This investigation is predicated upon information furnished this office by confidential informant 7-1 to the effect that the subject was a member of the Orange Branch of the Communist Party, Essex County, New ersey, on December 10, 1943. It is noted that this informant also advised that subject's wife, STELLA, was also a member of the Communist Party as of this date.

The records of the Retail Merchants Credit Bureau, Hewark, in a report dated February 17, 1942, stated that the subject and his wife, STELLA, resided at 73 South Walnut Street, Bast Orange, in a good, middle-class residential district. PAGE was said to have moved to this address two weeks before this report. He gave 12 Dessan Avenue, Troy, New York,

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and 153 Madison Avenue, New York City, as previous addresses. His present occupation was listed as a tool designer in the Engineering Department of the GEORGE SCHER ENGINEERING COMPANY. Subject was reported at this time to be making approximately \$5200 e year. Subject stated that he was formerly employed in the War Department at Watermilt, New York.

Mrs. J. MC GOVERN, wife of the superintendent of the apartment at 72 South Walnut Street, East Orange, stated that MARK and STELLA PAGE reside in an apartment at 302 this address. She could give little information of importance about the subject, and stated that he seldom mixed with other tenants.

Mrs. MC GOVERN thought that Mrs. PAGE was employed as a teacher of economics in a neighborhood New Jersey high school.

Mrs. MC GOVERN advised that she knew nothing of the type of reading material the subject received, and that she had never discussed any political beliefs with him. She stated that she did not believe the subject was presently residing at this address as she understood he had been drafted. Mrs. PAGE resides in this apartment.

Mr. ROY ROBINSON, Personnel Manager of the GEORGE SCHER ENGIN-BERING COMPANY, 116 First Street, Mewark, advised that the subject entered their employ on September 24, 1941 and left May 17, 1944.

In company records the subject had listed his date of birth as November 15, 1918 at New York City. He listed previous employers as the CURMO OPTICAL COMPANY, 518 East 16th Street, New York City, 1938, and the BULOVA WATCH COMPANY, Woodside, Long Island, New York, 1940. It is noted that in company files a photostat of a legal order for a change of name for MARCUS and STELLA HOPE-POGARSKY to MARK and STELLA PAGE. This order was issued August 15, 1940 by the City Court of New ork City.

ROBINSON advised that the subject was a radical and tempered individual who was disliked by fellow employees. ROBINSON stated the subject had never discussed political views to his knowledge while in the company employment.

Correspondence from Selective Service Board #2, New York County, 217 Bast Broadway, New York City, indicated the subject was inducted May 19, 1944 into the Navy. ROBINSON ascertained that the subject's present address was S. F. C. (R.T.) MARK PAGE, Company 1288, U.S.N.T.C., Great Lakes, Illinois.



DETAILS:

On August 4, 1946, WILLIAM CRANT, Public Relations Officer, Westinghouse Mamufacturing Company, Bloomfield, New Jersey, advised that an employee, MARK PACE, had aroused his suspicion in that he was willing to take a \$60.00 a week cut in salary in order to obtain work on a secret Navy contract at the plant.

GRANT advised that the Subject was attempting to "bump"

an engineer working on the project who had less seniority.

CRANT advised he asked the Subject how he could take a \$60.00 cut in salary. The Subject replied that he was independently wealthy and that his wife was working.

GRANT advised that the Subject was born on November 15, 1918, in New York City. He has resided since 1946 at 73 South Walnut Street, East Orange, New Jersey. He is a Navy veteran, a graduate of New York University, New York City, is married to STELLA HOPE PAGE, and was formerly employed at Material Arsenal, War Department, Watervliet, New York.

A review of the file reflects that the following information has been obtained on the Subject since reference report was submitted.

On July 7, 1944, Confidential Informant T-1 advised that the Subject was carried on the rolls of the Communist Political Association of Newark, New Jersey, in an "on leave status".

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that the Subject was acquainted with LAWRENCE MAHAN, State Party functionary, even before they were intoduced. The Informant gained the impression that PAGE was afraid of MAHAN and probably that MAHAN was responsible for the Subject having been "put over the bumps". The Informant could not elaborate on this information. The Informant gained the impression that PAGE had been subject to Party discipline.

