The writer and SA DAVID A. WIBLE interviewed MICHAEL SIDOROVICH and AMN SIDOROVICH on March 15, 1951, ANN being interviewed at her home the morning of March 15 and MICHAEL being interviewed at his place of employment and on route therefrom to Pontious' Restaurant at 86th and Carnegie Avenue, Cleveland.


ann again denied any involvement in the ROSENBERG espionage parallel and denied any knowledge of WILLIAM PERL. She advised she had heard the news of PERL's arrest and appeared a bit incensed at the publicity given her as a result of DAVID's testimony indicating she was to be a courier between ROSENBERG and GREENGLASS. Although ANN attempted to appear cooperative, she did not feign the attitude of cooperation she has evidenced in the past. She referred to her name being mentioned in the papers as a smear campaign, although she did not press this point, and turned to the point of Communism and the fact that persons labeled Communists are often left without employment and in dire straits.

ANN corroborated MICHAEL's previous statement that they had received a blanket from JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG as a gift to their child, ANDREA ANNE, at the time of ANDREA's birth in 1949.

On reinterview, MICHAEL again exhibited interest in the sentences received by ALGER HISS, HARRY GOLD and WILLIAM REMINGTON and the comparative sentences received by each. He did again deny his involvement in any espionage activities but after a few moments, it was noted he stopped making his usual periodic protestations of innocence. MICHAEL appeared quite nervous and again appeared to be weighing the courses open to him.

He denied knowing WILLIAM PERL but stated he felt he would be arrested since one count against PERL involved PERL's denial of knowing SIDOROVICH.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ARLO J. QUIIL, and concerns the interview of Mr. and Mrs. A. A. EUSE, Apartment 9, 8706 Carnegie Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio.


The EUSEs advise that they are not closely acquainted with the SIDOROVICH family but stated that they have been on speaking terms with them since they, the EUSES, moved into the apartment approximately three years ago.

They advised that they have never been given any reason to question the loyalty of the SIDOROVICH family, but added that they had overheard peculiar noises eminating from the SIDOROVICH apartment in the early morning hours (1 AM to 3 AM) which lasted for about one to two hours. They described this noise as sounding like a "printing press" with a regular beat and vibration as though from a heavy machine. Mr. EUSE related that frequently there would be a "swishing" noise during which there was water running quite rapidly. They advised that the washing machines through all apartments were kept in the basement and that Mrs. SIDOROVICE maintained a regular washing day schedule. It was ascertained that this noise was first heard approximately one year ago and was last heard about three weeks ago.

Mrs. EUSE stated that she believed Mrs. SIDOROVICH had a brother presently living in Japan with his family but could furnish no further information regarding this. She related that ANNE had stated this to her during the holidays when they were discussing Christmas presents.

Mrs. EUSE also advised that the SIDOROVICH family had very few visitors during the past few years, but that about two years ago a family frequently spent three or four days a week with the SIDOROVICHs and she believed these people were from Pennsylvania since they were driving an old model "dirty cream" colored auto with Pennsylvania license (this is probably ANN's brother, MICHAEL HANUSIAK). She stated that she believed she

would recognize one of the persons whom she described as quite tall with blond hair, wearing work clothes or "fermer" clothes. She added she knew of no other visitors and both Mr. and Mrs. EUSE advised that they did not recognize any of the pictures of the ROSEMBERG Espionage ring.

Mrs. EUSE stated that Mr. and Mrs. CLOSE, now living at 27480 Treamane Drive, Euclid, Ohio, were very closely acquainted with the SIDOROVICH family during the time the family resided in the apartment house and also stated that a family by the name of KRAUSE, formerly tenants in the apartment directly across the hall from the SIDOROVICH family, had been closely acquainted with the family for several years during the recent war. She stated that the KRAUSE family now reside in Dayton, Ohio, having moved from the apartment approximately two years ago. (Both the CLOSEs and the KRAUSEs have been interviewed. The CLOSEs are in contact with this office and furnished information concerning the SIDOROVICHes which may be of value.)

Mrs. EUSE also advised that the SIDOROVICHS evidently visited New York before the holidays, probably during September or October of 1950, which information was obtained from a conversation between her and rs. SIDOROVICH.

