



It should be noted that a GLORIA FASCHER, according to Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, was a member and also was a delegate to the 1948 New Jersey Convention.



It has been reported by HUTH GREENGLASS, wife of DAVID GREENGLASS, also a convicted espionage agent, that her husband had told her that ROSENBERG had told him that animosity existed netween ROSENBERG and HARK PAGE. She also stated that ETHEL ROSENBERG, wife of JULIUS ROSENBERG and herself a convicted espionage agent, had taken her son, MICHAEL, to MARK PAGE's home in East Orange, New Jersey at various times.



Our placement services are without charge to employers except when an employer orders a special service, or volunteers to pay a placement fee."

THOMAS F. BRIDGE, Manager of the Stamford, Connecticut Credit Bureau, made available records concerning ACHLEICH DUAN HALLIWELL, of Rock Rimmon Road, Stamford, Connecticut, which revealed the following information. It is to be noted that A.D. PALLIWELL was the correspondent of a letter to the Postmaster at Stamford under date of August 27, 1951, representing the Scientists and Engineers Association.





A report dated October 11, 1951, reflected that the Hunter Spring Company, Inc., 8th and Maple Streets, Lansdale, Pa., has a plant #2 at 400 Pierce Street, and a warehouse at 160 East Main Street in Lansdale. Officers of the corporation were shown as KNOWLTON D. MONTGOMERY, President and Treasurer; WILLIAM J. COOK, Vide-President; and PHILIP C. CLARKE, Secretary. The firm was incorporated in Pennsylvania on December 29, 1916.

MONTGOMERY was born in Pittsburgh in 1901 and is married. He was graduated from the Washington and Jefferson College in 1921. In the same year he was successively elected Treasurer and President of the comporation. He is the son of the former president of the company. MONTGOMERY owns 425 shares of the 500 shares of capital stock authorized.

COOK was born in Brooklyn, N. Y., in 189h and is married. He has been with the company since 1922 and is Work Manager.

CLARKE was born in Camden, N. J., in 190h and is married. CLARKE studied mechanical and electrical engineering at Drexel Institute of Technology. He joined the organization in 1933 and assists COOK in managing the company.

The company has 325 employees and has a tangible network of \$518,856, as of July 31, 1951. For the first seven months of 1951, the company sales were \$1;750,000, and over 10 per cent of its volume is represented by Government work. A mortgage for \$112,000 is held by the Occidental Life Insurance Company of California. The business of the Hunter Spring Company is steadily increasing and more profitable.

The files of the Philadelphia Office contain no information identifiable with the Hunter Spring Company or its officers.

Rerep of SA JACK WEST dated 12/26/51, at Philadelphia.

In view of the possibility that PHILIP CartlankE, Secretary of the Hunter Spring Company, Lansdale, Pa., had attended Drexel Institute of Technology in Philadelphia at the time HARRY GOLD was a student there, investigation at Drexel Institute was conducted. It was believed that if CLARKE had attended Drexel contemporarily with HALLY GOLD, an interview with CLARKE concerning GOLD could be conducted, at which time CLARKE might furnish information concerning subjects of other security investigations, including MARK PAGE.

It was determined from Miss THERESE RICO, Registrar's Office, Evening School, Drexel Institute of Technology, Philadelphia, that PHILIP CORLIES CLARKE attended Drexel's Evening School from September to December 1923. It will be recalled that HARRY GOLD attended Drexel in the 1930's.

This office does not at this time intend to conduct interviews at the Hunter Spring Company, Lansdale, Pa., to determine the nature of that company's relations with the subject. It is believed that an exploratorytype investigation such as this would have to be at the flunter Spring Company might jeopardize future investigation of this case. The possibility also exists that the company's correspondence with the subject, disclosed by the Newark mail cover was an isolated communication sent to the subject by the Hunter Company in the course of its normal business activities.

In the event further investigation of this case discloses an established pattern of correspondence between the subject and the Hunter Company, the Newark Office may desire to bring this to the attention of the Philadelphia Office and the advisability of conducting an investigation at the Hunter Spring Company will be reconsidered.



