DETAILS

Investigation and interrogation of Harry Gold has developed the fact that his brother, Joseph Gold, is an employee of the U. S. Naval Supply Depot, Philadelphia.

On the basis of information now available, there is no indication that Joseph Gold was cognizant of or assisted in any way in the admitted espionage activities of Harry Gold. Harry and Joseph Gold have been residing together with their father, Sam Gold, at 6823 Kindred Street, Philadelphia.

The Correlation Unit of the Security Division is presently preparing a correlation memorandum on Joseph Gold. The Navy Department was advised by Lisison that Joseph Gold is a brother of the subject. Harry Gold.

That this memorandum be routed to the attention of the Loyalty Section for consideration as to the necessity for instituting a loyalty investigation of Joseph Gold.

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

On July 19, 1949, the Chicago Office in a letter to the Bureau, concerning the Educational Foundation for Buclear Science, Inc., and the Bulletin of Atomic Scientists, submitted Volumn V, June, July 1949, issues 6 and 7 of the above mentioned bulletin, which contained an article entitled "Washington Votes", "AEC Under Fire" by ANN WILSON MARKE. This article reviewed the hearings which had taken place with respect to the awarding of AEC fellowships and with respect to the then current topic of misplaced uranium.

With regard to HERBERT SIMON MARKE, husband of ANN VILSON MARKE, the files of this office reflect that he was very friendly with MAROLD STEIN, who is a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, and the Washington Bookshop Association. Further, a Mrs. MURIEL B. WILLIAMS of 4108 Anderson Street, Chattanooga, Tennessee, testified relative to Communist activities in the TVA before the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Volumn II, Page 1294, and stated she had attended Communist Party meetings in Enoxville, Tennessee, with one HERBERT MARKE, not further identified.

The report of Special Agent EISUM G. HEDGES, dated March 10, 1949, at Washington, D. C., entitled HERBERT SIMON MARKS, EUROPEAN RECOVERY PROGRAM, reflects that the files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities then contained no reference that HERBERT MARKS, employed by TVA, was a member of the Communist Party and under transfer to the Bonneville Sam Project, which had been reflected in the Civil Bervice Commission files.

This same report of Agent HEDGES reflects membership in the Mational Lawyers Guild of HERBERT MARKS from 1937 until 1940, and residence at 1509 Cameron Street, Alexandria, Virginia.

A pretext phone call to Overlook 5682 reflects this listing has been changed and the individual answering the phone stated he had had this listing for about one month, and that prior thereto it was apparently listed to HERBERT S. MARKS. The person answering the phone stated that the listing wasnot presently at 1509 Cameron Street.

The current phone directory reflects HERBERT B. MARKS, Lavyer, Ring Building, Washington, D. C., and also contains a listing for Rear Admiral CEORGE B. WILSON, 3135 Commecticut Avenue, who is the father of ABNE WILSON MARKS.

EDWARD MURPHY, M.D., Secretary of the Connecticut State Medical Board, advised that their records reflected the following information concerning the subject.

HERBERT WIATT, M.D., was born HERBERT KWIATKOWSKI at Rixdorf, on 2/17/10. Dr. MURPHY believed that Rixdorf was in the eastern part of Germany. Dr. WIATT attended the Kaiser Frederick School at Berlin, the University of Friedburg, and the University of Berlin, receiving his M.D. from the latter institution in 1936.

From Germany WIATT went to London as a Rockefeller Research Foundation Fellow in the fall of 1936. In ondon he studied at the Guis Hospital and received a Ph. D. from the University of London in 1940. From 1941 to 1946 he was attached to the National Research Counsel of the British Government. According to notations in the Connecticut State Medical Board files WIATT claimed that he worked in an undercover capacity in Europe during World War II for the British Government and Dr. MURPHI believed that WIATT claimed that it was during this time that the British gave him the name WIATT.

WYATT arrived in the United States on 12/12/46 traveling under a Certificate of Identification issued by the British Foreign Office, London, England. He secured his first papers in the United States District Court, Brooklyn, New York in 1947, Certificate no. 348467, Naturalization file no. 0300-K-50782.

WYATT passed the Connecticut State Medical examination and Dr. MURPHY advised that the person who identified Dr. WYATT'S photograph at the time of his antrance into medical practice in Connecticut was one MARION KUSNIER, M.D., of Meriden, Conn.

The records further reflected that from July 1947 to May 1948 WYATT was attached to the White Plains, New York Hospital and from there went to a hospital in Meriden, Conn. for one year and was licensed to practice in Connecticut in July 1948. WYATT gave as references to the Connecticut State Medical Board the names of ALLEN HYAN, M.D., of Meriden, Conn.; WILLIAM T. SALTER, M.D., Professor of Gynecology, Yale Medical School, who in 1948 stated that he had known WYATT for three years; JOHN FULTON, M.S., Professor of Gynecology, Yale Medical School, who in 1948 stated he had known Dr. WYATT for five years by reputation. Dr. MURPHY pointed out that Dr. FULTON was a graduate of Oxford University, England, and that both Dr. FULTON and Dr. WALTER had numerous friends in England and Europe and perhaps they had met WYATT in England.

Dr. FRANCIS G. HLAKE, Physician in Chief, Grace-New Haven Hospital, New Haven, Conn.,

stated that WYATT, in the fall of 1948, sought an appointment in the Department of Cardiology at that hospital. He did not receive, such appointment but Dr. BLAKE was under the impression that WYATT visited as an observer in the Cardiac Out-Patient Clinic of the hospital. This privilege is granted to all physicians in the New Haven area for purposes of refreshing themselves in any particular field they desire.

Dr. ALLEN GOODYER, of the Department of Cardiology, New Haven Hospital, advised that he first met WIATT in September, 1948. WIATT at that time appeared at the Department of Cardiology and indicated that he would like to look for some position in the Cardiology Department. He gave the impression that he was learned in Cardiology but never actually stated that he was an expert in this field. WYATT has come to the hospital cardiac clinic many times and has observed the staff physicians in their work.

Dr. FRANK CRAY, of the cardiac clinic, New Haven Hospital, furnished substantially the same information as had Dr. GOODYER. Both Dr. DOODYER and Dr. GRAY stated they never had occasion to know Dr. WYATT personally.

The records of the New Haven Credit Bureau, New Haven, Conn. reflected that Dr. WYATT was 38 years of age in 1949; that he is a physician and maintains his office at 2454 Whitney Avenue, Hamden. His wife, MARION, is also a practicing physician and has her office on Colony Street, Meriden, Conn. As of 1/3/50 the credit records reflect that Dr. WYATT'S address was 1696 Whitney Avenue, Hamden, Conn.

A notation dated 12/7/48 lists his employer as the New Haven Hospital.

The Milwaukes office by teletype dated 5/26/50 advised that there was no record in the Milwaukee office indices under the name WEIFKOVSKY or variations in that spelling.

The Philadelphia office by teletype dated 5/25/50 stated that subject HARRY GOLD, of the "FOOCASE", during previous interviews had advised that on occasions he had been mistakem for a Dr. HARRY GOLD, a prominent cardiologist in New York Eity. Subject GOLD further stated that he was not capable of writing articles on cardiac research as was Dr. HARRY GOLD. This teletype further advised that the Philadelphia office had no knowledge of subject GOLD having contacted WIATT.

By teletype dated 5/26/50 the New York office advised that Dr. HARRY GOLD was employed as an Associate Professor of Clinic Pharmacology at Cornell University Medical School, New York City, and was not identical with subject of the FOOCASE, HARRY GOLD. New York suggested discontinuance of investigation re Dr. HARRY GOLD.

vacationing at Haverns Haven, Ludington, Michigan, advised that he had been employed in the Experimental Division at Los Alamos during the period that Subject was attached to the Theoretical Division there. He continued that he, KERST, had also been treasurer of the Ski Club and said that he had a vague recollection that he had had a conversation with FUCHS on one occasion when he collected his dues for the Ski Club. However, he stated that it was possible that he was entirely wrong about this and that FUCHS might not even have been a member of this club. He said that beyond this, he was unable to remember any conversations with FUCHS ether than chance meetings as they passed in the corridors at Los Alamos. He said that he was unable to recall the occasion in which he and FUCHS first met. He continued that he last saw him at a breakfast in Harwell, England, in the Fall of 1948. He explained that he, KERST, at that time was attending a nuclear physics conference at Birmingham, England, and that they only engaged in small talk at this breakfast. He said he spent no other time with FUCHS in England. He further explained that he believed he was living in Les Alamos with his family when FUCHS originally came to Los Alamos and that FUCHS probably lived in the dormitory during that period as he was single and that he was sure he never knew any of FUCHS' friends or even who they were.

