

JEROME EUGENE TARTAKOW INFORMANT

TARTAKOW was interviewed at the Federal House of Detention on June 17, 1951, by the writer, and he advised that he was being released on Sunday, June 10, 1951.

TARTAKOW stated that upon his release he is travelling to Bridgeport, Connecticut, with his family and that he expects to return to New York City on Tuesday evening. He stated that he would call the New York Office and contact either SA NORTON or SA HARRINGTON and arrange for an interview with them.

TARTAKOW advised that he had received word that his wife is coming East to live with him, and he stated hopes to find an apartment and set up a home. TARTAKOW stated that he would be agreeable to a gift in the form of a monetary remuneration for his past services, but that he was in no way inclined to accept pay for any possible help he might be to the Bureau in the future.

TARTAKOW advised that he had some information which he is sure would be of value to the Bureau, and stated that he would furnish this information to SAS NORTON and HARRINGTON when he sees them.

The Rosenberg and Sobell espionage trial was the culmination of the concentrated and cooperative efforts of a group of Special Agents. Confessions were obtained from admitted Soviet espionage agents who became completely cooperative in implicating friends and relatives. In one instance, a reluctant witness against NONTON SOBELL became more cooperative and testified against SOBELL when an examination of postmarks on two envelopes located in Washington, D.C. disclosed that at least two letters to SOBELL'S relatives had been relied in the vicinity of the citness' residence in Now York City. The F.B.I. Laboratory was able to show that the envelopes were in the witness' handwriting, thus securing

from him an admission that he was a mail drop for SOBELL whon the latter fled to Hexico.

In another instance, an informant advised that the ROSENBERGS had had passport photos taken in contemplation of fleeing the country. The entire area of the Lower East Side of Hanhattan was systematically canvassed by P.B.I. Agents in an effort to locate a passport photographer who might have made such photographs for the ROSENBERGS. Such a passport photographer was located in the vicinity of Brooklyn Bridge, who testified in rebuttal at the trial that JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife and children had had passport photographs taken for a trip to Europe. This testimony apparently had great weight in destroying the creditility of the ROSENBERGS on the witness stand since they had previously categorically denied taking such photographs.





# BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The files of Confidential Informant T-1, another Government Agency, which conducts Intelligence Investigations, reflected on January 21, 1947, that the subject, under the name MORRIS SAVITSKY, was given a probational appointment as an engineering draftsman (electrical) on March 10, 1941, at the New York Naval Shipyards, Brocklyn, New York, and that he was released from the Navy Yard on July 2, 1945, on military furlough. He was inducted into the United States Navy on July 3, 1945, and was honorably discharged on May 7, 1946, at which time he resided at 61 Hanson Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. SaVITSKY was re-employed by the New York Naval Shipyards on May 29, 1946, at which

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time he indicated that his name was changed by court order to MORRIS SAVITT. He resigned from the New York Naval Shipyards on April 11, 1947, to accept a better position.

## COMMUNIST ACTIVITY

# Branch 16-B. Industrial Division, Communist Party

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised on March 15, 1944, that the following individuals had been transferred from the Branch 16-B, Industrial Division of the Communist Party:

JULIUS ROSENBERG, 10 Monroe Street, New York City; SOL TANENBAUM, 116 Second Avenue, New York City; AL SARANT, 46 Monroe Street, New York City; NAT SUSSMAN, 43-09 - 47th Avenue, Sunnyside, Long Island, New York; GERTRUDE SUSSMAN, 43-09 - 47th Avenue, Sunnyside, Long Island, New York; JOEL BARR, 241 West 97th Street, New York City; MORRIS SAVITSKY, 61 Harrison Avenue, Brooklyn, New York; SHIRLEY SAVITSKY, 61 Harrison Avenue, Brooklyn, New York; MARTY HAMBERGER, 42 Ridge Street, New York City.

Concerning the subject, T-2 advised that SAVITSKY was transferred in February, 1944, under Transfer No. 12184 from the Branch 16-B, Industrial Division, Communist Party, to the 4th AD Club of the Williamsburg Section of the Kings County Communist Party.

Concerning the aforementioned members of the 16-B Branch, Industrial Division of the Communist Party, it should be noted that JULIUS ROSENBERG, and his wife, ETHEL ROSENBERG were convicted in Federal Court, in New York City, on March 29, 1951, for conspiracy to commit espionage.

Investigation concerning ALFRED SARANT and JOEL BARR has indicated they were involved in espionage activities and have fled the jurisdiction of the United States.

ISRAEL L. TANNENBAUM, 409 East 21st Street, Brooklyn, New York, advised SAS ROBERT F. ROYAL and BERT S. TAYLOR, on March 27, 1951, that he had been active in the Young Communist League at Cooper Union Institute and had subsequently joined a Communist Party group whose name or designation he could not recall.

