wife received as a gift from the Russians. ROSENBERG stated that he lost his and that he purchased the one which he is now wearing and can easily explain that. With reference to the watch which his wife has, ROSENBERG will contend that he bought it from a salesman who called at his shop one day.

ROSENBERG stated that the Leica camera which he has was given him by the Russians and that he is greatly concerned that this camera might be found by the FBI and that he would be questioned about it. He stated that it would be difficult to explain where he got this camera and that he is at a loss to offer a reasonable story.

ROSENBERG stated that the SIDOROVICHS have an identical camera which was also given to them by the Russians. He stated finat they also would be unable to explain where they got it. According to ROSENBERG, the SIDOROVICHS are key people in the Russian espionage setup and are about as important as he is. ROSENBERG stated that they were receiving information of the same caliber as he and that they were copying it with their Leica camera and sending it on to the Russians. ROSENBERG is not worried about the SIDOROVICHS testifying against him since to do so they would have to cut their own throats.

ROSENBERG stated that according to information given him by his attorney MANNY BLOCH on Tuesday, 3/20/51, a man had appeared at BLOCH'S office and had stated that he had been held as a material witness in a murder case in the Tombs. This individual claimed to have been in the Tombs at the time GREENGLASS was incarcerated there. This man spoke

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to the elder BLOCH and advised that he would swear to the fact that GREENGLASS was offered a deal by the government to testify as he is doing. This individual asked the elder BLOCH how much this information would be worth. According to ROSENBERG, the elder BLOCH conferred with MANNY BLOCH and the two of them advised this individual to relate his story to a disinterested attorney, to swear to the story and have it notarized, and then to return to them with it, at which time they would discuss the value of his information.

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ROSENBERG stated that when he was first picked up by the FBI, he contacted his Russian accomplices and told them that he could not protect or cover WILLIAM PERL and the others who were involved with him. He told the Russians to have someone contact PERL in Cleveland and tell him to get out of the country. According to ROSENBERG, a Russian agent directly contacted VIVIAN GLASSMAN and asked her to bring \$2,000 to PERL who was to use it to leave the country.

PERL at that time was applying for a position with the Atomic Energy Commission in the field of sereodynamics. PERL was aware of the fact that he was being investigated by the FBI in connection with his application for this position and, therefore, when he was approached by VIVIAN GLASSMAN, he did not show any sign of recognition nor did he accept the \$2,000. VIVIAN GLASSMAN thereupon left Cleveland and returned to New York City with the money. ROSENBERG stated that he had no knowledge as to what disposition has been made of the money and he feels that she still has it.

T-l advised that from the way in which ROSENBERG speaks of VIVIAN GLASSMAN, he feels that she is considered a top-level courier for the Russian Government. ROSENBERG told T-l that VIVIAN GLASSMAN was the sweetheart of JOEL BARR, who is a courier for the Russians and who is now in Europe and probably Russia.

ROSENBERG stated that PERL is one of the top men in the field of aereodynamics and that should he have obtained a position with the government, he had been all set up to pass information learned by him on to the Russians.

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ROSENBERG stated that the woman in Ithaca, New York named SARANT was also an active Russian agent and that her husband is now in Europe.

T-1 stated that WILLIAM PERL, after his incarceration in prison, related to him the story about being approached by VIVIAN GLASSMAN and ordered \$2,000 and that he, PERL, reported the entire indignation the FBI.

Thadvised that he has also become an intimate confident of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN. Tel stated that BROTHMAN discussed the story of the \$40,000 in his account which HARRY GOLD furnished to the FBI. According to BROTHMAN, this \$40,000 was not given him by the Russians. He was paid the \$40,000 for working on and developing an explosive for the Palestine Government to be used in the fighting over there. The \$40,000 was paid to BROTHMAN by Haganah. BROTHMAN stated that he gave officials of Haganah a receipt for the \$40,000 but the receipt had a fictitious name on it. He stated that Haganah would deny ever having given him the \$40,000 since his work was in direct violation of the President's Embargo Act.

BROTHMAN is not concerned about being questioned in reference to the \$40,000 since he states that he has completely destroyed all the evidence reflecting his experiments with the explosives. BROTHMAN stated that the boxes and cartons which he had kept the materials for his explosives were thrown by him in Newtown (Ph.) Creek.

T-1 was asked to relate again his story concerning a money order being received from a BUD WHITE via bonded messenger. T-1 stated that this story was entirely true and that BLOCH wrote a letter thanking this alleged individual for his contribution to the defense of ROSENBERG and that the letter was returned to him marked "not known at this address". BLOCH has this letter in his possession and intends to use it as evidence to show source of funds for conducting the ROSENBERG trial if he is questioned concerning the origin of the money.

