It has been reported by RUTH GREENGLASS, wife of DAVID GREENGLASS, also a convicted espionage agent, that her husband had told her that ROSENBERG had told him that animosity existed between ROSENBERG and MARK PAGE. She also stated that ETHEL ROSENBERG, wife of JULIUS ROSENBERG and herself a convicted espionage agent, had taken her son, MICHAEL, to MARK PAGE's home in East Orange, New Jersey at various times.

According to Informant T-2, the letter was prepared on stationery of the Scientists and Engineers Association, which identified the business as "A specialized placement service, nation-wide, through department managers, each covering a specialized occupational field. Our placement services are without charge to employers except when an employer orders a special service, or volunteers to pay a placement fee."

THOMAS F. BRIDGE, Manager of the Stamford, Connecticut Credit Bureau, made available records concerning ASHLEIGH DEAN HALLIWELL, of Rock Rimmon Road, Stamford, Connecticut, which revealed the following information. It is to be noted that A.D. HALLIWELL was the correspondent of a letter to the Postmaster at Stamford under date of August 27, 1951, representing the Scientists and Engineers Association.

The credit records revealed that in the report dated June 14, 1951, prepared by the Stamford Bureau for the Commercial Rating Company of St. Louis, Missouri, it was indicated that Mr. HALLIWELL has been known to the Stamford Bureau since 1935, having resided on Rock Rimmon Road in Stamford since 1945. According to the credit report Mr. HALLIWELL is married and has been in the real estate business in Stamford for a number of years. It was reported that Mr. HALLIWELL has served as president and treasurer of the Stamford Development Company, which is a local real estate and contracting firm. Mr. BRIDGE advised that there was no record on file at his bureau for the Scientists and Engineers Association.

Miss JULIA MOORE, employee at the Stamford Chamber of Commerce, 417 Main Street, Stamford, Connecticut, advised that ASHLEIGH DEAN HALLIWELL, former owner of Scientists and Engineers Assoc., has been known to the Chamber for a number of years. Miss MOORE pointed out that Mr. HALLIWELL sold his business, which was formerly known as the Scientists and Engineers Association about August of 1951, to Mrs. JAMES W. CAMPBELL of Cedar Gate Road in Darien, Connecticut. According to Miss MOORE, subsequent to the sale, the Chamber of Commerce directed correspondence to

Mrs. CAMPBELL inviting the latter to join their Chamber of Commerce, but to date the Chamber has received no answer from Mrs. CAMPBELL. Miss MOORE advised that Mr. HALLIWELL is well known in the area of Stamford and has an excellent reputation in the community. He has been identified with the real estate business for a number of years. Miss MOORE furnished no information concerning Scientists and Engineers Association, other than to report that such has been known to be some type of specialized placement service bureau.

The 1951 City Directory for Darien, Connecticut, reflects that Mrs. JAMES W. CAMPBELL, also known as CELESTIA D. CAMPBELL, currently resides on Rebel Lane in Darien, Conn. It is to be noted that Rebel Lane is off Cedar Falls Road in Darien. The City Directory further identified Mrs. CAMPBELL'S husband, JAMES W., as an industrial psychologist employed in New York.

The records of the Stamford, Connecticut Credit Bureau contain no information identifiable with either Mr. or Mrs. JAMES W. CAMPBELL of Darien, Connecticut.

Their records indicated that he had previously been employed by the Waterplit Arsenal in New York. He listed his wife, STELLA, in his records at George Scher Engineering Company. *ATA's*

Mr. ALF WAKSLY, Chief Draftsman, advised that MARK PAGE worked under him while employed there and that he had never had any reason to question his loyalty to the United States, however, he volunteered that he considered MARK PAGE to have a "big shot" complex and that he felt he was better than most people.

Mr. ARTHUR BARTSCH, President, Enterprise and Tool Manufacturing Company, 117 Sylvan Avenue, Newark, N.J., advised that MARK PAGE was never employed by him. He stated he first met PAGE when PAGE was employed at Westinghouse at Bloomfield, N.J.

He stated that during PAGE'S employment at Westinghouse, he came to BARTSCH in an attempt to work out a toy and used a desk or small work bench in BARTSCH'S shop for about two months. It was agreed by BARTSCH and PAGE that if the toy was developed, BARTSCH would make the tools and dies for its manufacture. He stated that there was never any agreement signed and the toy was never developed.

He advised that PAGE later worked with the Ideal Toy Company, Long Island City, New York. Mr. BARTSCH advised that he never had any indication of any Communist Party activity on the part of PAGE and he considered him to be a loyal American.