Confidential Informant T-3 advised that the Subject was a member of the Communist Political Association, Newark, New Jersey, in 1944. At that time he was on leave, was a member of the Orange Branch, his residence was 73 South Walnut Street, East Orange, New Jersey, and that he had requested no mail be sent to his home. His occupation was a tool designer, he was 26 years of age, had a nationality origin of Russian-Jew. He entered the party in 1935.

Confidential Informant I-4 advised that a letter sent to the Subject on December 28, 1945, by GAEE BLOKSBERG who at that time was Chairman of the Essex County Veterans Committee.

The letter is as follows:

*Dear Comrade:

#Quite a number of Communist Vets have returned to Essex County. This gives us the forces for developing a program of action around the vaterans issues. NK 100-23841 MicD

"Such activities however must be organized. It is with this in mind that I'm asking you to attend a meeting at 40 Clinton Street on Wednesday, January 2, at 8:00 PM. The purpose will be to organize a veterans commission to plan and develop the work.

"Make every effort to attend. If you find it impossible to be present, please call me and let me know.

Comradely yours,

Gabe Bloksberg For the County Committee

Confidential Informant T-2 confirmed the fact that the Subject was in the veterans commission and was a representative from the Orange Branch. This confirmation was made on January 22, 1946.

Confidential Informant T-5 advised that the Subject and his wife were members of the Orange Club of the Communist Party, Essex County, New Jersey, as of July 1, 1946. The Informant advised that the Subject had requested that no mail be sent to him.

This same Informant was again contacted on February 2, 1947, at which time the Informant stated that the Subject and his wife were unofficially connected with the Orange Branch of the Communist Party and were
members of the Professional Club of the Essex County Party.

The Informant advised that the Subject was very active in the American Veterans Committee but did not attend meetings.

The Informant advised that the Subject and his wife were still residing on South Walnut Street in East Orange.

For the information of the New York Office, the Subject was born at New York City on November 15, 1918, as Marcus Pogarsky. His name was changed legally to MARK PAGE on August 15, 1940, by the City Clerk in New York City. No information has been developed regarding his background prior to his coming to New Jersey.







Confidential Informants Newark T-3 and T-1, of Imoun reliability, advised that the Professional Club is an underground organization of the Communist Party in New Jersey.

Confidential Informant Newark 2-2 of known reliability advised in early 1948 that ALIEISEMBERG, described by Newark 1-3 and 1-4 as New Jersey State Educational Director of the Communist Party, asked Subject if he would be interested in doing economic research work for the good of

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the Communist Party. EISENDERG, according to Newark T-2, explained that the work would concern such plants as the Bell Telephone Company and Public Service. Newark T-2 stated that PAGE indicated he was attending New York University three or four nights a week, but that he was otherwise unemployed and felt he could contribute his engineering emperience and training to the work, inasmuch as he had been employed by large firms in New Jersey for the past tealve years.

Confidential Informants Newark T-3 and T-1, of known reliability, stated that all EISENBERG is New Jersey State Educational Director of the Communist Party and femore organizer for the Communist Party in Passaic County, New Jersey. T-3 and T-1 further advised that EISENBERG in early 1949 set up a Communist Party front organization known as the New Jersey Research Bureau with offices at 38 Park Place, Newark, New Jersey, which is the same address as the New Jersey State Headquarters of the Communist Party. The Informants mentioned that this organization is apparently endeavoring to solicit many kinds of research information, possibly to be used in Communist Party propaganda.

By letter dated July 25, 1949, the New York Office advised that the records of the Recorder, School of Engineering, How York University, Uptown Division, contained verification of the Subject's attendance at New York City School of Engineering evening session. The record indicated that the Subject would receive an engineering degree (mechanical engineering) in the summer of 1950 if he continues to regularly attend classes the remainder of the time. The record reflected that the Subject registered at New York University in September, 1940, attended a short time and then discontinued his attendance for personal demostic reasons. The Subject returned in 1946 to continue his studies in mechanical engineering.