According to information furnished by ROSENBERG, the money was deposited in his, ROSENBERG'S, account the day

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after it was received by BLOCH! T-1 stated that if this money has not been deposited to ROSENBERG'S account, ROSENBERG has no knowledge of that fact.

T-l stated that EUGENE DENNIS, just before leaving the Federal House of Detention, gave him a pen and pencil set and told him that he wished to further their relationship with each other. According to T-l, DENNIS stated that this pen and pencil set had originally been given to him by a member of the National Committee of the Communist Party.

T-l advised that he is anxious to continue cooperating with the writer. He was advised that he would be contacted on 3/23/51.

ARTHUR HEDER, Engineer, National Boardcasting Co., 106th and Park Ave. was interviewed by the writer on 3/15/51.

HEDLIR advised he was formerly employed by the Jefferson-Travis Radio Co. in NYC. Also employed there as engineers were ROBERT STUDY and DAVID LEWIS. STUDY, LEWIS and HEDLER developed a device they called the "Radio Homing Control". They were attempting to secure a financial backer for this device and were told by JULIUS ROSENBERG that he had some friends who might be interested.

HEDLER explained that ROSENBERG was stationed at Jefferson-Travis by the U.S. Signal Corps. He would inspect the parts for the Corps and would report to the engineer any deficiency noted. Because of this arrangement HEDLER stated they were closely associated with the subject during working hours.

At ROSENBERG'S suggestion he, STUDY and LEWIS went with ROSENBERG to talk to his friends about sponsoring their device. He recalled this visit took place sometime during the late part of 1942 or early 1943.

HEDLER remembers they were driven to the shop by MILTON CHASIN, a junior inspector, under ROSENBERG and also seemingly a close associate of the subject's

HEDLER recalls they were taken to a converted garage, containing some radio parts and equipment. This place was located on Bedford Ave, about 2 blocks below Ebbets field and on the opposite side of the street. HEDLER was unable to recall the name of the concern visited.

Upon arrival they were introduced, by ROBENBERG, to two men whose names HEDLER was unable to recall. The homing device was explained to the 2 men who asked pointed and detailed questions regarding the intracacies of the mechanism. HEDLER said the device had not yet been patented so they were reluctant to divulge the innermost secrets of their invention.

After a short discussion HEDLER stated they felt the two men were more interested in obtaining information about the invention than discussing the possibility of advancing funds for its development. They decided that the possibility of advancing funds for its development the discussion.

ROSENBERG'S friends were not sincere so they terminated the discussion.

HEDLER stated that during his associations with the subject at Jefferson-Travis he never heard ROSEMBERG say anything, or give any indication, that he adhered to the tenents of Comminism.

HEDLER did state however, that ROSENBERG had several testers working under him, one of which he recalls was definitely a Communist. He recalled this person as being JOSEPH CICERESKA. HEDLER said CICERESKA continually argued in favor of Communism and openly advocated the Russian type government. HEDLER stated he never heard CICERESKA admit CP membership, but presumed that he was.

In this connection HEDLER said that ROSENBERG, who was CICERESKA'S superior should have reprimanded him for talking the way he did; however ROSENBERG never admonished CICERESKA for his rantihgs.

HEDLER stated he has not seen ROSENBERG since he terminated his employment with Jefferson-Travis, nor has he seen CICERESKA, but he recalls hearing that CICERESKA was employed by the Reeves Instrument Corp. in NYC. HADLER advised he did not know the present whereabouts of JOSEPH SCHIDLIN, but the last he heard he was working for the Raytheon Corp. in NJ.

According to HEDLIR, DAVID LEWIS is presently employed by the Smith-Meeker Co. in NYC. LEWIS resides in the vicinity of HEDLER'S home on Long Island and they maintain a close friendship. HEDLER stated he would contact LEWIS and between the two of them they would possibly arrive at the identities of ROSINDERG'S friends.

LEMIS who recalled the writer later in the day to advise he had spoken with LEMIS who recalled the concern to which the subject took them was called the Bedford Radio Co." LEMIS recalled me of the men was named EPSTEIN and the other was LEO ALTSHULLER.