TANNENBAUM stated that this group was a study or discussion group and all meetings that he could recall attending were held at the home of JULIUS ROSENBERG on the Lower East



Side of New York City and that ROSENBERG was usually Chairman of the group.

TANNENBAUM advised that this Communist Party group was more or less a secret group due to the fact that most of the members were Federal Civil Service employees, and they were admonished not to engage in any mass activity which would call attention to their Communist Party membership.

TANNENBAUM recognized the photographs of JULIUS ROSENBERG and ETHEL ROSENBERG, JOEL BARR, AL SERANT, and NATHAN SUSSMAN, and recalled the name of MORRIS SAVITSKY, as members of this Communist Party group.

NATHAN SUSSMAN, 56-55 - 205th Street, Bayside, New York, advised SAS BERT S. TAYLOR and ROBERT F. ROYAL that MORRIS and SHIRLEY SAVITSKY, had attended meetings of Branch 16-B, Industrial Division of the Communist Party, which meetings were held at the home of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, 10 Monroe Street, New York City.

On March 30, 1951, NATHAN SUSSMAN advised SA ROBERT F. ROYAL that MORRIS and SHIRLEY SAVITSKY were present at a farewell party of Branch 16-B, Industrial Division, Communist Party, which was held in 1944 at Bonat's Restaurant, located at 32d or 33d Streets between Eighth and Ninth Avenues, New York City.

GERTRUDE SUSSMAN, wife of NATHAN SUSSMAN, 56-55 205th Street, Bayside, New York, was interviewed on November 29, 1950, by SAS JAMES T. C'BRIEN and CHARLES P. SILVER-THORN. Mrs. SUSSMAN advised that MORRIS SAVITSKY, an engineer, who had lived in a housing project and had been employed at the Brooklyn Navy Yard, was a visitor to the home of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. She could not state definitely if SAVITSKY was a Communist Party member but remarked that since the rest of the individuals visiting the ROSENBERG were Communists, SAVITSKY must have been a member also.

On March 20, 1951, Mrs. SUSSMAN advised SAS BERT S. TAYLOR and ROBERT F. ROYAL that she recalled the attendance of MORRIS SAVITSKY and his wife at three meetings of the Branch 16-B, Industrial Division, Communist Party, which meetings were held at the home of NATHAN SUSSMAN'S parents, 103 Eldridge Street, New York City, and at the home of JULIUS ROSENBERG, 10 Monroe Street, New York City.



According to Mrs. SUSSMAN, these meetings were held late in 1943 and the early part of 1944. She stated that this Communist Party group broke up in approximately February, 1944, at which time Communist Party transfer cards were issued to each member.

MARTIN HAMBURGER, 420 West 121st Street, New York City, advised SAS ROBERT F. ROYAL and BERT S. TAYLOR on March 23, 1951, that he had been invited by MORRIS SAVITSKY to attend meetings of a "discussion club" or "study club" in his neighborhood in the Lower East Side section of New York City, in the fall of 1943. HAMBURGER stated that he can recall attending only two or three meetings of this group, and that he was unable to recall where these meetings were held.

HAMBURGER added that it was quite possible that the meetings were held in the home of NATHAN SUSSMAN. He stated that he could recall one meeting of the discussion group which was devoted to a discussion from the Marxist point of view on Thomas Jefferson.

HAMBURGER stated that MORRIS SAVITSKY was in attendance at these meetings of the discussion group and that he had also known SAVITSKY as a fellow member of a social club known as the Arts and Crafts Studio, which was located on Grand Street, New York City, during the period of 1942 to 1945.

HAMBURGER stated that he was unable to identify this "discussion group" as the 16-B Club of the Industrial Division of the Communist Party since he had never paid dues to anyone and that any transfer out of the club had been made without his knowledge or consent. He stated that he had received mail from the 4th AD Club of the Communist Party and that this could have been the result of his having been transferred out of the Industrial Section, but that he had ignored such mail and had never taken any further part in any Communist activity.

HENRY NATHAN SHOIKET, on March 27, 1951, advised agents of the Scattle Office that he knew MORRIS SAVITSKY as an engineer in the Brooklyn Navy Yard and as a fellow member of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians.



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SHOIKET stated that he may have eaten lunch with SAVITSKY on one or two occasions, and he denied knowledge that SAVITSKY was a member of the Communist Party.

It should be noted that NATHAN SUSSMAN has identified HENRY NATHAN SHOIKET as a member of the Branch 16-B, Industrial Division of the Communist Party and that SAVITSKY had visited SHOIKET at SHOIKET'S home in the Astoria Section of Queens County, New York, in 1941 or 1942.

# 4th AD Club, Kings County Communist Party

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised on May 5, 1944, that MORRIS SAVITSKY was a member of the 4th AD Club of the Kings County Communist Party.

