For your information and assistance in connection with the interrogation of Fuchs, there are enclosed herewith a letter from the Atomic Energy Commission, dated May 19, 1950, and its enclosures entitled "Evaluation of Fuchs Case by Committee of Senior Responsible Reviewers" and "Fuchs' Participation in the Thermomuclear Weapon Program at Los Alamos," all of which are classified Secret.

You will note that the Committee of Senior Responsible Reviewers raises several questions in its report, most of which are of a technical nature. It will not be necessary that you endeavor to obtain the answers to these technical questions, as this has been undertaken by the Atomic Energy Commission. You should, however, attempt to determine from Fuchs whether he turned over to the Russians the document designated "XSH-18," and in general terms the extent of his disclosures, as, for example, whether he furnished any information concerning the Hanford Plant or other phases of the United States project.

Mr. Jack Neal of the State Department called on Saturday afternoon, May 13, and advised that the State Department had forwarded to Mr. Peyton Ford's office a reply to the latest memorandum from the Department relative to the restrictions on interviewing Fuchs.

Subsequently, on the same afternoon, Mr. Peyton Ford called and advised that he had been informed by Mr. Webb that a reply had been sent to the Department but that he, Ford, had not seen it as yet. He stated further that he understood that this reply basically approved the interview and had lifted the restrictions; that he, Mr. Ford, thought even though there were some slight restrictions it might be desirable to conduct the interview as soon as possible.

In this regard he pointed out that Senator McMahon is getting mad and has indicated that he might make a speech; that this could be highly undesirable because of the effect it might have on Anglo-American relations.

I told Peyton Ford that of course the Bureau could not yet decide what steps it was going to take until we had received the reply in writing in order that we might study it and determine whether it in fact does lift the restrictions.

1. We will give it prompt attention when received.
2. Start at once to find out if Fuchs will consent to interview if we decide to conduct it.

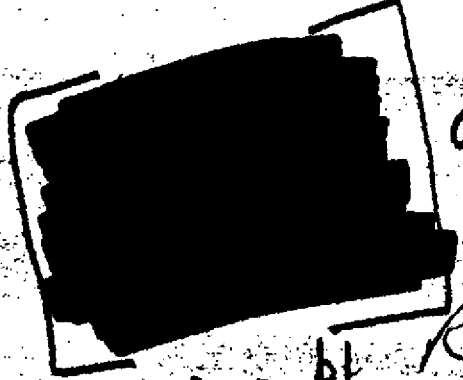

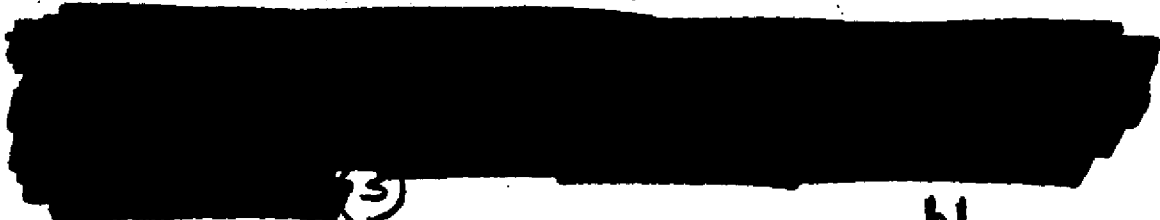

2a. We have no information as to what part the purity of the metallic element, calcium, has in the nuclear study.

2b. Gallium is a metallic element which has been studied as a possible material used as an alloy with uranium.

2c. "Piles" are the reactors built to control the rate of fission of nuclear materials.

2d. The gaseous diffusion process is a means of separating the isotopes of uranium to recover radioactive U235. The function of the barrier is to separate the desired isotopes in the gaseous diffusion process.

Questions Asked on March 10, 1950

2d. "Heavy Water Reactors." Heavy water has the same formula as ordinary water, H2O, but the hydrogen is an isotope with twice the weight of ordinary hydrogen and heavy water is also known as deuterium oxide. The heavy water in the reactors is used to control the speed of neutrons.

5. "Pu" is the symbol for plutonium.

6. "Tritium bomb" refers to the hydrogen bomb, tritium being an isotope of hydrogen.

10. The "Em process" probably refers to the electromagnetic method of separation of the isotopes of uranium.

13. The exact significance of "delta phase plutonium" is not known but it probably refers to the calculations on the rate of formation of plutonium.

