





On 4/13/1951 MAX ELITCHER advised the writer that he recalled HELEN SOBELL having a small wrist-watch with a thin, black band but said he had never observed it closely and did not know the make of this watch. He did not recall seeing HELEN SOBELL wear this watch often. He did not recall her watch having any diamond chips.

MAX ELITCHER then contacted his wife, HELENE, who recalled that HELEN SOBELL had a small wrist-watch. She had never observed it closely however, and was unable to furnish any particulars about it.

MAX and HELENE ELITCHER stated that they would give the matter additional consideration and advise this office if they recall any specific information.

On 4/13/51 the writer with the cooperation of MR. THIEL, Floor manager of Willoughby's Camera Store, checked records of sales of used Leica cameras for the periods January 1, 1949 through May 30, 1950 and October 1943 through January 1947. The period covering January 1947 through December 31, 1948 was previously checked by SA M. CORCORAN.

No record was located of any purchase of such a camera by JULIUS ROSENBERG or any other of his known associates in Espionage activity.

The following items were noted however, and are set forth since they may have some possible relationship to ROSENBERG'S Espionage work.

- 1. On Herch 15, 1946 WILLOUGHBY'S sold Leice Model III B #321155 to ALEXANDER ZOUROV of Soviet Consulate, 7 E. 61st St., New York City. CT #A 8294. This appears on page of sale book dated March 1946.
- 2. On 6/26/1945 Leica Model F # 208034and an eveready case was sold to Government Purchasing Commission of Soviet Union, Washington, D.C. This item appears on page dated November 1944. Stock # 16288.
- 3. On 7/19/44 Leica G #287792 and an eveready case sold to D.E. CFESSER of Cleveland, Ohio. This appears on July 1944 page, stock # 15541.
- 4. On 1/12/1950 Leich III C #402338 and case sold to ADTRED PUHN. 40 Monroe St., New York. This item appears on December 1949 page.
- 5. Leica G #263030 and case stock #38241 sold to GILBERT GORDON, 815 Kensington Hall, Columbia University.
- 6. Leica C #426029 and case sold 8/8/1949 to JOHN C. ALEXANDRE.



Mr. JUHN t. CHOWLET, JR., Associate Director for Research, National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, advised that he was formerly Chief of Research at Langley Field, having under his general supervision eight divisions. He stated that he recalled that FERL had for a period of approximately four years worked at Langley Field, as his name had come to CROWLIY'S attention in connection with reports and work being done. He further noted that he had seen FERL occasionally, but had had no close official or social association with him. Mr. CROWLEY further stated that after FERL went to Cleveland, he was even further removed from his supervision. Mr. CROWLEY had no comment to make concerning PERL'S character or loyalty, but stated that from his meager knowledge of PERL he had apparently done his work and had not been engaged in any questionable activities.

Mr. CRCLEY was not acquainted with MORTON SCREIL or JULIUS ROSENBERG other than through the publicity attendent to their recent trial. He noted that these individuals were unknown to him, that neither PERL no anyone else had interceded on behalf of SOBELL or ROSENBERG in the matter of their securing employment with the NACA, and that PERL had never mentioned either name to CHOWLEY, nor had CROWLEY ever seen these individuals in the company of FERL.

At the Passport Division of the State Department, the following information was obtained concerning HENATETTA SAVIDGE PERL: She executed an application for a passport on March 1, 1951, at New York

City, in which she reflected her marriage to VILLIAM PERL as of October 21, 1950. FERL'S birthdate was given as August 1, 1918, at New York City. The application reflected her intention to depart from New York, May 29, 1951, on the S. S. Volendam for a four months stay in France, Switzerland, Italy, (possibly anglend) for the purpose of pleasure. The affidavit of identifying witness was executed by WILLIAM PERL, husband, who had known the applicant personally for seven years. The application reflected HENRIETTA Daviden name was HENRIETTA BOYD SAVIDGE, and her birthdate was March 3, 1916, at Indianapolis, Indiana. Her parents were listed as ALBERT CLINTON SAVIDGE and RUTH GEARHART SAVIDGE, the latter being deceased. The applicant's permanent residence address was noted to be 104 East 38th Street, New York City.