## Carlson Club, No. 2, Communist Party

SEYMOUR NEWMAN, 1840 Tenbroeck Avenue, Bronx, New York, in a signed statement furnished on May 3, 1948, to SAS JOHN M. COLLINS and ARTHUR E. DOOLEY, advised that he joined the Communist Party on May 1, 1942, and became in 1945 or 1946, a member of the Carlson Club, No. 2, of the Communist Party, which was composed of professional and white-collar workers employed at the Brooklyn Navy Yard.

NEWMAN advised that as of the summer of 1947, MORRIS SAVITSKY was a member of the Carlson Club, No. 2, of the Communist Party. NEWMAN identified SAVITSKY as an individual who lated changed his name to SAVITT and who had lived in the Williamsburg section of Brooklyn, New York, and who, in 1948, was no longer an employee of the Brooklyn Navy Yard.

NEWMAN advised that he was willing to repeat the foregoing information by public testimony at any time.

# Young Communist League .

The Young Communist League has been declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of executive order #9835.

DAVID H. PESSIN, 2135 Washington Avenue, Bronx, New York, advised Sh VARRO L. RITTER on September 18, 1950, that in 1937, or in 1938, at which time he was a student at





the College of the City of New York, MCRRIS SAVITSKY who was also a student at the College, had requested him to join the Young Communist League to which SAVITSKY belonged. SAVITSKY stated that at the time of his approach to PESSIN, that PESSIN "would be surprised at the number of the College of the City of New York students who were members of the Young Communist League."

PESSIN stated that at that time, SAVITSKY resided in the Lower East Side section of New York City, near Delancey Street, and that in 1941, SAVITSKY was employed at the Brooklyn Navy Yard and that he had been drafted into the Armed Forces and had later returned to the Navy Yard in about 1945.

PESSIN stated that in 1946, SAVITSKY moved to Albany, New York, to work on a state project near or in Albany, New York.

MILTON MANES, 356 Rock Hill Road, Bridgeville, Pennsylvania, advised agents of the Pittsburgh Office on May 28, 1951, that he had joined a College of the City of New York Chapter of the Young Communist League around January of 1937, and that he continued membership in that group until June of 1937, when he graduated and moved to Washington, D. C.

MANES stated that he was a member of a group of engineering and chemistry students known as "engineering group" of the Young Communist League. Among a list of individuals named by MANES as either engineering or chemistry students who were active members of the engineering group of the College of the City of New York's Young Communist League Chapter, and who attended three or four meetings of the group in 1937, was an individual named SAVITSKY whose full name could not be recalled by MANES.

MANES stated that he was unable to furnish any other information concerning SAVITSKY but that the meetings of the Young Communist League Chapter, which he had mentioned, had been held in 1937, at a hall in the vicinity of Union Square, New York City, which hall was owned by some Italian national organization friendly with the Communist Party.





It should be noted that among others named by MANES were JULIUS ROSENBERG, NAT SUSSMAN, and NAT SHOIKET, all of whom have been previously reported as members of the Branch 16-B Club of the Communist Party.

## Miscellaneous

EINO LAHTONEN, 939 Dawson Street, Bronx, New York, a former student at the College of the City of New York, advised SA RAYMOND J. RUCKEL on September 26, 1950, that MORRIS SAVITSKY, who graduated from the College of the City of New York, either in January or June of 1939, had approached him while both were students at the College of the City of New York, in an attempt to persuade LAHTONEN to join the Communist Party.

LAHTONEN stated that he could not recall the exact date this attempt was made by SAVITSKY, but that to the best of his recollection, it had occurred in the spring after LEHTONEN had been elected to the Cm Alpha Pi Fraternity.

LAHTONEN stated that he did not join the Communist Party and that he was unable to recall any of SaVITSKY'S friends or associates at the College of the City of New York, or furnish any additional information concerning SAVITSKY.

It should be noted that Dean JAMES S. PEASE of the College of the City of New York, advised in August, 1950, that SAVITSKY had graduated from the College of the City of New York, with an engineering degree in June, 1939.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised in 1944, that the subject was on the mailing list of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians.

It should also be recalled that NATHAN SHOIKET identified SAVITSKY as a fellow member of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians.





Concerning the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians, the "New York Journal American" in its issue of March 20, 1942, reflects that on March 21, 1941, Representative DIES spoke in the House of Representatives and stated: "I wish to bring to the attention of the House, another case of Communist leadership in a C. I. O. Union, which operates in some of our vital industries." Naming MARCEL SCHERER, National Organizer of the Foderation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians, as a member of the Communist Party, DIES added: "SCHERER is by no means the only Communist who occupies a leading position in the important union of technical men. In fact, the union as a whole, is under the complete domination of the Communist Party. Other leaders and active members of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists, and Technicians have been identified with the Communist Party or with Communist controlled front organizations."

The following description of the subject was obtained from Confidential Informant T-5, another Government Agency which maintains personnel records and from DAVID H. PESSIN, 2135 Washington Avenue, Bronx, New York:


