

No ROBERT E. PFLECLER could be located at 5411 Cleveland S.W., Canton, Chio, but a ROBERT E. PFLECER resided at 5411 Cleveland N.W., North Canton, Chio, and moved from there late in 1945. While in Canton PFLECER was employed by Timken Roller Bearing Company in the Advertising Department. He was so employed from November 22, 1943, to October 31, 1945, at which time he quit to secure a better position and moved to Cleveland, Chio, where he went to work for the Meldrum Fewsmith Advertising Agency in Cleveland.

Records at Timken indicate PFLEGER was born December 12, 1907, in Cleveland, his wife's name is MILDRED and his father, HARRY R. PFLEGER, as of 1942 resided at 2005 Treadway, Cleveland, and was employed by the Aluminum Company of America. Records at Timken also indicate that ROBERT E. Serial 24 of Cleveland file 100-16990 reflects that one s source of information, advised SA EDWIN B. BIRNEY on June 15, 1950, that SOL BAUER, "President of an international engineering society and artist", visited KALMAN KUBINYI (CP member) at his home. At the time of this visit SAMUEL HANDLEMAN (CP attorney) and YETTA LAND (CP attorney) were also present. MOSES described BAUER as a loyal citizen who may be in a position to furnish information regarding the activities of KALMAN KUBINYI.

SA BIRNEY recontacted on July 21, 1950. At that advised SA BIRNEY that the SOL BAUER who was acquainted with KALMAN KUBINYI is identical to the SOL BAUER who is President of the Eauer Surveys Company. Dr. ROBERT CADMUS, Assistant Director of University Hospital, Western Reserve University, reviewed records of ANNE SIDOROVICH, an obstetrical patient from May 8, 1949, to May 18, 1949. According to Dr. Carries, the maiden name of ANNE SIDOROVICH is HANUSIAK, born July 8, 1918, at New Haven, Connecticut, and a statement was contained on the admitting form that she had resided in this county approximately us months at the time of admission. Entry application indicates that her husband is MICHAEL A. SIDOROVICH, a draftsman for the Tucker Industries to January, 1949 and at the time of admittance was unemployed. Application reflects that MICHAEL was born in New York and was 32 years of age. It reflects that a girl, ANDREA ANN has born to the couple on May 9, 1949. This was registered as a legitimate birth and the first child, the first time of pregnancy, and no previous pregnancies or miscarriages noted. The couple were residing at 8706 Carnegie Avenue and financial arrangements for the hospital charges were largely covered by Blue Cross policy #4-134455, 🧺 GR #3317. 2017. Caracta noted that this policy had formerly been the Tucker Industries group but had subsequently been transferred to that of an individual policy.

ANNE SIDOROVICH was the private patient of Dr. R. W. BARNEY of the Hanna Building in Cleveland and indications are that her first visit to Dr. BARNEY was on December 8, 1949, and there is a record of a subsequent visit to this physician on May 6, 1949, three days prior to the birth of the child. There is one record on ANNE SIDOROVICH's chart of a dilitation curettege in February, 1949, but the place is unknown. Hospital charges for ANNE SIDOROVICH were covered by the Cleveland Hospital Service Association.: There were nine days charges for the baby at \$4.50 a day and telephone charges of \$1.70, for a total of \$42.70, charges paid in cash. ir. CAP stated in reference to the telephone charges that \$1.00 is the installation fee and that ten cents is then charged for each local call. He advised that records of outgoing calls, long distance and collect calls, are kept only for a period of six months and he would have no way of ascertaining any outgoing calls on the phone during the hospitalization of ANNE SIDOROVICH.

This brokerage office is located in Room LO7, Union Building, 1836 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, and is called the "Business Brokers - Investments". The owner is Mr. G. A. GAFFORD Mr. GAFFORD was interviewed on July 24, 1950, and furnished the following information:

Subject was employed by Mr. GAFFORD during the period August, 1949 to February, 1950, as a real estate salesman. Subject came to GAFFORD along with DAVID JAMES GORDON and FOSTER NAPP. At that time GORDON became office manager for Mr. GAFFORD and he brought SIDOROVICH and NAPP with him.

GAFFORD stated that it was his opinion SIDOROVICH was Russian.

GAFFORD stated that SIDOROVICH had told him he was an engineer by trade and that he intended to go back to engineering when he left Mr. GAFFORD's employ. Mr. GAFFORD also stated that at one time, upon coming into the office, he heard GORDON and SIDOROVICH in a discussion of Communism. It appeared to GAFFORD that SIDOROVICH leaned toward Communism although he could point no specific examples to the belief other than the general impression he gained from hearing SIDOROVICH's conversation on the one instance.

Navy during the past war and was expecting to be called at the present time he became highly incensed upon hearing GORDON's and SIDOROVICH's conversation and ordered them to cease talking along these lines in his office.