The file contained an undated letter, received Earch 7, 1951, in the Fessport Division from HENRIETTA PERL stating that she wished to cancel her application for a passport as, "I will be unable to make the trip as planned." No passport was issued to HENRIETTA PERL and the application was canceled as of March 7, 1951, it being noted that a \$9 fee was returned to the applicant. According to the file, the applicant had not previously been issued any passport.

on 4/16/51 DAVID GREENGLASS advised he recalls that while standing by the milling machine at Pitt Machine Products Inc., probably in September or October 1948, but possibly in the spring of 1948, he was having a conversation with JULIUS ROSENBERG and one or two others. The others were either BERNARD GREENGLASS or MORRIS ISRAEL or both. During this conversation JULIUS ROSENBERG mentioned that the mathematics had been all worked out for the construction of an atomic energy airplane motor. DAVID later asked JULIUS, in private, how JULIUS knew about this, and JULIUS told him he had learned about it from one of his boys. DAVID then asked JULIUS about the possibility of the pilot receiving radiation burns. JULIUS said this problem had been solved by placing the pilot and passengers far away from the shielded power plant.

DETAILS:

AT WASHINGTON, D. C.

Mr. FRFI) B. BRYANT was interviewed at David Taylor Model Basin, where he is presently employed, and advised that for approximately three or four months during the summer of 1939 he had shared an apartment with ARTHUR TIFFORD and WILLIAM PERL in Hampton, Virginia. He recalled the address as approximately 245 Newport News Avenue.

BRYANT stated that he met TIFFORD and PERL casually at Langley Field, and also had occasion to eat with them and other employees of the National Advisory Committee on Aeronautics at one of the few restaurants in Hampton, Virginia. During the course of general conversation, it was ascertained that all three of them were seeking an apartment. Consequently it was decided that it would be to their mutual advantage to procure one together.

BRYANT res of the opinion that TIFFORD, whom he believed to have been from New York, and subject had slightly more in common than he had, due possibly to the fact that both

were from New York. He advised that he had very little social contact with subject, that they were employed in different divisions at Langley Field, and that most of PERL's spare time which was spent in the apartment seemed to be taken up with studying.

BRYANT advised that he, himself, had been transferred to Washington, D. C. in the fall of 1939. Since that time he has had no contact or correspondence with subject. Mr. BRYANT stated that even in retrospect, he could not recall any actions or conversations on the subject's part which would indicate that his loyalty was questionable, or that he was at the time engaged in any activities of a subversive or questionable nature.

BRYANT had no knowledge of JULIUS ROSENBERG or MORTON SOBFLL, other than that which came to his attention during their recent trial on charges of espionage; he had never seen either of these individuals with PERL or at Langley Field, and cannot recall PFRL ever alluding to them in any way.

BRYANT knew of no visitors or contacts which PERL had at their apartment.

ROY COHN, AUSA, on April 25, 1951 brought in and showed me a letter he had received from one AARON RABINOWITZ, 551 Fifth Avenue. It's COHN advised that RABINOWITZ is the owner of Knickerbocker Village and that he is a very high type gentleman, who is completely anti-Communist. RABINOWITZ feels that there are many, and he stated several hundred, Communists or Communist sympathizers in Knickerbocker Village, who are known to himself and to his manager, one Mr. MURRAY. He would like to see somebody about this matter. He says that he has written a letter to Mr. DONEGAN, after he served on the Grand Jury, but that nothing has happened.

RABINOWITZ may be laboring under the impression that perhaps we could assign an agent to Knickerbocker Village, which, of course, we cannot do. However, during the course of the ROSENBERG investigation agents on your squad have had occasion to do some checking on people living in Knickerbocker Village. You fellows also know the area and the particular problem, and the case that has highlighted Knickerbocker Village.