The firm was incorporated in Pennsylvania on December 29, 1916.

MONTGOMERY was born in Pittsburgh in 1901 and is married. He was graduated from the Washington and Jefferson College in 1924. In the same year he was successively elected Treasurer and President of the corporation. He is the son of the former president of the company. MONTGOMERY owns 425 shares of the 500 shares of capital stock authorized.

WILLIAM J. COOK was born in Brooklyn, N. Y., in 1894 and is married. He has been with the company since 1922 and is Work Manager.

PHILIP C. CLARKE was born in Camden, N. J., in 1904 and is married. CLARKE studied mechanical and electrical engineering at Drexel Institute of Technology. He joined the organization in 1933 and assists COOK in managing the company.

The company has 325 employees and has a tangible network of \$518,856, as of July 31, 1951. For the first seven months of 1951, the company sales were \$1,750,000, and over 10 per cent of its volume is represented by Government work. A mortgage for \$112,000 is held by the Occidental Life Insurance Company of California. The business of the Hunter Spring Company is steadily increasing and more profitable.

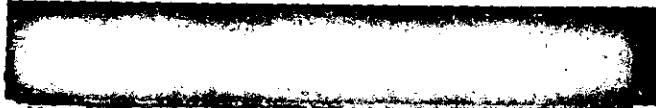

Rerep of SA JACK WEST dated 12/26/51, at Philadelphia.

In view of the possibility that PHILIP C. CLARKE, Secretary of the Hunter Spring Company, Lansdale, Pa., had attended Drexel Institute of Technology in Philadelphia at the time HARRY GOLD was a student there, investigation at Drexel Institute was conducted. It was believed that if CLARKE had attended Drexel contemporarily with HARRY GOLD, an interview with CLARKE concerning GOLD could be conducted, at which time CLARKE might furnish information concerning subjects of other security investigations, including MARK PAGE.

It was determined from Miss THERESE RICO, Registrar's Office, Evening School, Drexel Institute of Technology, Philadelphia, that PHILIP CORLIES CLARKE attended Drexel's Evening School from September to December 1923. It will be recalled that HARRY GOLD attended Drexel in the 1930's.

This office does not at this time intend to conduct interviews at the Hunter Spring Company, Lansdale, Pa., to determine the nature of that company's relations with the subject. It is believed that an exploratory-type investigation such as this would have to be at the Hunter Spring Company might jeopardize future investigation of this case. The possibility also exists that the company's correspondence with the subject, disclosed by the Newark mail cover, was an isolated communication sent to the subject by the Hunter Company in the course of its normal business activities.

In the event further investigation of this case discloses an established pattern of correspondence between the subject and the Hunter Company, the Newark Office may desire to bring this to the attention of the Philadelphia Office and the advisability of conducting an investigation at the Hunter Spring Company will be reconsidered.

the State of New York, at that time, join him in a May Day Parade, but GASSELIN refused when he realized and learned what the May Day Parade consisted of. Mr. HANSEN related the above incident to substantiate the fact that PAGE was considered somewhat of a radical in the plant.

Mr. JOE GASSELIN was contacted at the Bulova Watch Company the same day, but he could furnish no further information other than that given by Mr. ARTHUR HANSEN.

Mr. WILLIAM HALPERIN, Plant Manager, at the Ideal Novelty and Toy Company, 184-10 Jamaica Avenue, Jamaica, Long Island, New York, advised that they had not required any Personnel Security Questionnaire or non-Communist affidavit to be signed by PAGE while he was employed by them. He advised that PAGE was employed from February 28, 1949, to April 28, 1950. He stated that PAGE had not been employed on any war work during this time.

In regards to the "Congress Weekly", from whom PAGE received communication, according to a report by the Foreign Nationalities Branch of the office of Strategic Services dated October 10, 1944, the "Congress Weekly" is edited by SAMUEL CAPLAN and deals in strictly Jewish matters in the United States and abroad.

It should be noted that A. J. C. undoubtedly stands for the American Jewish Congress.

Espionage investigation of Page was instituted on the basis of information furnished by Ruth Greenglass 7-17-50, that Julius Rosenberg had told her he attempted to recruit Page to furnish information to the Russians and Rosenberg was apparently upset by Page's refusal to cooperate.

Previous security investigation of Page was instituted 7-24-44, because of information reflecting he and his wife, Stella, were CP members in Orange, New Jersey, in 1943.
