

Greenglass, coconspirator of Rosenberg and Sobell. Perlin
allegedly wanted to interview Fuchs to determine if Fuchs could
make an identification of Gold and in the event Fuchs did not
make such an identification if he then feels he would have a
basis for a new trial.

Sobell was convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage along with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and is currently serving a 30-year sentence in Atlanta Penitentiary. His attorney, Marshall Perlin, traveled to England to interview Fuchs. Perlin claimed that he wanted to determine if Fuchs actually saw Harry Gold since he feels he can break the case against Sobell on this point. Gold is an admitted Soviet agent who testified as a Govt. witness at the Rosenberg-Sobell trial and told of his contacts with Fuchs and with David Greenglass, codefendants at the trial. The "Washington Post and Times Herald" for 3-25-59 had a letter to the editor captioned, "The Case of Morton Sobell." Letter signed by Reinhold Niebuhr, John C. Bennett, Paul Ramsey, Gerhard O.W. Mueller, Edmond Cahn, Daniel Day Williams, Jerome Nathanson of New York. The letter recommends the commutation of Sobell's sentence giving 5 hackneyed reasons which echo the terms of the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell. The authors state, "We are and consistently have been convinced anti-Communists." Sobell is Soviet espionage agent who was convicted along with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and is currently serving a 30-year term in Atlanta prison.

Reinhold
Bufiles reflect *Niebuhr* is connected with the Union Theological Seminary, New York. He is regarded in some circles as one of the leading theologians in the United States. He is an inveterate joiner and has filed numerous petitions on behalf of the Socialists and pro-communist individuals. In April, 1957, he wrote the Director accusing him of being completely wrong in a statement that A. J. Muste had long fronted for the communists and had circulated an amnesty petition for the relatives of communist leaders convicted under the Smith Act. Niebuhr claimed Muste was anticommunist.

Calif. N.Y.
John C. Bennett is a theology professor who also wrote the Director defending Muste. In the early 1940's his name appeared on a list at Communist Party headquarters in Alameda County, California. In the 1940's he was active in communist front groups and filed a petition opposing the renewal of the Dies Committee. He was among a group of 9 who initiated a December, 1955, petition for amnesty for Smith Act subjects.

The Case of Morton Sobell A-12

We are American citizens who believe that the sentence of Morton Sobell should now be commuted. Sobell was convicted of conspiring with others to transmit to the Soviet Union writings and information relating to the national defense of the United States and was sentenced on April 1, 1951, to serve 30 years in Federal prison.

Morton Sobell was tried with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, who were convicted of espionage in connection with the atomic bomb and who were sentenced to death and later executed. Sobell, however, was never implicated in any way with involvement in the atomic espionage for which the Rosenbergs were convicted. This fact was confirmed by the judge who sentenced Sobell.

This statement is not concerned with the Rosenberg conviction. We are and consistently have been convinced anti-Communists. None are associated with any organization, committee, or group of any kind concerned either with the case of the Rosenbergs or that of Sobell, nor are any of us connected in any way with Morton Sobell or any members of his family. After study of the case, we believe that the following considerations warrant a commutation of the very heavy sentence Sobell is now serving.

1. Sobell was never implicated with atomic espionage for which the Rosenbergs were convicted.

2. The charges against Sobell, supported mainly by the testimony of one man, Max Elitcher, were that he had solicited information and had, on one occasion, taken something which looked like a can film to Julius Rosenberg.

tion supposed to have been secured by him or transmitted by him to anyone else is specified in the record. The case against him, therefore, is vague in content and slender in proof. The possibility that a trip to Mexico which he and his family took should be construed as flight cannot be ignored, though it is subject to various interpretations.

3. Whether or not the judge and prosecution made sufficient efforts to provide a fair trial, we ought to recognize that the emotions surrounding the trial of the Rosenbergs and the fact that Sobell's case was tried with theirs made it difficult to separate the two cases and to recognize the very different character of the two charges and the evidence introduced to support them respectively.

4. Sobell has already served, with good conduct, nearly eight years in prison, six of them in Alcatraz.

5. As Americans we are fully aware of the threat of communism to our freedom and way of life. Any attack on that freedom from without or within must be resisted. Nevertheless, one of the factors which makes that freedom so precious is its capacity to practice a disciplined and humane administration of justice precisely in those cases where emotions are aroused which make it difficult to remain objective about the merits of a specific case. We believe a commutation of the Sobell sentence would demonstrate our national faith in that freedom.

SYNOPSIS:

NCSJMS cited by House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) as communist front has twofold purpose: (1) remove Morton Sobell from Alcatraz (in 3-58 he was transferred to Atlanta Penitentiary) and (2) obtain either his release, reduction of sentence or new trial. NCSJMS is carrying out its program of obtaining support from prominent persons, influenced Senator Frank E. Moss (D-Utah) to write to President Eisenhower requesting that perhaps the Attorney General should consider a new trial for Sobell.

The communists have cried "frame-up" regarding the Sobell case since 1953 and Moss's letter implies that Sobell was "unjustly convicted." Court record shows Rosenberg & Sobell case reviewed 16 times by U.S. District Court; 7 appeals were argued before Circuit Court of Appeals; 7 petitions made to U. S. Supreme Court and 2 applications for executive clemency. Judges Irving E. Kaufman and Harold R. Medina have also denied Sobell's motions. HCUA has previously prepared excellent pamphlet entitled "Trial by Treason" (attached) deflating communist charges in this matter.