In view of the prominence of RABINOWITZ, I would like to have an agent call RABINOWITZ and make an appointment to go see him in an effort to obtain whatever information he has.



DETAILS:

On April 9, 1951, Mrs. ELIZABETH HANES, Assistant to the Registrar, California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, California, advised that an examination of her records reflected that there was contained therein a graduate student file on the subject. Examination of this file reflected that the first correspondence contained therein was in November, 1945. At this time the subject addressed a communication to the Institute in which he made application for enrollment there as a graduate student. Examination of the material contained in the subject's file in addition to the aforementioned letter reflected that he gave no indication that he was previously acquainted with anyone on the Institute campus.



Mrs. Hanes, likewise, advised that the subject's course of study reflected that his time spent on the campus was in the Physics Department, which is physically somewhat separated from the Guggenheim Laboratory, which houses the feronautical Department. She advised further that ordinarily graduate students from the Physics Department would not be acquainted with studies conducted at the laboratory.


Doctor CLARK B. MILLIKAN, Professor of Aeronautics, Director of the Guggenheim Laboratory and the Cooperative Wind Tunnel, advised on April 12, 1951 that he had been Acting Director of the Guggenheim Laboratory and Cooperative Wind Tunnel during the entire war-time period and for a year or so thereafter before he was made permanent head of these two campus facilities.

He said that during this time, in his capacity as acting Director, he was reasonably conversat with all of the research being conducted and individuals who visited the Guggenheim Laboratory and Cooperative Wind Tunnel. MILLIKAN stated that when the subject's case received considerable publicity in local papers recently, that he had given the matter much thought but had not been able to recall that he had ever met the subject, nor had he known of any instance where he visited or did any work in either the Guggenheim Laboratory or the Cooperative wind Tunnel.

MILLIEAN, likewise, stated that he could recall no correspondence with the subject on any matter, and after a check of his files stated that his files, likewise, failed to reflect any such correspondence.

On April 12, 1951 VALDEMAR C. LARSON, JR., Administrator, Jet Propulsion Laboratory, California Institute of Technology, advised as follows:

During the war-time period the Jet Propulsion Laboratory, which was then commonly known as GALCIT, was concerned with considerable research in the field of Rocket Propulsion. He said, however, that this type of research was such that it had no particular application to Jet Propulsion, rather it concerned itself more in the field of Rocket Missles.



LARSON, after a check of his central files, advised that the Jet Propulsion Laboratory had no dealings with Consolidated Vultee Aircraft Company concerning the development of the XP-81. He, likewise, advised that these files reflected no correspondence on any subject with PARL.


On April 12, 1951 LD BEEHAN, Secretary of the fero Jet Engineering Company, Azusa, California, was interviewed at which time he related the following facts:

BEEHAN explained that the Aero Jet angineering Company was set up to some extent at least to produce pilot models which were developed at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory of the California Institute of Technology, then known as GalcIT. He went on to state that actually hero Jet angineering Company, during the pertinent period, produced only two types of products which had jet propulsion applications. These he described as special type of rockets which were used on pursuit ships to give them extra bursts of speed if needed. The other type, and perhaps the best known, is JATO.

This latter name is an abbreviation for Jet Assist Takeoff for Aircraft. Buthan described this as a system of rockets that assists heavily loaded airplanes in takeoff and thereby reduces the takeoff run considerably.

He explained that seldom, if ever, was the Aero Jet Engineering Company in possession of complete sets of plans for any aircraft, although on occasions they did have occasion to do so. With particular regard to the plans of the XP-81, developed at Consolidated Vultee Aircraft Company, he said he was positive that Aero Jet Engineering Company had never been furnished with the plans and specifications of this ship. BraHAN, likewise, advised after a search of his files that the company had no correspondence with the subject of this case with regard to the XP-81 or any other matter.