The EUSE family appeared very cooperative and stated they would immediately contact this office in the event their suspicions were aroused by any activities of the SIDOROVICH family. In this case, they were requested to contact either SAS DAVID A. WIBLE or JOHN B. O'DONOGHUE in the event they observed any actions which might lead them to believe that the SIDOROVICH family was leaving or moving, or in the event they were not available, to furnish the information to anyone in the office.

On March 9, 1951, while being interviewed in connection with the American Legion Program, Mr. HARRY W. GATZKE, Supervisor, Military Allotments Section, U.S. Mavy Department, 1901 East 13th St., Cleveland, Ohio, made the following information available:

GATZKE stated that he had taken a real estate course under the GI Bill of Rights at the Serpas Realty Foundation, a school owned and operated by WILLIAM/SERPAS. This is approximately a nine week course, and GATZKE graduated in December, 1950.

Prior to his graduation, GATZKE formed the opinion that SERPAS was radical, and one occasion heard him make the statement that wif he were a young man he would not serve this country". In December, 1950, at the commencement exercies, GATZKE recalls that SERPAS gave a loud. ineffective speech to the graduates, and that the contents of the speech did not go over too well with GATZKE and other people present. GATZKE was unable to recall exactly what comments were made by SERPAS in the graduation speech.

In January or February of 1951, CATZKE had occasion to see SERPAS in connection with a real estate patter, and, at that time. SERPAS told him that he was interested in opening a TV school in Cleveland, Ohio.

GATZKE commented that SERPAS receives U.S. Government funds for G.I. trainees at his realty school and that his comments about this country, plus his radical piews, have made GATZKE reflect about his loyalty to this country.





There are but two physicians listed in the 1951 telephone directory, bearing the surname BROOKS; one, ERNEST R. BROOKS, 9400 Euclid, is known to be a general practitioner; the other, LOUIS H. BROOKS/ Rose Building (Pr. 1-6363); residence - 14712 Onaway (LO. 1-9131) has a practice limited to rectal diseases. In view of MICHAEL's malady, as he related it to me on March 30, 1951, it is probable LOUIS H. BROOKS will be the attending physician.

The files of the Newark Office failed to reflect any relationship between VICTOR PASCHKIS and other members of the SIDOROVICH and related investigation.

WAIDO R. MC NUTT who resides on River Road, Frenchtown, New Jersey, advised that he did not know nor has he ever heard of VICTUR PASCHKIS.

The files of this office reflect that information was received from the New Haven Office in 1943 that VICTOR PASCHKIS had been the subject of an investigation by the office of the Provost Marshal, Governor's Island, New York. At that time PASCHKIS resided in Hamden, Connecticut, and the local police department there conducted the investigation.

This investigation reflected that PASCHKIS, his wife, and two children were the objects of much suspicion by the neighbors while residing in Hamden. PASCHKIS appeared surly and distant and did not seem to be friendly with any of the people in his neighborhood. The PASCHKIS family at times had a great many people at their home for the week and these people seemed to be of a wealthy class.

It was also ascertained that the PASCHKIS family was supposed to be refugees from Germany.

Subsequently, FASCHKIS moved to Leonia, New Jersey, and worked at Columbia University. While in Leonia this office received a letter dated June 3, 1942, from W. WORTHINGTON WELLS, publisher of the newspaper "Leonia Life." In his letter WELLS advised that it had come to his attention that PASCHKIS held meetings of conscientious objectors at his residence.

WELLS added in his letter that these meetings were being held under the guidance of Quakerism but he had no knowledge of PASCHKIS being a member of the Friends Organization.

Investigation of FASCHKIS was thereafter conducted by this office but no further derogatory information concerning him was developed at that time.

In May, 1948, a report was submitted by this office to the Bureau concerning PASCHKIS, who was then an Atomic Energy Act Applicant. This investigation included inquiry concerning PASCHKIS in the vicinity of Neshanic, New Jersey, where he was then residing. No derogatory information was developed as a result of this investigation, although but few of the persons contacted actually were acquainted with him. Since that time no further investigation has been conducted by this office concerning PASCHKIS.

The following background information concerning PASCHKIS is taken from PASCHKIS personnel security questionnaire, which was furnished Newark by Bulet dated May 5, 1948.

