Refuses to Reduce Bail For 2 Held in Spy Case

Queens chemical engineer Abraham Brothman and Miriam Moskowitz, his business associate, pleaded not guilty yesterday to charges of conspiracy to obstruct justice in the FBI investigation of the Soviet spy ring in which British atomic scientist Klaus Fuchs was a key figure.

William L. Messing, defense counsel, staged a futile half-hour f

William L. Messing, defense counsel, staged a futile half-hour battle to prevail on Federal Judge Davis to reduce the \$25,000 bail for each prisoner to \$1,000, insisting the charges against them have been "grossly exaggerated."

This brought a sharp reply from U. S. Attorney Saypol, who criticized Messing for seeking to minimize the "gravity" of the charges. Judge Davis finally fixed Sept. 11 as the day when he will set a trial date.

Brothman, 36, of 41-08 42d St., Sunnyside, also pleaded not guilty to a second count which accused him of attempting to influence the testimony of Harrandom, confessed atom spy for Hussia, when Gold appeared to testify lefore a Federal grand jury here in July, 1947.

Brothman appeared cheerful when he entered the courtroom, smiling and waving to his wife Naomi.

Messing immediately attacked the government charges, claiming his clients were innocent and would be vindicated. He said his information was that the charges against Brothman were first made by Gold and Elizabeth Bentley, former courier for a Red spy ring. Messing called Gold and Miss Bentley "scoundrels of the most despicable type."

Judge Davis reminded Messing the charges against Brothman and Miss Moskowitz were made by the grand jury. Messing Brothman was the sole support of his wife and two children and unless he could be released in low bail his business enterprises would be endangered. The judge, however, turned down the plea, upheld the \$25,000 bail and remanded both prisoners to custody of the U. S. marshal.

On February 17, 1951, the Gettysburg Times carried an article referred to above, to the effect that the subject came to this country in 1911, on an emergency visa, available at that time for persons in danger, after he had spent seven years in concentration camps in Germany and France as a consequence of his anti-Nazi activities. He became involved, he claims, in Communism in the post war Germany in the early 1920s. As a member of the party he took an anti-Moscovite stand in 1925, and in 1926 was expelled from the party because of his anti-Bolshevik activities. He engaged subsequently in anti-Communist activities which he says he has continued for the past 20 years. He applied for an Immigration Visa in the fall of 1946 before his visitor's visa expired, but was notified by the American Consulate in Montreal, that he was not eligible for immigration. He then filed an appeal through counsel, JAMES R. SHARP, Washington, D.C., to Attorney General TOM CLARK for a waiver, requesting a hearing. Documentary proof of his anti-Communist activities was supplied with this appeal. A copy of the appeal was sent to the Secretary of State (Federal) and a preliminary hearing was held on August 3, 1949, at Philadelphia. The subject stated in the article "It seems ironical to me that I chould be deported as a former Communist from this country which long since became my second home, the more so since I could not return to my place of birth, which is situated in the now Russian Zone of Germany. Under the present law the only way to adjust my status in the United States is by a personal bill." ...

The Honorable JAMES F. LIND, Congress of the United States, House of Representatives, York District of Pennsylvania, advised that he has introduced a bill H.R. #1578 in Congress which in effect states that for the purposes of the Immigration and Naturalization Laws; insofar as membership in the German Communist Party prior to his expulsion from that party in 1926 is concerned, HEINZ LANGERHANS shall be held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence as of the date of enactment of this act. Mr. LIND advised that the Sub-Committee on Immigration would first hear his bill, and that he intended to request the Committee on the Judiciary to grant an open hearing so that all of the pertinent facts might be made a part of the record, since on the basis of this record the Committee would pass on the merits of the hill.

Captioned individual is employed by the Shell Chemical Corporation in Houston and has been reported to this office by an acquaintance as being a person who has expressed favorable comments towards the Russian interests in the Korean war and has expressed sympathy for ALGER HISS and Dr. KLAUS

Investigation thus far has reflected that subject was born on July 15, 1910 in Prestonpons, Scotland and that he entered the United States at Detroit, Michigan on May 6, 1930 and obtained his first citizenship papers in 1936, later becoming an American citizen in San Francisco in 1943.

The San Francisco Office furnished a summary of information in their files by letter dated March 30, 1951, which revealed that ANDERSON was known to have associated with Communications. ist Party members in Chicago in 1944. MAY 8 1951

It is requested that the Bureau check its indices for any identifiable information pertaining to ANDERSON and furnish a summary of this information to Houston.

The only remaining descriptive information in the Houston files at this time is that ANDERSON's father's name is J. T. ANDERSON and that he married DOROTHY BELL DAVIS in Saint Augustine, Florida.





It is to be noted that ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG were convicted on March 29, 1951 in the U. S. District Court, Southern District of New York, for conspiracy to commit espionage and was sentenced to death by Trial Judge IRVING R. KAUFFMAN on April 5, 1951.

The ROSEVEERGs were executed on June 19, 1953 at Sing Sing Prison Ossining, New York.

During the course of interviews in May and June of 1950 by Assistant Director HUCH_H. CIEGG and Special Agent ROBERT J. IAMPHERE of EMIL JULIUS KIAUS FUCHS, who was convicted in London, England, for furnishing the Soviet Union with atomic energy information, FUCHS stated that during the period he was in England from September, 1933, until sometime in 1941, he was sware that an underground section of the German Communist Party was operating in England. FUCES stated that he was considered a member of this section of the German Communist Party, and that he was aware that JURGEN KUCZYNSKI was regarded as the head thereof. during this period. In May of 1941 when he accepted employment as a scientist on atomic energy research, he decided to furnish information regarding this research to the Soviet Union. FUCHS advised KUCZYNEKI, in the latter part of 1941, of his desire to furnish information to the Soviet Union, and KUCZYNSKI subsequently arranged a claudestine contact with an individual who FUCES has identified as SIMON DAVIDOVITCE KREMER, who, in 1942, was the Secretary of the Military Attache's Staff at the Soviet Embassy in London.