The record further reflected the Subject's birth date as November 15, 1916 in New York City, that he is a GI student, ASN 9093710, and that his other, DAVID TAGE, listed as a naturalized citizen and his mether, SINK TAGE, needed, were both born in Ukrainia. Other background information indicated that the Subject is married and at the time of registration, was employed in the engineering firm of Manning, Maxwell and Hoore, Jersey City, New Jersey.

Past employment was reflected as a tool designer for George Scher Engineering Sompany, assigned to the Wright Acronautical Corporation. His

address was reflected as 73 South Valnut Street, East Orange, New Jersey. He had, according to the record, at one time, around 1942, resided at 12 Desson Avenue, Troy, New York. It also disclosed that the Subject graduated Seward High School, New York, New York; that he attended the College of the City of New York from 1934 to 1933, and that he speaks German and French.

A review of the records of the Manning, Eaxwell and Moore Company,
Jersey City, New Jersey, reflects that the Subject was employed in the mirex Diviion of that corporation until February, 1949, when the division was moved to
Bridgeport, Connecticut.



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



She said that both MARK and STELLA PAGE had been active in Communist Party circles during the late 30s, but had broken off with all of their friends on the lower East Side of New York City when they moved to New Jersey about 10 years ago.

Mrs. GREENBAUM further stated that she was fairly certain that neither MARK nor STELLA had been active in the Communist Party in New Jersey.

Mrs. GREENBUAN also stated that recently RUTH GREENGLASS had come to her and told her that if MARK PAGE was involved in espionage it would be to his advantage to make a complete disclosure to the FBI. Mrs. GREENBAUN subsequently spoke to her mother, Mrs. MAX MARKOVITZ, who also resides at 73 Willet Street, New York City, who went to New Jersey to visit MARK and STELLA PAGE, and at that time told the PAGES what RUTH GREENGLASS had said. PAGE, at that time, told Mrs. MARKOVITZ that he was not involved in espionage. MARK PAGE subsequently came to New York City to see Mrs. GREENBAUN and told her that he was entirely clear in this matter. He said, however, that Mrs. GREENBAUN had no business meddling in his (PAGE'S) business and that the less she knew about his business the better off she would be. MARK PAGE

further told Mrs. GREENBAUM that she should keep her mouth shut because she is also involved. Mrs. GREENBAUM then told MARK PAGE that her former membership in the Young Communist League did not make her a spy, to which MARK PAGE replied, "That's what you think." MARK PAGE, according to Mrs. GREENBAUM, further stated that the only way he could have been involved with JULIUS ROSENBERG was because he was supposed to have obtained some equipment for ROSENBERG at one time several years ago, and that there had been a fight over this matter and that PAGE had discontinued his: friendship with ROSENBERG.

Mrs. GREENBAUM further advised that during the Spanish Civil War MARK PAGE had recruited numerous persons to fight for Loyalist Spain, but when she asked him why he didn't go to fight for Loyalist Spain, PAGE replied that he was much to important an individual and should remain in the United States to further his career.

Mrs. GREENBAUM also advised that her sister, LEONA RUDMAN, and her husband, MORRIS RUDMAN, had been at odds with the PAGES for several years. She also said that her sister, SYLVIA MARKOMITZ, had never been friendly with MARK PAGE and would have nothing to do with him. Mrs. GREENBAUM concluded the interview by saying that MARK PAGE had told her he could never be a traitor to the United States and that although she has no regard for MARK PAGE and no respect for his ideals, she does not believe he could be a "spy."



The indices of the New York Office were negative in reference to Mrs. ALFRED M. WOLF.

It should be noted that the subject also contacted a SAMUEL S. WOLF of the H. Lehman Company, Inc., 374 Park Avenue, New York City, and it is possible that this is the son of Mrs. ALFRED M. WOLF.



Re Newark letter 8/30/50 requesting authorization to interview subject and Bulet 10/3/50 requesting other investigation prior to granting of authorization to interview subject.

Interview with Mrs. CELIA KEATING, Building Superintendent, 73 South Walnut Street, East Orange, New Jersey, where PAGE resides, reflected that PAGE is around the apartment during most of the time but that he occasionally goes out during the day. Mrs. KFATING does not believe that IAGE is presently employed.