Mr. WILLIAM HALPEHIN, Plant Manager, at the Ideal Novelty and Toy Company, 184-10 Jamaica Avenue, Jamaica, Long Island, New York, advised that they had not required any Personnel Security Questionnaire or hon-Communist affidevit to be signed by PAGE While he was employed by them. He advised that PAGE was employed from February 28, 1949, to April 28, 1950. He stated that PAGE had not been employed on any war work during this time.

In regards to the Williams Aero-Research Company; it should be noted that this company is no longer in existence, and therefore, it could not be ascertained whether the subject signed a Personnel Seburity Questionnaire or a non-Communist affidavit, while employed with this company. However, it should be noted that this company was operated by a PAUL WILLIAMS and Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised on November 25, 1941, that he was introduced to PAUL WILLIAMS and WILLIAMS stated he was a pilot and flew for the Spanish Loyalist Army.

Mrs. E. S. MITCHELL, Personnel Department, Beli Laboratori 463 West Street, New York City, advised that their records reflected that M. M. McKEE was presently employed with them as Superintendent of Building Operation and Maintenance. He had previously been employed with the New York Telephone Company from November 3, 1924, to June 11, 1944. He was born in New York City, March 29, 1901.

Mr. McKEE was then contacted and he advised that in a regard to MARK PAGE that PAGE had contacted him regarding some



special type of florescent lamps for use in the building occupied by the Bell Laboratories. He advised; however, that no purchase was made from PAGE.

Mr. LORD, Personnel Director of the Eutectic Welding Company, 172nd Street and Northern Boulevard, Flushing, New York; searched their records and could find no reference to MARK PAGE, either among the applications for employment or personnel correspondence. He advised that their company had no classified contract with the Government.

It should be noted that the C. H. Ribble Company is located at 261 Broadway, New York City, and it is believed that this is the company that PAGE had contact with, rather than the Bibble Company.

Mr. M. G. SAAKE, advised that this company is merely a sales agency for various manufacturers of motors, including the Howell Motor Company.

The Almak Plastics Company, 230 - 5th Avenue, New York, from whom the subject received correspondence is a sales office for the Almak Plastics Company and the Mack J. Lewis Plastics Company. Mr. LEWIS advised that there was no record concerning MARK PAGE in their office and he believed that PAGE must have been interested in purchasing some of their plastics, as a result of being circularized by mail.

DAVID MAYER, 69 Besey Street, New York, is identified as a Paint and Varnish Retail Store. Mr. DAVID MAYER advised that he knew of no one by the name of MARK PAGE.

It should be noted that the Children's Record Guild, 27 Thompson Street, New York City, is a manufacturer of children's records and no further investigation was conducted in regard to this company.

It should be noted that MORRIS WEINBERG from whom the subject received correspondence is the owner and publisher of the

"Jewish Day".

Doctor S. MARGOSHES advised in regard to the "Jewish Day" that the present owner MORHIS WEINBERG introduced a vigorous pro-Soviet policy and that he, MARGOSHES was replaced by a new editor, although MARGOSHES remained with the paper writing an English language column and occasionally criticizing the Soviet Union from time to time.

In regards to the "Congress Weekly", from whom PAGE received communication, according to a report by the Foreign Nationalities Branch of the office of Strategic Services dated October 10, 1944, the "Congress Weekly" is edited by SAMUEL CAPLAN and deals in strictly Jewish matters in the United States and abroad.

It should be noted that A. J. C. undoubtedly stands for the American Jewish Congress.

Previous security investigation of Page was instituted 7-24-44, because of information reflecting he and his wife, Stella, were CP members in Orange, New Jersey, in 1943. Investigation has established that Page had been a CP member from at least 1938 to 1948. Investigation, however, has failed to develop evidence of Page's involvement in espionage.

On 12-15-50, agents attempted to interview Page and he refused. Page also appeared before a Federal grand jury, SDNY, on 1-31-51 and 2-7-51, and refused to answer pertinent questions concerning his CP activities and associations with Rosenberg on the ground his answers might tend to incriminate him. On 2-18-53, and 3-12-53, Page was again contacted by agents and refused to be interviewed. Subject on Security Index. Additional investigation not believed warranted in view of negative results thereof. Appropriate dissemination has been made to the Department and ON1. Check of Bureau references reflects all pertinent information on subject in main case file.

RECOMMENDATION:
