

.My enemy No. 1

From a newspaper of Barcelona, "Universal News", dated August 14, 1953, I learned that you were very happy with your job of executioner, but that you presented your irrevocable resignation. What caused you to do that? Your conscience? You had no peace? How could you have, criminal enemy, with 237 executions on your conscience: How could your conscience be at peace when you have killed 237 fathers of families! And their children cry out to heaven and to God against you who are the criminal no. 1 of the world. You can be nothing else in this wicked world. Your two children, your new (?) wife, and all those close to you call you criminal. Even the whole world hates you, detests you! You should not have resigned; you should have committed suicide, as ----- (?). Your own children must hate you, when they think for a moment of the 237 crimes which their detested father has committed. Among them were many innocent people, like the Rosenbergs. Even though they were traitors to their country, they were not criminals like you. No: Who authorizes you, a criminal, to execute human beings? The high officials of a nation have no right to do that. Only God, the Supreme Being, has that right. Material men, no, never! God gives life and is the only one who can take it away. No matter how much power men have, they have no right to take anyone's life. You have your jails, your prisons, your concentration camps, in which to keep those who are guilty of high treason to the fatherland, criminals, thieves. Allof these can be kept in these places until the end of their days. Death should not exist among the human race, and even less in a strong government, which considers itself civilized. Do not believe it. A conscience like that: Criminal enemy! 237 executions and their loved ones are calling for vengeance. Even the greater part of the human race calls for it with all their hearts: Do not forget these two innocent children of the Rosenbergs, and the other innocents who have been abandoned by their parents. They will always ask for revenge against the criminal who killed their beloved parents. Joseph Francell, there is only one recourse for your conscience -- suicide, death by poisoning. I ask for it and so does humanity.



PALLOR that he had attended the Tastern Seaboard Conference" of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, which was held on Sunday, 8/15/53, at the Hotel Ansonia, 75th Street and Broadway, New York, N. Y. The informant had been unable to attend the Saturday, 8/15/53, session of this conference because of personal reasons.