During the course of a surveillance of PAGE he was surveilled to the Enterprise Tool and Mamufacturing Company, 117 Sylvan Street, Newark, New Jersey where he stayed for a few hours. he Enterprise 176 Company reflected that the subject is not employed by that company but that he does come in now and then to do some work. It is believed probable that FAGE performs work of a consulting nature. No direct contact was made with the Enterprise Company.

From November o through 10, 1950 a physical surveillance was maintained on PAGE every evening starting in the afternoon. It was observed that PAGE was home every afternoon at the time the surveillance was instituted and it appears therefore that PAGE is not employed at the time.

Newark confidential informants have been recontacted concerning FAGE and have not been able to furnish any information concerning recent CP activity on the part of the subject. Other sources of information have failed to reflect / any CP activity on the part of PAGE. During the course of the physical surveillance mentioned above, PAGE was not observed to make any contacts with CF members or to attend any meetings nor was he observed to have any visitors. Therefore, it appeared that even though PAGE may still be a member of the CP he is not active at this time.

In view of the fact that if cooperative, rAGE will be of value in connection with the investigation involving JULIU. HOSERBAIG, authority is again requested of the Bureau to authorize an interview with rAGE at the earliest_possible date.

LEWIS September 12, 1950, at the New York Office, advised that he was a half brother of Fill and O.VII. Green SS. During the interview, the photograph of the subject was an individual who had been and he advised that the subject was an individual who had been introduced to him at the home of the ROSENBERGS at a party given on the occasion of the birth of ETHEL's first child.

He recalled that this man had been introduced to him as MARK and was told that MARK was in the exterminating business in Orange, New Jersey. He further stated that he was also told that MARK had some furniture at a place where JULIUS and ETHEL previously lived.

He recalled that the subject was at the party for about one hour and that during this time the subject agreed with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG in every point they made in a discussion of the rewspaper, "The Worker" and concerning the general Communist Party line.

BERNARD GREENGLASS, the brother of ETHEL ROSENBERG, was interviewed at the New York Office by SAS JOHN W. LEWIS and EDWIN R. TULLY on October 5, 1950, at which time GREENGLASS advised that he recognized the photograph of MARK FACE as an individual named MARK who was married to STELL MARKOWITZ and who had previously gone to school with JULIUS ROSENBERG.

He also recalled that FARK lives in Grange, New Jersey, where he is employed as an engineer of some sort. He stated that from his contact with MARK he was of the opinion that the subject was very arrogant. He could furnish no further information as to any activities of the subject.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised when shown the photograph of the subject that the man looked familiar but he could not recall or elaborate on the reason that he apparently knew this man. He could not, therefore, recall any Communist activities on the part of the subject.

Mrs. LEONA RUDMAN and Mrs. EMANUEL/ERTENBAUM, sisters of the subject's wife, were contacted and advised that they did not recall any illness on the part of the subject's wife in 1948. The purpose in asking them concerning this illness was due to the fact that DAVID GREENGLASS, in interviews, stated that ROSE BERG had furnished cuite a sum of money to one of his "boys" whose wife was sick in early 1948.

A check was also made of the "Elue Cross" Hospitalization records, 80 Lexington Avenue, New York City, but no record was found for the subject.

PURPOSE

To recommend that the New York Division be authorized to discuss with USA, SDNY, the refusal of subject to be interviewed by Agents, with a view towards bringing subject before GJ, SDNY.

DETAILS

As detailed in my memorandum 12-6-50, Ruth Greenglass informed Agents Julius Rosenberg had told her he attempted unsuccessfully to recruit subject into Russian espionage work. Recent investigation has disclosed that Rosenberg and subject are not now on friendly terms. Page was a Communist Party member in New Jersey at least from 1938 to 1948. On 12-15-50, when Newark Agents attempted to arrange an interview with him, Page advised Agents he had "nothing to say," and he refused to be interviewed.