It is noted that PASCHKIS listed under the caption of organization membership for the past 15 years approximately 15 organizations, among which was the Religious Society of Friends in which he held the office of Executive Committee of the Peace and Service Committee of the New York yearly meetings.

He also listed membership in an organization called rellowship of Reconciliation, 2929 Broadway, New York, Religious Pacifist, in approximately 1940.

Other information in the Newark files reflect that PASCHKIS is President of an organization known as "The Society for Social Responsibility and Science" which organization was formed in 1949. Information has been received that FASCHKIS, as President of the Society for Social Responsibility and Science, made a speech in Asbury Park, New Jersey, on June 3, 1950, under the auspices of "Women for Peace."

A newspaper article reflected that the Monmoth County Women for Peace have secured more than 4000 signatures to a letter to President TRUMAN headed "We, the undersigned, enroll for peace" and urging the banning of atomic weapons throughout the world. This is the organization that sponsored PASCHKIS' speech, and it is noted that a number of known CP members and leaders were present at this meeting sponsored by the Women for Peace.

It is suggested that if Cleveland is desirous of more complete detailed information concerning PASCHKIS, that they so request the Bureau.

WALDO R. MC NUTT advised on March 20, 1951, that in the early part of March he wrote MICHAEL SIDOROVICH a letter advising him he had a \$500 deposit on hand for his, SIDOROVICH, half interest in the property that he and SIDOROVICH held jointly on River Road, Frenchtown, New Jersey. This property is approximately four acres with a small summer house and three car garage on it, both in very bad need of repairs. According to MC NUTT, he has the right to this, but that to avoid any trouble in the future and so that he may have a completely clear title to the property. MC NUTT wants SIDOROVICH to sign a deed to the property.

MC NUTT stated that within a week he received an answer from SIDOROVICH's lawyer, LEON J. WEINER, 403 Cuyahoga Savings Bank Building, Prospect at East Ninth Street, Cleveland 15, Chio, which could be classed as a tentative acceptance.

MC NUTT said his lawyer, HYMAN HERR of Flemington, New Jersey, is handling this for him and that HERR is drawing up a deed which he will send to SIDOROVICH's lawyer within the month of March, 1951.

This four-acre property joins the small piece of property which SIDOROVICH owns outright and on which is located one cabin.

On April 5, 1951 Mr. JOSEPH JAMES PAVLOVIC, Box 753 Dillonvale, Ohio, with Cleveland address 3441 West 1644 Street, telephone ME 1-2178, appeared at the Cleveland Office requesting information concerning a complaint he lodged with the Mami Office in February, 1951 in connection with the theft of a \$20 Travelers check drawn on a Broadview, Ohio bank. This check was stolen from his person in Mismi, Florida.

PAVIOVIC said he has not heard of the check's being cashed, does not recall the name of the Agent to whom he spoke in Mismi, and does not know how to contact that office for information. He desired that this office contact Fiami to ascertain the status of his case there.

The files of the Cleveland Office reflect that one JOSEPH PAVIJCIC (note difference in spelling) is the manager of the New Cooperative Company with main offices located in Dillonvale, Ohio (Cincinnati territory). Further information in the Cleveland files indicates that JOSEPH PAVIDVIC of Dillonvale, Ohio was listed as a member of the INO and a subscriber to the "Daily Worker".

PAVLOVIC indicated his intention of remaining in Cleveland for a fewmeks at the address mentioned above. He was informed that should any information be forthcoring from the Miami, Florida Office, he would be advised by telephone. Eather than furnishing PAVLOVIC with the address of the Miami Office so that he might inquire via his own correspondence, this action is being taken with a view towards maintaining a contact with PAVLOVIC in connection with the ITSP matter while at the same time possibly developing other valuable information of a security nature.

Therefore, it is requested that the Hismi Office advised Cleveland as soon as possible concerning the status of PAVLOVIC's case there.

The Book Find Club buys the right to print books and then has the printing and binding done by others on a contract basis with the Book Find Club itself furnishing the paper.

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, on February 14, 1950, advised that the subject organization now operates with approximately 50 employees at 40l Broadway. Informant said that the club now had approximately 80,000 members with the large monthly mailing being handled by the HADDON CRAFTSMAN COMPANY of Scranton, Pennsylvania, which, according to the informant, also handled the mailings of the Book of The Month Club.

C GENERAL ACTIVITIES

Confidential Informants T-1 and T-2, both advised that the Book Find Club's sole activity consisted of securing the rights to books and promoting their sale as mentioned in the foregoing section of this report.

According to Confidential Informant T-2, the circulation of the club's book selections was secured through the issuing each month to Book Find Club members copies of a leaflet called, "The Book Find News". This leaflet contained reviews of the Book Find Club selections and also contained listings of recent club selections.

As an auxiliary promotion aid Confidential Informant T-2 said that the club had set up a division called, "The Seven Arts Library" which was limited to books devoted to art and painting. This last division, according to the informant, regularly issued leaflets setting out the books available to the Book Find Club members at special savings.

II OFFICERS

The Officers of the Book Find Club according to Confidential Informant T-2 are as follows:

GEORGE BRAZILLER, President. HERMAN FIGATNER, Controller. ED:IN LEAVER, Advertising Manager. MARSHA BRAZILLER, Editorial Advisor.



GEORGE BRAZILLER, according to Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, has also used the name JOSEPH as a first name, was born February 12, 1916, Brooklyn, New York, married MARSHA NACHADOVITZ, August 21, 1940 at Woodridg New York and was associated in business with HERMAN FIGATNER of Sheffield Avenue, Brooklyn, New York.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, on December 17, 1946, advised that BRAZILLER was listed as a member of the New Council of American Business, Inc. Regarding the latter organization, Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, in February, 1947, advised that he did not feel the organization was Communistic but did feel that it was "friendly to the Communist Party".

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised that GEORGE BRAZILLER was listed as a member of the American Sponsoring Committee of the World Congress For Peace, Paris, France, April 20 to April 23, 1949.

The 1949 report of The California Un-American Activities Committee, pages 476 and 490 reports that the Scientific and Cultural Conference for World Peace held at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City, March 25 to March 27, 1949, was "an international Communist front activity" and was "a forerunner of a World Peace Congress to be held in Paris on April 20 to April 23, 1949, which was to be headed by FREDERIC JOLIOT CURIE, an avowed French Communist".

III STATED AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, on October 7, 1949, furnished a four page leaflet issued by the Book Find Club captioned, "An Invitation". This leaflet indicated that the objective of the Book Find Club was to choose "the best in fiction and non-fiction" in the choices selected for distribution to club members.

IV SUBVERSIVE RAMIFICATIONS

A CONNECTION WITH COMMUNIST PARTY

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, on Jamuary 5, 1950, advised that Communist Party members were instructed as far back as two years ago to withdraw from the Book Find Club because it was potting out "reaction ry works" and had refused to "desist" in that practice.





Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, on January 6, 1950, advised that during the past year the Book Find Club had begun to advertise "non-progressive" books and consequently "progressives" had deserted it for the Liberty Book Club. According to this informant the Liberty Book Club had been formed by a group of progressives and leading Communists of the New York State Committee of the Communist Party in order to give wide circulation to "Communist and progressive writers". In addition, the club membership campaign the informant said, was conducted through "Communist Party clubs, progressive mass organizations and trade unions."

The October 5, 1948 issue of the "Daily Worker", east coast Communist newspaper, in column 3 on page 12 carries an article headed, "Liberty Book Club: Channel for Progressive Books". The article stated that the Liberty Book Club was being welcomed by publishers who see in it "the only channel for progressive books to attain a mass sale". The article stated that members were required to take a minimum of four selections of the twelve books distributed each year at a cost of \$1.20 each.

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that he had no knowledge of Communist activities of influence in the Book Find Club at the present time.

EDWIN LEAVER, Advertising Manager.

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that LEAVER had been associated with the Book Find Club since January, 1949 and had previously been associated with the Book of The Month Club.

MARSHA BRAZILLER, Editorial Advisor.

Confidential Informant T-11, of known reliability, on May 20, 1946, furnished a souvenir program of the 15th anniversary of the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade. This program on page 43 contained an advertisement reading "Greetings from Maria Braziller".