14. The mixed bomb unquestionably refers to the use of more than one fissionable material in the same bomb such as a mixture of U235 and plutonium.

16. "Pile lattice" refers to spacing and general configuration of the nuclear material in a pile.

19. The purpose of the solvent extraction is not known but probably refers to one step in the production which is used for purification of one of the materials.

22. Plating process employed for coating weapon components is a method for placing a very thin film of nickel on weapon parts as a protective coating for the parts.

24. This question pertains to the calculations in the study of using the light non-metallic elements such as hydrogen in the protection of an atom bomb.

On the afternoon of May 24, 1950, ASAC Whelan, of the New York Office, advised that Elizabeth Bentley had called the office to state that she had received a number of telephone calls from members of the press inquiring as to her knowledge of Harry Gold. One reporter asked her to what she testified before the Federal Grand Jury, to which she replied that such a question was an insult to her intelligence as anyone appearing before the Grand Jury was forbidden to talk concerning the testimony given by him.

I pointed out to Mr. Whelan that the fact that Golos had handled Harry Gold and had also handled Elizabeth Bentley, and it was known that Harry Gold had been before the Grand Jury in connection with the Gregory Case, had undoubtedly caused newspapermen to contact Bentley for any information she might have. I pointed out that the way she was handling this seemed to be sound and I saw no reason for either her or the New York Office to be concerned about it; that inasmuch as Bentley had said she did not know Gold, there was no reason for her to be concerned about newspaper inquiries.

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Relative to a prosecutive summary on Harry Gold, Mr. Whelan advised that it does not appear to be the appropriate time to prepare such a summary, inasmuch as there are numerous leads to be covered to corroborate Gold's story and these leads should be covered in order that they may be included in the prosecutive summary. He advised that New York is closing the case on "Unsub [redacted]" and opening a file on Harry Gold, was., and preparing a report reflecting available information in such a manner that the report can be disseminated with no mention of "Unsub [redacted]" or [redacted] in the title. I advised him this was correct and that he should call the Philadelphia Office and instruct that that office likewise should prepare an immediate report reflecting all developments on Gold in that area, including the interview and developments thereafter. I again stressed that it was necessary to cover all leads immediately and that we should not wait to set out leads by report but should handle this by telephone or teletype. 2.6.87

My dear Admiral:

I believe the President and you will no doubt be interested in information concerning Harry Gold who has been identified as the individual who received atomic information from Dr. Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs in the United States for transmittal to the Soviet Union.

Harry Gold was born December 12, 1910, in Switzerland. In 1914 he came to the United States with his parents, Sam and Gelia Golodnitsky, both of whom were born in Russia. At the time of their naturalization as United States citizens their name was changed to Gold. Harry Gold claims citizenship by derivation through his parents. His mother is deceased. Harry Gold resides with his father and his brother, Joseph Gold, at 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Shortly after arriving in the United States the Gold family moved to Philadelphia, where, in 1929, Harry Gold became employed by the Pennsylvania Sugar Company in their laboratories. He continued his employment with this company until about February, 1946, at which time he became employed with A. Brothman Associates, Consulting Engineers, New York City. He left this firm in June, 1948. He presently is employed at the Philadelphia General Hospital and is a Civil Service employee of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. At the hospital he is engaged in the laboratory doing research in connection with serious cardiac cases.

Gold received his education attending night school at the Drexel Institute, the University of Pennsylvania, and Columbia University. In 1938 he obtained leave of absence from the Pennsylvania Sugar Company to attend Ohio State University, Cincinnati, Ohio, where he received a Bachelor of Science Degree summa cum laude in 1940.

Gold first came to the attention of this Bureau in connection with the activities of Abraham Brothman, concerning whom Elisabeth F. Bentley furnished information. In a signed statement dated November 30, 1948, Bentley advised that in about May, 1940, she was introduced to Brothman, whose photograph she identified, as "Max Gold," her Soviet espionage superior.

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She stated that Golos told her that Brothman would furnish her with certain blueprints. Following that she met with Brothman about ten times in the summer of 1940 until the fall of that year, and obtained blueprints from him for Golos. She said that in the fall of 1940 Golos claimed to have become disgusted with Brothman and told her he was turning Brothman over to someone else.