In view of the allegations of Ruth Greenglass, together with subject's known background, it is suggested that the New York Office be authorized to discuss with USA, SDMY, Page's refusal to be interviewed so that the USA may consider the desirability of taking Page before a GJ in the SDNY.

RECOMMENDATION

That the New York Division be authorized to discussed the above-outlined situation with the USA, STMY, for his consideration as to securing a subpoena for GJ appearance of subject; if you approve, there is attached a teletype so advising New York and Newark (origin).

IN VIEW OF THE FACT THAT GLASSMAN HAS ADVISED THAT R(SENBERG ATTEMPTED TO RECRUIT PAGE FOR ESPIOHAGE AND THAT PAGE REFUSED, THE BUREAU IS REQUESTED TO CURSIDES THE ADVISABILITY OF ATTEMPTING PROSECUTION OF PAGE UNDER MISPRISION OF ESTIONAGE.

The reference to classman in the last sentence of the above-quoted teletype apparently is in error, as it was Ruth Greenglass, not Vivian Glassman, who advised that Rosenberg attempted to recruit subject for Russian espionage. For the further information and guidance of Newark, the results of your attempts to interview subject, as reflected by reftel, should have been furnished to the New York Division inasmuch as the trial of Julius Rosenberg et al is now set for 1/4/51, and one of the principal reasons for interview of subject 3 was to attempt to secure information of value of possible use in that prosecution.

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Bureau consider the advisability of attempting prosecution of Page for misprision of espionage, it would seem that the facts developed to date do not constitute sufficient basis for such a prosecution. As an indication of the views of the Department as to requirements for such a prosecution, the espionage case involving Thomas L. Black, was., with which you are familiar, can be cited. Inasmuch as Black admittedly received from Harry Gold considerable information re Gold's espionage activities, and had never reported such information to the proper authorities, the opinion of the Department as to prosecution of Black for misprision of a felony was submitted.

concealment from the authorities of his knowledge of Gold's espionage involvement was not sufficient to support a prosecution for misprision of a felony. It was pointed out by the Department that previous court decisions have held that an affirmative act of concealing evidence must be shown, and that mere concealment of knowledge of the commission of a felony is insufficient grounds for prosecution.

Rebulet 12/26/50 requesting observations from this office as to the desirability of attempting to interview PAGE in the manner used.

By letter dated November 16, 1950 this office requested authorization from the Bureau to interview PAGE for any information he might be able to furnish concerning JULIUS ADSENBERG.

Bureau letter dated December 6, 1950 authorized interview with PAGE to be conducted by two experienced Agents.

As pointed out in rebulet, information had been received that PAGE and ROSENBERG are not now on friendly terms. No information has been received that PAGE engaged in espionage but on the contrary that he actually refused ROSENBERG'S request to participate. It was felt, therefore, that PAGE would not be hostile to interview; and even if not completely informative, would at least furnish routine background information on ROSENBERG.

It is further noted that PAGE has no regular employment and consequently would have to be interviewed at home or at the Newark office, This facts were considered together with the complexities of the ROSENBERG case, probable length of interview, and facilities available in the Newark office; and after discussion with the supervisor, it was felt desirable that the interview be conducted at the Newark office rather than at PAGE'S home where his wife and daughter would be present.

In view of the fact that the Bureau has received only sketchy information concerning this office's contacts with PAGE, the following information is being set forth:

On Thursday, December 14, 1950, telephonic contact was made with PAGE by Special Agent THOMAS M. O'CONNOR to whom this case is assigned. PAGE was told that his cooperation in a matter of importance was desired and he was invited to come to the Newark office.

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Letter to DIRECTOR, FBI NK 100-23881

PAGE stated that he would be glad to cooperate with the FBI but preferred to be interviewed at his residence and made an appointment for interview at his residence on Saturday, December 16, 1950 which was the earliest date that PAGE stated he would be available. This conversation was carried on very amicably. PAGE made no inquiry as to the nature of the information which he was desired to furnish and in view of this, no reason was volunteered to him.