JGHN W. PARSONS was interviewed by reporting agent on April 12, 1951, at which time he was questioned as to whether he knew the subject of this case. PARSONS stated that the name meant nothing to him, and after viewing a photograph of the subject stated he was positive he had never met him.




PARSONS advised that while he was associated with the Acro Jet Engineering Company, he was in correspondence with numerous individuels concerning JATO but that to the best of his recollection he had no such correspondence with the subject of this case.

PARSONS advised that he was generally familiar with XP-81 as a result of his having read of it in technical journals, and that he was certain he had no occasion to review the plans and specifications thereof during the time he was associated with hero Jet Engineering Company. PARSONS added that he seldom, if ever, saw the plans and specifications of experimental aircraft in that he spent his time solely on the development of JATO, which is considered to be, for the most part, his own invention.

At the time Doctor MILLIKAN supplied the information " set forth elsewhere in this report, he advised that in early 1942 Doctor THEODORE VON KARNAN was placed on leave of absence from the Institute and spent his full time as a consultant for the Air Porce. He said it was at this time that he, MILLIKAN, was appointed Acting Director of the Guggenheim Laboratory and Cooperetive Wind Tunnel. MILLIKAN added that after VON KARMAN was placed on a leave of absence by the Institute that he seldom, if ever, was at the laboratory. In instances when he did return he, MILLIKAN, worked rather closely with him while he was at the leboratory and he was, therefore, reasonably conversant with the individuals who contacted him. MILLIKAN stated that he has no recollection that VON KARMAN had any contact with the subject prior to the time that the subject become VCN KARMAN's assistent, when the latter was ecting as a visiting professor in the Physics Department at Columbia University.

At the time BEEHAN was interviewed, the results of which are set forth hereinbefore, he advised that he was familiar with the fact that the subject had acted in the capacity of an assistant to VON KARMAN while the latter was at Columbia University. He said, however, that he was frequently in contact with VON KARMAN during 1942 - 1945 in that he was one of the original founders of the Aero Jet Engineering Company. He advised that it had never some to his attention during this period that PERL and VON KARMAN were acquainted or had any contact.



JOHN W. PARSONS, at the time he was interviewed, said that he had considerable contect with VON KARMAN in the early days of the development of rocket propulsion and more particular in the founding days of the Aero Jet Engineering Company. He advised during this time it had never come to his attention that PERI, knew VON KARMAN or that these individuals had any contact whatsoever.

Agent, testified in the recent New York espionage trial that, sometime during 1948, Julius Posenberg told him he, Rosenberg, had the mathematics on the problem of atomic energy for airclanes which problem had just been completed by the scientists. At the time of subsequent interview of Greenglass, it was learned that this statement was probably made to him by Rosenberg in September or October, 1948, but there was the possibility the information may have been received in the Spring of that year.

In addition, you are advised that Jerome Eugene Tartakow, a fellow prisoner with Rosenberg in the Federal House of Detention in New York City, has reported certain information which he claims to have received through his conversations with Rosenberg. According to Tartako:, Posenberg recently advised him that Ferl had furnished him (Rosenberg) much valuable information, including the plans for the use of nuclear fission to propel airplanes. He also stated that Rosenberg told him Ferl was a brilliant man in the field of aerodynamics and that some of the material furnished to him (Rosenberg) by Ferl was "terrific."

As a result of the aforementioned statement by Greenglass, an inquiry has been made of AEC as to the exact nature of the information to which Communication may have made reference in his conversation with Greenglass. As a result thereof, it was learned that the material undoubtedly pertained to the highly confidential North (Nuclear inergy Propulsion of Aircraft) froject. It was further indicated that the mathematics pertaining to the project would undoubtedly refer to the mathematics of the power plant in the INA Project. According to ACC, the final report on the NEPA Project, this is an an as the "Lexington Report" and was entitled "Euclear Power Plant," was completed on September 30, 1950. It was learned that Chapter III of this report concerned "power plants" and that the mathematical

analysis of a nuclear power plant appeared in a supplemental report entitled "Appendices to Chapter III - Power Plants, Nuclear-Powered Flight." The AEC has advised that all of the aforementioned reports pertaining to the NEPA Project were then and are now classified secret.