GAFFORD stated that GORDON, SIDOROVICH and NAPP had been employed by the Serpas Realty Company prior to the time they entered his employ.

Foundation is located at 7016 Euclid Avenue. This concern is a combination real estate broker and real estate salesman's school. On the same date the writer interviewed Mr. WILLIAM J. Mr. SERPAS said that this was not an unusual arrangement and through a combination of practical experience and private tutoring he offered prepared prospects for the real estate salesman's examination

in a matter of one or two months. DAVID GORDON also came to SERPAS at about the same time and entered into a similar arrangement.

SIDOROVICH did not make any sales while connected with SERPAS but was successful in obtaining a salesman's real estate license (#21686). GORDON also obtained a license, the number of which Mr. SERPAS was unable to find.

GORDON stating that SERPAS was interested in doing business "for love" while he (GORDON) was interested in doing business to make money. SERPAS stated that GORDON was inclined to "cut corners too fine" doing "nothing illegal but always skating on thin ice". SERPAS stated that he did not care to do business this way so they severed their relationship, GORDON leaving and taking SIDOROVICH and NAPP with him.

All three then entered the employ of Mr. GAFFORD.

By way of background information, Mr. SERPAS stated that during the course of his acquaintanceship with GORDON, GORDON had told him that prior to June, 1949, he had been a "hot shot" real estate salesman doing business as the "Gordon Sales" with an office in a downtown hotel in Miami, Florida. Mr. SERPAS stated that he attempted to check this information through a credit concern and that the credit concern was unable to locate any trace of GORDON in Miami, Florida. GORDON also told SERPAS that he had at one time been connected with the trucking business and led SERPAS to believe that he had committed a felony and "had done time". From GORDON's conversation, SERPAS believed that he had previously spent considerable time in Ohio and SERPAS believed that GORDON's incarceration might have been in Ohio.

Both Miss KAY and Mr. GAFFORD stated that SIDOROVICH had told them that he planned to change his name from SIDOROVICH to SIDNEY because of the inconvenience of the name SIDOROVICH.

for about twenty years. SERPAS believed that GORDON, who he described as a very smooth and slick talker, had talked NAPP into going along with him. Both NAPP and GORDON, according to SERPAS, are presently employed at the Bassett Realty Company, Central National Bank Building, West 25th Street and Lorato, Cleveland, Ohio.

SERPAS explained that for a salesman to receive a license in Ohio it was necessary that he be sponsored by a licensed broker. In the case of GORDON and SIDOROVICH one Mr. ALVIN SWICK, 3562 Antisdale, Cleveland, acted as sponsor.

Miss KAY telephoned a friend of hers under the employ of SWICK and ascertained that SWICK has a very poor opinion of GORDON; however, no details were learned.

Mr. SERPAS advised that all candidates for licensing at the Real Estate Board in Ohio submit a detailed statement of background information. He said that this information could be obtained through Mr. L. F. WOLDBAUER, Secretary, State Board of Real Estate Examinations, Department of Commerce, State of Ohio (teletype lead has been directed to Cincinnati to obtain this background information in the case of SIDOROVICH and CORDON).

The indices of the Cleveland Office contain no information regarding FOSTER NAPP.

Other background concerning GORDON has been made the subject of a separate memorandum.

All of the individuals interviewed above were requested to keep the Bureau's interest in this matter on a strictly confidential basis. All promised that they would do so.



According to LOCH, they are not particularly cooperative tenants and LOCH has had several small verbal battles with the SIDOROVICHS.

During the time SIDOROVICH resided at this address he has sold real estate and has been employed by a furnace concern near Fenn College, the exact name of which is unknown to Mr. LOCH.

Visited the SIDOROVICHS last year at the time he was supposed to be on his way to service in Japan.

The SIDOROVICES originally came from New York State.

MICHAEL S. SIDCROVICH was absent on a business trip for approximately a week or ten days during the time ANNE was in the hospital when their baby was born. Prior to the time the baby was born, the SIDCROVICHS made frequent week-end trips, destination unknown to the LOCHS. They have been away two week-ends since the baby was born.

The SIDCROVICES used to receive lots of mail and a considerable number of papers and literature, mostly from New York. They subscribed to the "New York Times" for a while. Presently, they do not receive so much mail. LOCH believes that SIDOROVICH receives the "Cleveland Union Leader."

During the period immediately after their baby was born, the SIDOROVICHS were quite friendly with SONALD and GLADYS KRAUSE, the KRAUSES living immediately across the hall from SIDOROVICHS. SONALD KRAUSE was then employed with the Veterans Administration, working in the Contact office at Akron, Chio. The KRAUSES moved from this address approximately a year ago and are believed to be presently residing at Dayton, Chio. KRAUSE is believed to be working for some "big Jewish organization" and, according to the LOCHS, has bought a home in Dayton.

