

By letter dated Nov. 27, 1991 George P. Murdock, Professor of Anthropology, Institute of Human relations, Yale University, substituted to this office literature distributed by the above captioned committee which listed its address as 17 Furray St., New York 7, New York.

This literature consisted of a letter which was dated lov. 21, 1971 and which was simed, ". Iblin" B. HEUTEN, Provisional Chairman" and was adoressed, "Dear Triend". This letter requested contributions to be forwarded to the above mentioned committee and stated that the ROSINEERS case was likened to the Dreyfus and the Sacco-Vanzetti CFEES.

Attached to this letter, which was mimeographed, was a mineographed statement which decried the conviction of the ROSENBERGS. among the signers of this letter were Dr. JOHN MARSALMA and Dr. GEME WELTHISH.

Dr. MURDOCK, in his letter of transmittal, advised that he knew Pr. MPRSALKA slightly and mentioned that the only member of the Committee whom he knew really well was Dr. WELTFISH. MURDOCK remarked that he had every reason to believe that WELTFISH was a "confirmed Communist".

The New Loven Office is origin in the case entitled "JCHN PAUL MYLAM MAPSALKA - JS-C". MARSALKA is National President of the American Slav Congress which has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

It is to be noted that the signature of Dr. JOHN MAYSALKA was typewritten on this miseographed release, while the names of the other seven individuals to reincographed. It might be that Dr. MARSALKA is the person to the for distributing these locally.



Informant advised today that he had been in touch with NAOMI BROTHMAN on 12/8/51. She advised him that she had sent a money order to Emanuel BLOCH'for \$100.00 under a fictitious name. She advised that she put a note in the envelope telling MANNY "This is part of money I promised I would send you."

Informant called BLOCH and told him that he should expect the money order from BROTHMAN.

On 12/11/51, BLOCH told informant that he had received the money order from BROTHMAN and that he was putting the money in a legal fee fund and not in the fund being raised by the National Committee to Free the Rosenbergs.

On 12/12/51, informant went down to BLOCH'S house and BLOCH gave him a copy of his brief. BLOCH told him that he had collected about \$3,000.00 and that money was still coming in. He told informant that they had a headquarters in the Guardian Building, 17 Murray Street, New York City, with one full time employee.

BLOCH asked informant if he would be willing to spend about two nights a week helping to address envelopes and send out literature for the Committee. Informant stated that he would give as much time as he could. BLOCH advised informant that they had not as yet obtained a National Chairman for the Committee and that he was still looking around to find a reputable person.

Informant stated that during this visit, BLOCH discussed the ROSENBERG appeal and BLOCH read part of his brief. Informant stated that it appeared to him that BLOCH had lost a great deal of his enthusiasm for the case and he discussed the appeal with an air of "resignation."

Informant advised that he has been in touch with BLOCH by telephone a number of times, but that he has not been down to see him since the last visit. Informant stated that he had made a tentative appointment to BLOCH'S house on the eve of 12/24/51.