On December 15, 1950 PAGE telephoned the Newark office and again spoke to Special Agent THOMAS M. O'CONNOR. At this time he stated that he did not wish to be interviewed saying that he had "nothing to say". At this time he was advised that his assistance was requested in the investigation of JULIUS ROSENBERG who was under indictment for espionage. (It is known that PAGE was aware of ROSENBERG'S indictment for espionage). He again declined saying that he had "nothing to say".

It was pointed out to him that the Federal Government was requesting his cooperation in an important matter. He again declined interview.

At no time during these conversations was any indication given to PAGE that the Bureau was interested in any way in his own activities but that the Bureau was only interested in any assistance he could give concerning the investigation of ROSENBERG.

PAGE would not elaborate on his reason for his refusal to be interviewed.

GRISCTI of the building located at 106-15 queens Boulevard, Forest Hills, New York, advised that a family by the name of HERMES resides in the building and consists of the father, PAUL HERMES, and a son, W. I. NER ES. He advised that the son, W. L. HERMES, is almost deaf and to his knowledge is not presently employed. He could furnish no information concerning the family except that they were good tenants and never seemed to have too much company.

The Credit Bureau of Greater New York was checked against the name W. L. HE JES, and no record was found.

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The indices of the New York Office were searched against the name W. L. HERNES and PAUL HERNES and nothing was found under these names.

The same informant a vised that the subject received correspondence from Mrs. IRVINE COHEN, 109 Ocean Front, Long Beach, New York.

The name Mrs. IRVING CCHEN was checked with the Credit Bureau of Greater New York and no record was found under this name in connection with the above accress.

The following investigation was conducted at Long Beach, New York by SA GARTH GRAY:

Post Office, Long Beach, New York, advised that there is an Ocean Front Street in Long Beach but the numbers start at 1000.

The address 1095 Ocean Front Street was checked inasmuch as 109 Ocean Front is apparently an incorrect address, and the owner of 1095 Ocean Front Street is J. J. BOWE. This is summer home and is closed at present. The address of J.J. BOWE is 437 Ogden Avenue, West Englewood, New Jersey.

It should be noted that the area of Long Beach is a seaside resort with many visitors during the summer who never submit a change of address. Therefore, no further investigation was conducted to locate Mrs. IRVING COMMER.

Dr. MAX LIONEL HART, 6345 Wethercle Drive, Rego Park, New York, was interviewed on November 1, 1950, and November 20, 1950, by SAS RICHARD A. KINIVAN and STUART J. CAMERON.

Dr. HART advised in reference to the subject and his wife that they were former extients of his and that MARK PAGE's name was originally POGARSHI and his wife's maiden name was MARKOWITZ. MARK

He stated that he knew of no information concerning the PAGEs and his relationship with them has been strictly professional. He did recall that the PAGEs had originally recommended the ACSMALERGS (JULIUS and ET.EL, presently under indictment for espionage).

The PAGEs, according to Dr. HART, visited him originally in 1935 or 1936 and were his patients until they moved to Orange, New Jersey, about five years ago. In reference to the first visit of the PAGEs, Dr. HART advised that he had been acquainted for many years with a Krs. BERTHA ESKIN, whose maiden name he believed to be CIRCURA, and is presently residing at 1444 Park Place, Brooklyn, and it was Mrs. ESKIN who originally recommended the PAGEs.

In the way of background, Dr. HERT stated that Mrs. PERTHA ESKIN has a brother-in-law. SMARFIN, who was about ten years ago. Furthermore, he bilieved that Ers. Shella Fade is a cousin of SMARFIN's wife. 57

It should be noted that in an application for a clerical position with the Federal Bureau of Investigation dated October 24, 1941, filed by HELENELITCHER, nee HELEN STERNEERG, the name of BERTHA ESKIN, 1444 Park Place, Brooklyn, was listed as a reference.

In December, 1950, Newark Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised this office that PAGE was under consideration for employment with ELECTRONIC ASSOCIATES INCORPORATED, located at Long Branch, New Jersey. ARTHUR L. ADAMSON, Vice President of ELECTRONIC ASSOCIATES INCORPORATED, advised that the subject had been referred to them by an employment agency for a position as engineer. According to information furnished by Mr. ADAMSON, PAGE indicated that he had been employed from May, 1950 until the time of his application with ELECTRONIC ASSOCIATES INCORPORATED which was dated in December, 1950, being in charge of Management of Design and Development of Novelties for a metal products company, which included negotiations with vendors and contractors. No additional information concerning this employment is in the possession of Mr. ADAMSON.