On 3/26/51 MR. IRVING MITCHELL FELT, 40 Wall St., New York City was interviewed by SAS JOSEPH J. PALGUTA and VINCENT J. CAHILL. MR. FELT stated that he was president of Jefferson-Travis Co., 22nd St.& 2nd Avs. New York City from approximately 1941 until 1943. During this time, according to FELT, JULIUS ROSENBERG was assigned to the plant as a Signal Corp inspector which was engaged in the manufacturing of two way radio equipment, walkie-talkie, electrical installation equipment for the U.S. Army and U.S. AirForce. FELT said that ROSENE'RG only scent a portion of his tile at the plant when the company first started production and that as production increased, ROSENBERG spent more time at the plant and eventually was putting full time at the plant. FELT stated that he was nositive that ROSENBERG did not receive any remunerations from the company in any form including money, personal gifts, or household furniture. FELT stated that ROSENBERG definitely did not receive a breakfront from the company. He pointed out that it was the company's policy not to give any remuneration to government inspectors at the plant. He also pointed out that this policy was strictly adhered to.

FELT stated that one EDGAR ALLEN ELLINGER. JR. was vice-president of the Jefferson Travis Co. during the time that JULIUS BOSENEERG was employed at the plant as a Signal Corp inspector. He said that one JOHN T. FILGATE also served as vice-president of that company for a period in 1944. However he was not sure whether ROSENEERG was still assigned to the plant at that time. FELT stated that ELLINGER is presently residing at SADDLE ROCK RANCH, SEDOMA, ARIZONA. He also stated that JOHN T. FILGATE is a retired Army Colonel and that he resided in STANFORD, COMM. at the time he was vice-president of the Jefferson-Travis Co.. He said he did not know where FILGATE presently resides or where he is employed.

FELT said that he has never heard that either ELLINGER or FILGATE gave ROSENEERG a present of any kind and specifically said that he had never heard of ELLINGER or FILGATE giving ROSENEERG a breakfront.

FELT commented that he thought it very unlikely that either of these men would give ROSENBERG a present since they did not associate with him socially and that their relationship with him would have been a strictly business relationship at the plant.

On 3/26/51 MR. PETER A. PETROFF, 127-129 Water Street, New York City, was interviewed by SAS VINCENT J. CAHILL and JOSEPH J. PALGUTA. PETROFF said that ROSEN HERG was assigned as a U.S. Army Signal Corp Inspector to his plant periodically from 1942 to 1944. PETROFF stated that JULIUS ROSENTERG during that period was very friendly with one DONOMIC LIBERATORE who was then the Chief Signal Corp Inspector assigned to PETROFF'S plant. LIBERTORE according to MR. PETROFF is presently assigned to the REEVES INSTRUMENT CO., 215 E. 91 St., New York City, as an aircorp inspector of equipment.

PETROFF said that JULIUS ROSENBERG WOULD visit his plant from time to time during 1942-1944 although ROSENBERG was not assigned to the plant at the particular of his visits. ROSENBERG would make inquiries from him & his employees of the particular work being done at the plant at that time although he had no connection with the work being done at that time. He recalled ROSENBERG specially inquiring about motors being built at the plant in connection with radio sets SCR-545-A and SCR-584. PETROFF said that ROSENBERG asked him if there were blueprints available of the above motors. PETROFF said that he could not understand the purpose of JULIUS ROSENBERG inquiring about the above described motor when he ostensible had no connection with these motors.

PETROFF stated that in about 1946 JULIUS ROSEVERG came to him and stated that he had been dismissed from his employment with the U.S.Army Signal Corp and asked PETROFF if he could do something to assist him in regaining his position with the Signal Corp. PETROFF

said that ROSENBERG told him that he was dismissed by the Signal Corp because he was accused of being in subversive activities. PETROFF said he told ROSENFERG he was unable to do anything for him in that regard.

PETROFF said that ROSENEERG came to him again in about 1947. He told him that he had his own shop and asked if PETROFF would give him some work to do on a sub-contract basis. PETROFF said he was unable to give ROSENBERG any work and that was the last time he sawROSENBERG.

MRS. JOSEPHINE SAQUIE, Assistant to PETER A. PETROFF. Manufacturing Contractors, 127 Water Street, New York City, for the past fourteen years, was interviewed by SAS JOSEPH J. PALGUTA and VINCENT J. CAHILL on 3/26/51. She stated that in her opinion she first met ROSENBERG in 1941 when the company was located at 128 Water Street, New York City when the company was engaged in manufacturing of small plugs, under contract with the Signal Corp. She stated that ROSENBERG was a Signal Corp inspector assigned to PETROFF'S plant on that contract. She stated that the company had great difficulty with ROSENBERG because in her opinion he deliberately delayed approval of the plug for shipment thereby causing the company great inconvenience.