As a result of this information an investigation of Brothman was conducted, which resulted in an interview of Brothman on May 29, 1947. At first Brothman denied recognizing the name or photograph of Golos. Upon being shown a photograph of Bentley, which he identified as a person whom he knew as "Helen," he then admitted that he did recognize the photograph of Golos.

Brothman related that some time in 1938 or 1939 Golos had come to his office at 114 East 52nd Street, New York City, and advised Brothman that he had contacts with the Russian Government, by reason of which he was in a position to obtain contracts from that government for Brothman if Brothman would turn over to him blueprints of certain products on which Brothman was working at the time. Brothman advised that the blueprints in question were his own property. He said Golos visited his office on several occasions thereafter until Golos introduced him to "Helen." Golos advised that "Helen" would thereafter obtain the blueprints. "Helen" visited Brothman's office over a dozen times during 1938, 1939, and 1940. Some time in 1940 she stopped coming and another individual named Harry Gold appeared at Brothman's office and said that he represented Golos. Thereafter Gold visited Brothman's office on a number of occasions during 1940 and 1941, and obtained blueprints from Brothman. He said the last time Gold picked up the blueprints, according to the best of his recollection, was late in 1941 or early 1942. He was emphatic in stating that Gold was the last individual to pick up any blueprints or material for Golos. He stated that Harry Gold was, at the time of the interview, namely May 29, 1947, employed by him as a chemist in his laboratory at Kilmuret, Long Island. A signed statement to this effect was obtained from Brothman.

Upon receiving the information about Gold from Brothman, Gold was interviewed the same day at A. Brothman Associates Laboratory, 8503-57th Avenue, Kilmuret, Long Island. Gold related in substance that he had met Jacob Golos in October, 1940, at a meeting of the American Chemical Society at the Franklin Institute, Philadelphia. At this time Golos propositioned Gold, saying that he had connections with individuals in a foreign country, not naming the country, and also had connections with Abraham Brothman in

New York who was turning over certain blueprints. Geles told Gold that he required the services of a chemist to go to New York City, obtain the blueprints from Brothman, and then evaluate them on a chemical basis. Gold stated that about two weeks after this, in November, 1940, he contacted Brothman in New York City and introduced himself as a representative of Geles. For the next six months he made visits to New York City on the average of every three weeks to obtain blueprints from Brothman. He said that during this period he received four or five telephone calls from Geles, who always stated that they would have to get together very soon, but that actually this never happened. He said the last telephone call from Geles was in May, 1941, after which time he had no further word from Geles. He denied that he ever had seen Geles except on the occasion when he met him in October, 1940. Gold claimed that after his second or third trip to New York City Brothman became friendly and exhibited an interest in Gold's career as a chemist. He said that ever since that time Brothman had been interested in having Gold join Brothman's organization, but that it was not until February, 1940, that he could see his way clear to accept such employment, which he did at that time. Gold denied any financial agreement with Geles, and claimed he never received a cent from Geles. He insisted that he stood the expenses for the trips to New York City on the first two occasions, after which Brothman became friendly and furnished him a five-dollar bill to cover expenses. A signed statement to this effect was obtained from Gold.

On July 22 and 31, 1947, Abraham Brothman and Harry Gold, respectively, were called before the Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York. Both testified in substance before this Grand Jury to that which they had furnished on interview. The investigation of the Grand Jury concerning the charges of Elizabeth T. Bentley culminated in the finding of a "no bill."

After extensive and intensive investigation which developed information indicating that Harry Gold was very probably the United States contact of Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs, he was interviewed at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and on May 22, 1950, he furnished a signed statement admitting espionage activity. He admitted that he began the procurement of industrial information for the Soviet Union in the fall of 1938, and continued this activity until 1943, except for the period from 1938 to 1940 while he attended Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Gold advised that very early in 1944 his then superior made arrangements for him to meet Dr. Klaus Fuchs in New York City. This first meeting occurred on a Saturday afternoon in February or March, 1944, on the East Side of Manhattan, from where they took a cab uptown to a restaurant around Third Avenue in the 80's, possibly Mummy Wolf's Restaurant. Following the dinner they walked about and completed arrangements for further meetings. Gold recalled the arrangements for actual recognition to be that he was to carry a pair of gloves in one hand, plus a green-covered book, while Fuchs was to carry a handball. He introduced himself as "Raymond" and Fuchs introduced himself as Klaus Fuchs. He said that Fuchs never used the name "Raymond" because he knew it was fictitious.