Mr. ADAMSON further advised that under date of December 12, 1950, he had written a letter to PAGE advising him that he was no longer being considered for employment with ELECTRONIC ASSOCIATES INCORPORATED.

In February, 1951, Newark Confidential Informant T-2 advised that the subject was being investigated by the RETAIL CREDIT COMPANY of Newark, New Jersey for employment with some firm unknown to T-2. The records of the RETAIL CREDIT COMPANY located at 36 Commerce Street, Newark, New Jersey, contained a report of an investigation conducted by the RETAIL CREDIT COMPANY concerning MARK PAGE, at the request of the MASSACHUSETTS MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, with offices in the Raymond Commerce Building, Newark, New Jersey. These records contained no additional background information concerning PAGE, other than the fact that he had listed his present employment as being with the MOTHERCRAFT TOY COMPANY, which agency was not contacted by the RETAIL CREDIT COMPANY. It was indicated in the files of the RETAIL CREDIT COMPANY that the subject was not employed by the MASSACHUSETTS MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY.

On November 7, 1950, Special Agent JOHN R. BRETT and the writer observed the subject's wife, STELLA HOPE PAGE, depart from her residence, 73 So. Walnut Street, at approximately 7:15 p.m. and proceed to Public School # 34 in East Orange, New Jersey. A catalogue which was available at P. S. # 34, contained information that STELLA HOPE PAGE was a teacher of adult education evening classes at Public School # 34 several nights a week, from 7:45 p.m. to

Newark Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, has previously advised that PAGE received correspondence bearing a return address -J. RICH, 5741 Clemson Street, Los Angeles, California, which correspondence was

postmarked August 16, 1950. The Los Angeles Office had identified J. RICH as being identical with JACOB RICH, concerning whom the following information is set forth.

JACOBIRICH was born March 30, 1903 at Jersey City, New Jersey. In 1944, he resided at 94 South Munn Avenue in East Orange, New Jersey and was employed in 1943 as a campaign director for the United Jewish Appeal of Essex County, New Jersey. On December 10, 1943, Newark Confidential Informant T-4 of known reliability, advised that JACK RICH of 94 So. Munn Avenue, East Orange, New Jersey, was a member of the of t Party. On June 21, 1945, Newark Confidential Informant Tub, of known reliability, advised that of Essex RICH was at that time a member of the County, and that he had been recruited by the Party in 1935. In June of 1946, Newark Confidential Informant T-6 of known reliability, advised that of the Party. On January 8, 1947 RICH was a member of the T-6 advised that as of that time RICH was a member of the Party. On November 17, 1948, Newark Confidential Informant of the T-7 of known reliability, advised that RICH was a Party member, and at that time was residing in Los Angeles, California. In October, 1948, the New York Office advised that RICH had been employed with the National Urban League, 1183 Broadway, New York City but had resigned on September 1, 1948 and moved to 5741 Clemson Street, Los Angeles, California. b7C

On December 15, 1950, MARK PAGE refused to be interviewed by agents of the Newark Office, or furnish any information concerning his knowledge of JULIUS ROSENBERG, who is currently on trial in New York City under indictment for espionage. At the time of the attempted interview, PAGE advised that he had "nothing to say".

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater Newark, Incorporated 24 Branford Place, Newark, New Jersey reflect that ALFRED J. AMMERMAN presently resides at 31 No. 9th Street and formerly resided at 53 New Street, East Orange, New Jersey. These records reflect that he is employed with the Motor Fuel Division of the New Jersey State Tax Department, 1060 Broad Street, Newark, New Jersey, He is described as white, married, middle-aged, wife (ELIZABETH C.) dependent. He resided at the address in East Orange for 17 years and is employed as an inspector. Prior to this employment which was obtained in April, 1940, he had been employed as a bookkeeper with the U.S. Treasury Department, State Accounts Office, 1060 Broad Street, Newark, New Jersey for one year. He had for many years previous to that been engaged in IMCA work. The files of the Credit Bureau contain nothing on W. WILSON RYNO. However the latest Newark City Directory, which is for the year 1947 lists W. WILSON RYNO as a manufacturer's agent with offices in rooms 306-7, 1060 Broad Street, Newark, New Jersey and that he resides at 37 Belgrade Terrace, West Orange, New Jersey. There was no information in the files of this office concerning AMMERMAN or RYNO.