HRS. SAQUIE stated that in about 1946, JULIUS ROSENBERG visited PETROFF'S plant and at that time explained to her that he was dismissed FRCH his job with the Signal Corp because of anti-Semitic reasons. She said that she told ROSENBERG that the Signal Corp did not dismiss people without good reasons. ROSENBERG then told her that he was dismissed from his position because of charges that he was engaged in subversive activities.

SAQUIE stated that in about July 1950 after reading of the ROSEN-BERG arrest she was at Long Beach. New York and spoke to some unidentified individual who told her that he was a classmate of ROSENBERG'S at CONY and that ECSENBERG had approached him in their senior year to join some organization or society. This individual also told MRS. SAQUIE that he almost became involved as a result. She was unable to furnish any information about this unidentified schoolmate but believed that he was a family, vacationing at Long Beach. I called Mr. Carl Hennrich, Bureau, at 11:30 A. M. today and advised him that defendants, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG; and Morton Sobell would be sentenced 4/5/51 at 10:30 A. M. I advised him Judge Irving Kaufman had stated this was a just verdict and he complimented the FBI on its usual efficient investigation of the case, stating that they performed a splendid job in the true tradition of the FBI. I said that United States Attorney Irving Saypol complimented the Attorney General, the United States Attorney's staff, Mr. Hoover and the PBI. He paid tribute to the work of the men and women of the FBI, stating that the excellence of their work could be expressed only in superlatives. They are not a police force, but an investigative agency; and their eternal vigilance, pervading, ceaseless, untiring efforts resulted in bringing this case to prosecution. He also advised that Mr. BLOCK had extended his appreciation to the FBI for its courtesies. He was satisfied that the Jury deliberated carefully. I pointed out that the defendants accepted the verdict in stoic fashion.

Re memorandums of SA ARMAND A. CAMMAROTA, at New York, dated February 17 and February 20, 1951.

JEROME EUGENE TARTAKOW was interviewed at the Federal House of Detention in the Office of Warden E.E. THOMPSON on March 19, 1951, at which time he advised the writer that his personal feelings have changed since the last interview, and that he has become somewhat adjusted to the sudden loss of his son. He advised that he still has personal problems and that his wife has refused to come to New York City. TARTAKOW intimated that he and his wife would probably be separated and divorced upon his release from prison. He stated that upon his release, he expects to go to work for his sister, who operates a small photography studio and shop in the Bronx.

TARTAKOW was very congenial toward the writer and he stated that he is more or less resigned to his fate. He stated that as of that date, he had only 83 more days to serve on his time and that he had little or no hope of getting out sooner. TARTAKOW advised that his mother has been fighting to get the detainer against him in courts removed and that she has been promised it would be done but that to date it has not been accomplished.

TARTAKOW advised that with reference to JULIUS ROSENBERG, he would be glad to furnish the writer with any information requested of him. He

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stated that he would do this on a personal basis only and that he was not requesting any consideration or compensation for it. He also stated, however, that he absolutely does not wish to testify in court to any information he may give.

TARTAKOW stated that if he is going to be called to testify to information he has already 's furnished, he does not desire to furnish any more. He explained his wishes in this respect by saying that first, he does not care to be publicly acclaimed as an informant with sordid individuals such as ROSENBERG, and secondly, that at the time of his son's: death, inmates of the prison who are friendly to the ROSENBERG cause and who know him to be a friend of ROSENBERG, had given him or loaned him \$700.00 which with he used as expenses for himself and a prison guard to fly out to his son's funeral in Phoenix, Arizona. TARTAKOW stated that he intends to some day repay all of this money and does not wish the people who befriended him in time of need to know that he had been furnishing information concerning ROSENBERG all:

TARTAKOW stated that he now sleeps in the same cell with ROSENBERG and that ROSENBERG discusses every aspect of the trial with him. He furnished the following information with respect to ROSENBERG and the trial:

"ROSENBERG at the beginning of the trial appeared to be in good spirits and was self-confident although he has never assumed that he would be acquitted. During the last few days, however, ROSENBERG has become depressed and has said that should he receive the death penalty, both he and his wife will go to the chair without uttering a word. ROSENBERG is fanatically devoted to the cause of Communism and is prepared to die for it.

"with reference to the trial, both ROSENBERG and his wife intend to testify and their defense is going to be based on the fact that GREENGLASS and his wife, HARRY GOLD, and ANATOLI A. YAKOVLEV are spies and Communist agents. ROSENBERG and his wife will and Communist agents. ROSENBERG and his wife will contend, however, that because of the acquaintanceship between these people and themselves, these people are trying to use them as fall guys and are unjustly implicating them.