It should be noted that the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade has been listed as a Communist organization coming within the purview of Executive Order #9835.

IV SUBVERSIVE RAMIFICATIONS

A CONNECTION WITH COMMUNIST PARTY

Confidential Informant T-2 on March 18, 1948 advised that JOAN MENKEN praised Communist ideas and policies while LENORE MASOR wanted him to subscribe to the "Daily Worker" and SARA OSTRIE as well as HUBERT BAUE seem to go along with the "leftist" ideas of the others.

At the time the foregoing information was received all of the above individuals according to the informant were clerical employees of the Book Find Club. However, when reinterviewed on February 14, 1950, Confidential Informant

T-2 advised that only SARA OSTRIE of the individuals mentioned above was still employed by the Book Find Club and her actions gave no indication of "Communist sympathies".

Confidential Informant T-2 also advised that during the Fall of 1949 tentative arrangements had been made for the Gimbels Department Store to become an outlet for the Book Find Club. The informant said that protest of the public to Gimbels had prompted the store to withdraw from the contemplated contract with the Book Find Club. The informant attributed the protest and subsequent loss of the contract to the "past policies" of the club rather than to its "present policy".

Confidential Informants T-12, T-13, T-14 and T-15, all of known reliability, could furnish no information indicating Communist infiltration or Communist control of the Book Find Club and its officers.

Reference is made to the surveillance log of SAs McINNIS L. WARD and FRANCIS J. PIERONI on June 9, 1951, wherein it was noted that the subject traveled to 15908 St. Clair Avenue, which is the address for the DiLillo Radio and Television Service. It was noted that the surveilling agents stated that the subject carried some sort of recording or radio apparatus into the aforementioned store.

The writer on June 10, 1951, contacted Mr. ANTHONY DI LILLO, owner of the Di Lillo Radio and Television Service, at which time he stated that MICHAEL SIDOROVICH brought in an automobile radio for repairs. The writer was permitted to examine the radio apparatus and verify that it was an automobile radio.

Reference is also made to the surveillance of the subject on April 29, 1951, by SAs JAMES S. PEELMAN and THOMAS W. SMITH wherein it was noted that the subject traveled to 11915 Ashbury Avenue and entered the apartment building through the rear. It should be noted that WILLIAM PERL resided at 1516 East 120th Street, which is located directly across the street from the apartment building at 11915 Ashbury Avenue.

She stated that after MIKE left she went to the back door and found a note from him stating that they had come over to visit them but since they found no one at home they just wanted to inform the EDWARDSES that they were there.

Mrs. EDWARDS advised that in the event they obtain any information which they feel might be of some value to the FBI they will immediately contact the Cleveland Office.

SA RICHARD A. MINIHAN of the New York Office today advised that the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals had unanimously upheld the conviction of JULIUS ROSENBERG, ET AL, and in accordance with previous Bureau instructions, a full surveillance of both subjects is to be instituted immediately for a period of three days for two purposes:

- A. To keep apprised of the subjects' movements at all times and to be alert to any indications of departure from their normal habits or attempts to leave the country.
- B. To ascertain their contacts.

The subjects are known Soviet Agents and have been involved in the JULIUS ROSENBERG espionage apparatus. MICHAEL SIDOROVICH served in the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in Spain and both were associated with left-wing movements in their youth. The SIDOROVICHES have denied any implication in such activities despite incontrovertible proof and their testimony before a Federal Grand Jury is the basis for consideration of charging them with Perjury. ANNE SIDOROVICH in 1945 was to have acted as a courier in communicating information re the Atom Bomb from Los Alamos to New York. MICHAEL SIDOROVICH has been a "cut-out" between WILLIAM PERL, an MGB agent employed at NACA and one of the country's leading mathematicians in the Aeronautics field, and New York. Through SIDOROVICH it is believed top-secret data including material concerning an Atomic-pewered aircraft was passed to ROSENBERG.

The subjects reside in Suite 10, 1225 East 124th Street. The custodians are ATWELL T. SHARPE and ETTA SHARPE and have appeared to be co-operative in this matter. MIKE SIDOROVICH is employed at the Gas Machinery Company, 16100 Waterloo Road, Cleveland, Ohio.