Mr. ADAMSON of the ELECTRONICS ASSOCIATES INCORPORATED, Long Branch, New Jersey, who furnished information which is reported in the details of this report, adviced that he believed that the subject had been referred to his company by the Technical Service Agency, Incorporated, 217 Broadway, New York, New York by their agent, H. W. PALEN.

of the Fidelity Union Trust Company, East Orange, New Jersey, advised that the subject and his wife had a joint checking account which was opened in January 1942. This account was closed in 1944, at which time the subject opened a Special Checking Account, which was again changed togather Checking Account in February, 1946. He further advised that the subject also has a savings account which was also opened in 1942. In addition, advised that the January 31, 1951 balance of the checking account was \$414,99 and that of the savings account was \$767.18. He advised that the

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check account reflects normal activity. These accounts reflect that the savings account was opened on January 13, 1942 with an initial deposit of \$125.67. As of May 22, 1943 balance in this account was \$1,937.74. The largest balance for this account was as of July 5, 1944, at which time it was \$3,720.19. The largest deposit noted for this account was \$1,576.00 on December 1, 1948, which made the balance at that time \$2,378.54.

advised that the Special Checking Account was opened on Oct-Printer Commence ober 30, 1944 with a balance of \$223.16. It was closed on February 26, 1946 and the highest balance for this account was \$247.29 on February 27, 1945. He advised that the Regular Checking Account of the subject was first opened on January 22, 1942, with a deposit of \$250.00, that the highest balance prior to the opening of the Special Account was \$565.21. The Regular Checking Account was reopened on February 23, 1946 with a deposit of \$720.09. It might be noted that in August of 1950 subject made the following deposits in his checking. account: \$250 on August 1st; \$450 on August 8th; \$950 on August 28th, at which time the balance of this account was \$1,145.51 In connection with this account, advised that the bank has no photographs of checks which were drawn. on the subject's accounts. However, he advised that the bank does have photographs of checks which were deposited to this account and which were drawn on out of town banks, which he explained would have been on banks other than those in the Newark metropolitan area. He advised that they would have no photographs of checks deposited and drawn on local banks.

Company has fourteen branch banks and that all checks from all of these branch banks are photographed in a group and filed in the main office without any breakdown. He advised that in order to locate any particular check, it would be necessary to review the film of all the checks forwarded from all of these branch banks for any given date.

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In referenced report, the Buffalo Office was requested to identify subscriber to telephone number Delaware 7985 at Tonawanda, New York. Buffalo office has advised this number is listed to ALVIN C. BENNET who was employed as a railroad mail ckerk and that in view of his government employment, no additional investigation was being conducted concerning him.





The investigation concerning the above-named individual has developed information indicating that Page entered the Communist Party around 1935 and that, through a highly confidential source known to the Bureau, it was determined that he was a member of the Orange Branch of the Communist Party, Essex County, New Jersey, as of December 10, 1943.

In view of this information, it is desired that an immediate check be made through the various known places of employment of Page to determine whether he has ever executed a Personnel Security Questionnaire by reason of his being engaged in classified work in behalf of the armed forces. Any such PSQ's, if located, should be examined and photostatic copies thereof made available to the Bureau. It is pointed out in that respect that Page's answer to the usual question as to his organizational membership on such PSQ's might be of interest in connection with this matter.

In addition, it is desired that appropriate inquiry be made at any of these places of employment where he is known to have engaged in classified work to determine the exact nature of the classified projects and material to which he may have had access. Such information may be of considerable value at some future date in the event of further developments in connection with the investigation of the Rosenberg related cases.

You should give this matter your immediate attention.