At this first meeting no written information was passed, but Fuchs revealed that he was with the British Mission working with the Manhattan Engineer Project. He told Gold that the British Mission was working on the separation of isotopes, and Gold believes there was at least implied the eventual utilization of the energy produced by nuclear fission in the form of a weapon. Following this, Gold had about four meetings with Fuchs in the Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, and Queens. During at least two of these meetings Fuchs furnished written information to Gold, who thereafter delivered it to his superior, "John." He said that he had taken a brief glance at the material on one occasion and found it to consist of a number of folded sheets of paper containing mathematical equations which seemed to concern mathematical derivations.

Gold further advised that he lost contact with Fuchs when Fuchs failed to keep a meeting in August, 1944. He stated that "John" obtained the information whereby he was once more enabled to contact Fuchs. "John" gave Gold the address of Mrs. Keineman in Cambridge, Massachusetts, the sister of Fuchs. As a result of this, he met Fuchs at the Keineman residence shortly after Christmas Day, 1944, or early in 1945. At that time Fuchs told him that he was at Los Alamos, New Mexico, a short distance from Santa Fe. Fuchs also gave him written information at the time and the two made an arrangement to meet in June of that year in Santa Fe. Gold stated that on this occasion he had been given a sum of approximately fifteen hundred dollars to offer Fuchs in a very diplomatic manner so as not to offend him. He said that Fuchs "turned it down cold." Gold returned to New York with the money and information which he delivered to "John."



Gold has further advised that he met Fuchs in Santa Fe, New Mexico, in June, 1948, and again in September, 1948. On both of these occasions Fuchs furnished him with written information. He said that during the September, 1948, meeting Fuchs told him that he had been present at the initial large-scale trial of nuclear fission at Alamogordo, New Mexico. He also stated that Fuchs told him at the time that he probably would return to England soon, but that by paying a call to Fuchs' sister he could ascertain just when. Gold said he made one or two attempts to see Fuchs again at the home of his sister, but was not successful. After the possible second attempt, which was either in late January or early February, 1948, Gold missed a scheduled appointment with his superior, "John," and has not seen or heard from him since.

In connection with the current interview of Fuchs in London by representatives of this Bureau, still and movie photographs of Gold were surreptitiously obtained for display to Fuchs. Previously, Fuchs and Robert and Kristel Meisner had failed to recognize a photograph of Gold. On May 20, 1950, Fuchs was shown the new still photographs of Gold and he did not identify them, though he stated he could not reject them.

On May 22, 1950, Fuchs viewed three repeat showings of the moving pictures of Gold, after which he stated that Gold was very likely his contact in the United States. It is most interesting to note that this information was received by cable at 11:00 AM, while Gold had first admitted his espionage activity to the interviewing agents in Philadelphia at approximately 10:45 AM the same day.

On May 23, 1950, a complaint was filed before a United States Commissioner for the Eastern District of New York, Brooklyn, New York, charging Harry Gold and "John" Doe with conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics in violation of Section 23, Title 50, United States Code. A warrant was issued and Gold was thereupon taken before United States District Judge James P. McGranery at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for arraignment. Judge McGranery gave Gold the complaint to read and he admitted that he was the Harry Gold named in the complaint. A preliminary hearing was set for June 12, 1950, and bail was set at one hundred thousand dollars, in default of which Gold was remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal.

**DETAILS:**

Mr. RAY CLARK, negotiator for the Colorado River Commission at the Basic Magnesium Plant, Henderson, Nevada, advised that the Hardesty Chemical Company is a defunct corporation. He stated this company's records are in a very confused state and presently stored at the Basic Magnesium Plant.

The records of the Hardesty Chemical Company, at the Basic Magnesium Plant, Henderson, Nevada, were checked for a personnel record and photograph of MARION GORDON MASTIN by Mr. CLARK and the writer with negative results. The only record located of MARION GORDON MASTIN in the Hardesty Chemical files was a 3" x 5" card concerning a plant insurance deduction. It was noted this card bore the following: 6-13-46, MARION GORDON MASTIN, born August 12, 1891, wife, EILEEN LOOQUIT MASTIN, born May 2, 1920, and MICHAEL H. MASTIN, born December 21, 1945. No other information concerning MARION GORDON MASTIN could be located in the Hardesty Chemical Company files. Mr. CLARK advised the Hardesty Chemical had never kept a good set of personnel records or other required records while at the plant, which had been one of this company's difficulties with the Government.