Pursuant to a request by the Bureau, the AEC is presently making a routine security check to determine the initial and original distribution that was made with respect to the "Lexington Report," as well as the present location of all copies of this report, including the copies of the appendices to Chapter III. For your information and assistance in connection with the hereinafter requested investigation, there is being attached hereto a copy of the letter which was received from AEC dated March 30, 1951, together with its various enclosures.

You will note in Appendix E of the reference AEC letter there appear the names of the technical personnel of the Lexington Project. This list contains the name of one Addison M. Rothrock of NACA, who was indicated as having been on loan to AEC. It will also be noted that Appendix G of this referenced communication indicates that, im July and August, 1949, Abe Silverstein and E. J. Manganiello of NACA, Cleveland, were consulted by Lexington Project personnel relative to the power plants in the NEPA Project.

Inasmuch as a provious inquiry by the Cleveland division at NACA Lowis Flight Propulsion Laboratory, Cleveland, Chio, has reflected that Rothrock, Silverstein, and Manganiello were all employees at that laboratory during 1948, it would be of interest to determine exactly what information pertaining to the mathematics of the power plant with respect to the NECA Project was available to the NACA Imboratory in Cleveland during this period, as well as the approximate dates when such material was available there.

To this end, the Washington Field division is requested to thoroughly interview Addison Fothrock, who was reported as having handled the lisison for WACA between Cleveland and Sashington, D. C. It is also

requested that the Claveland division similarly interview Dr. Abe Silverstein, who was the technical director of this program at KACA, Cleveland, and Eugene J. Manganiello, who was directly connected with the development of the program at that laboratory. During the course of these interviews, it should be specifically determined what reports as to the mathematics of the power plants pertaining to the NEPA Project were available, the approximate dates, and in whose custody such reports were maintained. Further, these persons should be questioned as to whother the appendix to Chapter III of the Lexington Report was in the possession of the NACA Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory, Cleveland, either in rough draft form or as a finished report, and, if so, the date this report was available and in whose custody it was maintained. They should be directly interrogated as to the possibility of any such information pertaining to the NEPA or Lexington Projects being available to William Perl.

For the information of the Detroit division, it was ascertained at NACA, Cleveland, that Alfred R. Bobrowsky, a former employee of NACA, performed the analytical work on shielding and was also engaged in material studies for the project. Further, that his report on the method of computation for the shielding was distributed, after being reduced to report form. According to the Bureau's information, one of the principal drambacks to the production of the plane involved in the NEPA Project was the excessive weight caused by the shielding surrounding the source of nuclear energy which, it night be noted, was apparently the phase of the work assigned to Bobrowsky. It has been pointed out to the Bureau that, in view thereof, such information would have been of considerable value to any person interested in the project, since it could avert unnecessary research and experimentation.

The Detroit division was previously authorized to interview Bobrowsky concerning "illiam Porl by Bureau letter of January 15, 1951. This interview should immediately be conducted by experienced agents of that office, and full information should be obtained from him as to the nature of the work he performed on the NEPA Project, the identity of the

NACA employees who may have assisted him in the work, the types of the report or reports which he prepared and the approximate dates thereof, and the availability of such reports to other employees at NACA, particularly William Perl. During this interview, the extent of his association with Perl should be ascertained, as well as any information which he might have concerning the participation of or his discussion with Perl concerning the NEPA Project.

The Cleveland office should also ascertain further information as to the nature and exact dates of all reports known to have been submitted by Bobrowsky as a result of his research in the NEFA Project, together with any available information as to the possible access of Perl to such reports.

This matter should be given expeditious attention, in view of the ininence of the trial of Perl for perjury in SDNY, which is tentatively set for the early part of May, 1951.