In connection with the surveillance of SA EDWIN B. BIRNEY on July 31, 1950, it is to be noted that at 11:05 PM SIDOROVICH and an unknown woman were observed leaving the apartment building occupied by SIDOROVICH at 8706 Carnegie. SIDOROVICH was carrying a large suitcase and the woman was carrying a shopping bag which appeared to be full. SIDOROVICH and the woman were observed in SIDOROVICH's car driving west on Carnegie and SIDOROVICH was driving. The car entered the underground ramp to the Terminal Tower, the woman left the car and entered the station, and SIDOROVICH drove off. Upon entering the station the woman carried the shopping bag. The disposition of the suitcase was not known, but may have been checked at the baggage counter adjacent to the entrance by the unknown woman or by a porter.

The unknown woman is described as white, female, about 40 years of age, light brown almost sandy hair - rolled in back and fairly short, wore rimless glasses, no hat, light pea green short coat or jacket, and carried paper shopping bag.

The unknown woman boarded New York Central Train #9, Car 2129-C, which departed from Cleveland 10:35 PM EST, July 31, 1950, and was due to arrive in Chicago at 5:55 AM CST, August 1, 1950.

The following investigation was conducted by the writer on July 27th and August 1 and 2, 1950:

were checked in an effort to obtain background information concerning ANNE SIDOROVICH. These records reflect that ANNE SIDOROVICH was hired by the Lindner Co'y (now known as Lindner-Davis) on April 13, 1946 as a saleslady. She resigned her position voluntarily on December 22, 1948 because of her pregnancy. Her social security number was listed as 058-16-8214. Her maiden name was shown as ANNE HANUSIAK.

nationality is shown as Ukrainian. Her husband was listed as Michael and his occupation is shown as being a designing draftsman. She attended New Haven High School and stated that she was experienced at designing clothes. She listed as her last employer, Mr. RAYMOND MARINELLI, Tailored Woman, Pifth Avenue, New York Oity. She said that she began her employ with that company on October, 1944 and left on January, 1945.

She listed the following individuals as references:

DR. CUMMINGS, Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio

The files of the Lindner-Davis Company also contain a letter from her former employer, RAYMOND MARINELLI, 61 West 56th Street, New York City. In the letter he stated that ANNE HANUSIAK had been in his employ; that she was an honest and capable employee, but was not employed as a dress designer. He did not state in the letter what her occupation had been. This letter was dated May 22, 1946.

The files also contain various rating sheets made by ANNE SIDOROVICH's supervisors at the Lindner-Davis Company. These contain no information of particular value with the exception that in one her name is shown as ANNE SID. The above information was made available by LEONARD SMALL, Employment Manager, Lindner-Davis Company.

The records of the Cleveland College, Western Reserve University, Public Square, Cleveland, were checked for the purpose of ascertaining what information they might have concerning subject, MICHAEL SIDOROVICH. These records show SIDOROVICH to have been born on July 6, 1916 in New York City. He listed himself as a graduate of Stuyvesand High School (probably in New York City) in 1935. He also stated that he had attended Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn 1943-45. Cleveland College records reflect that SIDOROVICH enrolled in one course during the winter session of 1947, attending a class in Real Estate Law from September, 1947 to February, 1948. This course gave him two semester credit hours and he obtained a grade of B in this course.

He also attended the college from February 1950 to June 1950 at which time he enrolled in a course entitled "Fundamentals of Chemistry." He received four semester credit hours for this course and received a grade of C. There was no further information in the files of Cleveland College concerning MICHAEL SIDOROVICH.

A number of the residents in the apartment house at 8706 Carnegie Avenue were contacted by the writer in an attempt to obtain information concerning the SIDOROVICH's. Photographs of the following individuals were displayed to those residents herein after listed:

It should be noted that Suites #14 and #15 are in the basement of the apartment house; suites 1 through #4 are on the first floor; suites #5 through #8 are on the second floor and #9 through #12 are on the third floor.

The following individuals were interviewed and the comments made by them are set out after the names:

MRS. C. O. SCHROEDER

Wrs. SCHROEDER is an elderly woman, the mother of Mrs. G. F. UTTER. Both Mr. and Mrs. UTTER are employed and Mrs. SCHROEDER is in the apartment most of the time. She said that she had been living in Apartment #1 with her daughter for approximately one year, but that her daughter had resided there for approximately six years. Mrs. SCHROEDER did not know the SIDOROVICHS except to greet them, but had not formed a friendship with them. She could furnish no information concerning their background or their associates.