CLARK further advised that in September, 1948, MASTIN and two other individuals, W. VALENTINE and L. L. HEZZELWOOD, formed the Basic Reduction Company and stated this company would be incorporated for \$250,000.00. CLARK stated

MASTIN leased a building and some equipment from the Basic Magnesium Plant of which he at the present time is supposedly operating. However, CLARK said he had heard from an unrecalled source that MASTIN's two partners had pulled out of the Basic Reduction Company, and that this company is presently inactive. CLARK advised the Basic Reduction was reportedly a new method developed by MASTIN to remove lead, silver, gold and other metals from the ore by a chemical process.

Mr. PRATT PRINCE, former identification officer in the Security Section of the Basic Magnesium Plant, Henderson, Nevada, advised that photographs of the Hardesty Chemical Company employees were made in 1946 for this company by the Security Section of Basic Magnesium, Incorporated. However, Mr. PRINCE stated he did not know where these negatives or photographs could be located.

A search of the Basic Magnesium, Incorporated files as well as a re-check of the Hardesty Chemical Company files by the writer and Mr. CLARK failed to disclose any photograph of MARION GORDON MASTIN or any other employee of the Hardesty Chemical Company.

Mr. WILLIAM BELKNAP, of the Belknap Studios, Boulder City, Nevada, and a former Naval photographer, advised that he did all of the photographic work for the Boulder City paper. However, BELKNAP stated he had no photograph of MARION GORDON MASTIN.

Mr. B. B. BURTON, Personnel Officer for the Bureau of Reclamation, Boulder City, Nevada, advised the Bureau of Reclamation Department of Interior had employed MARION GORDON MASTIN as a Consulting Engineer on the study of the city water filtering plant, at the rate of \$50.00 per day, beginning September 3, 1947 and terminating September 16, 1947. Mr. BURTON stated the only other information in his files concerning MASTIN was his Social Security Number [REDACTED] and his home address, which was listed as 620 Arizona Street, Boulder City, Nevada.

C. E. PETERSON, Chief of the Bureau of Reclamation Rangers, Boulder City, Nevada, advised from the city records that MARION GORDON MASTIN resided with his wife, EILEEN, and family at 620 Arizona Street. PETERSON stated MASTIN at the present time is interested in the development of the Basic Reduction Company, which, according to MASTIN, is a new method of recovering lead and other metals from mineral bearing ore, and MASTIN was endeavoring to obtain a lease from the Government for buildings and equipment at the Basic Magnesium Plant at Henderson, Nevada in order to get the Basic Reduction Company on an operating basis. PETERSON stated MASTIN has a reputation in the community of being an excellent chemist.

Mr. A. E. CAHLAN, editor of the Review Journal Newspaper, Las Vegas, Nevada, advised the writer he did not have a photograph of MASTIN in his files. However, Mr. CAHLAN, who is very cooperative with the FBI, stated that the Colorado River Commission was holding a meeting with individuals who were interested in leasing portions of the Basic Magnesium Plant buildings on May 4, 1950, and that MASTIN would be present at this meeting. Mr. CAHLAN stated he would have all individuals present photographed for future news reference and would furnish the writer a photograph of MASTIN. On May 5, 1950, Mr. CAHLAN furnished to the writer a photograph of MARION GORDON MASTIN.

The following description of MASTIN was furnished by Mr. RAY CLARK and Miss MARY JO PARKER, employees of the Colorado River Commission, Henderson, Nevada, who both know MASTIN personally:

Mrs. CLAUDIA DAVIS, Clerk, Credit Bureau of Southern Nevada, Las Vegas, made available the Credit Bureau file which reflected that MARION GORDON MASTIN has resided in Boulder City, Nevada since September, 1945 and was formerly resident manager of the Hardesty Chemical Company, Henderson, Nevada. A notation in the Credit Bureau file reflected that in December, 1946, MASTIN resigned his position with the Hardesty Chemical Company and stated he planned on operating in this vicinity as a consulting engineer. The Credit Bureau file further reflected that on September 3, 1948, MASTIN announced the incorporation of the Basic Reduction Company, which was to be incorporated for \$250,000.00, with W. W. VALENTINE as Vice President and L. L. HEZZELWOOD as treasurer. Mrs. DAVIS stated the Credit Bureau files reflected MASTIN has a good reputation in the neighborhood where he resides. She advised the files contain no further information concerning MASTIN.