KERST advised that he visited Los Alamos in March, 1950, and that during this visit to Los Alamos, Dr. EDWARD TELLER made the remark, "We can be sure that Mr. FUCHS is a very thorough man and if he were to communicate any information, it would be a report including a great deal of detail". Mr. KERST explained that this remark was made by TELLER in the way of emphasizing the importance of the amount of harm FUCHS has possibly caused and further explained that TELLER had felt that the interest in this work among scientists outside Los Alamos has wanted in the past two years and was making the point strongly regarding FUCHS to arouse interest. He continued that there has been a tendency among scientists outside of Los Alamos to minimize the harm that FUCHS had done, although he personally felt that he could have contributed an $^{\prime\prime}$ immense amount of aid to the Russian cause. He pointed out that there was two types of information that FUCHS might have passed on. Firstly that he could have supplied which of the parallel developments in this work were "paying off" and that such information would have released an enormous amount of Russian manpower to be devoted to more fruitful channels. Secondly, he said FUCHS might have communicated engineering details to the Russians, although he emphasized that would have taken a much longer contact or much longer report. He continued FUCHS had access to a wast amount of information, "particularly on bombs". He said that it was interesting to speculate on how much he was able to communicate. He further reflected that there is some concern among United States scientists that FUCHS may still be a potential giver of information if he has not already passed all of his information to the Russians.

RERST stated that FUCHS could have been systematic about technical things and at the same time have been a "forgetter of names". He also stated that the remark made by Dr. TELLER was more in the way of emphasizing FUCHS! thoroughness rather then stressing his memory.

MERST stated that he quoted or paraphrased the remark made by Dr. TELLER in March, 1950, to perhaps a half dozen people when he was asked to characterize FUCHS. However, he asserted that personal contacts with FUCHS were very limited and that Dr. TELLER and others connected with the Theoretical Division at Los Alamos had a much greater opportunity to know FUCHS. He also stated that he had formed the impression from his chance meetings with FUCHS in the halls at Los Alamos that FUCHS was a "sour puss". However, he said that he has since learned from other scientists that this was arroneous and was, himself, surprised and impressed to find FUCHS extremely jovial when he met him at the afore-mentioned breakfast in England in the Fall of 1948. KERST also stated that he had the impression that FUCHS was about to be married when he was apprehended in England. However, he said that he was unable to recall the source of this information and remarked that "this may have come out of Newsweek".

KERST appeared extremely cooperative during the course of this interview.

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



"London - The local papers have published a report from TASS, the Soviet Press Agency that Dr. KLAUS FUCHS, English scientist who was sentenced to 14 years in prison for giving atomic secrets to the Soviet Union, lied when he stated that he was a Soviet Atomic spy.

"FUCHS was not known to the Soviet authorities, stated TASS, not even one Soviet agent had contacted him.

"The Russian press agency states:

"Reuters news agency published a report about the court procedure against the British Physicist, Dr. FUCHS, which took place in London and where FUCHS was sentenced to 14 years in prison for the corruption of State secrets.

"'In the lawsuit the chief British prosecutor, Sir HARTLEY SHAWCROSS, stated during the proceedings, that FUCHS gave atomic secrets to the agents of the Soviet Union.

**TASS therefore states that this is not true because FUCHS was not known to the Soviet government and no "agents" of the USSR had any connections with FUCHS.

"Spokesmen for the Communist Party stated that FUCHS was not a member of the party. The Communist Party would not tolerate a man in their ranks who was occupying himself with spying without any regard for which side he was carrying on this service.

The Albany indices contain no reference to Miss COLLETTE, who stated that she had cooperated in furnishing information to the Newark Office of the Bureau during the war while she was employed at one of the Dupont plants in New Jersey. DOES NOT RECALL CONSIDERED RAYMOND AS A LAST NAME AND MONEY OFFERED TO HIM. THE STREET BELIEVES GAVE SOME OTHER FIRST NAME TO SISTER. MAME EASTERN PARKWAY, BROOKLYN SOUNDS FAMILIAR TO FUCHS. DOES NOT RECALL SPECIFIC CINEMA NEARBY, ALTHOUGH LARGE PUBLIC-TYPE BUILDINGS WERE IN VICINITY.