When displayed the photographs of the persons listed hereinbefore, Mrs. SCHROEDER was not able to identify any of them with the exception of a photograph of WILLIAM PERL. She stated that PERL resembled an individual who she had seen getting into a car in front of the apartment house a few months before. In this connection, she stated that she could not be positive that it was the individual whose photograph she was shown as she could not recall the make or model of the car into which the individual had entered. She could not state whether this person had left the apartment house or simply was in the neighborhood on other business.

Mrs. FULTON stated that she has resided at the apartment house



for about a year. Although she resides directly across the hall from the SIDOROVICH suite, she stated that she had not been friendly with them and only knew them casually. She stated that she had never visited their apartment nor had they visited her apartment. Mrs. FULTON was shown the photographs listed above, and what appeared an effort to be helpful, she identified a picture of ROSENBERG, stating that he resembled an individual who Mrs. SIDOROVICH had said was her brother. This individual and his wife had visited the SIDOROVICHs approximately a year ago, having come here from Florida, she believed. She also stated that this person, according to Mrs. SIDOROVICH, was then going into the Army.

and VIVIAN GLASSMAN, stating that they both resembled the wife of the person who Mrs. SIDOROVICH stated was her brother. It appeared that Mrs. FULTON was trying to be helpful and it is believed unlikely that her identifications are accurate. In any case, she stated that there was only a resemblance and definitely did not identify any of the photographs.

Mrs. FULTON stated that her husband is not acquainted with the SIDOROVICHS at all.

MRS. S. GERALD CLOSE

since shortly after the arrival of the SIDOROVICHs in Cleveland. She advised that up until a year or so ago, she and her husband had been on very friendly terms with the SIDOROVICHs, visiting each other two or three times a week. She added that it was at her insistence that she persuaded her husband to discontinue the close friendship with the SIDOROVICHs. She advised that MICHAEL SIDOROVICH impressed her as a rather uncouth individual with "disgusting" eating habits. She stated that this primarily was the reason for the lessening of the friendship. She advised that in spite of her close friendship with the subjects, they had never talked a great deal about themselves and that she has very little information concerning their background or their associates. She advised that she did not recall meeting any visitors the SIDOROVICHs may have had and does not recall the names of any individuals with whom they might have been friendly.

Mrs. CLOSE further stated that she understood that the SIDOROVICHS have or had some uncultivated property which they were trying to sell through somebody in New York. She believed the property to be in Pennsylvania, although she was not certain on this point. During the course of the conversation with Mrs. CLOSE the aforementioned photographs were displayed to Mrs. CLOSE and the names of those individuals were mentioned to her.

She stated that the name of SARANT sounded vaguely familiar as the individual in New York through whom SIDOROVICH was attempting to sell his property. She also stated that when SIDOROVICH was engaged in the real estate business, he used the name SID or SIDD. An attempt was made to determine who the close friends of the SIDOROVICHS might be in Cleveland.

Mrs. CLOSE stated that the subjects had been friendly with the KRAUSE family who resided at the apartment house until approximately a year ago. She stated that the KRAUSEs presently live on East 115th or East 117th Street, off of Euclid Avenue. She was questioned concerning KRAUSE's first name and stated that she had seen both the name DONALD and SONALD on his mail.

Mrs. CLOSE further stated that the SIDOROVICHS had been on very friendly terms with the RALPH MINERS who occupied Suite #5 until approximately two years ago. She stated that she believes MINER lives on Crawford Avenue and also stated that she was under the impression that MINER had been in trouble with law enforcement authorities over the issuance of some fraudulent checks.

In addition, Mrs. CLOSE stated that a family by the name of GARCIA had occupied an apartment in the building until approximately 3½ years ago. The SIDOROVICHS, according to her, were close friends of the GARCIAS. She stated that she did not know the present whereabouts of the GARCIAS. Mrs. CLOSE added that a Cleveland Police Department Patrolman, whose last name is GALLASSO had formerly lived in Suite #7 and because of his occupation may know something about the SIDOROVICHS. She stated, however, that he had not been friendly with them. She did not know his present address.

Mrs. CLOSE appeared to be very cooperative and indicated that she would be willing to assist the FBI in any way in this matter. She appears to be intelligent and it is believed that she will use discretion should she be requested to assist in this investigation.

MR. S. GERALD CLOSE

Mr. CIOSE was interviewed at his place of business the THERM-O-ALARM Sales Company, 1935 Enclid Avenue, which company he owns. Mr. CIOSE advised, as did his wife, that until approximately a year or so ago, he and his wife had been on very friendly terms with the SIDOROVICHS. The only information he could add to that given by his wife, was that the subjects took a trip either to SaltLake City or to Denver during the latter part of 1948 or during the first part of 1949. He stated that the date could be more accurately fixed by determining the date when SIDOROVICH purchased his Studebaker. He stated that the trip was taken shortly after he made the purchase.