Under Hitler. Werner Finck twice had to pay for his inclination to political bons mots by lengthy stays in concentration camps. So, as a matter of precaution, the membership cards of the new party bear the words: "I join the Radical Center with the provise that my membership shall not be held against me in case of future questionmaires." The membership card will most likely be worn under the laps!

Finck is really serious, for all his fun. His leaflets demand the resignation of politicians who suffer from gastric complaints. They protest against uniforms, against standing at attention in public offices and places, and they propagate the view that things will be managed much better with humaneness, humor and elasticity than with systems, dogman and party discipline. He appeals against bureaucracy, against sanctity of office and the pathetic dead-seriousness of the dogmatists. Apart from all that his party has no program, and he is proud of it. He calls it briefly "counter movement". Regarding Winsten Churchill, Carle Schmid and Theodor Heuss he says that without being aware of it they are already members of the Radical Center. The human cheerfulness with which they engage in politics renders their policy more fertile than that of others.

Certainly there had never been so much fun in the large hall, which after the Russian manner had been festconed with large banners bearing slogans such as "We are in favor of the Saar question". Here many people again began to take a happy interest in politics, and this alone makes the constitution of the new party a worth-while effort, even if Werner Finck does keep his promise to carry humor and fresh air into the public offices, parliaments and schools.

ARGENTINE BAZIS: What is the use of responsible and reasonable people in Gormany trying to calm their nationalistic countrymen when a publisher in the Argentine makes it his business to rake up the old Maxi tales and to circulate them once more?

I have before we a book from the Dürer Publishing Company in Buenes Aires, the title of which runs, <u>With Dr. Goebbels Till the End</u>. It was written by the personal press director of the former Minister of Propaganda in order — as the wrapper says — to straighten out the picture of this leading, political personality, distorted in the course of years by political pession and hasty judgment. The book is a very misplaced spotheomis of Dr. Goebbels, whom the author adores.

In the introduction the author justifies his book by writing: "Up to the last day of the war I did everything in my power to bring about victory, or at least to try and prevent the defeat and all the terrible results which it was bound to bring to the German people." It is certainly a curious justification of the Maris to assert that all they wented was to prevent the results of the catastrophe which they themselves had brought about. In present-day Germany, with its unemployed, its refugees, its bombed-out people, nothing is more effective from the point of view of propagands then an appeal to the memory of those times when they still had work, homes and a future.

One cannot tell a foreign publisher what he whould publish and what he must not publish. But it is a sad sign of the times when an argentinian publisher presents his customers with such dangerous nepsents. Fortunitally, the book is at present not available in Germany. But ovidently the publisher has his customers, for on the wrapper a whole lot of pro-Mani literature is presented.

SCHIZOPHRENIA: For us dermans the Fuchs case has been of special interest, not so much because Klaus Fuchs was originally a German, but because as a result of our geographic position and our history we knew very well the two worlds in which he lived. They are the natural world of the West and the idealogical, artificial one of the East: artificial because there on a pseudo-scientific basis of historic materialism a theory of life has been evolved to which everything natural and everything human has been sacrificed. This goes so far that in the end even history, for the true Marxist, is nothing sore than a physical process.

Klaus Fuchs himself has called his behavior "controlled schizophrenia", meaning an intentionally accomplished split of his mind. He was able to live in the completely independent spheres: publicly in the world of highly qualified soil but or second with all its tangible paraphernalla, and secretly in the ideological ported of Marxist make-believe, its slogans and dream pictures.

The disposition towards such a divided consciousness is closely related to the crisis of Western thinking and the loss of common unifying values. The entity of Truchs' personality was broken, because it had no unified spiritual consciousness on which to fall back. In this respect, Fuchs is no isolated case. On the contrary, as a result of the upheaval of two world wars and the Spiritual unsettlement which they brought, schizophrenia has become a sickness of our ora.

Today it is the fate of whole peoples to live in a self-willed split of the ego: on the one hand the official plane of governmental rulings which control their public setions; on the other, the hidden plane of natural behavior and thinking reserved for the closest private circle. The original undivided consciousness of man has been shattered to its foundations by Marxist teaching, and has come into conflict with its social surroundings. In place of natural consciousness, which communism condems as capitalistic and therefore immoral, has arisen a theoretically created attitude called "social consciousness". This psychological conflict will split the ego of any man who has lest his inner freedom.

In the surroundings in which Fuchs lived the "socialistic conscience" created by his intellect could not in the long run hold its ground. Admittedly, he met too many people with a "deep-rooted strength which enables them to live a decent life". Under their influence Fuchs finally found his way back to natural mental condition.

For millions of people, who live within the Soviet orbit, schizophrenia is the only possible way of life. If they do not successfully contain their natural mind in a special compartment they will one day be liquidated for sabotage or deviation.

YOR FALKERHAUSER: Recently I met a young man with whom I often had very lively discussions during the war. He was, then, ADC to a rather objectionable Rank general whom, partly because of stupidity, partly because of loyalty, he used to defend whenever I attacked the attitude of his ohief and of the German military leadership as a whole. I remember quite well that during our leat discussion, in the autumn of 1943, he indignantly exclaimed: "I do not know what you mean; is there then no general whose attitude meets with your approval?" "Yes", I replied, "there is one who should be an example to all German officers: General von Falkonhausen."