"ROSENBERG will contend that GREENGLASS, GOLD, and YAKOVIEV are implicating him in order to keep from exposing the true identity of whoever they contact as a Russian agent. With reference to ROSENBERG'S doctor, ROSENBERG will maintain that the doctor's testimony is false and that he has never contacted the doctor by is false and that he has never contacted the doctor by telephone. ROSENBERG will claim that he had a personal telephone. ROSENBERG will claim that he had a personal telephone only with the doctor and that at that time interview only with the doctor and that at that time interview as a witness present named SHIRER (ph), who will be called as a defense witness.

"ROSENBERG swears to TARTAKOW and ABRAHAM
BROTHMAN that he is not acquainted with ANATOLI YAKOVLEV.
In this connection, it is noted that TARTAKOW advised
that he feels ROSENBERG is telling the truth. According to ROSENBERG, he has never seen or met YAKOVLEV.
He claims that in reality, he furnished the information
to two Russians named ALEX and HENRY, instead of to
YAKOVLEV as contended."

TARTAKOW advised that ROSENBERG has confided many things to him during the past few weeks, among which was the story in detail of how he, (ROSENBERG) had stolen the proximity fuse. ROSENBERG also told had stolen the proximity fuse. ROSENBERG also told TARTAKOW that at the time he was first questioned by TBI agents at his home, he had \$7000.00 in cash and FBI agents at his home, he had \$7000.00 in cash and a Leica camera secreted in the apartment. According a Leica camera secreted to give the agents consent to ROSENBERG, he refused to give the agents consent to search and that evening upon his return to the

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apartment, he took the \$7000.00 and the Leica camera and gave them to his wife, ETHEL. ROSENBERG had the \$7000.00 hidden in his son's victrola or record box which was on the floor in the child's den. ETHEL ROSENBERG removed these two items from the apartment the next morning in a brown paper shopping bag and brought them to the apartment of a Communist Party member, who also lives in Knickerbocker Village. According to TARTAKOW, this individual is not aware of the contents of the brown paper shopping bag and is merely safeguarding it for the ROSENBERGS until they return to claim it.

In the interest of discretion, the interview was terminated by the writer at this time since TARTAKOW had left the presence of ROSENBERG to return to the warden's Office. It was not deemed advisable to detain TARTAKOW for too long a period of time since he might have difficulty in explaining his absence. He was advised that he would be recontacted, but only on the days and during the hours in which ROSENBERG would be in court. He agreed that this would be the most advantageous arrangement and stated that he will cooperate fully with the writer in any manner requested of him.

Rememo of SA ARMAND A. CAMMAROTA, 3/23/51, with reference to interviews with JEROME TARTAKOW at the Federal House of Detention on March 22 and 23, 1951.

Contacts with TARTAKOW are being made on a personal basis between the writer and TARTAKOW, and no promise of remuneration or any other type of consideration has been given to TARTAKOW. TARTAKOW has, however, indicated to the writer that he would like some consideration for the information he is furnishing should that information be of any value. In this connection, it is noted that he has a short period of time to serve remaining and that with or without any assistance he will be discharged from the Federal House on or about June 7, 1951.

TARTAKOW has consented to furnish information to the best of his ability, and since information furnished by him to date has proven reliable and accurate, it was deemed advisable to maintain contact with him. He has furnished pertinent information with reference to the RCSENBERG trial.

He also is in a position to furnish information concerning all of ROSENBERG's activities and associates, and he is closely acquainted with ABRAHAM BROTHMAN and EUGENE DENNIS. He also became intimately acquainted with WILLIAM PERL during the four days in which PERL was held at the Federal House of Detention.

If his reliability is proven, the possibility exists that he may be utilized further. There is no question or doubt of his contacts with the above-mentioned individuals, and there is no doubt of the fact that information furnished by him came directly from them.

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ALCENDO

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Information furnished by TARTAKOW with reference to any of the subjects mentioned herein will be set out in memorandum form, and he will be referred to by a T symbol in order to protect his identity.

He has emphatically stated that he does not wish to testify in court as to the information furnished by him. He, therefore, is being interviewed for whatever intelligent Cvalue his information may have rather than for use as testimony.

In view of the above, should it be felt that contacts with TARTAKOW should be maintained subsequent to the ROSENBERG trial, it is requested that some consideration be given to offer him some recompense. It is felt that TARTAKOW will be more anxious to cooperate should he feel that he would get some personal neward for his trouble.