We have had friendly relations with Senator Moss who is an SAC contact, and on 11-29-56 he met the Director. He is past president of the National Association of County and Prosecuting Attorneys and on 7-21-58 he presented the Director with this organization's "Furtherance of Justice" award. On 1-19-59 Inspector Malone met Moss who stated he could be counted on the side of law enforcement re: future legislation. As Moss is favorably disposed to the Bureau, he should be contacted; alerted to the fact he is being used by a communist outfit; and through this action, he should become a stronger friend of the Bureau and further exploitation of him by NCSJMS will be eliminated.

RECOMMENDATION:

If you approve, it is recommended that Mr. DeLoach contact Moss with the aim of exposing captioned organization's designs on Moss' position and point out to Moss the fallacy of the claims that an injustice has been done to Sobell. The attached copy of "Trial by Treason" may be furnished Moss in the event he is not aware that such a pamphlet exists. After the contact with Moss, the Salt Lake City Office will be advised inasmuch as Moss is a contact of that office.

DETAILS:

The NCSJMS has been cited in the 1-2-57 issue of "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," prepared by House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA), as the successor organization to the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, which was a communist front created to conduct an amnesty campaign for convicted atom spies Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. The aims of captioned organization have been twofold; (1) to remove Sobell from Alcatraz Penitentiary (accomplished in 2-58 when Sobell was transferred to Atlanta Penitentiary) and (2) either his outright release, reduction of the 30-year sentence or a new trial.

Since the execution of the Rosenbergs in 1953, captioned group has unceasingly strived to obtain respectable and well-known persons to take up the cudgel for Sobell's cause. Recently the committee pulled out another "plan" in influencing Senator Frank E. Moss (D-Utah) to address a letter to President Eisenhower which was outlined in the 7-9 throwaway type newspaper published sporadically by captioned organization entitled "Today's Verdict." Moss is quoted by this paper in part as follows: "As you know there is widespread belief that Mr. Sobell was unjustly convicted and that his case should be re-opened. Because of the many letters I am receiving on this subject, I am writing to ask you to interest yourself in this case to see whether perhaps within the dictates of your conscience, you would like to ask the Attorney General to decide whether a new trial should be granted to Mr. Sobell." A Photostat of this paper, the original of which is being retained in Bufiles, is attached.

The communists have long echoed the cry of "frame-up" of Sobell with various distortions and charges aimed at showing the Rosenbergs and Sobell were victims of "McCarthyite" prejudices when in reality the trio were working for peace. Senator Moss in his letter implies Sobell was "unjustly convicted" but the record discloses that the Rosenberg-Sobell case prior to 6-53 was reviewed 16 times by the United States District Court, 7 appeals to the Circuit Court of Appeals were argued, 7 petitions to the United States Supreme Court were made and 2 applications were made to the President for executive clemency.

Likewise, Sobell has petitioned the U.S. Supreme Court on several occasions and has filed for a new trial on occasions, all of which motions were denied. Among other legal questions, Sobell has claimed that he was illegally deported from Mexico, thereby precluding the legality of his trial in New York; however, this particular motion was denied in a 48-page opinion dated 6/20/56 by Judge Irving R. Kaufman, U.S. District Court, Southern District of New York, and Judge Kaufman's decision was unanimously affirmed by the Circuit Court of Appeals, Second Circuit, when Judge Harold R. Medina ruled Sobell's charges were utterly groundless.

To further expose the fallacy of communist claims in this regard, the NCJIA on 8/25/56 prepared a history of this case in an excellent, comprehensive pamphlet entitled "Trial By Treason" which realistically punctures the claims of the communists or their dupes that the Rosenbergs and Sobell were "framed." A copy of this document is attached.

Background of Moss:

Moss was a prominent Salt Lake City attorney and was elected to the Senate in the 1958 elections. The Bureau has had friendly relations with him in the past and on 11/29/56 he toured the Bureau and met with the Director. SAC W. M. Felt contacted Moss in 10/56 to get acquainted and found Moss to be favorably disposed toward the Bureau. Moss was approved as an SAC contact on 2/27/58. He was in 1956-57 president of the National Association of County and Prosecuting Attorneys (NACPA) and by letter dated 9/18/56 the Director congratulated Moss on his election to that position. On 7/21/58 Moss presented to the Director the "Furtherance of Justice" award of the NACPA. The Director congratulated Moss on his election to the Senate by letter dated 11/5/58 to which Moss cordially replied on 11/17/58. On 1/19/59 Inspector Malone met Senator Moss who stated he could be counted on the side of law enforcement regarding any bills coming before Congress.

Since it appears that Moss is favorably disposed to the Bureau it is believed he should be contacted and acquainted with the fact that this communist outfit is using his good name in the furtherance of its aims. Our action in this regard is expected to have two results: (1) through our alerting Moss to this matter, he should become a stronger friend of the Bureau and (2) through our action Moss can be eliminated from further exploitation by captioned organization in its work.
